AGREEMENTS FOR UNINTERRUPTED SUPPLY OF URANIUM

Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state:

- (a) the names of the countries from which India is currently getting help to meet the country's nuclear energy needs;
- (b) whether Government has entered into agreements with some other countries of the world for an uninterrupted supply of Uranium; and
- (c) If so, the details thereof?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF STATE FOR PERSONNEL, PUBLIC GRIEVANCES AND PENSIONS AND PRIME MINISTER'S OFFICE (DR. JITENDRA SINGH)

- (a) Inter Governmental Agreement (IGA) for co-operation in peaceful uses of nuclear energy have been signed with seventeen countries like Argentina, Australia, Bangladesh, Canada, Czech Republic, European Union, France, Japan, Kazakhstan, Mongolia, Namibia, Republic of Korea, Russia, Sri Lanka, United Kingdom, United States of America and Vietnam.
- (b)&(c) Yes, Sir. Government of India has entered into an Agreement with Government of Russian Federation for supply of fuel for Russian Reactors at Kudankulam Nuclear Power Project (KKNPP) throughout the operation period of power units. Uranium purchase agreement has also been entered with Canada, Kazakhstan, Russia and Uzbekistan.
