OFFICE MEMORANDUM

Subject: Consolidated instructions in the procedure for Direct Recruitment to Group B (Non-Gazetted) and Group C posts.

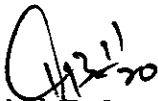
In supersession of DAE OM No. 28/2/2017-CCS/12675 dated 28.09.2017 regarding discontinuation of interviews for recruitment to Group B (non-gazetted) and Group C posts. The procedure for recruitment to the posts of Driver (OG), UDC, Stenographer II & III and Junior Translation Officer is being amended as follows from the date of this OM:

2. General Criteria for Selection:

- (i) All candidates who have applied and fulfilled the eligibility criteria should be called for the Level 1 examination.
- (ii) Minimum pass percentage for all posts in each Level shall be 50% for General and 40% for Reserved category.
- (iii) In the event where large number of candidates obtain the minimum qualifying marks in the Level 1 examination, the candidates shall be shortlisted for the Level 2 examination. For short listing of candidates, marks secured by the candidates shall be arranged in descending order up to the minimum qualifying marks as mentioned above. Separate mark list shall be prepared for UR, SC, ST, OBC, PH, EWS and one common list for all the candidates who appeared in Level 1 examination. Obtaining the minimum qualifying marks alone does not entitle a candidate to be called for the Level 2 examination.
- (iv) For up to 20 vacancies, the short listing of candidates on the basis of Level 1 examination should be in the ratio of 1:20 i.e., for every single vacancy, 20 candidates should be called for the Level 2 examination. From the 21st vacancy onwards, for every vacancy, 10 candidates i.e., 1:10 ratio should be called for the Level 2 examination. If there is more than one candidate with the same cut off mark (while shortlisting in the case of 1:10 and 1:20), then all the candidates with the same mark will be shortlisted for Level 2 examination.

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- (v) Final selection will be based on the marks obtained in Level 2 examination except in case of drivers and stenographers where combined marks in Level 1 & 2 will be taken.
 - (vi) Resolution in case of tie:
 - a. Total of Level 1 and Level 2 marks in case of UDC and JTO. Level 2 marks only in case of Stenographers II & III/Drivers (OG).
 - b. Date of Birth.
 - c. Alphabetical order of name (First name, middle name and surname, in that order).
3. The detailed procedure for Direct recruitment for the individual posts are tabulated at Annexure 'A'.
4. Further, all the units are required to comply with the aforesaid guidelines and invariably bring out all the above criteria in the advertisement itself.
