An Act further to amend the Constitution of India.

BE it enacted by Parliament in the Thirty-fifth Year of the Republic of India as follows:-

1. Short title.-This Act may be called the Constitution (Forty-eighth Amendment) Act, 1984.

Amendment article 356.-In article 356 the Constitution. 2. of of in clause (5). the following proviso shall be inserted at the end namely:-
