Topic of the program was “**Early Intervention in Hearing Impairment guidance of family centred care**”, Intervention strategies for communication for Children with **Hearing Impairment**.

Total **300 participants** were registered on RCI Calendar to attend the program.

CRE program started with the introduction of CRE topic, importance and objectives of the current topic by CRE Coordinator **Ms. Chandramala Shaurya**, CA (Speech Therapist) CRC Patna. Next coordinator, invited to **Dr Anil Kumar**, Director I/C, STTP I/C CRC, Patna. He focused on the current CRE topic and how all topics are important in profession of rehabilitation professionals.

There were **4 sessions** in this CRE Program.

First Session was conducted by **Mr Ajay Kumar (Audiologist SLP) Medanta, Patna** on Introduction to early intervention in hearing impairment. Definition, importance and goals of early identification and intervention programs, Newborn hearing screening. He focused on importance of early identification, If hearing loss is not identified and managed early, a child may experience delays in these areas. Therefore, early identification and intervention are important for helping children reach their developmental potential.

Second Session was conducted by **Mr. Robin AP(Speech) CRC Patna** on Assessment and individualized intervention planning, comprehensive hearing and developmental assessment, identifying family needs, strengths and priorities. Role of multidisciplinary team.

He focused on Assessment and individualized intervention planning are important parts of early intervention for children with hearing impairment. The aim is to understand the child’s hearing, communication, development, and family needs and then develop a personalized intervention plan.

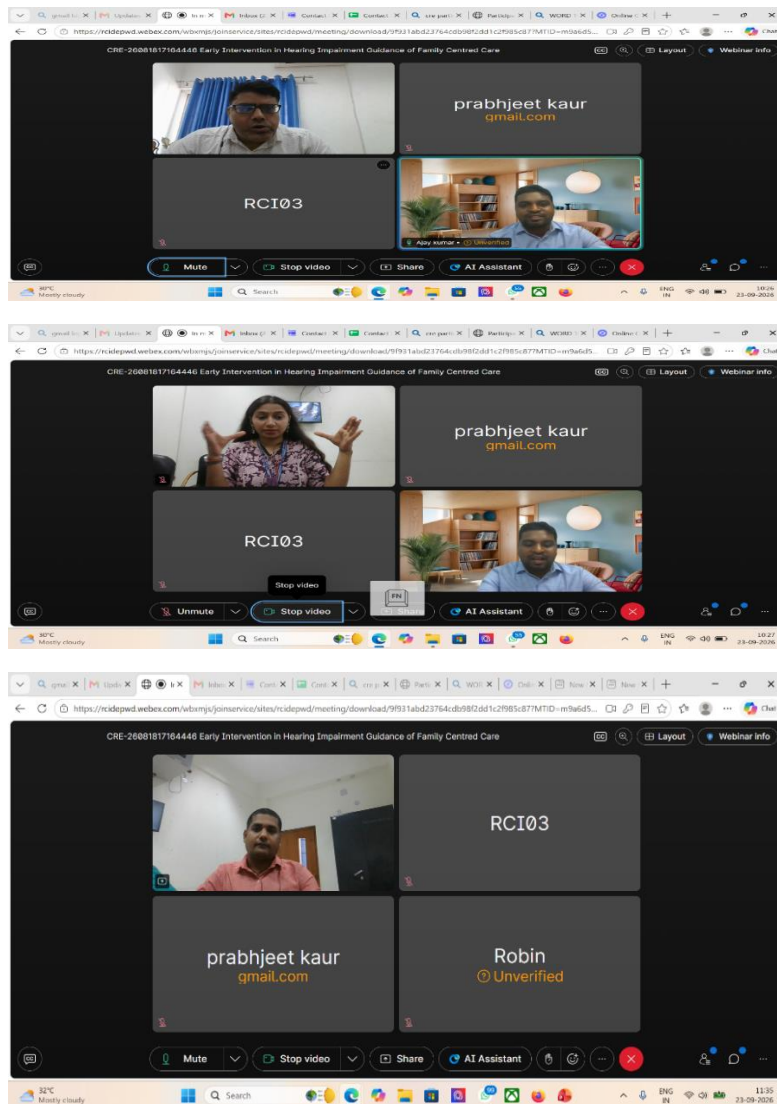
Third session was conducted by **Ms Prabhjeet Kaur School Counsellor St. Xavier’s Senior secondary school, Delhi** on Family guidance and support strategies for children with hearing impairment. Counselling parents after diagnosis, parent training, emotional, social and community support. She focused on Family guidance is an important part of early intervention. Parents and caregivers need accurate information, emotional support, and practical skills to help the child develop communication, language, and social skills.

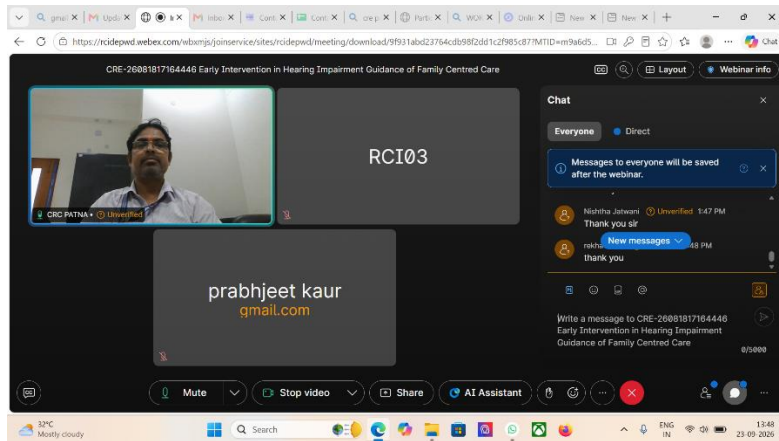
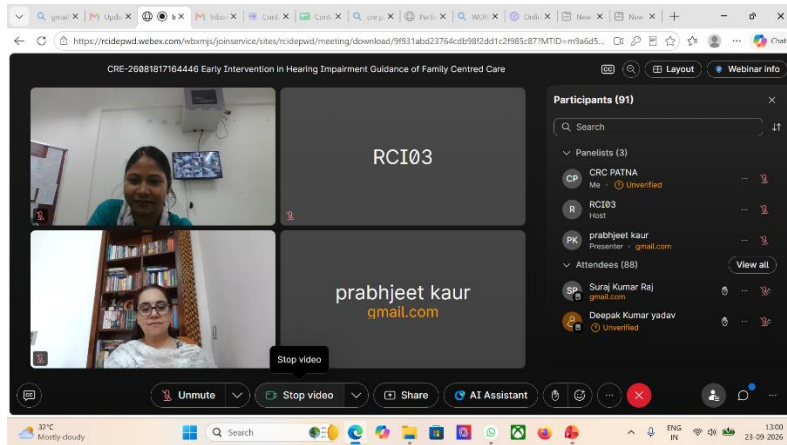
