CONSTITUTION OF INDIA.

No. RTR-1176/998(162)-II.—In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to article 309 of the Constitution of India and in supersession of all existing rules issued in this behalf and in force in the State or any part thereof, the Governor of Maharashtra is hereby pleased to make the following rules regulating recruitment to the posts of Assistant Solicitor and *Ex-Officio* Deputy Secretary to Government, and Additional Assistant Solicitor and *Ex-Officio* Deputy Secretary to Government, in the Law and Judiciary Department of the Government of Maharashtra, namely:—

1. These rules may be called the Assistant Solicitor and *Ex-Officio* Deputy Secretary to Government, and the Additional Assistant Solicitor and *Ex-Officio* Deputy Secretary to Government, in the Law and Judiciary Department (Recruitment) Rules, 1978.

2. Appointment to the posts of Assistant Solicitor and *Ex-Officio* Deputy Secretary to Government, and Additional Assistant Solicitor and *Ex-Officio* Deputy Secretary, in the Law and Judiciary Department of the Government of Maharashtra, shall be made, either—

(1) by promotion from amongst persons who have held the post of Under Secretary in the legal section of the Law and Judiciary Department for a period of not less than four years and who are well versed in conveyancing work; or

(2) by nomination from amongst candidates, who—

(a) unless already in the service of the Government of Maharashtra, are not more than 40 years of age;

(b) have practised as Solicitors or Attorneys of the High Court at Bombay for not less than two years; and

(c) are particularly well versed in conveyancing work.

Provided that, the age-limit may be relaxed in favour of candidates having exceptional qualifications or experience or both:

Provided further that, preference will be given to candidates having experience of practice and procedure in the Court of Small Causes, Bombay, or the City Civil Court, Bombay.

3. A candidate appointed to the post by nomination shall be on probation for a period of two years.

4. A candidate appointed to the post whether by promotion or by nomination shall be required to pass examinations in Hindi and Marathi according to the prescribed rules, unless he has already passed or has been exempted from passing, such examinations.

5. Notwithstanding anything contained in clause (2) of rule 2, if at any stage of selection, the Maharashtra Public Service Commission is of the opinion that sufficient number of candidates possessing the requisite experience are not available to fill up the vacancies reserved for candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Denotified Tribes or Nomadic Tribes, the Commission may relax the condition regarding experience set out therein and select suitable candidates belonging to such castes or tribes to fill up the vacancies reserved for them.

No. RTR. 1176/996(162)-41.—In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to article 309 of the Constitution of India, the Governor of Maharashtra is hereby pleased to make the following rules to amend the Assistant Solicitor and *Ex-officio* Deputy Secretary to Government, and the Additional Assistant Solicitor and *Ex-officio* Deputy Secretary to Government, in the Law and Judiciary Department (Recruitment) Rules, 1978, namely :—

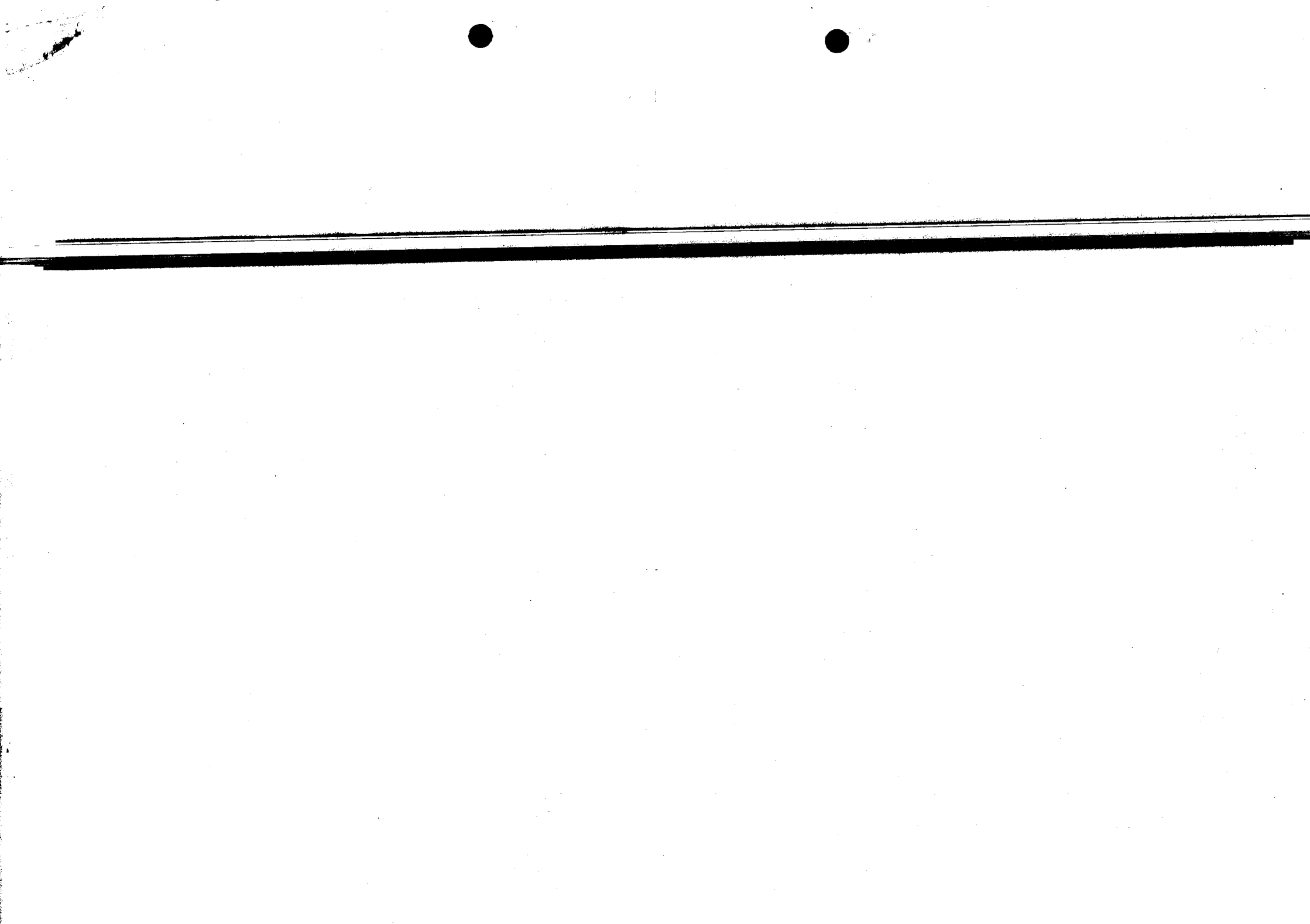
1. (1) These rules may be called the Assistant Solicitor and *Ex-officio* Deputy Secretary to Government, and the Additional Assistant Solicitor and *Ex-officio* Deputy Secretary to Government, in the Law and Judiciary Department (Recruitment) (Amendment) Rules, 1979.

(2) They shall be deemed to have come into force on the 29th day of May 1978.

2. In the Assistant Solicitor and *Ex-officio* Deputy Secretary to Government, and the Additional Assistant Solicitor and *Ex-officio* Deputy Secretary to Government, in the Law and Judiciary Department (Recruitment) Rules, 1978 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal rules"), the word "*Ex-officio*", wherever it occurs (including in the preamble), shall be deleted.

“(1A) by transfer of a Deputy Secretary in the legal section of the Law and Judiciary Department, who is well versed in conveyancing work; or”.
