Composite Regional Centre, CRC-Sikkim, situated at Assam Lingzey, under National Institute for the Persons with Visual Disabilities, Dehradun, joined the world to celebrate this day at Ranipool junction on the 15th of Oct 2022. This program was conducted under the Patronage of Dr. Himangshu Das, Director, NIEPVD, Dehradun, and Convener, Ms. Moirangthem Irish, Resident Coordinator CRC-Sikkim.
