

### Action Plan

### (April 1,2024 to March 31, 2025)

The Constitution of India guarantees social, economic and political justice to all its citizens. A large section of the society is deprived of getting justice due to lack of proper knowledge of their rights, lack of economic resources and other adverse circumstances.

The objective of the action plan is to provide benefits to the backward and deprived people of the society under the schemes of NALSA, SLSA and government, to preserve and promote the environment, making people aware about their legal rights in order to enforce them and also to motivate the masses to perform the fundamental duties etc.

# Action plan specifically focused on the development and promotion of Scheduled Tribes

As per Census 2011, the total number of Scheduled Tribes was found to be 10,42,81, 034, which is 8.6 percent of the total population of the country. Among the tribal groups of India, some tribes because of their extreme vulnerability have been placed in the category of PVTGs (Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups). Tribal have been categorized on the basis of forest dependent livelihood, preagriculture standard of living, stable and declining population, low literacy rate and subsistence based economy, whose number at present is 75.

The population of Scheduled Tribes in Madhya Pradesh is 153.16 lakh (as per Census 2011) which is 21.10 percent of the total population of the state, thus Madhya Pradesh is the state in the country where every fifth person belongs to the Scheduled Tribes category. In Madhya Pradesh there are also tribes belonging to the PVTGs (Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups) as these are very sensitive tribes, therefore, there is a need to provide much attention on these tribes.

In Madhya Pradesh, there are three special backward tribes namely Bhariya, Baiga and Sahariya and these special backward tribes are particularly living in Mandla, Baihar (Balaghat), Dindori, Pushprajgarh (Anuppur), Shahdol, Umaria, Gwalior, Datia, Sheopur, Bhind, Morena, Shivpuri, Guna, Ashoknagar etc. Since these backward tribes are largely not part of the mainstream society due to which these tribes are deprived of their rights even today.

Lack of literacy among the tribals is a major problem, along with other legal problems including land problems, health problems, getting involved in unnecessary litigation due to ignorance of the law, being implicated in false crimes, being denied rights by the departments, etc. appropriate efforts are to be made in coordination with various departments to solve the problems by preparing a panel of para-legal volunteers from the tribal community and through legal aid clinics.

In view of the special situation of the Scheduled Tribes in M.P., the Tribes and Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forest Rights) Act, 2006 has been made effective.

Keeping in view the special situation of the Scheduled Tribes and their inclusion in the mainstream of the society, the action plan for the year 2024-2025 has been specially focused on the promotion and development of the Scheduled Tribes.

For the said purpose, a Special Action Plan for effective implementation of NALSA (Legal Services for Protection and Enforcement of Rights of Tribals) Scheme, 2015 along with other schemes will be prepared by the District Legal Services Authority for tribal dominated areas. This will include following points along with other aspects:-

• While visiting the tribal dominated area by the Secretary, District Legal Services Authority, clusters will be formed as per the local situation by coordinating with various local departments and at least one legal aid clinic will be set up for each cluster. As per the local situation.

Clusters will be formed with the objective of ensuring access to legal services to every village including Gram Panchayats / Villages as per convenience.

- During the visit of Secretary, District Legal Services Authority to the tribal dominated areas, a database will be prepared by identifying the problems of the common people.
- Proper efforts will be made to solve the problems identified by establishing coordination with the concerned departments.

In order to provide the benefits of the welfare schemes related to the tribal community and to inform tribes about the rights available to them under the law, etc., problem-solving sessions, awareness programs will be organized in coordination with the concerned departments in a time-bound manner covering the topics suitable to the local situation and need.

- According to the NALSA scheme, people belonging to tribal communities will be included as panel advocates and paralegal volunteers.
- In the programs organized for the tribal community participation of students of universities, colleges and schools etc. running under the district will be ensured. In these programmes the students of law universities and colleges can play a special role.
- Keeping in view the problems of a particular region, the program will be organized for the community in coordination and cooperation with Corporate Social Responsibility, NGOs and various departments.

Note: -Under National Legal Services Authority, Legal Services Clinics Regulation, 2011, and under Legal Aid Clinic, Paralegal Volunteers Scheme, the process of appointment, training, etc. of PLV will be done.

### Community Mediation Programme for tribal dominated areas

As per the resolution passed by the Main Mediation Monitoring Committee (MMMC) meeting dated 24 th February, 2022, "Madhya Pradesh Community Mediation Programme" was launched in the State of Madhya Pradesh. Under community mediation, volunteers sponsored by social groups such as Muslims, Christians, Sikhs, Jains, etc. are given 20 hours of training by the Madhya Pradesh State Legal Services Authority to mediate and settle disputes arising between parties in the society, in respect of which detailed guidelines have been issued earlier by the State Legal Services Authority.

## Forwarding steps in the field of community mediation with participation of various communities: -

At present, under community mediation, a total of 344 community mediation volunteers of 36 communities namely Nema, Gond, Jain, Kayastha, Yadav, Pasi, Katiya, Kshatriya, Muslim, Meena, Bengali, Brahmin, Bohra, Balmiki, Kori, Bairwa, Gujarati, Agrawal, Sikh, Gahoi, Ahirwar, Dasora, Sen, Christian, Jaiswal, Sindhu, Balai, Maheshwari, Majhi, Maharashtrian, Ravidas, Teli, Punjabi, Vaishya, Jatav, Sindhi from different districts of MP have been imparted 20 hours training by MP State Legal Services Authority. The mediation proceedings are being carried out by them acting as community mediation volunteers.

## Resolution of disputes arising in the tribal community through community mediation: -

It is the need of the hour that necessary efforts should also be made through community mediation to resolve the disputes arising among the tribals. Keeping this in mind, under the Madhya Pradesh Community Mediation Programme in every tribal dominated district, by setting up community mediation centers by training community mediation volunteers, at the beginning of the conflict between the people of the community, the conflict at the grassroots level can be resolved through community mediation volunteers (CMV) and harmony and peace can be established in the society.

In order to conduct the Madhya Pradesh Community Mediation Programme in tribal dominated districts and areas in a systematic manner, the District Legal Services Authority shall carry out the following activities: -

The Secretary, District Legal Services Authority and other officers will visit the tribal areas, establish contact with the local people according to the local conditions and inform them about the community mediation programme.

- Under the Madhya Pradesh Community Mediation Programme, a panel of Community Mediator volunteers (CMV) will be formed.
- While preparing the panel of Community Mediation volunteers, it will be taken care that volunteers from each area (District / Tehsil / Sub-Division / Gram Panchayat / Village) are available for mediation so that necessary action can be taken by them under the mediation programme at the local level.

- The District Legal Services Authority will complete the preparation of the panel of Community Mediator Volunteers from tribal areas by 31<sup>st</sup> May, 2024 and the list will be sent to the State Authority.
- After the State Authority receives the list of panel of mediators, necessary action will be taken to provide 20 hours training to the volunteers. The training will focus on the community concept, basic concepts for working as volunteers, principles and practice of mediation, etc.

**Note:** - All the activities related to community mediation will be conducted as per the direction of "Madhya Pradesh Community Mediation Programme.

#### Other activities carried out in accordance with the plan

The main objectives of the Legal Services Authority is to provide free legal aid, to spread legal literacy, to organize Lok Adalat, to encourage settlement of disputes by alternative means of redressal, to provide compensation to victims of crime etc.

Keeping in view the above objectives, the following activities are proposed to be organized under the Action Plan year 2024-25 along with other operational schemes and may also include schemes and instructions issued by National Legal Services Authority and State Legal Services Authorities etc. from time to time: -

Thereafter, the concerned District Legal Services Authority shall propose the schedule and date of the special camp and forward the same to the State Legal Services Authority, Jabalpur for approval.

After the approval of the framework, special camps will be organized under the joint aegis of the State Legal Services Authority and the respective District Legal Services Authorities to provide artificial limb transplantation and assistive devices for the benefit of Divyangjans.

As aforesaid other District Legal Services Authorities under their jurisdiction shall organise programmes for providing artificial limb transplantation and assistive devices for the benefit of Divyangians and shall be information in this regard communicated to the State Authority.

## 4) Effective implementation of NALSA (Legal Services for the Mentally III and Mentally Disabled) Scheme, 2015:

Under the Mental Healthcare Act, 2017, every individual has been provided with the right to access mental healthcare and treatment without discrimination on grounds of sex, religion, caste, disability or any other ground, which includes a under trial prisoner suffering from mental illness, or has been convicted and is detained in jail or prison.

Every District Legal Services Authority shall conduct special awareness campaigns under its territorial jurisdiction for persons suffering from mental health in the light of the said Scheme, 2015 and the Act, 2017, and organize health camps

at the interval of every three months, in which mental health specialists and other specialists will be present for providing health services.

After examining the prisoners by mental doctors necessary health facilities will be provided to the detained prisoners in the jail at regular intervals, in this regard necessary action may be taken by preparing a plan by the District Legal Services Authority after establishing coordination with the concerned departments. In case of serious mental illness of a detainee, the state authority shall also be informed to provide immediate medical attention.

#### Note: -

- 1. After ensuring the fulfillment of the target set as above ,the monthly progress sheet of the schemes will be send by the District Legal Services Authority and the Tehsil Legal Services Committees as per the pre-determined instructions.
- 2. Payments of office schemes and all office expenses should be made regularly every month and the payments to be remitted to M.P. State Legal Services Authority, Jabalpur should also be verified and remitted to this office in a time bound manner as per rules.
- 3. Regarding wide publicity of the activities steps may be taken by each District Legal Services Authority by creating profiles on YouTube, Twitter, Facebook and other social media. Radio, short film creation, and other similar mediums may also be used in an appropriate manner for propagation.
- 4. At least one camp must be organized under all the schemes of NALSA including 01 or more schemes of NALSA in the said camps.
- 5. The camps to be held at the district headquarters level will focus more on local issues and will be held after wide publicity. For this, the cooperation of panel advocates and N.G.O. paralegal volunteers of the concerned district and tehsil will be taken.

### Guidelines for implementation of the Action Plan:-

- 1. For the implementation of the action plan, an advance action plan will be prepared by the District Legal Services Authority for the activities mentioned in the action plan for each month in advance and the program will be organized by informing all the concerned departments etc. according to the action plan.
- 2. Coordination must be established with all the concerned government departments, voluntary organizations, other stakeholders and discussions should be held with them. Their full cooperation can be taken with mutual consent in the activities, in accordance with the action plan as per local conditions to ensure practical results.
- 3. The programme mentioned in the action plan for which the date has not been fixed, the District Legal Services Authority may take action in accordance with the local conditions by fixing the date of the programme etc. for the activities mentioned in the action plan.
- 4. In case there is a need to change the date fixed earlier in the action plan to suit the local situation, the new date may be fixed by considering the overall circumstances and informing the State Legal Services Authority Jabalpur by the Hon'ble Chairman / Principal District Judge, District Legal Services Authority and information about the post-programme activities may be sent as per the earlier direction.
- 5. Information about the program to be organized as per the Action Plan 2024-25 will be sent to the State Legal Services Authority by 01st of every month along with brief details which may include success stories, photographs, newspaper cuttings etc.
