Sewage Treatment Plant (STP) Incentive Scheme, 2025

(For Environment Protection and Public Health Regulations)

Issuing Authority:

Department of Tourism, Union Territory of Ladakh

1. Preamble

In view of the fragile ecology of the Union Territory of Ladakh, the increasing pressure of tourism on local resources, and the need for sustainable wastewater management, the Department of Tourism, UT Ladakh, introduces the Sewage Treatment Plant (STP) Incentive Scheme, 2025, aimed at promoting the installation of decentralized Sewage Treatment Plants (STPs) in accommodation units (hotels and guesthouses with room count from 10 to 19 rooms) and thereby ensuring the protection of the region's natural environment and public health.

The STP Incentive Scheme is aligned with the "Guidelines for Regulation of Hotels and Restaurants under the Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act-1974 and the Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act-1981", issued by the Ladakh Pollution Control Committee (LPCC) Vide Order No. 16 of LPCC, dated 06.08.2025 (enclosed for reference).

2. Background

The Union Territory of Ladakh, with its pristine landscapes, rich cultural heritage, and sensitive ecological balance, faces acute challenges related to water scarcity and wastewater management, particularly during the peak tourist season. Accommodation units such as hotels and guesthouses form the backbone of the tourism economy but, without adequate sewage treatment, risk polluting local water bodies, degrading ecosystems, and harming public health.

Climate change and increasing tourist activity are compounding pressures on Ladakh's limited water resources. In view of this, the Sewage Treatment Plant (STP) Incentive Scheme, 2025 is framed to financially assist accommodation units with room count of 10 to 19 rooms, in installing decentralized STPs.

3. Vision

To promote clean and sustainable waste management practices across accommodation units in UT Ladakh, encouraging responsible tourism supported by robust sewage treatment infrastructure, thereby enhancing public health standards and environmental sustainability.



4. Applicability

The Sewage Treatment Plant (STP) Incentive Scheme, 2025 shall apply to hotels and guesthouses operating in the Union Territory of UT Ladakh that meet the following minimum criteria:

- New and existing hotels and guesthouses operating in the Union territory of Ladakh with room count of 10 to 19 rooms.
- Should be Provisionally or Permanently registered with the Department of Tourism, UT Ladakh.

 Should have relevant permissions or No Objection Certificate (NOC) to operate the hotel/ guesthouse in UT Ladakh, as issued by the Competent Authorities from time to time.

5. Norms of Ladakh Pollution Control Committee (LPCC)

As per LPCC Order No. 16 of LPCC, dated 06.08.2025, all hotels or guesthouses having 7-19 rooms, or hotels with an attached restaurant seating up to 35 patrons, shall be eligible for Consent to Establish and Operate from Ladakh Pollution Control Committee (LPCC) subject to rigorous compliance with the following conditions:

- The hotels must maintain a fully functional septic tank of sufficient capacity, serviced regularly and operated in an efficient manner at all times.
- All effluent from kitchen and laundry operations must first pass through a well-designed oil and grease trap, prior to discharge into municipal sewers or drainage systems.
- The treated effluent must comply with the effluent quality standards prescribed by MoEF&CC vide Notification No. G.S.R. 794 (E), dated 04/11/2009 and relevant CPCB/LPCC norms.

Note: While the installation of a decentralized STP is not mandatory for obtaining CTE/ CTO, hotels and guesthouses with room count of 10 to 19 rooms are encouraged to install one and avail the benefits under the Sewage Treatment Plant (STP) Incentive Scheme, 2025.

6. Incentive

All eligible hotels and guesthouses operating in the Union Territory of Ladakh intending to install decentralized STPs shall be reimbursed the cost of the equipment as below:

1.	10–19 Rooms	75% of the cost of the equipment, subject to a limit of
		₹5,00,000/- (Rupees Five Lakh only), whichever is less



Note: To support women entrepreneurs, the maximum quantum of incentive shall be raised by an additional amount of 10% across each category for a hotel or guesthouse owned by a woman resident of the Union Territory of Ladakh.

The eligible expense shall include the cost of equipment, installation charges, transportation, and consultancy fee. Expenses related to Goods and Services Tax (GST), or any other non-listed item will not be considered as eligible expenses.

7. Incentive Disbursal Framework

To avail incentive under the Sewage Treatment Plant (STP) Incentive Scheme, 2025, the eligible applicant shall follow the following framework:

- a) The STP must be installed by the applicant based on any suitable technology approved by the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB) or Ladakh Pollution Control Committee (LPCC), ensuring the treated discharge meets LPCC approved discharge standards.
- b) The applicant shall obtain the 'Consent to Establish (CTE)' and 'Consent to Operate (CTO)' from the LPCC.
- c) Once the above requirements are met, the applicant shall apply to the Prescribed Authority i.e. Assistant Director (Tourism), Leh or Kargil, with the following documents:
 - Request in the Prescribed Format (Annexure 1) for availing incentive under the Sewage Treatment Plant (STP) Incentive Scheme, 2025, with details of the applicant, the unit, and the installed STP
 - Copy of valid Consent to Operate (CTO) from LPCC
 - Valid Registration Certificate (Provisional or Permanent) from the Department of Tourism, UT Ladakh
 - GST invoices and payment proof for eligible expenses related to STP installation
- d) Upon verification of the above documents, the Prescribed Authority shall reimburse the eligible quantum of incentive directly into the applicant's Aadhaar-seeded bank account via Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT).

8. General Conditions

- An applicant who has already availed similar incentive for the same hotel or guesthouse under any Policy/ Scheme of the Government of India, Administration of Union Territory of Ladakh, or Ladakh Autonomous Hill Development Council (LAHDC) shall not be eligible.
- The Department of Tourism, UT Ladakh reserves the right to modify the terms & conditions of the Sewage Treatment Plant (STP) Incentive Scheme, 2025, from time to time, as deemed appropriate.
- Non-compliance with LPCC standards after installation of the STP shall lead to recovery of the incentive amount and may invite action under applicable environmental laws.
- The responsibility for installation, operation and maintenance of the decentralised STP shall rest solely with the applicant. The Department of Tourism, UT Ladakh shall not be held liable for any operational lapses, penalties, or legal actions resulting from noncompliance with LPCC standards or other applicable environmental regulations.
- The Prescribed Authority, in consultation with the Ladakh Pollution Control Committee (LPCC), reserves the right to conduct periodic inspections to verify compliance with prescribed discharge standards at any time, as and when required.
- Incentives under the Sewage Treatment Plant (STP) Incentive Scheme, 2025 shall be disbursed only after satisfactory commissioning and functioning of the decentralised STP. If the STP is later found to be non-functional or not in regular operation after the



incentive has been availed, the incentive amount shall be recovered from the beneficiary.

- The Sewage Treatment Plant (STP) Incentive Scheme, 2025 is a voluntary incentive scheme to promote the installation of decentralized STPs in hotels and guesthouses with room count of 10 to 19 rooms.
- The Department of Tourism, UT Ladakh shall not be responsible for the operation, maintenance or future replacement or upgradation cost of the STP.

ORDER No.: 16 of LPCC Dated: 06/08/2025

Sub: Guidelines for regulation of Hotels and Restaurants under the Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act-1974 and the Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act-1981.

With a view to ensure that the establishment and operation of hotels are fully aligned with environmental protection laws and well-being of the public, the following guidelines are hereby issued for strict and immediate compliance by all hotel and guesthouse proprietors in Ladakh: -

- Consent from the Ladakh Pollution Control Committee to Establish/Operate under sections 25/26 of the Water (Prevention & Control of Pollution) Act, 1974 and section 21 of the Air (Prevention & Control of Pollution) Act, 1981 will be granted only upon fulfillment of the conditions detailed below:
 - (i) Hotels or guest houses having up to six rooms shall not require consent from Ladakh Pollution Control Committee, to establish/operate provided that they: -
 - a) Install and maintain a septic tank of sufficient capacity, ensuring proper sewage management,
 - Operate in a manner that does not create any nuisance or environmental hazard in their surroundings,
 - c) Submit a formal undertaking to that effect, to Ladakh Pollution Control Committee (LPCC).
 - (ii) Hotels or guesthouses having seven to nineteen rooms, or hotels with an attached restaurant seating up to thirty-five patrons, shall be eligible for Consent to Establish and Operate from Ladakh Pollution Control Committee (LPCC) subject to rigorous compliance with the following conditions:
 - a) The hotel must maintain a fully functional septic tank of sufficient capacity, serviced regularly and operated in an efficient manner at all times.
 - All effluent from kitchen and laundry operations must first pass through a well-designed oil and grease trap, prior to discharge into municipal sewers or drainage systems.
 - c) The treated effluent must comply with the effluent quality standards prescribed by MoEF&CC vide notification no. G.S.R. 794 (E) dt: 04/11/2009 and relevant CPCB/LPCC norms as follows:

pH	5.5-9.0
BOD 3days, 27° C	100mg/l
Total Suspended Solids	100mg/l
Oil & Grease	10mg/l

(iii)The Ladakh Autonomous Hill Development Council (LAHDC), Leh, through the Tourism Department of the Union Territory of Ladakh, has introduced the STP Incentive Scheme 2024 to promote sustainable tourism by encouraging all hotels and guesthouses in Leh with less than 20 rooms to install decentralized sewage treatment plants (STPs). Under this initiative, eligible establishments can receive financial assistance covering up to 75% of the cost of STP, with a maximum subsidy of ₹5 lakh, thereby advancing environmental conservation and public health in the region.

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All hotels and guesthouses having less than 20 rooms are strongly encouraged to install decentralized, on-site sewage treatment plants to support sustainable tourism and protect Ladakh's fragile ecosystem by availing subsidy under the STP Incentive Scheme-2024.

(iv) Hotels or guesthouses with twenty rooms or more or hotels with an attached restaurants with a seating capacity of thirty-six or more, shall qualify for Consent to Establish and Operate from the Ladakh Pollution Control Committee (LPCC), only upon installation and continuous maintenance of a Sewage Treatment Plant (STP) in an efficient and fully operational condition at all times. The treated effluent from such STPs must conform to the effluent quality standards prescribed by the MoEF&CC vide notification no. G.S.R. 794 (E) dt: 04/11/2009 and relevant CPCB/LPCC norms as follows:

Parameter	Effluents standards

BOD 3days 27° C	30 mg/l
Total Suspended Solids	50 mg/l
Oil & Grease	10 mg/l
Phosphate as P	1.0 mg/l

- All hotel and restaurant kitchens must be equipped with effective air pollution control mechanismsincluding extraction hoods, ducting, chimneys, and exhaust fans. Exhaust emissions shall be discharged through a stack extending a minimum of 2 meters above the highest point of the building.
- Hotels and restaurants operating boilers fueled by diesel or coal shall ensure that emissions comply with the standards prescribed by the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB).
- In case of Consent to Establish/Consent to Operate along with Authorization for DG sets, if applicable, the applicant shall apply on Online Consent Management & Monitoring System (OCMMS) portal.
- Ambient noise must not exceed prescribed limits across residential, commercial, industrial, and silence zones as per the Noise Pollution (Regulation & Control) Rules as amended from time to time.
- Mandatory segregation of waste at source (e.g., biodegradable, recyclables, inert) and proper storage, collection, transportation, processing, and disposal under Municipal Solid waste (management & Handling) Rules as amended from time to time.

Failure to comply with any of the aforementioned environmental requirements: emission and effluent norms, waste segregation and noise limits shall constitute a violation of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986, the Water (Prevention & Control of Pollution) Act, 1974, the Air (Prevention & Control of Pollution) Act, 1981, and related rules and amendments.

In such instances, the Ladakh Pollution Control Committee (LPCC) is empowered to revoke or suspend any environmental consents, impose financial penalties, initiate criminal prosecution, and direct compensatory remediation or environmental restoration in accordance with the polluter-pays principle.
