1. Legal Awareness Campaign

Venue :Hmunsam Kohhran Hall
Date :10th November, 2025

A Legal Awareness Campaign on '*Anti-Drug Campaign with Special Reference to NALSA (DAWN – Drug Awareness and Wellness Navigation) Scheme, 2025*' was organized at Hmunsam Kohhran Hall on 10th November, 2025.

The programme featured **Dr. Lalrinfela H., Medical Superintendent of District Hospital Mamit**, as the resource person. He emphasized the harmful consequences of drug abuse and underscored the significance of prevention and rehabilitation.

The campaign sought to educate the community—particularly the youth—about the risks associated with substance abuse while promoting a healthy and productive lifestyle. A total of **90 participants** attended and actively engaged in the awareness session.

The initiative effectively disseminated crucial information on drug prevention and strengthened the collective resolve to build a drug-free society.



2. Outreach Campaign

Visit to Kawtethawveng Legal Aid Clinic cum Legal Awareness Campaign on various NALSA's Schemes, 2025

An outreach programme was organized at Kawrtethawveng on 14th November 2025, which included a visit to the **Legal Aid Clinic** and a **Legal Awareness Campaign** focusing on various NALSA's Schemes, 2025. The Para Legal Volunteers (PLVs) from Kawrtethawveng village extended a warm welcome to the Officials from District Court, Mamit and actively participated in an interactive session. The visit provided an opportunity to interact with the local community and assess the functioning of the Legal Aid Clinic, ensuring that free legal services are accessible to those in need.

The awareness session was led by **Shri. H. Vanlallawmzuala, Advocate** who served as the resource person. He highlighted the objectives of NALSA's schemes, explained the importance of legal aid in safeguarding rights, and encouraged the community to utilize the services available through the clinic. His address emphasized the role of legal awareness in empowering citizens, particularly marginalized groups, to seek justice and resolve disputes effectively.

Community members actively participated in the campaign, raising questions and sharing their experiences. The programme successfully strengthened public understanding of legal rights, promoted awareness of welfare schemes, and reinforced the significance of the Legal Aid Clinic as a vital support mechanism for the people of Kawrtethawveng. A total of **120 participants** attended and actively engaged in the awareness session.



3. Legal Awareness Campaign

The programme aimed at safeguarding the rights and welfare of elderly citizens. The campaign was graced by **Smti. Lalrinchhani, Advocate**, who served as the Resource Person. She emphasized the importance of legal awareness regarding the responsibilities of children and relatives towards their parents and highlighted the support mechanisms available under the Act.

The event concluded successfully with active participation from the attendees, strengthening their understanding of the legal protections and welfare measures for senior citizens. A total of 80 participants attended the programme and engaged meaningfully in the awareness session.



4. Lok Adalat

Venue :District Court ,Mamit
Date :29th November, 2025

The Mamit District Legal Services Authority held a Lok Adalat at the District Court,Mamit on November 29, 2025.

- **Number of Benches:** 1 bench was constituted to oversee the proceedings.
- **Cases Taken Up:** 7 pre-litigation cases and 15 pending cases were considered.
- **Cases Successfully Disposed:** 5 cases were settled amicably.
- **Total Settlement Amount:** ₹.18,52,856/-.

Lok Adalats provide an alternative dispute resolution mechanism, promoting speedy and affordable justice. These events help reduce the burden on regular courts and offer a platform for parties to settle disputes through mutual agreement.
