# Court & Case Management through NJDG

## 1.Introduction

National Judicial data grid (NJDJ) is the database where our entire judicial case data, including orders and judgements, are stored under the two heads: (i) District and Taluk Court NJDG; and (ii) High Court NJDG. National Judicial Data grid was inaugurated for public access on 19 September 2015 by Hon'ble Mr Justice Madan B. Lokur, then Judge in-charge of eCommittee Supreme Court of India. NJDG for High Courts was launched by the learned Attorney General of India, Shri. K. K. Venugopal in the august presence of Hon'ble Dr Justice Dhananjaya Y Chandrachud, Judge, Supreme Court of India & Chairperson of eCommittee at a virtual meeting held on 3 July 2020.

NJDG data is available on a real-time basis. These statistics are updated every day by the respective Courts across the country through the Case Information System (CIS). NJDG got the stamp of the world bank and moved India 20 ranks forward in the ranking of countries under ease of doing business. Administrative login to NJDG will give greater details ,inputs and reports. The real-time statistics of NJDG can be used in multifarious ways by the administrative judges: (i) Court Management Tool; (ii) Case Management Tool; (iii) Policy Planning; (iv) Policy decision making; and (v) Digital inspection, etc.

**District and Taluk Court NJDG:** As on 1 October 2021, the District and Taluk Court NJDG has details of Pending Cases: Civil Cases (10673184); Criminal



Cases (26325882); Total cases (36184451); Disposed of Civil Cases (30594898); Disposed of Criminal Cases (81930711); Disposed of Total Cases (112525609); and Total orders of District Judiciary (155043519).

**High Court NJDG:** As on 1 October 2021 is also a repository with details of Pending Cases: Civil Cases (5614787); Criminal Cases (4824697); Total Cases (4824697); Disposed of Civil Cases (20075171); Disposed of Criminal Cases (11673049); and Disposed of Total Cases (31748220).

**Query builder** tool can be used to generate the customisable report as required by the High Courts and District Courts.

**Types of Reports:** One can generate reports agewise, stagewise, case type-wise list, orders not uploaded list, undated cases list of every District, Taluk, High Court wise, Judgewise etc. Example: List of particular case type which are 20/30/40 years old from all District Courts; List of cases pending in District Courts which are stayed by High Court, Supreme Court; List of appeals pending with percentage of more than 5-year-old appeals; which court has the most number of appeals; List of the officers who have disposed of the Highest cases/Lowest cases; total number of Writ Petitions, First Appeals, Revisions, etc, can be easily known through the dashboard.

All this at a click of the mouse which can be used by the Administrative Judges for further planning and instructions for reducing pendency and for effective Court and Case Management at the District and High Court level.

## 2. NJDG Access

### 2.1. Through NJDG webpage:

NJDG can be accessed directly through the NJDG webpage. A simple Google search of the word “NJDG” will take one to the NJDG web page. Otherwise, one can click the following link to access NJDG webpage as well: <https://njdg.ecourts.gov.in/njdgnew/index.php>

### 2.2. Through e-Committee website link:

NJDG can also be accessed through the new eCommittee website (<https://ecommitteesci.gov.in/>). NJDG is provided under the tab of “Citizen’s Corner” on the eCommittee’s website. In order to access the NJDG on the eCommittee’s website, one should proceed in the following order on the website Citizen corner --> Cltizen centric services --> NJDG. Else, one can also access NJDG through Committee's website by using the following link: <https://ecommitteesci.gov.in/service/national-judicial-data-grid/>


### 2.3. Through E-Courts services website:

NJDG can also be accessed through the E-Courts services website ([https://services.ecourts.gov.in/ecourtindia\\_v6/](https://services.ecourts.gov.in/ecourtindia_v6/)). One can click on the “NJDG” tab, which is made available on the top panel of the website, and it will take them directly to the NJDG webpage. One can use any one of these options to access the NJDG.


### 3. High Court NJDG




The home page of the NJDG welcomes you with colourful bands, with the “NJDG High Court” tab on the top right corner and the “NJDG (District and Taluka Courts of India)” tab on the top left corner. To access the National Judicial Data Grid for High Courts, one needs to click the “High Court NJDG” tab available on the right side corner of the NJDG home page. It will open up the NJDG for the High Courts.



The coloured statistical bands display real time statistics of High Courts under various headings, such as: Total No. of Civil Cases; Total No. of Criminal Cases; Total Cases; Civil Cases more than 1-year-old; Criminal Cases more than 1-year-old; Total No. of Cases more than 1-year-old.



The home page of the High Court NJDG has three main tab options: (i) Drill Down; (ii) Pending Dashboard; and (iii) Disposed Dashboard. The screenshot of the NJDG High Court home page showing the tab options is also appended for ready reference. Each of the tabs has a variety of options bundled up, which is discussed in detail under separate headings.



The NJDG High court home page also gives one the option of selecting the High Court and the respective High Court Bench from the drop-down list to set the desired statistics of any particular High Court or its Bench. For example, if Bombay High Court is selected in the first drop-down, it will display the corresponding Benches for the Bombay High Court from which one can then choose.




## 4. District and Taluka Courts NJDG



To access the National Judicial Data Grid for District and Taluka Courts, one needs to click the “National Judicial Data Grid (District and Taluka Courts of India)” tab available on the left side corner of the NJDG home page. It will open up the NJDG for District and Taluka Courts of India.






The NJDG District and Taluka Courts of India home page also displays a variety of statistics under five main tabs: (i) Drill Down; (ii) Pending Dashboard; (iii) Disposed Dashboard; (iv) Alerts; and (v) Information Management. Under Each of the tabs a variety of options are bundled up which is discussed in elaborate under separate headings.

The home page also gives one the option of selecting the State and




District from the drop-down list to get the desired statistics of any particular District. For example, when Andhra Pradesh is chosen in the State drop-down, the corresponding Districts from Andhra Pradesh are displayed in the District drop-down, from where one can choose the required District and get the NJDG data for that particular District.



## 5. Admin Login

Administrative Judges can use Admin login to NJDG for a variety of administrative purposes. This login for Admin can be created by the respective Central Project Coordinators of the High Courts for the portfolio Judges of High Courts, Principal District Judges, Chief Judicial Magistrates and other Administrative Registrars, as per the administrative requirement of each High Court. The login through the Admin user ID will open up a variety of tabs, as shown in the screenshot below, which can be used as a Court and Case Management tool by the Administrative Judges.



## 5.2. Admin Sub menus




Under each of the main NJDG tabs, a bundle of sub-menus are available. For example, under the tab of “Data Monitoring”, there are 15 sub-menus as shown in the screenshot above on the right. It includes options such as, Yearwise Victim Count, Email Sent Count, Mobile Email Details, Court Complex Report, Summary Report of Courts, etc. Similarly, under the tab “NJDG”, several important sub-menus are made available, including Query Builder, Return Report, Judgewise Disposal, Establishmentwise Reports, Police Stationwise Pendency, Case Type Wise, etc. The list of sub-menus available under the “NJDG” tab is also captured in the screenshot herewith. These NJDG reports can be put to multiple uses. For example, if a crime meeting is arranged, the details of the station-wise pendency report of NJDG reports can be utilised for review and discussion of a crime meeting. These data are real-time statistics that can be put to use to improvise the efficiency of various Courts. The other tabs and its submenus are tabulated herewith for easy reference.



## 5.4. Help Desk



One very useful menu available for the admin user is the online “Help Desk” option. The status of the troubleshooting is displayed in regards to how many are resolved, unresolved and closed. Under the “Help Desk” option, one can login and enter the required Technical Help, which will be assigned a ticket number. The District level technical Admin users can make an entry of their troubleshooting in this option, which will then go to the State level team for resolving. If the troubleshooting relates to the District level or Taluk level issue, the same will be handled by the State team. Only when the issue relates to the National level, does it need to be forwarded by the State Admin to the National Level. Once the issue is resolved, it will be displayed as closed. The screen shot of the help desk below will speak more on this.

## 5.5. Digital Inspection of a particular Court

Another important Court Management tool available for an Admin user is the “Dashboard” option, where any Administrative Judge can log into the dashboard of any particular Court under their Judicial District. This menu is available only for the Admin users under the tab “Management Tools”, through which the Administrative Judge can login directly to the CIS dashboard of any particular District Court or Taluk Court.

For example, the screenshot above shows the Admin Login into the District Session Judge Court of Assam. Through this login, the Administrative Judge can get the total pending cases of that particular Court, the disposal of that particular Court for a given month, top pending cases (category wise) of that particular Court. The Admin user can also view the cases under Mediation and Lok Adalat of that particular Court. Hence, this menu provides for digital inspection of any Court under the District Judiciary by the Administrative Judges of the High Court, the Principal District Judge, or any Administrative Head. This tool is a way forward in attaining complete digital inspection without physically visiting the concerned Court.

## 5.6. DCMS (District Court Monitoring System) Report

Under the DCMS report, an Administrative Judge can effectively monitor the District Judiciary's work on any particular day. The report captures Cases Fixed for Evidence; Witnesses Examined; Issues Framed; Charges Framed, Arguments Heard; Part-heard Matters heard; disposal of Interlocutory Applications; Disposal of contested and uncontested Cases; Cases filed (Civil or Criminal) of any particular Court. This data, regarding the work done, need to be entered by every Court on a daily basis under DCMS through the CIS. If a Court examines 20 witnesses and it is not entered in CIS through DCMS, then the witness examination will be shown as 0. Hence, in the training programmes, the awareness and the importance of CIS data entry under DCMS is also stressed upon.

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## 5.7. Query Builder

The “Query Builder” option available under the Admin login is the most useful Court and Case Management tool. Using “Query Builder”, one can generate a variety of customized reports according to one’s individual needs.

Query Builder has a variety of options for generating reports from NJDG as shown in the screenshot herein. One can get a report of pending/disposed cases, with multiple search criteria and combinations such as case type, stagewise, act wise, party wise, as per registration date, filing date of any particular state, district, etc. It is recommended for everyone to try their hands in the “Query Builder” toption, which is the *Akshayapatram* of NJDG and has the potential to generate numerous combination reports

needed for effective Court and Case Management.

Under the Admin Login through the Dashboard, the Administrative Judge can check the disposal for a particular month by a particular Judge. Under this option, the entire list of cases disposed of by the Judge will be displayed. The Administrative Judge can check the time spent by the Court in disposing of the case, and can also directly view the orders and judgments of the particular Judge. This is a game-changer, which will pave the way for increased judicial efficiency and productivity.

Through this tool, under “Disposed Case and Order”, the entire history and lifespan of a case can be digitally inspected by an Administrative Judge. As stated earlier, the Administrative Judge can get the entire details of the disposed case including the case details, case status, case history, along with final orders and judgements.



A new option has been provided under NJDDG for capturing the “Judicial Time”, spent case wise and also Judge wise. This option will help us to track the judicial time spent by the Judge for a particular period, and also to capture the judicial time spent in a particular case. During training programmes, awareness is created to ensure entries are made for this data so that in the coming years, this feature will also be one of the top administrative tools in finding out the judicial time spent by the Judges in the whole, and also to get figures for the judicial time spent case wise.

### 5.11. Pendency report under Admin Login

Under Admin Login, the pendency of cases of any District or establishment of a particular Court can be generated under this option. One can select the State, then select the District, then select the date for which the pendency report is needed and thereafter click on "Go" to generate the pending list of cases. The top 10 high pendency States, top 10 high pendency Districts within a state, top 10 high pendency establishments in one District, all can be generated and the screenshots of the same are appended below.

This will be useful for an Administrative Judge to understand what is the workload of cases of a particular District or an establishment or a particular Court, and even decide whether there is any need for bifurcation of the Courts or not. Even while making a simple transfer of the staff, an Administrative Judge can find out the workload of any particular Court and the disposal of a particular Judge through the NJDG.







## 8. Drill Down



The “Drill Down” tab provided under NJDG is a very useful and interesting tool. Under this tab, the figures which are displayed in blue colour can be clicked on to further drill down the details. For example, on the screen one can see the year wise pendency of cases under various categories. One such category is 20-30 year cases and if the figure is clicked, it will further show up the break up details. Using this option, one can even find out the oldest case which is pending in the particular State or District or establishment or in a particular Court.

The drill down main page provides the options for drill down under the following heads: Pending Cases (Year Wise); Case Type Wise; Institution; Disposal; Woman; Senior Citizen; and Delay Reason Wise.

How to find an old pending case in a particular District? Here, for example, the pending cases of the particular District are displayed yearwise. Under that, if one clicks the cases "above 30 years", it gives the split up figures and one can see that there are 11 criminal cases shown which are more than 30 years old. Now, when one clicks the figure 11, it will give them the further split up year wise, that is 1986, 1987 and 1997. Now, when one clicks on that 1 under 1986, it shows them that the District and Session Judge Balasore is where the case is pending. Further, if one wanted to know what is the case number in that particular Court, then they would just have to click the 1 and

it will give them the entire case history. Thus, an Administrative Judge sitting in his chamber can find out what are all the top pending cases in the District Judiciary in a particular District or in a particular Court and can issue directions for working towards its disposal, and these steps will fast track the disposal of the oldest cases under the said administrative unit.

As per the directions of the Supreme Court, a great concern has been to bring down the delay involved in the disposal of the cases and also to reduce the pendency of cases. As a way forward towards it, a new option has been introduced by the SCI to capture the delay reason involved in each case. Under this option, every Court in the country is now required to enter the “delay reason” for every case which is more than 2 years old and those delay reasons are tabled under various headings, such as, awaiting documents, difficult in securing the presence of important witnesses, non-availability of Counsel, etc. For example, many cases are tabled under one of the delay

reasons for the pendency of the State. If you click on that option, it will further drill down into a variety of said options like stayed for other reasons, stayed by High court, stayed by Court other than the Supreme Court or High Court and stayed by Supreme Court. These said particulars under delay reasons are also reflected as graphical pie charts and graphical line charts. Using this option, any Administrative Judge right from the District level to the High Court level can find out, with the click of a mouse, as to how many cases are pending as stayed by the High Court or the Supreme Court, and it can be worked out to reduce the pendency of cases.







## 9.1. Matter Type Pendency Pie Chart





## 9.2. Age wise pendency pie Chart





### 9.3. Stage wise pendency Pie chart





## 9.4. Institution versus Disposal




The comparative graphical chart of institution versus disposal for any particular year can be obtained using this option, and one can get the comparative graphical analysis regarding institution and disposal as well.


### 10.1. Case type wise disposal

### 10.3. Judge Wise Disposal




disposal option can also be utilised to know the disposal of all the Judges in a particular unit, so that the administrative Judge will be able to find out which Judge is disposing which type of cases in his administrative unit. There is also another option under this category where the disposal by the Judge can be chosen for any particular period by selecting the dates. Here, in a given example, the District session Judge category is chosen from an establishment to find out the disposal of cases of the said Judges.

Naturewise disposal charts give details on the variety of the disposal types like decreed, allowed, convicted, dismissed, discharged, etc.




## 10.5. Time to disposition




This option tracks the time taken for disposal of a particular case. This is very useful to find out what is the average time taken for the disposal of original suit appeal, suit application and execution, whether this one year or 1-2 years or 2-3 years or more than 10 years. This option can be used for further study in analysing the road to disposal of the cases. This option will be reflected only if the concerned Courts are filling up the data regarding this option, and if these data are not filled up by the concerned Courts, it will not be reflected in NJDG and we will not be able to obtain this interesting data analysis. Hence, in the eCommittee training programmes, we have a strategy for filing up this data regarding time taken for disposition.

## 11. Information Management
