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The Composite Regional Centre for Skill Development, Rehabilitation and Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (CRCSRE), Guwahati, under the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities, Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India, organized a **Screening Assessment cum UDID Camp** on **22nd July 2025**. This initiative was carried out in collaboration with **The Hans Foundation** at **Jatiya Vidyalaya Bhalukamuri School, Baksa District**, with the aim of reaching out to persons with disabilities (PwDs) in rural and underserved areas.

## **Objective**

The primary objectives of the camp were to:

- Conduct comprehensive screening and assessment of individuals with disabilities.
- Evaluate needs for rehabilitation and assistive devices.
- Facilitate disability certification and UDID (Unique Disability ID) registration.
- Provide counseling and guidance regarding government schemes and entitlements.
- Raise awareness about the rights and benefits available to persons with disabilities under various government initiatives.

## **Activities and Services Provided**

Under the expert supervision and guidance of **Dr. P. K. Lenka**, Director, CRCSRE Guwahati, the camp offered the following services:

- **Screening and Disability Assessment** by qualified professionals.
- **Needs Assessment** for appropriate assistive devices.
- **Counseling Services** for PwDs and their families.
- **Information Dissemination** on rights, entitlements, and welfare schemes.
- **Support for UDID Registration and Certification Process.**

## Beneficiaries

A total of **34 individuals with disabilities** were screened and assessed during the camp. Each beneficiary received personalized attention and evaluation to ensure that their specific rehabilitation and support needs were properly addressed.

## Conclusion

The camp successfully fulfilled its objective of extending outreach services to PwDs in remote areas. It not only addressed the immediate rehabilitation needs of the participants but also played a pivotal role in creating awareness about disability rights and available governmental support
