

REPORT ON ONE-DAY AWARENESS CUM ASSESSMENT CAMP FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES (PwDs)

1. Name of the Programme

One-Day Awareness cum Assessment Camp for Persons with Disabilities (PwDs)

3. Organizing Authority

The **Composite Regional Centre for Skill Development, Rehabilitation and Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (CRCSRE) – Guwahati**, under the **Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment**, Government of India, in collaboration with **Barak Vision NGO**.

4. Objective of the Programme

The primary objective of the camp was to:

- Create awareness about various disabilities
- Sensitize beneficiaries about Government of India welfare schemes
- Assess Persons with Disabilities for identification and recommendation of suitable aids and assistive devices
- Promote inclusion, rehabilitation, and empowerment of PwDs

5. Guidance & Supervision

The programme was conducted under the guidance and supervision of **Dr. L. W. Aimol**, Director, CRCSRE Guwahati.

6. Inaugural Session

The camp was inaugurated by **Kamalakhya Dey Purkayastha**, Hon'ble MLA, Karimganj North. During the inaugural session, the importance of early identification, rehabilitation services, and government support systems for PwDs was highlighted.

7. Awareness Session

After the inaugural programme, rehabilitation professionals from CRC Guwahati delivered awareness sessions on:

- Various categories of disabilities
- Rights of Persons with Disabilities
- Government schemes including ADIP and RVY
- Importance of assistive devices and rehabilitation services

8. Assessment & Participation

A total of **187 Persons with Disabilities** were assessed during the camp by a multidisciplinary team of rehabilitation professionals from:

- CRC Guwahati
- **National Career Service for Differently Abled (NCS-DA) Guwahati**
- **Bhagwan Mahavir Viklang Sahayata Sansthan (BMVSS)**



Eligible beneficiaries were recommended appropriate aids and appliances based on individual assessment.

- Identification and assessment of unmet rehabilitation needs
- Recommendation of appropriate assistive devices
- Increased awareness about disability rights and government schemes
- Strengthened coordination among rehabilitation agencies
