INTRODUCTION

Rehabilitation for Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan) is related to a range of measures from interventions to improve body function for social inclusion and integration. As per Article 26, United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (UNCRPD) defines rehabilitation as "appropriate measures, including through peer support, to enable persons with disabilities to attain and maintain their maximum independence, full physical, mental, social and vocational ability, and full inclusion and participation in all aspects of life". It is estimated that in India, 2.21% of total population, around 2.68 corers have one or other form of disability. The Constitution of India ensures equality, freedom, justice and dignity of all individuals and implicitly mandates an inclusive society for all including Persons with special abilities. In the recent years, there have been vast and positive changes in the perception of the society towards persons with disabilities. It has been realized that a majority of differently abeled can lead a better quality of life if they have equal opportunities and effective access to rehabilitation measures. The services of Physiotherapy, Occupational Therapy, Prosthetic & Orthotic, Communication therapy/Speech-Language Therapy, Audiological intervention professionals along with other medical & paramedical professionals are essential at different stage to prevent, manage disability and their rehabilitation.

DISABILITY HAS BEEN BROADLY GROUPED AS:

The number of recognized disability conditions has been increased from 7 to 21 in the RPwD Act 2016. Following are the disability conditions included in the RPwD Act 2016:

1. Blindness
2. Low-vision
3. Leprosy Cured persons
4. Hearing Impairment (deaf and hard of hearing)
5. Locomotor Disability
6. Dwarfism
7. Intellectual Disability
8. Mental Illness
9. Autism Spectrum Disorder
10. Cerebral Palsy
11. Muscular Dystrophy
12. Chronic Neurological conditions
13. Specific Learning Disabilities
14. Multiple Sclerosis
15. Speech and Language disability
16. Thalassaemia
17. Hemophilia
18. Sickle Cell disease
19. Multiple Disabilities including deaf-blindness
20. Acid Attack victim
21. Parkinson's disease

Although Government, NGOs and some civil society Institutions have been providing services to the persons with disabilities since long, but these efforts have gained momentum since 1970's, when the decade was marked by a new approach to disability with the concept of "Rights for Disabled Persons". The United Nations took the lead and issued declarations relating to Rights to the Disabled Persons (1975). The 1983-92 was declared as the "Decade of the Disabled Persons". This was followed by the "Asia and Pacific Decade of Disabled Persons" (1993-2002). The standard rules for the equalization of opportunities for persons with disabilities were adopted by the UN General Assembly in 1993.

In 1995, Indian Parliament introduced "Persons with Disabilities (Equal Opportunities, Protection of Rights and Full Participation) Act" 1995, is adopted by all the states and union territories. The act defines the responsibilities of the central and state Governments regard to the services to the persons with disabilities. It mandates affirmative action for ensuring useful life to disabled person and refers to the need for action on prevention of disability, provision of medical and other services to minimize the impact of impairment on account of diseases & accidents etc. It also refers to rehabilitation through education, vocational training, barrier free environments, assistive aids and other interventions. In 2016, Country finally witnessed the much awaited Rights of Persons with Disabilities (RPwD) Bill on 14th December, 2016 in the Rajya Sabha and subsequently in the Lok Sabha on 16th December, 2016. The Bill was further approved and signed by the Hon'ble President and 'notified' by the Government in its official Gazette on 28th December, 2016. Thus, RPWD Bill 2016 was 'enacted' and became a 'LAW', the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (RPWD) Act, 2016. It covers 21 categories of disabilities from the previous 7 categories under the 1995 Act, this new Act lays complete emphasis on one's rights – right to equality and opportunity, right to inherit and own property, right to home and family and reproductive rights among others. Unlike the 1995 Act, the new Act talks about accessibility - setting a two-year deadline for the government to ensure that persons with disabilities get barrier-free access to physical infrastructure and transport systems. Additionally, it will also hold the private sector accountable. This also includes educational institutions 'recognized' by the government such as privately owned universities and colleges. A path-breaking feature of the new Act is the increase in reservation in government & private jobs from 3% to 4%. Govt. of India has established several National Institutes to train professionals/manpower in the field of rehabilitation. National Institutes are Autonomous bodies established for different types of disabilities. The following National Institutes are engaged in Human Resources Development in the field of disability, providing rehabilitation services to the persons with disabilities and Research and Development efforts:-

- (i) Pt. Deendayal Upadhyaya National Institute for Persons with Physical Disabilities (PDUNIPPD), Delhi
- (ii) National Institute for Locomotor Disabilities (NILD), Kolkata
- (iii) National Institute for Empowerment of Persons with Multiple Disabilities (NIEPMD), Chennai
- (iv) Swami Vivekanand National Institute of the Rehabilitation Training and Research (SVNIRTAR), Cuttack
- (v) Ali Yavar Jung National Institute of Speech and Hearing Disabilities (AYJNISHD), Mumbai
- (vi) National Institute for the Empowerment of Persons with Visual Disabilities (NIEPVD), Dehradun
- (vii) National Institute for the Empowerment of Persons with Intellectual Disabilities (NIEPID), Secunderabad
- (viii) Indian Sign Language Research & Training Centre (ISLRTC), New Delhi
- (ix) National Institute of Mental Health and Rehabilitation (NIMHR), Sehore, Madhya Pradesh
- (x) Atal Bihari Vajpayee Training Centre for Disability Sports, Gwalior.

These Institutes are conducting training programs at Certificate, Diploma, Degree and Postgraduate levels in their respective disciplines. The Institutes also carry out research; develop models of rehabilitation service, manpower development, and clinical & therapeutic service. They also have extensive outreach programs so that services are available in a decentralized manner. Over the years, the Institutes have trained thousands of professionals who are in their careers in the Country and abroad. In addition to above, the Ministry has also established Composite Regional Centers, District Disability Rehabilitation Centre, supporting to voluntary action programs and National Program for Rehabilitation of Persons with Disabilities under state sector scheme. 1. TRAINING PROGRAMMES

The Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment supports manpower development in the field of rehabilitation through National Institutes, who are offering a number of courses for which All India Entrance Test is being conducted. Amongst them, some are in the area of:

- (i) Physiotherapy
- (ii) Occupational Therapy
- (iii) Prosthetics & Orthotics
- (iv) Audiology and Speech Language Pathology

1.1 PHYSIOTHERAPY

Physiotherapy practice spans health promotion, prevention, and rehabilitation across the lifespan, enhancing overall quality of life. Physiotherapists serve as first-contact providers for individuals with impairments or functional limitations and collaborate closely with other healthcare professionals.

Physiotherapy is a healthcare profession dedicated to the comprehensive assessment, investigation, treatment, and guidance of individuals experiencing movement or functional difficulties. Practitioners establish functional diagnoses and design individualized treatment plans to address dysfunction, disability, pain, and healing needs arising from trauma or disease. They employ a wide range of therapeutic methods, including exercise, mobilization, manual techniques, electrical and thermal agents, and electrodiagnostic interventions such as electromyography (EMG) and nerve conduction studies (NCV). Advanced rehabilitation technologies, including isokinetic systems and functional electrical stimulation (FES), are also utilized.

Opportunities for higher education and research exist across specialties such as musculoskeletal science, neuroscience, cardiopulmonary science, sports science, pediatrics and neonatology, obstetrics and gynecology, oncology, and community physiotherapy. Physiotherapists work in diverse settings, including hospitals, private clinics, nursing homes, occupational health centers, outpatient clinics, home-based care, sports and fitness facilities, special schools, senior citizen centers, and community rehabilitation or disaster relief programs.

1.2 OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY

Occupational Therapy aims to provide therapeutic and functional management to the disabling medical conditions (physical and mental) so as to enable the clients to perform maximum possible function independently viz. daily living activities, play, performance at the work place through sensory integration therapy, work simulators, therapeutic activities, and other advanced rehabilitation technologies. In occupational therapy, modified, adaptive/assistive & supportive devices are also developed and used to make the life more independent, productive and dignified.

As an indispensable member of a medical/rehabilitation team, one find a wide scope in various hospitals, NGOs, paediatric hospitals, psychiatric centers, industrial setups, educational institutions, sports industries, homes for aged, reconstructive/plastic surgery and leprosy rehabilitation centers etc. The community based rehabilitation is another area where occupational therapy is being recognized as an important component.

A successful candidate has job opportunities as therapist in Government & NGOs, self-employment, consultant/advisor in industrial & educational institutions etc. in the country & abroad.

The avenues for higher studies in occupational therapy are in the specialties like Rehabilitation, Orthopedics, Hand Rehabilitation, Paediatrics/Developmental Disabilities, Neurology, Psychiatry etc.

1.3 PROSTHETICS & ORTHOTICS

Prosthesis is an artificial replacement or substitute for a lost part of a limb amputates due to congenital or acquired causes. The profession got its recognition more in early seventies in post war era. This was due to the sudden increase in number of war victims amputees requiring fitments of artificial limbs (Prosthesis).

Orthosis is a device applied over body to the individual to support, maintain or correct the deformity in a weakened part of body. It may also be applied with the additional objective to assist, allow or restrict movement of joint of the body in different orthopaedic, neurological, pediatric & sports injury condition. Orthotics is the practice to design & fabricate the orthoses.

After successful completion of the course, a student may get placement as a Prosthetist/Orthotist in Rehabilitation Centres, Hospitals, Trauma Centres, Multinational Companies and Manufactures, Academic Institution and Self employment, in Government and Non-Government sector in the country and abroad.

The avenues for higher studies & research in the area of Prosthetics and Orthotics are enormous.

1.4 AUDIOLOGY AND SPEECH LANGUAGE PATHOLOGY

Bachelor in Audiology and Speech Language Pathology (BASLP) is a 4 years program that aims to equip the students with knowledge and skills to function as Audiologist and Speech Language Pathologist. The program promotes understanding of communication, speech, language, & hearing in both normal and persons with communication disorders and /disabilities. An Audiologist and Speech language pathologist (ASLP) assess, diagnose and provide intervention (non-medically) to an array of speech, language, hearing and swallowing disorders. An ASLP offers clinical services to clients of all ages (from newborn to geriatric population). The clinical population includes person with hearing loss, balance disorders, tinnitus, voice disorder, stuttering, speech sound disorder, receptive and expressive language disorder, language disorder associated with intellectual disability, autism, cerebral palsy, learning disability, and multiple disabilities, adults with language loss (aphasia) and neurogenic speech disorder (dysarthria) and swallowing disorders (dysphagia).

Audiologist and Speech Language Pathologist provides services in a variety of settings, such as Health care settings (including hospitals, clinics, nursing homes, medical rehabilitation centres, mental health facilities), Regular and special schools, Early intervention programs/ multidisciplinary rehabilitation centres, Industrial settings, Hearing aid and cochlear implant manufactures, Manufactures of devices/prosthesis for individuals with communication and swallowing disorders, Universities/ colleges, State and central government agencies and institutions, Research centres and Private practice setting.

2. INSTITUTES UNDER CET-2026

National Institutes offering said courses were established as Autonomous Bodies under Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan), Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Govt. of India in early eighties with the following aims and objectives.

2.1 Pandit Deendayal Upadhyaya National Institute for Persons with Physical Disabilities (Divyangjan), (PDUNIPPD), New Delhi

PDUNIPPD is an autonomous organization under the administrative and financial control of Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (DIVYANGJAN), Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Government of India. Originally, the Institute for the Physically Handicapped was registered as society in the year 1976 under the societies Registration Act of 1860. It was rechristened as Pandit Deendayal Upadhyaya National Institute for Persons with Physical Disabilities (Divyangjan), PDUNIPPD, New Delhi in 2016.

PDUNIPPD is located in the heart of New Delhi, the capital city of India. It is committed for developing skilled manpower to serve Persons with Disabilities (PwDs) by offering Bachelor's and Master's programs in Physiotherapy, Occupational Therapy, and Prosthetics. 2.4 Swami Vivekanand National Institute of Rehabilitation Training and Research (Divyangjan), (SVNIRTAR), Cuttack

SVNIRTAR is located in Olatpur, PO-Bairoi, in the District of Cuttack, Odisha 30 Kms away from Cuttack and Bhubaneswar. The pilgrimage centre of Puri is also nearby. The Institute is conducting Bachelors Degree Programs in Physiotherapy, Occupational Therapy, Prosthetics & Orthotics and Audiology & Speech Language Pathology. SVNIRTAR also conducts Postgraduate courses like Diplomate in National Board (DNB) in Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation, Master of Physiotherapy, Occupational Therapy and Prosthetics & Orthotics. DISLI course of 02 years duration, CBS Course with 01 Year duration, CBID Course with 06 month duration and CCCGP course of 06 months duration are also being conducted at this Institute. Regional Centres of the institute have been established in Kolkata (1984), New Delhi (1986), Secunderabad (1986) and Bhubaneswar (1986- in association with the Government of Orissa). These are centres aimed at meeting local and regional needs in terms of manpower development and services. Regional Centre in New Delhi has been shifted to Noida in 2015 and the Regional Centre at Bhubaneswar has been shifted to Janla in 2008. The Institute offers a wide range of professional programmes, including Ph.D. in Audiology and Speech-Language Pathology, Ph.D. in Special Education, Bachelor's degree programmes in Audiology and Speech-Language Pathology, Master of Science in Audiology, Master of Science in Speech-Language Pathology, B.Ed. Composite Regional Centre for Skill Development, Rehabilitation & Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities, Guwahati is an initiative of Govt. of India, Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment. The centre is located at Guwahati Medical College & Hospital (GMCH) Campus, Bhangagarh, Guwahati, Assam 781032. It provides comprehensive rehabilitation services at the centre and through extended services (Identification, assessment and distribution camps) to the PWDs. The centre also conducts various courses in the field of disabilities. Presently, the centre is running Bachelor in Audiology & Speech Language Pathology. 2.7 Composite Regional Centre for Skill Development, Rehabilitation & Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan), (CRC), Patna

Composite Regional Centre for Skill Development, Rehabilitation & Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (CRC Patna) functions under the administrative control of National Institute for Locomotor Disabilities, Kolkata under the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities, Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India. It was established in 2009, and its permanent building was inaugurated in July, 2018 by Dr. Thawarchand Gehlot (Former Hon'ble Cabinet Minister of Social Justice & Empowerment). The centre caters to the rehabilitation needs of Persons with Disabilities (PwDs) in Bihar and neighbouring regions by providing comprehensive services including clinical, educational, and vocational interventions, along with training and awareness programs. **CRC Patna also has hostel facilities for students with an intake capacity of 100.**

- EWS Certificate Issued by competent authority (For Candidates seeking EWS Reservation) issued on or after **01 April-2025** will be accepted. EWS certificate issued before will not be accepted.
- Residence/Domicile/Nativity certificate (For Candidates seeking Reservation under NE & JK Category)
- CWAPP supporting document: As per policy of Kendriya Sainik Board (KSB), Ministry of Defence or Welfare and Rehabilitation Board (WARB) Ministry of Home Affairs

All the Admit cards will be available at PDUNIPPD website by **10.06.2026**. The candidates have to download and print the admit card from the PDUNIPPD website which must be endorsed by the Invigilator of the examination centre for allowing the candidate to appear in the exam.

- a. If an applicant fails to take print out of Admit Card from the PDUNIPPD website for the CET-2026 or desires to change any information printed on the Admit card, then he/ she may contact DEPARTMENT OF ACADEMICS, PDUNIPPD office immediately by email & mobile numbers available in cover page well in advance before Entrance Test.
- b. The candidate should carry a proof of identity along with the Admit Card.

11. METHOD OF SELECTION & COUNSELLING/ADMISSION

11.1 Merit list/ Waiting list will be generated on the basis of marks obtained in the Common Entrance Test-2026.

The result and schedule of online B-counseling will be available on the website <https://pdunippd.nic.in> by stipulated date. The candidates are advised to appear for Document verification and admission/counseling based on result published on website.

11.2 Merit List

The admission will be made strictly on the basis of merit of the eligible candidates determined by the marks obtained in CET-2026.

In case of two or more candidates obtaining equal marks in the CET-2026, the inter-se-merit of candidates will be determined according to the following criteria:-

- i. The candidates getting higher marks for Biology/ Mathematics in CET-2026 shall rank higher in the merit list.
- ii. In case of tie in (i) above, the candidates securing higher marks in Chemistry in CET-2026 shall rank higher.
- iii. In case of tie in (i & ii) above, then the candidate getting higher marks in Physics in CET-2026 shall rank higher.
- iv. In case of tie in (i), (ii) & (iii) above, the candidate getting higher marks in 10+2 shall rank higher.
- v. In case of tie in (i), (ii), (iii) & (iv) above, the candidate elder in age shall rank higher.

As the merit list will be generated based on the marks secured in qualifying examination and date of birth (in case of tie) as provided by candidate during submission of application form, the candidate will lose the right for admission if the information provided is found to be incorrect during document verification.

11.3 CHOICE LOCKING, SEAT ALLOTMENT, AND DOCUMENT VERIFICATION

Merit list for CET-2026 will be published on the stipulated date. All candidates irrespective of their Rank are required to login the website <https://pdunippd.nic.in> for Registration and CHOICE FILLING & LOCKING for choice of Course/Institute as per the date mentioned, failing which the Candidate will not be allotted any seat during seat allotment process. THIS IS ONE TIME. Candidates are advised to fill choices in the order of preference taking course/Institute (Minimum 1 and Maximum 15 choices) into consideration and submit maximum number of choices in order to avoid un-allocation.

After completion of choice locking period, seat allocation will be done by the system considering merit rank, reservation rule, availability of seat, and choices filled. System will allocate the best possible preference of choice from the list of choices submitted by the candidate. Once seat allotment result is declared, candidates can login to the admission portal and complete the following activities:

- a. View seat allotment
- b. Pay part admission/ Seat allotment fee of Rs. 10,000.00 towards confirmation of allotted seat (Not applicable for UDID Card holders) (to be adjusted or deducted from admission fees of respective Institute).
- c. The amount shall be partially refunded to the candidate after deduction of processing fee
 - i. If the candidate not attended for certificate verification on the stipulated date.
 - ii. If leaves the course during admission/counseling process
- d. The amount shall be forfeited, if the documents provided by the candidate mismatch during physical verification at respective Institute.
- e. Willingness for Seat Up-gradation or Freeze.

All the candidates who have completed the above steps will be called to the Institute for document verification. The candidate must be physically available at the Institute with all original documents on the date of document verification. Allotted Candidates who will not complete the above activities within the scheduled date/time, their allocated seat will be cancelled and they will not take part in further round of seat allocation.

During document verification, if there is change in profile of candidate i.e. change of domicile, social category (SC/ST/OBC/EWS), special reservation (PwBD/NE/JK/ CWAPP/STNA) and it affects seat allocation, the allotted seat will be cancelled, candidate's profile will be updated and he/she will be considered in subsequent rounds of seat allotment with updated profile only. Any reservation category i.e. SC, ST, OBC, EWS, PwBD, NE, JK, CWAPP, STNA cannot be added during this period as it will affect the overall rank.

On successful document verification for a candidate, he/ she will have to pay the remaining balance amount (Not applicable for UDID Card holders), through Debit Card/ Credit Card/ Internet Banking/UPI/ Wallet/ Challan, to confirm the admission process within the stipulated period of time, on the day of counselling. Once the Balance Admission Fee is paid online, the candidate must take a print-out of Admission Fee Payment Receipt for future references

A candidate, who fails to enrol or register or appear in e-counselling process on the notified date and time, shall forfeit his/her claim for a seat.

The candidates offered admission would have to deposit caution money. However, if a student discontinues on his/her own reason before completion of the course, the caution money deposited by the candidate will be refunded after recovering the losses/damages in Hostel/Institute and upon submission of clearance Certificate obtaining at the time of withdrawal from Course.

14. HOSTEL ACCOMODATION

Limited separate hostel facilities for boys & girls are available in the Institutes. Only girls hostel is available at PDUNIPPD, New Delhi and NIEPMD (D), Chennai. 15. INTERNSHIP

The successful student has to undergo compulsory Internship as per rule of the respective University/ National Commission for Allied Health and Professionals (NCAHP), Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI). During this period a student is required to work in accredited hospitals, rehabilitation organizations in rural area/district centres as allotted. He/she may be paid stipend as per norms of the concerned Institute. The internship is part of training and mandatory for award of degree and candidate has to abide all disciplinary rules of institute during this period as well.

16. DEGREE OFFERED

On successful completion of the course, the concerned University will issue Degree/ Marks certificate for Bachelor of Physiotherapy (BPT), Bachelor of Occupational Therapy (BOT), Bachelor of Prosthetics & Orthotics (BPO) and Bachelor of Audiology and Speech Language Pathology (BASLP) courses.

17. ATTENDANCE

Students will have to fulfill criteria as per respective University norms.

18. DISCIPLINE

The candidates admitted shall follow strict discipline in the campus and hostel. Students are expected to maintain decorum, decency, stipulated dress code and disciplined behavior throughout their pursuance of the course.

19. REFUND

In the event of the candidate withdrawing from the course, the entire fee and deposits (except Caution Money) paid at the time of admission shall stand forfeited. In addition, any sums expended by the Institute in training the candidate shall be deposited by the candidate as per the terms and conditions of the concerned Institute.
