COVID-19 Update

India's Cumulative COVID-19 Vaccination Coverage crossed 64 Cr landmark

More than 53 lakh Vaccine Doses administered today till 7 pm

Recovery Rate currently at 97.51%



42,909 New Cases reported in the last 24 hours



India's Active Caseload (3,76,324) is 1.15% of Total Cases



Weekly Positivity Rate (2.41%) less than 3% for last 66 days



In a significant achievement, India's COVID-19 vaccination coverage has crossed **64 Crore** landmark milestone today. More than **53 lakh** (**53,37,042**) Vaccine Doses have been administered today, as per the 7 pm provisional report. Final reports would be completed for the day by late tonight.

As per the provisional 7 pm provisional report, India's Cumulative COVID-19 Vaccination Coverage is **63.99** Cr (**63,99,01,822**). The cumulative coverage of vaccine doses, segregated based on population priority groups, is as follows:




The recovery of **34,763** patients in the last 24 hours has increased the cumulative tally of recovered patients (since the beginning of the pandemic) to **3,19,23,405**.

Consequently, India's recovery rate stands at 97.51%.




Sustained and collaborative efforts by the Centre and the States/UTs continue the trend of less than 50,000 Daily New Cases that is being reported for 64 consecutive days now.

42,909 new cases were reported in the last 24 hours.




The Active Caseload is presently **3,76,324.** Active cases presently constitute **1.15%** of the country's total Positive Cases.



The testing capacity across the country continues to be expanded. The last 24 hours saw a total of 14,19,990 tests being conducted. India has so far conducted over **52.01** Cr (**52,01,46,525**) cumulative tests.

While testing capacity has been enhanced across the country, Weekly Positivity Rate at 2.41% remains less than 3% for the last 66 days now. The Daily Positivity rate stands at 3.02%. The daily Positivity rate has remained below 5% for 84 consecutive days now.

More than 63.09 Crore vaccine doses provided to States/UTs

More than 4.87 Crore balance and unutilized vaccine doses still available with States/UTs with 21.76 Lakh doses in Pipeline

As part of the nationwide vaccination drive, Government of India has been supporting the States and UTs by providing them COVID Vaccines free of cost. In the new phase of the universalization of the COVID19 vaccination drive, the Union Government will procure and supply (free of cost) 75% of the vaccines being produced by the vaccine manufacturers in the country to States and UTs.

More than **63.09 crore (63,09,30,270)** vaccine doses have been provided to States/UTs so far through Govt of India (free of cost channel) and through direct state procurement category. Further, more than 1.76 Lakh doses **(21,76,930)** are in the pipeline.

More than **4.87** Cr **(4,87,39,946)** balance and unutilized COVID Vaccine doses are still available with the States/UTs to be administered.

Vice President asks DRDO scientists to intensify research to combat any pandemic threat in the future

VP lauds the role of DRDO labs in treatment and management of COVID-19

DRDO Chairman, Dr. G Satheesh Reddy briefs Vice President on various products and equipment developed by DRDO to tackle COVID-19

The Vice President, Shri M Venkaiah Naidu today commended the contribution of scientists and frontline workers from DIPAS (Defence Institute of Physiology and Allied Sciences), a DRDO lab, in the fight against COVID-19 pandemic and advised them to intensify their research to effectively combat any such pandemic in the future.

Around 25 scientists and technicians from DIPAS were invited to Upa-RashtrapatiNivas by the Vice President. They were accompanied by DRDO Chairman, Dr G. Satheesh Reddy.

Interacting with them, Shri Naidu said that the pandemic has triggered unprecedented health crisis and severely impacted lives and livelihoods across the world. Lauding DIPAS and other DRDO labs for rising to the occasion and developing various indigenous products for treatment and management of COVID-19, he said that in the wake of the emergence of new variants of SARS-CoV-2, it is important to be ever vigilant to effectively tackle any future threats.
