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CHAPTER - 1

INTRODUCTION

VISION

To create an environment that facilitates the highest standards in human resource development in the disability sector based on principles of human rights and inclusion.

MISSION

To ensure enhancement in the quality of existing and emerging human resource development programmes in disability rehabilitation and to address the life cycle needs of persons with disabilities across the country, including those from remote and less-served areas.

The Rehabilitation Council was initially set up under the Societies Registration Act XII of 1860 vide Resolution No. 22-17/83-HW.III dated 31st January, 1986 to have uniformity and to ensure minimum standards and quality of education & training in the field of special education and rehabilitation. It was given statutory status by an Act of Parliament, the Rehabilitation Council of India Act, 1992 (No. 34 of 1992) dated 1st September, 1992 effective from 22nd June, 1993. The RCI Act was amended by Parliament in 2000 (No.38 of 2000) to make it more broad based. The Act provides for constitution of the Rehabilitation Council of India for regulating and monitoring the training of rehabilitation professionals and personnel, promotion of research in rehabilitation and special education and maintenance of a Central Rehabilitation Register.

By signing and ratifying the United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (UNCRPD), India has committed itself to harmonize all the domestic laws including the RCI Act. The Convention has brought the inclusion of persons with disabilities to the centre-stage need to implement the provisions of the Convention in its true spirit. Accordingly, the syllabi and curricula of the various rehabilitation courses developed and standardized by RCI are being continuously revised so as to meet the requirements of the relevant provisions in the UNCRPD.



MAJOR PROVISIONS OF THE RCI ACT

Objectives of the Council

1. To regulate and monitor the training programmes in the field of rehabilitation of persons with disabilities.
2. To prescribe minimum standards of education and training for various categories of professionals dealing with persons with disabilities.
3. To regulate these standards in all training institutions to bring about uniformity throughout the country.
4. To make recommendations to the Ministry regarding recognition of qualifications granted by Universities, etc., in India for rehabilitation professionals.
5. To make recommendations to the Ministry regarding recognition of qualification by institutions outside India.
6. To maintain Central Rehabilitation Register of persons possessing the recognized rehabilitation qualification.
7. To encourage Continuing Rehabilitation Education in collaboration with organizations working in the field of disability.
8. To promote research in rehabilitation and special education.

Functions of the Council

1. The qualifications granted by any University or other institution in India that are included in the Schedule shall be recognized qualifications for Rehabilitation Professionals.
2. Any University or other institution which grants qualification for rehabilitation professionals not included in Schedule may apply to the Central Government to have any such qualification recognized and the Central Government, after consulting the Council may, by notification amend the Schedule so as to include such qualification therein and any such notification may also direct that any entry shall be made in the last column of the Schedule against such qualification only when granted after a specified date.
3. The Council may enter into negotiations with a recognized authority in any other country for setting up of a scheme of reciprocity for the recognition of qualifications. In pursuance of any such scheme, the Central Government may by notification, amend the Schedule so as to include therein any qualification which the Council has decided should be recognized, and by such notification may also direct that an entry shall be made in the last column of the Schedule declaring that it shall be a recognized qualification only when granted after a specified date.



4. Registration of Rehabilitation Professionals in the Central Rehabilitation Register of persons possessing the recognized rehabilitation qualifications as per the Schedule attached to the Act.
5. To prescribe the minimum standards of education required for granting recognized rehabilitation qualification by Universities/Institutions in India.
6. To prescribe the standards of professionals, conduct and etiquette & code of ethics for rehabilitation professionals.
7. To assess and grant approval to institutions/universities for the training of professionals in the field of rehabilitation and to facilitate their recognition and its withdrawal by the Government.
8. The Council may appoint such number of visitors as it may deem requisite to inspect any University or Institution wherein education for rehabilitation professionals is given or attend any examination for the purpose of granting recognized rehabilitation qualifications.

Rehabilitation Professionals under the Purview of the Council

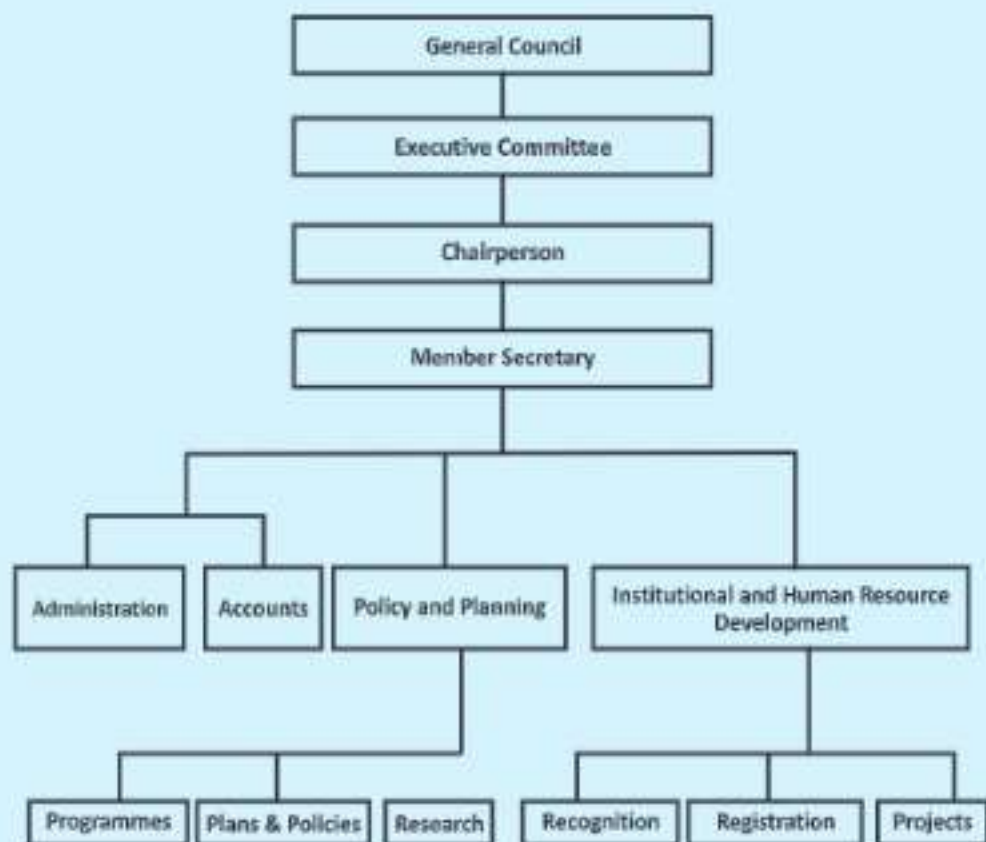

- (xi) Rehabilitation Practitioners in Mental Retardation
- (xii) Orientation and Mobility Specialists

- (xvi) Rehabilitation Workshop Managers
- (xvii) Any other category of Professionals included from time to time



COUNCIL AND ITS MEETINGS

The Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI) functions under the administrative control of the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment. GENERAL COUNCIL

In accordance with Sub-Section (1) and (3) of Section 3 of the Rehabilitation Council of India Act, 1992 (34 of 1992), the Central Government appoints members of the General Council of Rehabilitation Council of India consisting of a Chairperson and 28 Members representing the Ministries/Departments, rehabilitation professionals, social workers, medical practitioners and Members of Parliament. During the period, Shri Lov Verma, IAS, Secretary, Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, acted as Chairperson, RCI (Additional Charge) upto 31st January, 2016 and Dr. Vinod Aggarwal, IAS, Secretary, DEPWD was given the additional charge of the Chairperson, RCI w.e.f. 1st February, 2016 to 31st October, 2016. Dr. Kamlesh Kumar Pandey, Chief Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities was given additional charge of Chairperson, RCI w.e.f. 1st November, 2016.

39th Meeting of the General Council

39th Meeting of the General Council of Rehabilitation Council of India was held on 22nd February, 2017 at India International Centre, New Delhi under the Chairpersonship of Dr. Kamlesh Kumar Pandey, Chief Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities & Chairperson, RCI. Following decisions were taken in the meeting:

1. Confirmation of the Minutes of the 38th Meeting of the General Council held on 30.11.2015

Minutes of the 38th meeting of the General Council were confirmed.



2. Follow up Action on the Minutes of the 38th Meeting of the General Council

Follow-up Action on the Minutes of the 38th Meeting of the General Council was perused and approved by the Members with the following decisions:

- (i) All the National Institutes conducting examination of Certificate/Diploma level Courses under the National Board of Examination in Rehabilitation (NBER), an adjunct body of RCI, shall depute concerned officials to study the examination system developed and implemented by the National Institute for Empowerment of Persons with Multiple Disabilities (NIEPMD), Chennai in respect of Certificate/Diploma Courses to facilitate better conduct of examinations.
- (ii) RCI to expedite hiring of building for NBER.
- (iii) Scope of Practice shall be prepared by the Council for other categories of professionals like Clinical Psychologists, etc. and put up for approval in the next Meeting of the Executive Committee.

3. Perusal of the Minutes of the 71st, 72nd, 73rd and 74th Meeting of the Executive Committee

Minutes of the 71st, 72nd, 73rd and 74th Meeting of the Executive Committee of RCI were perused and approved by the General Council.

4. Opening of State Chapter of RCI

General Council authorized the Chairperson, RCI to approve parameters for appointment of Chairpersons for State Chapters and norms & guidelines for running of State Chapters which shall be placed in the next meeting of the Executive Committee for approval. General Council also authorized the Chairperson, RCI to select new Chairpersons for Zonal Coordination Committees (ZCCs) whose term is expiring in June, 2017.

As regards setting up of four Regional Centres, it was decided that instead of setting up infrastructure at regional places, additional officers along with supporting staff, shall be appointed at RCI who would be responsible for their respective regions of the country.

5. Cut-off date for accepting State Government NOC for consideration of fresh proposals for the academic session 2017-18

Following decisions were taken:

- (a) It was informed to the General Council that the Council had invited proposals for grant of approval to conduct RCI approved training Courses in the field of disability rehabilitation and special education vide Council's Circular dated June 23, 2016 which was placed in the public domain on the Council's website and various leading newspapers. As per the aforesaid circular, last date for receiving the proposals completed in all respects, including No Objection Certificate (NOC) from the State





Government was September 15, 2016. Subsequently, the date was extended up to December 31, 2016. It has been observed that many proposals are not containing State NOC or even State NOCs are received after December 31, 2016 whereas the proposals have already been received by the Council within the prescribed last date.

- (b) Accordingly, the matter was discussed by the General Council and it has been decided that: (1) Fresh Proposals for the academic session 2017-18 received on time through on-line and offline mode, wherein NOC from State Government was not available, shall be considered for the academic session 2017-18 only in cases where State NOC is issued till February 28, 2017 and received in the Council latest by March 06, 2017; and (2) Remaining proposals wherein NOC from State Government is issued after February 28, 2017, shall be considered and processed for the academic session 2018-19 subject to willingness of the concerned institution.
- (c) RCI shall issue notice to all State Governments under Section 24 (9) of RCI Notification, 1997 which states that "On receipt of an application from an organization for permission to start new rehabilitation professional course, the Council shall call for, if not done by the organization, the recommendations/views of the State Government. In case the recommendations/views of the State Government are not received within a period of ninety days, the Council shall be entitled to process the application on its own with the support of its Committees and thereafter take such decision as it deems necessary" and subsequently the Council will initiate necessary action as provided under Section 24 (9) of notification referred above.
- (d) It was also decided by the General Council that RCI shall conduct surprise inspection of institutions which are given approval to verify the facts stated in the self-assessment report and inspection report submitted by the experts.

6. Registration of Workers/Technicians of Jaipur Foot/Limb in Central Rehabilitation Register

The candidates working in Bhagwan Mahaveer Viklang Sahayata Samiti, Jaipur and having minimum qualification of Matric (10th class pass) shall be allowed to undergo a six months Bridge Course in P&O to be eligible for registration in the Central Rehabilitation Register as a P&O Technician. The candidates who do not have the minimum qualification of Matric (10th class pass) shall be eligible for registration only after acquiring minimum qualification of Matric (10th class) from a recognized Board through distance mode or NIOS. The procedure for conducting the Bridge Course shall be decided by the Council for such candidates.



7. Programmes of Salus University, USA

It was informed to the General Council by the Member Secretary that subsequent to approval by the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan), Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, he visited Salus University, USA from 12-13 September, 2016 to study their programmes in the field of Audiology and Speech Language Pathology. As a follow up of the visit, representatives from Salus University, USA shall be visiting India to explore the possibility of signing MoU between Indian Universities/Institutions like Ali Yavar Jung National Institute of Speech & Hearing Disabilities (Divyangjan), Mumbai, National Institute of Speech & Hearing, Thiruvananthapuram, MGR University, Chennai, and Dr. Shakuntala Misra National Rehabilitation University, Lucknow and Salus University to run the following programmes:

- (i) International Aud Degree Bridge Programme
- (ii) Advanced Studies Certificate Programme and
- (iii) M.Sc. in Clinical Audiology Programme

General Council approved the proposal of collaboration with Salus University, USA and to place the syllabi of above Courses before the respective Expert Committee for consideration and approval. RCI can have an MoU with Salus University after completion of all the formalities required in such cases.

8. Re-start of BPO Condensed Course

In view of the comments received from the Experts in the matter of conducting the BPO Condensed Course and in the interest of the candidates, General Council approved the proposal to re-start the BPO Condensed Course through its approved institutions.

9. Publication of Books for Diploma Courses by RCI

General Council approved the proposal to bring out Books/Manuals on the lines of NCERT in collaboration with eminent publishers for the benefit of Diploma programme students. An Apex Advisory and Monitoring Committee shall be constituted consisting of a coordinator, experts for writing the books/manuals and an editor. Such books/manuals shall be translated in regional languages through the Centre for Disability Studies proposed to be set up at the Universities all over the country.

General Council also approved the following rates of remuneration/honorarium for payment to experts for this purpose:

Any Other Matter

1. It was informed to the General Council that the Bangalore University has conducted Diploma in CBR outside their jurisdiction. As a result the passed out candidates cannot be registered in the Central Rehabilitation Register. With the intervention of the Council, Bangalore University has now stopped conducting the DCBR Course but the Courses conducted earlier cannot be regularized to give registration to passed out candidates. General Council directed to take up the matter again with DEPwD for resolving the issue of registration of passed out candidates from Bangalore University.
2. MoU with North-east Universities to be signed/renewed for conducting distance education programmes with the approval of Distance Education Bureau (DEB).
3. RCI has requested the Hon'ble Minister for Social Justice & Empowerment to write to the Hon'ble Minister for Human Resource Development to direct the Universities to establish Centre of Disability Studies for conducting Courses in disability rehabilitation and special education and promoting the schemes and programmes in this field for the benefit of persons with disabilities.
4. Dr. Ravinder Singh, Indian Council of Medical Research informed that he has requested Director General Health Services to direct the institutions to apply to the Council for running Courses in Clinical Psychology.
5. General Council approved to recommend to the Ministry/Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities to undertake a study to validate the census data relating to disability.



6. In view of the enactment of the RPD Act, 2016, it has become necessary to make amendments to the RCI Act, 1992. Accordingly, General Council approved to constitute a Committee under the Chairmanship of a retired Judge to review and redraft the RCI Act.
7. General Council approved to recommend to the Ministry/Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities to reconsider starting of the National Programme of Rehabilitation of Persons with Disabilities (NRPD) Scheme for catering to the needs of persons with disabilities living in rural areas/villages.
8. Two Schemes for Leprosy Cured Persons prepared by the Expert Committee constituted by RCI for this purpose should be recommended to Government for launching through a single window system for the benefit of leprosy cured persons.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

To fulfill the purpose of the Rehabilitation Council of India Act, 1992 (as amended in 2000), the General Council as per the powers conferred under Sub Section (1) of Section 7, the Chairperson, RCI constituted the Executive Committee from amongst the members of the General Council. The Executive Committee is responsible for the management and administration of the affairs of the Council. The Executive Committee of the Council shall meet at least once in every four months. The meeting of the Executive Committee may be convened by the Chairperson of the Executive Committee or any other member of the Executive Committee who may be authorized by him on his behalf.

List of the Executive Committee Members as on 31st March, 2017 is placed at Annexure 1.2.

Details of the meetings of the Executive Committee and decisions taken during the year are given below:

72nd Meeting of the Executive Committee

72nd Meeting of the Executive Committee of Rehabilitation Council of India was held on 28th June, 2016 at Conference Room, DEPWD, Paryavaran Bhawan, New Delhi under the Chairmanship of Dr. Vinod Aggarwal, IAS, Secretary, DEPWD & Chairperson, RCI. Following decisions were taken in the meeting:

1. Confirmation of the Minutes of the 71st Meeting

Minutes of the 71st Meeting of the Executive Committee held on March 10, 2016 were confirmed.

2. Follow-up Action of the Minutes of the 71st Meeting

Follow-up Action on the Minutes of the 71st Meeting held on March 10, 2016 was approved with following observations/decisions:

- (i) It was decided in the meeting of the Executive Committee held on March 10, 2016 that two consultants for North-East are to be appointed which has not been done so far. Executive Committee expressed its displeasure on it and directed to appoint two Consultants for North-East within one month.
- (ii) It was also decided to develop a Format within one month for effective monitoring of the progress/activities undertaken as part of MoUs signed by RCI with different Universities.



- (iii) Central Government Employees Group Insurance Scheme (CGEGIS) may be implemented by RCI under intimation to DEPwD.
- (iv) It was apprised to the Committee that many pass out professionals/personnel are not renewing their registration on time and submit their application after the lapse of five or more years. It was decided that a penalty of Rs.1500 shall be imposed on candidates for providing relaxation for renewal of Registration beyond one year.
- (v) (a) The progress of National Board of Examination in Rehabilitation (NBER) was reviewed. It was observed that instructions given by the Executive Committee in its earlier meeting in this regard have not been complied. In addition, JS (AKA) pointed out that National Institutes have been given the task of conducting examinations while this should be conducted by RCI/NBER. It adds to the workload on National Institutes. Hence, a decision was taken that NBER shall conduct the examinations independently from the next academic session.

(b) The status of availability of staff in NBER was apprised to the Committee. It was informed that out of 08 contractual posts sanctioned earlier, all eight posts were filled (out of which one Programme Officer and one Accountant have left), which includes Consultant Examination and Assistant Controller of Examination. It was decided to fill the contractual posts sanctioned for NBER within one month and also submit a proposal for creation of regular posts for NBER to DEPwD, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment within 15 days for approval.

(c) It was apprised to the Committee that at present NBER is functioning in the building of RCI whereas the space for RCI itself is limited and insufficient. It was also informed that for functioning of NBER, initially about 6000 sq. ft. carpet area shall be needed. It was decided to hire approx. 6000 sq. ft. carpet area from a government organization for functioning of NBER adjacent or close to RCI in Qutab Institutional Area.
- (vi) Navshikhar Channel - A Committee consisting of experts from ISRO and other allied areas, shall be constituted to undertake valuation of the equipments available in Navshikhar Channel and suggest ways for its use by other organizations or disposal by auction, etc., so that the outstanding audit para on this subject could be settled without further delay.
- (vii) Regarding payment portal for RCI, it was apprised that for submission of new application forms for courses/extension of approval, fee has to be submitted through earlier developed package of NIC where there is a provision to give bank draft details. It was also apprised to the Committee by Member Secretary that RCI tried amendment in this package in consultation with NIC, however, it was not possible because the code, etc. of that particular package is not available with NIC. It was recommended by Director, NIC to go for development of a new software. It was apprised that for this purpose, AMAS (Academic Monitoring & Analysis System) software is under process for development. In addition, it was also apprised to the Committee that the system of payment for issuance of CRR certificates, fees of NBER and other fees/charges received, has been made through

NEFT/RTGS. It was decided by the Committee to pursue AMAS web application as soon as possible and develop payment portal with the help of bank and NIC, following the proper procedures of e-tender, etc.

- (vii) It was apprised to the Committee that under North East Financial Assistance Scheme to SC/ST students, the list of students with their name, father's name, address, mobile number, etc., who have been provided Laptop, has already been uploaded on RCI website. It was also informed that mobile numbers of a few students are not available. It was directed by the Committee to collect the mobile numbers of such students and upload the same on RCI website.

3. Progress Report

Progress Report of the Council was perused by the members and following decisions were taken:

- (i) The status of inspection reports for Fresh and Extension of approval cases is given below:

It is evident from the above Table that Inspection Reports awaited are 34 for fresh and 27 for extension of approval. It was directed by the Committee to clear all such proposals by 15th July, 2016.

- (ii) It was apprised to the Committee that many experts who are deputed for inspection do not conduct timely inspection. Sometimes they inform RCI late for their inability to conduct inspection and the inspection team is bound to be changed and it causes undue delay in getting the inspection reports for no fault of the concerned institutions. The Committee directed that visiting experts who fail to conduct inspection within the stipulated time but maximum within 45 days, shall be debarred from conducting inspection in future. Also due action for cancellation of their CRR may be taken up.
- (iii) It was also apprised to the Committee that getting NOC from State Government on time is very cumbersome. It has been felt that many States are not providing formal NOC to the institutions on time. As such these institutions suffer to conduct RCI approved courses. It was decided by the Committee that NOC obtained from the States upto 30th June, 2016 shall be accepted for deputing inspection team by 7th July, 2016 and such inspection reports shall be obtained by 15th July, 2016 so that time decision is taken about their approval/rejection before beginning of the current academic session.



- (iv) It was apprised to the Committee that there is a great variation/discretion amongst the visiting experts while assessing the progress report of inspecting institutions. It was suggested by the Committee to develop a self-assessment format for institutions applying for new/extension of approval of courses from the next academic session to ensure transparency. Once they submit their self-assessment report, it should be compared with the reports submitted by the visiting experts so that deviations can be counteracted.
- (v) In order to control the delay in processing application forms for running RCI approved courses, it was decided by the Committee to develop a timeline for processing of proposals, scrutiny, deputing inspection team, time allowed for inspection, receipt of inspection report, scrutiny of inspection reports, time for disposal of inspection reports, issue of orders and uploading the status of approval/decision categorically on RCI website to make the concerned aware about it.
- (vi) It was also apprised to the Committee that due to inordinate delay in obtaining formal "NOC" from State authorities, institutions are suffering for none of their fault. So it was decided that in case NOC in the prescribed format is obtained from the district authorities with a copy marked to RCI, shall be accepted for considering proposals for inspection and approval of institutions under endorsement to the concerned State Government. In case any adverse report is received from the State Govt. later on, it shall be taken into account and appropriate action shall be taken against the approved institution.

4. Approval of Schemes under North East Sub Component Plan

- (a) The Executive Committee approved the following Schemes for implementation in North-East region under North-East Sub Component Plan from the financial year 2016-17:
 - (i) Seminar on Capacity Building of RCI registered Professionals and Personnel.
 - (ii) Scheme for Reimbursement of Tuition Fee.
 - (iii) Scheme for providing Financial Assistance for Purchase of Laptops.
 - (iv) Scheme for Financial Assistance for Human Resource Development in Disability Rehabilitation and Special Education in North East Region.
- (b) Executive Committee approved the proposal for conducting Seminar on Capacity Building for Rehabilitation Professionals for Persons with Disabilities in North-East submitted by Arunachal Universities of Studies for Rs.15,21,850/- (Rupees Fifteen Lakhs Twenty One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty only).
- (c) Executive Committee also approved the proposal received from Zonal Coordination Committee of North-East for conducting Seminar on Capacity Building for Rehabilitation Professionals for Persons with Disabilities at Tripura of Rs.20,00,000/- (Rs. Twenty Lakh only).



5. Diploma in Computer Education (VI)

Executive Committee approved the revised syllabus of Diploma in Computer Education (VI) for implementation from the academic session 2016-17.

6. Withdrawal of maximum age criteria in the curriculum of Post Graduate Diploma in Early Intervention (PGDEI) Programme

Executive Committee approved the proposal to withdraw the maximum age limit for admission to PGDEI programme.

7. Approval of New Programmes on Pilot Basis

Executive Committee approved the syllabi of following four programmes to be offered on pilot basis by NIEPMD, Chennai from the academic year 2016-17 after following the process of recognition:

- (a) M.Ed.Spl.Ed. (Autism Spectrum Disorders)
- (b) M.Ed.Spl.Ed. (Multiple Disabilities)
- (c) B.Ed.Spl.Ed. (Deaf blindness)

8. Registration of Candidates with Level C of Indian Sign Language Training in the Central Rehabilitation Register

Executive Committee ratified the decision taken by the Council to register candidates with hearing disability having completed C Level of ISL Training from AYNIHH, Mumbai for registration as Sign Language Teacher in the Central Rehabilitation Register (CRR).

9. Enhancement of Registration Fee

Executive Committee considered and approved the following revised fees for registration and other certification which would be effective from 01.08.2016:

10. Approval of Course Curricula

Executive Committee approved the following revised syllabi of Courses for implementation from the academic session 2017-18:

- (i) M. Phil. (Clinical Psychology)
- (ii) M. Phil. (Rehabilitation Psychology)
- (iii) Bachelor in Audiology and Speech Language Pathology (B.ASLP)
- (iv) Master in Prosthetics and Orthotics (M.P.O.)
- (v) Bachelor in Prosthetics and Orthotics (B.P.O.)

11. Ratification of Permission Granted with Relaxation for Approval of Institutions/ Retrospective Approval

(A) Permission Granted with Relaxation

Executive Committee ratified the decision taken by RCI for according approval to the proposals considered for inspection after the due date, where scores were less in parameters like Research & Development/Barrier Free Environment/Community Promotional Activities and for re-inspection though the scores were below 50% due to the fact that there is a need of rehabilitation professionals in the State.

(B) Retrospective Approval

Following decision was taken:

To protect the interest of the students, it has been decided that Institutes those have applied for extension with retrospective approval may be considered separately for Government Organizations/Universities and NGOs. GOs may be asked to fix responsibility for conducting Courses without prior approval and send the report to RCI for further consideration, on case to case basis. Regarding giving retrospective approval to NGOs, a penalty of Rs.1.00 lakh for each batch shall be imposed. No fresh proposal shall be considered for retrospective approval.

12. Criteria for Approval Fee

Executive Committee approved the proposal for charging approval fee for each Course and each batch separately effective from the academic session 2017-18. The amount of approval fee for different Courses as approved earlier shall remain the same for one year and shall be charged at the rate of 50% for the subsequent batches approved.

13. Approval of Annual Accounts for the financial year 2015-16

The Annual Accounts of the Council for the financial year 2015-16 consisting of Balance Sheet, Receipt & Payment Account, Income & Expenditure Account were perused and approved by the Executive Committee for onward submission to the Director General of Audit, Central Expenditure.

14. Action Plan for the Year 2016-17

Executive Committee approved the Annual Action Plan of the Council for the year 2016-17.



73rd Meeting of the Executive Committee

73rd Meeting of the Executive Committee of RCI was held on 14th October, 2016 at Conference Room, DEPWD, Paryavaran Bhawan, New Delhi under the Chairmanship of Dr. Vinod Aggarwal, IAS, Secretary, DEPWD & Chairperson, RCI. Following decisions were taken:

1. Confirmation of the Minutes of the 72nd Meeting

Minutes of the 72nd Meeting of the Executive Committee held on 28th June, 2016 were confirmed.

2. Follow-up Action of the Minutes of the 72nd Meeting

Follow-up Action on the Minutes of the 72nd Meeting held on 28th June, 2016 was approved with the following observations/decisions:

- (i) National Building Construction Company Ltd. (NBCC) should be requested to allot land/building for housing the office of the Rehabilitation Council of India and the National Board of Examination in Rehabilitation (NBER). Funds available with RCI from its own internal receipts may be utilized for this purpose. The existing building of RCI may be considered by DEPWD for allotment to National Trust/NHFDC on payment basis if they are also keen for shifting to the site of RCI.
- (ii) Compliance to audit para received from office of the Director General of Audit (Central Expenditure) vide letter No.V.L./Pub. Fund/2016-17/538 dated 26.09.2016 regarding Public funds lying outside Government Accounts should be submitted immediately.

3. NAAC Accreditation of RCI Approved Institutions

The issue of NAAC accreditation of RCI approved Institutions was discussed by the members. Dr. N.S. Dharamshaktu suggested that the matter should be examined further. Dr. Ravinder Singh said that NAAC accreditation should not be made mandatory. Accordingly, it was decided to constitute an Expert Committee consisting of representatives of concerned government departments, experts in the field of disability rehabilitation and special education and representatives of NGOs/approved Institutions to discuss the matter at length. Any decision on NAAC accreditation of RCI approved Institutions shall be taken only after receipt of the recommendations of the Experts Committee in this regard.

4. Withdrawal of Circular regarding Supernumerary Seats

- (i) It was informed to the Executive Committee that the Council had issued a circular No. 5-3/EC/RCI-2009 dated 05.05.2009 making a provision for supernumerary seats (15% management quota and 15% foreign/NRI quota) over and above the sanctioned intake at graduate and post graduate level. However, it has been observed that institutions/ organizations offering higher education programmes enroll students under such quota without enhancing the academic, clinical and other infrastructure. Therefore, it is proposed that the said provision may be withdrawn by the Council w.e.f. 2017-18.
- (ii) The matter was discussed at length by the Executive Committee and it was approved to withdraw the said circular dated 05.05.2009. Further, it has been decided that a provision shall be made to provide for 10% supernumerary seats over and above the sanctioned



Intake at graduate and post-graduate level, for NRI/foreign quota/ candidates from Andaman & Nicobar, Lakshadweep, North-East and J&K. Necessary circular may be issued in this regard to be applicable from the academic session 2017-18.

5. Discontinuation of CPO, DPO and DHLS Programmes

After deliberating the issue at length, following decision has been taken:

- (a) Certificate in Prosthetics & Orthotics (C.P.O.) course shall be discontinued from the academic session 2017-18 giving prior notice to all the Institutions running C.P.O. course.
- (b) D.P.O. & D.H.L.S. Courses shall be continued to meet the requirement of personnel at lower level.

6. Approval of Model Recruitment Rules for Professionals under RCI

Executive Committee approved the model Recruitment Rules in respect of the following categories:

- (i) Special Educator in all disability areas
- (ii) Clinical Psychologist
- (iii) Rehabilitation Psychologist
- (iv) Prosthetists & Orthotists
- (v) Audiologists and Speech Language Pathologists
- (vi) Speech & Hearing Technician
- (vii) Hearing Aid & Ear Mould Technician

7. Ratification of Approval of Institutions

(a) Ratification of Approval Granted with Relaxation to the Institutions

Executive Committee ratified the decision to grant approval to 21 Institutions with relaxation in scores in certain parameters like Research & Development/Barrier free Environment/Community Promotional Activities.

(b) To consider minimum three years approval to all eligible institutes as per DEPwD letter No.29-9/2016-NI dated 29.6.2016

Executive Committee approved the proposal to grant approval/recognition of minimum three years and it would be effective prospectively, i.e. from the academic session 2017-18.

(c) Ratification of proposals considered after due date from NF's/CRC for 04 Pilot Courses and other RCI approved Institutes

Executive Committee ratified the decision to consider proposals received after the due date for grant of approval.

(d) Approval for consideration of proposals received for fresh & extension from 2017-18 as per the EC decision:

- (i) Executive Committee approved the proposal to regret fresh proposals received without online application & proposal ID, except proposals/applications received from North-Eastern States, Andaman & Nicobar, Lakshadweep, J & K and other inaccessible remote areas.
 - (ii) Executive Committee approved the proposal to accept hardcopies of Fresh proposals received after last date with a penalty of Rs. 5000/- till 30th November, 2016.
 - (iii) The procedure for consideration of proposal for conduct of course shall be on receipt of State NOC along with the proposal as per the earlier norm should be continued. NOC from district authorities shall not be considered.
 - (iv) Executive Committee approved the proposal to accept applications/proposals for extension of approval without online or hardcopies after last date with a penalty of Rs.15, 000/- till 30th November 2016.
- (e) **Maximum two proposals may only be considered every year from any Organization/ Society across the country**
- Executive Committee directed that this item may be placed before the next meeting of the Executive Committee.

1. Confirmation of the Minutes of the 73rd Meeting of the Executive Committee

Minutes of the 73rd Meeting of the Executive Committee held on 14th October, 2016 were confirmed.

2. Follow up Action of the Minutes of the 73rd Meeting of the Executive Committee

Follow up Action on the Minutes of the 73rd Meeting of Executive Committee held on 14th October, 2016 was approved with following modifications/observations:

(a) Executive Committee approved the proposal for opening of 14 State Chapters from the financial year 2016-17.

(b) Following changes were suggested in the composition of State Chapters and UTs of Daman & Diu and Dadar Nagar Haveli have also been included:

Progress Report was perused by the members and the following observations were made:

- RCI shall write to North Eastern Hill University (NEHU), Shillong to start full-time regular B.Ed. Spl. Ed. Course to meet the demand of special educators in the region.
- Name and contact details of the Nodal Officer of Open Universities should also be mentioned against each University.
- Ethics, mandate and monitoring format in respect of distance education programmes is being prepared by the Council.
- As regards the setting up of four Regional Centres, 4 Nodal Officers may be deputed from RCI.

4. Approval of Revised Curricula

Executive Committee approved the revised syllabi of the following programmes for implementation from the academic session 2018-19:



- (i) Diploma in Vocational Rehabilitation (Mental Retardation/Intellectual Disability) (Two year duration)

- (ii) Master In Disability Rehabilitation and Administration (MDRA)

5. Financial Assistance to SC and ST under Special Sub- Component Plan

Executive Committee deliberated upon the issue and suggested that efforts may be made by the Council in consultation with respective Institutions to recover the financial assistance given to SC/ST students who discontinue the Course. However, keeping in view the difficulty in recovering the amount released to the SC/ST students who discontinue the course and the audit objection, the Council may reconsider the Scheme of financial assistance provided under SC and ST Sub-Component Plan.

6. Maximum Age limit for Admission to Diploma in Hearing Language and Speech (DHLS) Course

After detailed discussions, it was decided by the Executive Committee that no age limit shall be prescribed for DHLS Course from the current academic session.

7. Norms for extending Financial Assistance to Associations/Organizations for Sanction of Workshops/Seminars/Symposium/Conference in Disability Sector Granted CRE status

Following decisions were taken by the Executive Committee for implementation from the financial year 2017-18:

- (i) Financial assistance to Professional Associations for organizing national/international Workshops/Seminars/Conferences or Annual Meet shall be granted once in two years as applicable to RCIs approved training institutes for sanction of CRE.

- (ii) Financial assistance shall be limited as given below:

- (a) State Level Workshop: Rs. 50,000 (maximum)
- (b) National Level Workshop: Rs. 75,000 to Rs. 1,00,000 (maximum)
- (c) International Level events: Rs. 1,00,000 to Rs. 1,50,000 (maximum)

- (iii) CRE status can be granted to such events organized by Professional Associations within the prescribed intake as approved for CRE programme, as and when the proposals are received, provided the norms are met.

8. Creation of Posts and Provision for other Infrastructural Facilities for Functioning of National Board of Examination in Rehabilitation (NBER)

Executive Committee approved the proposal for creation of new posts for NBER. This may also be brought to the notice of Governing Body of NBER.

9. Exemption of Fee for PwD Candidates to Attend CRE Programmes Approved by Council with Financial Assistance

Executive Committee ratified the decision taken by the Council to exempt the PwD candidates from payment of fee for attending CRE programmes from the financial year 2017-18.

10. De-centralization of Approval to Grant CRE Status without Financial Assistance to RCIs Approved Institutes from the Financial Year 2017-18



Executive Committee ratified the decision taken by RCi to authorize National Institutes to give approval to CRE programmes without financial assistance submitted by the RCi approved institutions affiliated to them.

11. Scores for Approval of Institutions

Executive Committee approved the following revised criteria for according approval to institutions:

Following relaxations shall be provided, wherever necessary:

- 10% relaxation in scores in maximum of three parameters, except Human Resource, to meet the criteria of approval of overall 80% scores in case of On-going Courses only.
- In case of proposals for North Eastern region and other justified cases, this limit may further be relaxed by the Chairperson under intimation to next E.C. meeting.
- Re-inspection cases
 - Fresh proposals where the scores during the first inspection were more than 50% in all parameters may be considered.
 - Last month for considering the request of re-inspection should be within June of the calendar year as most of the courses are started in the month of July.
 - Penalty fees of Rs.15000/-, processing fee of Rs.7500/- along with inspection fee applicable for respective course may be charged
 - In case of proposals for extension of on-going courses, same criteria, as for new proposals, may be followed.

12. Revised Application Format for Fresh Proposal and Extension of Approval

Executive Committee approved the revised simplified application formats for fresh proposals and extension of approval for implementation from the academic session 2018-19.

13. Ratification of Last Date for Receipt of the Hard Copy of Proposals for the Academic Session 2017-18

Executive Committee ratified the decision taken by the Council to extend the last date for receipt of hard copy of the proposals up to 31st December, 2016.

14. Self Assessment Format for Institutions Applying for Fresh/Extension of Approval of Courses from Academic Session 2017-18

Self-assessment format prepared and circulated by the Council to institutions was perused and approved by the Executive Committee.

15. Consideration of Maximum of Two Proposals Every Year from any Organization for Approval

Executive Committee decided that the proposal of considering a maximum of two proposals every year from an institution shall be implemented from the next academics session, i.e. 2018-19 only. Necessary announcement of this decision shall be made while inviting online applications for the academic session 2018-19.

16. Revision of Registration Fees

The proposal for revision of Registration Fee from the next financial year, i.e. 2017-18 was approved by the Executive Committee.

17. Registration of Candidates as Professional for Vocational Instructor and Addition of Category

Proposal for inclusion of the category of Vocational Instructor for registration in CRR with Code No.1702 has been approved.

18. Promoting Open Universities to establish Centre for Disability Studies

Proposal for establishment of Centre for Disability Studies at the University Departments was approved by the Executive Committee provided there is no financial liability on the part of the Council.

SUPPLEMENTARY AGENDA

1. Ratification of Approval for Orientation Programme for Course-Coordination by NIEPMD, Chennai

Executive Committee approved the proposal for reimbursement of Rs.10,49,250 to NIEPMD, Chennai for conducting the Orientation Programme on 08-09 June, 2016.

2. Clarifications about the Scheme of Examination of NBER

Executive Committee approved the proposed changes in the Scheme of Examination of NBER. This may also be placed before the Governing Body of NBER.

3. Permission to re-start M. Ed. Spl. Education through ODL Mode

Executive Committee approved the proposal to re-start M. Ed. Spl. Ed. through ODL mode at the University Departments only from the academic session 2017-18. An Expert Committee shall be constituted by the Council for finalization of norms and guidelines for conducting the M. Ed. Spl. Ed. ODL mode. After this, the issue may again be placed in the next meeting of the General Council/Executive Committee.



4. **Proposal to Develop Bridge Course of 10 Month Duration and 09 Month Duration for In-Service Teachers**

Executive Committee approved the proposal to initiate action for development of Course structure of the proposed Bridge Course for in-service teachers to be launched from the academic session 2017-18.

5. **Development of Courses in Inclusive Education:** The matter of development and launch of Diploma and Degree Courses in Inclusive Education was discussed and based on the apparent need for such courses to train special educators for inclusive education, it was decided by the Executive Committee to constitute an Expert Committee for development of Diploma and Degree Courses in Inclusive Education on pilot basis.

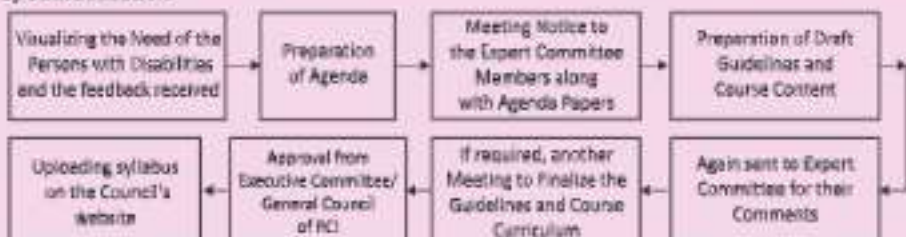
6. **Amendment of RCI Act, 1992 (as amended in 2000):** With the passage of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016, it has become necessary to amend the RCI Act, 1992 (as amended in 2000) to include new disabilities added to the list of disabilities in the RPWD Act, 2016 and other provisions of the Act relating to the activities of Rehabilitation Council of India. Therefore, it was decided by the Executive Committee to constitute a high level Committee headed by a retired High Court Judge or a senior judicial officer to suggest amendments in the RCI Act, 1992 and re-draw the Act for recommending the amendments to Government for consideration and approval.

CHAPTER - 2

EXPERT COMMITTEES AND STANDARDIZATION OF TRAINING COURSES

The Council develops and standardizes training Courses to meet the human resource requirement for various categories of Professionals/Personnel allocated to RCI. These Courses are reviewed, revised and updated from time to time. At present 60 Courses are operational through regular mode in the area of disability rehabilitation and special education and the list of such Courses is given at Annexure 2.1.

EXPERT COMMITTEES/CORE COMMITTEES

To carry out the purpose of the Rehabilitation Council of India Act, 1992 (as amended in 2000), the Council has constituted various Expert Committees under Sub-Section (1) of Section 7 of the RCI Act. The list of the Expert Committees is placed at Annexure 2.2. to 2.12. The objectives of the Expert Committees are as given below:

- (i) To recommend the Courses, the duration of the Courses, subject for examinations and standards of the proficiency to be obtained in any University or Institution for grant of recognized rehabilitation qualifications.
- (ii) To recommend to the Council, the standards of the staff, equipment, accommodation, training and other facilities for study or training of the rehabilitation professionals.
- (iii) Any other matter related to the above issues.

The details of the meetings of the Expert Committees/Core Committees organized during the period and gist of the discussions and decisions taken are given below:

EXPERT COMMITTEES/SUB-COMMITTEES/MEETINGS OF EXPERTS

Meeting of the Expert Committee on Hearing Impairment held on 18-19 April, 2016 at RCI, New Delhi

A meeting of the Expert Committee was held on 18-19 April, 2016 and the following decisions were taken:

Inclusion of ISL 'A' Level content in B.Ed. & B.Ed.Spl.Ed.(HI) and 'B' Level in M.Ed.Spl.Ed.(HI) as compulsory syllabus

- (i) In addition to the existing prescribed hours in the B.Ed. Spl.Ed. (HI) syllabus, 200 hours of Indian Sign Language (ISL) shall be covered through "Notional Hours" by the centre/institute/organization/university by holding workshops/evening classes spread across the four semesters. The candidates undergoing B.Ed.Spl.Ed. (HI) would also be certified as Foundation in ISL. The certificate may be issued by the respective recognised centres of RCI running the said programme.
- (ii) For the M.Ed.Spl.Ed. (HI) syllabus revised in 2015-16, the members opined that it is not feasible to include ISL 'B' Level in M.Ed.Spl.Ed. syllabus as many of the candidates would not have undergone the ISL 'A' Level course. Because of the following reasons:
 - a. One of the eligibility criterion for M.Ed.Spl.Ed.(HI) is General B.Ed. with D.Ed.Spl.Ed.(HI). Another criteria is PG Diploma in Special Education along with General B.Ed.
 - b. Candidates also take admission after some years of work experience and the old Course B.Ed.Sp.Ed.(HI) did not have components of ISL 'A' Level.

The institutes conducting B.Ed.Sp.Ed.(HI) and M.Ed.Sp.Ed.(HI) can enrol the M.Ed.candidates in the workshops being conducted for ISL and those who do not have B.Ed.Sp.Ed. (HI) and have only M.Ed.Sp.Ed.(HI) will organise minimum 2 CRE programmes in ISL of 60 hour duration.

Diploma in Master Trainers in Training Teachers in Early Intervention of Deaf Children in Auditory Oral Option

On going through the contents submitted by Balavidyalaya, the members opined that the said Course could be titled as a 'Short-Term' Training in Early Childhood Special Education- HI in Dhvani Methodology for Master Trainers. The duration and other details re-submitted to RCI have been agreed upon by the members. The training programme will be considered for 50 CRE points and would be appropriately certified by RCI as CREs.



Experts participating in the Expert Committee Meeting on Hearing Impairment held at RCI on 18-19 April, 2016

Development of Post Graduate Diploma in Indian Sign Language Interpretation (PGDISLI) Course

The ISL experts had an understanding that the recently revised DISLI Course could be re-titled as PGDISLI by making changes in the eligibility criteria from standard to graduation and also revising the content of syllabus of DISLI Course and thereafter DISLI Course could be withdrawn.



The Council informed that withdrawal of DISU programme at this juncture is not feasible as inspection and approval for offering DISU programme has already been communicated to the concerned institutes.

Development of B.A. (ISU) Course

Prof. Amuthavalli suggested that title and content of the programme may be submitted to UGC for consideration and notification of nomenclature of the degree. For developing the content of the said programme, experts were nominated.

Development of Certificate Course in Indian Sign Language Interpretation

Experts of ISL felt that the Certificate Course in Indian Sign Language Interpretation (ISU) is not necessary as there is already DISU programme and two more programmes, i.e. PGDISU and BA ISU are proposed to be developed. Instead of Certificate in ISU, members suggested to develop a Diploma in ISL Teaching.

Meeting of Expert Committee for the Development of Training Programmes in the Field of Cerebral Palsy, Autism and Multiple Disabilities held from 17-19 May, 2016 at NIEPMD, Chennai

This meeting was convened to consider the following syllabi proposed by NIEPMD, Chennai:

1. M.Ed.Spl.Ed. (Multiple Disabilities)
2. M.Ed.Spl.Ed. (Autism Spectrum Disorders)
3. B.Ed.Spl.Ed. (Deaf blindness)
4. D.Ed.Spl.Ed. (Multiple Disabilities)

The Committee suggested that the objective of the papers should be framed so that they reflect the overall objective of D.Ed.Spl.Ed.(MD) and M.Ed.Spl.Ed.(MD). Activities listed under each paper should be reviewed and matched with the content therein. The reference under each paper should consist of books that have been published recently. Books on multiple disabilities should also be included.

Meeting of Experts to Prepare a Scheme for Persons Affected by Leprosy held on 07-08 September, 2016 at RCI, New Delhi

Following decisions were taken in the meeting:

1. Guidelines of the Scheme and Training Module were prepared and finalized.
2. Scheme-I (Training of Trainers/Patients) on Disability Management Training of Persons with Grade-1 & 2 Disability due to Leprosy was prepared.
3. Scheme-II for Self-help Training and Institutional Based Support Services for Persons Affected by Leprosy having advance Grade-II disability (patients & healthy family members) has also been prepared.
4. The above Schemes include Proposal, Application Format, Reporting Format, Budget, etc.



Meeting of the Sub-Committee on Course Curriculum of Masters' Programme in Audiology and Speech-language Pathology held on 26-27 September, 2016 at the School of Audiology & Speech-Language Pathology, Bharati Vidyapeeth, Pune

1. Prof. M Jayaram, Chairperson, Expert Committee shared his thoughts and ideas about the proposed revision of Master Degree programmes in Audiology and Speech Language Pathology keeping in view the recent developments in the field and the global scenario. He suggested that the Master's degree programmes should be in a single discipline/specialization rather than two disciplines/specializations. He pointed out that each of the two disciplines of Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology have grown vastly in our country and conducting a dual discipline programme does not do justice for either field. Besides, running a combined degree is not in tune with global practice. He also briefed the members on the need for keeping a healthy ratio between the number of seats in bachelors' and masters' programmes so that the field will not be considered 'top heavy'. It should also be ensured that there are adequate number of assistants to assist the experts.

2. Shri S.K. Srivastava, Member Secretary, appreciated the effort of the Committee in revising the syllabi. He emphasized the need for regular revision of the programmes. He expressed his apprehension about discontinuation of on-going combined Master degree programmes and urged the members to suggest measures to ensure that holders of combined master degree programmes are not put to any disadvantage. He also drew the attention of the members to the advancements in this field elsewhere and the need for specific programmes such as Clinical Doctorate in Audiology (AuD) so that our post-graduate candidates are considered on par with specialists in other fields, notably medicine.

Following decisions were taken in the meeting:

- It was resolved to request RCI that in future Chairman of the Sub-committees in different disability areas should be invited as special invitees to the meeting of the Executive Committee of RCI to facilitate justification of the programmes/issues of the different Sub-Committees before Executive Committee.
- It was decided by the Committee that RCI should discontinue the combined master degree programmes, viz. M.Sc. (Speech and Hearing) and Masters in Audiology and Speech Language Pathology (M.ASLP) from the academic session 2018-19. There should be two master degree programmes - one in Speech- Language Pathology (M.Sc in Speech Language Pathology) and the second in Audiology (M.Sc in Audiology).
- RCI should declare that M.Sc. in Speech Language Pathology, M.Sc. in Audiology and the combined M.ASLP/M.Sc.-Speech & Hearing are equivalent degrees so that holders of combined M.ASLP/M.Sc.-Speech & Hearing are not put to any disadvantage. The speech and hearing institutions in the country may consider, with the approval of RCI, offering bridge course for holders of combined M.ASLP/M.Sc.-Speech & Hearing depending on the particular needs of their institutions.



- d) It was resolved to request RCI to write to different institutions in the country in the public sector as well as in the private sector, to include all the three qualifications, namely, M.Sc in Speech Language Pathology, M.Sc. in Audiology and the combined MASLP as qualifications in their recruitment rules/ (posts) or eligibility rules (Scholarship/Fellowship etc.) wherever masters' qualification is stipulated.
- e) In tune with other Master degree programmes in the country and the directives of the UGC and Inter-University Boards, the bifurcated Master degree programmes shall be offered on semester pattern and with that the annual pattern shall cease to exist. RCI should take up this issue with different Universities, if required.
- f) All institutions offering combined master degree programmes in the area of speech and hearing shall discontinue the programme and offer two master degree programmes - one in Speech Language Pathology (M.Sc. in Speech Language Pathology) and second in Audiology (M.Sc. in Audiology), in the semester pattern, from the academic year 2018-19. However, institutions are free to offer these programmes from the academic year 2017-18 itself, if they so desire. Such institutions shall co-ordinate with their respective Universities on the means and methods of implementation of the new training programmes.
- g) It was decided that the ratio of seats in the bachelors' and masters' programmes should be 1:0.5 (or 2:1). In other words, the number of seats for masters' programmes should be limited to 50% of the sanctioned intake for B.ASLP in any given institution. This would ensure that experts will have sufficient number of assistants to help them in their work. It would also address the issue of unemployment.
- h) It was also decided that RCI should take up with Universities the issue of supernumerary seats for admission to RCI approved training programmes and persuade them to do away with this practice. Ideally, sanctioned intake communicated by RCI through Certificate of Approval should be considered as final intake and no enhancement should be considered. RCI should convince the different Universities on how this system of supernumerary seats will affect the quality/standard of clinical programmes like speech and hearing. However, if the Universities cannot be convinced with the thinking of RCI on this issue, then the sanctioned strength of a given institute will be suitably adjusted to ensure that the Intake (sanctioned strength + supernumerary seats) shall not exceed 50% of the intake capacity of the bachelors' programme in any given institution.
- i) The issue of adopting Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) in speech and hearing training programmes was discussed at length and it was decided that implementation of CBCS in a clinical field like speech and hearing may not be practical. It was, however, decided to revisit the issue once more, number of complementary Courses are available in the core as well as related fields.
- j) It was decided to revise curriculum for only bifurcated programmes of M.Sc. in Speech Language Pathology and M.Sc. in Audiology. Furthermore, only the semester system was considered for revision as it is planned that all the institutions will adopt the semester system by the academic year 2018-19.

- k) It was decided to provide equal number of hours for clinical and theory work in the revised curriculum. It was also resolved (i) that students can start their dissertation work starting from the 3rd semester, (ii) to provide more number of hours for dissertation work in the 4th semester, and that (iii) the dissertation will be evaluated by two external examiners for 100 Marks. It was also suggested that the students should be encouraged to submit, along with their dissertation, a submission-ready manuscript based on their dissertation work.
- l) It was decided to have 16 theory papers in each course, 5 in semester 1, 6 in semester 2, 5 in semester 3 and just 1 in semester 4. There shall be a clinical examination at the end of every semester. Clinical evaluation by the internal examiners (or the faculty) will be a continuous process throughout the year and shall be the average of the marks given by all the faculty members of the core department. Dissertation will be evaluated by two external examiners for 100 Marks.

Meeting of the RCI Expert Committee for Development of Training Programmes for the Professionals/Personnel, namely, Audiologists & Speech Pathologists, Hearing Aid and Earmould Technicians held on 9-10 February, 2017 at the National Institute of Mental Health and Neurosciences, Bangalore

After detailed deliberations, following recommendations were made by the Expert Committee:

1. The Council should discontinue the combined Master degree programmes (M.Sc. Speech and Hearing and M.ASLP) from the academic year 2018-19. In its place, there should be two Master degree programmes - one in Speech Language Pathology (M.Sc. in Speech Language Pathology) and the second in Audiology (M.Sc. in Audiology).
2. The Council should declare that the master degree programmes in M.Sc. Speech & Hearing/ M.ASLP shall be equivalent to master degree programmes in M.Sc. in Speech Language Pathology and/or M.Sc. in Audiology. This will ensure that M.Sc. Speech & Hearing/M.ASLP candidates are not put to any disadvantage.
3. In tune with other master degree programmes in the country and the directives of the UGC and Inter-University Boards, the bifurcated Master degree programmes shall be offered on semester pattern and with that the annual pattern shall cease to exist. RCI should take up this issue with different Universities, if required.
4. All institutions offering combined master degree programmes in the area of speech and hearing shall discontinue the programme and offer two master degree programmes in its place - one in Speech-Language Pathology (M.Sc. in Speech-Language Pathology) and the second in Audiology (M.Sc. in Audiology), in the semester pattern, from the academic year 2018-19.
5. It was resolved that the ratio of seats in the Bachelors' and Masters' programme should 1: 0.5 (or 2: 1). In other words, the number of seats in each of the Masters' programme should be limited to 50% of the sanctioned intake for B.ASLP in any given institution. This would ensure that experts will have sufficient number of assistants to help them in their work. It would also address the issue of unemployment. Core faculty and student ratio should not exceed 1:3.



6. Only those institutions who have conducted B.ASLP programmes for at least 5 years shall be permitted hereafter to offer Masters' programmes in Audiology, Speech-Language Pathology or both.
7. Norms, guidelines, admission criteria and content of M.Sc. (Audiology) and M.Sc. (Speech Language Pathology) were revised.
8. The issue of adopting Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) in speech and hearing training programmes (U.G. & P.G.) was discussed at length, and it was resolved that implementation of CBCS in a clinical field like Audiology and Speech Language Pathology is not practical and need not be pursued by the institutions offering B.ASLP and M.Sc. (Speech Language Pathology), M.Sc. (Audiology).

Meeting of the Expert Committee for Development of Training Programmes for the Professionals/Personnel, namely, Clinical Psychologists and Rehabilitation Psychologists held on 16th March, 2017 at Rehabilitation Council of India, New Delhi

A meeting of the Expert Committee was held on March 16, 2017 to revise the Post Graduate Diploma in Rehabilitation Psychology (PGDRP) programme. Following decisions were taken:

1. Syllabus of Post Graduate Diploma in Rehabilitation Psychology (PGDRP) was revised with Papers having been reduced from six to four papers. References shall be revised by the members of Expert Committee and will be sent within a week.
2. Visiting experts deputed for inspection for approval of institutions may include only Associate Professor/Professor having M.Phil.(Clinical Psychology) and Ph.D with CRR No., five years of post M.Phil. teaching experience and providing clinical services. No experts who are not working as faculty for M.Phil. (Clinical Psychology) and not providing clinical services shall be deputed as visiting experts in Clinical Psychology area.
3. There should be an independent department to offer M.Phil. (Clinical Psychology) programme.
4. Chairperson, Expert Committee informed about the letter of CIP, Ranchi forwarded to him regarding non-recognition of M.Phil. (Clinical Psychology) programme. Members unanimously suggested that uniform standard should be adopted while granting approval to institutions. It has been observed that some institutions have been accorded approval based on contractual appointment of faculty and some institutions have been denied approval in spite of having requisite faculty on contractual basis.
5. Norms and guidelines mentioned in respective syllabi should be strictly adhered while inspection.
6. The Council should obtain undertaking from each faculty member associated with the specific institute that they are not associated/employed with any other institution.

Meeting of the Expert Committee for Development of Training Programmes to Promote Courses in Inclusive Education and Multi-category Teacher Training held on 23-24 March, 2017

After detailed deliberations on the agenda points, following decisions were taken during the meeting:

1. B.A./B.Com./B.Sc.B.Ed.Spl.Ed. (4 Years Integrated) syllabus was discussed at length and content of the syllabus was approved with comments/suggestions.
2. Suggested comments shall be incorporated in the syllabus by Amity University within a week.
3. Sequencing of the papers has to be done as per the relevance (credits & hours).
4. References should be updated.
5. After receiving the draft syllabus from Amity University, the Council shall circulate it to all members of Expert Committee for final approval.
6. Specialization in disability area has been discussed. Amity University shall submit the structure along with added component.
7. This programme may be opened from the academic year 2017-18 subject to fulfilment of norms and guidelines of the Council.
8. Only a University shall be eligible to offer this programme.



Experts participating in the Expert Committee Meeting on Development of Training Programmes to Promote Courses in Inclusive Education and Multi-category Teacher Training held on 23-24 March, 2017



Meeting of the Expert Committee for the Development of Training Programmes for the Categories of Special Teachers for Educating and Training the Persons with Mental Retardation and Rehabilitation Practitioners in Mental Retardation & Learning Disability held on 28-29 March, 2017

After detailed deliberation on the agenda points, following recommendations have been made :

1. Annual Examination of Diploma in Education-Special Education (Mental Retardation/ Intellectual Disability) - The matter was deliberated in detail. The Committee suggested that examination pattern of D.Ed.Spl.Ed. may be done on yearly basis. Since the programme is in operation and Course is due for revision in next academic year, i.e. 2018-19, the Council may permit the examining body to conduct examination of two semesters in case of academic and administrative issues.
2. Revision of Post Graduate Diploma in Early Identification (PGDEI) – The Committee suggested that the revision/continuation of this programme may be done along with revision of D.Ed.Spl.Ed. programme. In case of non-operation of the programme, this Course may be discontinued.
3. Following decisions were taken for B.Ed. & M.Ed.Spl.Ed. (MR/ID) (3 Years Integrated) programme and B.Ed. & -M.Ed.Spl.Ed.(LD) (3 Years Integrated) programme:
 - Courses/Papers have to be sequenced as per Semester (theory and practical should be matched in each semester).
 - Objectives should be changed and written as per unit listed in each course/paper.
 - Suggested correction/modification shall be incorporated by Amity University and submitted to the Council within a week for circulation to all members of Expert committee for their approval.
 - B.Ed.-M.Ed.Spl.Ed. in Intellectual Disability and Specific Learning Disability (Integrated 3 Years) shall be offered on pilot basis for two batches, i.e., for 4 years.
 - These two programmes shall be reviewed after 4 years before opening to other institutions.
 - Duplication of content should be avoided.
 - No. of Unit /sub-unit should be uniform across the papers as per credits.
 - The Council may write to UGC for notification of Nomenclature of Degree.
 - Practical components need to be worked out in detail for both the Courses and same shall be included in the final document.
 - Credits and hours of each Course should be reworked in accordance with hours available in the semester.



Meeting regarding Equivalency of B.Ed.Spl.Ed. and M.Ed.Spl.Ed. with B.Ed. (General) and M.Ed. (General) and Non-inclusion of Faculty from Special Education in NCTE (Recognition Norms and Procedure) Regulation, 2014 held on April 11, 2016 at Rehabilitation Council of India, New Delhi

A meeting of experts regarding equivalency of B.Ed. Spl. Ed. and M.Ed. Spl. Ed. with B.Ed. (General) and M.Ed. (General) was held at RCI. Following recommendations were made:

- (i) Candidates with B.Ed. (Spl. Ed.) and M.Ed. (Spl. Ed.) qualifications must avail the opportunity in general stream also as they are equipped with skills to manage the disabled learners in special/inclusive schools and also both disabled and non-disabled learners in inclusive schools since according to PWD Act, 1995 and RTE Act, 2009, students with disabilities have a right to be placed and receive quality education in the mainstream schools and whereas if a teacher having special education qualification can serve both types of learners in a better way.
- (ii) Eligibility criteria for admission to B.Ed.Spl.Ed. should be as per NCTE notification 2014.
- (iii) Programmes of B.Ed.Spl.Ed. and M.Ed.Spl.Ed. have been reframed and restructured as per NCTE notification 2014.
- (iv) Equivalency has to be decided based on different criterion such as admission, duration, course content, etc. The objectives of both B.Ed. (General) and M.Ed. (General) and B.Ed.Spl.Ed. and M.Ed.Spl.Ed. are different so it may not be appropriate to decide equivalency without examining all possible aspects.
- (v) It was decided to reconstitute the Committee including more experts/members from UGC, NCTE, NCERT and RCI to resolve the issue of equivalency in line of NCTE Notification, 2014. AIU representative may also be included in the Committee.

Meeting of the Committee to prepare a Scheme/Course for Disabilities Management Training of Leprosy Cured Persons held on May 26, 2016 at RCI, New Delhi

A meeting was organized to prepare a Training Course for Disabilities Management Training of Leprosy Cured Persons to make the Leprosy affected disabled persons to adopt self-care practices, to take care of their disabilities and to prevent further problems and to suggest a Scheme of pattern of assistance for implementing the same.

Following decisions were taken:

- (a) Two types of training Courses need to be developed – one for Disability Gr. I and II Leprosy affected persons in the field based training who require similar types of services which should be field based. For advance disability of above Grade II Leprosy, it should be institutional based as a referral hospital where the needed beneficiaries of Lymphatic Filariasis could be added.
- (b) Experts were divided into two groups for preparing draft the Scheme/Course. Both the groups will develop a Training Course and Scheme on the lines of the terms of reference and including other areas.



Meeting for B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. & B.Ed.Spl.Ed. and B.Ed.M.Ed.Spl.Ed. (Integrated Programme) held on June 17, 2016 at Dr. Shakuntala Misra National Rehabilitation University, Lucknow

A meeting of experts was held at DSMNRU, Lucknow to discuss the continuation of BA/B.Sc/B.Com B.Ed.Sp.Ed. (4 Years) in view of NCTE Regulations, 2014 and Proposal for Launching of B.Ed. & M.Ed.Spl.Ed. (Integrated 03 Years) programme from the session 2016-17.

After detailed deliberation following recommendations have been made:

1. Committee unanimously approved introduction of 4 Year Integrated Programme of B.A./B.Com/B.Sc B.Ed.Spl.Ed. as NCTE has already approved this module which is operational. Likewise introduction of B.Ed.M.Ed.Spl.Ed. (3 Years) programme was also approved.
2. The content of B.A./B.Com/B.Sc B.Ed. Spl.Ed. Programme should have the complete content of new B.Ed. Spl.Ed., 2015. Liberty provided by UGC regarding relaxation of content for integrated programme may be considered while drafting the curriculum.
3. Award of B.A./B.Com/B.Sc B.Ed. Spl.Ed. degree should be in single disability for career prospect in higher education and employment opportunity as at present programmes at Diploma, Bachelor and Master level are in single disability.
4. Only Universities should be permitted to offer the Integrated B.A./B.Com/B.Sc B.Ed. Spl.Ed.
5. Other stake holders may be consulted regarding B.A./B.Com/B.Sc B.Ed.Spl.Ed. programme.
6. Exit policy in Integrated B.A./B.Com/B.Sc B.Ed.Spl.Ed. programme may be subject specific (Art, Science and Commerce) subject to approval of respective Universities.
7. B.A./B.Com/B.Sc B.Ed. Spl.Ed. Integrated Programme should be kept on hold till the syllabus is modified as per B.Ed.Spl.Ed. 2015 syllabus approved by the respective Committee.
8. Modified Content of B.A./B.Com/B.Sc B.Ed.Spl.Ed. Programme should be submitted by Amity University which may be placed before respective Committees.
9. Committee appreciated the initiative of Amity University for B.Ed.-M.Ed.Spl.Ed. (3 Years) programme and recommended that content of Programme should include the revised B.Ed.Spl.Ed. and M.Ed.Spl.Ed. of specific disability.
10. Integration of B.Ed.-M.Ed.Spl.Ed. should be done in accordance with NCTE guidelines. Relaxation in content should be as per the norms of UGC.
11. Modified content of B.Ed.-M.Ed.Spl.Ed. programme should be submitted by Amity University and the same may be placed before the Committee.
12. To finalize the integrated programmes in special education, an Expert Group may be constituted by RCI.

Meeting of the Apex Advisory Committee to consider Higher Education Programmes in Audiology and Speech Language Pathology held on October 17, 2016 at Goa

A meeting of the Apex Advisory Committee constituted by the Council was held on October 17, 2017. Dr. Vinod Aggarwal, Secretary, DEPWD & Chairperson, RCI, Shri S K Srivastava, Member



Secretary, RCI, Prof. M. Jayaram, Chairperson, Expert Committee and other experts participated in the meeting.

The issues raised by the members were discussed at length and the members recommended the following:

1. The need for higher level programmes in Audiology was discussed and the members agreed that the country needs a clinical programme like Doctor in Audiology (AuD). In addition, the members were unanimous in their recommendation that there should be a parallel programme of Doctor in Speech- Language Pathology (SLPD).
2. It was agreed that the duration of the programme shall be four years after graduation in audiology and speech language pathology. The issue of an Integrated Course leading to Doctorate of Audiology and Ph. D can be considered at a later stage.
3. The members agreed that bifurcated post graduate degrees M.Sc. (Audiology) and M.Sc. (Speech –Language Pathology)) should be continued.
4. The AuD/ SLPD shall not be at par with Ph.D Degree in the discipline.
5. The entry point of service for doctor in audiology was discussed and recommended that such doctors should be employed at the level of Assistant Professor or equivalent at Govt. / Private Organizations. Further, service progression may depend on the policies and regulation of respective institutions.
6. Rehabilitation Council of India may recognize the course/programme after rules and regulations of the programme are finalized and may also write to all the Universities to implement this programme in their University.
7. Only those institutions offering master's programme in this area and fulfilling infrastructure and other criteria as approved by RCI shall be considered eligible to offer AuD/SLPD programme.
8. The issue of MoU with Universities in USA and other countries was considered for running this programme in India and the consensus was that there can be mutual collaboration on equal basis between institutions in India and other countries and there could be exchange programme.
9. The institutions offering AuD programmes in India may enter into MoU with institutions in USA and other countries and conduct the Course as per rules and regulations of the Indian Universities. Initially, the programme may be implemented on pilot basis to be revisited after five years, subject to approval of RCI.
10. The Advisory Committee will develop Course Curriculum for the proposed programmes.
11. The Council may consider recognizing the institutions willing to offer AuD programme from next academic session 2017-18 provided all formalities are completed.
12. Advanced Certificate Courses/Fellowship Programmes (for example Cochlear Implants, Vestibular Sciences, Tinnitus and Hyperacusis, etc) may be considered by institutions and appropriate proposals may be placed before RCI.



Meeting of Experts held on January 17, 2017 at RCI, New Delhi

A meeting of experts was held on January 17, 2017 to discuss the issue of qualifying examination for CODA, SODA and Experienced Non-Certified Interpreters. After detailed deliberations on the agenda points, following recommendation were made:

1. In order to provide opportunity to persons who have completed Level A, Level B and Level C (part of old syllabus of DISLI) shall be continued for next two years i.e., till July, 2019. After July, 2019, Old Level B and Level C shall be discontinued. The examination of Level B and Level C shall continue to be conducted by AYJNISHD, Mumbai.
2. Syllabi of Level A, Level B and Level C shall be developed as per revised syllabus of Diploma in Indian Sign Language Interpretation (DISLI) Course implemented in 2016.
3. Examination for CODA, SODA and experienced Non-Certified Interpreters shall be held as per new syllabus of Level A. ISLRTC shall conduct the examination for the same. Relaxation in attendance for Level A module shall be considered by the Director, ISLRTC.
4. There will not be separate Course content for Level A for SODA/CODA.
5. Examination of DISLI (old) shall continue to be conducted by AYJNISHD, Mumbai.
6. Examination of DISLI (revised 2016) shall be conducted by ISLRTC, New Delhi.

Meeting of the Committee for consideration of National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) Accreditation of RCI approved Institutions offering Bachelor and above level Programmes held on March 01, 2017 at Rehabilitation Council of India, New Delhi

A meeting was held at RCI with National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) regarding accreditation of RCI approved Institutions by NAAC. After detailed discussions, following recommendations have been made:

1. NAAC Accreditation is required for the institutions offering Bachelor and above level programmes for minimum of six years or two passed out batches, whichever is earlier.
2. Institutions must upload Self Study Report (SSR)/Self Appraisal Report (SAR) on Institutional website and apply Letter of Intent (LOI) to NAAC by April, 2018. Once LOI is submitted to NAAC by the institution, RCI may consider their application for recognition subject to fulfillment of other criteria.
3. Separate manual in tune with the current process may be developed by NAAC with the help of experts from RCI by October, 2017 for RCI approved institutions offering bachelor and above level programmes in Disability Rehabilitation and Special Education.
4. NAAC may conduct a Workshop for training of assessors and awareness/orientation programmes for the institutions.
5. RCI shall request NAAC to waive assessment and accreditation fee.
6. In case, institutions could not get NAAC accreditation due to shortcomings/ rejection of LOI, institutions shall be given one year time by RCI to comply with shortcomings.



7. The Council should take up the matter with UGC not to impose the condition of NAAC accreditation for the academic session 2018-19.
8. RCI shall upload the list of approved institutions offering bachelor and above level programmes.
9. RCI may enter an MoU with NAAC to facilitate assessment and accreditation of institutions offering RCI approved Bachelor and above level programmes on priority basis.

Meeting of the Apex Advisory Committee on Development of Higher Education Programmes in Speech and Hearing held on March 02, 2017 at Rehabilitation Council of India, New Delhi

Second Meeting of the Apex Advisory Committee was held at RCI, New Delhi on March 02, 2017 in which following recommendations were made:

1. Nomenclature of the programme shall be Clinical Doctorate in Audiology abbreviated as Au.D and Clinical Doctorate in Speech-Language Pathology abbreviated as SLP.D.
2. There shall be three programmes in each area: Au.D Post Bachelor's Scheme, Au.D Post M.Sc. (Audiology) Scheme and Au.D Post Master's Scheme (Speech & Hearing). Separate rules, regulations and content for these three programmes need to be developed. The duration of Au.D and SLP.D shall be of four years after B.ASLP, three years after M.ASLP / M.Sc. (Sp. & Hg.) and two years after M.Sc. (Audiology) or M.Sc. (Speech-Language Pathology).
3. It was decided to introduce 4 additional papers which would help to achieve the objectives of the clinical doctorate programme.
4. Clinical practicum for the last two semesters of the Au.D and SLP.D programme are to be developed. Members have been requested to provide input to the Chairperson, Expert Committee.
5. RCI may have to revisit its policy on minimum educational level and position of audiologists and speech-language pathologists who are eligible to practice independently, particularly with the availability of professionals with Masters' and clinical doctorate degrees.
6. Au.D and SLP.D programme shall be implemented on pilot basis from 2018-19 and reviewed three years after inception.
7. RCI shall constitute a 3-member Committee which will identify institutions where internship can be undertaken as part of clinical doctorate programme in Audiology and/or Speech-Language Pathology. Internship shall not be allowed in institutions not recommended by this high level Committee.
8. The issue of introduction of M.Sc. (Clinical Audiology) and Bridge Programme of Salus University was discussed. It was decided that this matter will be reviewed after the completion of pilot programme of Au.D. and SLP.D. in face to face mode.
9. The issue of Au.D with international collaboration was discussed. It was decided to leave this issue to the participating institutions with the stipulation that institutions entering into international collaboration shall do so without violating the rules and regulations of the programme and meeting all the requirement of the Government of India in this regard.



10. RCI may explore ways and means of facilitating international student exchange programme and help institutions relating to approvals from different Ministries of the Government of India. Norms of MCI on International Student Exchange Programme may be followed in this regard.

Meeting of Experts held on March 21-22, 2017 at Rehabilitation Council of India

A meeting of Experts was held for development of norms, guidelines and content of Diploma in Inclusive Education. Following recommendations have been made:

- a. Development of Diploma in Inclusive Education programme was discussed at length and after deliberation, Committee recommended to defer the development of programme due to various administrative reasons.
- b. Instead of Diploma in Inclusive Education, the Committee suggested to develop a 6 months Advanced Certificate in Inclusive Education (Cross Disability).
- c. Accordingly, the draft norms, guidelines and content have been developed and same shall be circulated to all members.
- d. Application format for candidates and institutions have also been developed.
- e. RCI may establish a Cell to monitor the implementation of this programme. The Council may also appoint a Consultant, a Programme Officer and a Data Entry Operator.
- f. Resource materials shall be developed in e-format.
- g. Draft list of writers/contributors/editors/coordinators has also been suggested.
- h. Norms for Institutions working in the field of inclusive education but not offering RCI approved programme may also be considered at later stage to offer this programme subject to fulfilment of RCI norms and guidelines to be developed for this programme.
- i. Next meeting for final review of norms, guidelines, content, practical component, references and e-resource material may be held at NIEPMD, Chennai, preferably before 26 April, 2017. Draft minutes, norms, guidelines, content may be circulated to all members for their consideration and comments.
- j. The Course may be offered on pilot basis for one batch and first fifty eligible institutions who apply may be considered to offer this programme.
- k. Remaining Institutions who apply may be considered after review of pilot programme for next batch.
- l. The Council may develop a separate portal for receipt of applications. Applications received through e-portal and completed in all respect may be considered for processing and approval. Approval may be communicated through e-mode to expedite the process. Likewise list of admitted students by the Institutions may also be obtained on prescribed format before commencement of the programme and later hard copy of proposal and list may also be asked from the organizations.

SPECIAL COMPONENT PLAN FOR NORTH EAST REGION

Govt. of India has given special focus to development of services in North East region and has made allocations under Special Component Plan for North East Region for the financial year 2016-17. The existing training institutions are inadequate to serve the persons with disabilities and bring them in the mainstream development of society. The trained professionals/personnel in the field of Special Education and Disability Rehabilitation for catering the needs of children with disabilities are too less in North-Eastern Region (NER). It is also pertinent to mention that the presence of GOs and NGOs in North East is minimal as compared to other States. Following activities were organized in North East region to utilize the funds allocated under SCP.

(i) Capacity Building of Professionals/Personnel

- Seminar on Capacity Building of Rehabilitation Professionals for Persons with Disabilities in North-Eastern States was organized from 07-09 September, 2016 at Namsai.
- Seminar on Capacity Building of Rehabilitation Professionals for Persons with Disabilities in North-Eastern States was organized on 04-05 October, 2016 at Aizawl.
- Bethany Society organized Refresher Course on Braille and Mobility Skills from 20 to 24 March, 2017 at Shillong.

(ii) Financial Assistance for Human Resource Development

- Financial Assistance for Human Resource Development Programme in Disability Rehabilitation & Special Education in North-Eastern Region was given to All Manipur Mentally Handicapped Person's Welfare Organisation, Keishamthong, Imphal for running D.Ed.Spl.Ed.(MR) programme.
- Financial Assistance for Human Resource Development Programme in Disability Rehabilitation & Special Education in North-Eastern Region was given to Shishu Sarothi, Guwahati for running D.Ed.Spl.Ed.(CP) programme.

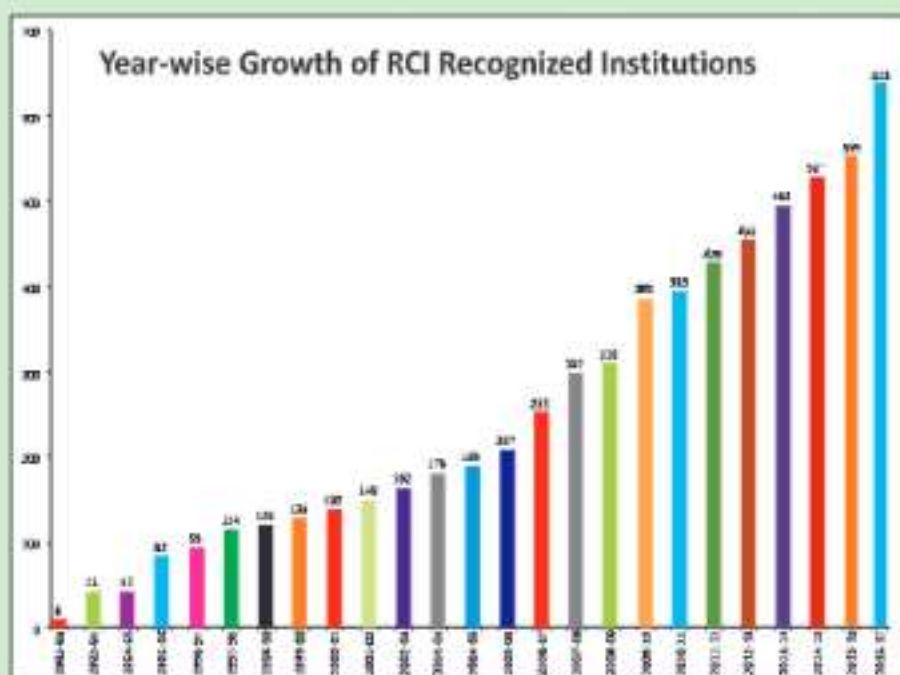

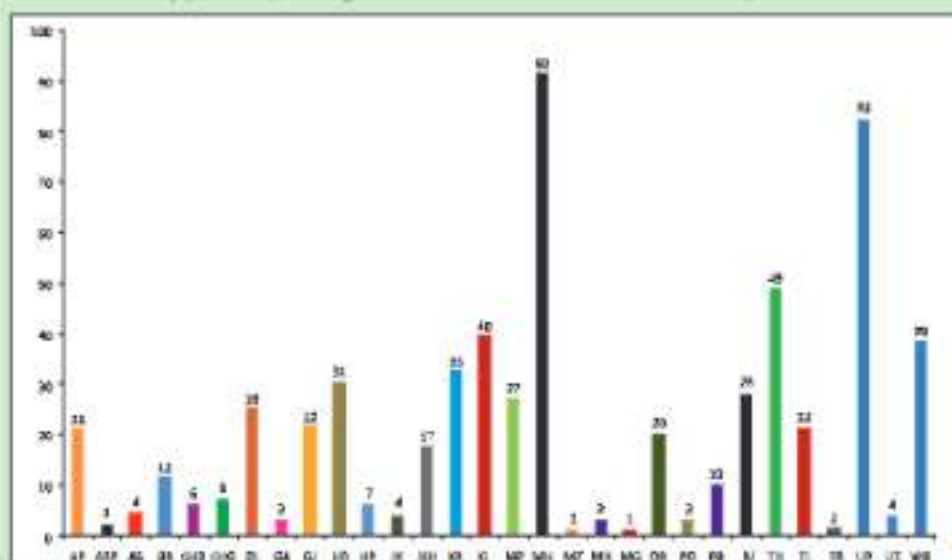

CHAPTER – 4

NATIONAL BOARD OF EXAMINATION IN REHABILITATION (NBER)

The National Board of Examination in Rehabilitation (NBER) has been set up as a Society registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860 in 2006. NBER is an adjunct body of the Rehabilitation Council of India established for conducting examinations of Certificate/Diploma level courses approved by the Council. In exercise of the powers conferred by Sub-Section (k) of Section 29 of the Rehabilitation Council of India Act, 1992 (34 of 1992), Regulations for Conduct of Examinations were notified by the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment on 8th June, 2014. Governing Body of NBER was also constituted vide Order No. 7-19(1)/Exam. Main (NBER)/2014/RCI/8608-28 dated 09th January, 2015. A copy of the members of Governing Body of NBER is placed at Annexure-4.1.

Issuance of Diploma Certificates to IGNOU Candidates for the Academic Session 2010-11 and 2011-12

During the academic session 2010-11 and 2011-12, annual examinations in respect of Diploma/ Certificate level Courses operational at RCI approved training institutions were conducted by the National Centre of Disability Studies (NCDS), Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU) on behalf of the Council. However, due to some administrative reasons, the NCDS, IGNOU refused to issue Diploma Certificates to these candidates for which statements of marks were issued by 16 November, 2016. As per the direction of the Council, NBER has issued 6991 Diploma Certificates to the respective candidates based on statement of marks issued by NCDS, IGNOU for the academic session 2010-11 and 2011-12 till date. Accordingly, data of all these candidates is maintained in NBER.

Issuance of Diploma Certificate for D.C.E. (VI)

The Blind Relief Association, New Delhi was permitted by the Council to conduct the D.C.E. (VI) Course on pilot basis during the academic session 2014-15 for which examinations were conducted by NBER. On successful completion of the programme, NBER issued statement of marks and Diploma Certificates to all 17 students. However, from the academic session 2015-16, responsibility to conduct the examination of the above Course has been given to National Institute for the Empowerment of Persons with Visual Impairment (Divyangjan), Dehradun.

Revision of Scheme of Examination, 2016

The Scheme of Examination, 2016 was revised and placed before the Executive Committee in its 74th Meeting held on 2nd February, 2017 and General Body of NBER in its meeting held on 28th February, 2017. The revised Scheme has been uploaded on Council's website.

Information on the RCI website

Relevant circulars, i.e. admission criteria and reservation policy for admission to Diploma/ Certificate level Courses at various Institutes for the academic session 2016-17, Scheme of Examinations, 2016, instructions issued to the respective National Institutes to conduct the examinations for the academic session 2016-17 etc. were uploaded on the Council website from time to time for the benefit of institutions and students.



Fee Sharing between NBER and respective National Institutes

During the meeting of Directors of all the National Institutes held under the Chairmanship of Dr. Kamlesh Kumar Pandey, Chief Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities and Chairperson, RCI on 28th February, 2017 at RCI, New Delhi, it was decided that incidental charges will be shared between RCI and the examining body in the ratio of 50:50 and training institutes to be asked to pay the 50% of incidental charges separately to RCI and examining bodies within the prescribed time.

Updation of Data in respect of Affiliation/Incidental Charges

NBER has been updating the information with regard to affiliation/incidental charges of Certificate/Diploma level Courses being conducted at various RCI approved training institutions across the country. At present, 495 batches of Certificate/Diploma level Courses are being conducted at these institutions for which a database with regard to affiliation/incidental charges for the financial year 2015-16 & 2016-17 has been updated. It has been observed that most of the institutions do not remit their required fee to NBER on time and NBER has written to the concerned institutions to remit their dues immediately.

Orientation Programme conducted at NIEPMD, Chennai

02 days Orientation Programme for Course Co-ordinators of D.Ed. Spl. Ed. (CP), D.Ed. Spl. Ed. (ASD), CCCG and DBDT courses was organized by NIEPMD, Chennai on 08-09 June, 2016 at Chennai where 225 participants (150 residential and 75 non-residential) attended the programme.

Meeting of General Body of National Board of Examination (NBER)

2nd Meeting of the General Body of National Board of Examination in Rehabilitation (NBER) was held under the Chairmanship of Dr. Kamlesh Kumar Pandey, Chief Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities and Chairperson, RCI on 28th February, 2017. During the meeting, a proposal with regard to development of a "Data Management Software", that would facilitate the examination related work of NBER, was placed before the General Body members. After deliberation, the General Body accorded its approval for conducting a Workshop for further discussion on development and procurement of data management system.

In order to avoid any kind of deficit from the academic session 2018-19, it was decided by the General Body of NBER that the approved institutes may be asked to provide one-time payment of fee (including affiliation fee and incidental charges) in respect of all the Courses to NBER.

Creation of posts in National Board of Examination in Rehabilitation (NBER)

In accordance with the decision taken during the 72nd Meeting of the Executive Committee of RCI held on 28th June, 2016, a proposal for approval of creation of new posts and provisions for required infrastructure facilities for functioning of NBER have been submitted to DEPwD, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment on 02.12.2016. As per the new proposal, it is proposed to recruit 9 regular staff of Group-A level and 49 contractual staff for smooth functioning of NBER. Details of financial implications, i.e. projected income & projected expenditure including projected salary has also been sent to DEPwD for consideration.



CHAPTER - 5

CENTRAL REHABILITATION REGISTER

In accordance with Section 23 of the Rehabilitation Council of India Act, a Central Rehabilitation Register (CRR) is being maintained by the Council for registration of the Professionals/Personnel having RCI approved qualifications in disability rehabilitation and special education.

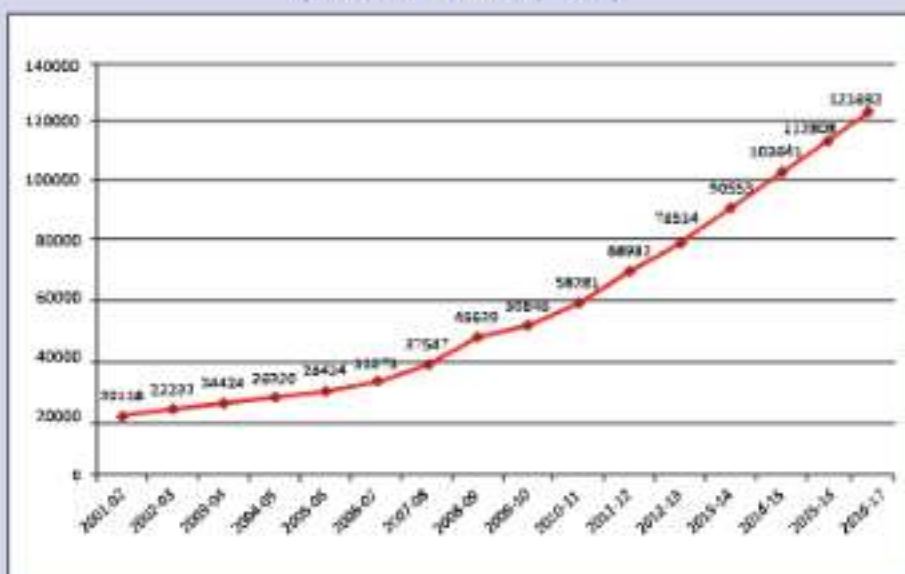
During the year, registration was granted to 8884 Professionals/Personnel, out of which the number of registered Professionals is 4342 and Personnel 4542. Accordingly, 52769 Professionals and 68923 Personnel have been registered in the Central Rehabilitation Register as on 31st March, 2017. 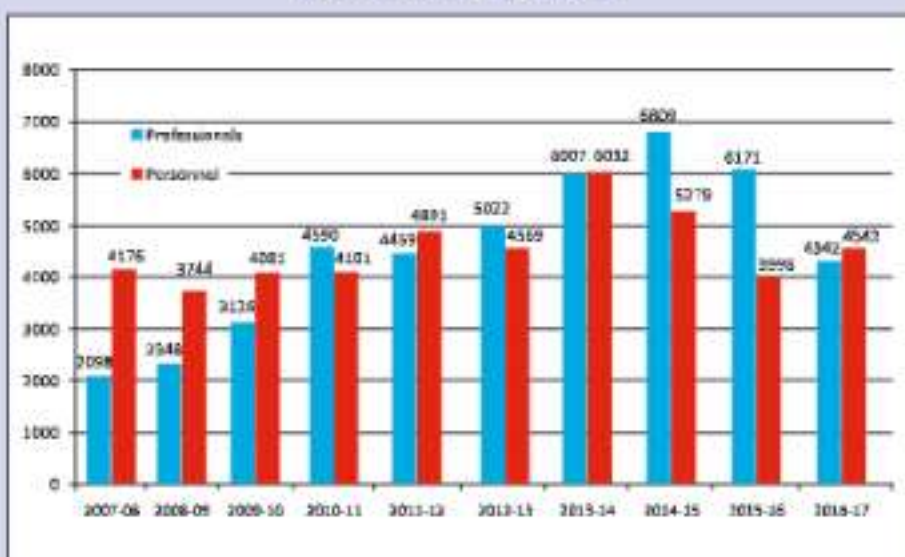

Assessment & Accreditation Committee (AAC) Meeting

Assessment & Accreditation Committee (AAC) Meeting comprising of eminent experts from various disability areas that decide the equivalency of foreign qualification and other qualifications at par with RCI approved qualifications for the purpose of registration in Central Rehabilitation Register was held on 17th March, 2017 at Rehabilitation Council of India, New Delhi under the Chairmanship of Dr. M. Jayaram, Senior Professor and Dean, NIMHANS, Bengaluru. Out of nine applicants, only two candidates appeared before the Committee to present their case. After examining the documents submitted by the applicants and presentation made before the Committee, only two candidates were found eligible for registration in CRR. Committee also suggested that in future the applicants may be asked to submit the curriculum of the respective Course (s) clearly stating the duration of different components of study like theory/practical/clinical work, etc., for consideration of AAC. The candidates applying for registration on the basis of foreign qualifications must also mention the category for which the application is being made failing which the application will not be considered.

CHAPTER -6

CONTINUING REHABILITATION EDUCATION (CRE) PROGRAMME & OTHER ACTIVITIES

The Council is responsible for updating and upgrading the knowledge and skills of professionals/ personnel working in different areas of disability. Objectives of Continuing Rehabilitation Education (CRE) programmes are as given below:

1. To upgrade the knowledge & skills of in-service & practicing Rehabilitation Professionals & Personnel already registered with RCI under Section 19 of RCI Act of 1992.
2. To update professional knowledge of master trainers working in the field of rehabilitation & special education.

Norms and Guidelines to Conduct CRE Programmes

Following norms and guidelines have been prescribed for approval/sanction of Continuing Rehabilitation Education (CRE) programmes:

- (i) Institute must have 5 years of experience in offering RCI approved Course to be eligible for conducting a CRE programme. This condition can be relaxed in the case of Jammu & Kashmir and States of North East where an institution/ organization working in the field of disability sector may organize CRE programme with the recommendation of National Institutes or Zonal Coordination Committees of RCI.
- (ii) CRE points are awarded for 1 day/2 days/3 days/4 days/5 days programmes with 6 hours of actual training, excluding lunch break.
- (iii) Approved Institute may choose any topic of interest from the approved list of topics mentioned in the Council's website under CRE. However, the Institute may also choose the same option to conduct CREs on the topics which are not included in the list of approved topics if they meet the needs of professionals and persons with disabilities with the prior approval of the Council. Institutions are required to submit a detailed proposal for permission to conduct CRE programmes at least two months before the scheduled date along with following information:
 - (a) Title of the topic and duration
 - (b) Background and Justification
 - (c) Aim of the programme
 - (d) Content of the programme with -
 - (i) Names of resource persons: internal and external
 - (ii) Methods
 - (iii) Category of professionals who can participate
 - (iv) Desired outcome
 - (v) Proposed budget and grant requested, if any



- (iv) Proposals for grant of CRE status to relevant Seminars/Conferences/Workshops in disability sector submitted by the eligible Institutions/Registered Professional Associations may also considered by the Council provided such proposals contained all the information as mentioned above.
- (v) All CRE programmes will be approved on first come first served basis and financial assistance for conducting CRE programme will be given only once in two financial years. Approved Institutes may be allowed to conduct a maximum three CRE programmes in a financial year. However, permission for 2nd /3rd CRE programmes is given on receipt of report of 1st CRE programme.
- (vi) A maximum number of participants in any CRE programme shall not exceed 30. Attendance shall not be less than 10 in any CRE programme.
- (vii) As per the CRE norms, financial assistance, i.e. 60% of the total amount of Rs.90000 for 5-day programme and 60% of Rs.54000 for a 3-day programme is considered once in two years subject to availability of funds.

Sanction of Zonal & Administrative Grant to ZCCs

Zonal & Administrative Grant of Rs. 25,90,000/- (@ Rs. 3,10,000/- + 60,000/-) to each zone has been sanctioned by the Council to 07 ZCCs for organizing zonal activities during the financial year 2016-17.

Extension of Zonal Coordination Committees of RCI (From existing 07 ZCCs to 14 ZCCs)

General Council of RCI in its 38th meeting held on 30th November, 2015 has approved the proposal of the Council for extension of ZCCs from 07 to 14 ZCCs. Accordingly, a detailed proposal for extension of 14 ZCCs (Including 07 ZCCs) has been sent to DEPWD for administrative approval. DEPWD vide their letter no. 29-15/2016-Nid. 25th July, 2016 has accorded its approval for opening of 14 ZCCs (Including 07 ZCCs). The aforesaid proposal of the Council has also been approved by the 74th EC and 39th GC of RCI. Accordingly, the existing guidelines and a detailed scheme of ZCCs are being revised by the Council to implement the said decision from the financial year 2017-18 onwards.

CENTRAL SECTOR PLAN SCHEME OF "IN-SERVICE TRAINING AND SENSITIZATION OF KEY FUNCTIONARIES OF CENTRAL AND STATE GOVERNMENTS, LOCAL BODIES AND OTHER SERVICE PROVIDERS"

The 12th Five Year Plan of Govt. of India has recognized inadequate awareness and sensitivity amongst various stakeholders as a major challenge. It was felt that there is urgent need for in-service training amongst the various stakeholders to create awareness about the rights and entitlements of persons with disabilities (PwDs), provisions in various schemes, developmental programmes, ways and means to access their specific entitlements and those that they are entitled to as equal citizens. Therefore, in order to realize the above said objectives, the Govt. of India has made a provision for training and sensitization of key functionaries of Central/State Govt. under the 12th Five Year Plan.

Development of the Scheme

A Scheme for In-service Training & Sensitization Programme was required to be developed for implementation of the objectives as recognized by the Government of India. Therefore, the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (DEPwD) had developed a new Central Sector Plan Scheme, i.e. "In-Service Training and Sensitization of Key Functionaries of Central and State Governments, Local Bodies and Other Service Providers" w.e.f. 29th December, 2014. This Scheme was implemented for the remaining part of 12th Five Year Plan for the financial year 2015-16 & 2016-17.

Objectives of the Scheme

The Scheme was launched with the following objectives:

- (i) To train and sensitize the key functionaries of the Central/State Govt., Local Bodies and other service providers on a regular basis on disability related matters through State/District/Block level Workshops. The Workshops aim to raise the awareness among employees and peer groups about capabilities of persons with disabilities and how we can work together to create an inclusive environment, etc. at work place. To ensure enlightened, efficient and committed key functionaries to further the cause of empowerment of PwDs.
- (ii) To create awareness about the disability related legislations, development programmes, schemes and programmes for the benefit of PwDs, rehabilitation and referral services amongst the various stakeholders, namely, in-service officials of Central and State Governments, local bodies and other service providers.
- (iii) To provide in-service training on some important skills like oralism, sign language, Braille, alternative communication, etc. and to create awareness and sensitization towards prevention, early identification, intervention, rehabilitation and mainstreaming of persons with disabilities.
- (iv) To obtain feedback about the quality of delivery of the Schemes/Programmes of Government. The training programmes are meant to sensitize the officers to new and important



issues facing the disability sector in the changing and economic scenario. The prime objective of the Scheme is to focus on the demand-driven training of key functionaries dealing with disability sector which will be conducted in close coordination with the Administrative Training Institutes as far as possible.

Fund Sanctioning Authority (FSA)

A Fund Sanctioning Authority (FSA) has been constituted to take major decisions with regard to the work related to the Central Sector Scheme launched by DEPwD. This Committee comprises of the following members:

- (i) Secretary, Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan)
- (ii) Joint Secretary, Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan)
- (iii) Joint Secretary & Financial Advisor, Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan)
- (iv) Chairperson, Rehabilitation Council of India
- (v) Director (Concerned) - Member Secretary

Meetings of the Fund Sanctioning Authority

A number of meetings of FSA were organized during the year:

- (i) To discuss the modalities of the Scheme to be developed by the Council under the In-Service Training & Sensitization Programme.
- (ii) To prepare the guidelines for implementation of the said Scheme.
- (iii) To finalize the sanction of grants-in-aid to the Council by the DEPwD and further to the implementing agencies by the Council. The funds were released by the Council to the implementing agencies as approved by the Fund Sanctioning Authority.
- (iv) To discuss numerous issues relating to the implementation of the Scheme, viz. development of Unique Identification Number, development of certificate of participation, distribution of training module, translation of training module in regional languages, monitoring of the training programmes, submission of the report and analysis of the feedback forms. These issues were discussed during different meetings of the FSA and after an in-depth deliberation and discussion of the members of the FSA, various decisions were made. The Council was given the responsibility to undertake the action accordingly.
- (v) To finalize the structure as well as contents of e-training module, a meeting of the Expert Committee was organized by the Council. The experts from the different disability areas including Directors/Representatives of National Institutes attended the meeting, thereby developing an "e-Training Module" for In-service Training & Sensitization Programme to make the training programmes more effective, meaningful and useful for the trainees.

The Rehabilitation Council of India being the Nodal Agency for the said Scheme has undertaken various actions on all the issues as and when required, thereby, accomplishing the objectives of the Scheme successfully during the financial year 2016-17.

Guidelines for Implementation of Central Sector Plan Scheme

The guidelines for smooth implementation of the Scheme were framed by the Council that provided an in-depth view of the Scheme along with its detailed objectives, scope of the Scheme, summary statement of target groups, prescribed budget heads with the limit of expenditure and all the requisite proforma as required for submission of proposal, feedback/evaluation form, proforma for programme report submission, etc.

As per guidelines, the trainees were categorised under the various Target Groups as under:

- Key functionaries of certain Central Ministries/Department, State Govt., Local Bodies (Panchayats and Municipalities) and other Service Providers connected with the disability Sector.
- Medical and Para-Medical Practitioners.
- Teachers and Principals.

Development of Proforma for Submission of Proposals

Proforma for submission of proposals under the Scheme was developed by the Council that provided the details of the institute along with a brief description of the training programme to be conducted, viz., date & venue of the training programme, target group, number of participants, details of estimated expenditure, bank details of the institute, etc. All the eligible institutes/ organizations desirous of undertaking this training programme submit their online proposal to RCI in the prescribed format.



Training Module

As the Nodal Agency of the Scheme, RCI was entrusted with the responsibility to develop the training module by DEPWD. The Council in this regard, organized a meeting of the Expert Committee to finalize the structure as well as contents of the training module. The experts from the different disability areas including Directors/Representatives of National Institutes attended the meeting. Therefore, Council with the help of the members of the Expert Committee had developed a "Training Module" for In-service Training & Sensitization Programme to make the training programmes more effective, meaningful and useful for the trainees. The training module developed by the Council and was further distributed to all the implementing agencies and other government institutes. A copy of the training module in English and Tamil languages had already been uploaded on Council's website for reference.

The training module included contents on the following topics:

- (a) Prevention, early identification, early intervention, rehabilitation and mainstreaming
- (b) Awareness on various legal provisions in the field of disability
- (c) Disability specific and other development schemes that benefit PwDs
- (d) Rehabilitation and referral services for various disabilities
- (e) Advocacy program on various disability aspects
- (f) General disability issues such as human rights, gender issues, etc.
- (g) Orientation training on Braille and sign language for the service special educators and others.

Schedule of the Training Programme

The schedule for conducting the training programme was prepared based upon the target groups as categorised in the table mentioned above. Accordingly, 02 days schedule was prepared for the Target Group-I (State Level) & TG-II (District level) and 03 days schedule for Target Group-II, III & IV (District/Block level). This schedule provided the details of the topics to be covered under the training programme along with the methodology such as lectures, group discussions, presentations, self-learning materials, etc. for imparting training.

Financial Assistance

The budgetary provision for the Scheme was finalized as per the requirement of each of the 05 target groups under the prescribed budget heads with upper limit of expenditure. A detailed description of the budget allocated under each group was, therefore, developed by the Council and approved by the Fund Sanctioning Authority (FSA).

Based on the above said approved budget under the guidelines for implementation of the Scheme, the Implementing agencies approved to conduct In-service training programme for 02 days duration under State level, i.e., for Target Group-I was given a grant of Rs.1,13,300 and similarly, an amount of Rs. 2,35,675 was granted for 03 days duration programme under District/Block level i.e. for the Target Groups-II, III, IV and V.

Implementation of the Scheme

As DEPwD had assigned the responsibility of Nodal Agency to Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI) to play a pivotal role in implementation and overall execution of the said Scheme at national level, the Council undertook a step-by-step approach for smooth implementation of the Scheme.

Unique Identification Number (UID) & Certificate of Participation

Based on the decision of the FSA, Council developed a "Unique Identification Number", i.e., Agency UID No. that had been provided to each implementing agency approved for conducting the In-service Training Programme.



FSA had also advised to provide a "Certificate of Participation" to all the participants by the implementing agencies on successful completion of the training programme. Therefore, Council developed a certificate of participation to be provided to each participant on completion of the training programme and uploaded on Council's website.

Screening of Proposals

As the number of proposals, batches and their request for fund have been found very high in comparison to the allocation of funds by DEPwD for the said programme, all proposals received under the Scheme were considered by the Screening Committee under the Chairmanship of Member Secretary, RCI. The following parameters were adopted by the Council to scrutinize the proposals

- (i) Proposals received within the due date were considered for screening.
- (ii) Proposals received have been distributed under OS categories.
- (iii) In the 1st phase proposals received from above said categories only may be considered for release of Grants-in-aid subject to the availability of funds.
- (iv) Optimization of geographical coverage up to the extent possible in order to maintain regional balances.

Sanction of Proposals

During the year 2016-17, left out proposals submitted by various implementing agencies, namely, office of the District Magistrate/Government Institutions/University departments and National institutes/Composite Regional Centre under DEPwD were placed before the Fund Sanctioning Authority (FSA) in its 3rd & 4th meeting held on 7th June, 2016 and 15th December, 2016 respectively for their consideration. FSA considered sanction of 91 batches of training programme submitted by 28 implementing agencies and accordingly approved for release of grant-in-aid of Rs. 1,90,71,000 (rupees one crore ninety lakhs seventy one thousand only) to conduct in-service training and sensitization of key functionaries of Central and State Government, Local Body & other Service Providers in 16 States/UTs of the country.

Release of Grant-in-Aid

Based on the recommendation of Fund Sanctioning Authority (FSA) in its 3rd & 4th meeting, DEPwD sanctioned and released an amount of Rs. 1,90,71,000 towards recurring expenditure under the Scheme to further release grant-in-aid to selected implementing agencies to conduct in-service training programme during the financial year 2016-17. Further, the Rehabilitation Council of India, Nodal Agency released grant-in-aid for an amount of Rs. 1,90,25,875 to 28 implementing agencies to conduct 91 batches to train 3000 (approx) functionaries under the in-service training programme during the financial year 2016-17. Details of the funds released, name of implementing agencies, number of batches conducted and target groups are as under:

Monitoring of the Training Programme

Although the In-service Training Programme has been found very useful by a large number of participants, feedback is essential to take any corrective measure. As per the directions of FSA, monitoring of training programmes conducted under the above said Scheme had to be undertaken by the Council. The Council, therefore, deputed officers for carrying out the monitoring activity by making surprise visits to various implementing agencies conducting the In-service Training Programme. This was done to ensure the timely conduct of the training programme at their institute. The concerned officers were required to submit a detailed report on completion of the training programme. The Council deputed visiting experts to carry out surprise checks during the ongoing training programme. These surprise checks, without informing the implementing agencies, have facilitated the RCI to judge the efficacy of the programme.

Submission of Report

On completion of the training programme, implementing agencies prepare and submit the programme wise report along with group photographs of the participants, list of participants and their attendance sheet with signature (local and out station), list of resource persons and duly filled feedback form, to the RCI in the form of a soft copy, along with Utilization Certificate and Income & expenditure statement, duly certified by Chartered Accountant or Govt. Auditors as the case may be, within a month of organizing the training programme.

Feedback

RCI has also developed a feedback form to be filled in by the participants after the completion of the training programme. Each In-service Training Programme that was conducted had to be evaluated by obtaining feedback from the participants. Feedback not only enabled RCI and DEPWD, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment to assess the effectiveness of the training conducted but it also made up some good suggestions that can be incorporated in the training programmes to be organized in future. The system of feedback was such that it had not inhibited the participants from speaking out what they honestly felt about the training programme. It was, therefore, left to the participants whether they would like to disclose their name on the feedback form or make their assessment anonymous.

Based on the reports along with the feedback form received from various implementing agencies, In-service Training and Sensitization Scheme had a powerful impact. The objective of the training programme was useful and the instructions were easily understandable. The learning materials as hand-outs provided to the participants were satisfactory that was unanimously supported by the participants. Majority of the participants informed that there should be wide publicity of the awareness about the schemes related with the disability in rural areas so that no child is deprived of the rights and provisions. Also, important suggestions were made by the delegates based on the response of the participants. Some of the suggestions that were made are as under:

- » Beneficiaries reported that the training programme is very useful and this type of training programme may be conduct on regular basis.
- » Participants were found satisfied with reference to knowledge, content, presentation skills.
- » Participants informed that the training programme has achieved its objective very well.
- » The objective of the training programme was useful and instructions were easily understandable.
- » Everyone strongly agreed upon the quality of the content and the approach in which the instructors communicated.
- » The training programme was organised in a very effective manner. Most of them delivered their presentation in an excellent manner.
- » Regarding the various aspects of the programme, the participants agreed that the organisation and content was at par with the issues in vogue and well met with the socio-cultural perspective through the lens of inclusive education.

It is also proposed to impart training through Administrative Institutes of Central and State Govt./National Institutes of DEPWD/RCI approved training institutes/University Departments.



CHAPTER - 8

ADMINISTRATION

Administration of the Rehabilitation Council of India involves many activities besides managing the establishment and financial aspects.

Use of Hindi in Official Work

In order to promote use of Hindi in official work, the orders/instructions/guidelines issued by the Department of Official Language from time to time are followed strictly by the Council. The employees of RCI are motivated to carry out their official work in Hindi. During the year, RCI celebrated Hindi Pakhwara between 14-28 September, 2016 wherein various programmes were conducted and prizes were given to employees for participating in various events and to promote use of Hindi. Quarterly reports on the work done in Hindi were submitted to the DEPwD, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment and Department of Official Language, Ministry of Home Affairs regularly.

Reservation Policy

Training

Officers/Staff of the Council were deployed to attend the training courses/ workshops organized by ISTM & various institutes of repute from time to time for better competency.

Vigilance Awareness Week

Vigilance Awareness Week was observed in RCI from 31st October to 5th November, 2016. During the period awareness is created among its employees to maintain the transparency and integrity in their official works. A lecture was organized for all staff members about the "Public participation in promoting Integrity and eradicating Corruption". On 31.10.2016 all employees were administered Pledge to bring about integrity and transparency and to strive for eradicating Corruption from all spheres of life, as per the instructions issued by Central Vigilance Commission.

Implementation of RTI Act, 2005

Consequent upon the enactment of the RTI Act, 2005, RCI is following the instructions/guidelines issued by the Government from time to time. All the requisite information about RCI is displayed on the website of the Council, www.rehabcouncil.nic.in for the general public. During the year, total 264 RTI applications were received and all were replied.

Swachh Bharat Mission

Swachh Bharat Mission was implemented by the Council and Swachhta Campaign was organized from 16-31 May, 2016, 15-30 June, 2016 and 16-31 July, 2016. Following activities were organized as a part of the Swachhta Campaign:

- (a) Intensive record review/weeding out of unwanted records.
- (b) Disposal of old and unusable furniture/fixtures/electrical and electronic gadgets.
- (c) Thorough cleaning and dusting of workstations/electrical fixings/computers etc.
- (d) Thorough cleaning/beautification of the surroundings areas of the premises/lawns.
- (e) Thorough cleaning of common areas like corridors/ stairs/parking lots/wash rooms, etc.



Library and Documentation

RCI has a good collection of Books/Publications/Audio-Video material/Journals/Periodicals, etc. in the area of disability rehabilitation and special education which are being used regularly by the professionals/personnel/experts/students.

RCI brings out a number of publications on regular intervals such as the Journal of the Rehabilitation Council of India (JRCI), Status of Disability in India, Manuals of Diploma Courses, Training Manuals for different functionaries, etc. During the year following publications were printed:

Audit Report on the Accounts of the Rehabilitation Council of India, New Delhi for the Year 2016-17

Separate Audit Report of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India on the Accounts of Rehabilitation Council of India for the year ended 31st March 2017

1. We have audited the attached Balance Sheet of the Rehabilitation Council of India as at 31 March 2017, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts & Payment Account for the year ended on that date under Section 19 (2) of the Comptroller & Auditor General's (Duties, Powers & Conditions of Service) Act, 1971 read with Section 21 (3) of the Rehabilitation Council of India, Regulations 1997. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Council's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.
2. This Separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller and Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification, conformity with the best accounting practice, accounting standards and disclosure norms, etc. Audit observations on financial transactions with regard to compliance with the Law, Rules & Regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency-cum-performance aspects, etc., if any, are reported through Inspection Report/CAG's Audit Reports separately.
3. We have conducted the audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidences supporting the amounts and disclosure in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.
4. Based on our audit, we report that:
 - i. We have obtained all the information and explanations, which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit.
 - ii. The Balance Sheet, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipt & Payment Account dealt with by this report have been drawn up in the common format approved by the Ministry of Finance.
 - iii. In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by the Rehabilitation Council of India as required under Section 21 (2) of Rehabilitation Council of India Regulations, 1997 in so far it appears from our examination of such books.
 - iv. We further report that:
 - A. Balance Sheet
 - A.1 Liability
 - A.1.1 Current Liabilities & Provisions - Rs.316.09 lakh (Schedule-6)
 - A.1.1.1 The Council paid salaries amounting to Rs. 18.32 lakh and Rs. 14.65 lakh for the months of March 2017 and March 2016 during April 2017 and April 2016 respectively. However the



provision for the same was not made under Current Liabilities & Provisions on Liabilities side instead the amounts were booked as expenditure of accounting year corresponding to the month of actual payment.

This resulted in understatement of Current Liabilities & Provisions by Rs.18.32 lakh and understatement of Current year expenditure by Rs.3.67 lakh (Rs.18.32 lakh – Rs.14.65 lakh) along with understatement of prior period expenditure by Rs.14.65 lakh.

- A.1.1.2** The Council paid professional fees amounting to Rs.0.60 lakh and Rs.0.55 lakh for the months of March 2017 and March 2016 during April 2017 and April 2016 respectively. However the provision for the same was not made under Current Liabilities & Provisions on Liabilities side instead the amounts were booked as expenditure of accounting year corresponding to the month of actual payment.

This resulted in understatement of Current Liabilities & Provisions by Rs.0.60 lakh and understatement of Current year expenditure by Rs.0.05 lakh (Rs.0.60 lakh – Rs.0.55 lakh) along with understatement of prior period expenditure by Rs.0.55 lakh.

A.2. Assets

A.2.1 Current Assets, Loans and Advances – Rs.414.34 lakh (Schedule-9)

- A.2.1.1** The interest accrued on staff loans (Computer Advance) had not been accounted for in the annual accounts. This resulted in understatement of Current Assets as well as current year income. The amount of accrued interest could not be quantified in audit.

A.2.1.2 Fixed Assets – Rs.279.82 lakhs

Fixed Assets included an amount of Rs.7.71 lakh as "Capital works in progress" still lying unadjusted with CPWD due to arbitration in respect of construction of building which was put to use since 2004. This has resulted in overstatement of "Fixed Assets" by Rs.7.71 lakh and understatement of "Current Assets, Loans and Advances" by the same amount.

B. Income & Expenditure Account

B.1 Expenditure – Rs.737.24 lakh

- B.1.1** A sum of Rs.15.04 lakh was received as refund from various Institutes along with adjustment bills of programmes conducted by them in previous years. However this amount was shown as reduction of expenditure of current year. This should be shown in (-) Rs.15.04 lakh as Prior Period Expenditure.

B.2 Income Rs.1131.46 lakh

- B.2.1** A sum of Rs.6.84 lakh, pertaining to financial year 2015-16 on account of Inspection/ registration fee, was received during April 2016 and accounted for in the year 2016-17 which resulted in overstatement of current year income and understatement of prior period income by the same amount.

C. General

C.1 Current Liabilities & Provisions – Rs.316.09 lakh (Schedule-6)

The Council has not made provision for gratuity & leave encashment on actuarial valuation. Instead the same are being accounted for on cash basis in contravention of the Uniform format of Accounts approved by the Government of India, Ministry of Finance.



C.2 Interest earned

Interest earned on investment of GPF account (Schedule-13) is being accounted by the Council on cash basis instead of accrual basis. This is in contravention of Uniform Format of Accounts and also Accounting Policy 4 of the Council.

C.3 Current Liabilities and Provisions

It was seen that balances were lying in following accounts without any utilization or refund to grantee agency (Current Liabilities and Provisions – Schedule-6). This resulted in unsettled liabilities of the Council amounting to Rs.15.77 lakh.

C.4 Loans Advances and other Assets

An amount of Rs. 5.93 lakh and Rs. 1.52 lakh relating to "Advance to NIC" and "Project Advance" respectively in Schedule-9 "Current Assets, No efforts are being made by the Council for settlement. Steps may be taken for only settlement of above amount. Loans and Advances" were pending for settlement for last three years i.e. 2014-15, 2015-16 and 2016-17. Further, an amount of Rs. 38,905 is receivable by the Council in respect of IEDC impact assessment project since 2005-06.

Council may make efforts for early settlement of these advances.

D. Grants-in-Aid

The Council received a grant of Rs.623.00 lakh (Rs.400 lakh under Plan and Rs.223.00 lakh under Non-Plan) during 2016-17 from Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment. Out of this, Rs.118 lakh under Plan and Rs.63.00 lakh under Non-Plan was received in March 2017. It had unspent balance of grant-in-aid of previous year of Rs.16.05 lakh under Plan and internal receipt of Rs.416.13 lakh. Out of the total funds available the Council utilized a sum of Rs.658.27 lakh.

E. Management letter

Deficiencies which have not been included in the Audit Report have been brought to the notice of the Rehabilitation Council of India through a management letter issued separately for remedial/corrective action.

Schedule – 19: Significant Accounting Policies, Contingent Liabilities and Notes on Accounts

1. Contingent Liabilities – Nil, (Previous Year – Nil)
2. The Rehabilitation Council of India, New Delhi is a Statutory Body set up under the Rehabilitation Council of India Act 1992, (No. 34 of 1992). The Council is financed by the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Government of India through Annual Plan & Non-plan Grants-in-Aid.
3. The Council as desired based on the observations of DGACE, New Delhi in the audit report 2003-04 prepared Annual Accounts in the common/revised format approved by the Govt. of India in consultation with the Comptroller & Auditor General of India (CAG). As per these formats, the Council has to prepare following statements:
 - a. Balance Sheet
 - b. Income & Expenditure Account
 - c. Receipts & Payment Account
4. Traditionally the system of accounts being maintained in the Council are similar to the one being maintained by various government departments on accrual system of accounting, accrued interest on investment, prepaid expenses, etc. are also included in the accounts accordingly.
5. The depreciation has been provided for fixed assets since inception on w.d.v. method.
6. Physical verification of fixed assets for 2016-17 is carried out as continuous/perpetual basis every year and no deficiencies are noticed.
7. Physical verification of inventory, stationery & other consumables is carried out and no deficiencies are noticed.
8. Value of unsold publications as on 31.03.2017 is shown in the balance sheet.
9. Value of inventory/books received as gifts has been added in the schedule of assets.
10. Previous year figures have been re-grouped/rearranged wherever necessary as per requirement of the Council.
11. Schedule of investment has been prepared in common format.
12. As separate bank accounts are maintained for RCI G. P. Fund, RCI Pension Fund, RCI Main Account, RCI Project Account, RCI NBER Account and In-Service Training Programmes, therefore, separate receipt & payment accounts have been prepared for each account.
13. The M/o Social Justice & Empowerment sanctioned to create a Pension Fund only to discharge pension liability. Accordingly, actuarial valuation of pension fund was got made from actuaries. The Council has a staff strength of 38 only. One or two officials retire in a span of 2/3 years. Therefore, necessity was not felt to make provision for gratuity and leave encashment and the same is charged from the allocated budget in the relevant year in which the official is due to retire.
14. The Council has sent a proposal to the administrative Ministry to amend the RCI Act, 1992 with a provision to insert a clause regarding Income Tax Exemption in the Amended Act.
