1. Introduction

A CPR (Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation) Training Session was organized to enhance life-saving skills among participants and to empower individuals to act swiftly and effectively during cardiac emergencies. The session aimed to provide both theoretical knowledge and hands-on experience, enabling attendees to respond with confidence in real-life situations.

This program was successfully coordinated by **Sh**. **Ravi Bandi, Scientist-C & Welfare Officer, NIC Telangana,** received an overwhelming response from employees.

2. Guests and Facilitators

The event commenced with a warm welcome to **Dr. Shekar Reddy**, Head of the Emergency Department, KIMS Hospitals, and his expert medical team. The session was officially inaugurated by **K. The training was facilitated by certified trainers from KIMS Hospitals, bringing extensive expertise and practical insights.





Training Content

The CPR Training Program included:

- **CPR for All Ages** covering infants, children, and adults
- Emergency Response understanding immediate steps during cardiac arrest situations
- Hands-on Learning practical demonstrations using CPR manikins
- Guidance on safety measures and the importance of timely medical intervention
- A special segment of the training focused on Choking and the Automated External
 Defibrillator (AED) a portable device used to restore normal heart rhythm during sudden
 cardiac arrest. Participants were shown how to operate the AED, recognize when it should be
 used, and integrate it effectively with CPR techniques. This practical exposure aimed to ensure
 that attendees could confidently handle the device in a real emergency until professional
 medical help arrives.
- The trainers emphasized that "Safety Starts with You", underscoring the role of community awareness in preventing fatalities. Participants were encouraged to practice the techniques repeatedly for better retention and readiness.
