<u>Minutes of Fifteenth Meeting of Project Sanctioning Committee (PSC) of the</u> <u>'Scheme for Action Research and Studies on Judicial Reforms' held on 13th</u> March 2020 in Department of Justice, Jaisalmer House, New Delhi

- The 15th meeting of Project Sanctioning Committee (PSC) of the 'Scheme for Action Research and Studies on Judicial Reforms' held on 13th March 2020 in Department of Justice, Jaisalmer House, New Delhi under the Chairmanship of Secretary (Justice). A list of members attended is at Annexure.
- 2. The following actionable points emerged in the meeting:
- All Joint Secretaries and other stakeholders should be consulted regarding necessary topics for action research studies before studies are allotted to institutions.
- The new specialized institutions should be included in 'Eligible Implementing Authorities' for conducting action research studies.
- AI / Data analytics agencies will be included for implementation of project outcomes.
- Every project proposal for action research studies by each organization has to be submitted to the PSC with number of studies already conducted, studies pending, extensions given and total grants released so far. All proposals are to be examined with its focus on deliverables and outcomes of the report and with implementation modalities.
- All proposals relating to Juvenile Justice may be sent to Ministry of Women & Child Development to ascertain whether such research studies have been already conducted earlier and, if not, then the relevance of such research in contemporary situation. Continuous follow up should be done with the Ministry to obtain their views. Similarly project proposals which are received in future which have interface with another Ministry needs to be shared with the concerned Ministry for their feedback.
- Only one time extension may be allowed to action research studies which have been approved. If any institute seeks for further extension, they may be informed that the amount of grant may be deducted. This needs to be built into all future contracts.
- In every project proposal, institutes will submit 'undertaking' in advance, mentioning that it has obtained permission to get information from other bodies/agencies which are relevant for conduct of research. They should not submit any kind of request for 'extension of time' on grounds of delay in accessing of information from another office and should not delay the project on the same ground.
- Those who submit the projects within a short period may be incentivized. Those agencies who request for extensions several times may be blacklisted.
- The next meeting will be held in 3rd week of April
- Before the next meeting all Joint Secretaries will give the topics for projects and suggestions will be taken from other stakeholders also.
