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CHAPTER-1 INTRODUCTION

ABOUT NATIONAL TESTING AGENCY (NTA).

The Ministry of Education (MOE), Government of India (GOI) has established National Testing Agency (NTA) as an independent autonomous and self-sustained premier examining organization under the Societies Registration Act, 1860 for conducting efficient, transparent and international standards exams in order to assess the competency of candidates for admissions to premier higher educational institutions.

The objectives of NTA, inter-alia, include: -

- (a) To conduct efficient, transparent and international standard exams in order to assess the competency of candidates for admission.
- (b) To undertake research on educational, professional and examining system to identify gaps in the knowledge systems and take steps for bridging them.
- (c) To produce and disseminate information and research on education and professional development standards.

ABOUT MINISTRY OF SOCIAL JUSTICE AND EMPOWERMENT

In the year 1985-86, the erstwhile Ministry of Welfare was bifurcated into the Department of Women and Child Development and the Department of Welfare. Simultaneously, the Scheduled Castes Development Division, Tribal Development Division and the Minorities and Backward Classes Welfare Division were moved from the Ministry of Home Affairs and also the Wakf Division from the Ministry of Law to form the then Ministry of Welfare.

Subsequently, the name of the Ministry was changed to the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment in May, 1998.

The Department of Social Justice and Empowerment (Samajik Nyaya and Adhikarita Vibhag) had created under the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment vide notification dated 12.5.2012.

The Department of Social Justice and Empowerment under Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment Government of India has entrusted the responsibility of conducting the SHRESHTA (NETS) Entrance Examination to NTA.

ABOUT SHRESHTA (NETS)

The Government has approved a Scheme named SHRESHTA (Residential Education for Students in High Schools in Targeted Areas) for the purpose of providing seats for the meritorious SC boys and girls in the best private residential schools in the country. Every year, it is expected that about (3000) students would be selected for admission in Class 9 and Class 11 under the scheme.

The SHRESHTA (NETS) 2026 will be conducted for admissions in classes 9th and 11th only for SC candidates whose parental annual income is upto Rs. 2.5 lacs.

The objective of the Scheme for Residential Education for Students in High Schools in Targeted Areas (SHRESHTA) is as follows:

- To enhance the reach of the development initiative of the government.
- To fill the gap in service-deprived Scheduled Castes (SCs) dominant areas in the sector of education by collaborating with voluntary organizations.
- To provide an environment for socio-economic upliftment and overall development of the Scheduled Castes (SCs).
- To provide access to high-quality education to bright Scheduled Caste (SC) students so that they can secure future opportunities.

PROCEDURE FOR FILLING THE ONLINE APPLICATION FORM:

Important Points.

- 1. It is advised to go through the website of the SHRESHTA (NETS) and understand their Admission Policy/Procedure clearly.
- 2. Admission of boys/girls under SHRESHTA Scheme is as per the admission policy of the MoSJ&E.
- 3. It is strongly advised to read the Information Bulletin carefully and check and ensure your eligibility for the examination and admission. Neither NTA nor MoSJ&E will be responsible for any error committed by the candidates in selection of Class/State/Domicile/filling of incorrect particulars etc. and possible loss of opportunity to join the Schools under SHRESHTA Scheme.
- 4. Candidates must follow the instructions strictly as given in the Information Bulletin and on NTA website https://exams.nta.nic.in/shreshta/. Candidates not complying with the instructions shall be summarily disqualified.
- 5. It is advised to be in touch with the Website of NTA and SHRESHTA (NETS) for latest updates.

Step 1: Registration Form:

Register for the Online Application Form and note down the system-generated Application Number. The candidate should supply the required details while filling the Online Application Form and is also required to create PASSWORD and choose Security Question and enter his/her Answer. After successful submission of the personal details, an Application number will be generated and it will be used to complete the remaining Steps of the Application Form and will also be required for all future reference/correspondence.

Step 2: Application Form:

The Candidates can log in with the system-generated Application Number and pre-created Password for completing the Application Form including filling up of personal details, applying for the Class, choosing the Examination Cities, providing the details of Educational Qualifications.

Step 3: Upload Scanned Images of following:

Upload the scanned photograph and signature in the prescribed format and size:

- i. The recent photograph should be either in colour or black & white with 80% face (without mask) visible including ears against a white background.
- ii. Scanned photograph should be in JPG/JPEG format (clearly legible) and size should be between 10 kb to 200 kb.
- iii. Scanned signature should be in JPG/JPEG format (clearly legible) and size should be between 10 kb to 50 kb.
- iv. Scanned Category Certificate/Undertaking should be in PDF format (clearly legible) and size should be between **50 kb to 300 kb**.
- v. Scanned Income Certificate should be in PDF format (clearly legible) and size should be between 50 kb to 300 kb.
- vi. Candidate's left-hand thumb impression should be in JPG/JPEG format (clearly legible) and size should be between 10 kb to 50 kb.

[Note: The Candidate has to upload only his/her own photograph and signature as mentioned above (and not of anybody else) in a correct/proper manner, as the facility for correction will not be given after the mentioned correction period. In case, it is found at any time in the future that the Candidate has used/uploaded the photograph and signature of someone else in his/her Application Form/Admit Card, or he/she has tampered his/her Admit Card/Result/Scorecard, these acts of the candidate shall be treated as Unfair Means (UFM) Practices and he/she shall be proceeded with the actions as contemplated under the provisions of the Information Bulletin relating to Unfair Means Practices.]

- iii. Usage of Data and Information: NTA/Government of India can use the data provided by the End Users (test taker in this case) for the internal purpose(s) including training, research and development, analysis, and other permissible purposes (s). However, this information is not foruse by any third party or private agency for any other use.
- iv. Candidates are advised to fill only one Application Form and to take utmost care while filling out the mobile number and e-mail address (Optional). Candidates are also advised to use the mobile number and email address (Optional) that are accessible to them such as of their parent/guardian.

Notes:

- The requisite documents (including original) and candidature will be verified at various stages of the exam process against the details provided by the candidates during the online registration/application. The candidature is liable to be rejected if the candidate fails to produce the requisite documents or if the candidate is not able to furnish the requisite documents which corroborates with the details given in the online application form.
- Candidates are advised to maintain secrecy regarding their application number and password so as to prevent change of profile or data filled by them by other unauthorized persons.

ELIGIBILITY AND QUALIFICATIONS

Admission under SHRESHTA Scheme is strictly merit based as per the policy of MoSJ&E. The Eligibility for admission in Class IX and XI under the Scheme is as under:

- 1. Student belonging to scheduled castes, studying in class 8th and 10th in the current academic year (2025-26).
- 2. Parent's annual income is upto Rs. 2.5 lacs.
- 3. Candidate opting for class IX should be born between 01-04-2010 to 31-03-2014 (i.e. 16 to 12 years of age as on 31.03.2026)
- 4. Candidate opting for class XI should be born between 01-04-2008 to 31-03-2012 (i.e. 18 to 14 years of age as on 31.03.2026)

EXAMINATION SCHEME

1. Mode of Examination

SHRESHTA (NETS) 2026 will be conducted in pen and paper mode (offline).

The SHRESHTA (NETS) – 2026 (NETS) Exam is conducted for admission in best private residential schools in the country under Residential Education for students in High Schools in targeted areas for Class IX and XI.

The Exam comprises of one paper having four sections, i.e. Mathematics, Science, Social Science and General Awareness/Knowledge.

The paper will be based on NCERT syllabus of class VIII for admission in class IX and class X syllabus for admission in class XI.

- 1. SHRESHTA (NETS) will be conducted as per the guidelines of the MoSJ&E.
- 2. Merely appearing and passing in SHRESHTA (NETS)-2026 does not confer any right to the candidate for admission to the MoSJ&E.
- 3. Applications of candidates submitting false and fabricated information will be rejected and such candidates will be further debarred from appearing in future examinations.
- 4. Incomplete application and applications not in accordance with instructions are liable to be rejected without any further intimation.
- 5. Instructions in the Information Bulletin may change /be updated based on decisions taken by the NTA / MoSJ&E and other authorities from time to time. Therefore, it is advised to regularly check the website https://exams.nta.nic.in/shreshta/ any further updates or information.
- 6. The NTA/MoSJ&E reserves right to alter the number of vacancies; modify Examination process and fix the minimum cut off marks without assigning any reason thereof. Number of vacancies are subject to change. All instructions are to be complied with strictly by the candidates.
- 7. Candidates are required to keep with them at least one identity proof along with the admit card issued to the candidate and shall produce the same on demand at the time of examination at the center.
- **8.** Candidate's admission to **SHRESHTA** (**NETS**)-2026 is purely provisional and is subject to fulfillment of eligibility criteria prescribed by the MoSJ&E as applicable.
- 9. Application Form of candidates who do not fulfill the eligibility criteria shall be rejected.
- 10. Selection of a candidate in the Examination is provisional, subject to being found otherwise eligible for selection.
- 11. In case of any ambiguity in interpretation of any of the instructions/terms/rules/criteria regarding determination of eligibility/conduct of examination/registration of candidates/information contained therein, the interpretation of the MoSJ&E shall be final and binding.
- 12. Candidates are advised to keep visiting the NTA website(s) https://exams.nta.nic.in/shreshta/ regularly for all examination related updates and to check their emails. However, candidates are advised to visit the official website (s) of NTA about the latest updates.
- 13. Candidates are NOT allowed to carry Instrument/ Geometry/ Pencil box, Hand bag, Purse, cap, goggles, jackets, any kind of Paper/ Stationery/ Textual material (printed or written material), Eatables (loose or packed), Mobile Phone/ Ear Phone/ Microphone/ Pager, Calculator, Docu Pen, Slide Ruler, formulae, Log Tables, whitener, Camera, Tape Recorder, Electronic Watches with facilities of calculator, any metallic item or electronic gadgets/devices, pointed instruments etc. in the Examination Hall/ Room.
- 14. A candidate needs to give her/his preferences for examination city/centres during submission of online application form. However, centres shall be allocated taking into account logistical considerations.
- 15. The information about the examination centers will be given in the respective admit cards.
- 16. No request for change of centre/venue/date/session for Examination shall be entertained.

- 17. NTA/MoSJ&E, however, reserves the right to cancel any of the Examination Centers and/ or add some other Centers, at its discretion, depending upon the response, administrative feasibility, etc.
- 18. NTA/MoSJ&E also reserves the right to allot the candidate to any centre even other than the preferences given by her/him.
- 19. Candidate will appear for the examination at an Examination Centre at her / his own risks and expenses and NTA/MoSJ&E will not be responsible for any injury or losses etc. of any nature.
- **20.** No TA/DA will be paid to any candidates for appearing in the examinations.
- 21. In case it is found at any time in future that the Candidate has used / uploaded the photograph and signature of someone else in her/his Application Form /Admit Card or she/he has tampered her/his Admit Card /result, these acts of the candidate shall be treated as Unfair Means (UFM).
- 22. In case, it is detected at any stage of recruitment that a candidate does not fulfill the eligibility norms and/or that she/he has suppressed/twisted or truncated any material acts or any other grounds which the NTA/MoSJ&E consider to be sufficient clause, her/his candidature shall stand cancelled without giving any reasons and notice to the candidate concerned. If any of these shortcomings is detected even after selection/admission, their admission may be liable to be terminated.
- 23. No recommendation for selection of written other than those for whom required as per Rules applicable will be taken into consideration. Any attempt on the part of a candidate to enlist support directly or indirectly for his candidature by other means shall disqualify him/her for selection/admission.
- 24. The candidates are required to fill in the Online Application Form with correct and complete information carefully. If any incomplete or false information is given, then the candidate will be solely responsible for the same and on the basis of false and incomplete information, the Application Form shall be rejected at any stage of the selection without giving any reasons/notice. On furnishing any false information, particulars, certificates or indicating wrong category/sub-category etc.in the application form or in case of any other default, NTA/ MoSJ&E may reject the candidature at any stage of the selection/admission.
- 25. Information uploaded on the website shall not be provided to the candidate or any other person under R.T.I. Act, 2005. The information uploaded on the website shall remain for a specific period only. Therefore, the candidates are advised to download the uploaded information and keep up with them for future. In due course of recruitment examination or in midway of process, neither any application under Right To Information Act, 2005 shall be entertained nor information shall be provided. Factual Information under R.T.I., Act shall be provided only after declaration of final result. Inferential questions or Speculative questions shall not be answered in RTI.
- 26. It is to be noted that if a candidate has been allowed to appear in the examination, it does not imply that the candidate's eligibility has been verified. It does not vest any right with a candidate for selection/admission. The eligibility is subject to final verification by the MoSJ&E at subsequent stages. The candidate shall satisfy her/his eligibility before applying and shall be personally responsible in case she/he is not eligible to apply as per the given eligibility criteria on the last date for submission of Application Form.

- **27.** Furnishing of false, wrong or inaccurate information may lead to cancellation of the candidature of the Applicant and/or her/his Result. Canvassing in any form and use of unfair means (U.F.M.) during the examinations shall disqualify the candidature of the applicant.
- 28. The Result of the Candidates who indulge in Unfair Means (UFM) Practices shall not be declared (and may be cancelled)
- 29. Mobile Phones, Pagers, Bluetooth devices or any other communication device is not allowed inside the premises where the examination is being conducted. Any infringement of these instructions may entail suitable actions/restrictions as NTA/MoSJ&E may deem fit and proper, including ban from future examinations.
- 30. The NTA/ MoSJ&E will not be responsible for any inadvertent error and reserves the right to correct such errors that might have inadvertently crept in. However, it does not owe any responsibility for error committed by the candidate.
- 31. NTA/ MoSJ&E reserves the right to incorporate any subsequent changes/modifications/additions in the terms & conditions of selection/admission under the notice as necessitated and applicable by issuing necessary addendum/corrigendum to their Notification.
- 32. Under no circumstances, any candidate or parents/guardians/relatives or friends are permitted to approach any officer in the Service Headquarters or any other person concerned with the selection of the candidates. Any attempt to do so is liable to result in rejection of the candidate.
- 33. Any matter not specifically covered in this Information Bulletin or elsewhere shall be decided by the NTA/ MoSJ&E, whose decision in this regard shall be final, binding, and non-challengeable.

Caution:

Selection of the candidates shall be purely on the merit basis in a transparent way. Hence, the Candidate has to be careful of touts and selection racketeers, who promise to get them selected unlawfully on illegal considerations / means. Candidates/Parents/Guardians are cautioned not to fall prey to unscrupulous touts, crooks and fraudsters who may make false, bogus and misleading assurances/ claims while approaching them (using spoofed emails, SMS, fake telephone calls or forged documents or personally in the name of NTA/MoSJ&E for assistance with admission in exchange of monetary considerations. They are also likely to collect personal data of the aspiring candidates which may be misused by them in future. Neither NTA nor MoSJ&E has authorised any person or agency to offer help for online registration and support for SHRESHTA (NETS) on their website or to use the name, logo and their website contents. It is hereby made clear that NTA or MoSJ&E do not have any agents or touts, liaison, admission offices, representatives or any other office/ school than those mentioned on the official website. In case candidates are approached by any such agent promising undue favours, they should not respond to such offers and should immediately approach the police Authorities if the situation so warrants. Candidates could get their grievances addressed and ascertain the status of their candidature from the public grievances and nodal officers at NTA/Helpdesk.

Further, the NTA/ MoSJ&E has not appointed any agent(s) or coaching advertisement for action on its behalf. Candidates are warned against any such claims being made by persons/agencies. Candidates are selected purely as per merit. Beware of unscrupulous elements and do not fall in their trap. Candidates attempting to influence NTA/ MoSJ&E directly or indirectly shall be

disqualified and legal action can be initiated against them. Candidates are advised to visit only the official website of NTA and/or MoSJ&E and beware of FAKE websites put up by unscrupulous elements/touts.

LEGAL JURISDICTION:

All disputes pertaining to the conduct of SHRESHTA (NETS) -2026 including results shall fall within the jurisdiction of Delhi / New Delhi only. Further, any legal question arising out of the Examination shall be entertained only when raised within 30 days from the declaration of result.

RETENTION POLICY:

The record of SHRESHTA (NETS)-2026 would be preserved upto 2 months after declaration of result of each Stage and thereafter will be weeded out as per standard operating procedures.

CHOICE OF CITIES

The Cities where the SHRESHTA (NETS)-2026 will be conducted are given in CHAPTER-14. While applying, candidates have to select any four cities of their choice. The efforts will be made to allot the city of examination to the candidates in order of choice opted by them in their online Application Form. However, due to administrative/logistic reasons, a different city can be allotted.

NOTE:

- 1. While filling up Online Application Form, candidates should One Convenient City from the above list of cities as their choice of centre cities in order of their priority.
- 2. NTA will not be responsible for any inconvenience due to incorrect selection of city codes by the candidates.
- 3. In case, the number of candidates opting for a city is less than a certain minimum, NTA reserves its right not to allot any centre in that City.
- 4. In case, the number of candidates opting for a city as centre is less than certain minimum, candidates may be allotted Centre in another city irrespective of the city opted by the candidates for appearing in the examination.
- 5. Though, every effort will be made to allot a centre in one of the cities selected by the candidate, the NTA reserves its right to allot a centre in a city other than the candidate's choice. Allotment of centre's will be done by the computer and there will be no human intervention.
- 6. All efforts will be made by NTA to consider the comfort and convenience of candidates while allotting centres. However, Center/City allocation will depend upon technical and logistical feasibility. Candidates may have to travel to other Cities/States.

BARRED ITEMS

Candidates are not allowed to carry the following items inside the examination centre under any circumstances. Candidates will be subjected to extensive and compulsory frisking before entering the exam centre with the help of hand-held metal detectors.

- Any stationery item like textual material (printed or written) bits of papers, geometry/pencil box, Plastic Pouch, calculator, pen, scale, writing pad, pen drives, eraser, electronic pen or scanner etc
- Any communication device like mobile phone, blue tooth, earphones, micro phone, pager, health band etc
- Other items like wallet, goggles, handbags, belt, cap etc
- Any watch or wristwatch, bracelet, camera etc
- Any ornaments/metallic item
- Any food item opened or packed
- Any other item which could be used for unfair means, by hiding communication device like microchip, camera, bluetooth device etc.

No arrangement will be made at the centres for keeping any articles, /items belonging to the candidates.

In case any candidate is found in possession of any of the barred items inside the centre it will be considered as use of Unfair Means and action will be taken against the candidate in accordance with the relevant provisions.

INFORMATION FOR CANDIDATES/PARENTS/GUARDIANS

- 1. It is expected that parents/guardians will guide their wards appropriately on the following issues before leaving home for appearing in SHRESHTA (NETS)-2026.
- 2. Candidates should avoid coming with more than one escort (parent/ guardian). Escorts shall remain outside the gate during the conduct of the examination.
- 3. Candidate will not be allowed to enter the exam centre after Gate Closing Time. Therefore, the candidate shall leave home well in advance, taking into consideration various factors such as traffic, location of the centre and weather conditions etc. It would be appropriate to visit the centre a day before the examination to confirm the location, distance etc. to avoid any problem of reaching late at the centre and then not being allowed to appear in the examination.
- 4. Candidate shall follow all the instructions and maintain discipline in the examination hall.
- 5. Candidate shall not breach any examination rule.
- 6. Candidate shall not use or promote any unfair means activity during the examination.
- 7. Candidate will not be allowed to leave the exam hall till the conclusion of the exam. Candidate is advised not to attend examination on an empty stomach.
- 8. In case the candidate finds another candidate using unfair means in the examination, the same shall be immediately informed to the invigilators on duty.
- 9. Candidate are permitted to bring only the following items, to the examination centre:
 - Admit card (with Self Declaration on it downloaded from NTA website) with passport size photograph and thumb impression affixed on it
 - Valid and original Photo ID proof
 - Drinking water in a personal transparent water bottle
 - A simple transparent black/blue ball point pen only
 - Passport size photograph for affixing on the attendance sheet
 - A candidate shall not bring any barred items to the centre.
- 10. Candidate shall co-operate in frisking with the staff at Examination Centre.
- 11. Candidate will report at the centre at the time indicated on his/her admit card to make themselves available for compulsory frisking and completing other registration procedures.
- 12. Candidates are advised to regularly visit website https://exams.nta.nic.in/shreshta/ and also check registered email /SMS for any update regarding examination.
- 13. In case your ward is found breaching any of the above-mentioned rules, your ward will not be permitted to enter the examination centre and will not be allowed to appear in the examination.
- 14. If your ward indulges in any unwanted activities, he/ she shall be debarred from taking this examination as per rules and shall also be liable for criminal action and or any action as may be deemed fit by NTA.

ADMIT CARD

- 1. The Admit Card is issued provisionally to all the candidates, subject to the fulfillment of the eligibility conditions.
- 2. Admit card will be hosted on the NTA website https://exams.nta.nic.in/shreshta/ https://exams.nta.nic
- 3. The candidate has to download the Admit Card from the NTA website using their application number and date of birth and appear for the Examination at the given Centre on Date and Timing as indicated in his/her Admit Card.
- 4. Admit card is not transferable to any other person. Impersonation is a legally punishable offence.
- 5. No candidate will be allowed to appear at the examination centre, on Date and Timing other than that allotted to him/her in his/her Admit card.
- 6. In case candidate is unable to download Admit Card from the website, the candidate should approach the **NTA Help Line between 10:00 am and 05:00 pm.**
- 7. The candidates are advised to read the instructions on the Information Bulletin as well as on the Admit Card carefully and follow them during the conduct of the examination.

Note:

- a. Candidate must be in possession of the Admit Card to appear in the examination.
- b. Candidate may please note that Admit Card will not be sent by post.
- c. In no case, the duplicate Admit Card for SHRESHTA-2026 would be issued at the Examination Centres.
- d. Candidate must not mutilate/disfigure the Admit Card or change any entry made therein.
- e. The validity of the Admit Card is only upto the day of Examination. Candidates are advised to preserve their Admit Card in good condition for future reference.
- f. No Admit Card shall be issued to the candidates whose Applications are found to be incomplete for any reason (including indistinct/ doubtful photographs/without uploaded signatures) or who do not fulfill the eligibility criteria for the examination.
- g. Issue of Admit Card, however, shall not necessarily mean acceptance of eligibility which shall be further scrutinized at subsequent stages of admission process.

USE OF UNFAIR MEANS/ MALPRACTICE

DEFINITION

- 1. Use of unfair means or malpractice allows a candidate to gain an undue advantage over other candidates. It includes, but is not limited to:
 - (a) Being in possession of any item or article which has been prohibited or can be used unfairly, including any stationery item, communication device, accessories, eatable items, ornaments or any other material or information relevant or not relevant to the examination in the paper concerned;
 - (b) Using someone to write examination (impersonation) or preparing material for copying;
 - (c) Breaching examination rules or any direction issued by NTA from time to time in connection with the conduct of **SHRESHTA** (**NETS**) examination.
 - (d) Assisting other candidates to engage in malpractices, giving or receiving assistance of any kind, directly or indirectly or attempting to do so;
 - (e) Writing questions or answers on any material other than on the OMR answer sheet given by the Centre Superintendent for writing answers;
 - (f) Tearing of answer sheet, any page of the exam booklet etc.;
 - (g) Contacting or communicating or trying to do so with any person, other than the Examination Staff, during the examination time in the Examination Centre;
 - (h) Taking away the answer sheet out of the examination hall/room;
 - (i) Smuggling out answer sheet or part thereof;
 - (j) Threatening any of the officials connected with the conduct of the examination or threatening any of the candidates or using violence against anyone;
 - (k) Using or attempting to use any other undesirable method or means in connection with the examination;
 - (1) Manipulation and fabrication of online documents viz. admit card, rank letter, self-declaration, etc.;
 - (m) Forceful entry/exit in/from Examination Centre/Hall;
 - (n) Use or attempted use of any electronic device after entering the Examination Centre;
 - (o) Affixing/uploading of wrong/morphed photographs on the application form/admit card/proforma;
 - (p) Erasing or obliterating any information printed on the OMR answer sheet;
 - (q) Providing incorrect information on the answer sheet;
 - (r) Making fake claims by manipulating the responses in OMR sheet uploaded on website for challenge before or after declaration of result.
 - (s) Creating obstacles in smooth and fair conduct of examination or creating disturbance to others inside the examination hall/room/centre.

- (t) Making an approach or attempting to influence the outcome of the result after the examination.
- (u) Any other malpractice declared as unfair means by the NTA.

PUNISHMENT FOR USING UNFAIR MEANS/MALPRACTICE

During the course of, before or after the examination if a candidate indulges in any of the above or similar incident, he/she shall be deemed to have used unfair practices and booked under UNFAIR MEANS (UFM) case. The candidate may be debarred from future exams.

CANCELLATION OF RESULT

- (a) The candidature and result of **SHRESHTA (NETS)-2026** of the candidates who indulge in Unfair Means/ Malpractice will be cancelled and will not be declared.
- (b) Similarly, the result of those candidates who appear from the Centre other than the one allotted to them, write on the Exam booklet/ OMR Sheet of other candidates or allow other candidates to write on their Exam Booklet/ OMR Sheet will be cancelled (and will not be declared).

2. Re-Evaluation/Re-Checking of Result

There shall be no re-evaluation/re-checking of the result. No correspondence in this regard shall be entertained.

ADMISSION

The Admission Policy, as announced by the Competent Authority of the admitting schools shall be followed at the time of admission. The Candidates are advised to satisfy themselves about their Eligibility for Admission.

Role of NTA is confined to registration of candidates and conduct of exam. Further, finalization of answer keys processing and declaration of results is being done by NTA. Admission and Counselling of the candidates is being done by MoSJ&E. NTA has no role to play in Admission and Counselling or other downstream processes.
