**App to access Judgments of the Courts**

**1391. Dr. Ashok Bajpai:**

Will the Minister of Law and Justice be pleased to state:

- (a) whether there is any single online/offline app to access the judgments of the Supreme Courts, High Courts, Tribunals etc.;
- (b) whether the private companies charge heavily for online/offline apps to access judgments of the Courts;
- (c) whether Government has any proposal to provide to the members of the bar, litigants, and judges any online/offline app to access judgments of the courts to relieve them from their hardships and create greater awareness of the judgments; and
- (d) if so, details thereof?

**ANSWER**

(a) to (d): At present, there is no single online/offline app to access the judgments of the Supreme Court, High Courts, Tribunals etc. However, a mobile app namely, **eCourts Services** developed for District Court and High Courts has facility to view the Judgments as part of the Case Status. A dedicated portal <https://judgments.ecourts.gov.in/> is also created for providing access to judgments from High Courts. This service is absolutely free of cost. Judgments are also available on the websites of respective High Courts. Information on private companies charging for online/offline apps is not centrally maintained.
