REPORT ON CELEBRATION OF "EARTH DAY"

Every year on **April 22**, millions of people across the globe unite to celebrate Earth Day-a movement that began in 1970 and has since evolved into the largest environmental observance worldwide. Earth Day is more than a symbolic gesture; it is a clarion call to safeguard our natural environment and commit to sustainable living practices.

On the occasion of celebration of Earth Day total **276** Legal Awareness Camps and Seminars were held to engage participants creatively. Poster Making Competition, Essay Writing Contest and Street Play highlighting the dangers of plastic pollution and environmental neglect were also organized. And during the celebration approx. **13322** people were informed about importance of earth, climate change, sustainability and eco-friendly habits. Further, the Earth is Source of Natural/Essential Resources such as: Water, Air, Soil, Minerals, Fossil fuels, Forests and biodiversity. These resources support agriculture, industry, energy, and day-to-day living. During this programme **82** Banners/Posters were also printed/pasted and total **12141** Pamphlets and Brochures were distributed amongst the individuals. Exclusive tree plantation programmes were conducted by the District Legal Services Authorities at Court Compounds, along the streets, roads, Govt. Department Office Compounds, School/College compounds, Police Line etc.

The Earth Day celebration created significant awareness and inspired action toward environmental conservation. Participants pledged to reduce plastic usage, adopt greener habits, and support sustainable initiatives. The event fostered a strong sense of environmental responsibility among all age groups.
