CHAPTER - 1

INTRODUCTION

VISION

To create an environment that facilitates the highest standards in human resource development in the disability sector based on principles of human rights and inclusion.

MISSION

To ensure enhancement in the quality of existing and emerging human resource development programmes in disability rehabilitation and to address the life cycle needs of persons with disabilities across the country, including those from remote and less-served areas.

The Rehabilitation Council was initially set up under the Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860 vide Resolution No 22-17/83-HW.III dated 33st January, 1986 to have uniformity and to ensure minimum standards and quality of education & training in the field of special education and rehabilitation. It was given statutory status by an Act of Parliament, the Rehabilitation Council of India Act, 1992 (No. 34 of 1992) dated 1st September, 1992 effective from 22nd June, 1993. The RCI Act was amended by Parliament in 2000 (No.38 of 2000) to make it more broad based. The Act provides for constitution of the Rehabilitation Council of India for regulating and monitoring the training of rehabilitation professionals and personnel, promotion of research in rehabilitation and special education and maintenance of a Control Rehabilitation Register.

By signing and ratifying the United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (UNCRPD), India has committed itself to harmonize all the domestic laws including the RCI Act. The Convention has brought the inclusion of persons with disabilities to the centre-stage need to implement the provisions of the Convention in its true spirit. Accordingly, the syllabilitation of the various rehabilitation courses developed and standardized by RCI are being continuously revised so as to meet the requirements of the relevant provisions in the UNCRPD.









MAJOR PROVISIONS OF THE RCI ACT

Objectives of the Council

- To regulate and monitor the training programmes in the field of rehabilitation of disabled persons.
- To prescribe minimum standards of education and training for various categories of professionals dealing with persons with disabilities.
- To regulate these standards in all training institutions to bring about uniformity throughout the country.
- To make recommendations to the Ministry regarding recognition of qualifications granted by Universities, etc., in India for rehabilitation professionals.
- To make recommendations to the Ministry regarding recognition of qualification by institutions outside india.
- To maintain Central Rehabilitation Register of persons possessing the recognized rehabilitation qualification.
- To encourage Continuing Rehabilitation Education in collaboration with organizations working in the field of disability.
- 8. To promote research in rehabilitation and special education.

Functions of the Council

- The qualifications granted by any University or other institution in India that are included in the Schedule shall be recognized qualifications for Rehabilitation Professionals.
- 2. Any University or other institution which grants qualification for rehabilitation professionals not included in Schedule may apply to the Central Government to have any such qualification recognized and the Central Government, after consulting the Council may, by notification amend the Schedule so as to include such qualification therein and any such notification may also direct that any entry shall be made in the last column of the Schedule against such qualification only when granted after a specified date.
- 3. The Council may enter into negotiations with a recognized authority in any other country for setting up of a scheme of reciprocity for the recognition of qualifications, in pursuance of any such scheme, the Central Government may by notification, amend the Schedule so as to include therein any qualification which the Council has decided should be recognized, and by such notification may also direct that an entry shall be made in the last column of the Schedule deciaring that it shall be a recognized qualification only when granted after a specified data.





- Registration of Rehabilitation Professionals in the Central Rehabilitation Register of persons possessing the recognized rehabilitation qualifications as per the Schedule attached to the Act.
- To prescribe the minimum standards of education required for granting recognized rehabilitation qualification by Universities/Institutions in India.
- To prescribe the standards of professionals, conduct and etiquette & code of ethics for rahabilitation professionals.
- To assess and grant approval to institutions/universities for the training of professionals in the field of rehabilitation and to facilitate their recognition and its withdrawal by the Government.
- The Council may appoint such number of visitors as it may deem requisite to inspect any University or institution wherein education for rehabilitation professionals is given or attend any examination for the purpose of granting recognized rehabilitation qualifications.

- (vi) Vocational Counsellors, Employment Officers and Placement Officers dealing with Persons with Disabilities
- (vii) Multi-purpose Rehabilitation Therapists & Technicians
- (viii) Speech Pathologists
- (b) Rehabilitation Psychologists
- (x) Rehabilitation Social Workers
- (xi) Rehabilitation Practitioners in Mental Retardation
- (xll) Orientation and Mobility Specialists
- (xdii) Community Based Rehabilitation Professionals
- (xdv) Rehabilitation Counsellors / Administrators
- (xv) Prosthetists and Orthotists
- (xvi) Rehabilitation Workshop Managers
- (xvII) Any other category of Professionals Included from time to time










COUNCIL AND ITS MEETINGS

GENERAL COUNCIL

In accordance with Sub-Section (1) and (3) of Section 3 of RCI Act 1992 (34 of 1992), the Central Government appoints Members of the General Council of Rehabilitation Council of India consisting of a Chairperson and 28 Members representing the Ministries/Departments, rehabilitation professionals, social workers, medical practitioners and Members of Parliament. During the parlod, Dr. (Prof.) Sudesh Mukhopadhyay held the post of Chairperson, RCI till 15th September, 2015, Shri Lov Verma, IAS, Secretary, DEPwD took over as Chairperson, RCI (Additional Charge) w.e.f. 16th September, 2015 upto 31st January, 2016 and Dr. Vinod Aggarwal, IAS, Secretary, DEPwD was given the additional charge of Chairperson, RCI w.e.f. 01st February, 2016.

38th Meeting of the General Council

38th Meeting of the General Council of Rehabilitation Council of India was held on 30th November, 2015 at India International Centre, New Delhi under the Chairmanship of Shri Lov Verma, Secretary, DEPWD & Chairperson, RCI. Following decisions were taken in the meeting:

 Confirmation of the Minutes of the 37th Meeting of the General Council held on 27.11.2014

Minutes of the 37th meeting of the General Council were confirmed.

2. Follow up action on the Minutes of the 37th Meeting of the General Council

Follow up Action on the Minutes of the 37th Meeting of the General Council was approved with following observations/recommendations:

- (i) Chairperson, RCI & Governing Body, NIER has been authorized by General Council to take appropriate decision on conduct of All India Aptitude Test through outsourcing agencies for admission to Certificate/Diploma level Courses on behalf of National Board of Examination in Rehabilitation (NBER).
- (ii) General Council also approved to continue the conduct of examinations of Certificate/ Diploma level Courses through National Institutes on behalf of NBER till the NBER is in a position to conduct such examinations.
- (iii) RCI shall write to all the North Eastern States to allow relaxation of 15% marks in the qualifying examination for admission to Certificate/Diploma level Courses on the pattern of State of Assem to facilitate adequate human resource development in the area of disability rehabilitation and special education in North Eastern States.
- (iv) ACI to promote human resource development in North Eastern States through ICEAI and other Universities by offering Courses through ODL mode.
- (v) The process of admission to Certificate/Diploma level Courses may be made Online starting from Inviting applications for admission, selection of candidates for admission, list of admitted candidates, etc. and this information should also be uploaded on RCI website. RCI should also publicles the admission process through indicative advertisements and detailed information may be uploaded on its website. Academic Monitoring and Analysis System (AMA5) being developed by RCI should have provisions for containing all the details relating to admissions, examinations, results and registration in Central Rehabilitation Register.
- (vi) RCI to organize a Workshop for State Project Directors, SSA/RMSA in association with Ministry of HRD to orient them about RCI role, responsibilities and mandate.
- (viii) RCI to organize a meeting with NCTE, NCERT, Ministry of HRD in collaboration with DEPwD, M/o Si&E to resolve the issue of equivalency of 8. Ed. Spl. Ed. and M.Ed. Spl. Ed. Courses.

3. Perusal of the Progress Report of the Council

Progress Report of the Council was perused and approved with the following observations & recommendations:

- (i) Dr. Ravinder Singh, ICMR suggested to sensitize the personnel working under ICMR through the In-Service Training Programme. It was decided that ICMR may send the proposal under in-Service Training Programme and if the target group is covered under the Scheme, sensitization programme can be organized for them.
- (ii) Progress Report should be prepared with reference to the targets fixed in the approved Action Plan of the Council in order to have a better understanding of the achievements and shortfalls, if any.
- Approval of the Draft 28th Annual Report along with Audited Accounts of the Council for the year 2014-15

28th Annual Report along with Audited Accounts of the Council for the year 2014-15 (01.04.2014 to 31.03.2015) was approved for printing and submitting to DEPwD for laying before both the Houses of the Parkament.

 Approval of Minimum Qualifications for Recruitment of Faculty in Special Education and Disability Rehabilitation Programme

General Council approved the proposal to approach UGC for notification of minimum qualifications for recruitment of faculty in disability rehabilitation and special education programmes for which nomenclature of the degrees has been notified by UGC.

5. Approval of Programmes being run on Pliot Basis

General Council approved the following proposals:

- Discontinuation of following non-operational programmes approved on Pilot Basis:
 - (a) Diploma for Information Assistive Technologies for Instructors of the Deafblind and Deaf with Low Vision (On Pilot Basis)
 - (b) M.Sc. Disab(lity Studies (Early Intervention) (Pilot Basis)
 - (c) Post Graduate Diploma in Rehabilitation Engineering (Pilot Basis)
- (ii) To include the following pilot basis programmes in the list of approved courses that can be run by any approved institute after following due process:
 - (a) Diplome in Computer Education (Visual Impairment) (Pilot basis)
 - (b) Post Graduate Diploma in Alternative and Augmentative Communication (Pliot basis)
- (iii) To accept the off-line proposal for extension of Diploma in Computer Education (Visual Impairment) (Pilot basis) and Post Graduate Diploma in Alternative and Augmentative Communication (Pilot basis) for the academic session 2016-17.









7. (A) Discontinuation of Non-Operational Courses

Seneral Council considered and approved the proposal to discontinue the following nonoperational courses:

- (a) B.A. B.Ed. (Visual Impairment)
- (b) Diploma in Early Childhood Special Education (Visual Impairment)
- (c) Diploma in Basic Development Therapy

7. (B) Discontinuation of Post Graduate Diploma in Special Education Programmes

General Council also approved discontinuation of following programmes from the academic session 2016-17:

- (a) Post Graduate Diploma in Special Education (Mental Retardation)
- (b) Post Graduate Diploma in Special Education (Multiple-Disabilities Physical & Neurological)

8. Approval of Scope of Practice

General Council approved the document on "Scope of Practice" covering the scope for Audiology and Speech Language Pathology Professionals.

Approval of Programme Curricula

Revised curricula of the following courses was approved by the General Council for implementation from the next academic session, i.e., 2016-17:

- Diploma in Hearing Language and Speech
- 2. Diploms in Hearing Aid Repair and Ear Mould Technology.

10. Incidental Charges for Examination of Certificate and Diploma Level Programmes

General Council decided that Ali Yavar Jung National Institute for the Hearing Handicapped (AKINIHH), Mumbal may be asked to conduct the Examinations of Certificate and Diploma Level programmes as per approved guidelines issued by the Council and the incidental charges may be sent to RCI as is being done by other National Institutes conducting the examinations of Certificate/Diploma Courses.

11. Relaxation in Rider for Number of Inspections by a Visiting Expert

General Council authorized Member Secretary/Chairperson, RCI to take appropriate decision on case to case basis for deputing visiting experts for inspection for more than 3 times for the countes approved in categories like Speech & Audiology, Clinical Psychology, Education, etc., wherever it becomes justifiable.

Approval of Revised Joint Inspection Report Format for Fresh Application and Application for Extension of Approval

General Council accorded post-facto approval to the revised Joint Inspection Report Formats (New & Ongoing Courses) for Implementation from the ecademic session 2016-17.





13. Approval for MoU with Special Schools to conduct Approved Courses

General Council approved the proposal to allow MoU with any other special school for the academic session 2016-17 with following riders:

- MoU should be in the format of RCi and for a maximum two years.
- School should have not less than 40 students and also it should not have undergone.
 MoU with any other institution and also maintains the quality of special educators for the purpose of observation and Supervision during practice teaching.
- An undertaking from the institute to start their own special school/inclusive school within 2 years to continue the course.

14. Relaution in norms in respect of Continuing Rahabilitation Education (CRE) Programmes

General Council approved the proposal to relax the condition of five years experience of running RD approved courses in respect of Government institutions/Universities only to be eligible to conduct CRE programmes.

15. Permission to Re-start M. Ed Spi Ed. through ODL mode

Keeping in view the need and demand of professionals in special education, General Council approved the following:

- M. Ed.Spl.Ed. (ODL) syllabus in disability specialization of MR, Hi & VI may be developed and approved by the respective Expert Committee/ competent authorities before re-starting M.Ed.Spl.Ed. through ODL mode.
- (II) M.Ed. Spi. Ed. disability specialization of MR, HI & VI through ODL mode may be run only at the Universities fulfilling the prescribed norms from the academic session 2016-17, subject to approval of revised M.Ed. Spi. Ed. (ODL) syllabus in disability specialization of MR, HI & VI.
- (III) Decision to run M.Ed. Spl. Ed. (ODL) in disability specialization of MR, Hi & VI through Study Centres of openy distance universities shall be taken later on after obtaining approval from GC/EC.

Permission to Ra-start Bachelor of Prosthetics and Orthotics (BPO) Condensed Bridge Course through distance mode

Regarding re-start of Bachelor of Prosthetics and Orthotics (SPO) Condensed Bridge Course through distance mode, it was decided by the General Council that an Expert Committee may be constituted to make its recommendations within a given time frame of three months. Representatives of both the Associations, viz. OPAI, Chennal & OPPAHR, Delhi may also be invited to the meeting of the Expert Committee. Recommendations of the Expert Committee may be circulated to all members of the General Council for their comments and their comments may be further placed before the competent authority for taking appropriate decision.









17. Proposal for establishment of Regional /State Chapter of RCI

General Council agreed in principle for establishment of 14 State Chapters and 04 Regional Chapters of RCI and authorized Member Secretary/Chairperson to initiate necessary action to frame proposal for approval by DEPwO, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, subject to availability of funds.

18. Hixley of Remuneration for Examination related work

General Council approved the rates of honorarium for paper setter, moderator, evaluator, etc. for the work related to examination under NSER. General Council also authorized Chairperson, RCI & Chairperson, Governing Body, NSER to take decision for further enhancement of the above rates, if necessary, on the recommendation of the Expert Committee.

Proposals received to continue the approved Courses from the Academic Session 2016-17 (Extension of Approval Cases)

General Council took the following decisions:

- Applications for extension of approval for the academic session 2015-17 may be considered till 31st December 2015 along with a penalty of Rs. 5000.
- (ii) In case of institutions, especially the National Institutes, running the Courses without applying to the Council, DEPwD, M/o SI&E may be approached to take punitive action against the National Institutes and if necessary, release of grants to such institutes may be stopped on the recommendation of the Council.
- (iii) In case of fresh proposals submitted online but hard copy of the applications received after due date, may be considered on a case to case basis provided the institute re-submits with proper justification for late submission.
- (iv) Fresh proposals received without NOC from the respective State Government, may be returned for re-submission through State Government.
- (v) In case of non receipt of NOC from State Government within the prescribed period, provisions prescribed in the RCI Regulations may be invoked.

20. Extension of Legal Advisor

General Council took the following decisions:

- (i) Approved the extension of engagement period of Mrs. Anuje Saxena as Legal Advisor for a period of one year from 22.12.2015 to 21.12.2016 on the existing terms and conditions with 10% increase in the existing honorarium of Rs.50,000, i.e. Rs.5,000 per month.
- 86 pending cases and 29 cases wherein reply has not been filed, may be reviewed and necessary action taken on priority.
- (iii) Presence of Legal Advisor in the Council may be ensured for a reasonable time, i.e. minimum three days (full time) in a week.
- (Iv) Alternative options for dealing with legal matters/court cases of RCI may also be explored.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

To fulfill the purpose of the RCI Act, the General Council as per the powers conferred under Sub Section (1) of Section 7, the Chairperson, RCI constituted the Executive Committee from amongst the members of the General Council. The Executive Committee is responsible for the management and administration of the affairs of the Council. The Executive Committee of the Council shall meet at least once in every four months. The meeting of the Executive Committee may be convened by the Chairperson of the Executive Committee or any other member of the Executive Committee who may be authorized by him on his behalf. List of the Executive Committee Members as on 31st March, 2016 is placed at Annexure 1.2. Following meetings of the Executive Committee were held during the year as per details given below:

69th Meeting of the Executive Committee

69th meeting of the Executive Committee of RCI was held on 12.05.2015 at RCI, New Delhi under the Chairpersonship of Prof. Sudesh Mukhopadhyay, Chairperson, RCI. Following decisions were taken in the meeting:

- (A) Minutes of the 68th Meeting of the Executive Committee were confirmed and the following up action was approved.
- (8) Progress Report of the Council was perused by the members and the following observations/decisions were made:
 - Research Scheme prepared by the Council and approved in 68th Meeting of the Executive Committee shall be implemented during the financial year 2015-16.
 - (ii) Scheme of In-service Training & Sensitization of State Governments, Local Bodies and Other Service Providers shall be implemented from the financial year 2015-16. A sum of Rs.2.00 crore has been allocated for the same and the approval of the Fund Senctioning Authority (PSA) has already been communicated by the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (DEPwD). Training schedule shall be prepared on the basis of proposals received till 30th June, 2015 for utilization of allocated funds of Rs.2.00 crore during the year 2015-16. RCI may go ahead for conducting the training programme without waiting for further communication from the Department/ Ministry and first batch of training should be organized during the month of July/ August, 2015. National institutes and State Governments may be involved in the training programme.
 - (iii) With regard to approval of institutions, following decisions were taken:
 - (a) Inspection Report should be sent by the visiting experts within a week from the date of inspection and if the report is received late, without proper justification, the same shall not be accepted.
 - (b) In case the inspection Report is not favourable and re-inspection is requested by the institute or the proposal is regretted by the Council, a scanned copy of the inspection Report should be sent to the concerned institute through email so that they can improve upon the shortcomings and can re-approach the Council for re-inspection/approvel.









- (c) Online system used for monitoring of institutions should have a provision/ software to generate automatic alerts to the Institutes whose extension of approval is due so that they can apply for extension of approval on time.
- (iv) It was decided to write to the Commissioner, Kandriya Vidyalaya Sangthan, New Delhi and Secretary, School Education, Ministry of Human Resource Development and Chairperson, NCTE to resolve the issue of equivalence of B.Ed. Spl. Ed. and B.Ed. General for appointment of teachers in KVS and related issues.
- (v) As regards the matter of Allied Health Sciences being taken up by the Task Force of National initiative for Aliled Health Sciences, it was decided by the members to take up the matter with Ministry of Health & Family Welfare through the Department of Empowerment of PwDs, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, as the field of disability rehabilitation and allied health sciences related to persons with disabilities is the mandate of RCL.
- (vi) A feed-back form needs to be prepared and sent to all the beneficiaries of Scheme of Special Component Plan for SCs and STs implemented by RCI for distribution of Laptops during the financial year 2014-15, to obtain their feedback on the impact of the Scheme on their studies, job placement, etc.
- (vii) National Board of Examination in Rehabilitation (NBER) to be made fully operational by 31st August, 2015 and start conducting the Semester/Term-end examination of Certificate/Diploma Courses from December, 2015.
- (viii) Regarding maintenance of Central Rehabilitation Register (CRR), it has been decided to Issue Plastic Identity Cards to all the registered professionals/personnel containing details about their name, registration number, qualifications, date of registration, validity period of registration and signed by the Member Secretary, RCI, it was also decided that Tender process for preparation and issue of Plastic Identity Cards should be completed within the next, two months and Issue of Cards is started immediately thereafter by the selected agency.
- (lx) Regarding CRE programmes, it was suggested by the members to undertake a study to find out how many registered professionals/personnel have undergone CRE programmes and how many have been left out. This information may be included in the proposed Research Study on "Status of Rehabilitation Professionals of RCI".
- (x) The issue of settlement of outstanding audit paras needs to be taken up by the Council with CAG through Financial Advisor, DEPwD, M/o SISE so that the audit pares are settled without further delay.
- (xi) The matter of obtaining completion certificate from CPWD and/or any other outstanding issues of arbitration, etc. should be resolved within next three months and if required, the matter may be taken up at the level of J5 (AKA), DEPwD with D6, CPWD.
- (xii) RCI to approach N.C.E.C. to find out availability of office accommodation/building on out-right purchase out of the funds accumulated from its internal receipts, to accommodate all the officers and employees at one place as the space available in the existing building at 8-22, Qutab Institutional Area, New Delhi is not sufficient to





accommodate even the existing regular employees and there is no space for accommodating contract/project staff.

(xiii) Regarding re-start of BPO Condensed Course, it was decided not to re-start or conduct any BPO Condensed Course or Bridge Course in P&O as a provision already exists for lateral entry to BPO Course for Diploma holders.

(C) Approval of Annual Accounts for the year 2014-15

The Annual Accounts of the Council for the financial year 2014-15 consisting of balance sheet, receipt & payment account, income & expenditure account were perused by the members and approved.

(D) Approval of Course Curricula

- (i) Executive Committee approved and retified the decision taken by the Chairperson, RCI for increasing the duration of B.Ed. Spl. Ed. & M.Ed.Spl. Ed. Courses from one year to two years and approved revised Course Curricula for implementation from the academic session 2015–16. The nomenclature of B.Ed. Spl. Ed. would be B.Ed. Spl. Ed. (Disability) and M.Ed. Spl. Ed. would be M.Ed. Spl. Ed. (Disability).
- (II) Post Graduate Certificate Course in Auditory Verbal Therapy (PGCCAVT) Executive Committee considered the course curriculum of Post Graduate Diploms in Auditory Verbal Therapy (PGDAVT) and approved the same for implementation from the ecademic session 2015-16. It was also decided to register the passed out candidates under a separate category.

(E) Registration of candidates with PGCCAVT and PGDAVT

Executive Committee approved the proposal to award 50 CRE points to the candidates who have undergone PGCCAVT. It also approved to consider the candidates with Post Graduate. Diploma in Auditory Verbal Therapy (PGDAVT) eligible for addition of qualification for registration in CRR as Auditory Verbal Therapist (AVT) in addition to their existing categories of registration under any other category. The necessary administrative procedure, if any, may be completed for the purpose.

Executive Committee approved the proposal to withdraw the equivalence of following Post Graduate Diploma in Special Education Programmes or combination of Courses of one year duration from the academic session 2015-16, as given below:

- B.Ed. In General Education and Post Graduate Professional Diploma in Special Education (PGPD-SE)
- 2. DSE[Special Education]/D.Ed. (Special Education) with B.Ed. in General Education
- 3. Senior Diploma in Teaching the Deaf
- 4. Secondary Level Teacher Training Course in Visual Impairment
- PG Diploma Course in Special Education (Mental Retardation)
- PG Diploma in Special Education (Multiple Disabilities: Physical & Neurological)

However, candidates who have completed the above said courses/programmes till academic session 2014-15 are equivalent to B.Ed. Spi. Ed. and will be eligible for admission into M.Ed. Spi. Ed.

(H) Revision of Norms for CRE Programmes

As the revised Continuing Rehabilitation Education (CRE) norms had been implemented only from April, 2015, Executive Committee decided that the proposal for revision of norms should be placed before the next meeting of the Executive Committee after collecting necessary supporting date and with full justification.

(I) Coreposition of Executive Body of NBER

Executive Committee decided that the proposal to form Executive Body of National Board of Examination in Rehabilitation (NBER) should be sent to DEPwD, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment.

(J) Creation of Hindi Posts in RCI

Executive Committee approved the proposal for creation of following posts to handle and promote use of Hindi in its work as per norms prescribed by Rajbhasha Vibhag, Ministry of Home Affairs and the proposal may be sent to DEPwD, M/o SI&E for creation of these posts on priority basis:

- Hindi Translator One PB-2-Rs.9300-34,800, Grade Pay Rs.4600
- Hindi Typist One PB-1—Rs.5200-20,200, Grade Pay Rs.1900

(K) Representation of B.P.O. students of Prosthetics & Orthotics College, Govt. Spine Institute, Ahmedabad to stop Diplome and Certificate Courses in P&O

Following decisions were taken by the Executive Committee:

- RCI to write to all the institutions conducting C.P.O. and D.P.O. Courses to get details about job placement of passed out candidates during the last three years.
- (ii) RO to take a view whether C.P.O. and D.P.O. Courses are required to be continued or not in consultation with experts and bring it to the next meeting of the G.C./E.C. for decision.





- (III) Before finalization of the revised syllabus of 8.P.O. Course, the revised syllabus shall be displayed on RCI website inviting suggestions/comments giving one month time and the suggestions/comments received to be considered by the concerned Expert Committee for appropriate decision.
- (ii) Enhancement of latake Capacity of National/International Seminars/Workshops, etc. Executive Consmittee approved the proposal to fix the intake capacity of National/International Seminars/Workshops, etc. sanctioned/approved by the Council. It also decided that prior permission/approval should be obtained if the number of participants is proposed to be more than the approved intake.
- (M) Scheme for Implementation of Special Component Plan for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in the RCI approved institutions/organizations
 Executive Committee approved the revised Scheme for Implementation of Special Component Plan for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes during the financial year
- 2015-16, subject to aveilability of funds.

 (N) Approval of the Scheme of Financial Assistance for Human Resource Development Programmes in Disability Rehabilitation & Special Education in North-Eastern region Executive Committee approved the Scheme of Financial Assistance for Human Resource Development Programmes in Disability Rehabilitation & Special Education in North-Eastern

region for the academic session 2015-16 to be funded from the North-East component.

70th Meeting of the Executive Committee

70th Meeting of the of Rehabilitation Council of India was held on 09th September, 2015 at RCI, New Delhi under the Chairpersonship of Prof. Sudesh Multhopadhyay, Chairperson, RCI. Following decisions were taken in the meeting:

- Confirmation of the Minutes of the 69th Meeting
 The Minutes of the 69th Meeting of the Executive Committee held on 12.06.2015 were confirmed.
- Follow up Action of the Minutes of the 69th Meeting
 Follow up Action on the Minutes of the 69th Meeting was approved by the members with following observations:
 - (i) Action to implement the Research Scheme approved by the EC in its 68th Meeting may be expedited and all the formalities to publicize the Scheme and issue of advertisement, etc. may be completed at the earliest so as to implement the Scheme during the current financial/year.









- (II) As regards award of Research Study to the agency selected as the lowest bidder (L-1), all the issues related to research design, etc. may be sorted out with the agency before awarding the research study.
- (iii) Executive Committee was informed about the progress of isunching the in-Service Training Programme by the Secretary, DEPWD at Jamia Millia Islamia, New Deihi and Hon'ble Minister for Social Justice & Empowerment at Dr. Shakuntala Misra National Rehabilitation University, Lucknow and preparation of e-training material by the expert committee constituted for the purpose. It was also informed that a grant of Rs. 2.00 crore has been sanctioned during the current financial year and the programme would be launched shortly.
- (iv) The issue of making the candidates with 8.Ed. Spl. Ed. degree eligible for appointment as PGT in Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan and other general schools may be sorted out with NCTE and RVS, etc.
- (v) A report on the feedback received from students for implementation of Scheme of Special Component Plan for SCs and STs for providing financial assistance for purchase of Laptops during the financial year 2014-15 shall be prepared and sent to DEPwD.
- (vi) Examinations of Certificate/Diploma level Courses shall be conducted by National Board of Examination in Rehabilitation (NBER) through National Institutes till the NBER is made fully functional and is in a position to conduct the examinations on its own.
- (vII) As regards issue of plastic identity cards to the registered professionals/personnel, the process of e-tendering may be expedited and the formalities for e-registration of RCI may be done through NIC on priority.
- (viii) Research Study of Registered professionals/personnel who have undergone CRE programmes and how many have been left out may be carried out under the Research Scheme.
- (ix) The matter may be expedited to obtain the building Completion Certificate from CPWD and if required, a meeting may be arranged with DG, CPWD and IS, DEPwD to sort out the issue.
- (x) NIC may be involved in digitization work. Alternatively, arrangements should be made in-house by engagement of staff and acquiring infrastructure for digitization of records/ files.

3. Progress Report

Progress report of the Council for the period April to August, 2015 was perused by the members.

- 4. Filling up of Project Posts on Contract basis
 - Executive Committee approved the proposal to engage the staff on contract basis through Walein-Interview in order to smoothly implement different important and time bound projects.
- Scheme of Financial Assistance for Human Resource Development Programmes in Disability Rehabilitation & Special Education in North-Eastern Region
 - Executive Committee approved the proposal to give financial assistance to one institute,





namely, All Manipur Mentally Handicapped Persons Welfare Organization, Imphal for ongoing D.Ed. Spi. Ed. (MR) Course for the academic session 2015-16.

Executive Committee also approved the proposal for reimbursement of tuition fee to students enrolled in the academic session 2015-15 for on-going RCI approved courses in North Eastern States during the financial year 2015-16, subject to availability of funds

6. Approval of Courses of 6 months duration

Executive Committee did not approve the proposal to introduce 6 month Certificate Course in Orientation Mobility submitted by NIVH, Dehra Dun and 6 month Add-on Certificate Course submitted by Perkins Voice & Vision, Mumbai. However, it was decided that the matter may be placed before the Expert Committee for consideration of the Courses as CRE programmes and allot maximum 50 CRE points as done in the case of PGCCAVT.

7. Presorbing Fee Structure for RCI approved Courses

Executive Committee directed to obtain the details of the expenditure incurred by the approved institutions for conducting RCI approved Courses in disability rehabilitation, viz. B.ASLP, M.ASLP, B.P.O., M.P.O., M.Phil. (Clinical Psychology), M.Phil. (Rehabilitation Psychology), etc., except Special Education courses, fee for which has already been fixed by RCI and place the matter before the Expert Committee to finalize the fee structure of all the Courses approved by RCI. The recommendations of the Expert Committee may be placed before the G.C./E.C. for approval before announcing the fee structure of various Courses.

Amendments in Recruitment Rules for Group "A", "B" and "C" posts in Rehabilitation Council of India

Executive Committee approved the proposal for amendments in Recruitment Rules of all the Group A, B and C posts (38 posts) in Rehabilitation Council of India for onward submission to the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, for approval and notification.

Digitization of records

Executive Committee suggested to consult NIC for digitization of records or alternatively to engage contract staff and acquire infrastructure/equipment for in-house digitization of records. Executive Committee also directed to consult DGS&D & NIC to complete the process of registration of RCI for e-Tendering. It was also decided by the Executive Committee to consult NIC to develop and launch the Academic Monitoring and Analysis System (AMAS) through NIC.

Revised Estimates (RE) 2015-16 (Plan & Non-Plan) and Budget Estimates (BE) 2016-17 (Non-Plan & Plan)

Executive Committee approved the Revised Estimates for 2015-16 (Plan & Non-Plan) and Budget Estimates for 2016-17 (Non-Plan & Plan) for onward submission to DEPwD, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment.









11. Issues related to inspection and Approval of Institutions

(a) Scores for approval cases

Executive Committee approved the following criteria to decide the period of approval based on obtained score to encourage the institutes and to maintain standards in the course curriculum:

(b) Relaxation in scores for approval of on-going Courses

Executive Committee approved the proposal to give 10% relaxation in scores in maximum of three parameters, except. Human Resource, to meet the criteria of approval of overall 75% scores in case of On-going Courses only and for one batch only. In case of proposals for North Eastern region and other justified cases, this limit may further be relaxed by the Chairperson under intimation to next meeting of the Executive Committee.

(c) Re-inspection cases

Executive Committee approved the following criteria for re-inspection:

- Fresh proposals where the scores during the first inspection were more than 50% in all parameters may be considered.
- (ii) Last month for considering the request of re-inspection should be within June of the calendar year as most of the courses are started in the month of July.





- (iii) A penalty fees of Rs.5000 and processing fee of Rs.7500 along with inspection fee applicable for respective course shall be charged.
- (IV) In case of proposals for extension of on-going courses, same criteria, as for new proposals, may be followed.

(d) Surprise inspection cases

Executive Committee approved the procedure being followed by RCI for inspection as per RCI Act.

12. Pay parity of RCI employees with CSS/CSSS

Executive Committee approved to re-approach the DEFwD, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment for implementation of the Ministry of Finance D.M. No.23/2008-E.III (A) dated October 7, 2008.

Permission to Re-start Bachelor of Prosthetics and Orthotics (6PO) Condensed Bridge Course by the Council

Executive Committee decided not to re-start Bachelor of Prosthetics and Orthotics (BPO) Condensed Bridge as provision for lateral entry to Diploma holders. In P&O already exists for admission to BPO regular course.

71st Meeting of the Executive Committee

71st meeting of the Executive Committee of Rehabilitation Council of India was held on 10th March, 2016 at RCI, New Delhi under the Chairmanship of Dr. Vinod Aggarwai, IAS, Secretary, DEPwD & Chairperson, RCI. Following decisions were taken in the meeting:

1. Confirmation of the Minutes of the 70th Meeting

The Minutes of the 70th Meeting of the Executive Committee held on 09.09.2015 were confirmed.

2. Follow up Action of the Minutes of the 70th Meeting

Follow up Action on the Minutes of the 70th Meeting held on 09.09.2015 was approved with following observations/decisions:

- (i) It was informed that only one institute, namely, All Manipur Mentally Handicapped Persons Welfare Organization, Imphal was found eligible and provided financial assistance to run D.Ed. Spi. Ed. (MR) Course, After deliberations, it was decided in principle that in order to attract qualified faculty for special education programmes in North-East region, remuneration for faculty may be enhanced suitably. However, no relaxation should be given in the prescribed qualifications and experience, etc. for faculty. A proposal shall be put up in the next meeting of the Executive Committee.
- (ii) With regard to prescribing fee structure for RCI approved Courses in disability rehabilitation, following decision was taken:









(a) As the role of RCI is not to fix the fees for courses approved by it, views of the State Governments should be obtained on the Issue of prescribing suggestive fee structure for RCI approved courses being run in the States by RCI approved institutions. Letter in this regard should be sent under the signature of Secretary, DEPwD & Chairperson, RCI and further action shall be taken after receiving the feedback from the State Governments. Further RCI shall prepare a draft fee structure for various courses based on the feedback being received from approved institutions. This exercise shall be completed within the next three months and the matter may be placed before the Executive Committee for consideration and approval of policy in this regard.

3. Approval of Diploma in Indian Sign Language Interpretation Course

The revised syllabus of Diploma in Indian Sign Language Interpretation Course was approved for implementation from academic session 2016-17.

4. Ratification of North East Schome

- (i) Executive Committee approved the North East Scheme for providing financial assistance to promote human resource development in the North East and reimbursement of tuition fee for the students of academic session 2015-16 enrolled in RCI approved institutions in North East Region. Chairperson, RCI further directed that the following information from the RCI approved institutes in North East shall be obtained and put up in the next meeting of the Executive Committee:
 - (a) Whether any fee is being charged from the students by the institutes provided financial assistance by RCI to run the Course (s)?
 - (b) Whether tuition fee is being reimbursed to the students by the institutes not provided financial assistance by the Council?
- (ii) It was also decided that RCI should organize programmes in North-East region in the States of Tripura, Sikkim & Assam to encourage voluntary organizations to run RCI approved programmes in North-East to meet the demand of professione's for providing rehabilitation services.
- (iii) It was also decided that RCI shall appoint two Consultants for North-East who shall be stationed at Guwahati and imphal to assist RCI in better implementation of the Schemes for North-East. Expenditure on this shall be met from the North-East budget allocation for RCI.

5. Establishment of Centre for Disability Studies

Executive Committee approved the non-financial proposal for establishment of Centre for Disability Studies at Dr. Shakuntala Misra National Rehabilitation University (DSMNRU), Lucknow as part of MoU signed between RCI and DSMNRU on 19th October, 2015.

6. Engagement of Contractual Staff in Distance Education Cell Project of RCI

Executive Committee approved the proposal for engagement of contractual staff in Distance Education Cell. However, it was decided that the post of Data Entry Operator, Clerk and MTS may be filled through outsourcing.

7. Implementation of "CUEGIS" Schome for RCI employees.

Executive Committee approved the proposal for introduction of CGEGIS Scheme to RCI employees and the same may be referred to DEPWD, M/o SI&E for consideration and approval in accordance with "Rehabilitation Council of India (Conditions of Service of the Member Secretary, officers and other employees) Regulations, notified in 1998.

8. Launch of M.Ed. Spi. Ed. Programme through Open & Distance Learning [ODL] Mode

Proposal to launch the M.Ed. Spl. Ed. Programme through Open & Distance Learning (ODL) Mode was not agreed to by the Executive Committee. It was directed to bring it to the next G.C. meeting for reconsideration of its decision.

 Approval of 3 month Primary Certificate and 5 months Advance Certificate course for Care Givers National Trust

Executive Committee approved the following programmes for Care Givers:

- Primary Certificate Course for Care Givers 3 months following modules of three months:
 - (a) (i) Mental Retardation/Intellectual Disability and Autism Spectrum Disorder
 - (II) Cerebral Palsy and
 - (iii) Multiple Disabilities
 - (b) (i) Multiple Disabilities
 - (ii) Visual Impairment
 - (iii) Locamator Disability
- Advance Certificate Course for Care Givers 6 months on the same module.

Following decisions were also taken with regard to approval of above Courses:

- (ii) Approval of RCI would be required to run the above Courses and the National Trust can be a sponsoring authority for agencies/institutes desirous to run these courses.
- (II) Certification would be given by RCI for these courses without CRR number.
- (iii) These courses should be started within three months.
- (b) Sufficient number of programmes should be started by National Trust by 30th June, 2016.

10. Delegation of Financial Powers

Executive Committee approved the revised schedule of delegation of financial powers for smooth functioning of the Council, a copy of which is placed at Amesure 1.8.

 Enhancement of weight-age points in respect of CRE programmes for revewel of registration and enhancement of validity period of Registration Certificate issued by the Council





Executive Committee took the following decisions:

- 10 CRE points for 01 day CRE programme (06 hours duration) be awarded for candidates in the North-Eastregion only.
- One year relaxation can be given for renewal of Registration Certificate
- 12. Integrated B.A./B.Com/B.Sc./B.Ed. Special Education Programme (4 years)

The issue was discussed by Executive Committee at length and it was decided that a meeting of the Expert Committee may be called to discuss the issue afresh and the matter be placed in the next meeting of the Executive Committee for taking appropriate decision.

13. Consideration of NAT Score for admission to RCI Programmes

Executive Committee did not approve the proposal submitted by the Society for Research & Development Education, Sector-8, Rohini, Delhi to accept the score of National Aptitude Test (NAT) for admission to Certificate/Diploma Courses of RCI.

The Council develops and standardizes training courses to meet the human resource requirement for various categories of Professionals/Personnel. These courses are reviewed, revised and updated from time to time. At present 63 Courses are operational through regular mode in the area of disability rehabilitation and special education and the list is given at Annexure-2.1.

To carry out the purpose of RCI Act, the Council has constituted various Expert Committees under Sub-Section (1) of Section 7 of the RCI Act. The list of the Expert Committees is placed at Annexum-2.2 to 2.12. The objectives of the Expert Committees are as follows:

- To recommend the courses, the duration of the courses, subjects for examinations and standards of the proficiency to be obtained in any Universities or institutions for grant of recognized rehabilitation qualifications.
- To recommend to the Council, the standards of the staff, equipment, accommodation, training and other facilities for study or training of the rehabilitation professionals.
- fil. Any other matter related to the above issues.

The details of the meetings of the Expert/Core Committees conducted during the period along with gist of the discussion and decisions taken are given below:

CORE COMMITTEE MEETING FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF CORE COURSES/PAPERS, CROSS DISABILITY & INCLUSION, ENHANCEMENT OF PROFESSIONAL CAPACITY (EPC) OF B. ED. SPL. ED. AND CORE COURSES/PAPERS AND ELECTIVE COURSES/PAPERS OF M. ED. SPL. ED. HELD ON 15-17 APRIL, 2015 AT RO., NEW DELHI

A meeting of the Core Committee was held on 15-17 April, 2015 at RCI, New Deihi. Following decisions were taken in the meeting:

- Courses of Area-A of B.Ed.Spl.Ed. were presented by the respective members of the Core
 Committee and accordingly contents of the courses were modified by the group of members
 and the same was again presented before the Committee for suggestions/comments, if any,
 and finalization. Members felt that there is a need to merge the contents of Course A-3 and A-5
 which was unanimously agreed by all the members of the Committee.
- 2. Courses of Area-B of B.Ed.Spl.Ed. were presented by the respective members of the Core Committee and accordingly contents of the Courses were modified by the group of members and the same was again presented before the Committee for suggestions/comments, if any, and finalization. Some members also felt that there is a need to have separate optional course/paper under B-12 for Mental Retardation/Intellectual Disability. The Chairperson agreed and requested the members to prepare and submit the contents of the proposed course/paper.
- It was also decided that nomenclature of the B.Ed.Spl.Ed. would be B.Ed.Spl.Ed. (Specialization) instead of B.Ed.Spl.Ed. Name of Specialization in Disability such as (Vi & Inclusive Education) and M.Ed.Spl.Ed. (Specialization).





 Core Courses/Papers, Cross Disability & Inclusion, Enhancement of Professional Capacity (EPC) of B. Ed. Spl. Ed. and Core Courses/Papers and Elective Courses/Papers of M.Ed. Spl.Ed. were developed.

MEETINGS OF CORE COMMITTEES

Core Committee Meetings for the Development of specialized courses / Pepper in hearing impairment, visual impairment, mental retardation / intellectual disability, multiple disabilities and learning disabilities of B.Ed.Spi.Ed. and specialised courses/papers in hearing impairment, visual impairment, mental retardation / intellectual disability and learning disabilities M.Ed. Spi. Ed. were held from 28 April, 2015 - 1st May, 2015 at AYINBH, Mumbai, NIVH, Dehradun, NIMH, Secunderabad, SNDT University, Mumbai and NIEPMD, Chennal respectively.

MEETING OF EXPERT COMMITTEE TO REVIEW BACHELOR IN PROSTHETICS AND ORTHOTICS (B.RO.) COURSE HELD ON ZITH & 29TH JULY, 2015 ATRCI, NEW DELHI

A meeting of the Expert Committee was held on 28-29 July, 2015 at RCI, New Deihl. Following decisions were taken in the meeting:

Revision of B.P.O. syllabus

- (a) Members of Expert Committee decided to have the syllabus in annual and semester system. Members had apprehension about OBCS system as it is still not established.
- (b) Internship of sponsored candidates/candidates enrolled through lateral entry (In-service) may be done at the perent organization.
- (c) 10,000 sq. ft. (approx. 3048 sq. mts.) built up area will be required for B.P.O. programme in view of Workshop requirement for prosthetics and orthotics and classrooms. However, the Council prescribes 1000 sq. mts. for each programme (500sq. mts. built up area and 500sq. mts. open area).
- (d) Maximum duration to complete the course/programme may be increased from 6 years to 8 years as University examinations get delayed and normally programme gets over in 5 X years. However, the Council has prescribed 6 years as maximum duration to complete the course/programme.

- Fine tuning of Mesters in Prosthetics & Orthotics (M.P.O.) curriculum in accordance with Bachelors in Prosthetics & Orthotics (B.P.D.).





 M.P.O. curriculum was revised in 2014. However, it was not implemented from 2014-15 as B.P.O. curriculum was also due for revision. It was decided that M.P.O. programme should be implemented along with B.P.O. curriculum. As per the revised curriculum of M.P.O., 2014, seven papers/ courses were recommended for each year. However, members recommended five papers in each year.

- Minimum of 2 faculty members in core areas will be required for giving recognition for the first year.
- Before the commencement of second academic year, one more faculty member must be appointed.





- In case of Professor not being available, 2 Readers are to be appointed to accommodate teaching, research guidance and administrative work.
- All reservations in admission will apply as per Govt. rules for aided and Govt. Institutions.
 The infrastructure will have to be enhanced as per the seats getting increased under reservation policy.

Feedback on C.P.O. and D.P.O. programmas

Feedback received from four institutions was presented before the Committee. Further, the Committee recommended that continuation or discontinuation of C.P.O. and D.P.O. Courses may be decided keeping the following points into consideration:

- (a) National initiative of Allied Health Sciences (NIAHS) If allied health services has been mapped, it is necessary to find where C.P.O., D.P.O., B.P.O. & M.P.O. are fixed.
- (b) National Skill Development Council.
- (c) Whether RCI should indulge in giving certificates.

CORE COMMITTEE MEETING TO DEVELOP CURRICULUM FRAMEWORK FOR INTEGRATED B.A./ B.COM./B.SC. B.ED. SPL. ED.

A meeting of the Core Committee was held under the Chairmanship of Shri Lov Verma, Secretary, DEPwD & Chairperson, RCI on 12.12.2015 at AVINIHH, Mumbai to consider:

- (A) Development of Curriculum Framework for Integrated B.A./B.Com./B.Sc. B.Ed. Special Education Programme (4 years); and
- (B) Development of Curriculum Framework for B.Ed., M.Ed. Special Education Integrated Degree Programme (3 years).

Following decisions were taken:

- (a) If the duration of existing Graduation (B.Com./B.A./6.Sc.) is for three years and existing B.Ed. Spl. Ed. is for two years, then it needs lot of deliberation to narrow down the duration of the said programme which cannot be less than 10 semester (5 years). Recently, duration of the B.Ed. Spl. Ed. has been enhanced from one to two years, hence the duration of the programme has to be minimum five years. Reducing the special education component to one year is like going back from the track.
- (b) integrated B.Ed.Spi. Ed. needs to be in tune with existing B.Ed. Spi. Ed. in terms of exposure and expertise into various types of disabilities. B.Ed. non-integrated current B.Ed. Spi. Ed. has cross disability exposure and single disability expertise. Same pottern needs to be followed for the integrated programme. Registration in C.R.R. needs to be in one disability for integrated programme.
- (c) In spelling out various eligibility criterion for applying for recognition, RCI must clearly mention: only those Colleges/Departments can apply for recognition which have permanent affiliation in that particular faculty (B.Com./B.A./B.Sc. and R.Ed. Spl. Ed.). This is to ensure adequate infrastructure and manpower required for the programme with a lot of diverse component from various faculties.





- (d) As mentioned in general points, B.Ed. Integrated needs careful system analysis in terms of surveying the market needs in the light of current options in teacher education (special education)—from Diploma to Ph. D. and from regular to distant mode.
- (e) It has been noted that there has been low enrolment in the B.Ed. Spl. Ed. Courses post recent revisions of two years B.Ed. Hence launching one more option needs a careful and stronger justification which is not currently ready.

Unless the above mentioned points are taken care, this programme of integrated B.Ed. cannot be either considered or launched.

The ides of starting an integrated B.Ed. and M.Ed. programme is very good and RCI must be congratulated for this initiative. The group consisting of Dr. Jayanati Narayan, Dr. Rubina Lai, Dr. Varsha Gathoo, Dr. Himangshu Das and Dr. S.R. Mittal considered the proposal. During discussion the following concerns emerged:

- Comprehensive need assessment for such a programme should be done.
- Parity in P.G. Degree (with existing two year M.Ed. programme) needs to be ensured for
 recruitment of foculty. The 2 year M.Ed. programme was initiated in 2015 as per UGC and
 NCTE guidelines with an intention to bring about parity between general and special
 education teacher educators in terms of job opportunities, designation and pay scales.
 When this exercise has just begun, it is to be considered whether it is appropriate to start a
 Course that does not fulfill the mandate provided by UGC and NCTE.
- 3. The B.Ed. and M.Ed. Courses were expanded to 2 year duration each by the collective wisdom of experts in the field from UGC, NCTE and the RCI and the programmes are being implemented from current academic year. Now with the proposed B.Ed. and M.Ed. Integrated Course, the duration for M.Ed. programme will be reduced by one year. This defeats the purpose of expanding the programme by 2 years.
- How many universities or institutes would be able to run it and what is the infrastructure needed.

The Council should be able to find answer to these questions before considering the launch of integrated B.Ed. and M.Ed. programme. The group suggested that the Council should evaluate the implementation and outcome of the newly started 2 year B.Ed. and M.Ed. programmes. Based on the derived information only, the proposal for integrated B.Ed. and M.Ed. programme should be mooted.

MEETING OF EXPERTS TO CONSIDER THE ISSUE OF EQUIVALENCY OF B.ED. SPL. ED. AND M.ED. SPL. ED. WITH B.ED. (GENERAL) AND M.ED. (GENERAL)

A Meeting was held under the Chairmanship of Shri Lov Verma, Secretary, DEPWD and Chairperson, RCI on 19.01.2016 to discuss the issue of equivalency of 8.Ed. (Spl. Edu.) and M.Ed. (Spl. Edu.) with B.Ed. (General) and M.Ed. (General) and non inclusion of faculty from Special Education in NCTE (Recognition Norms and Procedure) Regulation, 2014. It was decided that a Committee consisting of the following representatives may be constituted to resolve the issue of equivalence as it cannot be decided by NCTE or RCI on its own:

- Representative of UGC
- Representative of RCI





Representative of NCTE

4. Representative of NCERT

RCI will convene the meeting of the above Committee and the report of the same shall be submitted within three months.

As regards the non inclusion of faculty from Special Education in NCTE (Recognition Norms and Procedure) Regulation, 2014, Chairperson, NCTE informed that a notification would be issued by NCTE including the following faculty in the said Regulation of NCTE out of 15 prescribed faculties:

(1) One faculty with M.Ed.Sol.Ed. or M.Ed. General with B.Ed.Spl.Ed.

MEETING OF THE EXPERT COMMITTEE ON DEVELOPMENT OF TRAINING PROGRAMMES FOR AUDIOLOGISTS & SPEECH PATHOLOGISTS, HEARING AID AND EAR MOULD TECHNICIANS

A meeting of the Expert Committee for Development of Training Programmes for the Professionals/ Personnel, namely, Audiologists & Speech Pathologists, Hearing Aid and Earmould Technicians was held on 22-23 January, 2016 under Chairmanship of Prof. M. Jayaram at NIMHANS, Bangalore.

Following decisions were taken in the meeting:

(a) Consideration and approval of revised B.ASLP Syllabus

Draft Syllabus of B.ASLP was presented before the Committee. As per the suggestions of the members, Course on Research Methodology and Statistics has been incorporated in place of B 1.6. Practicals - Allied Sciences.

(b) Registration of candidates with M.Sc. (Audiology) or M.Sc. (Speech Language Pathology)

The issue regarding registration of candidates with M.Sc. (Audiology) or M.Sc. (Speech Language Pathology) was deliberated in detail. It has been recommended that base registration of candidates should be retained, i.e., Audiologists and Speech Therapists and additional qualification acquired by a candidate should be mentioned in the registration certificate. It was recommended that category of Audiologist and Speech Therapists should be renamed as Audiologist and Speech Language Pathologist, Further, it was also recommended that Speech Fathologist should be renamed as Speech & Hearing Assistant or Speech & Hearing Technician.

(c) Revision of M.ASLP Syllabus through already constituted Commistee

it was suggested that a separate meeting may be convened to deliberate on revision of the MASLP Syllabus.

(d) Integrated B. ASLP-M. ASLP Programme

The Committee suggested that integrated M.Sc. (Audiology) and Integrated M.Sc. (Speech Language Pathology) may be developed. The duration of programme may be of 5 years.

CORE COMMITTEE MEETING TO DEVELOP CARE GIVING COURSE

A meeting of the Core Committee to develop Care Giving Course (Primary/Basic & Advance/ Intermediate) for the National Trust was held under the Chairmanship of Dr. S.Y. Kothari, Chairperson, Expert Committee on 8th & 9th March, 2016 at RCI, New Delhi.





Following programmes were developed by the Committee:

- (a) Care Giving Course Primary (Mental Retardation, Autism Spectrum Disorder, Cerebral Palsy and Multiple Disabilities) - 3 months duration.
- (b) Care Giving Course Primary (Visual Impairment, Locomotor Disability & Multiple Disabilities) - 3 months duration.
- (c) Care Giving Course Advanced (Mental Reterdation, Autism Spectrum Disorder, Cerebral Palsy and Multiple Disabilities)-6 month duration.
- (d) Care Giving Course Advanced (Visual Impairment, Locomotor Disability & Multiple Disabilities) - 6 month duration.

Further, the Committee has also recommended following to be considered:

- Entry qualification for Care Giving Advanced Course should be 10th standard pass.
- (ii) The syllabi may be reviewed after implementation for two years after obtaining feedback from training centres, faculty and trainees.
- (iii) Study learning materials/references for the module may be developed in the form of booklet (50 pages/100 pages including pictures/diagrams) by the National Trust.

MEETING OF THE EXPERT COMMITTEE FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF TRAINING PROGRAMMES FOR THE CATEGORIES OF PROFESSIONALS/PERSONNEL, NAMELY, CLINICAL PSYCHOLOGISTS AND REHABILITATION PSYCHOLOGISTS

Ameeting of the Expert Committee for the development of training programmes for the categories of professionals/personnel, namely, Clinical Psychologists and Rehabilitation Psychologists was held under the Chairmanship of Prof. Amool Ranjan Singh, Chairperson, Expert Committee on 15th & 16th March, 2016 at RCI, New Delhi to consider the following agenda points:-

- (a) Revision of M. Phil. (Clinical Psychology) syllabus.
- (b) Revision of M. Phil. (Rehabilitation Psychology) syllabus.
- (c) Consideration of syllabus of M.Phil. Psychoenalytic Psychotherapy submitted by Ambedian University, Delhi

Following decisions were taken:

(a) Revision of M. Phil. Clinical Psychology

Existing syllabors of M.Phil. Clinical Psychology was presented before the Committee. As per the suggestions of the Committee, following modifications/changes/recommendations have been made:

- Post of Lecturer renamed as Assistant Professor.
- Qualification of faculty mentioned in the syllabus shall continue to be the same.
- Internal Assessment (IA) mentioned in the syllabus is comprehensive and does not require any change. The institute/Organization offering the programme should conduct the IA as per guidelines mentioned in the syllabus.
- Paper II of Part I has been shifted to Part III.e., 2nd year

- 5. Paper III of Part II has been shifted to Part I i.e., 1st year
- Relaxation of marks mentioned in respect of ORC has been removed as there is no such provision of relaxation.
- Number of sents prescribed in the syllabus shall be same as mentioned in the syllabus
 i.e., as per the faculty student ratio.
- Provision for introduction of supplementary examination in only falled paper/subject has not been considered by the Committee.
- The revised syllabus should be implemented from the academic session 2017-18.
- Dr. K B Rumar has agreed to write the preface of M. Phil. Clinical Psychology and M. Phil. Rehabilitation Psychology programmes.

(b) Revision of M. Phil. Rehabilitation Psychology

Existing syllabus of M. Phil. Rehab litation Psychology was presented before the Committee. As per





the suggestions of the Committee, the following modifications/changes have been made in the syllabus including guidelines:

- 1. Post of Lecturer renamed as Assistant Professor.
- 2. Qualification of faculty mentioned in the syllabus shall continue to be the same.
- Internal Assessment (IA) mentioned in the syllabus is comprehensive and does not require any change. The institute/Organization offering the programme should conduct IA as per guidelines mentioned in the syllabus.
- Relaxation of marks mentioned in respect of OBC has been removed as there is no such provision of relaxation.
- 5. Qualification of faculty shall be same as M. Phil. Clinical Psychology
- The revised syllabus should be implemented from the academic session 2017-18.

(c) Consideration of syliabus of M. Phil. Psychoenalytic Psychotherapy

Syllabus of M. Phil. Psychoanalytic Psychotherapy was presented by Dr. Honey Oberol Vahall, Ambedkar University, Delhi before the Committee as an invited member. After detailed discussion, the Committee did not recommend the programme for consideration of the Council.

(d) Any other Item

- Scope of Practice should be developed for Clinical Psychologist and Rehabilitation Psychologist.
- (ii) Assessment of training programme should only be done by the teaching faculty of Clinical Psychology.
- (III) Members were of the view that faculty advancement programme may be considered for faculties of institutions offering RCI approved programmes in Clinical Psychology so that reflance on some institutions for purpose of training/exposure may be gradually reduced.
- (iv) RCI to write to Pay Commission to Include Clinical Psychologists in their list for pay flustion and related matters.

SPECIAL COMPONENT PLAN FOR NORTH EAST AREA

Govt. of India has given special focus to development of services in North East region and has made allocations under Special Component Plan for North East Area for the financial year 2015-16. The existing training institutions are inadequate to serve the persons with disabilities and bring them in the mainstream development of society. The trained professionals/personnel in the field of Special Education and Disability Rehabilitation for catering the needs of children with disabilities are too less in North-Eastern Region (NER). It is also pertinent to mention that the presence of GOs and NGOs in North East is minimal as compared to other States. Following activities were organized in North East region to utilize the funds allocated under SCP:

(I) Capacity Building of Professionals/Personnel

- Seminar on Capacity Building of Rehabilitation Professionals for Persons with Disabilities in North-Eastern States organized on 25-26 February, 2016 at Shillong.
- (b) Seminar on Capacity Building of Rehabilitation Professionals for Persons with Disabilities in North-Eastern States organized on 3-4 March, 2016 at Imphal.





(II) Rnancial Assistance for Human Resource Development

Financial Assistance for Human Resource Development Programmes in Disability Rehabilitation & Special Education in North-Eastern Region was given to All Manipur Mentally Handicapped Person's Welfare Organisation, Kelshamthong, Imphai for running D.Ed.Spl.Edu.(MR) programme.

(III) Financial Assistance to Students for Purchase of Laptops

National Interactive Web Portal "Punarbahva" On Disability

Rehabilitation Council of India in collaboration with Media Lab Asia is implementing an interactive and informative web portal "Punerbhava" (www.punerbhava.in) on disability and rehabilitation since 2007. The purpose of the webportal is to fill the gap of availability of information and its dissemination for persons with disabilities. The webportal has opened new horizons for persons with disabilities. This is an innovative initiative where two government organizations have joined hands for reaching the unreached and providing them opportunities to fully participate in social life and become productive members of the society. Punerbhava is an attempt to provide a gateway to information for persons with disabilities and all others concerned with this sector.







CHAPTER-3

INSPECTION & APPROVAL OF INSTITUTIONS

As per the provision of Section 11(2) of RCI Act of 1992 and Section 7(3)(h) of its regulations, online proposals from the prospective government organizations (GOs)/non-governmental organizations (NGOs) to conduct RCI approved training courses are invited by RCI every year generally in the month of June. Accordingly, inspections are carried out by a team of experts for grant of permission to run the courses on fulfillment of prescribed norms and RCI recommends to Government for recognition to run training courses in the field of special education and disability rehabilitation.

During the year, teams of visiting experts were deputed by the Council to conduct inspection of 484 training programmes (253 extension of approval and 231 new proposals). The total number of approved/recognized institutions increased from 527 to 555 conducting 1109 batches of training programmes (Certificate to M.Phil. level) as on March 31, 2016. List of recognized institutions is placed at Approxime 2.1.








Year-wise Growth of RCI Recognized Institutions

CHAPTER - 4

NATIONAL BOARD OF EXAMINATION IN REHABILITATION (NBER)

The National Board of Examination in Rehabilitation (NBER) has been set up as a Society registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860 in 2006. NBER is an adjunct body of the Rehabilitation Council of India established for conducting examinations of Certificate/Diploma level Courses approved by RCI. In exercise of the powers conferred by Sub-Section (k) of Section 29 of the Rehabilitation Council of India Act, 1992 (34 of 1992), Regulations for Conduct of Examinations were notified by the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment on June 8, 2014. Governing Body of NBER was also constituted vide order No.7-19(1)/Exam. Main (NBER)/2014/RCI/8608-28 dated 9th January, 2015. A copy of the members of Governing Body of the NBER is placed at Annexure-4.1.

During the year, various circulars with regard to admission criteria, adherence of admission policies for the reserved candidates as per State Govt. norms, re-examination of unsuccessful students of the academic sessions 2010-11 and 2011-12 examined by National Centre for Disability Studies (NCDS), IGNOU and non-conduct of All India Aptitude Test (AIAT) for admission to various Diplome and Certificate level Courses were issued for information to all concerned. Policy decision has also been taken to restrict the number of years for completion of Diploma and Certificate level Courses.

Development of various Formats in respect of Mark Sheets, Diploma Certificates by MBER

in order to maintain uniformity and its implementation by the respective examining bodies, the Council has developed verious formats for Mark Sheets and Diplome Certificates to be issued to the candidates after successful completion of the course. In addition to these, other prescribed formats, namely, application form for admission to Diploma/Certificate level Course(s), award list for external/internal marks, etc. have also been developed by the Council and sent to all examining bodies for their comments and suggestions.





Fee Sharing between NBER and respective National Institutes

During the meeting of Directors of all the National Institutes held under the Chairmanship of Shri Lov Verma, Secretary, DEPwD & Chairperson, RCI on 12th December, 2015 at All Yavar Jung National Institute for the Hearing Handicapped (AYINIHH) Mumbai, it has been decided that Incidental charges paid by the respective training institutions will be shared between the examining bodies and NBER on 50:50 basis.

MEETING OF DIRECTORS OF NATIONAL INSTITUTES CONDUCTING EXAMINATIONS FOR RCI APPROVED CERTIFICATE AND DIPLOMA LEVEL PROGRAMMES

A meeting was held under the Chairmanship of Shri Lov Verma, Secretary, DEPwD & Chairperson, RCI on 12th December, 2015 at ASINIHH, Mumbailin which following decisions were taken:

 The examinations of Certificate/Diploma level Courses being conducted by National Institutes shall be conducted under the banner of National Board of Examinations in Rehabilitation (NBER) as notification regarding NBER has already been issued on June 8, 2014. It has also been emphasized that all the documents related to examinations should be uniform across all the examining bodies.





- Incidental charges will be shared between examining body and NBER on 50-50 basis.
- All National Institutes will submit guidelines/documents being used by them for the purpose of conduct of examination so that the uniform formst/documentstion may be developed.
- Existing Scheme of Examinations shall have to be revised to accommodate provisions for recommendations for revaluation answer scripts and other issues which have not been mentioned in the Scheme.
- The Director, NIEPMD suggested that holograms and barcode may be used on the Diploma Certificates for the security purpose which was agreed by all the members.
- Members were also requested to share the honorarium being given for the different work
 related to the examination so that uniform rates may be implemented across all the
 examining bodies.
- 7. It was agreed that heading of NBER will be used on Marksheets and Diploma Certificates issued by the examining bodies. Calendar of activities of examination will be prepared by each examining body. It was also decided that "Guidelines for conducting written examination for Persons with Disabilities" issued by DEPWO, M/o Social Justice & Empowerment dated 26.2.2013 will be followed for the purpose of conduct of examination.





CHAPTER - 5

CENTRAL REHABILITATION REGISTER

In accordance with Section 23 of the RCI Act, a Central Rehabilitation Register (CRR) is being maintained for registering the Professionals/Personnel having RCI approved qualifications in disability sector.

During the year, registration was granted to 10,167 Professionals/Personnel out of which number of registered Professionals is 6,171 and 3,996 is in Personnel category. Accordingly, 48,427 Professionals and 64,381 Personnel rabing the cumulative total to 1,12,808 have been registered in the Central Rehabilitation Register as on 31st March, 2016. Details of the registration done during the year are given below.








CUMULATIVE STATUS OF PROFESSIONALS & PERSONNEL IN CRR (AS ON 31ST MARCH, 2016)

Assessment & Accreditation Committee (AAC) Meeting

Assessment & Accreditation Committee (AAC) meeting comprising of eminent experts from various fields of disability that decide the equivalence of foreign qualifications at par with RCI approved qualifications was held on 31st March, 2016 at Conference Room, DEPwD under the Chairpersonship of Dr. Vinod Aggarwal, to consider the applications received from candidates having foreign qualifications. Seven applications with foreign qualifications were placed before the AAC to decide their equivalence to RCI approved qualifications. Applicants were also given a chance to present their credentials and relevant transcripts in respect of their foreign degree/diploma before the Committee. However, out of 07, only 03 candidates appeared before the Committee. Based on their qualifications and equivalency to the RCI approved courses, four applicants were recommended for registration with the Council. Accordingly, registration certificates were issued to four applicants.

Research Study for Registered Rehabilitation Professionals/Personnel

A Research Study to know the present status of over one lakh registered rehabilitation professionals/personnel about their status of employability and career prospects in disability sector has been awarded to Jal Nareln Vyas University, Jodhpur as approved by the Executive Committee of RCI. Progress of the research study is being monitored regularly and the report is likely to be received in the next financial year.





CHAPTER-6

PROGRAMME & OTHER ACTIVITIES

RCI is responsible for updating and upgrading the knowledge and skills of professionals/ personnel working in different areas of disability. Objectives of Continuing Rehabilitation Education (CRE) programmes are as given below:

- To upgrade the knowledge & skills of In-service & practicing Rehabilitation Professionals & Personnel already registered with the RCI under Section 19 of RCI Act of 1992.
- To update professional knowledge of master trainers working in the field of rehabilitation & special education.

Norres and Guidelines to Conduct CRE Programmes

Following norms and guidelines have been prescribed for approval/sanction of Continuing Rehabilitation Education (CRE) programmes:

- (i) Institute must have 2 years of experience in offering RCI approved course to be eligible for conducting a CRE programme. This condition can be relaxed in the case of J&K and. North East where CRE programmes can be organized with the recommendation of National Institutes and Zona i Coordination Committees of RCI.
- (ii) CRE points are awarded for 1 day/2 days/3 days/4 days/5 days programmes with Shours of actual training excluding lunch break.
- (III) The candidate may choose any topic of interest from the approved list of topics irrespective of his/her professional area of disability. However, the institutions should be given the option to conduct CREs on the topics which are not included in the list of approved topics if they meet the needs of professionals and persons with disabilities. The institutions are required to submit a detailed proposal covering the following items:
 - (a) Background (highlighting the need of the programme)
 - (b) Aim
 - (c) Detailed content of the programme with name (s) of the resource person (s)
 - (d) Methodology
 - (e) Desired outcome
- (iv) For according CRE status to various Seminars/Conferences/Workshops and other programmes, following information/documents have to be supplied at least two months before the scheduled dates:





- (a) Background and theme
- (b) Alm
- (c) Detailed content of the programme
- (d) List of resource persons content-wise
- (e) Expected outcome of the programme.
- (v) All CRE programmes will be approved on first come first served basis and financial assistance for conducting CRE programme will be given only once in two financial years. However, there will not be any limit to the number of CREs to be conducted by an institution without financial support, subject to meeting the RCI norms.

CHAPTER - 7 OUTREACH DIVISION

DISTANCE EDUCATION CELL

The Council is mandated to provide quality education to professionals/personnel in the field of disability rehabilitation and special education. Keeping in view the demand to offer Courses through distance mode, RCI set up a Distance Education Cell in the year 2001. First Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed between RCI & Madhya Pradesh Bhoj Open University (MPBOU), Bhopai to conduct B.Ed. — SEDE Courses through distance mode and MoUs have been signed with 12 Universities to offer courses through distance mode. Activities undertaken by Distance Education Cell are given below:

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU)

At present, the Council has signed MoU with 12 Universities which include 10 State Open Universities, 01 State University and 01 Central University for conducting Special Education Courses through distance mode from Certificate to Degree level within their jurisdiction. During the period under report, the Council signed an MoU with one more State University to conduct 8.Ed. Special Education and other Courses through distance mode.

ZONAL COORDINATION COMMITTEES (ZCCs)

The Council has established seven Zonal Coordination Committees in collaboration with nongovernmental organizations covering all States/UTs of the country. These Zonal Coordination Committees function as advisory in nature and assist the Council in coordinating and strengthening the training programmes under their zone by inviting professionals/personnel and NGOs in the Workshops/Sensitization Programmes, etc. ZCCs also assist in monitoring of RCI approved training institutions apart from conducting short-term programmes for grass root level functionaries, executives and legislatives, ZCCs are provided financial assistance to undertake its activities. During the year, an amount of Rs.24,50,000 at the rate of Rs.3,50,000 each was sanctioned and released to seven Zonal Coordination Committees to organize the zonal activities within their zones as per the Action Plan approved by the Council. Inaddition, an additional grant of Rs.1,00,000 and Rs.50,000/was sanctioned to ZCC (Eastern Zone) and ZCC (Northern Zone) respectively during the financial year 2015-16 to organize the Regional Conference on SWOT Analysis.

CENTRAL SECTOR PLAN SCHEME OF "IN-SERVICE TRAINING AND SENSITIZATION OF KEY FUNCTIONARIES OF CENTRAL AND STATE GOVERNMENTS, LOCAL BODIES AND OTHER SERVICE PROVIDERS"

The 12th Five Year Plan of Govt, of India has recognized inadequate awareness and sensitivity amongst various stakeholders as a major challenge. It was felt that there are urgent need for inservice training amongst the various stakeholders to create awareness about the rights and entitlements of persons with disabilities (PwDs), provisions in various schemes, developmental programmes, ways and means to access their specific entitlements and those that they are entitled to as equal citizens. Therefore, in order to realize the above said objectives, the Govt, of India has made a provision for training and sensitization of key functionaries of Central /State Govt, under the 12th Five Year Plan.

Development of the Scheme

A Scheme for In-service Training & Sensitization Programme was required to be developed for implementation of the objectives as recognized by the Government of India. Therefore, the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (DEPwD) had developed a new Central Sector Plan Scheme Le. "In-Service Training and Sensitization Key Functionaries of Central and State Governments, Local Bodies and Other Service Providers" w.e.f. 29th December, 2014. This Scheme was implemented for the remaining part of 12th Pive Year Plan for the financial year 2015-16 & 2015-17.

Objectives of the Scheme

The Scheme was launched with the following objectives:

- (ii) To train and sensitize the key functionaries of the Central/State Govt. Local Bodies and other zervice providers on a regular basis on disability related matters through State/District/Block level Workshops. The Workshops will aim to raise the awareness among employees and peer groups about capabilities of persons with disabilities and how we can work together to create an inclusive environment, etc. at work piace. To ensure enlightened, efficient and committed key functionaries to further the cause of empowerment of PwOs.
- (ii) To create awareness about the disability related legislations, development programmes, achemes and programmes for the benefits of PwDs, rehabilitation and referral services amongst the various stakeholders, namely, in-service officials of Central and State Governments, local bodies and other service providers.
- (iii) To provide in-service training on some important skills like oralism, sign language, Braille, Alternative Communication, etc. To create awareness and sensitize towards prevention, early identification, intervention, rehabilitation and mainstreaming of persons with disabilities.
- (iv) To obtain feedback about the quality of delivery of the Schemes/Programmes of Govt. The trefning programmes are meant to sensitize the officers to new and important issues facing the disability sector in the changing and economic scenario. The prime objective of the Scheme is to focus on the demand-driven training of key functionaries dealing with





disability sector which will be conducted in close coordination with the Administrative Training Institutes, as far as possible.

Fund Sanctioning Authority (FSA)

A Fund Sanctioning Authority (FSA) was constituted to take major decisions with regard to the work related to the Central Sector Scheme launched by DEPwO. This Committee comprised of the following members:

- (I) Secretary, Department of Empowerment of PwDs
- (iii) Joint Secretary, Department of Empowerment of PwDs
- (EI) Joint Secretary B. Financial Advisor, Department of Empowerment of PwDs
- (iv) Chairperson, Rehabilitation Council of India
- (v) Director (Concerned), Department of Empowerment of PwDs, Member Secretary

Meetings of the Fund Sanctioning Authority

A number of meetings of the FSA were organized during the year:

- (f) To discuss the modalities of the Scheme to be developed by the Council under the in-service Training & Sensitization Programme.
- (II) To prepare the guidelines for implementation of the said Scheme.
- (iii) To finalize the sanction of grants-in-aid to the Council by the DEPwD and further to the implementing agencies by the Council. The funds were released by the Council to the implementing agencies as approved by the Fund Sanctioning Authority.
- (iv) To discuss numerous issues relating to the implementation of the Scheme, viz. development of Unique Identification Number, development of certificate of participation, distribution of training module, translation of training module in regional languages, monitoring of the training programmes, submission of the report and analysis of the feedback forms. These issues were discussed during different meetings of the FSA and after an in-depth deliberation and discussion of the members of the FSA, various decisions were made. The Council was given the responsibility to undertake the action accordingly.
- (v) To finalize the structure as well as contents of e-training module, a meeting of the Expert Committee was organized by the Council. The experts from the different disability areas including Directors/Representatives of National Institutes attended the meeting, thereby developing an "e-Training Module" for in-service Training & Sensitization Programme to make the training programmes more effective, meaningful and useful for the trainees.

Council being the Nodal Agency for the said Scheme has undertaken various actions on all the issues as and when required, thereby, accomplishing the objectives of the Scheme successfully during the financial year 2015-16.

Guidelines for Implementation of Central Sector Plan Scheme

The guidelines for smooth implementation of the above said Scheme were framed by the Council





that provided with an in-depth view of Scheme along with the detailed objectives, scope of the Scheme, summary statement of target groups, prescribed budget heads with the limit of expenditure and all the requisite proforma as required for submission of proposal, feedback/evaluation form, proforma for programme report submission, etc.

As per the guidelines, the trainees were categorised under the various Target Groups as under:

- Key functionaries of certain Central Ministries/ Department, State Govt., Local Bodies (Panchayats and Municipalities) and other Service Providers connected with the disability Sector.
- (II) Medical and Para-Medical Practitioners.
- (III) Teachers and Principals.

Development of Proforma for Submission of Proposals

Proforms for submission of proposals under the Scheme was developed by the Council that provided with the details of the institute along with a brief description of the training programme to be conducted, viz., date & venue of the training programme, target group, number of participants, details of estimated expenditure, bank details of the institute etc. All the eligible institutes/organizations desirous of undertaking this training programme would submit their online proposal to RCI in the prescribed format.

Training Module

As the Nodel Agency of the Scheme, RCI was entrusted with the responsibility to develop the training module by DEPwD. The Council in this regard, organized a meeting of the Expert Committee to finalize the structure as well as contents of the training module. The experts from the different disability areas including Directors/Representatives of National institutes attended the meeting. Therefore, Council with the help of the members of the Expert Committee had developed.







a "Training Module" for in-service Training & Sensitization Programme to make the training programmes more effective, meaningful and useful for the trainees. The training module developed by the Council and was further distributed to all the implementing agencies and other government institutes. A copy of the training module in English and Tamil languages had already been uploaded on Council's website for the reference.

The training module included contents on the following topics:

- (a) Prevention, early identification, early intervention, rehabilitation and mainstreaming
- (b) Awareness on various legal provisions in the field of disability
- (c) Disability specific and other development schemes that benefit PwDs
- (d) Rehabilitation and referral services for various disabilities
- (e) Advocacy programme on various disability aspects
- (f) General disability issues such as human rights, gender issues, etc.
- (g) Orientation training on Braille and Sign Language for the service special educators and others.

Schedule of the Training Programme

The schedule for conducting the training programme was prepared based upon the target groups as categorised in the table mentioned above. Accordingly, 02 days schedule was prepared for the Target Group-I (State Level) & TG-II (District level) and 03 days schedule for Target Group-II, III & IV (District/Block level). This schedule provided the details of the topics to be covered under the training programme along with the methodology such as lectures, group discussions, presentations, solf learning materials, etc. for imparting training.

Financial Assistance

The budgetary provision for the scheme was finalized as per the inquirement of each of the 05 target groups under the prescribed budget heads with upper limit of expenditure. A detailed description of the budget allocated under each group was therefore developed by the Council and was further approved by the Fund Senctioning Authority (FSA).

Based on the above said approved budget, under the guidelines for implementation of the Scheme, the implementing agencies approved to conduct in-service training programme for 02 days duration under State level, i.e., for Target Group-I was given a grant of Rs.1,13,300 and similarly, an amount of Rs.2,35,675 was granted for 03 days duration programme under Obstrict/Blockleveli.e. for the Target Groups-II, III, IV and V.

Implementation of the Scheme

As DEPwD had assigned the responsibility of Nodal Agency to Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI) to play a plvotal role in implementation and overall execution of the said Scheme at national level, the Council undertook a step-by-step approach for smooth implementation of the Scheme.

Unique Identification Number (UID) & Certificate of Participation

Based on the decision of the FSA, Council developed a "Unique identification Number", i.e., Agency UID No. that had been provided to each implementing agency approved for conducting the inservice Training Programme.





FSA had also advised to provide a "Certificate of Participation" to all the participants by the implementing agencies on successful completion of the training programme. Therefore, Council developed a certificate of participation to be provided to each participant on completion of the training programme and uploaded on Council's website.

Release of Advertisement

Council had invited proposals from Govt. Institutes/Office of the District Magistrate, Nis/CRCs, etc., University Departments and RCI approved Training Institutes to Implement the above said Scheme across the country. In response to the advertisement, a total of 129 proposals were received from 22 States from different organizations. Out of 129, 56 proposals were received from DM office/Govt. Institutions/Nis/CRCs/Universities and remaining 73 proposals were received from NGOs. A total number of 1522 batches of the training programme were proposed to be conducted during the financial year 2015-16 with a proposed budget of Rs. 33,20,04,972.

Screening of Proposals

As the number of proposals, batches and their request for fund have been found very high in comparison to the allocation of funds by DEPWD for the said programme, all proposals received under the Scheme were considered by the Screening Committee under the Chairmanship of Member Secretary, RCI. The following parameters were adopted by the Council to scrutinize the proposals.

- Proposals received within the due date shall be considered for screening.
- (ii) Proposals received have been distributed under 05 categories.
- (iii) In the 1st phase proposals received from above said categories only may be considered for release of Grants-In-aid subject to the availability of funds.
- Optimization of geographical coverage up to the extent possible in order to maintain regional balances.

Sanction of Proposals

Initially, 35 proposals received within the stipulated date were examined and scrutinized by the Screening Committee of RCI as envisaged in the Scheme. Further, these 35 proposals were put up for consideration of the Fund Senctioning Authority (FSA) in its meeting for senction of grant-inaid, subject to availability of funds.

Release of Grant-In-Ald

Based on the recommendations of the FSA, DEPwD, M/o SI&E had sanctioned and released an amount of Rs.95,00,000 towards recurring expenditure under the above said Scheme, as 1st instalment to further release the grant to selected implementing agencies. Accordingly, Council released grant-in aid of Rs.92,28,010 to 33 implementing agencies to conduct 48 batches to train 3000 (approx.) In-Service Govt. functionaries during the financial year 2015-16. The details of the funds released along with the no. of batches and the target groups are as under:

Monitoring of the Training Programme

Although the In-service Training Programme has been found very useful by a large number of participants, feedback is essential to take any corrective measure. As per the directions of FSA, monitoring of training programmes conducted under the above said Scheme had to be undertaken by the Council. The Council, therefore, deputed officers for carrying out the monitoring activity by making surprise visits to various implementing agencies conducting the in-service Training Programme. This was done to ensure the timely conduct of the training programme at their institute. The concerned officers were required to submit a detailed report on completion of the training programme. The Council deputed visiting experts to carry out surprise checks during the ongoing training programme. These surprise checks, without informing the implementing agencies, have facilitated the RCI to judge the afficacy of the programme.

Submission of Report

On completion of the training programme, implementing agencies prepare and submit the programme wise report along with group photographs of the participants, list of participants and their attendance sheet with signature (local and out station), list of resource persons and duly filled feedback form, to the RCI in the form of a soft copy, along with Utilization Certificate and income & expenditure statement, duly certified by Chartered Accountant or Govt. Auditors as the case may be, within a month of organizing the training programme.

Feedback

RCI has also developed a feedback form to be filled in by the participants after the completion of the training programme. Each in-service Training Programme that was conducted had to be evaluated by obtaining feedback from the participants. Feedback not only enabled RCI and DEPwD, M/o SI&E to assess the effectiveness of the training conducted but it also made up some good suggestions that can be incorporated in the training programmes to be organized in future. The system of feedback was such that it had not inhibited the participants from speaking out what they honestly felt about the training programme. It was, therefore, left to the participants whether they would like to disclose their name on the feedback form or make their assessment anonymous.

Based on the reports along with the feedback form received from various implementing agencies, in-service Training and Sensitization Scheme had a powerful impact. The objective of the training programme was useful and the instructions were easily understandable. The learning materials as hand-outs provided to the participants were satisfactory that was unanimously supported by the participants. Majority of the participants informed that there should be wide publicity of the awareness about the schemes related with the disability in rural areas so that no child will be deprived of the rights and provisions. Also, important suggestions were made by the delegates based on the response of the participants. Some of the suggestions that were made are as under:










- 1. The programmes should be conducted on yearly basis
- 2. Evaluations should also be done after some days.
- 3. To share further developments via e-mail
- 4. To conduct few practical sessions in upcoming programmes
- 5. The higher authorities should also be given intensive training

It is also proposed to impart training through Administrative institutes of Central and State Govt./ National institutes of DEPwD/RCI approved training institutes/University Departments.







ADMINISTRATION

Administration of the Rehabilitation Council of India involves many activities besides managing the establishment and financial aspects.

Use of Hindi in Official Work

in order to promote use of Hindi in official work, the orders/instructions/guidelines issued by the Department of Official Language from time to time are followed strictly by the Council. The employees of RCI are motivated to carry out their official work in Hindi. During the year, RCI celebrated Hindi Pakhwara between 14-28 September, 2015 wherein various programmes were conducted and awards were given to employees for participating in various events and to promote use of Hindi. A Committee under the Chairmanship of Member Secretary, RCI has been set up to oversee the implementation of official language in RCI. Quarterly reports on the work done in Hindi were submitted to the DEPwO, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment and Department of Official Language, Ministry of Home Affairs regularly.

Reservation Policy

The procedure prescribed by the Government to implement the reservation policy in the office of the RCI is followed and due consideration is given for compliance of the orders on reservation issued by the Government from time to time.









Training

Officers/staff of the Council were deployed to attend the training courses/ workshops organized by ISTM & various institutes of repute from time to time for better competency.

Implementation of RTI Act, 2005

Consequent upto the enactment of the RTI Act, 2005, RCI is following the directions and guidelines issued by the Government from time to time. All the requisite information about RCI is displayed on the website of the Council, www.rehabcouncil.nic.in for the general public. During the year, total 293 RTI applications and two appeals were received. All the RTI applications and appeals were disposed off.

Vigilance Awareness Week

Vigilance Awareness Week was observed in RO from 26th to 31st October, 2015. During the period awareness is created among its employees to maintain the transparency and integrity in their official works. A lecture was organized among all staff members about the "Preventive Vigilance as a tool of Good Governance". On 26.10.2015 all employees were administered Piedge to bring about integrity and transparency and to strive for eradicating Corruption from all spheres of life, as per the instructions issued by Central Vigilance Commission.

Swachhta Abhiyan (National Cleanliness Campaign)

In accordance with instructions received from the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment from time to time, the Council organized National Cleanliness Campaign from 20th to 30th October, 2015 and 08th to 22nd Fabruary, 2016 under which various activities for cleaning of office campus and neighbourhood, cleaning of office rooms and tables, identification and weeding out of files/documents and disposal of obsolete Items, etc. were undertaken. All the employees of the Council were involved in successful organization of the National Cleanliness Campaign in the Council.



Library and Documentation

RCI has a good collection of books/publications/audio video/journals/periodicals in the area of disability rehabilitation and special education which are being used by the professionals/ personnel/experts/students.

Publications

Staff Strength

Under Section 8 (1) of the RCI Act, 1992, Central Government shall appoint the Mamber Secretary of the Council and under Section 8 (2) of the RCI Act, the Council shall, with the previous sanction of the Central Government employ such officers and other employees as it deems necessary to carry out the purpose of the Act. The present staff strength of the Council is 38 (i.e. 4 in Group 'W, 11 in Group 'B' and 23 in Group 'C'). Details of sanctioned strength of staff are placed at Anneuvre 8.1.

Annual Accounts and Audit Report

The accounts of the Rehabilitation Council of India are audited under Section 19 (2) of the Comptroller and Auditor General's (Duties, Powers & Conditions & Service) Act, 1971 read with Section 21 (3) of RCI Regulations, 1997 notified under Section 29 of Rehabilitation Council of India Act, 1992 (34 of 1992). The Office of the Director General Audit, Central Expenditure has conducted audit of accounts for the year 2015-16 from 12th to 26th August, 2016. The Audit Report along with Audited Accounts is placed at Annexure 8.2.

- We have audited the attached Balance Sheet of Rehabilitation Council of India as at 31 March 2016, income & Expenditure Account and Receipts & Payment Account for the year ended on that data under Section 19 (2) of the Comptroller & Auditor General's (Duties, Powers & Conditions of Service) Act, 1971 read with Section 21 (3) of the Rehabilitation Council of India, Regulations 1997. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Council's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.
- This separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller and Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification, conformity with the best accounting practice, accounting standards and disclosure norms, etc. Audit observations on financial transactions with regard to compliance with the Law, Rules & Regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency-cum-performance aspects, etc., if any, are reported through inspection Report/CAG's Audit Reports separately.
- 3. We have conducted the audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in india. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidences supporting the amounts and disclosure in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.
- 4. Based on our sudit, we report that:
 - We have obtained all the information and explanations, which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit.
 - The Balance Sheet, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipt & Payment Account dealt
 with by this report have been drawn up in the common format approved by the Ministry
 of Finance.
 - III. In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by the Rahabilitation Council of India as required under Section 21 (2) of Rehabilitation Council of India Regulations, 1997 in so far it appears from our examination of such books.
 - lv. We further report that:
- A. Balance Sheet
- A.1 Liability
- A.1.1 Current Liabilities & Provisions Rr.253.38 Lakh (Schedule-6)

The Council paid salaries amounting to Rs.14.65 lakh and Rs.11.99 lakh, for the month of March 2016 and March 2015, during April 2016 and April 2015 respectively. However the provision for the same was not made under Current Liabilities & Provisions on Liabilities side instead the amounts were booked as expenditure of accounting year corresponding to the month of actual payment. This has resulted in understatement of Current Liabilities & Provisions y Rs.14.65 lakh and understatement of









Current year expenditure by Rs.2.56 laich (Rs.14.65 laich – Rs.11.99 laich) along with understatement of prior period expenditure by Rs.11.99 laich.

A.Z. Assets

A.2.1 Current Assets, Loans and Advances - Rs. 420.88 lakh (Schedule 9)

The interest accrued on staff loans (Computer Advance) has not been accounted for in the annual accounts. This has resulted in understatement of Current Assets as well as current year Income. The amount of accrued interest could not be quantified in audit.

A.2.2 Current Assets - Rs. 420.88 laich (Schedule 9)

Current year income amounting to Re.5.84 lake which was received in March 2016 was not taken in current year accounts. This has resulted in understatement of Current Assets and Income by the same amount.

8. Income & Expenditure Account.

8.1 Income

8.1.1 Overstatement of income

A sum of Rs.7.62 laids, pertaining to financial year 2014-15 on account of inspection/ registration fee, was received during April 2015 and accounted for in annul account for the year 2015-16 which resulted in overstatement of current year income by Rs.7.62 laich and understatement of prior period income by the same amount.

C. General

C.1 Current Llabilities & Provisions - Ry.253.38 lakir (Schedule 6)

The Council has not made provision for gratuity & leave encashment on actuarial valuation. Instead the same are being accounted for on cash basis in contravention of the Uniform Format of Accounts approved by the Government of India, Ministry of Finance.

D. Gmets-InAld

Out of Rs.554.61 lakh (Rs.364.61 lakh under Plan and Rs.190.00 lakh under Non-Plan) received as grant-in-aid from Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Rs.45.21 lakh under Plan and Rs.9.50 lakh under Non-Plan was received in March 2016, it had unspent balance of grant-in-aid of previous year of Rs.19.52 lakh under Plan and Internal receipt of Rs.369.59 lakh. Out of the total funds available the Council utilized a sum of Rs.665.56 lakh.

- v. Subject to our observations in the preceding paragraphs, we report that Balance Sheet, income & Expenditure Account and Receipt & Payment Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with the book of accounts.
- vt. In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanation given to us, the said financial statements read together with the Accounting Policies and Notes on Accounts, and subject to the significant matters stated above and other matters mentioned in Annexure to this Audit Report give a true and fair view in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in India.
 - in so far as it relates to the Balance Sheet of the state of affairs of the Rehabilitation Council of India as at 32 March 2016 and
 - (b) in so far as it relates to the income and Expenditure Account of the surplus for the year ended on that data.





- As separate bank accounts are maintained for RCI G. P. Fund, RCI Pension Fund, RCI Main Account, RCI Project Account and RCI NBER Account and In-service Training Programme, therefore, separate receipt & payment accounts have been prepared for each account.









- 13. The M/o Social Justice & Empowerment sanctioned to create a Pension Fund only to discharge pension liability. Accordingly, actuarial valuation of pension fund was got made from actuaries. The Council has a strength of 38 only. One or two officials retire in a span of 2/3 years. Therefore, necessity was not felt to make provision for gratuity and leave encashment and the same is charged from the allocated budget in the relevant year in which the official is due to retire.
- During the year a sum of Rs. 4,36,124/- has been debited to Council's bank A/c No. 1484101026701 due to fraudulent encashment of 2 cheques. However, the same has been recovered from Canara Bankon 02.05.2016.
- The Council has sent a proposal to the administrative Ministry to amend the RCI Act, 1992 with a provision to insert a clause regarding income Tax Exemption in the Amendment Act.
