

10. Pradhan Mantri National Dialysis Programme (PMNDP)

The Pradhan Mantri National Dialysis Programme (PMNDP) is a flagship initiative of the Indian government to provide free dialysis services to Below Poverty Line (BPL) patients suffering from End-Stage Renal Disease (ESRD) across the country. Launched in 2016 under the National Health Mission (NHM), the PMNDP has made significant progress in expanding access to affordable dialysis care for those in need.

Key Achievements

- **Expanded Dialysis Capacity:** The PMNDP has significantly increased the availability of dialysis services by establishing new dialysis centres and upgrading existing facilities. As of November 2023, over 1,431 dialysis centres with 9,684 Dialysis Machines have been established across the country under the program.
- **Enhanced Accessibility:** The PMNDP has ensured that free dialysis services are readily accessible to BPL patients in their districts, reducing the need for long-distance travel and associated costs.
- **Improved Patient Outcomes:** The availability of free dialysis services has positively impacted the survival rates and quality of life for ESRD patients.
- **Reduced Financial Burden:** The PMNDP has alleviated the financial burden on BPL families struggling with the high costs of private dialysis services.

Impact in Terms of Numbers

- **Number of Dialysis Centers:** Over 1,431 dialysis centres have been established across the country under the PMNDP, significantly expanding dialysis capacity.

- **Number of Beneficiaries:** Over 21.06 lakh beneficiaries have availed dialysis services under the PMNDP since its inception, demonstrating the program's reach and impact.
- **Number of Dialysis Sessions:** Over 238.57 Lakhs dialysis sessions have been provided under the PMNDP, highlighting the program's effectiveness in addressing the needs of ESRD patients.
- **Financial Savings:** The PMNDP has saved over ₹3,500 crore (US\$440 million) for BPL families by providing free dialysis services.
