AGREEMENT

BETWEEN

The Ministry of New and Renewable Energy, Government of India

AND

The University of Saskatchewan, Canada

ON

INDO-CANADIAN RENEWABLE ENERGY COOPERATION

The Ministry of New and Renewable Energy, Government of India and the University of Saskatchewan, Canada; hereinafter referred to as "the parties" having identified new and renewable energy as a common area of interest to establish New and Renewable Energy Cooperation between Ministry of New and Renewable Energy, Government of India and University of Saskatchewan, Canada with the aim to strengthen cooperation in research, design and development of new and renewable energy technologies, HAVE AGREED as follows:

WORKING GROUP

In order to coordinate the above-mentioned activities and to decide upon project proposals related to research, design and development of various new and renewable energy technologies, the Parties intend to establish a "Working Group" with the objectives of:

- Identifying areas of mutual interest and cooperation for development of new and renewable energy technologies, systems, sub-systems, devices, components, etc.
- Monitoring and evaluating cooperation activities.

The Working Groups will be headed by the Joint Secretary of the Ministry of New and Renewable Energy, India and The Vice President Research, University of Saskatchewan, Canada, respectively. The Working Group shall meet twice a year alternately in India and Canada for the aforesaid activities.

The Working Groups can co-opt members from other scientific and technical institutions, research centres or any other related entity/organization, as and when considered essential.

The present Agreement can be amended by the Parties through Exchange of Note-Verbal. The amendments shall be enclosed alongwith the present agreement and shall form an integral part of it thereof.

The Agreement shall enter into force on the date of signing.
