# DIGITIZATION

**Digitization is not just about technology; it is a change in mindset and an opportunity to enhance access to justice. Let us work together towards this goal, keeping in mind the importance of this change for the betterment of our justice system and society as a whole.**



# DIGITIZATION

- **In today's world, Information Technology is not simply a tool, it has become an environment. The Rajasthan High Court has recognized this shift and embarked on a journey towards digitization in October 2018, in collaboration with an empanelled vendor.**
- **While the digitization process has been implemented effectively in the Rajasthan High Court, the District and Subordinate Courts of Rajasthan are yet to commence scanning and digitization of records.**
- **It's noteworthy that the Rajasthan High Court began its digitization efforts even before the Digital Preservation Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) was shared by Hon'ble e-Committee. However, the digitization process is being carried out in compliance with the guidelines prescribed in the aforementioned SOP.**

# SCANNING FACILITY



In an effort to encourage the adoption of e-filing among advocates and litigants, Rajasthan High Court has established e-filing centers in Jodhpur and Jaipur. These centers offer a range of services to help individuals file cases electronically, eliminating the need for paper-based filing.

The e-filing centers are equipped with state-of-the-art scanning facilities to ensure that documents can be digitized accurately and efficiently. The centers also have trained personnel who can assist advocates and litigants with the e-filing process if they require any help.

To make these services accessible to everyone, the e-filing centers charge a nominal fee of only 50 paise per page. This fee covers both the scanning and e-filing services provided by the centers.

The digitization firm that is responsible for managing the High Court's digitization efforts has been deputed to run these e-filing centers. This ensures that the centers operate efficiently and that the quality of the services provided is maintained at a high level.

Overall, these e-filing centers represent a significant step forward for the Rajasthan High Court in its efforts to go paperless and digitize its operations. They make it easier and more convenient for advocates and litigants to file cases electronically, helping to streamline the judicial process and reduce reliance on paper-based documents.

# APPOINTMENT OF COURT STAFF

**The shortage of court staff has been a persistent challenge for the efficient functioning of our court system. However, we have taken steps to bridge and minimize this gap.**

- Approximately 750 recruitments were made at various positions at the Rajasthan High Court in the year 2020.**
- A recruitment drive for 2756 Junior Judicial Assistants & 3678 Class IV Employees is currently underway and will be completed soon.**
- These measures are aimed at improving the delivery of justice and ensuring that our courts continue to function effectively.**

**Despite the shortfall in court staff, our dedicated team has been putting in their 100 percent and working tirelessly to ensure the smooth functioning of the court. We truly admire and appreciate their unwavering commitment to justice delivery.**





# CHALLENGES IN E-FILING

**E-filing has been implemented for all case types in the Rajasthan High Court and Trial Courts of Rajasthan, with detailed guidelines issued.**

**However, the following challenges have been identified:**

# SOLUTIONS FOR E-FILING

- 1. STREAMLINING RULES:** Streamlining rules for e-filing and methods to revamp the judicial process.
- 2. DATA MANAGEMENT SYSTEM:** Use of Data Management System for categorizing and bookmarking the data.
- 3. INTEROPERABLE CRIMINAL JUSTICE SYSTEM (ICJS):** Use of ICJS and Digital Solution Software integrated with e-Prison.
- 4. TRAINING & SENSITIZATION PROGRAM:** Training and sensitization program on e-filing by the stakeholders.
- 5. eSEWA KENDRAS & HELP DESK COUNTERS:** Establishing full-fledged eSewa Kendras and Help Desk Counters.

Addressing the challenges of e-filing will require a multi-pronged approach, including upgrading digital infrastructure, increasing digital literacy, and providing training to all stakeholders. The proposed solutions, if implemented, will significantly enhance the effectiveness and efficiency of e-filing in the Rajasthan High Court and the trial courts of Rajasthan.

# EMBRACING E-FILING

- 1. AWARENESS CAMPAIGNS:** The Rajasthan High Court has conducted several awareness campaigns to encourage lawyers and litigants to adopt e-filing. The campaigns have highlighted the benefits of e-filing, such as faster processing of cases and cost savings.
- 2. SIMPLIFIED PROCESS:** The Raj. HC has introduced a simplified process for e-filing, which involves uploading documents and paying the court fees online. The system is user-friendly and accessible to lawyers and litigants from remote areas.
- 3. ONLINE PAYMENT:** The Raj. HC has also introduced an online payment system for court fees and other charges. This has reduced the need for physical payments, saving time and effort.
- 4. DEDICATED HELPDESK:** To assist lawyers and litigants in the e-filing process, the Rajasthan High Court has established a dedicated helpdesk. The helpdesk provides technical support and guidance on e-filing-related issues.
- 5. E-FILING TRAININGS:** The court has conducted several training sessions to equip lawyers and litigants with the necessary skills to use the e-filing system. The training sessions have been conducted in person and online, making it accessible to all.

# MANDATORY E-FILING

**Digitization has been an ongoing process in Rajasthan High Court, aimed at bringing transparency and efficiency in the legal system. With the aim of increasing the number of e-filings, the High Court has introduced new measures to ensure more cases are filed electronically. In addition, from 01.01.2023, e-filing for 16 types of cases, irrespective of whether filed by a private party or the State/Central Government, has been made mandatory vide notification dated 17.12.2022.**

**The list of these 16 types of cases includes commercial appeals, customs appeals, income tax appeals and references, matters related to arbitration, intellectual property rights, and more. The Rajasthan High Court is committed to make the legal process faster and more efficient through digitization.**

This program displays the last page number of the petition/appeal on the High Court's website, indicating where the fresh pleadings should begin.

Lawyers and litigants can visit the website in advance to check the next available slot for paging before submitting their fresh pleadings.

The Rajasthan High Court is the first to develop such a computer program, which has been recognized as a best practice and shared with other High Courts.

This innovative computer program streamlines the process of continuous pagination, making it easier for lawyers and litigants to file their pleadings accurately and efficiently. 
## ONLINE PROGRAMME FOR FILING PERFORMANCE ASSESSMENT FOR JUDICIAL OFFICERS.



E-filing has become an essential part of the functioning of the Rajasthan High Court, and it is now available for all case types through the e-filing portal of the Hon'ble e-Committee, Supreme Court of India. The exhaustive guidelines for e-filing have been published and uploaded on the website to ensure streamlined and efficient processing of cases. From January 1, 2022, mandatory e-filing has been implemented for all cases of Central and State Government. Private parties are also required to file replies, affidavits, and applications through mandatory e-filing in such cases. To regulate mandatory e-filing, a notification was issued on December 20, 2021, and detailed guidelines were issued to streamline the entire process. On the request of the Rajasthan High Court, a separate mechanism for the creation of e-filing user accounts for Government Advocates has been provided by the Hon'ble E-Committee. This mechanism has been used to create e-filing user accounts for Advocate General, Additional Advocate Generals, and other Government Advocates/Counselors. From January 1, 2023, e-filing for 16 types of cases, irrespective of whether they are filed by private parties or the State/Central Government, has been made mandatory vide notification dated 17.12.2022. Mandatory e-filing has been successfully implemented and is working smoothly without any issue, streamlining the court's functioning and bringing in efficiency in the judicial process.

The birth of e-Prisons in Rajasthan High Court owes much to the efforts of Hon'ble Justice Sandeep Mehta (Presently Chief Justice of The Gauhati High Court). He had taken a PIL initiative to ensure that the State Judiciary leverages technology to improve access to justice and streamline the judicial process. As a result, in collaboration with NIC New Delhi, the Rajasthan High Court developed an indigenous digital solution software that is integrated with e-Prisons software. This software exchange databases of prisoners in the State of Rajasthan with the Rajasthan High Court and the District Courts. It includes details maintained through e-Prisons Software by police authorities, such as unique identification numbers of prisoners, dates of arrest, period of absconding, parole history, criminal antecedents, and issuance of custody certificates. Additionally, the court database is integrated with ePrisons, including court case details, court orders, hearing details, and causelist, among others. This software has a statistical database of prisoners and has multiple segments. It facilitates providing free Legal Aid Service to prisoners who cannot seek legal assistance due to poverty.

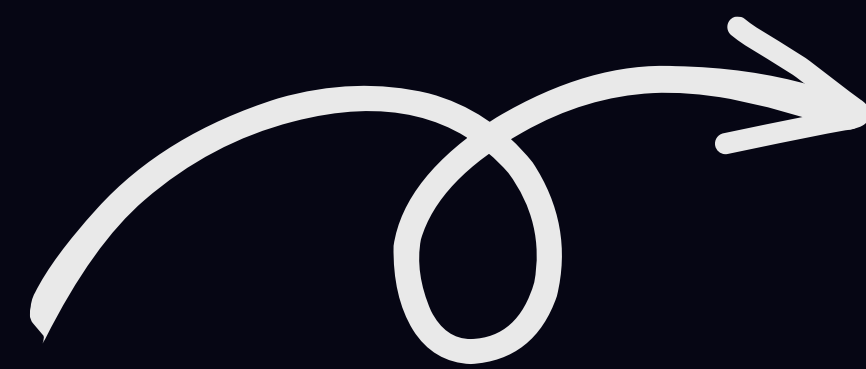

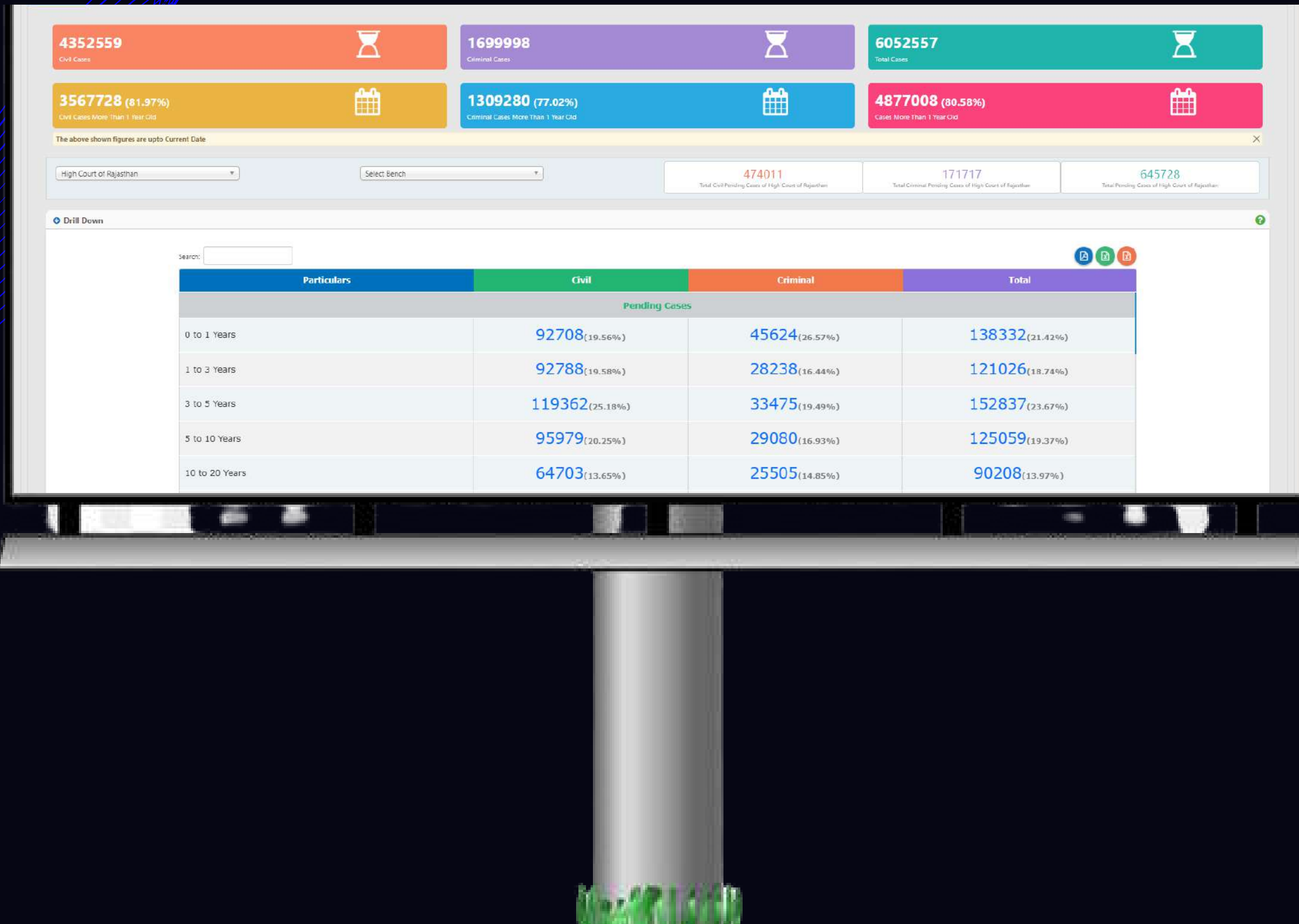
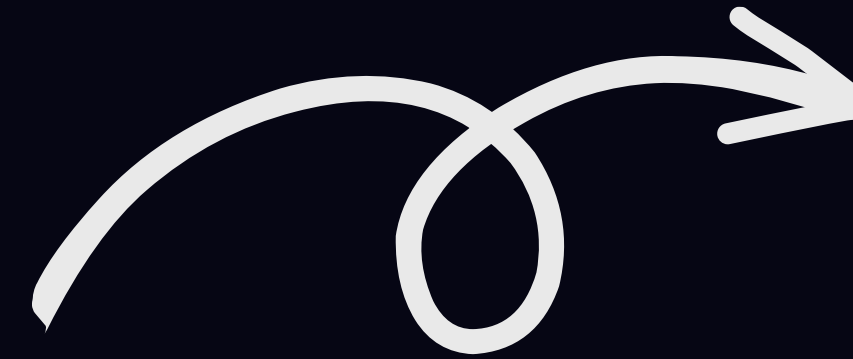

# E-PRISONS



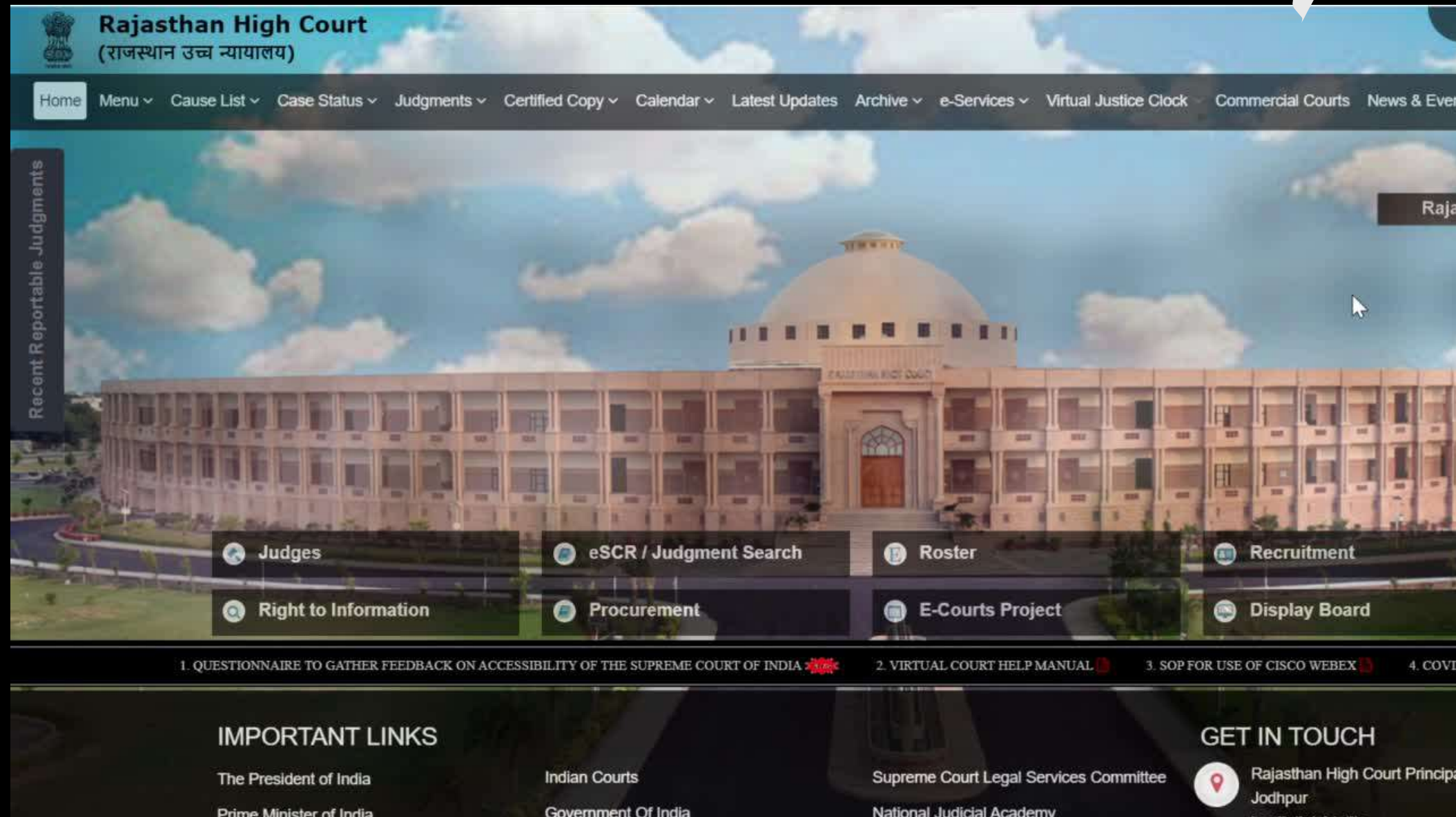


# DATA REPLICATION ACROSS ALL PLATFORMS


