

ICT initiatives adopted High Court of Uttarakhand

1	Mobile Court Units (M.C.U.)	<p>It is well known that the remoteness of habitats and virtual absence of transport facilities in remote and tough landscapes of Uttarakhand, pose a huge challenge for the litigants. Further the time lost in recording the evidence of witnesses who are located in far off places is also a matter of grave concern as it inordinately prolongs the life of a case. A lot of precious court time is wasted in securing the presence of medical and formal witnesses like Doctors and Policemen Investigation Officers for their evidence, as they are frequently transferred from one place to another. Hence, vehicles fully equipped with Video Conferencing hardware, Internet connectivity have been provided to all the District Courts of the State to facilitate evidence of women and child witnesses who are also victim of grave offence like sexual assault, disabled/physically challenged or infirm witnesses and of medical and Police witnesses.</p>
2	Legal Aid Information System	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• This website/portal has been developed for Uttarakhand State Legal Service Authority.• This portal shows all the application for legal aid along with present status of their processing that are registered in this website from the various Districts of Uttarakhand State relating to legal aid in the cases before Hon'ble High Court as well as

		from all District Courts.
3	Budget Monitoring System	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • This portal is used by Account Section of this High Courts and District courts. • This portal keeps the record of Budget allocation from High Court and utilization of that Budget by District Courts. • Various MIS reports are generated by this portal which is beneficial for both High court and District court.
4	Inspection Pendency Report Portal	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • This portal is used by Inspection Section of the Hon'ble High Court of Uttarakhand. • This portal keeps the record of all District Courts Cases data (including institution, disposal, pendency, Opening and closing balances). • In this portal data is collected month wise. • The portal shows Online Pendency and Arrears of cases. • This portal shows District wise pendency record of CIS as well as Non CIS data and therefore helps in comparing the difference if any, between data of CIS and Non CIS data of each District.
5	Recruitment Management System	This portal keeps the record of the staff like- No. of vacant positions, working strength and sanctioned post in each court of the District as well as in the High Court.

6	Under Trial Prisoner Management System	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • This portal was developed for Admin Section of this High Court as well as for Subordinate Courts. • Through this portal, one can keep track of the under trial prisoner along with their sentences.
7	Portal for uploading pdf file according to Daily Cause List	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • This portal has been developed for viewing pdf of those cases that are published in Daily Cause list. • All Sections of Hon'ble High Court uploads pdf of cases present in the Daily cause list. • Court can view and download these pdf's according to matters in the Cause list.
8	Software for sending Cause List through Email	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • This portal is used for sending published cause list through email to the petitioner and Advocates whose cases are listed in cause list. • This software picks up the advocate and party email ids from CIS and sends consolidated published cause list to their email IDs.
9	DCPMT(District Court Pendency Monitoring Tool)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • This portal is being developed for monitoring and evaluation of Pendency, and disposal records of each Judicial Officers (District Court). • This portal analyzes data of Judicial Officers according to these parameters:- <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Issues framed or Charged framed. (ii) Statement recorded under 313 CrPc. (iii) Witness Examined. (iv) Argument heard and cases fixed for Judgment.

		(v) Disposal (Judgement and Orders).
10	Modified Online Display Board for Subordinate Courts	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Display board has been modified for the benefit of the litigant to view real-time court proceedings. Bench Secretary/Reader (Peshkar) present in a Court enters data in the Business field along with other fields of CIS, which is then reflected in the display board installed outside the Courtroom. • The display board shows data such as:- court proceeding order, purpose, witness name, next date fixed for the case etc. • The modified Display board is presently functional in the District of Uttarkashi, PauriGarhwal, Almora, Champawat and Dehradun districts, respectively.
11	Witness Statement Recording Software	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A Witness Statement writer is created to record the statement of the witness. • It has an inbuilt writer which is integrated with CIS Software. Reader/User can open this software from CIS Case Diary and can continue typing the witness statement within CIS. Once the witness statement is completed it is saved in the CIS server in pdf format. • Earlier, a Reader used to open Microsoft office doc or LibreOffice writer and record the statement on it. After typing the statement, the .doc file is stored locally on that user's computer. Thus, there are chances of misplacement, mishandling, or altering of statement so recorded.

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The software has been implemented in the District of Pauri Garhwal, Uttarkashi, Almora and Champawat.
12	<p>Leave Management System</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Leave Management System portal is developed for Judicial Officers of Subordinate Court to apply for leaves electronically, instead of applying on papers (Physical form). • Each Judicial Officer is provided with individual login credentials who can apply for leave through the portal after logging in. A Judicial Officer can apply for almost every kind of leave such as Earned Leave, Paternity Leave, Medical Leave, Maternity Leave, Casual Leave, Station Leave, etc. • In this system leaves, such as, Casual Leave, Station leave, etc requiring district-level approval can be approved by the concerned District Judge. • Leave such as Earned Leave, Medical Leave, etc that require approval at the High court approval is forwarded by the concerned District Judge to High Court. The flow of such type of leave application is as follow: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) JO -> DJ - > ADMIN -> R(I) -> HON'BLE JUDGE (ii) Judicial Officer can track the status of their application at any stage. • This portal is a huge step toward paperless
