

2. During the course of the discussion, the Hon’ble Members presented several valuable suggestions covering various facets of the economy. These recommendations, aimed at further strengthening ongoing reforms and addressing critical economic challenges, have been compiled for further examination.

3. All concerned Departments/Ministries, as indicated in the enclosed document (**Annexure I**), are requested to examine these suggestions/recommendations. Kindly furnish your comments/views and take appropriate action where implementation is deemed feasible, based on the merit and practicability of each suggestion. The Action Taken Report (ATR) may be submitted to this Division at cordecndn-dea@nic.in for further necessary action by **14th August 2025**.

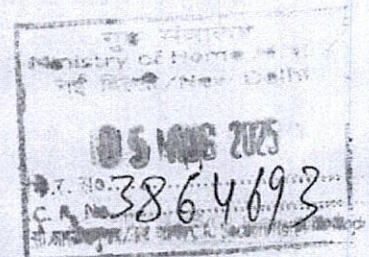

Annexure I**List of Suggestions of Consultative Committee for the Ministry of Finance: Discussion on the topic – “State of the Economy: Sustaining Reforms” held on 19th June 2025****1. Ease of Doing Business & Compliance**

1. **Reduce Compliances:** The biggest hurdle for ease of doing business in the MSME sector is the high number of compliances (around 170 compliances), which should be reduced. (Action: M/of MSME)
2. **Increase GST Registration Limit:** Increase the GST registration limit from Rs.20 lakh to a minimum of Rs. 50 lakh, considering average growth over the past 8 years. (Action: D/o Revenue, GST Council Secretariat)
3. **Consolidated Annual Information Report:** Create a single consolidated annual information report for all taxes, including the Companies Act, Income Tax Act, and TDS returns, instead of separate reports. (Action: NITI Aayog, MCA)
4. **Faceless GST Assessment:** Implement faceless assessment for GST, similar to income tax, in order to reduce corruption and target-based approaches of officials. (Action: D/o Revenue, GST Council Secretariat)
5. **Streamline Public Charitable Trust Registration/Renewal:** Simplify the registration and renewal process for public charitable trusts under the new policy. A dedicated team should address their concerns. (Action: D/o Revenue, Ministry of Law & Justice)
6. **Clear Reasons for Loan Rejection:** When MSME loan applications are rejected, the reason for rejection should be clearly communicated to the applicant, allowing for appeal or correction. Banks should receive specific instructions to assist genuinely needy MSME loan applicants and address unfair demands for collateral. (Action: D/o Financial Services)
7. **Investment Friendliness Index for States:** Publish an investment friendliness index alongside performance-linked grants to encourage state-level reforms like land titling, single-window clearances, and contract reinforcement. (Action: NITI Aayog)
8. **Address NCLT/NCLAT Delays:** Repeated delays in NCLT and NCLAT resolution matters need to be addressed. (Action: MCA)
9. **Change in Bank Mindset for Capital Access:** The mindset of banks needs to change to align with government and RBI policies, especially regarding collateral requirements for MSMEs and farmers seeking loans. (Action: D/o Financial Services)
10. **Monitoring Bank Loan Rejection Rates:** The Ministry should monitor banks with high MSME loan rejection rates and come up with a better structure. (Action: D/o Financial Services)

11. **IP Valuation for Entertainment Industry Loans:** The artists are getting affected by channels /OTT platforms keeping the intellectual property (IP) rights with them, due to which makers are not even eligible to get loans in the entertainment industry, which needs to be corrected. (Action: D/o Financial Services, Ministry of I&B)

2. Decentralization & Rural Development

12. **Decentralization of Entrepreneurship:** Decentralize entrepreneurship beyond big cities to give more momentum to development in smaller cities. Officers should focus on real development rather than just land and revenue. (Action: NITI Aayog, DPHT)
13. **District-level Ease of Doing Business Index:** Introduce a district-level index for ease of doing business and assign tasks to district officers, like the DM, to set up industries. (Action: NITI Aayog, DPIIT)
14. **Strengthening Rural Economy:** Re-evaluate the rural economy, introduce rural credit systems and rural enterprise, and strengthen rural areas to solve urban problems. (Action: D/o Financial Services, NITI Aayog)
15. **Building New Cities:** Instead of only improving existing urban areas, consider building new cities with complete infrastructure and no slums. (Action: MoHUA)

2. Digitization & Technology

16. **Platform for Connecting Citizens (Digitization Phase 2):** Beyond providing facilities like Jan Dhan accounts, the real meaning of digitization is to create platforms connecting citizens, enabling better utilization of human resources. (Action: NITI Aayog, MEITY)
17. **Single App for Government Services:** Aim for a single app for citizens to access all government services (income tax, GST, etc.) with a "whole of government" approach in the medium term. (Action: NITI Aayog, MEITY)
18. **AI-based Compliance Portals & Risk-Weighted Inspections:** Deploy AI-based compliance portals and risk-weighted inspections to create a genuinely trust-based and low-friction regulatory framework. (Action: NITI Aayog, MEITY)
19. **Modern Agricultural Technologies in Aspirational Districts:** Take modern agricultural technologies to aspirational and backward districts, increasing awareness and adoption among farmers. (Action: NITI Aayog, M/o Agriculture & Farmers Welfare)
20. **Linking Skill Training with AI:** Connect skill learning and training programs with AI, especially in aspirational and backward districts, so people understand the connection and benefit. (Action: MSDE)
21. **AI Integration in School Syllabus:** Integrate AI into the school syllabus like in Maharashtra it was introduced from 5th grade onwards to equip future generations with AI knowledge. (Action: D/o School Education)

4. Human Capital & Employment

22. **Empowering 80 Crore Human Resources with 3Ds:** Beyond education, vigour should be given to 80 crore human resources by helping them, with proposals focusing on decentralization, deregulation, and digitization. (Action: NITI Aayog, MEITY)
23. **Survey for Faculty in Educational Institutions:** Conduct a proper survey of faculty as required by UGC / AICTE in the Medical Education, as there is currently insufficient PG faculty, professors, or assistant professors. (Action: D/o Higher Education; Ministry of Health & Family Welfare)
24. **Statistics for Medical Specialists:** Beyond MBBS doctors, collect statistics on specialists (cardiologists, surgeons, gynecologists etc.) and make it public to identify shortages, post-graduation facility needs and ramp up such facilities. Further, increase medical seats. (Action: D/o Higher Education, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare)
25. **Specialized Skill Development Centers:** Establish specialized skill development centers, especially for unskilled labour like weavers (70 per cent of labor is unskilled), based on area-wise surveys of skill training needs. (Action: MSDE)
26. **Improve female labour force participation** as the global average is around 51% while we are at around 30: (Action: NITI Aayog, M/o WCD, M/o Labour & Employment)
27. **Hospitality Sector:** Promote the hospitality sector as it can generate immediate employment and is relatively immune to the developments in AI. Further, 'Infrastructure' status may be granted to hotel projects across cities irrespective of population size to facilitate institutional finance and tax benefits to rural areas for tourism activities, environmental adventures, safaris homestays, etc. Also, recognize real estate as capital investment in the hospitality industry to enable easier access to financial institutions. (Action: Infrastructure Division, DEA and NITI aayog)
28. **Address MGNREGA Payment Delays:** Resolve delays in MGNREGA payments, which sometimes extend to four or five months, causing problems for states in paying dues. (Action: M/o Rural Development)
29. **Next-Gen Skilling & R&D Alignment:** Align next-generation skilling and R&D (semiconductors, battery, biotech) with incentives and R&D through patent box regimes and collaborative university initiatives. (Action: MSDE)
30. **Robust Ecosystem for Doctors in Rural Areas:** Build a robust ecosystem to ensure doctors practice in rural areas and close the gap between urban and rural doctor-patient ratios. (Action: M/o Health & Family Welfare, D/o Higher Education)
31. **Reforms for Medical College Setup:** Rationalize and ease the process of starting medical education institutions, particularly regarding investment and teaching faculty requirements, such as insisting on having all five years' teachers in place while

starting a medical college. (Action: M/o Health & Family Welfare, D/o Higher Education)

32. **Institutionalization of Skill Development:** Skill development needs proper institutionalization with a structured and content-driven approach, from ITIs to engineering colleges. Dedicated institutions are needed. (Action: M/o MSDE)

5. Agriculture & Food Security

33. **Reduce Agricultural product wastage:** To reduce post-harvest wastage, encourage the exports of agricultural products. Also, there are fake exporters who are exploiting farmers. (Action: M/o Agriculture, D/o Commerce)
34. **Cash Subsidy for Natural Farming:** Provide cash subsidies to farmers transitioning to natural farming to compensate for initial yield drops, thereby encouraging risk-taking and ensuring financial security. How will natural farming ensure food security? (Action: M/o M/o Agriculture & Farmers Welfare, Budget Division, DEA)
35. **Value Addition in Agriculture:** Focus on localised value addition facilities for agricultural products, especially in agricultural-based districts, instead of just encouraging production. (Action: M/o M/o Agriculture & Farmers Welfare)
36. **Easy Access to Credit for Farmers:** Improve access to credit for poor farmers, making it easier for them to understand and participate in existing schemes. (Action: D/o Financial Services)
37. **Scientific Solution for Farmer Product Pricing:** Implement a scientific solution for pricing farmer products, such as an outlook report for every season and crop, providing indicative prices. (Action: M/o M/o Agriculture & Farmers Welfare)
38. **Direct Cash Transfer for Price Difference:** If prices fall below indicative prices, directly transfer the difference to farmers as a cash subsidy, saving government resources on procurement and storage. (Action: M/o M/o Agriculture & Farmers Welfare)
39. **Nano fertilisers to be studied:** Nano fertilisers are not helping the farmers and it is being thrust upon them. Its impact needs to be studied. (Action: D/o Fertilizers)
40. **Fertiliser shortage in Haryana:** There is a urea and DAP shortage in Haryana, which needs to be addressed. (Action: D/o Fertilizers)
41. **Safeguard Farmers' Interest in Trade Deals (GM Crops):** In trade deals, especially with the US regarding oilseeds, safeguard Indian farmers' interests by addressing the disparity in allowing GM crop varieties (like GM soybean) for import but not for domestic cultivation. (Action: D/o Commerce)
42. **Audit of Agriculture Universities:** Conduct an audit of agriculture universities (beyond financial) to assess their outreach and contribution to farmers' issues, and provide adequate budgetary support instead of withdrawing it. (Action: M/o Agriculture & Farmers Welfare, D/o Higher Education)

43. **Straw Burning Incentives:** Ensure central assistance is received for incentives given by the government for making bales from agricultural waste and not burning straw after harvest. (Action: M/o M/o Agriculture & Farmers Welfare)
44. **Ensure legal MSP,** as if farmers have to be the focus, then they cannot be left self-funded. (Action: M/o M/o Agriculture & Farmers Welfare)
45. **Reduce Farm indebtedness:** Most of the farmers are in distress due to heavy debt, though not in poverty. How to improve that? Only when they can rise above farm indebtedness can they move to different sectors (Action: M/o Agriculture & Farmers Welfare)

6. Economic Policy & Growth

46. **Judicial Reforms for GDP Growth:** Expedite judicial reforms to improve the speed and certainty of judicial outcomes, which could increase GDP growth by up to 2 percent. (Action: M/o Law & Justice)
47. **Export-led MSME Clusters:** Develop export-led MSME clusters linked to national industrial corridor nodes with common testing labs, design centers, and plug-and-play sheds to integrate them into global value chains. (Action: M/o MSME)
48. **Encourage Domestic Capital in Startups:** Introduce reforms to encourage insurance companies, pension funds, endowment funds, and other domestic institutions to invest in Indian startups to reduce over-reliance on foreign capital. (Action: D/o Financial Services, DPIIT)
49. **Accelerate Foreign Investment in SEZs:** Accelerate the process and strengthen state capacity to help foreign investors invest more in Special Economic Zones (SEZs), especially those oriented towards exports. (Action: D/o Commerce)
50. **Encourage Indians to invest abroad:** Take measures to encourage our entrepreneurs to go abroad and invest. (Action: Investment Division, DEA, Ministry of Finance)
51. **Re-evaluate PLI Scheme for EVs:** Re-examine the PLI scheme for Electric Vehicles (EVs) to support new entrants and startups, as current high thresholds disqualify them while benefiting legacy manufacturers. (Action: DPIIT)
52. **Specialized High-Tech Manufacturing Hubs:** Put more effort into establishing specialized high-tech manufacturing hubs in India, which will have ripple and compounding effects beyond mass manufacturing. (Action: DPIIT)
53. **Blueprint/Masterplan for Industry Hubs:** The Government of India should create a blueprint for industry and high-tech hubs across the country, providing advisories and incentives to state governments based on their land availability and other advantages. Center should identify which industry can come up in which area so that states can focus on the relevant skill developments in that area to ensure local availability of talent. (Action: DPIIT)

54. **Revisit Concurrent List:** Re-examine the Concurrent List to clarify responsibilities between central and state governments, addressing duplication and ensuring efficient governance in sectors like agriculture, education, and health. (Action: MHA)
55. **Address Land Acquisition Costs:** Address the issue of land acquisition and distribution to industries, where the end land price is significantly higher than the actual cost, without benefiting landowners or farmers. (Action: D/o Land Resources)
56. **Encourage Performing States; Support Needy States:** A policy should encourage states that are performing well economically without punishing them, while also providing sustainable equity to states that need more support so they can become efficient contributors to the national economy. How can states be incentivised to carry out reforms, as desired? (Action: FC unit & Budget Division, DEA)
57. **Measure Ecological deficit:** Alongside economic deficit measurement, can we measure ecological deficit and carry out ecological budgeting? (Action: MOSPI)

7. Urbanization & Infrastructure

58. **Urban Deficit and Municipal Structure:** Address the severe urban deficit in Indian cities by critically thinking about reforms to strengthen municipal service delivery institutions (municipal corporations, town municipal councils), including ensuring timely elections. (Action: MoHUA)
59. **Resource Availability for Urbanization:** Ensure that resources (like sewerage systems) are available on the scale at which building permissions are being granted in urban areas to address urbanization challenges like traffic and infrastructure problems. (Action: MoHUA)
60. **Basic Urban Infrastructure:** Address the lack of basic infrastructure (housing, sanitation) in industrial towns to prevent inhuman living conditions for labor and ensure sustainable industrialization by reducing the resistance in rural areas while attempting to set up new industrial townships. (Action: MoHUA, DPIIT)
61. **Transmission and Distribution in Power Sector:** Give greater attention to improving transmission and distribution in the power sector, as it is still lagging despite growth in generation capacity. (Action: M/o Power)

8. Governance & Administration

62. **Increase devolution to states:** The devolution to states shall be increased from the existing 42% to 50%. (Action: FC unit DEA)
63. **Economic Diplomacy Training for Diplomatic Corps:** Train diplomatic corps in business and economic diplomacy to encourage more investment from companies abroad and facilitate foreign investment into second and third-tier Indian cities. (Action: MEA)
