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CHAPTER 1**INTRODUCTION**

The Rehabilitation Council was initially set up under the Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860 vide Resolution No. 22-17/83-HW.III dated 31st January, 1986 to have uniformity and to ensure minimum standards and quality of education & training in the field of special education and rehabilitation. It was given Statutory status by an Act of Parliament, the Rehabilitation Council of India Act, 1992 (No. 34 of 1992) dated 1st September, 1992 effective from 22nd June, 1993. The RCI Act was amended by Parliament in 2000 (No.38 of 2000) to make it more broad based. The Act provides for constitution of the Rehabilitation Council of India for regulating and monitoring the training of rehabilitation professionals and personnel, promotion of research in rehabilitation and special education and maintenance of a Central Rehabilitation Register.

By signing and ratifying the United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (UNCRPD), India has committed itself to harmonise all the domestic laws including the RCI Act. The Convention has brought the inclusion of persons with disabilities to the centre-stage need to implement the provisions of the Convention in its true spirit. Accordingly, the syllabi and curricula of the various rehabilitation courses developed and standardized by RCI have been revised so as to meet the requirements of the relevant provisions in the UNCRPD.

CHAPTER 2

MAJOR PROVISIONS OF THE RCI ACT

OBJECTIVES OF THE COUNCIL

1. To regulate and monitor the training programmes in the field of rehabilitation of disabled persons.
2. To prescribe minimum standards of education and training for various categories of professionals dealing with persons with disabilities.
3. To regulate these standards in all training institutions to bring about uniformity throughout the country.
4. To make recommendations to the Ministry regarding recognition of qualifications granted by Universities, etc., in India for rehabilitation professionals.
5. To make recommendations to the Ministry regarding recognition of qualification by institutions outside India.
6. To maintain Central Rehabilitation Register of persons possessing the recognized rehabilitation qualification.
7. To encourage Continuing Rehabilitation Education in collaboration with organizations working in the field of disability.
8. To promote research in rehabilitation and special education.

FUNCTIONS OF THE COUNCIL

1. The qualifications granted by any University or other institution in India that are included in the Schedule shall be recognized qualifications for Rehabilitation Professionals.
2. Any University or other Institution which grants qualification for rehabilitation professionals not included in Schedule may apply to the Central Government to have any such qualification recognized and the Central Government, after consulting the Council may, by notification amend the Schedule so as to include such qualification therein and any such notification may also direct that any entry shall be made in the last column of the Schedule against such qualification only when granted after a specified date.
3. The Council may enter into negotiations with a recognized authority in any other country for setting up of a scheme of reciprocity for the recognition of qualifications. In

pursuance of any such scheme, the Central Government may by notification, amend the Schedule so as to include therein any qualification which the Council has decided should be recognized, and by such notification may also direct that an entry shall be made in the last column of the Schedule declaring that it shall be a recognized qualification only when granted after a specified date.

4. Registration of Rehabilitation Professionals in the Central Rehabilitation Register of persons possessing the recognized rehabilitation qualifications as per the Schedule attached to the Act.
5. To prescribe the minimum standards of education required for granting recognized rehabilitation qualification by Universities/Institutions in India.
6. To prescribe the standards of professionals, conduct and etiquette & code of ethics for rehabilitation professionals.
7. To assess and grant approval to institutions/universities for the training of professionals in the field of rehabilitation and to facilitate their recognition and its withdrawal by the Government.
8. The Council may appoint such number of visitors as it may deem requisite to inspect any University or Institution wherein education for rehabilitation professionals is given or attend any examination for the purpose of granting recognized rehabilitation qualifications.

- (xv) Prosthetists and Orthotists
- (xvi) Rehabilitation Workshop Managers
- (xvii) Any other category of Professionals included from time to time

CHAPTER 3

COUNCIL AND ITS MEETINGS

GENERAL COUNCIL

In accordance with Sub-Section (1) and (3) of Section 3 of RCI Act 1992 (34 of 1992), the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Govt. of India, vide Notification No. S.O. 550 (E) dated 13th April, 2005 appointed Major General (Retd.) Ian Cardozo as the Chairperson of the General Council. The Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment re-constituted the Council vide Notification No. S.O. 2479 (E) dated 15th October, 2008. The list of General Council members is placed at *Annexure A*.

34th Meeting of the General Council

34th Meeting of the General Council was held on 18.06.2012 at India International Centre, New Delhi. The gist of the discussions and the decisions taken are as under:

1. *RCI Vision 2020*: Vision 2020 document was approved by the General Council with the suggestion that RCI should work out the administrative and financial aspects to achieve its vision. Chairperson agreed to the suggestions and confirmed that the Council would submit a detailed plan to the Ministry in this regard.
2. *National Board of Examination in Rehabilitation*: The Member Secretary explained the need for a National Board of Examination for conducting examination of Diploma and Certificate level courses in rehabilitation. He further gave the background how the work is being currently done by an Examination Cell approved by the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment. The agencies to whom the job was earlier outsourced were Manipal University and Indira Gandhi National Open University. Although Manipal University did excellent work, a decision was taken to shift to IGNOU because students complained that the fee charged by Manipal University was too high. IGNOU unfortunately was unable to meet our requirements and due to country wide complaints, the MOU with IGNOU was terminated and a need has been projected for a National Board of Examination. Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment has been requested to convey its decision on a priority basis. Shri K.V.S. Rao, Director, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment enquired about the budget/expenditure on conducting examination through its own board "National Board of Examination in Rehabilitation (NBER)". Member Secretary

explained that it was a self financing & sustainable proposal. The expenditure will be met out of the accruals of the programme.

3. Annual Accounts for the year 2011-12 were approved for onward submission to the Office of the Director General of Audit.
4. Member Secretary briefed the members about the process of recognition from the beginning and how the consensus was arrived in the year 2001 to grant approval/recognition. Shri K.V.S. Rao assured that the matter was being examined and a decision would be conveyed soon.
5. Minutes of the 62nd Executive Committee meeting were taken note of by the General Council. The issue of relaxation in norms in respect of Institutions in North Eastern States was also clarified as desired by the members.
6. Dr. Bela Shah appreciated the contribution of Dr. J.P. Singh, Member Secretary, RCI for strengthening the Council as a strong backbone of the Council. She also expressed gratitude on behalf of the members to the Member Secretary, RCI as he was going to superannuate in October 2012. She also commended the manner in which Chairperson, RCI had fulfilled the objectives of the Council without any remuneration. Shri R. Manoj Kumar, Education Officer, UGC along with other members stated that this needed to be put on record.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

To fulfill the purpose of the RCI Act, the General Council as per the powers conferred under Sub-Section (1) of Section 7, the Chairperson, RCI constituted the Executive Committee from amongst the members of the General Council. The Executive Committee is responsible for the management and administration of the affairs of the Council. List of the Executive Committee Members is placed at *Annexure B*.

63rd Meeting of the Executive Committee

63rd Meeting of the Executive Committee was held on September 20, 2012 at RCI , New Delhi. The gist of the discussions & the decisions taken are as under:

1. The issue of making the National Board of Examination in Rehabilitation (NBER) was discussed. This was informed that the Department of Disability Affairs, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment was looking into the matter in a positive manner.
2. Action Plan for the year 2012-13 was approved by the Executive Committee.
3. The Member Secretary briefed the members about the project of the Ministry of Human Resource Development on the Foundation Course. Dr. Divya Jalan appreciated the concept and said that it would change the whole scenario of

inclusive education and that the Council would need to monitor the quality of training of BRC's.

4. The Revised Estimate (RE) for the year 2012-13 (Non-Plan Rs. 199.50 lakhs and Plan Rs. 496 lakhs) and Budget Estimate (BE) for the year 2013-14 (Non-Plan Rs. 196.50 lakhs) were approved.
5. Regarding delegation of powers, it was suggested by JS (DD) that the issue of delegation of powers be brought before the General Council and if approved, the issue of amendment of RCI Regulations be considered and forwarded to the Ministry for consideration and approval.
6. Following fee structure for processing fee, inspection fee and approval fee for the institutions was approved:

CHAPTER 4

**EXPERT COMMITTEES OF
THE COUNCIL**

To carry out the purposes of the RCI Act, Council has constituted various Expert Committees under Sub-Section (1) of Section 7 of the RCI Act. The list of Expert Committees is placed at *Annexures C to O*.

1. To recommend the courses, the period of the courses, subjects for examination and standards of the proficiency to be obtained in any University or Institution for grant of recognized rehabilitation qualifications.
2. To recommend to the Council, the standards of staff, equipment, accommodation, training and other facilities for study or training of the rehabilitation professionals.
3. Any other matter related to the above issues.

The details of the meetings of the Expert Committees conducted during the period are given below:

Meeting of Expert Committee for Development of Training Programmes for the Professionals/Personnel, namely, Audiologist & Speech Pathologist and Hearing Aid and Ear Mould Technician, etc., held on 01.05.2012 at Rehabilitation Council of India, New Delhi

The gist of the discussions & the decisions taken are as under:

1. Minutes and follow-up action on the Expert Committee meeting held on 18.02.2011 were approved.
2. *Three-month Course on Hearing Aid Dispensing*: Due to lack of consensus among members to run the Course, it was decided to defer the matter till the feedback on the analysis of audiologists and non-audiologists working at hearing aid manufacturers is conducted.
3. The Post Graduate Diploma course in Augmentative and Alternative Communication (PGDAAC) was approved in principle with modifications to be launched on pilot basis. All India Institute of Speech & Hearing, Mysore was requested to incorporate the modifications suggested by members and submit it to Council at the earliest so that it can be again circulated to the members of the Expert Committee for final approval.

4. It was unanimously decided that the DHLS course may be revised and necessary contents to be added in the light of present needs and the duration of the course be increased to two years.

Meeting of Experts held on 14.06.2012 at RCI, New Delhi to Discuss and Develop Add-on Courses at Diploma Level for Specialization in Various Disabilities

The meeting was organized to discuss the matter of development of add-on Courses at Diploma level for specialization in various disabilities so as to impart knowledge to special educators on other disabilities apart from in which they are trained. The gist of the discussions and the decisions taken are as under:

1. It was unanimously agreed that there is a need to develop the Add-on Courses at Diploma/Certificate level for specialization in various disabilities.
2. The duration of the Add-on Courses will be of 300 hours (Theory: 160 hours and Practical: 240 hours) and face-to-face mode. Total 50 CRE points will be awarded after completion of this course.
3. This Course will be offered at the Centres where RCI approved D.Ed. Spl.Ed. course in concerned disability has been granted approval.
4. Maximum fee of Rs.15,000/- (fifteen thousand only) has been fixed for initial three years.
5. The draft course curriculum will be circulated to the expert members of this meeting for their feedback/modification (if any) which can be sent by the experts on or before 31st July, 2012.

Meeting of Expert Committee of RCI for the Development of Training Programmes for the Categories of Special Teachers for Educating and Training Persons with Mental Retardation and Rehabilitation Practitioners in Mental Retardation at Diploma Level held on 7-8 February, 2013 at RCI, New Delhi to Revise the Different Courses in the Area of Mental Retardation

The gist of the discussions & the decisions taken are as under:

1. Minutes and follow-up action of the meeting held on 19.08.2008 was approved.
2. Review of D.Ed. Spl. Ed. (MR) Course Curriculum:
 - (a) Members unanimously agreed to revise the syllabus of D.Ed. Spl. Ed. (MR) Course since it was last revised in 2008.
 - (b) It was decided to include teaching of primary school subjects in the syllabus in the light of gazette notification by NCTE without changing the structure of the course.

- (c) The suggestion of introducing internship for the course was not agreed since enough practical input is available in the syllabus.
 - (d) It was suggested by Member Secretary that the nomenclature used by the Ministry of Human Resource Development for classification of school education should be used in the syllabus.
 - (e) It was decided that the practical examinations of D.Ed. Spl.Ed. (MR) course should be held on annual basis, i.e., after second and fourth semester.
 - (f) *Qualifications prescribed for visiting faculty:* Bachelor's degree in respective field of specialization or Diploma in the area of respective specialization with five years experience.
 - (g) *Building:* The building/space requirement as decided in the meeting of experts held on 17-18 October, 2011 to be prescribed.
 - (h) *Special School:* As decided in the meeting of experts held on 17-18 October, 2011, special school to be provided.
3. Review of D.E.C.S.E. (MR) Course Curriculum
- (a) Admission Procedure given in the syllabus has been deleted.
 - (b) Intake Capacity was revised from 20 to 25.
 - (c) *Duration of the Course:* One academic year (consisting of 220 working days).
 - (d) *Attendance:* To be worded as given in the D.Ed. SE (MR) Syllabus.
 - (e) *Examination Scheme:* As per RCI's Scheme of Examination.
 - (f) Faculty qualifications:
 - i. Core Faculty (Full Time) - One
 - Qualifications: (a) Master in Social Sciences, Humanities and Sciences
 - (b) DECSE (MR) with 5 years experience, or
 - D.Ed. Spl.Ed (MR) with 5 years experience, or
 - B.Ed. Spl.Ed (MR) with 2 years experience, or
 - M.Ed. Spl.Ed (MR)
 - (c) Having valid registration of RCI
 - ii. Faculty Psychology (Full Time) - One
 - Qualifications: Same as prescribed in D.Ed. Spl. Ed. (MR) Syllabus
 - iii. Special Educator (Full Time) - One
 - Qualifications: Bachelors degree in any subject with DECSE (MR)

- iv. Visiting Faculty Qualifications : As decided in the meeting of experts held on 17-18 October, 2011.
- v. It was also decided to include following non-teaching staff in the syllabus:
 - 1. Librarian
 - 2. Computer Operator-cum-Clerk
 - 3. Peon
 - 4. Chowkidar
- g. It was also decided to prescribe details of space, furniture and equipments as provided in the D.Ed.Spl.Ed. (MR) syllabus, proportional to a one year course.
- 4. Review of Post Graduate Diploma in Early Intervention (PGDEI) course curriculum:
 The Committee recommended that feedback on PGDEI course curriculum be obtained from the four institutions offering the said course latest by 30th March, 2013 and the Core Committee meeting may be fixed by the end of April, 2013. A Core Committee was constituted to review the PGDEI Syllabus.
- 5. It was decided that RCI would issue instructions to all the expert committee members to ensure smooth conduct of expert committee meetings in order to achieve the desired outcome of such meetings.
- 6. It was decided that RCI would prepare a calendar of meetings for the next year, i.e., 2013-14 and circulate it to all the members in the second week of April, 2013.
- 7. A 3-month modular course in Music and Dance, Adapted Physical Education and Yoga to be developed by RCI.
- 8. RCI to assess shortage of books and decide about the books which need to be written. A Committee of experts to be constituted to identify authors who can write books and RCI will pay suitable remuneration for writing such books.

Meeting of Expert Committee of RCI for the Development of Training Programmes in the field of Special Education for Persons with Hearing Impairment at Diploma Level held on 12-13 February, 2013 at RCI to Revise the Different Courses in the Area of Mental Retardation

The gist of the discussions & the decisions taken are as under:

Revision of D.Ed. Spl.Ed. (Deaf and Hard of Hearing)

- 1. All the expert members unanimously agreed on the need to revise the course curriculum keeping in view the latest developments in the field of special education and rehabilitation in hearing impairment.

2. Nomenclature of the course will be changed from D.Ed. Spl.Ed. Deaf of Hard of Hearing (DHH) to D.Ed. Spl.Ed. Hearing Impairment (HI) as per PWD Act, 1995.
3. Dr. Varsha Gathoo will revise educational psychology paper along with references and will send the same to RCI latest by 28th Feb. 2013.
4. References should be listed in APA style.
5. Practical paper on Communication Options has been added by removing Individualized Teaching in the practical.

Diploma in Indian Sign Language Interpreting Course

Curriculum of Diploma Course in Indian Sign Language Interpreting, 2002 was placed before the Committee. Members expressed their opinion that the curriculum of the course needs drastic changes and to be re-written as per standard format of RCI. Dr. Asmita Huddar informed that some exercises had been done by her and Dr. Varsha Gathoo and incorporated the changes in the syllabus submitted to AYJNIHH. It was decided to request Dr. Asmita Huddar and Dr. Varsha Gathoo to make the changes in the syllabus and return the same to RCI on or before 15th March, 2013. The revised syllabus will be placed before the Committee for approval.

Development of Skill Based Certificate Course in Each of Three Communication Options

The Experts Committee developed the following Certificate Courses in Communication Options:

1. Certificate in Communication Option – Oral Aural
2. Certificate in Communication Option – Total Communication
3. Certificate in Communication Option – Bilingualism- Sign Language

Following decisions were taken regarding the above Certificate Courses:

1. These Certificate Courses will be face-to-face regular programmes.
2. The duration of the Course will be 400 hrs. (Spread over one academic year).
3. The Entry requirement will be RCI Registered Special Educators. Preference will be given to in-service candidates.
4. These Courses will be offered by the following three institutions on pilot basis for a period of two years in each Communication Option:
 - a. Oral Aural - Balavidyalaya, Chennai.
 - b. Total Communication - Akshar Trust, Baroda.
 - c. Bilingualism - Sign Language - Muk Badhir Sanghthan, Indore.

5. These Courses will be reviewed after a period of two years from the date of commencement.
6. Examination for these Courses will be conducted by the respective Institute and the Certificate to the successful candidates will be issued by RCI.
7. Mrs. Nisha Grover will prepare the marks table for the Syllabus and send it to RCI by 28th February, 2013.
8. The experts committee members present in the meeting will share the curricula of above courses and submit to RCI after adding their inputs in the syllabus latest by 28th February, 2013.
9. Chairman, RCI stated that the Council would explore the possibility of funding these Certificate Courses in Communication Options.

Any Other Item

1. It was suggested by the experts that the Sign Language A, B, C level courses need to be streamlined. These should be converted equivalent to Diploma in Sign Language Interpreting and the candidates passing all the A, B and C level courses should be awarded Diploma.
2. The proposal for establishing a system to License Interpreters received from Indian Sign Language Research and Training Centre, IGNOU, New Delhi was placed before the members. It was stated that in India the word 'License' is not used and RCI provides registration numbers to qualified Sign Language Interpreters. Therefore, in place of "License", the word "Registration" should be used. RCI is agreeable with the concept but it is related to Registration. Proposal needs to be re-submitted to RCI giving details about the number of sign language interpreters practicing in the country without having RCI approved qualifications, job opportunities/placement, etc., to enable RCI to evolve a system of evaluating their skills to register them with RCI as Sign Language Interpreters.

Meeting of the Expert Committee of RCI for the Development of Training Programmes in the field of Cerebral Palsy, Autism and Multiple Disabilities to be held on 25th & 26th February, 2013 at RCI, New Delhi.

The gist of the discussions & the decisions taken are as under:

1. Minutes and follow-up action of the meeting held on 24.08.2011 were approved.
2. *Review of course curricula D.Ed. Spl.Ed. (ASD) / D.Ed. Spl.Ed. (CP) / D.Ed. Spl.Ed. (Db):* The syllabi of D.Ed. Spl.Ed. (ASD)/D.Ed. Spl.Ed. (CP)/D.Ed. Spl.Ed. (Db) courses were placed before the Committee for its revision. It was unanimously agreed that the course should be revised in view of the recent

developments in the field of disability rehabilitation and special education. Experts were divided into groups (disability specialization wise) to revise the syllabi. The members revised the syllabi and submitted them to RCI.

3. *Review of course curriculum of B.Ed.Spl.Ed. (MD) approved on pilot basis and offered at NIEPMD, Chennai:* Mr. Kamaraj, Lecturer in Special Education, NIEPMD, Chennai made a detailed presentation about the feedback of B.Ed.Spl.Ed.(MD) course which is operational at NIEPMD, Chennai on pilot basis. After detailed discussion, it was decided that the NIEPMD, Chennai will offer the said course for another two years on pilot basis. The said institute will send the feedback of students, staff and the employer (of passed out students) latest by March, 2014 for deciding future course of action. It was also decided that, if NIEPMD, Chennai wants to increase the number of seats in this course, RCI will examine the process, if request sent.
4. *Approval of PG Diploma in Developmental Therapy (Multiple Disabilities: Physical & Neurological) Course Curriculum:* As decided at the expert committee meeting held on 24th August, 2011 at RCI, New Delhi, AADI has incorporated the changes suggested by the experts and submitted the revised syllabus to RCI. The modified curriculum was sent to the core committee of experts for approval. The modified syllabus was placed before the Expert Committee members for their approval. Ms. Syamala, Executive Director, AADI, New Delhi made a presentation about the modifications incorporated in the said syllabus. After discussion, the course curriculum was approved by all the members.

Meeting of the Expert Committee for the Development of Training Programmes for the Categories of Special Teachers for Educating and Training the Blind & Low Vision and Orientation & Mobility Specialists held on 14th March, 2013 at RCI, New Delhi

The gist of the discussions and the decisions taken are as under:

1. Minutes and follow-up action of the Meeting held on 28.05.2008 were approved.
2. Revision of D.Ed. Spl Ed. (VI) Course Curriculum :
 - (a) A Core Committee consisting of six expert members was constituted to revise the syllabus.
 - (b) The Core Committee will hold its meeting on 24th and 25th April, 2013 at NCERT, New Delhi.
 - (c) Core Committee to consider the following points:
 - (i) Feedback received from Dr. Varsha Gathoo on the Educational Psychology paper should be given to all the Expert

Committee/Core Committee members. Psychological implications need to be added.

- (ii) UNCRPD should be added to the first Unit of the first paper.
 - (iii) References in all the papers are old, therefore, references and list of books need to be revised. Each paper should have at least one textbook for references.
 - (iv) In paper 2, one more objective should be included and in paper 3, plus curriculum needs to be changed.
 - (v) Job opportunities, employability, latest developments taking place in the field, standards of practicum, research studies, etc., should be considered by the Core Committee while revising the course curriculum.
 - (vi) Parameters of standards in the acquired skills like Braille to be achieved by the trainees should be prepared.
- (d) Draft syllabus should be ready by 15th May, 2013 for obtaining approval of the competent authority for implementing the revised syllabus from the 2013-14 academic session.

3. *Approval of Diploma Course in Computer Education (Visual Impairment)*

The Blind Relief Association, New Delhi had submitted a course curriculum for a one-year Diploma Course in Computer Education (Visual Impairment). Mr. A. K. Mittal gave the detailed background of the Course and highlighted the need for approval of such a course for teaching computers to persons with visual impairment. All members gave their comments on the course curriculum. However, no consensus could be reached for approval of the course since it was not clear whether it would come under the mandate of RCI as already NCVT and AICTE have approved such courses in computer education. Therefore, after detailed discussions and considering various options, it was decided that RCI should approach NCVT (National Council for Vocational Training) and AICTE (All India Council for Technical Education) to consider the Diploma Course in Computer Education (Visual Impairment) for approval or give their no objection if the said course is approved by RCI for teaching computers to persons with visual impairment.

4. Ms. Anuradha Dalmia informed that NIVH, Dehradun was facing problems in getting affiliation from State Universities in the State of Uttarakhand, Tamil Nadu and West Bengal as the Universities were not willing to allow any change in the course design and would accept only the course curriculum prescribed by RCI. It was clarified that RCI prescribes the minimum standard of course curriculum

and need based changes in the syllabus can be made by the Institutions/Universities provided the minimum standards prescribed by RCI are maintained. Modified course curriculum can be sent to RCI by NIVH for examination.

5. It was stated that in many States unqualified teachers after undergoing 90 days Foundation Course are teaching children with special needs under SSA. RCI to write to all the concerned States to employ only qualified special teachers under SSA to teach children with special needs as the objective of the Foundation Course is to help general teachers only to understand disability. Mr. A.K. Mittal volunteered to draft a letter in this regard.
6. It was suggested by some members that RCI should re-consider its decision for insisting on having a Model School with a minimum strength of 60 children with disability for getting approval to run any RCI approved course since institutions were facing problems in getting approval in the absence of an appropriate model school. Chairperson, RCI stated that this issue is being handled by the recognition division and the matter will be placed before it for analysis and decision.
7. International Organizations like CBM, Sight Savers, etc., are willing to work in the field of disability in coordination with various statutory bodies and extend technical and financial support. It was suggested that RCI should identify areas of co-operation like research, publications, technology where funding can be provided by International Organizations. It was also suggested that RCI can organize a meeting of all such International Organizations for exploring the possibility of getting support from these organizations. This matter will need to be discussed at the next RCI Council meeting.
8. Meetings of the Expert Committee would be held as and when required. Schedule of Expert Committee meetings for 2013-14 would be issued by RCI in the second week of April, 2013 enabling experts to plan their participation well in advance.

CHAPTER 5

**STANDARDIZATION OF
TRAINING COURSES**

Council develops and standardizes training courses to meet the human resource requirement for various categories of Professionals/Personnel. These courses are reviewed, revised and updated from time to time. At present 60 courses are operational through regular mode in the area of disability rehabilitation and special education and the list is given at *Annexure P*.

The norms and guidelines for the following courses were revised during the year which will be placed before the respective Expert Committees for final approval :

1. D.Ed. Special Education (Mental Retardation)
2. D.Ed. Special Education (Deaf and Hard of Hearing)
3. D.Ed. Special Education (Visual Impairment)
4. D.Ed. Special Education (Autism Spectrum Disorder)
5. D.Ed. Special Education (Cerebral Palsy)
6. D.Ed. Special Education (Deafblindness)
7. Diploma in Early Childhood Special Education (Mental Retardation)
8. P.G. Diploma in Community Based Rehabilitation
9. Diploma in Community Based Rehabilitation
10. B.Ed. Special Education (Multiple Disabilities)
11. P.G. Diploma in Early Intervention
12. P.G. Diploma in Developmental Therapy (Multiple Disabilities: Physical and Neurological)

The above courses are revised/under process of revision by the respective experts which will be placed before the respective expert committee for their final approval.

The following new courses were also considered and are in the process of development/standardization :

1. D.Ed. (Inclusive Education)
2. Post Graduate Diploma in Augmentative and Alternative Communication
3. Certificate Course in Communication Option – Oral Aural
4. Certificate Course in Communication Option – Total Communication
5. Certificate Course in Communication Option – Bilingualism-Sign Language

CHAPTER 6

INSPECTION & RECOGNITION
OF INSTITUTIONS

The Council conducts inspection and evaluation of institutions and on fulfillment of prescribed norms, recommends to Government for recognition to run training courses in the field of special education and disability rehabilitation.

During the year, teams of visiting experts were deputed by the Council to conduct inspection of 470 training programmes (341 extension of approval and 129 new proposals). The total number of approved / recognized institutions increased from 426 to 453 conducting 809 batches of training programmes (Certificate to M.Phil. level) as on March 31, 2013. List of recognized institutions is placed at *Annexure Q*.

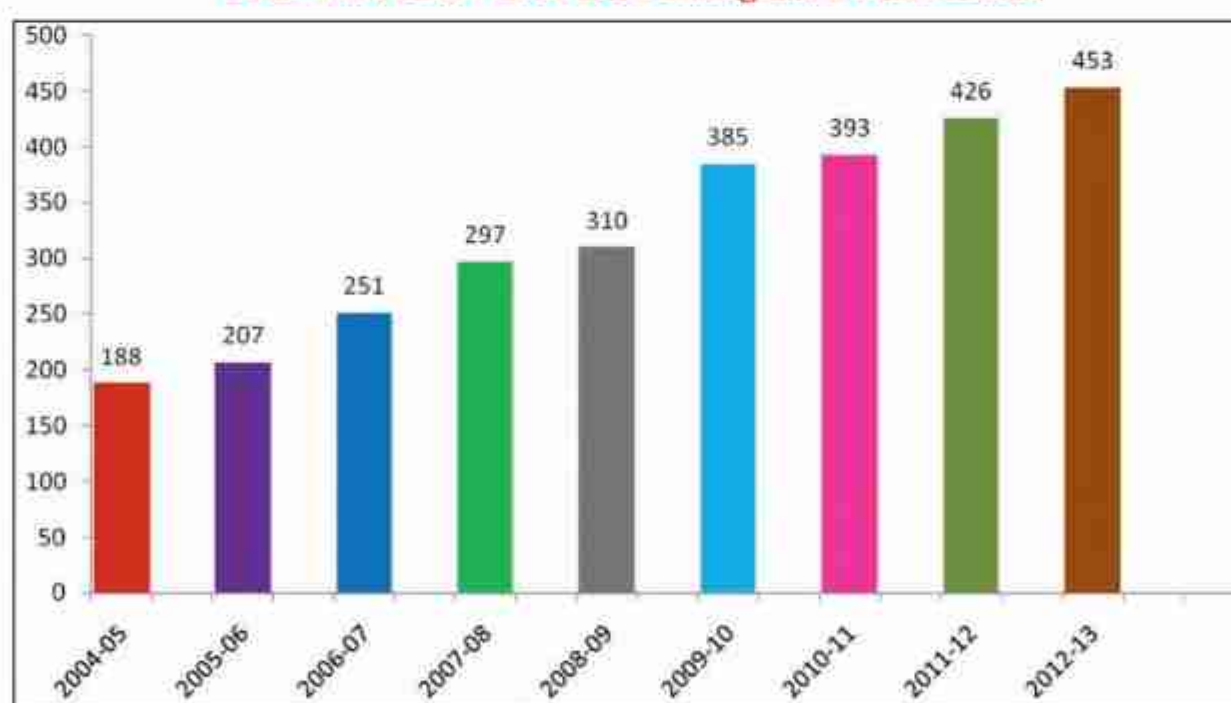

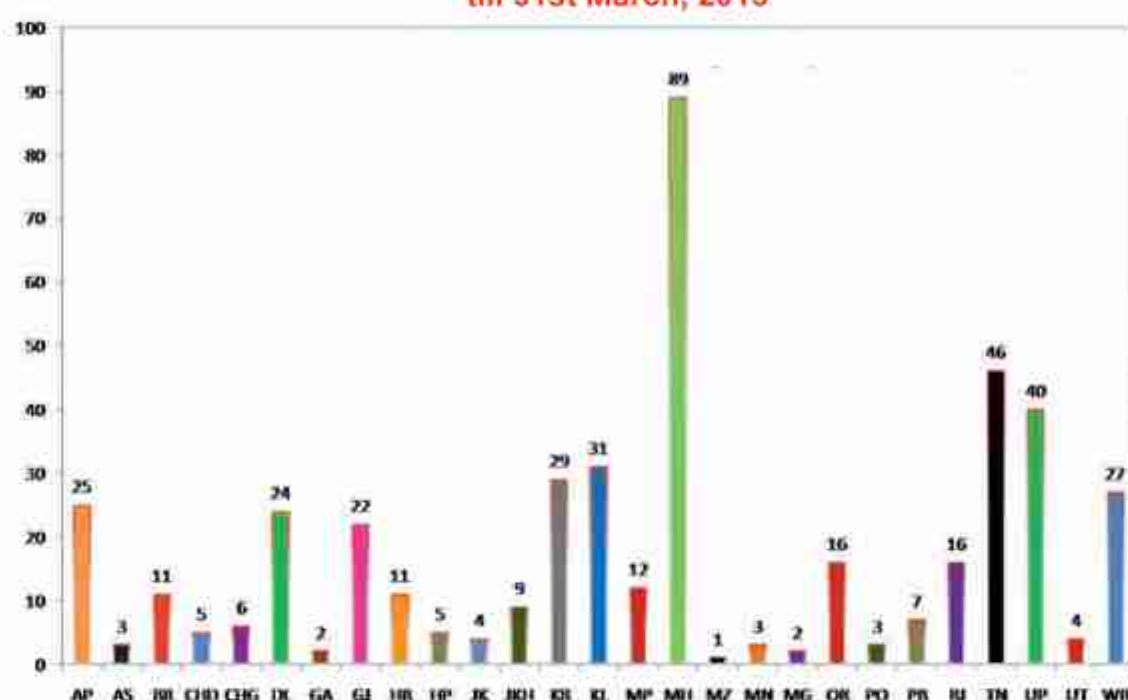

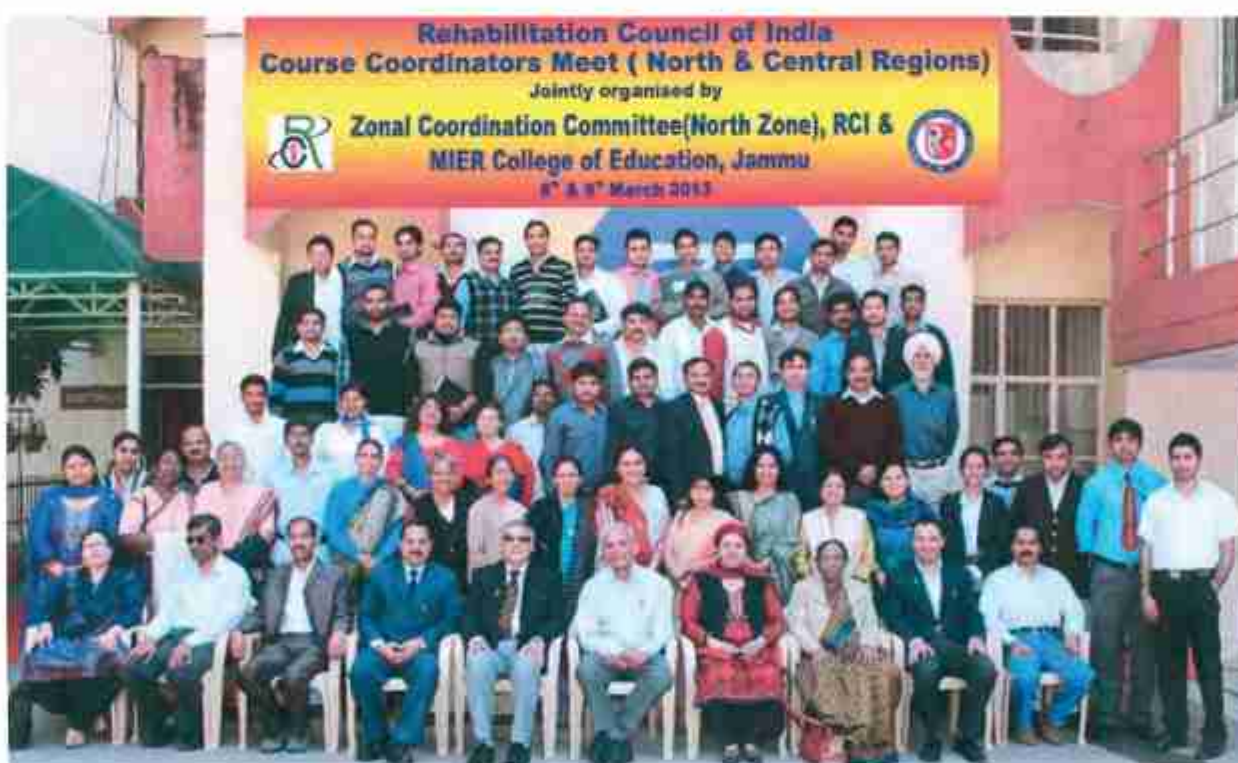

CHAPTER 7

CENTRAL REHABILITATION
REGISTER

In accordance with Section 23 of the RCI Act, a Central Rehabilitation Register is maintained for registering the professionals/personnel having RCI recognized qualifications in the area of rehabilitation and special education.

During the year, 5,022 Professionals and 4,569 Personnel were registered in the Central Rehabilitation register. 29,440 professionals and 49,074 personnel professionals raising the cumulative total to 78,514 have been registered in the Central Rehabilitation Register as on March 31, 2013.

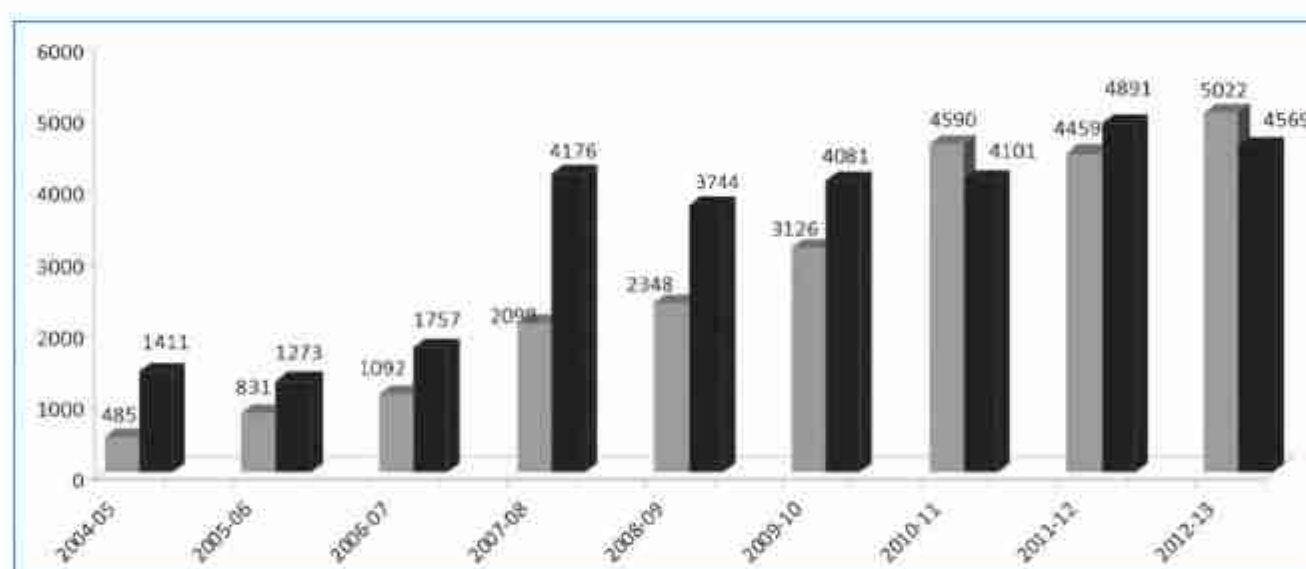
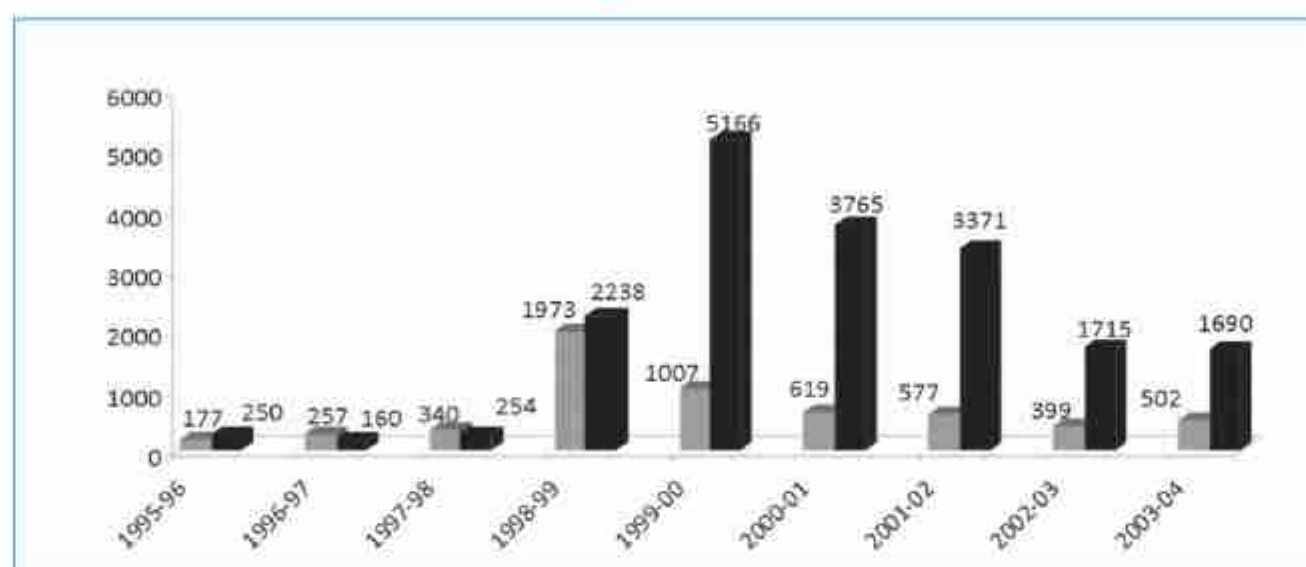

The old system of manual submission of applications for registration with the Council based on RCI approved qualification have been modified and a new online system for registration has been implemented during the year to expedite the issuance of registration certificate to the concerned. The new online system has a facility of receiving instant provisional certificate with a validity of 3 months for their use until the permanent registration certificate is issued by the Council. This online facility is provided through a separate web application, which has a link with RCI website.

Through this online facility, process of application for fresh registration, Renewal of registration, Addition of qualification, issuance of Good Standing Certificate and information regarding status of registration is made available to all concerned.

CHAPTER 8

CONTINUING REHABILITATION EDUCATION/REFRESHER COURSES/SEMINARS/WORKSHOPS

To update the knowledge and skill of the professionals/personnel to provide the quality services to the persons with disabilities, Council sponsors Continuing Rehabilitation Education (CRE)/Refresher Courses being conducted by the recognized institutions. The CRE programmes make professionals/personnel eligible for renewal of their registration. The details of CRE programmes sanctioned conducted during the year are shown at *Annexure R*.

Meeting of Experts to Review the Topics and Guidelines for Continuing Rehabilitation Education (CRE) Programmes Held on 18-19 March, 2013 at RCI, New Delhi

The gist of the discussions & the decisions taken are as under:

1. The institutions should be given an option to conduct CRE programmes on the topics which are not included in the list of approved topics if they meet the needs of professionals and persons with disabilities. However, the institutions are required to submit a detailed proposal covering the following:
 - (a) Background (highlighting the need of the programme).
 - (b) Aim.
 - (c) Detailed contents of the programme with name of the resource person.
 - (d) Methodology.
 - (e) Desired outcome.
2. List of professionals/personnel who acquire/accumulate CRE points from time to time should be put on website of RCI enabling them to know the status of CRE points accumulated by them for renewal of registration.
3. List of professionals/personnel whose registration has been renewed on the basis of CRE points during the last five years should also be prepared and placed on RCI website.
4. CRE programmes should be organized for the faculty/master trainers also for updating their knowledge and skills.
5. Pre-and post-CRE evaluation of the participants needs to be conducted. A

common format for evaluation should be designed. Ms. Anuradha Dalmia, Director, NIVH offered to prepare and send the common format for evaluation to RCI latest by 15th April, 2013.

6. CRE Reports should be accepted by RCI in soft copy and hard copy should not be insisted upon.
7. Institutes should not provide any short term training to unqualified persons to practice as Clinical Psychologists as RCI is the only authority for certifying Clinical Psychologists.
8. More CRE programmes need to be organized in the area of Learning Disability (LD), Clinical Psychology, Deafblind (Db), Cerebral Palsy (CP) and Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD).
9. Schedule of CRE programmes organized by various institutions should be displayed on RCI website well in advance for the benefit of professionals/personnel to plan and take part in such programmes. Institutions conducting CRE programmes should also exchange information with each other through email to give wide publicity to professionals/personnel working with them.
10. Impact study of CRE programmes in each disability needs to be conducted.
11. Renewal of registration of professionals/personnel should not be done without taking skill test in Braille in the area of visual impairment and sign language/communication options in the area of hearing impairment.
12. Norms and Guidelines were also reviewed and following modifications were suggested:
 - (a) The concerned institute must have 2 years of experience in offering RCI approved course for conducting a CRE programme. This condition can be relaxed in the case of J&K and North East where CRE programmes can be organized with the recommendation of National Institutes and Zonal Coordination Committees of RCI.
 - (b) The numbers of participants in CRE programme to be increased to 40 if desired. However, there will be no change in the budget and the institutions need to manage within the existing budget provision.
 - (c) For according CRE status to various Seminars/Conferences/Workshops and other programmes, following information/documents have to be supplied at least two months before the scheduled dates:
 - (i) Background and theme.
 - (ii) Aim.
 - (iii) Detailed content of the programme.

- (iv) List of resource persons – content-wise.
- (v) Expected outcome of the programme.
- (d) Institutions offering modular courses without RCI approval will not be considered for CRE points.
- (e) In the budget, the word "Honorarium" to be changed to "Remuneration".
- (f) List of activities for earning CRE points was reviewed and the revised list is given below:

13. CRE topics were reviewed and revised by the following groups:
 - (i) Hearing Impairment - ASLP
 - (ii) Clinical Psychology
 - (iii) Hearing Impairment - Education
 - (iv) Mental Retardation
 - (v) Prosthetics & Orthotics
 - (vi) Autism Spectrum Disorders

14. Regarding Syllabus for Diploma in Early Childhood Special Education (Across Disabilities), following recommendations were made:
 - (a) All experts agreed that there was a need for such a course but it cannot be developed as one course across all disabilities. While developing such a course, job market and job opportunity for the successful candidates needs to be considered. However, modular courses can be developed instead of a long term course across all disabilities.
 - (b) It was decided that a 3 month modular course be developed and offered as an Add-on course in each disability, i.e., VI, HI, MR.
 - (c) Modular Course on VI will be submitted by Prof. S.R. Mittal by 30th April, 2013.
 - (d) Modular Course on MR will be submitted by Prof. P. Jeyachandran by 31st May, 2013.
 - (e) Modular Course on HI will be submitted by Dr. Saraswathi Narayanswami by 31st May, 2013.

SEMINARS/WORKSHOPS/CONFERENCES SPONSORED/ CONDUCTED BY RCI

Council with the help of the Institutions/Non-Governmental Organizations sponsored Seminars/Workshops/Conferences to update the knowledge and to create awareness among the professionals/personnel, parents of disabled persons and persons with disabilities. List of Seminars/Workshops/Conferences sponsored during the year is shown at *Annexure S*.

DISABILITY AWARENESS CAMP AT PERAMBALUR

The Council participated in the Awareness Camp held at Perambalur, Tamil Nadu on 23rd and 24th February, 2013 by the Department of Disability Affairs, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment. A Stall was set up at the Awareness Camp to disseminate information about RCI activities. Posters in Flex depicting the activities and achievements of RCI were displayed. RCI publications were also displayed at the Camp. Photocopies of documents including a write-up on RCI, list of RCI publications, list of recognized institutions, list of distance education Universities and their Study Centres, forms of Registration, Renewal and guidelines for registration, specimen copy of forms for approval of institutions, etc., were distributed to the visitors free of cost.

Hon'ble Minister of State, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Shri D. Napoleon inaugurated the Awareness Camp. Hon'ble MoS visited the RCI Stall and was happy to see the presentation of posters, publications and other documents. Maj. Gen. (Retd.) Ian Cardozo, AVSM, SM, Chairman, RCI and Shri T.D. Dhariyal, Member Secretary, RCI also visited Awareness Camp and RCI Stall.

It was a good opportunity to show case the achievements of RCI and helped in creating awareness about RCI and other disability issues.

CHAPTER 9

EXAMINATION CELL

An Examination Cell was set up in 2005 – 06 at RCI to conduct, streamline bring uniformity, avoid malpractices and use of unfair means in the examination of all the RCI approved Diploma and Certificate level courses which included both semester and yearly examination system. The monitoring of the examination including surprise visits to the examination centre was done by the team constituted by RCI. In collaboration with the Examination cell of RCI the Manipal University successfully conducted the semester and term end examination of RCI approved Diploma and Certificate courses in May and December 2012 to complete the backlog. A total number of 4,045 and 350 Students took the examination respectively. The answer script of different languages such as Bangla, Hindi, English, Gujarati, Marathi, Tamil, Telgu, Kanada, Malayalam were evaluated at the designated and approved evaluation centres and the results were declared in August 2012 and February 2013. Indira Gandhi National Open University also conducted the semester and term end examination for 21 RCI approved Diploma/Certificate courses during June 2012. A total number of 3,220 students took the examination respectively. The answer script of different languages such as Bangla, Hindi, English, Gujarati, Marathi, Tamil, Telgu, Kanada, Malayalam were evaluated at the designated and approved evaluation centres and the results were declared in August 2012.

The work of conducting the Semester/Term End examination for the RCI approved Certificate/Diploma courses was entrusted to Ali Yaver Jung National Institute for the Hearing Handicapped, Mumbai, National Institute for the Mentally Handicapped, Secunderabad, National Institute for the Visually Handicapped, Dehradun, National Institute for the Orthopedically Handicapped, Kolkata, National Institute for the Empowerment of Persons with Multiple Disabilities, Chennai.

The Examination Cell conducted the fourth All India Online Aptitude Test (AIOAT) for admission to RCI approved six Diploma in Education, Special Education (DHH, MR, VI, ASD, Db and CP) Courses. A total number of 12,541 candidates applied for the AIOAT. Admissions to these six Diploma in Education Special Education Courses were made by the RCI recognized institutions from the successful candidates of the AIOAT.

The Examination Cell also framed and issued separate guidelines to the Examination Centres, Examination Superintendents, Centre Level Observers and Flying Squads for smooth and fair conduct of the examinations.

The Examination Cell also initiated a scheme of examination for Certifying Clinical Competency (EC3) in Psychology for candidates with Masters in Psychology from recognized Universities moved on to practice Clinical Psychology without undergoing adequate clinical training. A total number of 124 candidates applied for the EC3 examination. Out of the total 124 applications received, 123 candidates were found eligible. Computer based examination was conducted at four centres in New Delhi, Mumbai, Kolkata and Chennai on 16th September 2012. A total number of 87 candidates took the examination.

CHAPTER 10

OUTREACH DIVISION

Distance Education

The quality of rehabilitation services received by disabled people is in turn depended upon the quality education of rehabilitation professionals. As a result, need based Special Education Programmes through Distance Mode were initiated as a joint national ventures with different Open Universities and Rehabilitation Council of India since 2001, with an aim to generate Human Resource Development in the field of Special Education and Disability Rehabilitation and to monitor the training programmes.

Distance Education-Cell was set up by the Council in 2001. As on date, the Council in collaboration with 10 State Central Open Universities has launched 29 courses from Certificate to Master level programmes. The details of the distance education courses are as follows:

CHAPTER 12

**NAVSHIKHAR CHANNEL/
PUNARBHAVA WEBPORTAL**

The EDUSAT network was established in the month of July 2007 by setting up of Studio at RCI campus and installation of Direct Reception System (DRS) in the recognized institutes/centers in phased manners. The setting up of studio, operations and programme generation was funded by Media Lab Asia (MLA). Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO) has provided in setting up of Uplink equipment for the Earth Station and access of bandwidth on EDUSAT satellite. The independent disability channel was inaugurated on October 05, 2007 by then Hon'ble Minister of Social Justice & Empowerment, Mrs. Meira Kumar and named as "NAVSHIKHAR CHANNEL". Since then regular transmissions of programmes in various disability field were carried out.

Teleconferencing Programmes

Live/recorded programmes were telecast on different topics in the field of disability to 680 institutions/centers where the Direct Reception System (DRS) facility has been provided by the Council from Monday to Friday between 10.30 a.m. to 05.00 p.m. List of live teleconferencing programmes telecast between April, 2012 to March 2013 is given at *Annexure T*.

**NATIONAL INTERACTIVE WEB PORTAL "PUNARBHAVA" ON
DISABILITY**

The Council in collaboration with Media Lab Asia started an interactive and informative web portal "Punarbhava" (www.punarbhava.in) on disability and rehabilitation in the year 2007. The purpose of the web portal is to fill the gap of availability of information and its dissemination for persons with disabilities. The web portal has opened new horizons for persons with disabilities. This is an innovative initiative where two government organizations have joined hands for reaching the unreached and providing them opportunities to fully participate in social life and become productive members of the society.

Punarbhava is an attempt to provide a gateway to information for persons with disabilities and

all others concerned with this sector. It is recognized that information holds the key to knowledge, which in turn enables and empowers people and this initiative of Media Lab Asia in collaboration with Rehabilitation Council of India, is envisioned as a medium for persons with disabilities and all related stakeholders to be empowered and to participate fully in the national mainstream.

Latest and updated information was uploaded on Punarbhava regularly under different heads like national disability register, legal instrument resources/publications, RCI programmes, careers for persons with disabilities, national and international news in the field of disability, event calendar, research articles, assistive devices, data collection/NGO registration form, update on Navshikhar Channel, CDs on lecture series of Navshikhar, etc.

CHAPTER 13

ADMINISTRATION OF THE COUNCIL**Use of Hindi in Official Work**

The directives on implementation of Official Language were followed by the Council. Meetings were conducted from time to time to encourage correspondence in Hindi. Hindi Pakhwara was organized between 14th and 28th September, 2012 wherein various activities were organized for the employees of the Council to promote use of Hindi in official work. Prizes were distributed to the winners. All the required quarterly and yearly report on implementation of Official Language were submitted on time.

Implementation of RTI Act, 2005

Consequent upon the enactment of the RTI Act, 2005, the Council has been following the directions and guidelines issued by the government time to time. All required information for the general public was displayed on the website of the Council, www.rehabcouncil.nic.in. During the year, a total 226 RTI applications were received, out of which 9 applications were transferred to other public authorities to provide information. Five First Appeals were received and disposed off accordingly.

Vigilance Awareness Week

Vigilance Awareness Week was observed in the Council from 29th Oct., 2012 to 03rd Nov., 2012. During the period awareness is created among its employees to maintain the transparency and honesty in the official work.

Reservation Policy

The procedure prescribed by the Government to implement the reservation policy in the office of the Council is followed and due consideration is given to compliance of the orders on reservation issued by the Government from time to time.

Staff Strength

The Council has total sanctioned staff strength of 38 posts, i.e., 4 Group A, 11 Group B and 23 Group C (including group D) and placed at *Annexure U*.

The Council has a good collection of books/publications/audio video/journals/periodicals in the area of disability rehabilitation and special education which are being used by the professionals/personnel/experts/students.

Audit Report on the Accounts of the Rehabilitation Council of India, New Delhi for the Year 2012-13

Separate Audit Report of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India on the Accounts of Rehabilitation Council of India for the year ended 31 March 2013

We have audited the attached Balance Sheet of Rehabilitation Council of India as at 31 March 2013, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts & Payment Account for the year ended on that day under Section 19(2) of the Comptroller & Auditor General's (Duties, Powers & Conditions of Service) Act, 1971 read with Section 21 (3) of the Rehabilitation Council of India, Regulations 1997. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Council's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

2. This Separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller and Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification, conformity with the best accounting practice, accounting standards and disclosure norms etc. Audit observations on financial transactions with regard to compliance with the Law, Rules & Regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency-cum-performance aspects etc., if any are reported through Inspection Report/CAG's Audit Reports separately.
3. We have conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidences supporting the amounts and disclosure in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.
4. Based on our audit, we report that:
 - (i) We have obtained all the information and explanations, which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit.

- (ii) The Balance Sheet, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts & Payment Account dealt with by this report have been drawn up in the Common Format of Accounts approved by the Ministry of Finance.
- (iii) In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by the Rehabilitation Council of India as required under Section 21(2) of Rehabilitation Council of India Regulations, 1997 in so far as it appears from our examination of such books.
- (iv) We further report that:

A. Balance Sheet

A.1 Liabilities

A.1.1 Current Liabilities & Provisions – Rs. 344.55 Lakh –(Schedule - 5)

The Council has not made provision for gratuity & leave encashment and the same are being accounted for on cash basis in contravention of the Uniform Format of Accounts approved by the Government of India.

A.2. Assets

A.2.1 Current Assets, Loan & Advances –Rs. 320.81 lakh –(Schedule No.8)

Accrued interest amounting to Rs.1.61 lakh on investments of GPF was not depicted on the Assets side of the Balance Sheet. This has resulted into understatement of Current Assets and Income by Rs.1.61 lakh.

A.2.2 Investments

The Council has not invested General Provident Funds as per the pattern of investment prescribed by Ministry of Finance vide notification No.F-5(88)/2006 & PR dated 14.08.2008.

B. Income & Expenditure Account

B.1 Income

B.1.1. Interest Earned – Rs. 77.22 lakh

The interest accrued on staff loans was not being accounted for. This has resulted in under statement of Current Assets and Income. The amount of accrued interest could not be quantified in Audit.

B.1.2. Fees/subscription – Rs. 91.04 lakh

A sum of Rs. 4.53 Lakh received (April 2012) by Council on account of inspection/registration fee pertaining to financial year 2011-12 was taken in annual account of the year 2012-13 which resulted in overstatement of

Income. Similarly, a sum of Rs. 8.32 Lakh received (April 2013) by Council on account of Inspection/registration fees pertaining to financial year 2012-13 was not depicted in the annual accounts for the year 2012-13. This has resulted in understatement of Income and Current Assets by Rs. 3.79 lakh.

C. Grants-in-aid

Out of Rs. 405.50 lakh (Plan Rs. 268.50 lakh and Non-plan Rs. 137.00 lakh) received as grant-in-aid from Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Rs. 134.50 lakh under Plan & Non-Plan was received in March 2013. It had unspent balance of previous year of Rs. 16.00 lakh under Plan and Rs. 110.75 lakh under DRS Networking (Plan) and also internal receipt of Rs. 312.06 lakh. Out of the total funds available, the Council utilised a sum of Rs. 642.54 lakh.

D. Management letter

Deficiencies which have not been included in the Audit Report have been brought to the notice of the Council through a management letter issued separately for remedial/corrective action.

- v. Subject to our observations in the preceding paragraphs, we report that the Balance Sheet, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipt & Payment Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with the book of accounts.
- vi. In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanation given to us, the said financial statements read together with the Accounting Policies and Notes on Accounts, and subject to the significant matters stated above and other matters mentioned in Annexure to this Audit Report give a true and fair view in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in India.
 - (a) In so far as it relates to the Balance Sheet, of the state of affairs of the 'Rehabilitation Council of India' as at 31 March, 2013 and
 - (b) In so far as it relates to Income and Expenditure Account of the surplus for the year ended on that date.

2. The Rehabilitation Council of India, New Delhi is a Statutory Body set up under the Rehabilitation Council of India Act, 1992 (No. 34 of 1992). The Council is financed by the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Government of India through Annual Plan & Non-plan Grants-in-Aid.
3. The Council as desired based on the observations of DGACR, New Delhi in the audit report 2003-04 prepared Annual Accounts in the common/revised format approved by the Govt. of India in consultation with the Comptroller & Auditor General of India (CAG).
