CONSTITUTION OF INDIA.

No. RTR 1185/1347(183)-II.—In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to article 309 of the Constitution of India and in supersession of all existing rules, orders or instruments made in this behalf and in force in the State or any part thereof, the Governor of Maharashtra is hereby pleased to make the following rules regulating recruitment to the post of Solicitor and Joint Secretary to Government, General State Service, Class-I in the Law and Judiciary Department of the Government of Maharashtra, namely:—

1. (1) These rules may be called the Solicitor and Joint Secretary to Government, in the Law and Judiciary Department (Recruitment) Rules, 1986. J.S.  
(2) They shall be deemed to have come into force on the 16 May 1985.
2. In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires,—
  - (a) "Additional Assistant Solicitor" means the Additional Assistant Solicitor and Deputy Secretary to Government in the Law and Judiciary Department;
  - (b) "Assistant Solicitor" means the Assistant Solicitor and Deputy Secretary to Government in the Law and Judiciary Department;
  - (c) "Commission" means the Maharashtra Public Service Commission;
  - (d) "Government" means Government of Maharashtra.
3. Appointment to the post of Solicitor and Joint Secretary shall be made either,—
  - (1) by promotion of a suitable person on the basis of selection from amongst the persons holding the posts of Assistant Solicitor or Additional Assistant Solicitor who is well-versed in conveyancing work, or

(2) by nomination from amongst candidates, who—

(a) unless already in the service of Government, are not more than 43 years of age ;

(b) have practised as Solicitors or Attorneys of the Supreme Court or of any High Court in India for not less than seven years ;

(c) are particularly well-versed in conveyancing work ; and

(d) have adequate knowledge of Marathi so as to be able to read, write and speak the language with facility :

Provided that, the age limit may be relaxed by Government on the recommendation of the Commission in favour of candidates having exceptional qualifications or experience or both :

Provided further that, preference may be given to a candidate having experience on practice and procedure in the Court of Small Causes, or the City Civil Court.

4. A person appointed to the post by nomination shall be on probation for a period of two years.

5. A person appointed to the post whether by promotion or by nomination shall be required to pass examinations in Hindi and Marathi according to the rules made in that behalf, unless he has already passed or has been exempted from passing these examinations.
