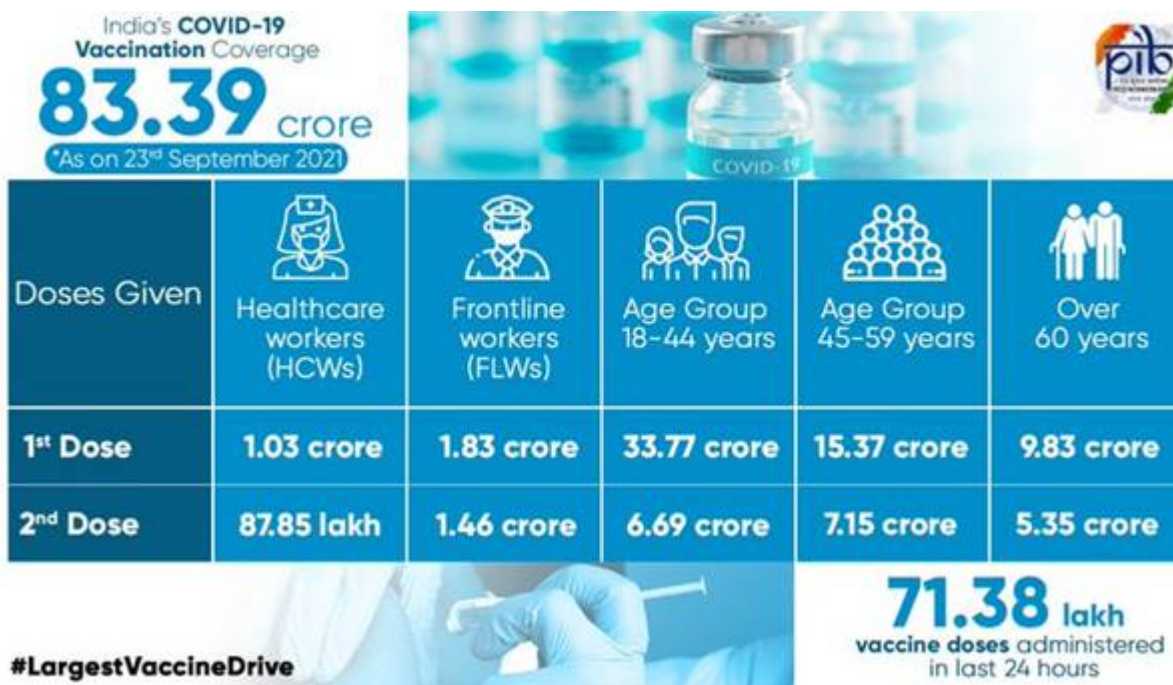
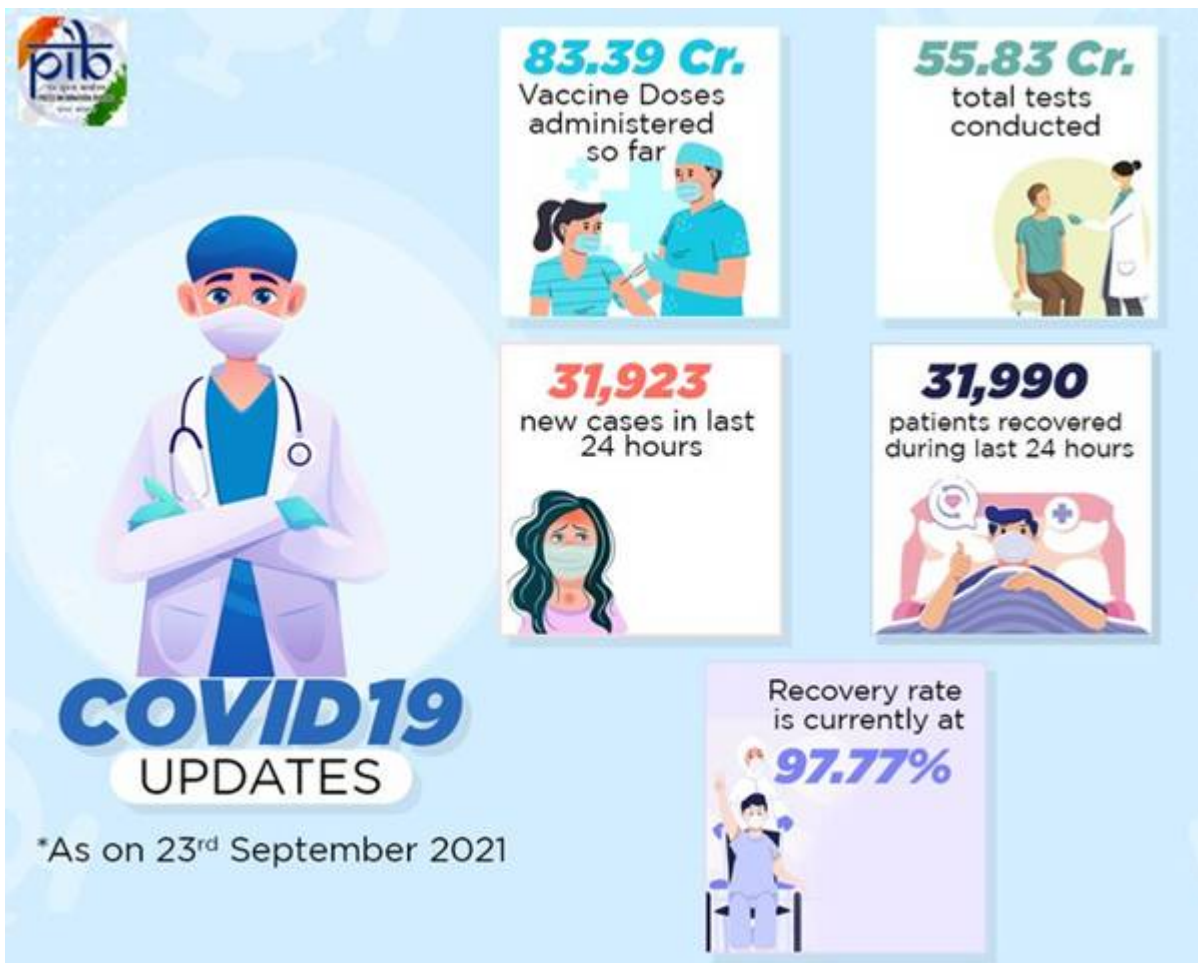

**India's Cumulative COVID-19 Vaccination Coverage crosses the landmark of 83 Cr**

**More than 71 Lakh doses administered in the last 24 hours**

**Recovery Rate currently at 97.77%****31,923 New Cases reported in the last 24 hours****India's Active Caseload (3,01,640) is 0.90% of Total Cases****Weekly Positivity Rate (2.11%) less than 3% for last 90 days**

With the administration of **71,38,205** vaccine doses in the last 24 hours, India's COVID-19 vaccination coverage crossed the landmark of **83Cr (83,39,90,049)** as per provisional reports till 7 am today. This has been achieved through 81,69,260 sessions.

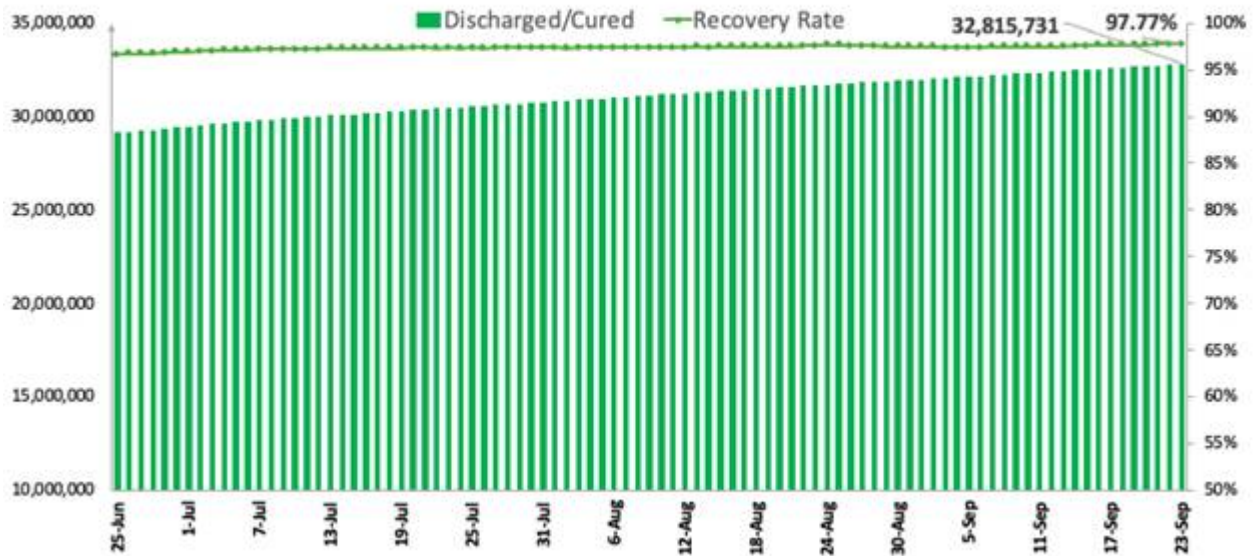

The recovery of **31,990** patients in the last 24 hours has increased the cumulative tally of recovered patients (since the beginning of the pandemic) to **3,28,15,731**.

Consequently, India's recovery rate stands at **97.77%**. Recovery Rate is currently at its highest peak since March 2020.



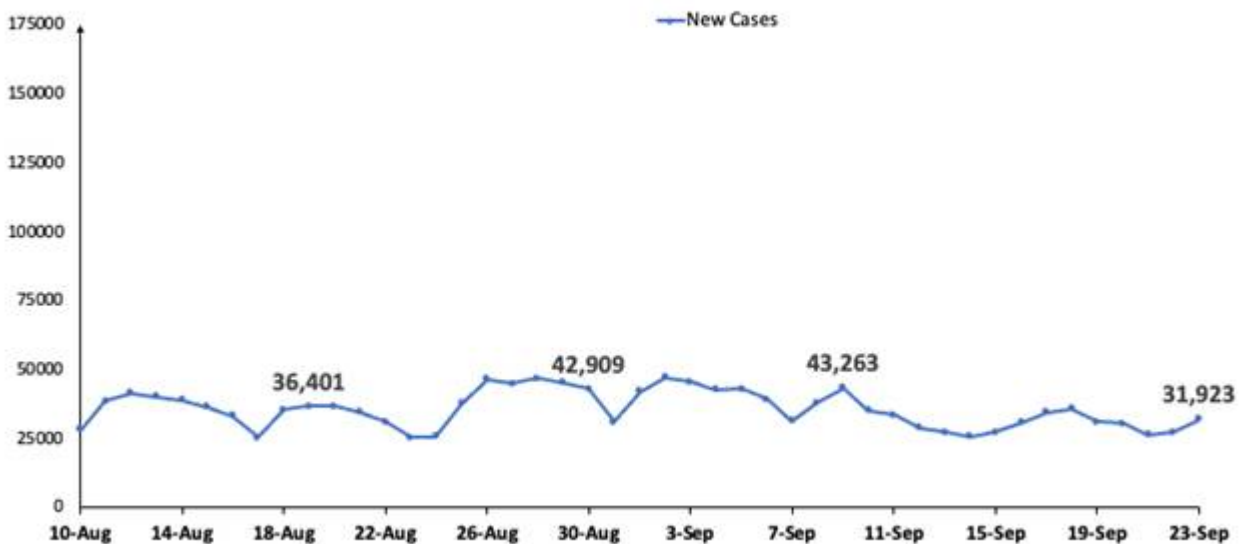
## Recovered cases over 3.28 Cr & Recovery rate at 97.77%



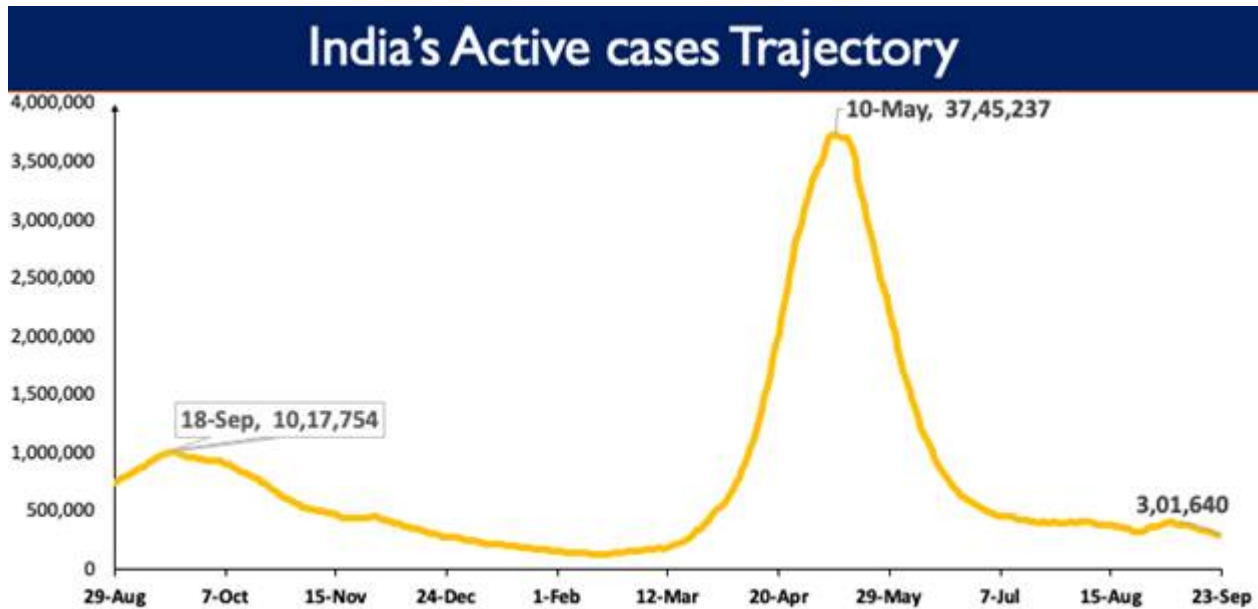
Sustained and collaborative efforts by the Centre and the States/UTs continue the trend of less than 50,000 Daily New Cases that is being reported for 88 consecutive days now.

**31,923 new cases** were reported in the last 24 hours.

## 32k New Cases reported in last 24 hrs



The Active Caseload is presently **3,01,640**. Active cases presently constitute **0.90%** of the country's total Positive Cases. This is the lowest figure in active cases in India since March 2020.



The testing capacity across the country continues to be expanded. The last 24 hours saw a total of 15,27,443 tests being conducted. India has so far conducted over **55.83 Cr (55,83,67,013)** cumulative tests.

While testing capacity has been enhanced across the country, **Weekly Positivity Rate at 2.11% remains less than 3% for the last 90 days now.** The **Daily Positivity rate reported to be 2.09%.** The daily Positivity rate has remained below 3% for last 24 days and below 5% for 107 consecutive days now.

**Update on COVID-19 Vaccine Availability in States/UTs**

**More than 80.67 Crore vaccine doses provided to States/UTs**

**More than 4.29 Crore balance and unutilized vaccine doses still available with States/UTs with 64 Lakh doses in Pipeline**

As part of the nationwide vaccination drive, Government of India has been supporting the States and UTs by providing them COVID Vaccines free of cost. In the new phase of the universalization of the COVID19 vaccination drive, the Union Government will procure and supply (free of cost) 75% of the vaccines being produced by the vaccinemanufacturers in the country to States and UTs.

More than **4.29Cr (4,29,03,090)** balance and unutilized COVID Vaccine doses are still available with the States/UTs to be administered.
