

Annexure-I

Reducing Seasonality at Tourism Destinations By organizing Meetings and Conferences during off-season

1. Promoting MICE to reduce seasonality

One of the key challenges of Tourism Sector is seasonality of our tourist destinations, which reduces the competitiveness and potential benefits of tourism. Hon'ble Prime Minister has directed to promote Meetings, Incentives, Conferences & Exhibitions (MICE) Tourism during off season at various tourism destinations in order to ensure that the tourism infrastructure such as hotels and other attractions are optimally utilized during off-season.

2. Pilot Tourist Destinations

In this connection, following tourist destinations have been identified by the Ministry of Tourism for promotion of MICE during off-season between 1stApril to 30thSeptember.

- (i) Varanasi
- (ii) Agra
- (iii) Khajuraho
- (iv) Hampi
- (v) Bodhgaya

3. Off Season

Currently, the off season for the above destinations is between 1st April to 30th September.

4. Promotion of MICE during off season - Generating Demand

Following three strategies to be used

(i) Central Government Ministries and PSUs

All Central Government Ministries and PSUs under them to be requested to organize their meetings, incentives, conferences and exhibitions at these destinations during off season.

(ii) State Governments

The Concerned State Governments to encourage all departments and PSUs to organise their meetings, incentives, conferences and exhibitions at these destinations during off season.

(iii) Private Sector

The Private Sector through their Associations such CII, FICCI, ASSOCHAM etc. to be requested to encourage their members to organize meetings, incentives, conferences and exhibitions at these destinations during off season.

5. Supply Side

Following three strategies to be used"

(i) Attractive Discounts

Tourism and hospitality industry to provide attractive discounts for MICE events during off season.

(ii) Additional offerings

Develop additional offerings such as festivals and events during off season.

(iii) Special incentives

State Governments/ ASI can offer discounts in tickets for monuments during off season. They may also allow MICE organisers to host hi-tea, lunch and dinners at these attractions to provide them unique and exclusive experience. Some of the star speakers at such events may be hosted by Ministry of Tourism or State Tourism Department as an additional incentive to the organisers.

6. Action Plan

(i) Collect relevant data

Collect relevant information regarding hotels, convention centres and other facilities and the discounts being offered at the destination. The data regarding number of events during the season and off season in the past may also be collected.

(ii) Publicity and awareness

Wide publicity and awareness to be created amongst the Government and Private Sector entities with details of the offerings from the destination to attract them for holding MICE events at the destination.

(iii) Follow up with Government and Private Sector entities

Ministry of Tourism and State Tourism Departments to ensure active follow up with Government of Private Sector entities for organizing MICE events at these destinations. Ministry of Tourism and State Tourism Departments to take lead in organizing events during off-season at these destinations.

(iv) Track progress

Track progress of number of MICE events hosted at these destinations and analyse the data with past years to develop insights and measure the efficacy of various measures and take suitable corrective action. Periodic reports to be submitted to Ministry of Tourism.
