

From that day onwards, 9th November assumed as Legal Services Day and is celebrated every year by all Authorities. The aim of celebrating the Legal Services Day is to make sure the availability of free services to the weaker section people as well as making them conscious about their rights. This year, Rajasthan State Legal Services Authority, is celebrating 25th year of enactment of LSA, Act 1987.

Right to Compulsory Education-My Right

The rights of children for free and compulsory education describe the modalities of free and compulsory education for children between the ages of 6 to 14 years. Article 21 A of the Constitution of India make education a fundamental right for every child while it is obligatory for the government to provide free and compulsory education to each & every child. All children between the ages of 6 to 14 shall have the right to free and compulsory elementary education at a neighbourhood school. The government will provide schooling free – of – cost until a child's elementary education is completed.

Therefore, Authority has decided to develop a platform to reach the unreached, with specific provisions for disadvantaged groups, such as child labourers, migrant children, children with special needs, or those who have a disadvantage owing to social, cultural, economical, geographical, linguistic, gender or such other factor.

Legal Services Camp

Access to justice is essential for rule of law, Access to justice, enable citizens to have their voices heard, exercise their rights and challenge discrimination. Access to Justice is not confined to court based legal services. It extends to making people aware about their entitlements under various enactments and welfare schemes and programmes and strengthening their access to the same. Some Legal Awareness Camps are being held by the State Legal Services Authorities to make people aware about their entitlements and apprise them about the availability of free legal services. In most of

the camps, it has been observed, only creating of awareness is focused on. Therefore, NALSA has launched a new Model of holding Legal Services Camps which would not only make people aware about their entitlements and procedural aspects relating to the same but also connect them to the welfare schemes meant for them.
