Overview

The **Composite Regional Centre for Skill Development, Rehabilitation, and Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (CRCSRE) – Guwahati** successfully organized an **Assessment Camp cum Awareness Program for Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan)** on **18th July 2025** at **Morigaon Town Higher Secondary School**, Morigaon District, Assam. The initiative was conducted under the leadership and guidance of **Dr. P. K. Lenka**, Director, CRCSRE Guwahati.

Inaugural Session

The camp was inaugurated in the esteemed presence of the following dignitaries:

All speakers highlighted the importance of inclusive policies, early intervention, and the availability of accessible rehabilitation services for Divyangjan.

Target Beneficiaries

The camp catered primarily to beneficiaries from Gharbhanga Block, Morigaon District. The objective was to reach rural populations, raise awareness, and deliver essential rehabilitation and support services.

Awareness Generation Session:

A total of **85 participants**, including **Anganwadi Workers, parents, and guardians**, took part in the awareness session. Discussions focused on:

- The **21 recognized disability categories** under the **RPwD Act, 2016**
- Importance of **early identification and timely intervention**
- Awareness of **rights, entitlements**, and **central government schemes** for persons with disabilities

Participants actively engaged in the session, acknowledging the role of community workers in identifying and supporting Divyangjan

Assessment Services Provided

In assessment part, total 137 Divyangjans have been assessed under different sections viz. UDID (66), Skill Development (14), NDFDC Loan (4), NIRAMAYA (3), P&O & ADIP (63), Speech & Hearing (35), O&M (18), PT (72), OT (67), Special Education (42), and Clinical Psychology (51).

Key Outcomes and Focus Areas

The camp served as a platform to:

- Evaluate feasibility for community-level sensitization
- Promote door-to-door rehabilitation services in remote areas

The event was conducted in collaboration with the Directorate of Social Welfare, Government of Assam, and actively supported on the ground by local CDPOs, supervisors, and Anganwadi Workers (AWWs).
