f With the administration of **74,57,970** vaccine doses in the last 24 hours, India's COVID-19 vaccination coverage has exceeded **131.18 Cr (1,31,18,87,257)** as per provisional reports till 7 am today. This has been achieved through 1,36,76,290 sessions.

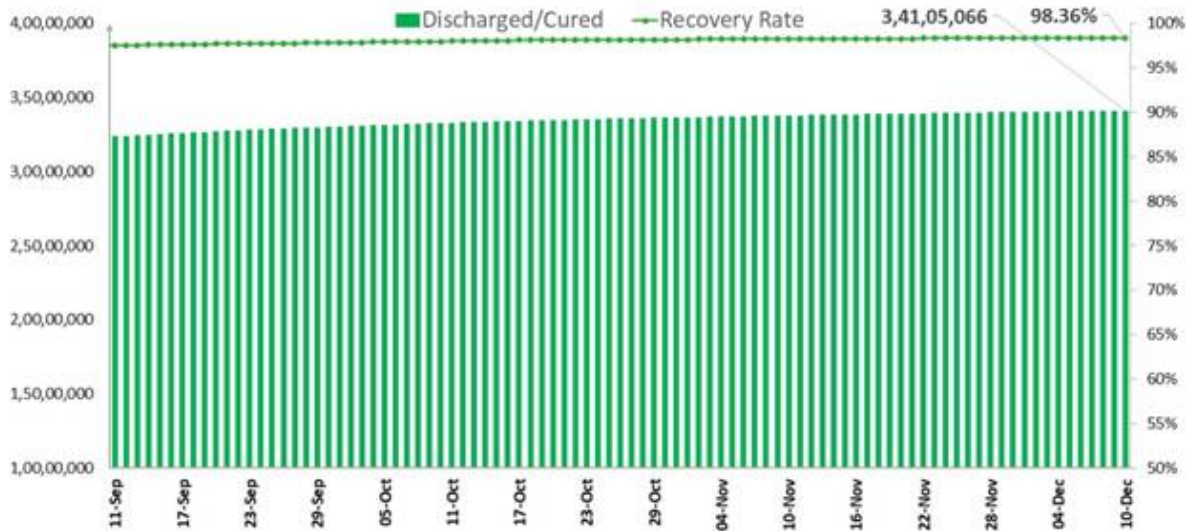

The recovery of **7,678** patients in the last 24 hours has increased the cumulative tally of recovered patients (since the beginning of the pandemic) to **3,41,05,066**.

Consequently, India's recovery rate stands at **98.36%**, highest since March 2020.



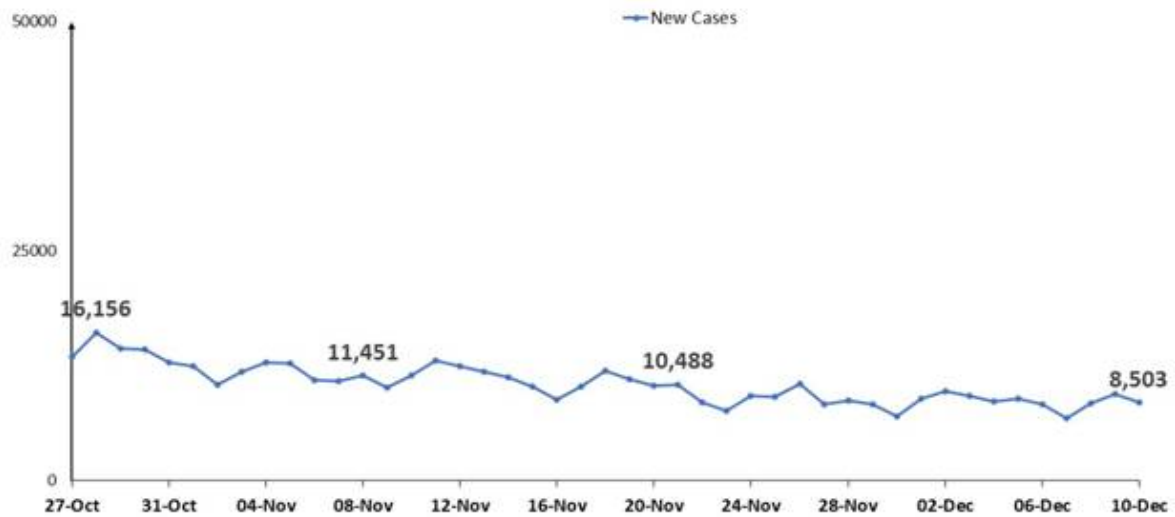
Recovered cases over 3.41 Cr & Recovery rate at 98.36%



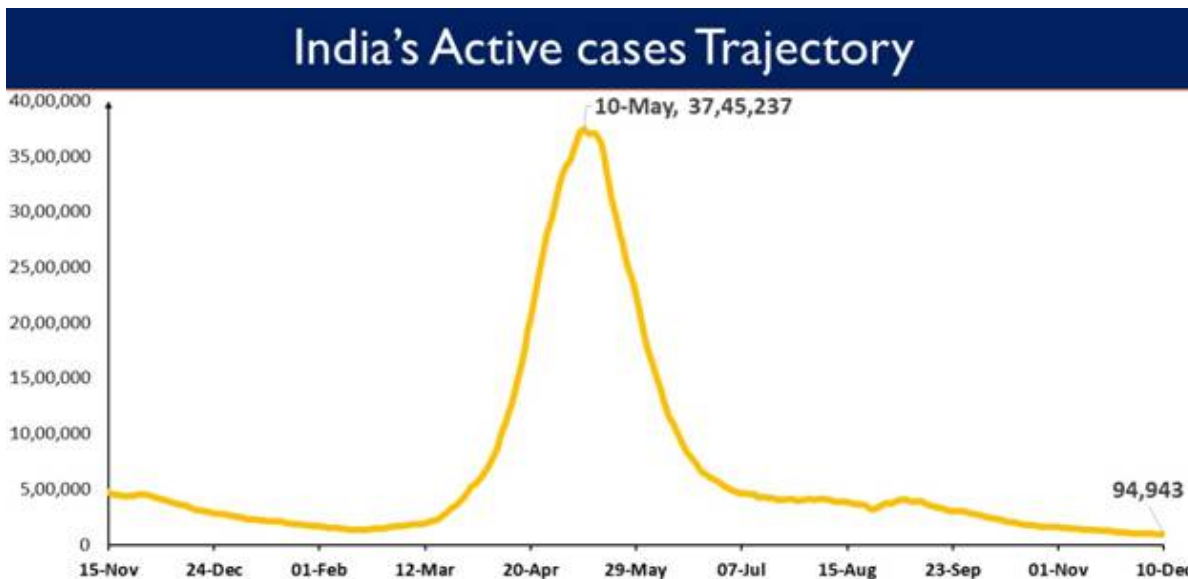
Sustained and collaborative efforts by the Centre and the States/UTs continue the trend of less than 15,000 Daily New Cases that is being reported for last 43 days now.

8,503 new cases were reported in the last 24 hours.

8K New Cases reported in last 24 hrs

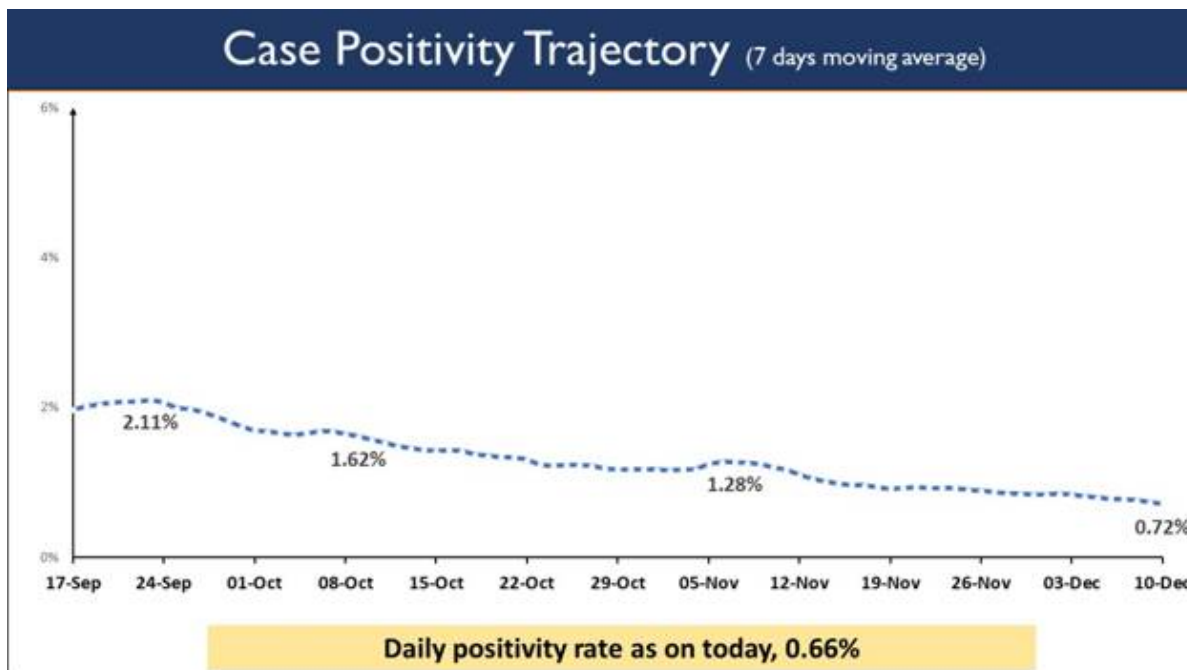


India's Active Case load is presently at **94,943**. Active cases constitute **0.27%** of the country's total Positive Cases, which is **lowest since March 2020**.



The testing capacity across the country continues to be expanded. The last 24 hours saw a total of 12,93,412 tests being conducted. India has so far conducted over **65.32 Cr (65,32,43,539)** cumulative tests.

While testing capacity has been enhanced across the country, **Weekly Positivity Rate at 0.72% remains less than 1% for the last 26 days now.** The **Daily Positivity rate reported to be 0.66%.** The daily Positivity rate has remained below 2% for last 67 days and below 3% for 102 consecutive days now.

Update on COVID-19 Vaccine Availability in States/UTs

More than 140 Crore vaccine doses provided to States/UTs

f More than 18.80 Crore balance and unutilized vaccine doses still available with States/UTs

The Union Government is committed to accelerating the pace and expanding the scope of COVID-19 vaccination throughout the country. The nationwide COVID 19 vaccination started on 16th January 2021. The new phase of universalization of COVID-19 vaccination commenced from 21st June 2021. The vaccination drive has been ramped up through availability of more vaccines, advance visibility of vaccine availability to States and UTs for enabling better planning by them, and streamlining the vaccine supply chain.

in As part of the nationwide vaccination drive, Government of India has been supporting the States and UTs by providing them COVID Vaccines free of cost. In the new phase of the universalization of the COVID19 vaccination drive, the Union Government will procure and supply (free of cost) 75% of the vaccines being produced by the vaccinemanufacturers in the country to States and UTs.

More than **140 crore (1,40,04,00,230)** vaccine doses have been provided to States/UTs so far through Govt of India (free of cost channel) and through direct state procurement category.

More than **18.80 Cr (18,80,33,706)** balance and unutilized COVID Vaccine doses are still available with the States/UTs to be administered.

Update on COVID-19 Vaccination Coverage

By 30th November 2021, 78.90 crore beneficiaries (84.0%) aged 18 years and above have received at least one dose of COVID-19 vaccine and 45.20 crore (48.1%) have received both the doses. The State/UT-wise details are at **Annexure-1**.

COVID-19 vaccines which have received approval for Restricted Use under Emergency Situation from the National Regulator i.e., Central Drugs Standard Control Organization (CDSCO), are used under the National COVID-19 Vaccination Program. Presently, three vaccines are used in Covid-19 vaccination program, namely, Covishield, Covaxin and Sputnik V, all of which are two dose vaccines.

India started external supplies of Made in India COVID-19 vaccines under Vaccine Maitri initiative on January 20,2021 in the form of grants-in-aid and commercial sales by Indian manufacturers and through GAVI's COVAX facility. Indian companies have significantly enhanced their vaccine production

capacity and are in a position to meet domestic requirements of COVID-19 vaccines as also contribute their surplus production to global Covid-19 vaccination requirements.

Government of India closely monitors COVID-19 vaccine stocks in States/UTs so as to ensure their optimal utilization. State/UTs have been advised to closely monitor and utilize the near expiry vaccine doses. The cold chain storage space was augmented at the start of the vaccination program and is sufficient to meet the vaccine requirement of both COVID-19 vaccination as well as routine immunization.

Financial Assistance to Combat COVID Pandemic

Government of India is supporting States in their endeavor to manage COVID-19 since the beginning of pandemic. Requisite support is provided to States/UTs to enhance preparedness and response capacities against COVID-19 and other public health emergencies. Various initiatives have been undertaken by the Government to provide technical guidance and further strengthen health infrastructure, availability of essential logistics including drugs and medical oxygen supply to manage COVID-19.

Steps Undertaken for the Wellbeing of COVID Warriors

Ministry of Health & Family Welfare has taken a number of steps to improve wellbeing of healthcare workers managing COVID-19. Few of the actions taken in this regard include:

- With the launch of COVID-19 vaccination initiative on 16th January 2021, Healthcare workers were identified as one of the first priority group. State Governments/ UT administrations have been repeatedly urged to ensure that the medical professionals engaged in Covid related work are suitably vaccinated.

SUPPORT TO CHILDREN ORPHANED DUE TO COVID-19

The Hon'ble Prime Minister has announced PM CARES for Children scheme to support children who have lost both parents or surviving parent or legal guardian or adoptive parents due to COVID-19 pandemic. The scheme is accessible through an online portal i.e. [pmcaresforchildren.in](https://pib.gov.in/PressReleasePage.aspx?PRID=1780152). The applications of such children are uploaded on the portal by the respective State/ UT Governments. As on 08.12.2021, 5714 applications have been uploaded on the portal out of which, 3258 applications have been approved by District Magistrates after due process and 542 applications are pending for approval.

f The Ministry is implementing a centrally sponsored scheme namely Child Protection Services (CPS) Scheme under which support is provided to States and UT Governments for delivering services for children in need of care and in difficult circumstances. The Child Care Institutions (CCIs) established under the CPS scheme support inter-alia age-appropriate education, access to vocational training, recreation, health care, counselling etc. As per the scheme guidelines, quantum of sponsorship of Rs. 2000/- per child per month is available for Non-institutional Care of children in Need of Care and **t** Protection and the provision for maintenance grant of Rs. 2160/- per child per month for children living in Child Care Institution. During the last three years period an amount of Rs. 2189.76/- Crores has been **e** released under the scheme with total 2,30,063 number of beneficiaries.

i The Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2015 and the Adoption Regulations 2017 establish a framework for the rehabilitation of orphaned, abandoned, and surrendered children which include cases where children have lost both the parents owing to Covid-19. The Child Welfare Committee and the District Child Protection Unit are entrusted with the placement of such children for adoption and rehabilitation. Besides, Central Adoption Resource Authority (CARA) and State Adoption Resource Agency (SARA) are also mandated under JJ Act, 2015 for facilitating adoption related matters of children.

INCREASE IN MALNUTRITION DURING CORONA PERIOD

To ensure continuous nutritional support to the beneficiaries, the Anganwadi Workers and Helpers distributed Supplementary Nutrition at the doorsteps of beneficiaries once in 15 days during Covid-19 as all Anganwadi Centres across the country were closed to limit the impact of the pandemic. In addition, Anganwadi Workers and Helpers also assisted the local administration in community surveillance, creating awareness as well as other work assigned to them from time to time.

Government has accorded high priority to the issue of malnutrition and is implementing several schemes like Anganwadi Services, Scheme for Adolescent Girls and Pradhan Mantri Matru Vandana Yojana (PMMVY) under the Umbrella Integrated Child Development Services (ICDS) Scheme as direct targeted interventions to address the problem of malnutrition in the country.
