An Act to provide for the licensing of race-courses in the ²[State of Bombay].

WHEREAS it is expedient to make provision for the ³ regulation, control and management of horse racing and all matters directly or indirectly connected therewith in the 2 State of Bombay; It is hereby enacted as follows:—.

1. (1) This Act may be called the Bombay Race-courses Licensing Act, 1912.

Short title and extent.

(2) "[This section extends to the whole of the State of Bombay.] The rest of the Act extends only to such areas as the 5[6] State] Government] may by notification in the [Official Gazette] direct :

Sprovided that on the commencement of the Bombay Race-courses Licensing XLVIII and the Bombay Betting Tax Acts (Extension and Amendment) Act, 1958, 1958 the rest of the Act shall extend to those areas in which the Hyderabad Horse Hyd. Racing and Betting Tax Regulation, 1358F., was in force immediately before Reg. such commencement.] XLIX

2. In this Act-

Definitions.

- (a) "horse-race" means any race in which any horse, mare or gelding runs or is made to run in connection with any other horse, mare or gelding for any prize of what nature or kind soever, or for any bet or wager made or to be made in respect of any such horse, mare or gelding or the riders thereof, and at which more than twenty persons shall be present;
 - (b) "race-course" means any ground on which a horse-race can be held.
- 3. (1) No horse-race shall be held save on a race-course for which a licence for prohibition horse-racing granted in accordance with the provisions of this Act is in force.
 - (2) The terms of such licence shall be published in the [Official Gazette.]

4. (1) The owner, lessee or occupier of any race-course may apply to the for licence 1/2[State] Government] for a licence for horse-racing on such race-course.

- (2) The ¹[2[State] Government] may withhold such licence or grant it subject to licence for (2) The [15tate] Government may withink fit. *[Such conditions may horse-such conditions and for such period as *[it] may think fit. *[Such conditions may racing, provide for-
 - (a) the payment of a licence fee;
 - (b) the amount of stakes which may be allotted for different kinds of horses:
 - (c) the measures to be taken for the training of persons to become jockeys: and
 - (d) such other matters, whether directly or indirectly connected with horseracing, for which, in the opinion of the 2 State Government, it is necessary or expedient to make provision in the licence.]
 - ⁵(3) The ¹[2[State] Government] may by such licence authorize the licencee to grant, subject to such conditions as shall be specified by the 1[2[State] Government] in such licence, a licence or permit flto any book-maker to carry on his business or vocation or to act as a book-maker or turf commission agent in respect of horseraces held on a race-course, being a race-course which is situated in this State or outside it. The licence may be granted for such period not exceeding the period of the licence granted to the licensee as the licensee may think fit :1

Cancellation

7[(4)] The 1/2 [State] Government] may at any time cancel any licence granted of licence. under this section in the event of any breach of the conditions subject to which it was granted.

Penalty for race-course.

5. Whoever takes part in any horse-race on any race-course for which a licence taking part in granted in accordance with the provisions of section 4 is not in force shall be punishunlicensed able with fine which may amount to two hundred rupees.

Penalty for place.

6. If any horse-race is held on any race-course for which a licence granted in owner, etc., accordance with the provisions of section 4 is not in force, any person being the allowing above, leasee or occupier of such race-course shall be punishable with fine which unlicensed may amount to one thousand rupees.

Penalty for

7. 8[(1)] If any person to whom a licence has been granted in accordance with contravening the provisions of section 4 contravenes any of the conditions subject to which such conditions the provisions of section 4 contravenes any of the conditions subject to which such of licence, licence was granted, such person shall be punishable with fine which may amount to one thousand rupees.
