

WORKDONE BY DLSA, LUNGLEI DURING THE MONTH OF JANUARY,2026

1. OBSERVATION OF NATIONAL YOUTH DAY AND LEGAL AWARENESS ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED UNDER DAWN SCHEME FOR THE PERIOD OF 5th to 12th JANUARY 2026 BY DLSA LUNGLEI

The activities conducted to observe National Youth Day from 5th to 12th January, 2026, are as follows:

a. Report on Legal Awareness Program on the observation of National Youth Day at Rescue Centre, Kawmzawl on Dt 08.01.2026:

As part of the NALSA DAWN Scheme and observation of National Youth Day, an awareness session was conducted on Dt 08.01.2026(Friday) at Rescue Centre, Kawmzawl, Lunglei which is a correctional and rehabilitation centre for people suffering from alcohol and drug addiction. The event focused on the NALSA (Legal Services to the Victims of Drug Abuse and Eradication of Drug Menace) Scheme, specifically the DAWN initiative. A total of 60 participants attended the session, which aimed to empower and educate the youth residing at the rehabilitation home.

b. Legal Awareness on NALSA's DAWN Scheme at TKP Pukpui on Dt 11.01.2025.

A Legal Awareness Program was conducted on Dt 11.01.2026 among the members of Pukpui Thalai Kristian Pawl on the occasion of National Youth Day. A total of 55 youths participated in the program. Ms. Ruth Rosangpuii, Para Legal Volunteer under the District Legal Services Authority (DLSA), Lunglei, acted as the resource person for the program.

c. PLEDGE TAKING CEREMONY ON NCB'S "SAY YES TO LIFE, NO TO DRUGS" INITIATIVE

A solemn Pledge Taking Ceremony was conducted among the youths of Thalai Kristian Pawl Pukpui on 11.01.2026. All 55 participants committed to the "Say No to Drugs and Yes to Life" campaign, vowing to protect their futures and contribute positively to the community. The pledge aims to empower young people to make healthy life choices, resist peer pressure, and build a supportive environment that discourages substance abuse while promoting personal growth, leadership, and community well-being. The program was followed by interactive sessions on the dangers of drug use, and a collective affirmation of each youth's commitment to uphold the values of sobriety, responsibility, and mutual respect. Through this initiative, members of the TKP Pukpui hopes to foster a generation of informed and resilient youths who champion drug-free lifestyles and work together for a healthier, safer future.



d. Digital Campaign and Circulation of National Helpline No. through Social Media on the observance of National Youth Day under NALSA DAWN Scheme:

The District Legal Services Authority (DLSA), Lunglei initiated a digital awareness campaign using Ms. Rosangpuii Ralte, Actress and Influencer as the ambassador of DAWN Scheme creating a 1:06 min video which is uploaded across multiple social media platforms on Dt 09.01.2026 to promote the National Helpline Number under the NALSA DAWN Scheme. The primary objective of this initiative was to ensure that members of the public are well-informed about the helpline, thereby facilitating easier access to justice. In addition, the campaign sought to reach out to individuals affected by drug abuse, including those currently struggling and their families and to encourage them to utilize the helpline for legal guidance, support with legal matters, and assistance in rehabilitation.

e. Dissemination of NALSA’s National Helpline No. at various locations within Lunglei Town.

The District Legal Services Authority (DLSA), Lunglei undertook an initiative to disseminate information about the NALSA Helpline Number - 15100 within various public locations across Lunglei on Dt 12.01.2026. Signboards containing the helpline number and related information were displayed at key locations across the town, such points included departmental offices, the taxi stand, bus stand, market areas, hospital and also distributed leaflets among members of the public through direct hand-outs to pedestrians. The objective of the campaign was to raise awareness among persons affected by drug abuse about the NALSA National Helpline Number so that they are encouraged to utilize this service to the fullest; for legal guidance, access to free legal aid, assistance to help them pursue recovery and build a drug-free life and assistance in rehabilitation and drug-related cases.

2. OBSERVATION OF NATIONAL GIRL CHILD DAY AND AWARENESS CAMPAIGN ON SEX-SELECTIVE PRACTICES AND PREVENTION OF CHILD MARRIAGE BY DLSA, LUNGLEI.

In observance of National Girl Child Day, the District Legal Services Authority (DLSA), Lunglei, organized a legal awareness campaign at Anganwadi Centre, Venglai - I, Lunglei, on January 24, 2026, focusing on eliminating sex-selective practices and preventing child marriage, aligning with NALSA ASHA SOP guidelines.



The programme aimed at raising awareness about the harmful impacts and the legal consequences of sex-selective practices and child marriage, sensitizing the community on legal provisions, including the Prohibition of Child Marriage Act, 2006, and the Pre-Conception and Pre-Natal Diagnostic Techniques Act, 1994, promoting gender equality, emphasizing the importance of girls' education, and empowerment.

This awareness session yielded positive outcomes, resulting in an increase in awareness about legal rights and support mechanisms, and the attendees expressed commitment to preventing child marriages and promoting girls' education. Approximately 70 members, including Anganwadi workers, parents and their children participated in the event.



3. 5 (FIVE) DAYS SENSITIZATION ON NALSA SCHEME -ASHA AMONG TARGETED HOTSPOTS (ANGANWADI WORKERS AND HEALTH SUB-CENTRE) WITHIN LUNGLEI TOWN:

The District Legal Services Authority (DLSA), Lunglei, successfully conducted a five-day sensitization programme in accordance with the *100-Days "Bal Vivah Mukh Bharat"* Campaign under NALSA Scheme ASHA (Awareness, Support, Help & Action) within Lunglei town. The initiative was strategically organized across targeted hotspots, focusing on Anganwadi workers and Health Sub-Centres, who play a crucial role in grassroots community engagement and health outreach.

ANGANWADI CENTRES: The sensitization programme at the Anganwadi Centres was conducted for selected Anganwadi Centres as outlined below:

- a. **Bazar Anganwadi Centre III:** Ms. Ruth Rosangpuii, Para Legal Volunteer served as the resource person at the Bazar Veng Anganwadi Centre, where she delivered an insightful session on the Prohibition of Child Marriage Act, 2006, the pivotal role of Anganwadi workers in preventing child marriage, and the availability of helplines such as NALSA (15100) and Childline (1098) for immediate support. A total of 47 mothers, along with their children, participated in the programme.





- b. **Chanmari Anganwadi Centre I** : Mr. Gospel Lalramzauva served as the resource person at the Chanmari Anganwadi Centre, delivering an insightful session on the Prohibition of Child Marriage Act, 2006. He highlighted the crucial role of Anganwadi workers in preventing child marriage and emphasized the importance of helplines such as NALSA (15100) and Childline (1098) for immediate support. The programme saw the active participation of 30 mothers along with their children.



- c. **Venglai Anganwadi Centre I:** Ms. H. Lalremruati served as the resource person at the Venglai Anganwadi Centre. She delivered an insightful session on the Prohibition of Child Marriage Act, 2006 and highlighted the vital role of Anganwadi workers in preventing child marriage. The importance of helplines such as NALSA (15100) and Childline (1098) was also emphasized. A total of 49 mothers, along with their children, actively participated in the programme.



- d. **Ramthar Anganwadi Centre I :** Mr. Pc. Zohmangaiha served as the resource person at the Ramthar Anganwadi Centre. He spoke on the Prohibition of Child Marriage Act, 2006 and the ASHA Scheme, highlighting the role of Anganwadi workers in preventing child marriage and its health implications. He also emphasized the importance of helplines such as NALSA (15100) and Childline (1098). A total of 39 mothers, along with their children, participated in the programme.



- e. **Zotlang Anganwadi Centre I** : Mrs. Vanlalhasangi from DLSA served as the resource person at the Zotlang Anganwadi Centre. She conducted a session on the Prohibition of Child Marriage Act, 2006, highlighting the crucial role of Anganwadi workers in preventing child marriage and its implications. She also emphasized the importance of helplines such as NALSA (15100) and Childline (1098). The programme saw the active participation of 49 mothers along with their children.



HEALTH SUB- CENTRES: At the health sub-centre, a session was held on the Prohibition of Child Marriage Act, 2006 and the NALSA ASHA Scheme. The discussion highlighted the responsive role of health workers in addressing child marriage and emphasized the importance of helpline numbers for immediate assistance.

As part of the 100-days 'Bal Vivah Mukht Bharat' campaign under the ASHA Scheme, an awareness campaign & training was organized in collaboration with CDPO Lunglei.



Mr. J. Lalruatfela, Advocate, served as the resource person. He delivered a presentation on the issue of child marriage and early motherhood. His talk highlighted key statistics, reasons behind child marriage, and the harmful effects of early motherhood. He also explained the legal provisions, offences, and punishments related to child marriage. In addition, he discussed matters concerning custody and maintenance of children born from child marriages.

The session further emphasized the importance of child helpline services and the NALSA helpline number.

A total of 74 participants, including teachers, health workers, and Village Council members, attended the programme.



5. LOK ADALAT HELD ON Dt 1.2.2026:

The DLSA, Lunglei constituted Lok Adalat on Dt 1.2.2026 with 1 bench. During the sitting, 47 cases were taken up, out of which 30 cases were successfully disposed and settled and the settlement amount is Rs. 19,64,500/-.
