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Chapter - 1

INTRODUCTION

Vision

A facilitative environment reflective of convergent effort fostering the highest standards in human resource development in the disability sector, for the singular and ultimate purpose of providing the best quality of education, training and composite rehabilitation services to persons with disabilities (Divyangjan), based on the paradigm of human rights and on the principles of inclusion.

Mission

- *To ensure the highest quality of emerging rehabilitation professionals through competency based curricula, which addresses the life cycle needs of persons with disabilities in contemporary India.*
- *To promote the highest attainable standards in the development of human and material resources, towards preparation and delivery of composite services in education, training, rehabilitation, skilling, research and technology.*
- *To prepare professionals who will respect the rights, dignity, autonomy, confidentiality and cultural diversity of persons with disabilities.*
- *To promote the training of rehabilitation professionals in un-served and under-served areas of the country.*
- *To ensure that the current focus is on training in cross disability, inclusion and multi-sectoral convergence, which lead persons with disabilities to live independently, confidently, and productively in their own communities.*

The Rehabilitation Council was initially set up under the Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860 vide Resolution No 22-17/83-HW.III dated 31st January, 1986 to have uniformity and to ensure minimum standards and quality of education & training in the field of special education and disability rehabilitation. It was given Statutory status by an Act of Parliament, the Rehabilitation Council of India Act, 1992 (No. 34 of 1992) dated 1st September, 1992 effective from 22nd June, 1993. The RCI Act was amended by Parliament in 2000 (No.38 of 2000) to make it more broad based.

The Act provides for constitution of the Rehabilitation Council of India for regulating and monitoring the training of rehabilitation professionals and personnel, promotion of research in disability rehabilitation and special education and maintenance of Central Rehabilitation Register (CRR) and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto.



By signing and ratifying the United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (UNCRPD), India has committed itself to harmonize all the domestic laws including the RCI Act. The Convention has brought the inclusion of persons with disabilities (Divyangjan) to the centre-stage need to implement the provisions of the convention in its true spirit. Accordingly, the syllabi of the various disability rehabilitation courses developed and standardized by RCI are being continuously revised so as to meet the requirements of the relevant provisions in the UNCRPD.

With the implementation of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 by the Government of India, the categories of disabilities have been increased from 07 to 21, thus, enhancing the responsibility of the Council to make provision for human resource development for all categories of disabilities notified in the Act. The Council has initiated appropriate action to include disability specific contents in syllabi of different courses and development of need based courses.

MAJOR PROVISIONS OF THE RCI ACT, 1992

Objectives of the Council

1. To regulate and monitor the training programmes in the field of disability rehabilitation and special education.
2. To prescribe minimum standards of education and training for various categories of human resources dealing with persons with disabilities (Divyangjan).
3. To regulate these standards in all training institution to bring about uniformity throughout the country.
4. To make recommendations to the Ministry regarding recognition of qualification granted by Training Institution, Universities, etc., in India for rehabilitation professionals/personnel.
5. To make recommendations to the Ministry regarding recognition of qualification granted by institution outside India under the scheme of reciprocity.
6. To maintain Central Rehabilitation Register (CRR) of persons possessing the recognized rehabilitation qualification.
7. To encourage Continuing Rehabilitation Education programme at approved institution.
8. To promote research in disability rehabilitation and special education.

Functions of the Council

1. Qualifications granted by any University or other institution in India that are included in the Schedule shall be recognized qualifications for Rehabilitation Professionals/ personnel.
2. Any University or other Institution which grants qualification for rehabilitation professionals not included in Schedule may apply to the Central Government to have any such qualification recognized and the Central Government, after consulting the Council may, by notification amend the Schedule so as to include such qualification therein and any such notification may also direct that any entry shall be made in the last column of the Schedule against such qualification only when granted after a specified date.



3. The Council may enter into negotiations with a recognized authority in any other country for settling up of a scheme of reciprocity for the recognition of qualifications. In pursuance of any such scheme, the Central Government may by notification, amend the Schedule so as to include therein any qualification which the Council has decided should be recognized, and by such notification may also direct that an entry shall be made in the last column of the Schedule declaring that it shall be a recognized qualification only when granted after a specified date.
4. Registration of Rehabilitation Professionals/Personnel in the Central Rehabilitation Register (CRR) of persons possessing the recognized rehabilitation qualifications as per the Schedule attached to the Act.
5. To prescribe the minimum standards of education required for granting recognized rehabilitation qualification by Universities/Institutions in India.
6. To prescribe the standards of professional conduct, etiquette and code of ethics for rehabilitation professional/personnel.
7. To assess and grant approval to institution/universities for the training of professionals in the field of rehabilitation and to facilitate their recognition and its withdrawal by the Government.
8. The Council may appoint such number of visitors as it may deem requisite to inspect any University or Institution wherein education for rehabilitation professional is given or attend any examination for the purpose of granting recognized rehabilitation qualifications.



COUNCIL AND ITS MEETINGS

In exercise of the powers conferred under sub-section (1) and (3) of Section 3 of the Rehabilitation Council of India Act, 1992 (34 of 1992), the Central Government appoints members of the Council consisting of a Chairperson and 28 Members representing the Ministries/Departments, rehabilitation professionals, social workers, medical practitioners and Members of Parliament.

Smt. Shankuntala D. Gamlin, IAS, Secretary, DEPwD, MoSJE, Govt. of India held the additional charge of Chairperson, Rehabilitation Council of India and Dr. Subodh Kumar as Member Secretary during the report period. The Council was reconstituted vide Gazette Notification No. S.O. 3609 (E) dated 14th October, 2020.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF THE COUNCIL

42nd MEETING OF THE GENERAL COUNCIL

42nd Annual General Meeting of the Council was held on 7th August, 2020 at 11.00 A.M. through video conference.



At the outset, Dr. Subodh Kumar, Member Secretary, RCI extended a warm welcome to Smt. Shakuntala D. Gamlin, IAS, Secretary DEPwD & Chairperson, RCI; Ms. Tarika Roy, Joint Secretary, DEPwD; and other Members of the General Council in the first virtual meeting ever. He apprised that due to the outbreak of unprecedented COVID-19 pandemic, the 42nd General Council meeting scheduled on 24th March, 2020 had to be postponed.

The Chairperson, RCI, welcomed the members to the virtual meeting. She stated that this meeting was long overdue and since she has been also entrusted with the additional responsibilities of the post of Chief Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities, Chairperson, National Trust & Rehabilitation Council of India, the delay may be condoned. This meeting had to be rescheduled due to COVID-19 pandemic. To fight against this pandemic, the Rehabilitation Professionals/Personnel, the creation of the network of State Commissioners for PwDs and other functionaries dealing with PwDs have played a pivotal role that deserves to be complimented. The Chairperson briefed about the initiatives taken related to the pandemic and appreciated the team effort.

She further stated that the course curriculum developed by the Council would also be required to be reviewed and restructured keeping in view the New education Policy being introduced by the Government shortly. Accordingly, there is a need to work closely in coordination with the Ministry of Human Resource Development. She apprised the members of General Council that DEPwD has requested Secretary, Department of School Education and Literacy to take the mandate of inclusive education forward. For this purpose, the Joint Secretary (TR), DEPwD and Member Secretary, RCI have been nominated to represent the Department to take up the issues of online learning and also to make online teaching more accessible for CWSN at school level with the Deptt of School Education, MHRD.

The Chairperson, RCI also apprised the members that there is a huge gap between the demand and supply of trained rehab professionals/personnel to deal with the PwDs, especially post-COVID scenario, such professionals will be in great demand. Though RCI has prepared human resources in the field of special education and disability rehabilitation, yet the number of trained manpower continues to be inadequate, to cater to the needs of PwDs. Further, mental health rehabilitation professionals will be required in great numbers. Therefore, RCI must prepare a 'Road Map' in this direction. **She pointed out the need to review the RCI Act, 1992 & its Regulations without further delay.**

She informed the members that the Government is working towards setting up of a Central University that will be a Centre of Excellence to standardize and improve the course contents, holding of examinations and conferring of degrees. She appreciated the initiative taken by Member Secretary, RCI for enlisting the RCI recognized institutes, students and faculty in registering for the WHO online courses. RCI registered rehab professionals/personnel henceforth will be awarded CRE points at the time of renewal of registration.

Smt. Tarika Roy, Joint Secretary, DEPwD explained that there is a need to enhance focus in the rehabilitation field and to develop human resource capacity. She also emphasized the necessity of promoting online courses and augment the learning system, as the lockdown and outbreak of COVID-19 pandemic has confined children and students in their homes. There is a need to revisit the curriculum to bring in quality to make the rehabilitation courses more standardized, besides sensitization of the people to make them aware about disability rights, inclusive education and accessible institutional infrastructure.

The Chairperson, RCI requested Member Secretary, RCI to take up the Agenda Items.

Item No. 1: Confirmation of the Minutes of the 41st Meeting of the General Council of RCI

The Minutes of the 41st Meeting of the General Council of RCI held on 29.11.2018 were confirmed.

Item No. 2: Follow up action on the Minutes of the 41st Meeting of the General Council

Follow up Action on the Minutes of the 41st Meeting of the General Council was perused and approved by the General Council Members.

Item No. 3: Perusal of the Progress Report of the Council

A brief progress report of the council for the period (i) November 2018 – March 2019, (ii) April 2019 – March 2020 and (iii) April – July 2020 was perused, approved and appreciated by the General Council. Members highly appreciated Dr. Subodh Kumar, Member Secretary, RCI and his team for the achievements and functioning of the Council.

Item No.4: Perusal of the Minutes of the Meeting of the Executive Committee of RCI

The General Council perused minutes of the 80th and 81st Meeting of the Executive Committee of RCI held on 21.06.2019 and 06.02.2020 respectively.

Item No. 5: Assessment Report Format for Fresh and Extension of Approval

The General Council perused and approved the proposal for Assessment Report Formats for Fresh and Extension of Approval.


- **Action taken on Item no. 5:** Assessment Report Formats (Fresh and Extension of Approval) developed separately in respect of courses at Certificate, Diploma, Bachelor, Master, M.Phil level of various disability specialization have been uploaded on the Council's website. These formats are being utilized for inspection of various courses by the experts w.e.f. 2020-21.

Item No. 6A: Registration of 364 candidates who have passed B.Ed.Spl.Ed.-ODL course from unapproved study centres - reg.

Item No. 6B: Grant of permission to conduct B.Ed.Spl.Ed.-ODL course by UoU in Summer and Winter Session from the academic session 2019-20-reg

After detailed deliberations, it was decided that an Expert Committee may be constituted by the Council to look into these matters to take appropriate decision during next Executive Committee/ General Council Meeting so that uniformity can be achieved in dealing with such cases.



Item No. 7: Registration of candidates in the CRR of the Council-reg.

- (a): **Registration of B.M.Sc. passed candidates from YMCA Institute of Education, Chennai-reg**
- (b): **Registration of M.Ed.Spl.Ed.(LD) passed candidates from Jamia Milia Islamia University, Delhi-reg**
- (c): **Registration of B.M.Sc. passed candidates from NIEPVD, Dehradun - reg.**

After detailed deliberations, it was decided that an Expert Committee may be constituted by the Council for this purpose and to include all other such type of cases. The recommendations of the Expert Committee may be put up before the next Executive Committee/General Council for decision on these matters.

- **Action taken on Item No. 6A, 6B and 7:** The Council has constituted an Expert Committee under the Chairpersonship of Prof. Subha Sankar Sarkar, Vice Chancellor, Netaji Subhash Open University (NSOU), Kolkata to discuss and submit their recommendations with regard to consideration for registration of candidates who have undergone B.Ed.Spl.Ed.-ODL mode at unapproved study centres of Uttarakhand Open University along with the candidates completed the B.M.Sc. course from YMCA, Chennai and NIEPVD, Dehradun and M.Ed.Spl.Ed. (LD) course from Jamia Milia Islamia University, Delhi. In this regard, the Council has conducted two meetings on 7th and 8th October, 2020 through virtual mode. As recommended by the Committee, detailed matter in chronological order of B.Ed.Spl.Ed.-ODL course has been sent to the Chairperson of the Committee and its members.

Item No. 8: Approval of various decisions taken during the meeting held with Directors of National Institutes conducting Examinations for RCIs approved Certificate & Diploma Level Courses held on 29th January, 2020 & 18th June, 2020 at RCI.

The General Council perused various recommendations made during the meeting of Directors of NIs regarding conducting examinations of RCI approved certificate and diploma level courses. The matter was discussed in detail inter-alia conduct of online examination to bring about transparency in the system, to stop cheating, streamlining the online examinations and maintaining the quality. It was decided that a Plan of Action for formulating uniform academic calendar, modalities and to undertake new initiatives to prevent malpractices; to ensure smooth conduct of online examinations, including practical examinations, that are required to be submitted by NIs in a time bound manner.

- **Action taken on Item No. 8:** As per the decision, Plan of Action to conduct examinations of Certificate and Diploma level courses was submitted by all the National Institutes conducting the said examinations.

Term End Theory Examinations of Certificate and Diploma level courses have been conducted in December, 2020. The Council has prepared a tentative Annual Academic Activity Calendar to bring out the uniformity in examination process and other allied activities and the same has been sent to all the respective NIs for their inputs.

Item No. 9: Grant of provisional permission to State Open Universities to initiate admission process for B.Ed. Spl. Edn. (ODL) courses only for the current academic session 2020-21.



After detailed deliberations, the members emphasized that prescribed rules and regulations are to be enforced, strictly for maintaining the quality. The Chairperson, RCI advised that a Committee may be constituted to visit the universities and educational institutions. However, it was agreed that the year 2020 being an extraordinary year, provisional permission to State Open Universities to initiate admission process for B.Ed. Special Education (ODL) course only for the current academic session 2020-21 may be granted. The General Council Members must also be nominated and be associated in the Committee to visit and interact with Vice-Chancellors of the Open Universities. The General Council Member appreciated and expressed their willingness for the same.

- **Action taken on Item No. 9:** The Council has granted conditional permission due to the COVID-19 pandemic situation to start admission process for B.Ed.Spl.Ed.-ODL course for the current academic session 2020-21 to 04 State Open Universities viz. MPBOU, Bhopal, NSOU, Kolkata, UPRTOU, Uttar Pradesh & UOU, Haldwani vide Council's letter No. 10-102/ Open University/RCI/2016 Dated 2nd September, 2020.

Item No. 10: Consideration of various recommendations received from Shri Mukesh Gupta, Zonal Coordinator, ZCC Northern Zone (III).

- (I) Keeping in view the unprecedented COVID-19 situation, Shri Mukesh Gupta, Zonal Coordinator, ZCC Northern Zone (III) suggested relaxation in the AIOAT 2020 and to allow direct admission for Diploma level programmes by RCI. After detailed deliberations, the Council accepted the suggestions of Shri Mukesh Gupta. However, the Council decided that the direct admission is to be done strictly on the basis of merit and as per norms. Dr Subodh Kumar, Member Secretary, RCI, however stated that the Council will develop a protocol for online centralized admission process. The prescribed enrollment fee of Rs. 500/- per candidate will continue to be charged by RCI. The Council approved the same.
- (II) The General Council approved the following:
 - (a) Institutions whose inspection is done for ongoing courses and proposal is rejected for the academic year 2020-21 may be given an opportunity to submit the undertaking/affidavit on the prescribed format on non-judicial stamp paper for compliance of shortcomings and based on it, permission for admission can be given for 2020-21 batch on conditional basis. Team to be deputed for the next academic session 2021-22 subject to the condition that if similar shortcomings are observed by the team, then further extension of approval is not to be given under any circumstances.
 - (b) Institutions whose proposal is due for extension of approval and team has already been deputed for inspection for the academic session 2020-21 however, inspection could not be completed due to COVID-19 situation may also be considered for permission to admit students for 2020-21 batch, subject to the condition that the institution will submit the undertaking/affidavit on the prescribed format on non-judicial stamp paper stating that if any shortcomings are found during the inspection, the Council shall reserve the right to withhold the extension of approval for next batch 2021-22 or take any penal action against the institutions as deemed fit. The team already deputed will be asked to carry out the inspection once normalcy is restored.



- (c) Fresh proposals received for 2020-21, without inspection permission cannot be granted. However, team will visit the institutions in due course depending on the COVID-19 situations for academic session 2021-22.
- (III) Keeping in view the standing order issued to all Universities to promote all first year students in the second year by the other academic bodies like UGC and NCTE, the General Council approved promotion of the students in the second year subject to the following conditions:
- (a) Students must have scored minimum 75% attendance up to 20th March, 2020.
 - (b) Students who have already obtained minimum passing marks in internal examinations (Theory and Practical)
 - (c) Exams of 1st year to be conducted along with 2nd year exams.
- (IV) All second year pending examinations under NBER may be taken up and completed as soon as possible; so that students do not loose opportunity for gainful employment which should be the top priority. Discussion may be held on changing the model of examination, from paper-based test to online/home-based/open-book examination etc., like being planned by other examining bodies in the country:
- It is already approved under Agenda Item No. 8.
- (V) Extension of grace period of one year for renewal of registration: Not required as provision already exists.
- **Action taken on Item No. 10:** As per the decision of the Council,
 - (i) Centralised Online Admission Portal for admission to Diploma level for the academic session 2020-21 has been developed in-house by engaging software developers.

The NBER issued detailed guidelines and schedule for admission to Diploma level courses for the Academic session 2020-21, purely on merit basis through Centralized Online Admission Portal vide its Circular No. 25-15/NBER(AIOAT)/RCI/2016 dated 10th Sep., 2020.

Till the 4th round of counseling for admission, 12633 seats have been filled. However, based on the requests of the training institutes during the 10th Interactive Session through VC held on 22nd Jan., 2021 and keeping in view of the large public interest, open round of admissions has been announced vide circular dated 23rd Jan., 2021 to fill the remaining vacant seats.

Admission formalities have been completed on 30th Jan., 2021 and total 14703 candidates (76.42%) out of 19239 seats have been admitted in 702 institutions conducting 18 courses for the academic session 2020-21. A sum of Rs. 3.80 crores has been received as application fee for admission to diploma level courses.
 - (ii) As approved the Council has issued a notification No. 8-A/Policy (Recog)/2019/RCI dated 21.08.2020.



- (a) Till 31st August, 2020, the Council deputed inspection team for assessment of 566 courses due for extension of approval from the academic session 2020-21. Out of these, 21 proposals were rejected. However, as per the decision of the Council, conditional permission has been granted to conduct these courses.
- (a) For the academic session 2020-21, inspection reports in respect of 427 proposals due for extension of approval have been considered for permission to admit students for 2020-21 batch.
- (a) Team has been deputed for assessment of 236 fresh proposals, out of which 32 proposals have been considered and approval granted and 14 proposals rejected. Report of 190 proposals is yet to be received.
- (iii) As approved the Council has issued a notification No. 25-1/NBER(policy)/RCI/2016 dated 1st Oct., 2020 for promotion of 1st year students of RCI approved diploma level courses to 2nd year.
- (iv) All the pending examinations of 2nd year along with the backlog have been conducted in the month of December, 2020 by the respective NIs.
- (v) No action required.

Item No. 11: Nomination of Zonal Coordination Committee (ZCC) Members and renaming of Zonal Coordinator as Chairperson, ZCC

Keeping in view the vast administrative experience of efficiently nurturing training institutions, the General Council considered the candidature of Smt. Dyuti Rani D. Burman, IPS (Retd), Guwahati to be associated with the Council as Chief Corordinator, North Eastern Zone-II till the term of ZCC is completed. The General Council, further, approved the renaming of the existing term 'Zonal Coordinator' to 'Chief Coordinator' of the ZCCs. The relaxation in age upto 65 years subject to fitness for all ZCC Coordinators and Members was also approved. As rehabilitation institutions and human resource training in different areas of rehabilitation science such as community based rehabilitation workers, care givers, rehabilitation psychologists, speech therapists, etc need to be encouraged, the otherwise deficient region of the North East needs proper mentoring and oversight in this regard. The Committee approved her nomination as ZC Coordinator.

The Committee also noted that more such people with experience should be nominated since it would help RCI which has very few officials on its strength.

- **Action taken on Item No. 11:** Smt. Dyuti Rani D. Burman, IPS (Retd), Guwahati has been appointed as Chief Coordinator of ZCC (North Eastern Zone-II) by the Council.

Existing designation of 'Zonal Coordinator' has been renamed as 'Chief Coordinator' vide Order No. 10-75/zcc/policy/2001/RCI dated 31st August, 2020.

Item No. 12: Approval for implementation of e-Office application at Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI)

The General Council approved the proposal.



- **Action taken on Item No. 12:** As approved, the matter has been taken up with NIC and payment of Rs.55.21 lakhs has been released to NICS in Jan 2021. The implementation of e-Office in the Council is under process at the end of NICS.

Item No. 13: Approval for receipt of processing Fee for CRE points to Registered Professionals/ Personnel who have undergone online WHO Course

Dr. Subodh Kumar, Member Secretary, RCI apprised the General Council members that it was at the behest of secretary DEPwD & Chairperson, RCI that pursuing of online WHO Courses by rehabilitation professional/personnel to train them to become Corona Warriors during global pandemic, could become a reality, further the award of 50 CRE points by RCI to them. He further informed the Council that the Council has received an overwhelming response for registering for online WHO courses by the rehabilitation professional/personnel. The Council is maintaining registrations of such rehabilitation professional/personnel and sharing it with the Ministry.

The General Council approved the proposal to grant 50 CRE points and processing fee of Rs. 500/- per participant to meet the additional cost on development of portal and issue of online certificates by the Council at the time of renewal and registration.

- **Action taken on Item No. 13:** Online software has been developed in-house for award of 50 CRE points to the rehab professionals / personnel on the basis of WHO online courses on COVID-19. In this regard, a Circular No. 7-16/RCI-2016 dated 27th October 2020 has been issued to all concerned applicants and training institutes. So far, 13623 candidates have applied. Out of these, 7240 candidates have been issued digital CRE certificates. A sum of Rs. 68 lakhs has been received as processing fee for the same.

The applications of 574 candidates were rejected due to incomplete information and received after due date. The process of issuance of digital CRE certificates is on.

Item No. 14: Annual Action Plan 2020-21

The General Council approved the Annual Action Plan 2020-21.

- **Action taken on Item No. 14:** As approved, the Annual Action Plan is being implemented.

Item No. 2: Exemption of Internship period beyond March 2020 due to lock down for the BASLP students of 2016-17 batch

Keeping in view the unprecedented COVID-19 pandemic situation and future of the BASLP students of 2016 batch, the General Council approved the proposal for consideration for exemption of Internship period beyond March 2020 by the respective affiliating Universities as a one time measure.

- **Action taken on Supplementary agenda Item No. 2:** As approved, a circular No. 7-91/RCI/2019 dated 22nd July 2020 has been issued granting exemption to the BASLP students of 2016-17 batch for Internship period beyond March 2020 by the respective affiliating Universities as a one time measure.

43rd MEETING OF THE GENERAL COUNCIL

43rd Annual General Meeting of the Council was held on 16th February, 2021 at 11.00 A.M. at Heritage Village, Goa.

At the outset, Dr. Subodh Kumar, Member Secretary, RCI extended a warm welcome to Smt. Shakuntala D. Gamlin, IAS, Secretary DEPwD & Chairperson, RCI and other Members of the General Council. With the permission of the Chair, he presented a PPT and briefed about the mandate of RCI, its activities and achievements during the last two years to the newly appointed Council's members. The members were briefed about:



- (i) Development of six months' CBID programme developed by the Rehabilitation Council of India as per MoU between Government of India and Australia. He stated that the Council has conducted a number of meetings including six day International Workshop in which 22 CBR Expert members from Australia and India participated to develop the said programme. The proposed CBID programme is to be conducted initially by National Institutes, seven non-government organizations with regional partners preferably in NE and Ladakh & J&K region and two batches in a year with intake of maximum 40 per batch on pilot basis. The Centres in NE, J&K and Ladakh may be subsidized by RCI for enrolling and mobilizing students. Self Learning Materials in Hindi and English have been developed by the Council and is expected to be released by the second week of March, 2021 by the DEPwD.
- (ii) The Member Secretary, RCI further stated that the Council has conducted a workshop at Guwahati about alignment of RCI courses in the light of RPWD Act, 2016. During the workshop, it has emerged that there is a need for convergence of underutilized courses. Further, RCI Vision Document 2020-30 was also developed.
- (iii) He informed to the members that RCI has only one office at New Delhi. The Council has constituted Zonal Coordination Committees (ZCC) for the monitoring of training programmes in the field of disability rehabilitation and special education. The ZCCs have been increased from 7 to 14 to cover the entire geographical area of the country.
- (iv) He further informed to the Council members that at present the Council has approved 60 courses from Diploma to M.Phil level in various specializations of disability.
- (v) Consequent upon the introduction of New Education Policy (NEP) 2020, there is a need to review the courses, quality, continuation or discontinuation of M.Phil course and various implications on RCI approved courses. He stated that a meeting of Experts was held in the first week of February, 2021 under the Chairpersonship of the Secretary, DEPwD and Chairperson RCI where 21 leading Experts from Ministeries / Departments and other eminent Experts were present.
- (vi) He also explained that the Council has taken utmost care about quality and transparency in the system for the grant of approval to the training institutions. Accordingly, the Council has revised and simplified Assessment Report format separately for each of the 18 courses and the process of recognition. The Council has also developed online Portal including payment gateway system for transparency.
- (vii) The Council members were also apprised of the Mental Health Counselling Services during COVID-19 pandemic.
- (viii) The Council has promoted WHO free online courses on COVID-19 amongst the rehabilitation professionals / personnel to undergo atleast 10 courses. For this purpose, the Council has developed in-house online software for issue of certificate of participation to WHO free online courses to enable them to accumulate maximum 50 CRE points. The Council has got tremendous response from the rehab professionals and personnel. So far 3516 professionals have undergone the courses and CRE points have been awarded to these professionals.



(ix) Due to COVID-19 pandemic situation and lockdown, All India Online Aptitude Test 2020 (AIOAT) was not feasible for admission to RCI approved Diploma level courses for the academic session 2020-21 in the 650 training institutions with intake of 19,500 seats. As per the decision taken by the General Council in its 42nd virtual meeting held on 07.08.2020, the Council developed a Centralized Online Admission Portal for fair and transparent admission process. 83,000 candidates applied against 19,500 seats available for admission to Diploma level courses. Highest ever 76% of the seats have been filled for the academic session 2020-21.

(x) Besides these achievements, the Council has detailed other achievements as per the progress report contained in Annexure 3 to the Agenda.

The Council Members appreciated the achievements made by the Member Secretary, RCI and his team under the leadership of Chairperson, RCI and Secretary, DEPwD.

Smt. Shakuntala D. Gamlin, IAS, Secretary DEPwD & Chairperson, RCI welcomed all the newly nominated members to the 43rd meeting of the General Council. She stated that the members of the Rehabilitation Council of India working in the field of disability rehabilitation will contribute to meet the objectives envisaged in the Rehabilitation Council of India Act, 1992 for the empowerment and rehabilitation of persons with disabilities (Divyangjan) and requested the Member Secretary, RCI to take up the Agenda items.

Item No. 1: Confirmation of the Minutes of the 42nd Meeting of the General Council of RCI

The Minutes of the 42nd Meeting of the General Council of RCI held on 07.08.2020 were confirmed.

Item No. 2: Follow up action on the Minutes of the 42nd Meeting of the General Council

Follow up Action on the Minutes of the 42nd Meeting of the General Council was perused and approved by the General Council Members.

Item No. 3: Perusal of the Progress Report of the Council

Progress Report was noted.

Members highly appreciated Dr. Subodh Kumar, Member Secretary, RCI and his team for the achievements and functioning of the Council.

Shri Pankaj Maru stated that it has been experienced that due to COVID-19 pandemic situation, the schools are closed as a precautionary measure to reduce the spread of the novel Corona virus amongst the school going children including CWSN. Since special school is one of the essential parameter for assessment to grant approval to start / extension of courses, the inspection of the institutes is not feasible wherever schools have been closed by the State Governments due to COVID-19 pandemic situation. He suggested that for the extension o approval, essential parameter of special schools be relaxed where the school is closed by the Govt. and based on the previous records of the special school, the report be prepared on other available infrastructural facilities at the time of inspection. However, this condition be restricted for the extension of approval of courses not for fresh proposal.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

To carry out the purposes of the Act, the Executive Committee is constituted from amongst the members of the Council as per Section 7 (1) of the Rehabilitation Council of India Act, 1992 (as amended in 2000). The Executive Committee is responsible for the management and administration of the affairs of the Council. The Executive Committee of the Council shall meet at least once in every four months. The meeting of the Executive Committee may be convened by the Chairperson of the Executive Committee or any other member of the Executive Committee who may be authorized by him on his behalf.

Consequent upon reconstitution of the General Council vide Notification No. S.O. 3609 (E) dated 14th October, 2020, constitution of the Executive Committee is under consideration as of 31st March, 2021.

82nd MEETING OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

82nd Meeting of the Executive Committee of Rehabilitation Council of India was held on 5th October, 2020 at DEPwD through video conferencing.

Smt. Tarika Roy, Joint Secretary, DEPwD and Dr. Ravinder Singh, Member could not attend the meeting.

At the outset, Dr. Subodh Kumar, Member Secretary, RCI extended a warm welcome to Smt. Shakuntala D. Gamlin, Chairperson, RCI and other Members of Executive Committee, RCI.

Smt. Shakuntala D. Gamlin, Secretary, DEPwD & Chairperson, RCI welcomed all the members to the 82nd meeting of the Executive Committee and requested Member Secretary, RCI to take up the



Agenda items.

Item No. 1: Confirmation of the Minutes of the 81st Meeting of the Executive Committee

The minutes of the 81st Meeting of the Executive Committee held on 06.02.2020 were confirmed.

The Chairperson, RCI suggested that the RCI approved courses need to be aligned with the provisions of the RPwD Act, 2016 so as to improve the prospects of employment. She informed that efforts are on to redraft the RCI Act. Further, the National Education Policy for primary school curriculum should be incorporated in the training modules developed by RCI. She further stated that there is a need for developing teaching techniques for innovative, inclusive education, skill development and employment of persons with disabilities. The difficulties faced by PwDs in inclusive education need to be addressed with technological intervention, creative curriculum design and adoption of technology and artificial intelligence.

Item No. 2: Follow-up-Action on the Minutes of the 81st Meeting of the Executive Committee

Follow up action on the Minutes of the 81st Meeting of EC held on 06.02.2020 was approved.

Item No. 3: Progress Report

Progress Report was noted.

The Chairperson, RCI further stated that after two and half decades of Rehabilitation Council of India Act, 1992, time has come to review and amend the Act for aligning it with the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 and Mental Healthcare Act, 2017. She also pointed out that Ministry of Health & Family Welfare has introduced the National Commission for Allied Health Professions Bill, 2000 in Rajya Sabha, which *inter alia* includes profession such as occupation therapist, physiotherapist, psychologist who is essentially working for rehabilitation of persons with disabilities and there is a need to relook at these provisions in the bill. Dr. Subodh Kumar, Member Secretary, RCI suggested that a copy of the draft amendment of RCI Act, 1992 may be sent to all the General Council / Executive Committee Members for suggestions, if any.

As per the recommendations of the Expert Committee on Clinical Psychology meeting held on 17.09.2020, the nomenclature of M.Phil (Clinical Psychology) and M.Phil (Rehab Psychology) is to be continued as it took several years of effort to build these programmes. However, keeping in mind the vision and thrust of the New Education Policy 2020, the RCI needs to develop an integrated M.Phil programme along with Ph.D.

- **Action Taken Report on Item No. 3:** Progress Report was perused and appreciated by the Executive Committee.

As recommended by the Executive Committee, a Circular has been issued and published on the website of the Council for continuation of M.Phil (Clinical Psychology) and M.Phil (Rehab psychology). Development of integrated M.Phil programme along with Ph.D is being placed before Expert Committee Meeting and the recommendations will be placed before next Executive Committee meeting.



Item No. 4: Approval of Revised Estimates (RE) 2020-21 and proposed Budget Estimate (BE) 2021-22


Revised Estimates (RE) 2020-21 and proposed Budget Estimate (BE) 2021-22 statement were perused and approved.

- **Action Taken Report on Item No. 4:** Revised Estimate (RE) 2020-21 and proposed Budget Estimate (BE) 2021-22 of the Council as approved in the 82nd Executive Committee have been submitted to DEPwD, vide Council's letter No. 9-2/Acctts/RCI/8171-72 Dated 6th October 2020.

Any other:

1. Regarding printing of the booklet of state-wise categories of registered professionals and personnel and training institutions, it was decided that it will be appropriate to get it printed in both eBook and manual mode.
- **Action Taken:** The booklet of state-wise categories of registered professionals and personnel and training institutions has been prepared and its designing and printing is under process. The same will be placed before next meeting.
2. RCI should explore additional office space from the National Institute of Social Defence, an autonomous body of MSJE, R.K. Puram, New Delhi or any other government building located in the vicinity of RCI Headquarters.
- **Action Taken:** The Council has requested the Director, National Institute of Social Defence and Indian Society for Technical Education to confirm availability of additional office space and the terms and conditions vide RCI letter No. 5-196/2015-RCI dated 16th June 2021. The reply is still awaited. The same is being followed up.
3. Shri Pankaj Maru appreciated RCI's initiatives for centralized online admission for approved diploma level courses for the current academic session 2020-21. He further suggested in case some seats remain unfulfilled, the last date may further be extended. Dr. Subodh Kumar, Member Secretary, RCI apprised that he would review situation at the appropriate time.
- **Action Taken:** The decision has been complied with.
4. The Chairperson, RCI suggested that separate module for doctors, teachers, policy makers, media persons, legislators be developed to sensitize them. Members may email their recommendations to RCI for taking appropriate decision.
- **Action Taken:** The Council has developed revised separate Modules for each category viz. For Introductory, Educational Functionaries, Grass Root Level Functionaries, Health & Allied Professionals. Module for Senior & Mid Level Functionaries is being finalised soon.
5. She further stated that the Uniform Indian Sign Language needs to be implemented vigorously to popularize the course in the area of education and communication. Accordingly, there is a need to develop short term module and also diploma level modules.

- **Action Taken:** The Expert Committee Meeting on convergence of courses was held on 04/03/2021 and 04/06/2021. The Committee was informed about inclusion of Indian Sign Language modules in the revised syllabus. Also, to develop six months duration top up course on ISL. One more meeting to finalise the course curriculum at Diploma level after its convergence was held on 6th July 2021 to have a final view of the experts.

6. Shri Pankaj Maru suggested that RCI should maintain its data base of registered professionals / personnel containing their mobile numbers and email addresses. Wherever required SMS / messages may be sent through SMS gateway at one click.
- **Action Taken:** The e-Portal for registration of professionals/personnel in the CRR developed in house was inaugurated by the Chairperson, RCI & Secretary DEPwD during 43rd General Council Meeting held on 16.02.2021 at Goa. The portal contains all such features.
7. The Member Secretary, RCI apprised that RCI has strated a new initiative of a regular “Interactive Session” with all RCI approved institutions and other stake holders every Wednesday at 4:00 pm. Where all the grievances of the institutions and stake holders are heard and redressed on the spot as far as possible. The grievances that require examination are noted and redressed with promptitude.
- **Action Taken:** This initiative has been much appreciated by the stakeholders. So far, 15 interactive sessions have been conducted and maximum upto 395 institutions joined these interactive sessions.
8. The Chairperson, RCI also suggested that while conducting the inspection of the institutions to accord approval to run RCI apporoves courses, the Council must include senior level retired government officers including Vice Chancellors, Professors, Lawyers, Police Officers, Administrative Officers and Accounts Officers in the regulatory and policy matters to bring

in more substance and content in the policy and regularity matters of RCI. They will be reimbursed TA/DA and honorarium as per the norms of the Council.

- **Action Taken:** In addition to the visiting experts, the Council also deputed EC & GC Members, ZCC Members, Retired Professors and Vice-Chancellors of Universities, State government officers for inspection of training institution.

However, in future the Council will also utilize the expertise of Lawyers, Police Officers, Administrative Officers and Accounts Officers wherever deemed necessary.

Launch of “Smart Hub” payment gateway

The Chairperson, RCI also launched the “Smart Hub” payment gateway of HDFC Bank for online payment for inspection and approval fee etc, through net banking and debit/credit cards, in the presence of all members of the Executive Committee and other officers present.

At the conclusion of the meeting, the Chairperson, RCI stated that the discussion has been purposeful and constructive for RCI as a regulatory and enabling institution; the RCI must continue to bring more substance content in the policy and regularity matters of the RCI work towards expanding its outreach, build capacity in different States and broaden the pedagogy and academic content both qualitatively and quantitatively.



CHAPTER – 2

STANDARDISATION OF TRAINING PROGRAMMES AND EXPERT COMMITTEES

The Council develops and standardizes training programmes to meet the human resource requirement for various categories of Professionals/Personnel allocated to RCI. These programmes are reviewed, revised and updated from time to time. As per Chapter III Section 18 of the RCI Act, 1992, “The Council may prescribe minimum standards of education required for granting recognised rehabilitation qualification by Universities or institutions in India”. At present, 60 programmes are functional through regular mode in the area of disability rehabilitation and special education and the list of such programmes is given at **Annexure 2.1**.

Procedure for standardization of programmes in the field of Disability Rehabilitation and Special Education



EXPERT COMMITTEES

To carry out the purpose of the Rehabilitation Council of India Act, 1992 (as amended in 2000), the Council has constituted various Expert Committees under Sub-Section (1) of Section 7 of the RCI Act. The list of the Expert Committees is placed at **Annexure 2.2. to 2.13**. Functions of the Expert Committees are as given below:

- (i) To recommend the courses, its duration, subject for examinations and standards of the proficiency to be obtained in any University or Institution for grant of recognized rehabilitation qualifications.



- (ii) To recommend the minimum standards of the staff, equipment, accommodation, library and other infrastructural facilities for institution and training of the rehabilitation professionals.
- (iii) Any other related matter.

The meetings of the Expert Committees organized during the period and gist of the discussions taken are as under:

MEETING OF EXPERT COMMITTEES


Development and Standardization of Courses:

- I. **A Meeting of the Core Committee on Clinical Psychology** was held on August 24, 2020 through video conference at RCI on **“Inclusion of aspects related to community/family sensitization and community resilience for rehabilitation of persons with disabilities in the course curriculum of clinical psychology /rehabilitation psychology /caregivers from diploma to PhD. Level”**. Subsequent Meeting was also conducted on August 28, 2020 through video conference at RCI to finalize the modules.

The following recommendations were made unanimously by the committee:

- (a) A stand alone module to be developed immediately which can be circulated to all the training institutions to be implemented along with the present course curriculum. In due course of time, this module can be incorporated as a part of relevant papers in the respective RCI approved courses.
- (b) Two separate modules may be developed - Basic (generic) level and Advanced (specific) level. The generic/ basic module can be implemented in the courses other than psychology like in education, audiology, etc. and the advanced /specific module can be implemented in courses of Psychology.
- (c) Each module should be of 4-6 units and a unit should not be more than one hour. Both the modules together should be of maximum 15 hours, however, the duration of each part may be decided on the content to be delivered.
- (d) The modules should have a specific learning objective & the curriculum transaction can involve various teaching learning methods such as lecture, tutorial, practicum (LTP) and case presentation followed by an evaluation of the outcome.
- (e) In place of Basic and Advanced, the modules must be mentioned as Part-1 for other than mental health professionals and Part-2 for mental health professionals (as per the inclusion in MHC Act).
- (f) Transgender group should be added under special groups.
- (g) Components like domestic violence, child sexual abuse should be mentioned.
- (h) Guidelines will be prepared for implementation so as to maintain uniformity and have similar understanding including faculty requirement & eligibility, references to be used, pattern of assignments to be used, etc.

- (i) Chairperson of the committee will prepare the structure and content of the modules, circulate to all the members, and finalise the modules for submission to RCI.
- (j) After the final approval of the Council, the final modules may be circulated to all the approved institutions of RCI for implementation from the current academic year
- (k) The evaluation for these modules in the current academic session will be as internal evaluation and the marks may be added to the marks obtained at the term-end university exam marks.
- (l) Same committee will be continued for review of proposal on Tele-Psycho Therapy Services received from NIMHANS.

II. A Meeting of the Core Committee on certification of Guidelines for Tele-Psychotherapy Services as a recognized mode of clinical services by RCI certified Clinical Psychologist was held on August 31, 2020 through Video Conferencing at RCI.

The following recommendations were made unanimously by the committee:

- a) Telepsychology services (Consultation, Assessment, Treatment, Rehabilitation, Review, Referral, etc) must be approved by the RCI as valid professional services and should be recognized as regular professional practice when offered by the RCI approved and other recognized professionals following a mandatory training as specified from time to time.
- b) The Guidelines for the practice of Tele-psychotherapy services is a legal document with several legal ramifications in the services sectors. Therefore, a legally sound and valid Practice Guidelines in this regard is an urgent need, and must be developed and be implemented by the Council based on priority basis.




- c) In view of its legal nature, the Practice Guidelines for Tele-psychotherapy must be developed by the Council itself and rather than outsourcing it to any other institute or approving any guidelines developed by others. Notwithstanding this caveat, expertise available at other institutes/departments/centres in this and subject matter may be mobilized on request, depending on the need.
- d) The Tele-psychotherapy shall be initially limited to only RCI registered clinical psychologists who after successful completion and obtaining a prescribed grade, in a mandatory training course conducted either through an online/in-person mode on nuances of offering web-based professional services, would render these services to the extent they have been approved by the Council. Keeping these norms in mind as a framework the Practice Guidelines as well as Competency-based Training manuals shall be developed and implemented by the Council.
- e) Keeping consistent with international rules & regulations, the Tele-psychotherapy work must be restricted within the boundaries of Indian sovereignty (all Union Territories included).
- f) The Council would develop two different documents - 1) Practice Guidelines for Tele psychotherapy (PGT), and 2) Competency-Based Training Manual (CBT-M). The later may have two levels; a) for the students in professional training (an introductory module), b) those that are qualified and already in professional services/practices with valid CRR (advanced version).
- g) The assessment of the levels of skill, knowledge, attitude and practice-related issues after the prescribed training must be carried out by the trainers and be graded objectively. Failing to obtain the prescribed grade would automatically mean the person is ineligible to offer online or web-based interventions. However, unsuccessful candidates are permitted to reappear in the assessment after a brief period re-training (at least one-third of time spent in training).
- h) The training modules should be comprehensive and the trained professionals should be made familiar with the scope and limitations of the online web-based professional interventions, FAQ, Do's and Don'ts, the law, the legal implications of the services offered, evaluation of the clients/family, record keeping – method and extent, etc.
- i) The limitation of rendering professional services only through audio mode was pointed out and the committee acknowledged the importance of incorporation of necessary clause when and where only audio mode is resorted for rendering professional services.
- j) The first draft of both the documents (PGT and CBT-M) would be circulated by the Chairperson (Dr. KBK) among the members of this group within one month and be implemented in the current academic year after incorporating any suggestions/modifications by the members.
- k) With regards to claims made by persons with M.A./M.Sc. Psychology qualification to practice/undertake online/in-person Psychotherapy work or function as Clinical

Psychologist was discussed and unanimously rejected any such plea and was declared by all the members such professional engagements by non-qualified and non-registered persons are not legal and to be deemed invalid.


III A Meeting on Inclusion of A & B level contents of Indian Sign Language in D.Ed., B.Ed. & M.Ed. syllabus of RCI was held on September 8, 2020 through Video Conferencing at RCI.

The following recommendations were made unanimously by the committee:

- a) ISL components could be increased during the syllabus revision of D.Ed.(HI), B.Ed.(HI) & M.Ed. (HI).
- b) Terminologies can be changed to Basic, Intermediate and Advance instead of A, B and C levels.
- c) Undertaking competency based test could be explored before CRR registration with RCI.
- d) The Sign Language and Bilingualism should be included in the syllabus and offered as elective papers to make the syllabus accessible.

IV. A Meeting of Expert Committee on Clinical Psychology was held on September 17, 2020 through Video Conferencing at RCI to review the nomenclature of M.Phil Clinical Psychology in the light of NEP 2020 and starting of short term programs in the field of psychology to meet the shortage of manpower.

The following recommendations were made unanimously by the committee:


Agenda 1: To review the nomenclature of M.Phil. (Clinical psychology)

- a) The 2-yr. M.Phil Programs in Clinical Psychology and Rehabilitation Psychology in the respective professional domains should be continued, as is manner, for time being.
- b) A notification should be issued by the Council immediately to remove all uncertainties and confusion existing with regard to continuity of these two programs.
- c) An integrated program at the next level should be developed and implemented concurrently maintaining the content, structure, eligibility conditions of the M.Phil program since this module has served the purpose of developing required human resource in the field of professional psychology and being tested for more than 60 years in the country. Additional two years training, one year each in research and clinical internship – a capstone experience, culminating academic and intellectual experience for students, which is conspicuously missing in the current M.Phil training should be added to make it a comprehensive and complete Clinical Doctorate program per global standard and in

the lines with Doctorate Degrees existing elsewhere in the World for Practice-oriented Clinical Psychologists who could render expertise both as generalists and specialists. The country needs more of service-oriented professionals who could adapt to realities of both rural and urban areas, than hard-line researchers. The need of the hour is reaching the unreached through various service-based projects.

Agenda 2: To review the start of Low-intensity Therapist (LIT) training programme to meet the shortage of human resources in areas like School Mental Health, Substance Use Suicide Prevention, Crisis Intervention, Depression, Anxiety Disorders, Family Counselling, Adjustment Disorder, etc.

- a) Programs at different level in various specialities, in aforementioned areas, and/or any other relevant areas apart from what is mentioned in Agenda point-2 should be developed and offered for students with minimum Bachelor Degree in Psychology (4 years of study of Psychology as core subject) or Masters Degree holders in Psychology (5 years of study of Psychology as core subject). Such training programs should have both theory and supervised practical input by RCI qualified professionals.
- b) New training Program in core clinical psychology and/or other related areas should not be less than one year and these should be conceptualized with approximately 6 months of theory input and another 6 months of practical/clinical/field/community hands-on experience (as case may be).

Agenda 3: Launching of Counselling Psychology training programme at Masters' level to meet the manpower shortage.

- a) Counselling psychology, particularly school counselling, should be taken up on priority




basis as new initiative by the Council at the Masters' level. Such program should not only should have intensive theory input but relevant practical/field and hands-on training in identifying children/adolescents with Mental Health issues, assessing, counselling/ treating the affected children/ adolescents and their families. Prevention strategies including developing family and community resilience also must be made as important focus of school-based training in counselling.

V. An Expert Committee meeting for development of curriculum in Physical Disability (VI, LV) was held on 01 March, 2021 at 10.30 a.m. through Video Conferencing.

After deliberate discussion on all the views with regard to curriculum development of D.Ed. Spl.Ed., B.Ed.Spl.Ed. and M.Ed.Sl.Ed., the members unanimously took the following decisions:

- a) Nomenclature of the programmes will be as under:
 - a. D.Ed.Spl.Ed.(Blindness & LV)
 - b. B.Ed.Spl.Ed.(Blindness & LV)
 - c. M.Ed.Spl.Ed.(Blindness & LV)
- b) Presently the Committee will look at syllabus of D.Ed.Spl.Ed.(VI) to find out as to what addition, deletion, modification this syllabus requires to make it comprehensive enough to meet the educational needs of children with low vision in theory component as well as practical.
- c) The 4 year B.Ed.Spl.Ed. Programme should be re-looked to make it comprehensive enough in terms of the education of children with low vision and also education of visually impaired children with multiple disabilities or Multiple Disabled Visually Impaired (MDVI).
- d) Sub-committee of 4 experts will be formed by the Chairperson of this Committee to prepare the structure for Top up course in VI so that the development can be done simultaneously.
- e) Syllabus of the existing D.Ed.Spl.Ed.(VI) curriculum was downloaded from RCI website and the decision of the papers to be retained, deleted was taken.
- f) The nomenclatures of some papers were also modified.
- g) Each member was given the responsibility of a theory paper or practical individually or in a group to submit their comments on addition, deletion or modification by 16th March, 2021 so as to make the teachers competent enough to teach children with blindness, children with low vision and children with associated disabilities.
- h) The learning outcomes for each paper and each module are to be written.
- i) Feedback to be sent to Council with copy to Prof. Mittal, Chairperson of the Committee



VI. An Expert Committee for development of curriculum in Physical Disability (HI & Speech Disorders) was held on 04 March, 2021 at 10.30 a.m. through Video Conferencing

The following recommendations were made unanimously by all the experts:

- Since the enrolment and employment of D.Ed.Spl.Ed.(HI) programme of 2 years duration was good, it will be retained till the 4 year integrated B.Ed. Special Education (HI and Speech) gains good grounds.
- A syllabi of Integrated 4 years program to be prepared.
- While revising the curriculum of all programs, provisions of RPWD Act (2016) and NEP (2020) be suitably incorporated.
- Top up courses in Hearing Impairment and Sign Language to be developed by experts of the group by co-opting members if required obtaining approval from RCI.
- Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) to be introduced.
- Pedagogy, practicals and sign language skills should be emphasized.
- Alternative options for Audiology/Speech practicals to be worked for deaf students enrolling in the curriculum of all programs.
- Curricular accessibility and reasonable accommodations as per RPWD Act (2016) and foundational literacy should be incorporated.


- i) Sign Language Interpreter should be a regular faculty in a training program.
- j) Revision to be started in a phased manner with D.Ed.Spl.Ed. (HI and Speech) first and next B.Ed.Spl.Ed.(HI and Speech) & M.Ed.Spl.Ed.(HI and Speech) curriculum to be developed.
- k) All the members agreed that suggestions of curriculum of D.Ed.Spl.Ed.(HI and Speech) to be submitted topic wise immediately to RCI and the Chairperson by 12th March 2021.
- l) A sub-committee formed to formulate the structure for Top courses.
- m) Shri K.N.Mishra was requested to prepare a module for internship.

VII. A meeting on e-content development was conducted on 05 March 2021 through video conferencing.

VIII. Expert Committee for development of curriculum for D.Ed and B.Ed in Developmental Disabilities (ID, ASD, LD) was held 08 March, 2021 at 10.30 a.m. through Video Conferencing.

The following recommendations were made unanimously by the committee:

- a) Course structure to be changed as three disabilities are to be included.
- b) Preamble, scope, eligibility for both courses will be prepared by Dr.Himangshu Das.
- c) Structure for both courses will be prepared by Prof.Amitav Mishra incorporating all the points discussed by the committee and circulated to all members for comments.
- d) After the structure is finalised the members will initiate the process of selection of papers and content writing.
- e) Final draft will be submitted to RCI.

IX. Expert Committee meeting was held on 7th and 8th October, 2020 through video conference to discuss the following issues:

A. Registration of B.M.Sc. passed candidates from YMCA Institute of Education, Chennai and NIEPVD, Dehradun.

It has been recommended by the committee that the request of the institute with regard to regularization of the 05 student passed B.M.SC course from YMCA and NIEPVD, Dehradun may be considered subject to the following conditions:

- Both the institute(s) must submit the undertaking stating that the B.M.SC course was conducted strictly as per the syllabus and it was ensured that all the required infrastructural facilities and faculties were available throughout the course as prescribed by the Council for said course.
- Both the institutes must submit undertaking on judicial stamp paper of Rs.500 stating that this kind of practice will not be repeated by them in future under any circumstances, failing which council shall reserve the rights to take disciplinary and penal action against the institutions as per rules.
- The validation fees as prescribed by the Council for regularization of registration of passed candidates of B.M.Sc course to be paid by the respective institutes

B. Registration of M.Ed.Spl.Ed.(LD) passed candidates from Jamia Milia Islamia University, Delhi.

Considering the fact that Jamia Milia Islamia University, New Delhi being a central University may not float the statutory provisions of the Council's and to safeguard the



future of 01 student it has been recommended by the committee that the request of the JMI with regard to regularization of the 01 student passed M.Ed.Spl.Ed.(LD) from JMI may be considered subject to the following conditions:

- JMI, New Delhi may submit in writing the reasons for conducting M.Ed.Spl.Ed.(LD) course with 01 student and without obtaining approval of the Council
- JMI, New Delhi must submit the undertaking stating that the M.Ed.Spl.Ed.(LD) course was conducted strictly as per the syllabus and it was ensured that all the required infrastructural facilities and faculties were available throughout the course as prescribed by the Council for said course.
- JMI, New Delhi must submit undertaking on judicial stamp paper of Rs.500 stating that this kind of practice will not be repeated by them in future under any circumstances, failing which council shall reserve the rights to take disciplinary and penal action against the institutions as per rules.
- The validation fees as prescribed by the Council for regularization of registration of passed candidates of B.M.Sc course to be paid by the respective institutes

C. Registration of 364 candidates who have passed B.Ed.Spl.Ed.-ODL course from unapproved study centres -reg.

It has been decided by the committee that the following information and documents pertaining to UoU, Haldwani to be furnished to the Committee Members for taking a judicious decision in this matter.

- Detailed concept note in chronological order comprising all the relevant and important information pertaining to B.Ed.Spl.Ed- ODL course since signing of MoU to till date.
- Copies of the important documents i.e. MoU, permission letters issued to UoU for conduct of B.Ed.Spl.Edn. Programme w.e.f. 2015-16 session and thereafter w.e.f. 2019-2020.
- Copies of the correspondence took place between RCI and UoU (both ways) regarding eligibility (i.e. lack of necessary infrastructure and instructional facilities available etc.) at the 22 unapproved study centres as depicted in Annexure-A of background note to be furnished.
- Details of workshop(s)/ seminar/conference/interactive meet etc. conducted by UoU, Haldwani under the approval of RCI alongwith the details of sanctioned grant if any.

D. Grant of permission to conduct B.Ed.Spl.Ed.-ODL course by UoU in Summer and Winter Session from the academic session 2019-20-reg

- It was decided by the Committee that the request of the UoU, Haldwani to conduct B.Ed.Spl.Ed.-ODL course by UoU in Summer and Winter Session from the academic session 2019-20 cannot be considered as the annual maximum intake prescribed by the Council for B.Ed.Spl.Ed- ODL course is only 500 seats, granting approval to such



request will be the violation of RCI's own norms. However, UGC has notified that State Open University(s) can take admissions in summer and winter sessions to avoid extension of last date every year.

OTHER MATTERS:

- I. **A meeting was held on 1st March 2021 with Member Secretary, National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE) through Video Conference regarding initiation of process for signing of a MoU between RCI and NCTE for recognition of TEIs for special teacher training courses.**

The following recommendations were made unanimously:

- The upcoming courses offered by NCTE will now be as per the mandate of NEP 2020. Accordingly, RCI too should endeavor to align with it.
- NCTE is dealing with general education and RCI is dealing with special education, therefore, the content of the course of General Education and Special Education needs to be shared between NCTE and RCI for similarity and to avoid replication of work. The curriculum prepared by NCTE for the ITEP shall be shared with RCI for introduction of special ITEP by RCI once the MoU is signed.
- The qualification, contents of the course and minimum standards for special teacher educators will be prepared by the RCI in consultation with NCTE.
- Regulations for TEIs imparting special teacher training courses to be framed in consultation between both the organizations.

- II. **Discontinuation of Master in Audiology Speech Language Pathology (MASLP) programme from the academic session 2021-22:**

As approved by Executive Committee of RCI in its 76th meeting held on 29th August 2017, the Master in Audiology Speech Language Pathology (MASLP) programme was discontinued w.e.f. the academic session 2018-19. However, based on the practical problems of training institutions the competent authority reconsidered and decided to continue the MASLP programme for the academic session 2018-19. Based on the recommendations of the expert committee, the Executive Committee of RCI in its 80th meeting held on 21 June 2019 provisionally agreed for continuation of MASLP programme two more academic sessions i.e. 2019-20, 2020-21.

Since, the extension of MASLP programme approved by the Council is valid upto academic session 2020-21, the said programme is being discontinued from the academic session 2021-22 vide circular no. 2-6/ASLP/2003/RCI Dated 27/01/2021

- III. Circular for amendment of entry level criteria in M.Sc.(AUD)/(SLP) was issued.

INTERACTIVE SESSIONS THROUGH VIDEO CONFERENCE DURING COVID-19 PANDEMIC

The Rehabilitation Council of India conducted the first of its kind virtual Interactive Sessions during the year 2020-21. Due to COVID-19 pandemic and lockdowns imposed by the government to contain the spread of the virus, it was necessary to have meetings through virtual mode to fill any gap arising



between the training institutions and the RCI, and to discuss issues and bring solutions together. The following interactive sessions were conducted with great success and with a huge number of participants from the training institutions.

1. Zonal Interactive session with all the heads of all RCI approved training institutes across the country.

The Council has conducted the following zonal interactive sessions with Head of the RCI approved institutions through video conferencing as per details given below:

After detailed deliberations on aforesaid issues, the following recommendations were made unanimously:

- Schedule and Guidelines for Online Centralized Admission process for admission to diploma level courses for the academic session 2020-21 to be uploaded on Council's website and will be functional from 14/09/2020.
- List of training intuitions given conditional permission to start admission process for 2020-21 to be uploaded on Council's website.
- Visiting experts deputed to carry out the assessment for the academic session 2020-21 will remain unchanged, unless the visiting experts refuse to conduct the assessment even after normalcy is restored or any other unavoidable situation arises.
- The Council will upload the prescribed proforma for submission of affidavit by the training institutes in pursuance of Council's Notification dated 21st August, 2020.
- The Council will hold a meeting to finalize the modalities and protocols to conduct online classes by the RCI's approved institutions.



- (vi) The Council to issue advisory to all institutes to pay the salary to all teaching and non teaching staff.
- (vii) All RCI approved institutions must have their own website and update the information about faculty, courses, validity, academic calendar, etc. In this matter, the institute will also upload video of minimum 5 minute duration on their website showing all the facilities available at their institute including clinic / special school activities.
- (viii) Recorded lectures on Navshikhar Channel on various disabilities to be uploaded on Council's website for use of general public.
- (ix) Universities Departments may conduct the examinations of 2nd year /final year in pursuance of the guidelines issued by the UGC.
- (x) State Govt. Directives are to be followed with regard to reservation policy for admission to various courses.
- (xi) Willingness/consent of visiting experts to be obtained before deputing them for inspection.
- (xii) Guidelines for promotion of students of first year to be communicated to all institutes. SOP provided by the affiliating universities be followed in conducting admission and examination.
- (xiii) The Council to conduct meeting with concerned National Institutes conducting Diploma Examination under NBER to develop the guidelines for online conduct of theory and practical examination. The matter with regard to translation of regional language is to be discussed as well in the said meeting.
- (xiv) In the light of NPE, 2020, the Council may conduct a meeting with expert and UGC/MHRD officers to decide the future course of action with regard to RCI's approved M.Phil. courses.
- (xv) Guidelines for CRE — Webinar will be uploaded on the Council's website.
- (xvi) It was decided to conduct interactive session course- wise only on every Wednesday from 4.00 p.m. to 5.00 p.m.

2. Interactive Session with Head of the RCI approved Institutes was held on 07.10.2020 through video conference.

The Interactive Session held on 07.10.2020 was attended by 107 Head of RCI approved Institutions. Heads of 20 institutions raised their queries and grievances in the session, in which the Council has taken decisions during the session and informed the Heads regarding the course of action needed to be followed with respect to their queries.

3. Interactive session: Central, Northern, Southern, Western, North Eastern Zones was held on 17th December, 2020 through video conference.

Interactive session with Heads of RCI approved training institutes from the Central, Northern, Southern, Western, North Eastern Zones was conducted by the Council on 17.12.2020 through video conference to discuss various matters pertaining to admission to RCI approved Diploma



Level Courses through Centralized Online Admission Process for the Academic Session 2020-21, Recognition, Registration (CRR), Continued Rehabilitation Education (CRE) etc. The session was attended by **296** participants including Heads of the RCI approved Training Institutions / Course Coordinators/ Faculty Members and RCI officials.

Member Secretary, RCI apprised the participants about the status of admission to the Diploma level courses. He mentioned that against **19144** seats, **75000** (approx.) applications have been received from the prospective candidates for admission to **18 diploma level courses** conducted at **714** institutes through Centralized Online Admission Portal for the academic session 2020-21. Out of which, **52000** applications were received from the State of Rajasthan.

The Council has prepared a National Merit list of **16671** candidates for admission to diploma level courses based on the marks obtained by the candidates in their 12th examinations and seats were allotted to the candidates as per their choice of course and institutes. During the 1st round of admission, **8757** candidates have taken admission at different training institutes. During the 2nd round of admission, the Council has given the opportunity to all the remaining candidates to opt 03 institutes (02 institutes from their domicile State and 01 outside the State) of their choice where the seats are lying vacant. Additionally, during the 2nd round of admission, merit list of **7359** eligible candidates have been uploaded on the Council's website. The admission process for 2nd round of admission is under way and the last date is 19th Dec., 2020. On completion of the 2nd round, the Council will decide further course of action for filling up the remaining seats, if lying vacant. Member Secretary, RCI requested all the Heads of the Training Institutes to raise their concern and issues pertaining to admission to diploma level courses. He further mentioned that all the issues raised by the Heads of the Training Institutes will be resolved as per the admission guidelines and existing policy of the Council.

4. **Interactive Session with Heads of RCI approved Institution conducting Diploma Level Courses held on 22nd Jan, 2021 through video conference**

The Council has conducted 10th Interactive Session on 22nd January, 2021 through video conference under the Chairpersonship of **Dr. Subodh Kumar, Member Secretary, RCI** to discuss various matters pertaining to admissions to diploma level courses through Centralized Online Admission Process for the academic session 2020-21. Session was attended by **260** participants including Heads of the RCI approved Training Institutes, Course Coordinator(s), Faculty Member(s) and RCI officials.

At the outset, **Dr. Subodh Kumar, Member Secretary, RCI** made a power point presentation to apprise the participants about the status of entire admission process covering various important aspects like development of in-house software for admission, launch of admission portal by **the Secretary, DEPwD & Chairperson, RCI, Joint Secretary, DEPwD and Member Secretary, RCI**, constitution of technical committee for finalization of admission guidelines and allocation of seats through Online Admission system, commencement of admission process, parameters for preparation of merit list, issuance of national merit lists during 1st -4th Round, guidelines, comparative status of state-wise, course wise available seats, filled and vacant seats in r/o academic sessions 2019-20 & 2020-21.



He informed that for the academic session 2020-21, a total of 75736 applications were received against the 19239 seats for admission to 18 diploma level courses being conducted at 704 training institutes across the country. Out of which, 52000 applications were from the State of Rajasthan and mentioned that after completion of 4th round of admission, a total of **12633** candidates took admissions in various courses conducted at RCI's approved Training Institutions, across the country.

He also apprised the participants about the representations received by the Council from the office of the Hon'ble Speaker, Lok Sabha, Chief Coordinator, ZCC-RCI(Northern Zone), President, Mook Badhir Shiksha Samiti, Delhi and joint representations submitted by 17 Heads of the Training Institutes from the State of Delhi, Uttar Pradesh & Madhya Pradesh, Delhi, therein requesting the Member Secretary, RCI to permit all the training institutes including Rajasthan to take admissions from the list of candidates eligible for open round to fill the remaining vacant seats in all diploma level courses.

Member Secretary, RCI requested all the Heads of the Training Institutes to raise their concern and issues pertaining to admission to diploma level courses. While he also gave assurance that Council will consider the proposal with regard to announcement of open round of admission to fill the vacant seats and also initiate appropriate action to address other issues related to admissions, as requested by the Heads /Representatives of the Training Institutes, during the session. He mentioned that a circular in this regard will also be uploaded on the Council's website very shortly. He urged that Training Institutes should ensure that they will not charge excess amount of fee from the candidates and admissions to be done as per the prescribed guidelines only.

MISCELLANEOUS:

Presentation on the functioning of RCI before the Department related Parliamentary Committee held on 10th November 2020.

The Parliamentary Standing Committee on Social Justice and Empowerment examined the following subjects during the year 2020-21:

- (i) Review/functioning of Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI)
- (ii) Assessment of Scheme for Implementation of Persons with Disabilities Act (SIPDA)
- (iii) Review of the functioning of National Institutes established for different types of disabilities
- (iv) Assessment of Deendayal Disabled Rehabilitation Scheme (DDRS)
- (v) Schemes/programmes implemented for the welfare of Divyangjan under Corporate social responsibility (CSR)

In relation to the examination of the above mentioned subjects, the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment furnished 5 copies each in English and Hindi version of the background notes giving inter-alia the following information:

- (a) Detailed background notes/updated background notes on the subjects separately



- (b) Details of various projects implemented under the above subjects State-wise
- (c) The steps taken/proposed to be taken and suggestions if, any, for the improvement in the implementation of the schemes
- (d) Various Guidelines/orders issued by the Ministry on the subjects separately
- (e) System of monitoring and control over the performance of the schemes/programmes
- (f) Copies of the evaluation studies/review of the schemes done by the NITI Aayog/NSSO/NGO or any other agency during the last three years along with the action taken by the Ministry on their suggestions/recommendations (if any)
- (g) Copies of the Minutes of sittings held by the Ministry with officials of States/SCAs/NGOs to review the schemes containing the details of issues raised therein.
- (h) Any other relevant material on the subject.


INSPECTION & RECOGNITION OF INSTITUTION

As per the provision of Section 11(2) of RCI Act, 1992 and regulation 7(3)(h) of RCI Regulations, 1997, online proposals from the prospective government organizations (GOs)/non-governmental organizations (NGOs)/ university departments to conduct RCI approved training programmes were invited by the Council in the month of January, 2021 for the academic session 2021-22. The last date for submission of proposal is 12.04.2021.

For the academic session 2020-21, inspections are carried out by teams of visiting experts for grant of approval to conduct the RCI approved programmes on fulfilment of prescribed norms in the field of special education and disability rehabilitation.

Inspection of Institution for the academic session 2020-21

For the academic session 2020-21, team of visiting experts were deputed by the Council to conduct inspection of 802 training programmes in respect of 566 extensions of approval and 236 fresh proposals. The graphic representation is as under:



During the period, approval has been granted to conduct 98 new training programmes at the existing institution and 25 new institutions. The total number of approved institutions is 656 conducting 1240 training programmes from Certificate to M.Phil. and Psy.D. Level.

*Inspection of 566 training programmes which were due for extension could not be done by the team of experts due to the nationwide lockdown as a preventative measure against the novel COVID-19 coronavirus; therefore this matter was placed before the General Council in its 42nd meeting held on 07.08.2020.

The following decisions were taken in the meeting:

- Institutions whose inspection is done for ongoing courses and proposal is rejected for the academic year 2020-21 may be given an opportunity to submit the undertaking/affidavit on the prescribed format on non-judicial stamp paper for compliance of shortcomings and based on it, permission for admission can be given for 2020-21 batch on conditional basis. Team to be deputed for the next academic session 2021-22 subject to the condition that if similar shortcomings are observed by the team, then further extension of approval is not to be given under any circumstances.
- Institutions whose proposal is due for extension of approval and team has already been deputed for inspection for the academic session 2020-21 however, inspection could not be completed due to COVID-19 situation may also be considered for permission to admit students for 2020-21 batch, subject to the condition that the institution will submit the undertaking/affidavit on the prescribed format on non-judicial stamp paper stating that if any shortcomings are found during the inspection, the Council shall reserve the right to withhold the extension of approval for next batch 2021-22 or take any penal action against the institutions as deemed fit. The team already deputed will be asked to carry out the inspection once normalcy is restored.
- Fresh proposals received for 2020-21, without inspection permission cannot be granted. However, team will visit the institutions in due course depending on the COVID-19 situations for academic session 2021-22.

In the light of the decisions taken by the General Council of the RCI, the Council has issued a notification, No. 8-A/Policy(Recog)/2019/RCI dated 21.08.2020, to all the institutes regarding grant of approval to these institutions for the academic session 2020-21 with the terms and conditions mentioned above in a, b, and c.

List of Institutions approved as on March 31, 2021 is placed at **Annexure 3.1**.













CHAPTER - 4

CENTRAL REHABILITATION REGISTER (CRR)

The Section 19 of the RCI Act states that “The Member-Secretary of the Council may, on receipt of an application made by any person in the prescribed manner enter his name in the Register provided that the Member-Secretary is satisfied that such person possesses the recognised rehabilitation qualification”. Additionally, Section 23 (1) of the RCI Act states “It shall be the duty of the Member-Secretary to keep and maintain the Register in accordance with the provisions of this Act and any order made by the Council and from time to time to revise the Register and publish it in the Official Gazette”.

According to the Rehabilitation Council of India Regulations 1997, R25 – Maintenance and Publication of Central Rehabilitation register,

- (i) The Member-Secretary shall maintain the register and it shall bear the seal of the Council.
- (ii) The register of the Council shall bear a preface which shall contain a covering page with the seal of the Council and also indicate abbreviations of the qualifications and the important mention pertaining to rehabilitation professionals in different fields.
- (iii) The register to be kept in accordance with the provisions of section 23 of the Act and from time to time revise the register and publish it in the Gazette of India.
- (iv) Such register shall contain two parts: One part contain the names of professionals who have already obtained the requisite degrees or other prescribed qualifications and gain expertise for his particular area of rehabilitation.

The other part shall contain the names of those who, either by virtue of their having acquired rehabilitation qualification or by virtue of their experience or on the lines of working for the rehabilitation of the PwDs has been registered as rehabilitation personnel. They shall be eligible for upgradation as rehabilitation professional after acquiring prescribed qualification and requisite experience.

- (a) Every application for registration with the Council under section 19 of the Act shall be made in Form ‘A’.
- (b) A fee of rupees two hundred and fifty (currently rupees one thousand) shall be charged as registration fee for every such application.
- (c) A certificate in Form ‘B’ shall be issued by the Member Secretary under his seal to all persons who are registered with the Council.
- (d) Applications for registration of additional qualification in the Register of the Council shall be made to the Council in Form ‘C’.
- (e) Certificate of Good Standing:- any rehabilitation professional desirous of obtaining certificate of good standing shall apply in Form ‘D’.



- (f) Appeal for restoration of Name in Register:- any person whose name has been removed from the Register on a ground other than that he is not in possession of the requisite rehabilitation qualification, he may appeal to Central Government under sub-section (1) of section 22 of the Act in Form 'E'. Every appeal so filed shall be accompanied by a fee within the stipulated period of thirty days.

As per the provisions of Section 19 and 23 of the Rehabilitation Council of India Act mentioned above, a Central Rehabilitation Register (CRR) is being maintained by the Council for registration of the Professional/Personnel having RCI approved qualifications in disability rehabilitation and special education.

Professionals and Personnel:

The candidates who possess certificate and diploma level qualification in various disability approved by the RCI are considered eligible for registration in CRR of the Council as Personnel. Whereas, the candidates who have acquired UG, PG and above qualification are considered eligible for registration in the CRR as Professionals.

During the year, 8685 (3191 Professionals and 5494 Personnel) registrations were granted. So far, 67720 Professionals and 90862 personnel (total 158582) have been registered in the Central Rehabilitation Register as on 31st March, 2021. Status is under:








Total Registered Professionals & Personnel (2020-21)





MH & Wellbeing Helpline for persons with/without disabilities during COVID-19 pandemic:

Due to the outbreak of COVID-19 pandemic and national lockdown by the Govt. of India to mitigate the spread of infections from COVID-19, it has been observed that the most of the people of India are suffering from several Psychological as well as Mental Health issues like anxiety, social isolation, unemployment and fear of getting infected. To support the psychological as well as emotional wellbeing of the common people, RCI has prepared a Statewise list of RCI certified and competent professionals for providing counselling and support services to the needy persons to overcome mental health issues arising due to COVID-19. The Council has obtained their consent through email from all certified professionals who have volunteered to provide free counseling services in English, Hindi and other regional languages like Tamil, Telugu, Marathi, Assamese etc. List of 640 certified professionals alongwith their name, CRR No., Mob.No, Address, preferred time slot for counseling services are uploaded on the Council's website and also being linked with DEPwD website.

Implementation of Payment Gateway

One of the important mandates of the Council is to maintain the CRR of certified professionals and personnel. For registration in the CRR, qualified rehabilitation professionals and personnel have to be enrolled in the CRR for which they have to apply online with requisite fees. To facilitate the different kinds of fees to be paid to the Council, online payment gateway has been implemented by the Council with respect to registration, addition of qualifications, etc.



CHAPTER - 5

CONTINUING REHABILITATION EDUCATION (CRE) PROGRAMME (WORKSHOP/SEMINAR/CONFERENCE ETC.)

The Council is responsible for the development, standardization and monitoring of training programs in the field of disability rehabilitation and special education. The Council also ensures that professionals in these fields update and upgrade their knowledge and skills on a continuing basis. A total of 100 CRE points are required to be accumulated for renewal of registration over 5 years. The objectives of CRE programs, and the norms/ guidelines for conducting CRE programs are enumerated below:

Objectives

1. To upgrade the knowledge and skills of in-service and practicing rehabilitation professionals/ personnel, registered with the RCI u/s 19 of the RCI Act of 1992.
2. To update professional knowledge and skills of master trainers working in the field of disability rehabilitation and special education.

Norms and Guidelines to Conduct CRE Programmes (Workshop/ Seminar/ Conference)

1. Institutes proposing to conduct CRE programme must have 5 years of experience in offering RCI approved Courses at Certificate/ Diploma/ Bachelor/ Post Graduate level with valid RCI recognition.

However, this condition may be relaxed in the case of the State of Jammu & Kashmir and the North Eastern states (Manipur, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Sikkim, Assam, Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland and Tripura) where institution working in the field of disability may organize CRE programs with the recommendation of National Institutes or Zonal Coordination Committee of RCI.
2. National level Professional Associations and/or any organization of national repute working for the empowerment of persons with disabilities having atleast 10 years of experience with valid society registration are considered eligible for grant of CRE status to various Seminar/ conference/ workshop and other programmes provided proposal on the prescribed format should reach the Council atleast 60 days before the proposed date of the programme.
3. RCI approved institutions are eligible for financial assistance to conduct the CRE programme as per the norms, once in 2 years subject to availability of funds.
4. RCI approved institutions may conduct maximum of 03 CRE programs within a financial year provided report of the CRE programmes are submitted to the Council before commencement of the another programme.



5. CRE programs to be planned in such manner so that regular activities of the institutions are not affected. However, maximum participation within the prescribed intake is to be ensured.

General Guidelines:

1. Maximum number of participants in any CRE program shall not exceed 30. However, number of participants should not be less than 10 in any CRE program.
2. Topics on which CRE programs can be conducted are shown on the website. However, institutions are free to conduct CRE programs on topics which may not be in lists, but institutions have to fully justify the need for such a CRE program.
3. Topics on the latest development in the field of disability, various legislative provisions, like RPWD Act 2016, RCI Act, 1992, National Trust Act 1999, RTE Act, 2007, UN Conventions, various schemes and programmes of the DEPWD, Accessible India Campaign (Sugmaya Bharat Abhiyaan), SIPDA, ADIP, NHFDC etc. to be included for CRE topics. In addition to this Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act (POCSO Act, 2012) to be included to generate awareness in this matter.
4. RCI Recognized training Institutions/University Department/National Institutes / CRCs may submit their proposal for consideration of permission to conduct CRE programme on the following format well before the 60 days of the proposed date.

CRE points can be awarded for 1 day /2 day /3 day /4 day /5 days with 6 hours of actual training each day. Faculty conducting CREs should have relevant professional qualification and experience with reference to the selected CRE topic.

5. Prescribed Intake for the CRE programme:

6. Provision for financial assistance

The Council provides partially financial assistance to the RCI approved institutions/ University departments to conduct CRE programme (3 days and 5 days) subject to the availability of



budget. The Council has prescribed a budget of Rs. 90000 for a 5 days CRE programme and Rs. 54000 for a 3 days CRE program. However, financial assistance is limited to 60% of total prescribed budget or the actuals, whichever is less.

Norms and general guidelines of CRE- Webinar:

The eligibility conditions for institutions to organize CRE webinars should be continued as per the existing norms

1. ICT requirements: Platform for content transactions & evaluation and general technical specification to conduct online program/webinar

The organizing institutes should have adequate internet connection (preferably broadband) and online platform to host webinar based CRE activities. However the institution shall have the flexibility to select the web platform of their choice depending upon local circumstances, license issues etc. The selected platform should have provision for

- a) recording of the deliberations
- b) receive feedback inputs from the participants
- c) participation of at least 200 members
- d) accessibility to persons with special needs

Besides having a suitable online platform for conduct of the webinar as mentioned above, the institution needs to have dedicated technical team/experts for:

- a) providing necessary support to the resource persons whenever required;
- b) permitting entry to the participants with their valid email ID and full name as per CRR Records
- c) engaging the participants full time by periodical monitoring for the presence of active attention/participation of registered delegates, and
- d) providing provisions for evaluating participants' learning

The participants' should have at least 10 mbps speed internet connection and 1 GB memory for each of the lectures.

2. Duration of program and number of hours for webinar

- a) CRE webinars shall be of 1 or 2 days duration only,
- b) there shall be maximum 4 lectures in a day consisting of 40 minutes presentation, 20 minutes interaction and 15 minutes for evaluation of participants at the end of each lecture,
- c) that the participants shall have the facility to type in their questions to which the speakers may answer.



3. Provisions of evaluation of learning outcomes for webinar

The evaluation of the participant's learning of a given lecture/presentation/panel discussion and to qualify in the evaluation exercises is must for them to get CRE points:

- a) learning of the participants will be assessed at the end of each lecture,
- b) the participant must score 70% or more to qualify,
- c) the organizing institution will conduct one more assessment at the end of the webinar for participants if fail to qualify in their first attempt,
- d) the questions will be of multiple choice based on the sessions conducted and not only based on the contents given through the PPT, and
- e) that the organizing institution will ensure that it is actually the registered participants who are answering the questions and not somebody else on his/her behalf.

4. Selection of topics, resource persons, duration of lecture & program for webinar

- a) Selection of topics is best left to the policies and priorities of the organizing institution, but topics have to be from the list notified by the Council. However, additional topics relating to recent relevant acts related to disability or any emerging areas can be considered.
- b) Selection of resource persons is also best left to the discretion/judgment of the organizing institution. However, the organizing institution shall ensure that the selected resource persons are experts and have a proven record of expertise/skills/research output etc. The resource person should also be well versed on technology for online presentation
- c) If it is deemed that the experts and active professionals in different fields outside the specializations coming under the purview of RCI can contribute significantly to the theme selected for the CRE, may be invited even if not having CRR number. However, their number should not be more than 25% of the total resource persons invited for a given program.
- d) Non-governmental organizations conducting CRE webinars shall ensure that at least 50% of the resource persons are from RCI recognised training institutions/ universities
- e) The duration of CRE webinars can be of 1 or 2 days. Longer duration webinars of 3 days shall be permitted by RCI only under exceptional circumstances.

5. Weightage points, prescribed fees, and intake for webinar

It was decided that

- a) weightage points will continue to be awarded as practised all these years.
- b) participants will be awarded 6 points per day for attending six hours and only on successfully qualifying all the tests conducted. Participants will get either six points (after qualifying all the tests) or nil points (even if they fail in one test).
- c) organizing institutions may charge participation fees of Rs. 400 and Rs. 600 per participant for 1 day and 2 days CRE webinar respectively.



- d) intake to be restricted to 200 participants for state / National level and 250 for International level.

6. Processing Fees for webinar

- a) The organizing institutes will pay to RCI a non refundable processing fee of Rs.3500/- for the CRE programme at State/National level & Rs.5000/- for the International level with maximum intake of 200 & 250 participants respectively.
- b) RCI will not extend any financial support to any organization for conduct of CRE webinar.

Accumulation of CRE points for renewal of registration:

- a) Total numbers of 100 CRE points are required to be accumulated for renewal of registration over 5 years. Actual training/hands/online on experience for 6 hours in a day at an RCI approved CRE is equivalent to 6 CRE points.
- b) Professionals who are qualified to register in the CRR shall register with the Council within 6 months from the date of completion of an approved course.
- c) All registered rehabilitation professionals shall renew their registration with the Council once in 5 years.
- d) Renewal of CRR is mandatory for all the professional/ personnel.
- e) Acquisition of a higher qualification (RCI approved) will be considered for renewal of registration.
- f) Professional/personnel may attend the International CRE/Conference held overseas. However, CRE credit hours may be allotted by the Council on the submission of certificate of attendance/ participation.

MEETINGS:

1. Meeting through Video Conferencing to review the norms and general guidelines of Continuing Rehabilitation Education (CRE) - Workshops/Conference/ Seminar through online mode on 11.08.2020:

The meeting to review the norms and general guidelines of Continuing Rehabilitation Education (CRE) through online mode was held on 11th August 2020 under the Chairpersonship of Sr.Prof. (Retd.) M. Jayaram, NIMHANS, Bangalore through Video Conferencing at RCI.

At the outset, Dr. Subodh Kumar, Member Secretary, RCI extended a warm welcome to all the expert members present during the meeting conducted through video conferencing. He stated that this is the first meeting of experts organized by the Council during COVID-19 outbreak through video conferencing. He also informed that due to the spread of the Corona virus, institutes across the country are facing problem to conduct CRE programmes to avoid social gatherings as per the Government orders and to encourage digital platform. As a result, professionals are finding it difficult to accumulate CRE points for renewal of RCI registration. He also apprised the members about the objectives of this meeting. He appreciated the cooperation extended by Prof. Sujata Bhan and Dr. Ranjith to formulate guidelines on technology to be used for conduct of webinars, measuring of efficiency level of the participants, etc. The meeting started with self-introduction by all the members.

Sr. Prof. M. Jayaram, Chairperson of the committee briefed the members on the guidelines to be followed and issues to be taken in this online meeting.

Some of the members shared their experiences and challenges they faced in conducting webinars as a host or as a resource person. Shri K.V.S. Rao, Director, DEPwD expressed that the existing norms and guidelines are not required to be changed completely as the objective of this meeting is to develop the guidelines for online CRE programs during this pandemic situation. The Chairperson of the committee agreed the same. However, to conduct online CRE programs the following recommendations were made:

Agenda 1 Review of norms and general guidelines of the CRE programs

- a) It was felt that CRE webinars are going to be relevant only in the short-term, and therefore, the existing norms and guidelines of the CRE programs are not required to be modified/ reviewed at present. However, a detailed exercise to be undertaken to review the topics for CRE programs post COVID-19 pandemic.
- b) The eligibility conditions for institutions to organize CRE webinars should be continued as per the existing norms

Agenda 2 ICT requirements: Platform for content transactions & evaluation and general technical specification to conduct online program/webinar

After detailed deliberations, the committee recommended that the organizing institutes shall have the flexibility to select the web platform of their choice depending upon local circumstances, license issues etc. However, the selected platform should have provision for

- a) recording of the deliberations
 - b) receive feedback inputs from the participants
 - c) participation of at least 200 members
 - d) accessibility to persons with special needs
 - e) locking system to control the number of participants,
 - f) periodical monitoring for the presence of registered delegates, and
 - g) should provide avenues for outcome evaluation.
- It was opined that the organizing institute should have a technical team well equipped with the knowledge of operating the system to support resource persons and participants.
 - The participants should have at least 10 mbps speed internet connection and 1 GB memory for each of the lectures.

Agenda 3 Development of online CRE format

The Committee recommended that;



- a) CRE webinars shall be of 1 or 2 days duration only,
- b) there shall be 4 lectures in a day consisting of 40 minutes presentation, 20 minutes interaction and 15 minutes for outcome evaluation at the end of lecture,
- c) LMS systems shall be developed, and
- d) that the participants shall have the facility to type in their questions to which the speakers may answer.

Agenda 4 Provisions of evaluation of learning outcomes

The Committee recommended that the evaluation of the participants' understanding of a given lecture and to qualify in the evaluation exercises is must for them to get CRE points. It was also recommended that

- a) learning outcomes will be assessed at the end of each lecture,
- b) the participant must score 70% or more to qualify,
- c) the organizing institution will conduct one more assessment at the end of the webinar for participants who could not qualify in their first attempt,
- d) the questions will be of multiple choice based on the lecture delivered and not only the PPT presented, and
- e) that the organizing institution will ensure that it is actually the registered participants who are answering the questions and not somebody else on his behalf.

Agenda 5 Selection of topics, resource persons, duration of lecture & program

The Committee recommended the following:

- a) Selection of topics is best left to the policies and priorities of the organizing institution, but topics have to be from the list notified by the Council. However, additional topics relating to national acts relating to disability or international agreements on disability can be considered.
- b) Selection of resource persons is also best left to the discretion/judgment of the organizing institution. However, the organizing institution shall ensure that the selected resource persons are experts and have a proven record of expertise/skills/research output etc. The resource person should also be well versed on technology for online presentation
- c) Experts and active workers in different fields outside the specializations coming under the purview of RCI can be invited without asking for CRR numbers. However, their number should not be more than 25% of the total resource persons invited for a given program.
- d) Non-governmental organizations conducting CRE webinars shall ensure that at least 50% of the resource persons are from educational institutions.
- e) The duration of CRE webinars can be of 1 or 2 days. Longer duration webinars of 3 days shall be permitted by RCI only under exceptional circumstances.



Agenda 6 Weightage points, prescribed fees, and intake

It was decided that

- a) weightage points will continue to be awarded as practised all these years.
- b) participants will be awarded 6 points per day only on successfully qualifying all the tests conducted. Participants will get either six points (after qualifying all the tests) or nil points (even if they fail in one test).
- c) organizing institutions may charge participation fees of Rs. 400 and Rs. 600 per participant for 1 day and 2 days CRE webinar respectively.
- d) intake to be restricted to 200 participants, and 250 under special circumstances.

Agenda 7 Any other relevant points

- a) The Chairperson requested the members to review the list of topics suggested for CRE and send in their suggestions to the Member-Secretary of RCI.
- b) RCI agreed to reduce application processing period to 15 days for webinars instead of existing 60 days. Members appreciated this gesture of RCI.
- c) It was recommended that organizing institutes will pay to RCI the processing fee of Rs.3000/-, 4000/-, 5000/- & 6000/- for the maximum intake of 50, 100, 150 & 200 participants respectively.
- d) RCI will not extend any financial support to any organization for conduct of CRE webinar.

All the members appreciated the efforts taken by the Council for the meeting through video conferencing and to make it successful by conducting the same for 4 hours without any break. They also asked to follow the same precedent

2. WHO Online Courses on COVID-19:

Due to COVID-19 pandemic & lockdown, the Council took initiative to promote WHO online free courses on COVID-19 and onetime opportunity was given to RCI certified rehab professionals & personnel to undergo these courses to acquaint themselves on precautionary health measures to contain the spread of COVID-19 amongst the PwDs and community at large.

For this purpose, an incentive of 50 CRE points @5 CRE point per WHO online course was given to the prospective rehab professionals to help them for renewal of their registration. The Council has developed in-house software for issuance of online WHO CRE certificates. As on date, 13,623 rehab professionals/personnel have applied for award of CRE points. Out of these, 6240 candidates have been issued WHO CRE certificates through email and the applications of 574 candidates were rejected as they did not fulfil the criteria. A sum of **Rs. 68 lakhs** has been received as processing fee for the same.



Status of sanctioned CRE Programmes (Conference/ Seminar/ Workshop/ International Conference etc.) and beneficiaries

During the year, the Council has sanctioned 359 CRE programmes and 43751 rehabilitation Professionals / personnel were benefitted from these programmes.



As evident from the data above, Andhra Pradesh had the highest number of sanctioned programmes and beneficiaries for the year 2020-21 with 89 programmes and 15400 beneficiaries, followed by Tamil Nadu with 69 sanctioned programmes and 5390 beneficiaries. Jharkhand had the least number of sanctioned programme along with the least number of beneficiaries, 1 and 35 respectively.

CHAPTER - 6

NATIONAL BOARD OF EXAMINATIONS IN REHABILITATION (NBER)

The National Board for Examination in Rehabilitation (NBER) has been set up as an adjunct body of the Rehabilitation Council of India under sub-section (k) of section 29 of the Rehabilitation Council of India Act, 1992 and is registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860 with the aim to conduct examinations, decide the qualification of Examiner and the condition of admission for RCI approved Certificate & Diploma level courses. Accordingly, regulations for Conduct of Examinations and conditions for admission and other allied activities were notified by the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment vide its notification No. 5-62/93-RCI on 8th June, 2014. Governing body of NBER was also constituted vide Order No. 7-19(1)/Exam. Main (NBER)/2014/RCI/8608-28 dated 09th January, 2015.

REHABILITATION COUNCIL OF INDIA (CONDUCT OF EXAMINATIONS, QUALIFICATIONS OF EXAMINERS AND THE CONDITION OF ADMISSION TO EXAMINATIONS) REGULATIONS, 2014

R5 – Conduct of Examinations, Qualifications of Examiners and Admission to Examinations by the National Board –

- i. The National Board shall conduct, facilitate, organize, coordinate and monitor examinations for any diploma or certificate level course or any other examination, approved by the Council from time to time as it may deem fit.
- ii. The National Board shall conduct the examinations as per the schemes of examination or part thereof as approved by the Council.
- iii. The National Board shall also award diplomas or certificates to successful candidates in the manner as approved by the Council.
- iv. The National Board shall have a system for evaluation and declaration of results of examination and shall maintain a data bank on a year to year basis.
- v. The qualification, experience and expertise required of the examiners will be decided by the Council in accordance with syllabi and recommendations of the expert committees.
- vi. The National Board shall appoint such panel of examiners, paper evaluators and moderators as it may deem fit from time to time and in accordance with the qualification, experience and expertise as may be prescribed by the Council.





As per the decision taken by the GC of RCI in its 42nd meeting held on 7th August, 2020, the Council has developed in-house software for inviting online applications from the aspirants for admission to diploma level courses for the academic session 2020-21 through Centralized Online admission portal. The said portal was formally inaugurated by **Smt. Shakuntala D. Gamlin, IAS, Secretary, DEPwD & Chairperson, RCI**, Smt. Tarika Roy, Joint Secretary, DEPwD and Dr. Subodh Kumar, Member Secretary on 23rd September, 2020. The inaugural ceremony was attended by Zonal Coordinators, heads of the training institutes, Directors of the NIs & RCI officials.

Centralized Online Admission Process for admission to Diploma Level Courses for the academic session 2020-21:

The NBER has issued the admission guidelines along with schedule for inviting online application forms from the aspirants for admission to its 18 approved diploma level courses being conducted at 704 training institutions to fill up of 19244 seats across the Country.

The online registration process was commenced from 14th September, 2020 and the last date was 20th October, 2020. A total of 75736 applications were received from all over the country, out of which 52000 (approx.) was from the State of Rajasthan. A technical committee was constituted to finalize the admission guidelines and allocation of seats through Online Admission system to the respective institutions for admission to Diploma Level Courses for the Academic Session 2020-21. The 1st National Merit list of 16671 candidates alongwith detailed admission guidelines & scheduled for admission was issued on 5th Nov., 2020. A total of 06 rounds including 02 open round were announced to fill all the vacant seats. The last dated for the same was 31st January, 2021. A total of 14703 seats have been filled during the academic session 2020-21.

1. Promotion of 1st Year students to the 2nd year:

The Council vide its Circular no. 25-1/NBER(Policy)/RCI/2016 dated 1st October, 2020 has promoted all the 1st year students to 2nd year due to COVID-19 pandemic.

2. Final list of admitted candidates uploaded on website:

The Council vide its Circular no. 25-15/NBER(AIOAT)/RCI/2016 dated 19.02.2021 has uploaded Institute and course wise list of candidates admitted in various RCI's approved Diploma level courses during the academic session 2020-21 through Centralized Online Admission Process on the Council's website.

3. Grant of permission to all the Training Institutes of North Eastern Region to take direct admission:

The Council vide its Circular no. 25-20/NBER(Admission)/RCI/2016 dated 19.2.2021 has permitted all the Training Institutes of North Eastern Region to take direct admission to RCI approved Diploma Level Courses for the academic session 2020-21 to fill the vacant seats.

4. Annual Academic Activity Calendar for the academic session 2020-21

In order to maintain the uniformity in the academic and examinations related activities of all the Certificate and Diploma Level Courses, NBER has developed the Annual Academic Activity Calendar for all certificate and diploma level courses for the academic session 2020-21 and uploaded the same on the Council's website vide its Circular no. 25-15/NBER(AIOAT)/RCI/2016 dated 13.03.2021.

MEETING WITH DIRECTORS OF NATIONAL INSTITUTES OF DEPwD

As per Item No. 8 discussed in the 42nd Meeting of the General Council, **Approval of various decisions taken during the meeting held with Directors of National Institutes conducting Examinations for RCIs approved Certificate & Diploma Level Courses held on 29th January, 2020 & 18th June, 2020 at RCI**, the General Council perused various recommendations made during the meeting of Directors of NIs regarding conducting examinations of RCI approved certificate and diploma level courses. The



matter was discussed in detail inter-alia conduct of online examination to bring about transparency in the system, to stop cheating, streamlining the examinations and maintaining the quality. It was decided that a Plan of Action for formulating uniform academic calendar, modalities and to undertake new initiatives to prevent malpractices; to ensure smooth conduct of online examinations, including practical examinations, that are required to be submitted by NIs in a time bound manner.

In pursuance to the decision of the General Council, Plan of Action to conduct examinations of Certificate and Diploma level courses was submitted by all the National Institutes conducting the said examinations.

Term End Theory Examinations of Certificate and Diploma level courses have been conducted in December, 2020. The Council has prepared a tentative Annual Academic Activity Calendar to bring out the uniformity in examination process and other allied activities and the same has been sent to all the respective NIs for their inputs.

1. Meeting with Directors of the National Institutes conducting examinations of RCI approved Certificate & Diploma level Courses was held on 18.06.2020 at RCI to discuss & finalize plan of action to conduct semester end theory/practical examination, supplementary & backlog examination conduct of online classes etc. amid COVID-19 outbreak.

After having in-depth deliberation on status of backlog examinations, plan of action to conduct term end theory & practical examinations for academic session 2019-20, maintain social distancing norms and health safety measures during conduct of practice teaching, explore other modes for conduct of examinations amid COVID-19, status of implementation of recommendations of malpractice preventions committee of RCI, conduct of online classes by TTI's for 2019-21, the following decisions were taken unanimously:

- (i) National Institutes to submit the details of backlog examinations along with plan of action to clear backlog by September, 2020 to the Council.
- (ii) National Institutes to conduct all Term End Theory & Practical Examinations for the academic session 2019-2020 through online mode as under:
 - (a) National Institutes will submit plan of action along with tentative schedule for conduct of online theory & practical examination (internal & external) to the Council and ensure that all examinations must be completed by September, 2020.
 - (b) All examination to be conducted in a phased manner, in the 1st phase only online theory examination to be conducted and practical examination may be conducted in the 2nd phase.
 - (c) Students may be given maximum three attempts to clear online theory & practical examination.
 - (d) ISLRTC, New Delhi may conduct Term End Theory Examination in November 2020. If normalcy is restored then exam to be conducted on annual exam pattern in conventional mode only, as requested by ISLRTC, New Delhi.



- (iii) National Institutes to ensure that necessary instructions will be issued to all students appearing in online examination that they must videograph the clippings while appearing in the examinations. Clippings of the videography to be submitted to the concerned NIs for necessary action at their end.
- (iv) Students who have opted regional languages for writing of Term End Theory Examination may be permitted to write their exams in regional language on paper and they have to submit the scanned image of handwritten answer scripts to concerned National Institute for evaluation as per the prescribed guidelines of National Institutes.
- (v) 1st year students may be promoted to 2nd year subject to the condition that candidate must secure marks in internal assessment under:
 - Minimum 40% marks in internal theory
 - Minimum 50% marks in internal practical
 - Aggregate marks should not be less than 50% in internal assessments including Theory & Practical
 - Must have secured minimum attendance as per the provisions of the scheme of the examination
- (vi) Question papers for online examination to be developed by senior faculties and moderated by eminent Experts to maintain the sanctity of examination process, for this purpose common guidelines prescribing minimum qualification for paper setters, moderator, evaluators to be developed by NIs and to be submitted to RCI for approval.
- (vii) National Institutes to initiate necessary action on priority to resolve all cases pertaining to malpractice and action taken report to be submitted to the Council.
- (viii) TTIs to be permitted to conduct online practical examinations by using any appropriate web application.
- (ix) As special schools are closed, due to COVID-19, students to be permitted to undertake practice teaching through recording video/assignments/lesson plan & unedited mock videos and submit the same to their TTIs for evaluation and award of marks.
- (x) TTIs to be advised to conduct theory classes through online mode from 1st week of September, 2020 for 2nd year student.
- (xi) TTIs may be permitted to plan for conduct of internal theory & practical examination at their own level with the prior permission of RCI & NIs.
- (xii) National Institutes to ensure that appropriate coding to be done on answer sheets of all students prior to evaluation. Only the coded answer sheets to be given for evaluation purpose.

2. Meeting with Director(s), National Institutes (NIs) of DEPwD conducting examinations of RCI approved Certificate & Diploma level Courses was held on 14th October, 2020 at RCI under



the chairpersonship of Dr. Subodh Kumar, Member Secretary, RCI through virtual mode to finalize the schedule and other matters relating to examinations.

After having in-depth deliberations on various issues related to examinations of RCI approved certificate & diploma level courses viz. Schedule to conduct the 2nd year and other pending examinations (Theory & Practical), mode of examinations, uniform academic calendar, methodology for evaluation of answer scripts and selection of evaluation centres, status of backlog, supplementary examinations for academic session 2019-20, the following decisions were unanimously taken during the meeting:

- (i) National Institute(s) will submit the detailed status of all pending examinations (Practical & theory) to the NBER comprising of academic year, course, training institute, backlog, supplementary, 1st year and 2nd year along with number of students appearing in the examinations.
- (ii) National institute(s) will undertake a mapping to club the examinations of two or three training institutions from the same city and to conduct the examinations at RCI approved training institutions having adequate infrastructure to conduct the examinations smoothly and submit the same to NBER latest by 15th November, 2020.
- (iii) National Institutes, CRCs, RCI approved training institutions, University Departments & State Open Universities to be selected as Examination Centres for Certificate and Diploma Level Courses. Home Examination Centre(s) will be permitted only in those places where other than RCI approved training institutes are not available within the radius of 40 to 60 kms as a special case.
- (iv) National Institutes to ensure that students of the training institutions selected as Examination Centre will not be permitted to write their exams at the same examination centre under any circumstances.
- (v) Term End Theory examinations of all certificate and diploma level courses will be conducted through conventional mode only.
- (vi) Tentative examinations schedule for backlog, supplementary, 1st year and 2nd year will be as under:

- (vii) National Institute(s) will frame the detailed guidelines for practical examination through simulation exercises and *viva* of all examinations to be conducted through conventional mode only.
- (viii) National Institute(s) will ensure that evaluation of answer scripts will be done after allotment of appropriate code on each answer scripts. Short video on the process for allotment of code on answer scripts will be developed by the NIEPMD, Chennai to the NBER an adjunct body of RCI.
- (ix) Evaluation of the answer scripts will be done at the Examination Centres only and a detailed Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) will be developed by the National Institutes for approval of NBER. All answer scripts to be retained at NIs, its Regional Centres and CRCs for future reference. Summary of all answer scripts will be prepared by the concerned institute and will be sent to the respective National Institute(s).
- (x) National Institute(s) will depute CLOs to monitor the proper and fair conduct of examinations and flying squad/observers to be sent from RCI.
- (xi) National Institutes will draft guidelines to monitor online classes to be conducted by RCI approved training institutions and submit the same to NBER.
- (xii) NBER will share the draft Uniform Academic Calendar with all the Directors of NIs conducting examinations to obtain their inputs, before its finalization.
- (xiii) National Institutes will confirm opening of separate Bank Account for NBER along with Utilization Certificate, Receipt and Payment Account duly certified by the Director of the concerned NIs.
- (xvi) National Institutes will provide the list of CLOs, invigilator, paper setters, moderators, centre superintendents, evaluators along with their academic and rehabilitation qualification, CRR no., experience, institute, contact details to the NBER latest by 21st October, 2020.



- (xv) NBER will conduct Orientation Programme for CLOs and observers about their roles & responsibilities during the examinations. A short duration video will also be developed by the NIEPMD, Chennai.

MEETING OF THE TECHNICAL COMMITTEE FOR ONLINE ADMISSION

A meeting of the Technical Committee was held on **28th October, 2020** under the chairpersonship of Dr. Subodh Kumar, Member Secretary, RCI through virtual mode to finalize the technical issues regarding Online Admission system for allocation of seats to the respective institutions for admission to Diploma level Courses for the academic session 2020-21.

At the outset Dr. Subodh Kumar, Member Secretary, RCI extended a warm welcome to Shri Pankaj Maru and other members present during the meeting. In his opening remarks, he stated that in pursuance to the decision taken during the 42nd meeting of General Council of RCI held on 7th August, 2020, the Council has developed a in-house software for inviting applications from the prospective candidate(s) for admission to Diploma level courses through Centralized Online Admission Portal purely on merit basis for the academic session 2020-21. The process for submission of online application form through Centralized Online Admission Portal was commenced from 14th September, 2020 and the last date was 20th October, 2020.

He also apprised that as on last date, a total of 75736 application forms have been submitted successfully from all over the country. He requested the members to deliberate on various aspects like preparation of national merit list, allotment of category wise and course wise seats to all the training institutions, adherence of reservation policy as per Government Rules, 2nd round admission and final round for admissions etc.

After having in-depth deliberation on various aspects, the following recommendations have been made unanimously:

- (i) NBER will prepare National Merit list in respect of each category including reserve category i.e., SC/ST/OBC/PWD/EWS/General.
- (ii) NBER to prepare institute wise, course wise and category wise list of candidates to be admitted at RCI's approved training institutes as per the approved intake capacity during the 1st round of admissions.
- (iii) Training institutes to take admission in consonance of the prescribed admission guidelines of the Council and also to follow the prescribed reservation policy of the concerned State Government.
- (iv) Admissions to be given based on the rank of the National merit list of the concerned training institutes within the stipulated time frame of the NBER.
- (v) In order to avoid any kind of malpractice and to ensure proper and fair admission process, the Council may also consult the experienced IT professionals to facilitate this process.



- (vi) Online application form for CRR, Recognition (new/extension), renewal of CRR, CRE were also discussed to make it fully online and it was decided to obtain the opinion of the experienced IT expert.

Extension of work contract of NSEIT Ltd. to conduct “All India Online Aptitude Test (AIOAT)” for admission to Diploma level courses for the Academic Session 2021-22

The Council vide its letter no. 25-15/NBER(AIOAT)/RCI/2016 dated 23.03.2021 has extended the work contract of NSEIT Ltd. to conduct “All India Online Aptitude Test (AIOAT)” for admission to Diploma level courses for the Academic Session 2021-22 as per previously agreed terms & conditions.

Constitution of Technical Committee for AIOAT 2021-22:

NBER vide its office order no. 5-106/NIC/RCI-2020 dated 23.03.2021 has constituted a Technical Committee to discuss and finalize the modalities in respect of online admission, allocation of seats to the respective training institutions and other matters related to conduct of AIOAT-2021 for admission to RCI approved Diploma Level Courses for the academic session 2021-22.

Monitoring:

- During the year the Council has asked the Directors of NIEPMD, Chennai, NIEPVD, Dehradun, AYJNIHSD, Mumbai & ISLRTC, New Delhi to submit the proposed list of CLOs, Internal & External Examiners and list of Examination Centres etc. for perusal of the Council.
- National Institutes have been asked to submit the details of examinations conducted by them for the academic year 2020-21.
- Observers were also deputed by the Council to monitor the proper and fair conduct of examinations of certificate and Diploma level conducted by the respective NIs, during the period under report.

CHAPTER – 7

OUTREACH DIVISION

1. Distance Education Cell

The quality of rehabilitation services received by persons with disabilities (divyangjan) is in turn dependent upon the quality of education of rehabilitation professionals. As a result, need based special education programmes through ODL mode were initiated by RCI in 2001 as a joint venture with different Open Universities with an aim to develop trained professionals in the field of Special Education and Disability Rehabilitation. The demand for the courses through Open & Distance Learning (ODL) mode increased manifold in due course of time and RCI started receiving requests from various stakeholders such as prospective learners, NGOs, GOs and approved training colleges to launch the teacher training programmes in special education through ODL mode in order to bridge the gap between demand and supply. Accordingly, a Distance Education Cell was set up by RCI in the year 2001 to implement and monitor the teachers' training courses through ODL mode in collaboration with State Open Universities in the country. 1st MoU was signed between RCI & Madhya Pradesh Bhoj Open University (MPBOU), Bhopal to conduct B.Ed. Spl.Ed.– ODL course(s) through ODL mode in 2001. As per the MoU, RCI started generation of separate revenues in the form of 10% of fee share from the respective Open Universities to sustain the Distance Education Cell.

Conditional grant of permission to State Open Universities for continuation of B.Ed.Spl.Ed.-ODL programme:

The MoU signed between RCI and 04 State Open Universities, namely, MPBOU, Bhopal; NSOU, Kolkata; UoU, Haldwani; and UPRTOU, Prayagraj was due for renewal, however, due to the unprecedented situation that arose due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Council has granted conditional permission to all the 04 State Open Universities to initiate the admission process of B.Ed.Spl.Ed ODL course for the academic session 2020-21.

Assessment of State Open Universities for renewal/extension of MoU:

The Council has deputed a Joint Assessment team at 04 State Open Universities, namely, MPBOU, Bhopal; NSOU, Kolkata; UoU, Haldwani; and UPRTOU, Prayagraj to assess the availability of required



infrastructural facilities and faculties, to decide on the matter with regard to renewal/extension of MoU with all the above said Universities and to continue B.Ed.Spl.Ed ODL programme.

The Council has constituted an expert committee for revision of existing B.Ed. Spl.Ed.-ODL norms, 2015, to make it at par with UGC - ODL/ Online Regulations, 2020. 1st meeting of the committee was held under the Chairpersonship of Dr. Subodh Kumar, Member Secretary, RCI on 16th Dec., 2020 through virtual mode. During the meeting, the Council has constituted a core committee to prepare the draft for the revised norms. The committee has submitted the final draft of the revised B.Ed. Spl.Ed.-ODL norms, 2021.



Spl.Ed.-ODL norms, 2015, to make it at par with UGC - ODL/ Online Regulations, 2020. 1st meeting of the committee was held under the Chairpersonship of Dr. Subodh Kumar, Member Secretary, RCI on 16th Dec., 2020 through virtual mode. During the meeting, the Council has constituted a core committee to prepare the draft for the revised norms. The committee has submitted the final draft of the revised B.Ed. Spl.Ed.-ODL norms, 2021.

The following decisions and recommendations were taken unanimously by the members:

- (a) The norms must have the provision that all Universities conducting B.Ed.Spl.Ed.ODL course should appoint the faculty as per the prescribed norms and qualification of the Council.
- (b) All universities should set up student grievance redressal cell to resolve academic and administrative matters.
- (c) The maximum duration to complete B.Ed.Spl.Ed. ODL course to be increased from 05 to 06 years.
- (d) Provision for maintenance of quality of B.Ed.Spl.Ed. ODL course along with methodology for quality assurance to be devised by the committee.
- (e) Eligibility criteria for admission to B.Ed.Spl.Ed. ODL course needs to be made at par with NCTE Regulations. Any graduate with Diploma in Spl. Education through face-to-face mode to be considered for admission to B.Ed.Spl.Ed. ODL course.
- (f) Monitoring mechanism for curriculum transaction, contact classes, practical and other academic activities to be developed as a part and parcel of the revised norms. Provision for monitoring of contact classes, availability of faculty etc by RCI & University needs to be inducted in the norms.



- (g) Details of equipment and infrastructure required for skill, practice teaching needs to be identified and the same to be put up at appropriate place in the revised norms. Further, details of equipment, CWSN intake, Spl. Educators required for Spl. Schools to be devised for effective curriculum transaction.
- (h) University running B.Ed.Spl.Ed. ODL course in all the disability specialization must have 01 faculty at Asst. Professor level for each disability specialization.
- (i) SWOT analysis of ODL courses to be carried out by the Council with the help of University Department or any appropriate body decided by the Council.
- (j) Practice teaching needs to be supervised by the qualified faculty and provision for video recording of supervisory works to be inducted.
- (k) Norms for selection and recognition of study centres needs to be flexible as in some of the States like Uttarakhand, the RCI approved institutes are comparatively less.
- (l) SLM to be developed as per UGC norms & guidelines in accessible formats for student with disabilities. University should ensure that the printed version of SLM to be given to learners on time.
- (m) Strict guidelines for practicum/practical work as per syllabus of the course to be developed by identifying the gap, knowledge and significance of the course.
- (n) The component of UDL to be incorporated in syllabus of B.Ed.Spl.Ed. ODL course.
- (o) Qualification, experience and process for selection of content developers and editors for developing SLM to be devised to ensure the quality of SLMs.
- (p) All State Universities must upload various material developed by them in respect of B.Ed. Spl.Ed. ODL course on their website as open educational resources.
- (q) Guidelines for contact classes/practice teaching etc needs to be developed separately amid COVID-19 outbreak.
- (r) All study centres must have RCI's approval to conduct the B.Ed.Spl.Ed. ODL course.
- (s) All State Universities must obtain RCI's approval on the SLM developed by them, prior to circulate the same to learners.
- (t) The MoU must have the provision that each University must submit the approval of the concerned State Govt. for appointment of faculty prior to commencement of the course.
- (u) Clause 6.1 of the existing norms, the term University Headquarters to be inserted.
- (v) RCI must delegate the powers to State University for fee enhancement in respect of B.Ed. Spl.Ed. ODL course.
- (w) All universities must develop the academic calendar, curriculum & SLM and upload on their official website.

2. Zonal Coordination Committees (ZCC)

Objectives of ZCC:

- i. The objective of ZCC is to create an outreach / extension of the Council to perform the functions as defined
- ii. ZCC will facilitate and assist RCI in providing information and conducting enquiries, etc. as directed by the Council, pertaining to Organizations approved by RCI and personnels / Professionals.

Constitution and appointment of Zonal Coordinator, Convener and Members:

- I. The Zonal Coordinator shall be appointed by the Chairperson, RCI on the basis of eligibility and suitability examined by the Committee constituted for this purpose by Chairperson, RCI, by inviting applications in public domain or through RCI website.
- II. The Govt. Department members will be nominated by the HOD of concerned department on the invitation/proposal of the Council.
- III. The remaining members will be appointed by the Chairperson, RCI by inviting applications of interested candidates by giving advertisement in public domain or through RCI website.
- IV. The Convener shall be appointed by Chairperson, RCI from amongst the ZCC members. The ZCC Coordinator, if appointed, may facilitate Chairperson, RCI in the process of appointment of convener and its members.



Functions of ZCC:

The Major functions of ZCC's shall be as follows:

- I. Monitoring the functioning of RCI's approved teacher training institutions recognized by the Council to conduct face-to-face mode and Open & Distance Learning mode courses and to monitor the Continuing Rehabilitation Education (CRE) Programmes being organized in the States concerned.
- II. Informing the Council about mal-practice/quackery in the field of special education and disability rehabilitation.
- III. Monitoring of contact programmes, term end examinations, entrance exam, conducted at RCI's approved Study Centres for Open & Distance Learning Courses by deputing Central Level Observers (CLO's).
- IV. Facilitating and liasoning of small NGO's with RCI for their further growth.
- V. Facilitating the translation of training /study material in the regional language whenever/ wherever required.
- VI. To create greater awareness about the importance of qualified rehabilitation professionals in dealing with the persons with disabilities and ensuring rapid progress in the development of various courses to suit the needs of each State.
- VII. To Liase with the various departments of the state Government like Health, Human Resource Development and Social Welfare and to ensure that various schemes of the state and central governments are implemented properly, also to create awareness about the importance of qualified rehabilitation professionals.
- VIII. To share the execution some of the tasks allocated to RCI, as assigned by RCI.
- IX. To provide easier access to institutes willing to affiliate themselves with RCI.
- X. To perform such other functions as may be assigned by the Council from time to time.
- XI. To undertake SWOT Analysis on various field and areas in disability sector, as assigned by the Council.
- XII. To facilitate inspection of institutes applying for recognition with the approval of RCI.
- XIII. To convene at least one State level meeting in a year to discuss technical issues pertaining to special education and disability rehabilitation in the State. In case more meetings of experts/ core group are required, the same may be organized subject to prior approval of the Council.
- XIV. To convene Seminars/Symposiums/Workshops at different places in the State on technical issues pertaining to the region, subject to prior approval of RCI.
- XV. To facilitate in improving the quality of training programme being conducted in the State by recognized institutions i.e. to facilitate with programme audit.


- XVI. Translation and writing of appropriate literature relevant to the region and to prepare such reports as RCI may assigned the ZCC to do so.
- XVII. To create awareness about the activities of the Council and other acts promulgated by the Central and State Governments for the welfare of persons with disability. The ZCC will establish proper liaison between State Govt. & RCI.
- XVIII. To forward grievances of individuals and institutions to Chairperson, RCI with appropriate comments. The decision of the RCI shall be final and abiding on all parties in case of any dispute.
- XIX. To raise funds from CSR, only for discharging the defined functions.
- XX. Any other functions that may be assigned to the ZCC by RCI from time to time.

MEETING OF ZCC:

The Council has conducted the Meeting of Zonal Coordinators of ZCCs on 10th August, 2020 through Video Conferencing to review Zonal activities carried out during the previous Financial Year 2019-20 and to finalize plan of action for the current Financial Year 2020-21. During the meeting it was recommended that Zonal Coordinator to be re-designated as Chief Coordinator.

Smt. Dyuti Rani D. Burman, IPS (Retd.), Guwahati has been appointed as Chief Coordinator (ZCC), North –Eastern-II Zone vide Council's letter no.10-75/ZCC/NE-II Zone/2016 dated 31 August, 2020, as per the decision taken by the General Council in its 42nd Meeting held on 07 August, 2020.

Funds of Rs. 29.60 lakhs (@ Rs. 3.70 lakhs per zone) were released to 08 ZCCs viz. Central-I, Central-II, Eastern-I, Eastern-II, North East-I, Northern-III, Southern-I and Western-I to conduct Zonal activities as per the approved plan of action 2020-21. Funds to remaining ZCCs will be released on submission of either bank account details or Utilization Certificates for the previous year.

3. Central sector plan scheme of “In-Service Training and Sensitization of key functionaries of Central and State Governments, Local bodies and other service providers”

The 12th Five Year Plan of Govt. of India has recognized inadequate awareness and sensitivity amongst various stakeholders as a major challenge. It was felt that there is urgent need for in-service training amongst the various stake holders to create awareness about the rights and entitlements of PwDs, provisions in various schemes, developmental programmes, ways and means to access their specific entitlements and those that they are entitled to as equal citizens. Therefore, in order to realize the above said objectives, the Govt. of India has made a provision for training and sensitization of key functionaries of Central/ State Govt. under the 12th Five year plan through DEPwD. This is envisaged to be achieved by organizing short term training programmes through workshops at State/District/Block level on regular basis.

3.1. Recommendations of 3rd party

From the findings of the study conducted on “In-Service Training and Sensitization of key functionaries of Central and State Governments, Local bodies and other service providers”, which was sponsored by Department for Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities, Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India, the following recommendations were made after analyzing the responses of the stakeholders of the scheme. These recommendations are based on the views expressed and information shared by the respondents- Implementing agencies, participants i.e, Key Functionaries, officials of the Department and RCI.

- I. Awareness generation at national, state and block level are required to sensitize Key Functionaries regarding the issues of Disability. Although the scheme has been implemented in many states belonging to all the zones of the country, still some states and union territories have remained uncovered. To broaden the coverage, budget allocation may be enhanced for the scheme. To increase the efficacy of the scheme in sensitizing officials, more and more non-government organizations, educational institutions may be involved along with the Government Organizations.
- II. It has been noted that there is no mechanism to monitor the scheme in terms of the training input. Although there exists an in-built mechanism to validate the financial aspects of the programmes, monitoring of academic performances is required for enhancement of the impact of the scheme.
- III. At present, irregularity has been observed on behalf of the government organizations so far as submission of UCs, accounts statements, programme report and the refund of the unspent amount. It is recommended that all the relevant documents should be submitted to RCI in stipulated time for maintaining a smooth coordination and better implementation of the scheme.
- IV. The time gap between sanction of money to the implementing agencies and the commencement of a programme may be increased.



- V. Number of programmes allotted under the scheme may be increased to sensitize more Functionaries/Officials dealing with the issues of disability.
- VI. List of participants with full contact details should be available and shared by the Implementing Agencies. All the implementing agencies may record the complete contact details of the participants and can make it available in their websites.
- VII. The sensitization programme should be suitable to the local culture and language and be conducted appropriately. Lectures may be delivered in local language at least for some target groups like target Group V and VI to make the participants better understand and internalize the course input.
- VIII. Pre-school teachers and elementary teachers may be included in the Target Group
- IX. It has been found that sessions on Oralism, Sign language and Braille have been delivered in limited number of Institutes although other issues have been covered by most of the Institutes. Hence, these issues should also be included in the training content by all the Institutes.
- X. Although practical components in the training input have been found sufficient, field visit need to be organized by all the Implementing Agencies. In the current evaluation study, it has been found that 70% of the Agencies have organized field visits.
- XI. The participants need to be sensitized about all types of disabilities. Although most of the training organizations have covered the issue on types of disability, still an in-depth coverage on this issue is required to be done by all the training institutions to make the Key Functionaries aware about different types of disabilities-physical and intellectual.
- XII. It is important to strengthen the institutional framework at all levels to have a stronger and more direct role for PwDs.
- XIII. Pamphlets and brochures regarding disability issues may be generated and distributed in different programmes for awareness generation.
- XIV. Running Social Media Campaigns on important days on round the year basis may perform a key role for increasing the awareness about schemes and rights of disabled people.
- XV. Collaborations with different stakeholders i.e, Government and Non Government Agencies are required for successful implementation of the programmes as well as of the scheme.
- XVI. Advocacy on appropriate forums may be an important tool for awareness generation.
- XVII. There should be nodal institutions with required number of professionals. These nodal institutions may proactively sensitize the Key Functionaries /Officials.
- XVIII. The Implementing Agencies suggest that the budget heads need to have some flexibility. Some re-appropriation across budget heads needs to be allowed for institution based customized planning and organization. Some Institutions suggest that the Honorarium for resource person may be enhanced to invite out-station experts and senior officials.



- XIX. There should be involvement of administrators i.e. Principals, Vice Chancellors and Registrars so that the message reaches functionaries at the level of decision making and appropriate matching of the requirements of the job and the training input can be made possible.

Submission of Physical and financial performance report of In-service training programme along with details of beneficiaries for last 04 years to DEPwD

The Council has compiled detailed information of **12910 beneficiaries from different government departments** trained under the various target groups at block, district and State level in-service training and sensitization programme conducted by implementing agencies across the country during the last 4 years (2015-16 to 2018-19). The detail information comprising of name of the in-service officials, gender, designation, department, contact details, location, target group, batches conducted etc. has been sent to DEPwD in the form of hard and soft copy on August, 2020 for third party evaluation.

Preparation of physical & financial data of last 04 years in respect of conduct of In-service Training & sensitization programme comprising GIA Sanctioned, Implementing agencies, target group, Batches sanctioned and conducted, details of approx. 12,910 beneficiaries along with their details like Department, gender, contact details, contact number etc. was completed and submitted to DEPwD for Third Party Evaluation by **NIELRD**.

Issuance of reminder letters to the implementing agencies for refund of GIA:

The Council has issued reminder letters to all such implementing agencies with unutilized amount of GIA for refund and to settle the account.

Comments on draft of third party evaluation report in r/o In-service Training & Sensitization programme:

The Council has submitted the para wise comments on draft third party evaluation report prepared by NIELRD in respect of In-service Training & Sensitization programme.

Release of Vision Document 2020-2030:

Vision document 2020-2030 of RCI has been launched by the Smt. Shakuntala Doley Gamlin, Secretary, DEPwD and Chairperson, RCI on 16th Feb., 2021 at Goa.

RCI's mandate is to develop, standardize and facilitate human resource development in special education and disability rehabilitation in India. This document reflects the shifting paradigm, the current and emerging needs for the coming decade and inclusion, participation and dignity of persons with disabilities (*Divyangjan*) as per **the provisions of Rights of Persons with Disabilities (RPwD Act 2016)**. This vision document is a strategic plan for the development of human resource that ensures that all relevant policy, programmes, interventions and approaches are streamlined and optimized to support the overall HRD policy framework of the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (*Divyangjan*), Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India.



The mission of RCI is to lead and advocate for systemic change in the field of disability rehabilitation, leverage collaborations and partnerships toward improved services and support for individuals with disabilities (*Divyangjan*); and promote positive perceptions and attitudes about them. In the larger context, with quality HRD services and programs, RCI aims to realize increased independence, productivity, integration and inclusion of persons with disabilities in the community. Though not a provider of direct services, RCI has promoted and assisted capacity building and coordinated comprehensive systems through systemic change in the development of array of services, supports and other programs to achieve full community inclusion for persons with disabilities (*Divyangjan*).

One important aim of this **Vision Document** is to provide an overarching and coordinated framework for the multitude of skills development agenda that will take RCI into the next decade of development for the country.

Development of Short Term Online Courses for Benchmark Disabilities:

The Council has constituted an expert committee to finalize the draft RFP for inviting proposals (Technical & Financial bids) through CPP portal from the eligible agencies to develop short term online courses on benchmark disabilities i.e. HI, VI, ID, MD, DB, Speech & Hearing & Mental Health . The meeting of the expert committee was held on 18th Dec., 2020. RFP is being finalised to upload the same on CP portal.

Workshop of NEP National Policy on Education and its impact and implications on RCI's approved Human Resource Programme(s) in Disability Sector.

The Council has conducted workshop on National Policy on Education (NEP) and its impact and implications on RCI's approved Human Resource Programme(s) in Disability Sector on 1st February, 2021 under the Chairpersonship of the Secretary, DEPwD & Chairperson, RCI .The meeting was attended by eminent experts across the country. A plan of action was devised to implement the recommendations of the committee.

After having –in depth deliberations on various aspects of RCI's courses in light of NEP, 2020, the following recommendations were made unanimously during the workshop:

- (i) RCI to promote research activities in the field of Special Education and Disability Rehabilitation.
- (ii) ECCE and Vocational Education components to be included in RCI course curriculum
- (iii) Online short term courses on various disabilities to be developed for in-service teachers.
- (iv) ICT component needs to be inducted in all RCI's approved course curriculum.
- (v) Courses on Inclusive education, cross disability & SLD to be developed.
- (vi) Short duration capacity building programme for parents of CWSN to be developed.
- (vii) Capacity building and sensitization programme for aanganwadi workers and other stakeholders to be developed.



- (viii) Curriculum framework for CWSN to be developed jointly by RCI, NCTE & NCERT.
- (ix) Multipurpose Rehabilitation worker (MRW) course of RCI to be revamped.
- (x) Inclusion of RCI Journal in UGC list.
- (xi) To develop additional special educators for pedagogy courses.
- (xii) To review the current courses offered by RCI to make it more inclusive and right based.
- (xiii) RCI to obtain 360 degree feedback from all concerned stakeholders for revision of its courses.
- (xiv) RCI to pursue the matter with UGC to include Special Education as a one of the subject in UGC NET.
- (xv) Short term courses on research methodology to be promoted by RCI.
- (xvi) Induction of provision of multiple entry and exit in all special education and disability rehabilitation courses.
- (xvii) Continuing Professional Development (CPD) programme to be jointly developed by RCI & NCTE

Constitution of sub-committee to create an inventory of colleges and organisations working in the field of e-content development of CWSN:

As per the decision taken during the expert committee meeting of CBSE, the Council has constituted an experts committee to create an inventory of colleges and organisations working in the field of e-content development for CWSN. The meeting was held on 4th September, 2020 under the Chairpersonship of Dr. Subodh Kumar, Member Secretary, RCI at RCI. A proforma was developed by the Council to invite the proposal from the eligible organizations to share the details of e-contents developed by them for CWSN.

CHAPTER – 8

COMMUNITY BASED INCLUSIVE DEVELOPMENT (CBID) PROGRAMME

Co-design of CBID Programme by RCI & University of Melbourne, Australia:

A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) has been signed between Govt. of India and Department of Social Services, Australian Govt. on 22nd November, 2018 to incorporate the joint development of disability training programmes in India. In pursuance of the said MoU, DEPwD, GoI has taken an initiation to develop a CBID programme as per WHO-CBR Guidelines 2010 in collaboration with Nossal Institute for Global Health & University of Melbourne, Australia to develop human resource in this sector.

DEPwD, MSJ&E has assigned the responsibility to RCI to co-design the CBID Course in collaboration with Nossal Institute for Global Health & University of Melbourne, Australia. Accordingly, the Council has developed a concept note, based on innovation, evidence and consensus, a Community Based Inclusive Development course to equip personnel across India to respond to disability at the local village level.

The Council has constituted an Expert Committee comprising of members viz. Dr. Bhushan Punani, Executive Secretary, Blind Peoples Association, Ahmedabad; Shri Carmo Narnoha, Executive Director, Bethany Society, Shillong; and Smt. Sara Varughese, CBM, India to utilize their experience and expertise in the co-designing of CBID Course in the Indian context. To meet out the above said objective the Council has conducted a series of meetings.

MEETINGS:


During the period under report the following meetings were conducted to develop the CBID programme:

- A. Meeting of Chairpersons of the respective CBID Groups & Content Developers was held on 17th August, 2020 to harmonize Course Structure, Session Plans & Self Learning Material (SLM) of CBID programme based on inputs of University of Melbourne, Australia.**

After having in-depth deliberation, the following recommendations were made unanimously:

- (i) The Council may constitute a core group comprising of Prof. Lindsey Gale, University of Melbourne, Australia, Prof. Sujata Bhan, SNDT University and Dr. Varsha Gathoo, AYJNISHD, Mumbai to harmonize Course structure, Session Plan and also to develop Assessment Plans, programme guide and Manual for Master Trainers as per inputs of Dr. Nathan. The said group will submit the final documents to the Council latest by 31st August, 2020.

- (ii) The Council may provide the full set of documents of all the three Modules i.e., ICD, A&I & PBRP to all the Chairpersons & content developers of CBID programme to identify the incomplete units of SLMs and to remove the overlapping of contents.
- (iii) The Core Group will pull out the contents of SLM and other documents to make them as a whole document.
- (iv) The Core Group will also prepare evaluation plan of marking system as per allocated hours (60:40) for practical and theory work latest by 30th September, 2020.
- (v) All the Chairperson may submit the bills to RCI in respect of expenditure incurred by them for Development of SLM, Course Structure with Bank account details, etc.
- (vi) The Council may hire a professional agency for content and language editing of all final documents developed for CBID Programme.

B. Meeting of the Chairpersons of the respective CBID groups, content developers, unit writers and officials of RCI and DEPwD was conducted on 14th December, 2020 to finalize the modalities to rollout the CBID programme.

The points of discussion of the Meeting were:

- Confirmation from the core group to finalize the documents i.e., Course Structure, Curriculum, Self Learning Material, Trainers Manual, Spread Sheets and Programme Guide in respect of CBID programme.
- Plan of action to rollout the CBID programme
- Training of Master Trainers

- Identification of potential NGOs to become the training partners with NIs


The members deliberated on the agenda points and had the following recommendations which were unanimously accepted.

- (i) The Self Learning Material needs to be harmonised. Prof. Sujata Bhan, Dr. Varsha Gathoo and Prof. Lindsey Gale, could once again glance through all the three modules and its components.
- (ii) The Chairpersons Dr. Punani, Sh Carmo & Dr. Sara may provide the list of potential NGOs working in the field of CBR and RCI may shortlist them as technical partners with National Institute of DEPwD to conduct the said programme, subject to approval of RCI.
- (iii) The CBID programme needs to be ready for the roll out tentatively by the last week of Jan 2021 through both online and offline mode. The proposal in this regard for financial assistance will be submitted to the DEPwD by the Council.
- (iv) Master Trainers programme to be conducted for 15 days involving the Senior Experts recommended by the respective Chairpersons Dr. Punani, Sh. Carmo and Dr. Sara. The Master Trainer programme could be conducted in a phased manner at the identified training sites across the country by ensuring the regional balance. The same may be completed by mid Feb 2021.
- (v) The evaluation of the outcomes of the Master Trainer programs of the CBID to be undertaken by the University of Melbourne, Australia after completion of 02 batches. This will be subject to approval from DEPwD.
- (vi) To promote the CBID programme, DEPwD may explore stipends to these students in lines of ISL trainings.
- (vii) The Council may organize one more meeting tentatively on 21st Dec, 2020 under the chairpersonship of the Secretary, DEPwD & Chairperson, RCI to apprise her about the current status of this programme and strategies to roll out the programme.

- E. All the documents of CBID programme are printed in English language and Hindi printing are underway and withheld due to Lockdown imposed by Govt. of NCT of Delhi. Translation in Marathi completed. Additionally, translation in Gujarati, Tamil, Telugu, Bengali, Malayalam, Oriya, and Kannada is under process.



- F. The Hon'ble Union Minister of Social Justice & Empowerment, Government of India has kindly given his consent to inaugurate the CBID programme through virtual mode on 13th May, 2021.
- G. The action plan for virtual launch of CBID programme by HMSJ&E was also discussed between MS, RCI, Director & Under Secretary, DEPwD on 5th April, 2021 at DEPwD.
- H. The Council has also submitted the estimated budget of Rs. 289 Lakhs to be incurred over the next 03 years for co-design of CBID programme jointly by RCI & NOSSAL Institute of Global Health, University of Melbourne, Australia. The same has been approved by DEPwD in principle.

CHAPTER – 9

Administration & Accounts

Administration of the Rehabilitation Council of India involves many activities besides managing the establishment and financial aspects.

1. Use of Hindi in official work

In order to promote use of Hindi in official work, the orders/instruction/guidelines issued by the Department of Official Language from time to time are strictly followed by the Council. The employees of RCI are motivated to carry out their official work in Hindi. RCI celebrated Hindi Pakhwara between 14-28 September, 2020 wherein various programmes were conducted and prizes were awarded to employees for participating in various events to promote use of Hindi in official work. Quarterly and half yearly reports were submitted regularly to the DEPwD, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment and Department of Official Language, Ministry of Home Affairs.

2. Reservation Policy

The procedure prescribed by the Government to implement the reservation policy in the office of the RCI is followed and due consideration is given for compliance of the orders on reservation policy issued by the Government from time to time.

3. Vigilance Awareness Week

The Council celebrated Vigilance Awareness Week from 27th October 2020 to 02nd November 2020 on the theme “Satark Bharat, Samriddh Bharat (Vigilant India, Prosperous India)” (सतर्क भारत, समृद्ध भारत) as per Central Vigilance Commission’s Circular No. 019/VGL/029 dated 08.10.2020. All employees of the Council took the Integrity Pledge.

4. Centralised Public Grievance Redress and Monitoring System (CPGRAM)

The Centralized Public Grievance Redress and Monitoring System (CPGRAM) is an online web-enabled system developed by National Informatics Centre (NIC) in association with the Directorate of Public Grievances (DPG) and the Department of Administrative Reforms and Public Grievances (DARPG). CPGRAM is a platform based on web-technology which primarily aims to enable submission of grievances by the aggrieved citizens from anywhere - anytime to the concerned Ministries / Departments / Organisations who scrutinize and take action for speedy and favorable redress of these grievances. Tracking grievances is also facilitated on this portal through the system generated unique registration number.



During the period under report, total 80 applications were received pertaining to Distance Education Cell, ZCC, Registration, Recognition through CPGRAM and all were disposed off as per the stipulated provisions of the CPGRAM.

5. Implementation of RTI Act, 2005

Consequent upon the enactment of the RTI Act, 2005, RCI is following the instructions/ guidelines issued by the Government from time to time. The requisite information about RCI is displayed on the website of the Council (www.rehabcouncil.nic.in) for general public. During the year, total 452 RTI applications were received and disposed off. In addition, 70 appeals were received and 68 were disposed off.

6. Library and Documentation

RCI has a good collection of books/ publications/ audio/ video/ journals/ periodicals in the area of disability rehabilitation and special education which are being used by the professionals/ personnel/ experts/ students. Library remains open on all working days.

7. Publications

RCI brings out a number of publications on regular intervals such as Journal of Rehabilitation Council of India (JRCI), Status of Disability in India, Training Manuals of Diploma Courses, Training Manuals for different functionaries etc. During the year, 33rd Annual Report for the year 2019-20 (Bi-lingual) was published.

8. Swachhata Pakhwada

As per directives of DEPwD, MoSJ&E, the Council observed Swachhata Pakhwada during 2nd fortnight of July, 2020 (i.e. from 16 July to 31 July, 2020). All officers & employees of RCI actively participated in the Cleanliness drive of Swachhata Pakhwada and undertook various activities during the period including maintenance of cleanliness, sanitization and hygiene of RCI premises during COVID period as per the protocol of MoHFW, maintenance of greenery, plantation and flowering in the premises, proper maintenance and cleaning of toilets, discouraged the use of plastic in the office, distribution of masks, sanitizers, soap and other safety related products.



9. Celebration of 6th International Day of Yoga

Due to outbreak of Covid-19 pandemic, a circular was issued by the Council requesting all employees of the Council to observe 6th International Day of Yoga on 21.06.2020 with the theme 'Yoga at Home – Yoga with Family' and practice Yoga at home with their family members. Officers and employees actively participated and performed Yoga at home with their family members on 21.06.2020 with precautionary measures to contain the spread of Covid-19.

10. Staff Strength

Under Section 8 (1) of the RCI Act, 1992, Central Government shall appoint the Member Secretary of the Council. Under Section 8 (2) of the Act, the Council shall, with the previous sanction of the Central Government, employ such officers and other employees as it deems necessary to carry out the purpose of the Act. The present staff strength of the Council is 39 (i.e.) 4 in Group "A", 12 in Group "B" and 23 in Group "C"). Details of sanctioned strength of staff are at **Annexure 9.1**.

11. Preventive measures taken due to outbreak of COVID-19:

- i. In order to contain the spread of Novel Corona Virus (COVID-19), Circulars were issued by the Council as precautionary measures from time to time in the public interest.
- ii. All the Officers and staff (including outsourced staff) working in RCI were directed to download 'Aarogyasetu' App on their mobile phones. They were asked to review their status on 'Aarogyasetu' regularly and to commute only when the app shows 'safe' or 'low risk' status. Infection status of employee shown in Arogyasetu app is being monitored during working days while reporting to the office.
- iii. Only essential visits of visitors were being entertained in RCI building.
- iv. Masks, Gloves, Soaps & Sanitizers distributed to all the officers & employees of RCI.
- v. The premises of RCI building was sanitised regularly using Sodium Hypochloride as per the directions of Health Ministry.
- vi. Consequent upon launch of online training courses by World Health Organisation (WHO), officers & employees of the Council participated in various courses offered by WHO and availed benefit of the online courses to combat Covid-19 pandemic.
- vii. Covid-19 testing for the officers and employees of RCI arranged on 16-09-2020 in consultation with District Magistrate (South), Delhi.

Schedule – 19: Significant Accounting Policies, Contingent Liabilities and Notes on Accounts.

1. Contingent Liabilities – Nil. (Previous Year – Nil.)
2. The rehabilitation Council of India, New Delhi is a Statutory Body set up under the Rehabilitation Council of India Act 1992. (No. 34 of 1992.) The Council is financed by the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Government of India through Grants-in-Aid.
3. The Council, as desired, based on the observations of DGACE, New Delhi in the audit report 2003-04 prepared Annual accounts in the common/ revised format approved by the Govt of India in consultation with the Comptroller & Auditor General of India (CAG).

As per these formats, the Council has to prepare following statements:

- a. Balance Sheet
- b. Income & Expenditure Account
- c. Receipts & Payment Account
4. Traditionally the system of accounts being maintained in the Council are similar to the one being maintained by various Government departments on accrual system of accounting, accrued interest on investment, prepaid expenses, etc are also included in the accounts accordingly.
5. The depreciation has been provided on fixed assets since inception on w.d.v. method
6. Physical verification of fixed assets for 2019-20 in carried out as continuous / perpetual basis every year and no deficiencies are noticed.
7. Physical verification of inventory, stationary & other consumables is carried out and no deficiencies are noticed.
8. Value of inventory/books received as gifts has been added in the schedule of assets.
9. Previous year figures have been re-grouped/rearranged wherever necessary as per requirement of the Council.
10. Schedule of Investment has been prepared in common format.
11. As separate bank accounts are maintained for RCI G.P. Fund, RCI Pension Fund, RCI Main Account, RCI Project Account, RCI NBER Account and In-Service Training Programme, therefore , separate receipt & payment accountns have been prepared for each account.
12. The M/o Social Justice & Empowerment sanctioned to create a Pension Fund only to discharge pension liability. Accordingly, actuarial valuation of pension fund was got made from actuaries. The Council has a strength of 39 only. One or two officials retire in a span of 2/3 years. Therefore, necessity was not felt to make provision for gratuity ad leave encashment and the same is charged from the allocated budget in the relevant year in which the official is due to retire.
13. The Council has sent a proposal to the administrative Ministry to amend the RCI Act, 1992 with a provision to insert a clause regarding Income Tax Exemption in the Amendment Act.

Separate Audit Report of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India on the Accounts of Rehabilitation Council of India for the year ended 31 March 2021

We have audited the attached Balance-Sheet of Rehabilitation Council of India as at 31 March 2021, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts & Payment Account for the year ended on that date under Section 19 (2) of the Comptroller & Auditor General's (Duties, Powers & Conditions of Service) Act, 1971 read with Section 21 (3) of the Rehabilitation Council of India, Regulations 1997. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Council's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

2. This Separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller and Auditor General of India (C&AG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification, conformity with the best accounting practice, accounting standards and disclosure norms, etc. Audit observations on financial transactions with regard to compliance with the Law, Rules & Regulations (propriety and Regularity) and efficiency-cum-performance aspects, etc., if any, are reported through Inspection Report/C&AG's Audit Reports separately.
3. We have conducted the audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards required that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidences supporting the amounts and disclosure in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.
4. Based on our audit, we report that:
 - I. We have obtained all the information and explanations, which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit;
 - II. The Balance-Sheet, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipt & Payment Account dealt with by this report have been drawn up in the Uniform Format of Accounts approved by the Ministry of Finance.
 - III. In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by the Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI) as required under Section 21 (2) of Rehabilitation Council of India Regulations, 1997 in so far as it appears from our examination of such books.
 - IV. We further report that:

A General

- A.1** A sum of Rs. 55.21 lakh was paid to M/s NICSI on 27.1.2021 for installation of e-office software for the period of 5 years. However, an amount of Rs.55.21 lakh was shown in other administrative expenses against payment to NICSI for the project. Since the service



of NICSI e-office was to be availed during the next five years, the payment should be treated as advance payment and proportionate amount was required to be charged as expenditure at the end of the year instead of charged whole expenditure in one year.

A.2 Interest earned on accounts in respect of GPF, Pension and National Board of Examination for Rehabilitation (NBER) accounts, In-Service Training Programme, RCI Main Account, RCI Project and investment except for RCI Main Account and RCI Project Account is being accounted by the Council on cash basis instead of accrual basis. This was in contravention of Uniform Format of Accounts and also Accounting Policy 4 of the council.

A.3 The Council has not made provision for gratuity & leave encashment on actuarial valuation in contravention of the Uniform Format of Accounts approved by the Government of India, Ministry of Finance.

B. Grants-in-Aid

The Council received a Grant in Aid of Rs. 550.00 lakh during 2020-21 from Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment. Out of this, grant amounting to Rs.34.07 lakh was received in March 2021. It had unspent balance of Grants in aid of previous year amounting to Rs 17.37 lakh. Out of the total funds available, the Council utilized a sum of Rs. 550.00 lakh leaving an unspent grant of Rs, 17.37lakh.

C. Management letter

Deficiencies which have not been included in the audit Report have been brought to the notice of the Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI) through a management letter issued separately for remedial/corrective action.

- V. Subject to our observations in the preceding paragraphs, we report that the Balance sheet, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipt & Payment Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with the book of accounts.
- VI. In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the said financial statements read together with the Accounting Policies and Notes on Accounts, and subject to the significant matters stated above and other matters mentioned in Annexure to this Audit Report give a true and fair view in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in India:
- a) In so far as it relates to the Balance Sheet of the state of affairs of the Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI) as at 31 March, 2021 and
- b) In so far as, it relates to Income and Expenditure Account of the surplus for the year ended on that date.

Annexure

1. Adequacy of Internal Audit system

The Internal Audit Cell/Department has not been set up in the Council. Internal Audit was also not conducted by Pr. A.O. of the Ministry. Internal audit is being conducted by Chartered Accountant who has conducted audit up to 2020-21.

2. Adequacy of Internal Control system

The internal control system of the Council was not adequate as accrual system was not adopted even though the Council stated that it was being adopted. There is not any Internal Audit wing in the Council. The Council had not accounted for accrued interest on Saving Bank accounts during the year 2020-21. Advances were lying unadjusted for long periods.

3. System of physical verification of fixed assets

The physical verification of fixed assets was conducted up to 2019-20.

4. System of physical verification of inventory

The physical verification of inventory like books and publication have been conducted up to 2020-21. Stationery and other consumable items have been conducted up to 2019-20.

5. Regularity in payment of dues

As per annual accounts, no payments over six month in respect of statutory dues are outstanding.

Director (AMG-II)
