



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Vision 2047

LADAKH'S DEVELOPMENT STRATEGY



Vision 2047 focuses on two specific areas i.e, **Economic Development** and **Infrastructure Development**. Based on these, it identifies gaps in the existing development scenario and proposes strategies to bridge the gaps and harness the potential available for the development of Ladakh.

Vision 2047 proposes **sector-wise strategies** tailored to local conditions of Ladakh. Realistic strategies, either being implemented or being planned by the other States/UTs of the country and in line with Central Government policies, have been proposed to ensure that these lead to formulation of implementable action plans further on.

Vision 2047 is the stepping stone in formulating a structured development blueprint to guide Ladakh's development strategy over the next 30 years.

Guiding Principles: The Vision 2047 for Ladakh is guided by **four principles - Self-sustainability, Smart Infrastructure, Carbon Neutrality** and **Integrated development**.

3-C Approach: With its scattered population, it is necessary to foster a sense of collectiveness and integration to develop a strong community culture in Ladakh, which in turn enables socio-economic development of its people. To address this, Vision 2047 recommends adopting a "hub and spoke" structure for balanced regional development. This is accomplished by 3-C strategy "Community, Connectivity & Clusters" to ensure service access to all in the UT.







ESTABLISHING EFFICIENT GOVERNANCE SYSTEMS

- **Ladakh Integrated Financial Management System (LIFMS)** implemented from 1st April 2022 for paperless budgeting, effective monitoring, budget planning and expenditure audit.
- **Financial services expanded** post formation of UT with banking services reaching remotest villages; **e-banking** and **e-seva portal** made functional.
- **Digitisation of land records** undertaken.
- **Emergency Response Support System (ERSS)** through helpline No. **112**; **Cyber-crime unit set up** with state-of-the-art Cyber Lab with cyber forensic capabilities.
- **Border Roads Organisation (BRO), Central Public Works Department (CPWD)** and other **Central Public Sector Undertakings (CPSUs) - National Highways and Infrastructure Development Corporation Ltd. (NHIDCL), Water and Power Consultancy Services (WAPCOS), National Projects Construction Corporation Limited, (NPCCCL)** etc. given 224 projects worth ₹ 3,155 Cr under UT budget.

ESTABLISHING EFFICIENT GOVERNANCE SYSTEMS

- **Sindhu Infrastructure Development Corporation (SIDCO)** set up as a multi-purpose construction agency to accelerate infrastructure works.
- **768 human resources** (consultants, engineers, accountants, nurses, etc.) hired on an outsourcing basis to strengthen executive agencies/departments.
- Capacity building of employees in Government e Marketplace (**GeM**), **Public Financial Management System (PFMS)**, **e-Tenders**, **e-Office**, **Project Management**, etc.

- The **State Land** stand transferred to respective **Ladakh Autonomous Hill Development Councils, (LAHDCs)** under Section 42 (1) of the LAHDC Act, 1997.

VIBRANT VILLAGE PROGRAMME

The Vibrant Village Programme (VVP) was launched on February 15, 2023, as a Centrally Sponsored Scheme aimed at facilitating comprehensive development in Changthang region, which comprises four blocks housing 34 villages, and Tyakshi village in Nubra sub-division.

The Changthang region is situated in eastern Ladakh, on the Indo-China border and is primarily inhabited by the nomadic *Changpa* tribe and their economy is centered around livestock and tourism.

The interventions encompass various aspects, including the promotion of tourism and cultural heritage, fostering skill development and entrepreneurship, and the establishment of cooperative societies. These cooperative societies encompass agriculture, horticulture, and the cultivation of medicinal plants and herbs. Additionally, the program seeks to improve infrastructure by providing road connectivity to previously isolated villages, enhancing housing and village community facilities, ensuring energy accessibility, including renewable sources, and extending television and telecom connectivity.

Key focus areas also include the development of greenhouses, pastureland, and fodder resources, Silvi pastoral units, improvements in education and healthcare infrastructure, sports facilities, tourism amenities, and enhancements of road and irrigation systems.



IMPLEMENTING 2019-2023
VILLAGE PROGRAMME

To promote the holistic development of these border villages, proposals totalling Rs. 624.98 Crores have been identified through consultations with various stakeholders, including Councillors of the Ladakh Hill Development Council (LAHDC) Leh, Block Development Councils, and other public representatives. These proposals have been reviewed and discussed in the District Level Committee and subsequently submitted to the Ministry of Home Affairs by the UT Level Committee.

Further, to maximize the reach of Centrally Sponsored Schemes and to ensure their effective implementation in rural areas, various activities are being carried out by line departments. These activities encompass Mobile Medical Unit Camps, screenings for tuberculosis, awareness campaigns, animal birth control programs, as well as cultural and sports programs in the villages.





- Ladakh successfully **hosted the Y-20 pre-summit** under the aegis of **G-20 India Summit** from **26th to 28th April, 2023**.
- Around **100 delegates** from over **30 countries** participated in the pre-summit.
