NATIONAL LOK ADALAT

National Lok Adalat is a special system of dispute resolution, where pending court cases and pre-litigation disputes are settled quickly through mutual agreement between the parties. In National Lok Adalat, cases such as bank disputes, motor accident claims, family matters, and other civil cases are resolved in a single day without lengthy court procedures. The decisions made in Lok Adalat are legally binding like a court decree, and there is usually no appeal against them. This system helps reduce the burden on courts.

During the quarter **October to December, 2025**, quarterly National Lok Adalat was organized on **13th December, 2025** across the State of Uttarakhand under the aegis of the National Legal Services Authority and the Uttarakhand State Legal Services Authority in accordance with the provisions of the Legal Services Authorities Act, 1987. The Lok Adalat was conducted simultaneously in the Hon'ble High Court at Nainital, all Districts, Taluks and Court Complexes with the objective of promoting amicable dispute resolution, reducing pendency of cases in courts, and ensuring speedy and cost-effective justice to litigants.

During the said National Lok Adalat, a total of **12159 pre-litigation cases** and **22981 pending cases** were successfully settled through mutual compromise between the parties. As a result of these settlements, an amount of **Rs. 20,25,61,306/-** was realized in pre-litigation matters, while **Rs. 61,87,77,182/-** was received as settlement amount in pending court cases. The successful disposal of a large number of disputes and the substantial settlement amount achieved during the National Lok Adalat significantly contributed to reducing the burden on regular courts and strengthened the objective of providing accessible, affordable, and expeditious justice to the people of the State.

The National Lok Adalat held on 13th December 2025 witnessed a remarkable achievement in the realm of alternative dispute resolution, as **38 cases** were settled amicably through quasi-judicial forums, including Consumer Courts and the Debts Recovery Tribunal, Dehradun. The concerted efforts of the legal services authorities resulted in a total compensation of ₹23,84,67,396/- being awarded to the deserving parties.



MULTI - PURPOSE LEGAL SERVICES AND AWARENESS CAMPS

A **Multi-Purpose Legal Literacy and Awareness Camp** was organized in Tanakpur District Champawat at Gandhi Maidan (at the 36th Battalion of the Indo-Tibetan Border Police (ITBP),) in the town under the joint auspices of the **DLSA Champawat and Udham Singh Nagar**. The main objective of the camp was to provide information about constitutional rights, free legal aid, and various government welfare schemes to the underprivileged sections of society, including backward communities, tribal groups, ex-servicemen, women, and persons with disabilities. Brave soldiers and their families were felicitated, and their courage and dedication were collectively saluted on behalf of the nation.

The program was graced by the **Hon'ble Mr. Justice N. Kotiswar Singh** Judge, Supreme Court of India as the Chief Guest, in the august presence of **Hon'ble Mr. Justice Manoj Kumar Tiwari**, Executive Chairman, UKSLSA and **Hon'ble Mr. Justice Ravindra Maithani, Hon'ble Mr. Justice Rakesh Thapliyal, Hon'ble Mr. Justice Ashish Naithani, Judges High Court of Uttarakhand**.

Representing the ex-servicemen community, Retired Colonel Umed Singh and Captain G.S. Dhama highlighted the invaluable contribution and unwavering dedication of soldiers in safeguarding the nation. During an interactive session with former servicemen, Veer Naris (war widows), decorated soldiers, and ex-servicemen were honored in recognition of their courage, sacrifice, and distinguished service to the country. The felicitation served as a heartfelt expression of gratitude for their immense contributions to national security and pride.

Representing the tribal community, President of the Pastoral Youth Association, presented the problems and expectations of the tribal society through the platform. Along with interaction with representatives of the Tharu and Boksas communities, tribal cultural performances vividly showcased their rich cultural heritage. A cultural presentation on the theme of drug de-addiction also conveyed a strong message to society to stay away from substance abuse.

Mr. Pradeep Kumar Mani, Member Secretary, UKSLSA, Nainital informed the public about Lok Adalat, Mediation, Free Legal Aid Schemes, and the 'Nyaya Mitra App', through which judicial services can be accessed from home.

On this occasion, Hon'ble Mr. Justice Ravindra Maithani, Hon'ble Mr. Justice Rakesh Thapliyal, Hon'ble Mr. Justice Ashish Naithani and stated that the aim of legal service institutions is to ensure that justice reaches the last person standing in the queue of society, so that no individual remains deprived of justice.

Addressing the gathering, the chief Guest Justice N. Kotiswar Singh, while referring to the Preamble of the Constitution, said that the values of justice, liberty, equality, and frater-

nity will become meaningful only when every section of society is aware of its rights and duties. Addressing ex-servicemen, he said that Uttarakhand is a land of brave soldiers, where almost every family has two warriors—one soldier protecting the nation at the border and another woman at home facing life's struggles.

More than 30 departments delivered services under one roof at the camp, ensuring convenient access for the public. On the spot, MNREGA job cards were issued to 183 individuals, 22 BPL certificates were provided, and 4 cases related to old-age and widow pensions were successfully resolved.

The Social Welfare Department facilitated services for old-age, widow, and disability pensions, while the AYUSH Department offered Ayurveda and Homeopathic consultations along with free medicines. The Agriculture Department provided information on seeds, fertilizers, and government schemes. The Health Department conducted eye check-ups, general health examinations, blood tests, and medical consultations.

The Labour Department carried out labour registrations, and the Food Supply Department handled ration card corrections and KYC updates. SBI ARSETI offered guidance on self-employment and skill development training, while the Cooperative Department shared information about loan and cooperative schemes. The Animal Husbandry and Dairy Development Department conducted animal health check-ups and provided scheme-related information.

In addition, services related to women's empowerment, military welfare, municipal corporations, revenue matters, disaster management, cybercrime awareness, drug de-addiction campaigns, Aadhaar card creation and updates, and Uniform Civil Code (UCC) registration were also made available. Overall, more than **3,636 people directly benefited** from the wide range of services and schemes offered at the camp.

In the concluding session, Chief Guest Hon'ble Mr. Justice N. Kotiswar Singh and Hon'ble Mr. Justice Manoj Kumar Tiwari, Executive Chairman of UKSLSA honored various participants and beneficiaries by presenting awards and certificates of appreciation. The program was attended by District Judge, District Magistrate, SP U.S. Naga, Chairman and Secretary DLSA Champawat, along with judicial and administrative officers, public representatives, social organization members and a large number of local citizens.





Apart from aforesaid, during the said period October to December, 2025, **three (03) Other** Multi-purpose Legal Services and Awareness camps were also organized by DLSA **Haridwar, Tehri Garhwal and Uttarkashi** with the objective of extending legal awareness, government welfare benefits, and essential public services to the local community. These camps were graced by the Hon'ble Executive Chairman, Uttarakhand State Legal Services Authority, Nainital, whose presence significantly enhanced the importance of the programme. The event was also attended by the Member Secretary, UKSLSA, Nainital, along with several distinguished dignitaries and officials from various government departments of the district.

These Multi-Purpose Camps witnessed enthusiastic participation from local residents. Various government departments set up facilitation counters to assist the public in accessing different State and Central Government welfare schemes. Officials from departments such as Social Welfare, Health, Agriculture, Revenue, and other line departments actively participated in the camp and provided ***on-the-spot guidance and services*** to the beneficiaries. During the camp, approximately **725 persons** were directly benefited through the distribution Wheelchair, Hearing aid machine, crutches, walking sticks and facilitation of several essential documents, Certificates, cards, and welfare benefits. Beneficiaries received assistance in obtaining and updating important identification and welfare cards and certificates, along with information and registration support under various government schemes.

The Social Welfare Department provided benefits under welfare schemes, including the distribution of "*Mahalaxmi Kits*" to eligible beneficiaries. In addition, support materials such as farming tool kits, seeds, and other agricultural assistance were distributed to farmers and rural beneficiaries to promote livelihood development and agricultural productivity. Officials also provided legal awareness to the participants regarding their constitutional and legal rights, access to justice, and the free legal aid services available through the Legal Services Authorities for economically weaker and marginalized sections of society. The camp served as a valuable platform for bridging the gap between government welfare services and the public. By bringing multiple departments together at a single venue, the initiative ensured that citizens could conveniently access information, assistance, and benefits according to their needs. The programme concluded successfully with a strong public response and appreciation from the participants.





CELEBRATION OF 'CONSTITUTION DAY' ON 26.11.2025

As per directions of the Hon'ble Executive Chairman, UKSLSA, Nainital a **Sensitization Programme** was organized by the Uttarakhand SLSA, Nainital on the occasion of **Constitution Day (संविधान दिवस)**, on 26th November, to mark the historic adoption of the Constitution of India in 1949.

The day is dedicated to promoting awareness of constitutional values such as justice, liberty, equality, and fraternity among Indian citizens. Constitution Day was officially established in 2015 by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment to strengthen citizens' connection with the Constitution. Before that, November 26 was observed as National Law Day. On this day, mass readings of the Preamble are held across the country, with participation from various government departments, schools, and public organizations. The intent is to reiterate and reorient citizens toward the principles of the Constitution and to encourage civic participation and awareness of fundamental duties.

In order to celebrate **Constitution Day (Samvidhan Diwas)** on **26th November**, a **Sensitization Programme** and **commendation ceremony for the Best DLSA** were organized by the UKSLSA, Nainital. The programme also included **Essay, Debate, and Drawing competitions** highlighting the historic adoption of the **Constitution of India**.

The event was conducted as per the approval of the Hon'ble Executive Chairman, UKSLSA, Nainital, in the benign presence of the Hon'ble Chief Justice of the High Court of Uttarakhand and Patron-in-Chief, UKSLSA, along with the Hon'ble Judges and Registrars of the High Court, learned Advocates, and other distinguished guests.

Further, kindly submitted that during the Sensitization Programme, Trophies/ Medals and Certificates was awarded to the winners, Law Students of the *State Level Debate Competition*, students from schools and colleges of the *Essay and Drawing Competitions* and to the Best District Legal Services Authority (DLSA) in the State, in recognition of their performance, on the occasion of Constitution Day i.e. on 26th November, 2025.

As per directions, the activities/programmes report conducted by the DLSAs from 01.01.2025 to 15.09.2025, have been called from all the DLSAs, to evaluate their performance. Accordingly, as per report 03 best performing DLSAs (DLSA- Dehradun, Haridwar and Nainital) was selected as per the performance report received from all the DLSAs in the State.









In commemoration of **Constitution Day** on November 26, 2025, all DLSAs along with TLSCs across the region organized **87 legal awareness camps and programmes** in collaboration with law colleges, district administration, and other concerned stakeholders. The events were graced by Secretaries of DLSAs, district administration officers, and representatives from various stakeholder organizations, who addressed the gatherings on the significance of Constitution Day, the right to free legal aid, maintenance laws, the NALSA Helpline No. 15100, and pressing issues such as cyber fraud and online scams. Approx. **21,550 persons** attended these programmes and were sensitized on their fundamental rights and available legal remedies. Adding a wider public outreach dimension to the occasion, a special Radio Show was also broadcast on **Kumaon Vaani Radio**, carrying the message of constitutional values and legal awareness to listeners across the Kumaon region.

On the occasion of Constitution Day, **11 Nukkad Natakas** (street plays) were also organized in various schools and villages across the districts on November 26, 2025, bringing the message of constitutional rights and legal awareness directly to the grassroots level in a creative and engaging manner. These vibrant street performances, rooted in the rich tradition of community theatre, effectively conveyed the importance of fundamental rights, free legal aid, and access to justice in a language and format that resonated deeply with common citizens, students, and rural communities alike. Numerous persons across the districts were benefited through these impactful cultural outreach programmes, making Constitution Day a truly inclusive and people-centred celebration.





OBSERVATION OF OCTOBER 13, 2025 'INTERNATIONAL DAY FOR DISASTER RISK REDUCTION'

The **International Day for Disaster Risk Reduction**, observed on October 13, is a global initiative led by the **United Nations** to raise awareness about reducing the risks of disasters. It emphasizes the importance of preparedness, early warning systems, and sustainable development to minimize the impact of natural and human-made hazards such as floods, earthquakes, and cyclones.

The International Day for Disaster Risk Reduction is especially significant for a hilly state like Uttarakhand, which is highly vulnerable to natural disasters. Due to its fragile Himalayan terrain, the state frequently faces landslides, cloudbursts, earthquakes, and flash floods. Studies show that thousands of landslides occur every year, especially during the monsoon and events like the 2013 Kedarnath floods highlight the devastating impact of disasters in the region. This day highlights the need for collective action by governments, communities, and individuals to build resilient societies.

In view of the aforesaid and considering that Uttarakhand is a hilly and disaster-prone state, the Hon'ble Executive Chairman, UKSLSA, Nainital has directed all Legal Services Institutions to spread awareness among the people across the State. The focus is on promoting disaster preparedness through awareness programs, strengthening early warning systems, encouraging eco-friendly and sustainable development, and ensuring active community participation.

With a view to strengthening community preparedness and promoting legal literacy among vulnerable and at-risk populations, a series of sustained and structured outreach activities were organized across the region. In all, **104 Legal Awareness Camps/Programmes** were conducted, providing communities with essential knowledge of their legal rights and entitlements, including access to relief, compensation mechanisms, and grievance redressal systems available under applicable laws and government schemes during and after disaster situations.

In addition, **11 Disaster Risk Reduction Demonstration Sessions** were organized, wherein trained experts and field officers practically demonstrated life-saving techniques, emergency response protocols, and community-level preparedness measures through hands-on activities and simulation exercises. These demonstrations covered critical aspects such as early warning systems, evacuation drills, first aid procedures, search and rescue basics, and the use of locally available resources to minimize loss of life and property.

Furthermore, **09 Awareness Rallies** were conducted across various localities, mobilizing community members, volunteers, local leaders, youth groups, and women's self-help groups to actively participate in spreading the message of disaster preparedness and resilience. These rallies served as powerful tools for mass sensitization, generating awareness in areas where formal programmes could not be easily organized.

Cumulatively, across all these initiatives approx. **21,380** participants were sensitized on a comprehensive range of disaster management themes, including identification of risks and timely response to early warning signals for floods, landslides, earthquakes, and other calamities; safe evacuation procedures and personal safety measures; protection of vulnerable persons and livestock; ensuring food security and access to safe drinking water; identification of secure shelters and construction of temporary housing; safeguarding essential documents and valuables; basic first aid and medical preparedness; maintaining effective communication through official channels while avoiding misinformation; awareness regarding post-disaster relief, compensation, and legal rights under SDRF and NDRF; and fostering community solidarity through collective preparedness and mutual support systems to ensure that no individual or household remains unattended during emergencies.





Celebration of Children's Day – November 14, 2025

Children's Day is celebrated every year on November 14th in India. This day marks the birth anniversary of Jawaharlal Nehru, the first Prime Minister of independent India. He had immense love and affection for children, and they lovingly called him "Chacha Nehru." He believed that children are the future of the nation and that their proper upbringing and education are essential for building a strong and prosperous country.

As per directions of the Hon'ble Executive Chairman, UKSLSA, Nainital Children's Day was celebrated by the Legal Services Institutions across the 14.11.2026. Therefore, DLSAs celebrated the day by raising awareness about children's rights, education and well-being also highlighted, the theme for Children's Day 2025 is "Every Child Has Every Right." This theme aligns with the global efforts of the United Nations Children's Rights, which aims to provide equal opportunities, education, health and protection to every child, regardless of their social or economic background.

Under the Children's Day celebration, a total of **282** legal awareness camps/programmes were organized by the DLSAs and TLSCs in coordination with Panel Lawyers, PLVs, and other stakeholders, with approx. **7250** persons, including women and children along with their parents, attending these programmes. The camps emphasized that the Right to Education is essential for the overall development of children and highlighted the duty of parents to ensure their children attend school. Participants were also sensitized about critical issues such as child trafficking, sexual abuse, child marriage, child labour, malnutrition, poor health and education, cybercrime and online fraud, digital arrest, drug abuse, environmental protection, and the proper hoisting of the Indian National Flag. Awareness was further created regarding government welfare schemes for children, including schemes for differently abled children such as Divyangjan Yojana and the U.D.I.D. Card, the Protection and Change of Tribal Rights Scheme, 2015, legal rights of disaster victims, senior citizens and survivors of sexual abuse, as well as the procedure and benefits of the National Lok Adalat, with the overall objective of promoting legal awareness and improving the well-being and protection of children and vulnerable sections of society.

On the occasion of Children's Day, various schools across the State organized student-led competitions such as Essay Writing, Poster Making and Painting, Slogan Writing and Quiz Competitions to encourage creativity, awareness and active participation among children, ensuring that the message of children's rights and legal empowerment reached every corner of the State. Certificates of participation and achievement were distributed to selected entries by the DLSAs in recognition of their enthusiasm and outstanding performance.

Awareness Programs with respect to the Maintenance and Welfare of Parents and Senior Citizens (MWPSA) Act-2007

Organized on 17.11.2025

As per the directions issued by NALSA, New Delhi, and under the guidance of the Hon'ble Executive Chairman, UKSLSA, Nainital, all 13 District Legal Services Authorities in the State of Uttarakhand were instructed to organise comprehensive sensitization camps and awareness programmes on 17th November 2025 across the entire State.

These programmes were aimed at educating and empowering the common masses, senior citizens, caregivers, local community leaders, Village representatives, frontline stakeholders, PLVs, and other concerned groups about the relevant Rules, statutory provisions, procedural safeguards and welfare mechanisms under the **Maintenance and Welfare of Parents and Senior Citizens Act, 2007 (MWPSA Act, 2007)**.

Under the said campaign total **94** legal services and awareness camps/programmes and Workshops were organized and approx. **5720** people have attended these programmes conducted by the District Legal Services Authorities. During the campaign DLSAs informed the village head, senior citizens, ASHA and Anganwadi workers, students, and other attendees about the rights of senior citizens, the role of Maintenance Tribunals, NALSA Helpline No. 15100, the provisions for protection of life and property, and the broader framework ensuring their well-being and dignity.





OBSERVATION OF 'WORLD HUMAN RIGHTS DAY'

ON 10TH DECEMBER, 2025

Every year, **10th December** is observed as **Human Rights Day**, commemorating the adoption of the **Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR), 1948** by the United Nations General Assembly. This historic document laid down, for the first time, a common standard of fundamental rights and freedoms to be universally protected, affirming that **all human beings are born free and equal in dignity and rights**. Human rights are the basic, inherent and inalienable rights that belong to every individual solely by virtue of being human. They transcend nationality, religion, caste, gender, language, economic status or any other distinction. These rights ensure-Dignity of the individual, Equality before law, Freedom of thought, expression and belief, Protection against exploitation and injustice, Access to justice and fair procedures.

The Constitution of India embodies human rights through Fundamental Rights (Articles 14–32), which ensure equality, freedom, and protection of life and personal liberty; the Directive Principles of State Policy, which promote social and economic justice; and the Fundamental Duties, which encourage respect for human dignity, harmony, and responsible citizenship.

Keeping in view the aforesaid, as per directions of NALSA, New Delhi and by the Hon'ble Executive Chairman, UKSLSA, Nainital the legal services institutions in the state have observed the Human Rights Day on 10th December, 2025 in the periphery of the State of Uttarakhand.

On the occasion, legal services institutions across the State conducted legal awareness camps in prisons, shelter homes, schools, colleges, communities, police stations, and other institutions for the general public as well as for persons with disabilities, with emphasis on constitutional guarantees, equality, dignity, entitlement to legal aid, and access to justice. In total, **165** legal awareness programmes were conducted during the day, which were attended by approximately **21,450** participants. Most of these awareness programmes were organized in cooperation with the State Human Rights Authority.

The participants were informed that every individual is guaranteed fundamental rights from birth, including the right to life, liberty, equality, education, security, respect, freedom of thought, and justice. The primary objective of the programmes was to strengthen the values of justice, equality, and human dignity in society, ensuring that no person is subjected to discrimination or injustice. It was emphasized that India is a de-

mocratic and independent nation where every citizen enjoys the rights guaranteed by the Constitution. The participants were also made aware of their rights and encouraged to fulfill their corresponding duties.

In order to commemorate Human Rights Day, some District Legal Services Authorities in coordination with the Medical Department, organized Blood Donation Camps in their respective districts. The initiative of DLSA, Nainital was conducted in the benign presence of Hon'ble Executive Chairman, UKSLSA, Nainital and other Hon'ble Judges of High Court of Uttarakhand. These initiatives witnessed enthusiastic participation from judicial officers, advocates, court staff, law students and members of the general public. The camps were conducted in a well-organized and hygienic manner under the supervision of qualified medical professionals, ensuring adherence to all prescribed health and safety protocols and total 75 units blood were donated in such camps. The noble endeavor aimed at promoting the values of humanity, compassion and the right to health, while also contributing significantly to meeting the urgent requirement of blood for patients in need.

Further, it was informed that on the occasion of **Human Rights Day**, Para Legal Volunteers (PLVs) organized **"Know Your Rights" walk-through programmes** at various police stations across the State. Students from different schools actively participated in these programmes and were sensitized about the complaint redressal mechanisms, including the procedure for registration of FIRs, the functioning and importance of Women Help Desks, and the available mechanisms for seeking legal aid.

During the programmes at Schools & Collects the students were also apprised of landmark judgments of the Hon'ble Supreme Court relating to human rights, the provisions of the POCSO Act, and the availability of free legal services under the Legal Services Authorities framework. Information regarding the **NALSA Helpline Number – 15100** was disseminated. Pamphlets and other informational materials were distributed among the students to reinforce awareness and ensure wider dissemination of legal knowledge.

In addition to the activities conducted by the DLSAs, Para Legal Volunteers (PLVs) organized **55** Legal Literacy and Awareness Camps across various shelter homes, effectively sensitizing residents to the history, significance, and practical application of human rights. Interactive sessions were held on the adoption of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, highlighting its role in upholding dignity, equality, and freedom, including the rights to life, liberty, education, non-discrimination, and protection from exploitation.

Shelter home residents—comprising women, children, destitute individuals, and survivors of abuse or disasters were provided tailored awareness on accessing NALSA schemes such as free legal aid, victim compensation, and protections under the POCSO Act. The sessions also emphasized the relevance and application of human rights in everyday life.

On the occasion of World Human Rights Day, The DLSAs with the assistance of PLVs also organized **09** Legal Literacy and Awareness-cum-Nukkad-Nataks in various District Jails. Through these interactive performances inmates were sensitized about the importance of human rights, access to free legal aid, and the fundamental values of *Equality, Dignity, and Justice for All*.

PAN-INDIA ENVIRONMENTAL LEGAL LITERACY & COMMUNITY PROTECTION INITIATIVE TITLED "PROTECT TODAY, SECURE TOMORROW."

The Legal Services Institutions in the State have undertaken activities/ campaign "Protect Today, Secure Tomorrow"- Environmental Legal Literacy & Community Protection Initiative across the State of Uttarakhand in the month of December, 2025, as per background, objectives, scope, components and expected outcomes of the initiative outlined in the Concept Note. The initiative is intended as a time-bound legal literacy and community protection effort, without directing or substituting the functions of executive or regulatory authorities.

Under the "Protect Today, Secure Tomorrow"- Environmental Legal Literacy & Community Protection Initiative, **30 Awareness Camps** / Programmes were organized in the industrial pockets and manufacturing corridors; **279 in urban low-income** and densely populated habitations and **232 in village clusters adjoining** industrial belts, **252 in Residents Welfare Associations**, brick-kilns landfill areas; **289 in polluted water** bodies areas, **331 in labour addas**, construction sites, transport hubs. These programs reached approx. **29,805 participants**, sensitizing them on the importance of environmental protection and empowering communities especially vulnerable groups to actively safeguard their surroundings.

During the program, participants, women, children and students were sensitized to the critical importance of environmental protection, particularly in view of the increasingly adverse effects of environmental pollution being witnessed across the globe. Participants were also informed about environmental law provisions, including the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986, Water and Air Pollution Acts, Forest and Wildlife Protection Acts, and Waste Management Rules. The programs highlighted citizens' duties under Articles 48A and 51A (g) of the Constitution, the Right to a Clean Environment, and legal mechanisms to protect community rights.

08 Training Programmes were conducted for Para-Legal Volunteers (PLVs) and Panel Lawyers to ensure consistent and effective communication on environmental and public health issues. These sessions focused on building a thorough understanding of relevant environmental laws, the health impacts of environmental degradation, and practical strategies for community engagement.

Further, as part of the initiative, PLVs actively engaged communities through creative and participatory approaches. They organized **Nukkad Nataks** emphasizing environmental protection, the hazards of single-use plastics, and how to leverage legal mechanisms to safeguard the environment and community rights. Additionally, DLSAs with the help of Panel Lawyers, PLVs and local people conducted rallies in their local areas to raise awareness among the public about environmental conservation, water preservation and the harmful effects of polythene use, fostering a sense of responsibility and proactive action within the community.

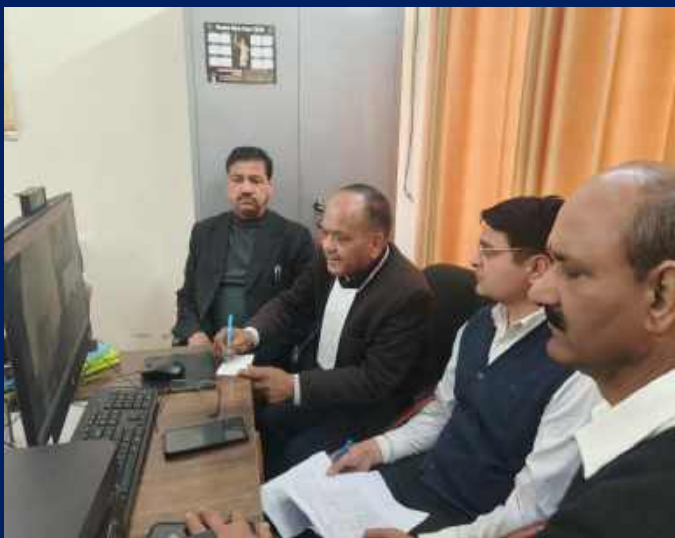
JAIL ACTIVITIES AND PROGRAMMES FOR UNDER TRIAL PRISONERS/ JAIL INMATES

During the period **October to December, 2025**, the District Legal Services Authorities (DLSAs) across the State of Uttarakhand organized **76 Legal Awareness Camps and programmes** and conducted **58 jail visits**, through which **9848 jail inmates** were sensitized about their **legal rights, bail provisions, legal aid facilities and the process of furnishing bail bonds**. During these visits, the visiting teams also inspected the **overall conditions and management of the jails**, including arrangements related to food, sanitation, hygiene, prisoners' safety, medical facilities, and other basic amenities, to ensure that inmates are treated in accordance with the provisions of law and human rights standards.

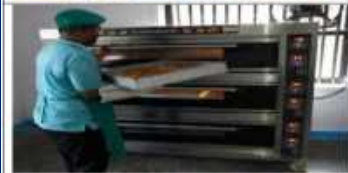
The inmates were also informed about the free legal services available through Legal Services Authorities and were encouraged to seek legal assistance for the redressal of their grievances and expeditious disposal of their cases.

During the said period, a total of **821 prisoners** were provided free legal aid through the appointment of Panel Advocates to represent them before the competent courts. The legal assistance was extended primarily to undertrial prisoners who had applied for legal aid in order to effectively defend their cases, particularly in matters relating to bail applications, criminal appeals, and other connected criminal proceedings.

This initiative was undertaken in furtherance of the mandate of NALSA and implemented through the DLSAs, ensuring that economically or socially disadvantaged prisoners are able to access fair legal representation and justice in accordance with the principles of free legal aid and access to justice.







24 OCTOBER, 2025 WORLD POLIO DAY

World Polio Day is observed every year on 24 October to raise awareness about polio, a highly infectious disease that mainly affects young children and can lead to permanent paralysis. The day highlights global efforts to eradicate polio through vaccination and public health initiatives. Governments, health organizations, and volunteers work together to ensure that every child receives the polio vaccine and is protected from this preventable disease. World Polio Day also honors the dedication of healthcare workers and organizations like World Health Organization and Rotary International, which play a major role in the fight against polio. By spreading awareness and promoting immunization, this day reminds us that with continued effort and cooperation, a polio-free world is possible.

On the occasion of World Polio Day on 24.10.2025, Legal Services Institutions organized **247** Legal Literacy and Awareness Programs across various districts, sensitizing **32,065** participants about the ongoing efforts to eradicate polio and the essential measures required to prevent the disease. These programs aimed to increase awareness about the importance of vaccination and the global initiatives undertaken to eliminate polio permanently. The sessions emphasized the significance of World Polio Day and highlighted the crucial role of immunization and public health awareness in protecting children and communities from this preventable disease. Participants were also informed about the collective responsibility of society in supporting polio eradication initiatives and ensuring that every child receives timely vaccination.

During the programs, participants were also educated about various welfare schemes and legal support mechanisms, including the NALSA (Legal Services for Victims of Drug Abuse and Elimination of Drug Menace) Scheme, 2015, and the NALSA (Legal Services for Persons with Mental Illness) Scheme, 2024, to ensure that vulnerable and marginalized sections of society are aware of the legal aid and assistance available to them.

The awareness sessions also provided information about the role of the National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) in safeguarding human rights. Participants were informed that the NHRC has established a toll-free helpline number, **14433**, to assist citizens in registering complaints related to human rights violations and seeking guidance. They were also made aware that complaints can be filed online through the official portal at hrcnet.nic.in, thereby ensuring accessible grievance redressal mechanisms for the public. These awareness activities were conducted in collaboration with the District Hospital and the Health Department to strengthen public outreach and health awareness.

On this occasion, rallies and community outreach campaigns were also organized by Legal Services Institutions in their respective districts to spread awareness among the local

population about the importance of timely vaccination, disease prevention, and the collective commitment required to achieve a polio-free society.



Campaign on Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) (POSH) Act, 2013

The **Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) (POSH) Act, 2013**, commonly known as the POSH Act, was enacted to protect women from sexual harassment at workplaces and to ensure a safe and dignified working environment. The law was introduced following the guidelines issued by the **Supreme Court of India** in the **Vishaka Guidelines** case. The Act defines sexual harassment to include unwelcome physical contact, requests for sexual favours, sexually coloured remarks, showing pornography, or any other verbal, non-verbal, or physical conduct of a sexual nature that creates a hostile work environment.

The POSH Act requires every organization with ten or more employees to establish an **Internal Complaints Committee (ICC)** to receive and address complaints of sexual harassment. It also mandates employers to create awareness, ensure a safe workplace, and take action against offenders. The law provides a proper complaint and inquiry mechanism and ensures that victims receive protection and justice. Overall, the Act plays an important role in promoting gender equality, respect, and safety for women at the workplace.

In view of the above, the District Legal Services Authorities organized **55 workshops, awareness programmes and orientation programmes** during October 2025 at various locations, including District Court complexes, rural areas, jail premises, and Tehsil court compounds. These programmes were conducted for the employees of the District Court, District Legal Services Authorities, members of the Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) constituted for the DLSAs, and members of the Internal Complaints Committee constituted under the District Administration and Police Department.

During these awareness programmes, the **Chairperson of the Internal Complaints Committee** constituted for the District Court and DLSAs provided detailed information to **22,560** members of the general public and committee members. It was explained that the said Act applies to workplaces in **both the government and private sectors**, including the organized and unorganized sectors.

It was further emphasized that every organization is required to constitute an Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) to inquire into and redress complaints of sexual harassment. In institutions with **fewer than 10 employees**, or in cases where an Internal Complaints Committee cannot be constituted, complaints are received and addressed by the Local Committee established at the district level.

At the event, the **Secretary, DLSAs** also informed the participants that the Act is a law enacted to address the issue of sexual harassment faced by women at the workplace. The Act aims to create a safe and conducive working environment for women and to protect them against incidents of sexual harassment. The Secretary further informed the participants that the primary objective of the awareness programme was to educate both employees and employers about the various forms of sexual harassment, its adverse effects, and the mechanisms available for its prevention and redressal. The attendees, including the members of the Internal Complaints Committee, were also sensitized in detail about the provisions of the Act through PowerPoint presentations and video demonstrations.

INTERNATIONAL ANTI-CORRUPTION DAY

By spreading awareness about legal provisions, preventive measures, and institutional mechanisms against corruption, International Anti-Corruption Day plays a vital role in building a fair, transparent, and accountable society.

Keeping in view the aforesaid, the Hon'ble Executive Chairman, UKSLSA, Nainital has been pleased to direct all the DLSAs to observe International Anti-Corruption Day, on 09 December, 2025. Operating under the strategic supervision of the **Member Secretary, UKSLSA**, these services are professionally facilitated by dedicated counsellors **Ms. Rakhi** and **Mr. G.K. Tripathi**.

Our institution is dedicated to providing comprehensive, psychological support tailored to the unique needs of individuals and families. Specializing in marital and family counselling, we offer a compassionate environment where professional guidance meets a commitment to holistic care. By integrating empathetic therapeutic practices with proven clinical strategies, we aim to enhance emotional well-being and foster the development of sustainable, healthy relationships. This dual focus ensures that our clients receive the tools necessary to navigate complex interpersonal dynamics, ultimately underscoring our mission to strengthen the foundational bonds of the community through specialized, person-centered mental health services.

Our counsellors are observing a notable surge in cases characterized by anxiety, depression, and emotional dysregulation, often compounded by severe psychological distress. Reflecting a complex interplay of stressors that impact both individual well-being and family stability. In response, we remain committed to providing targeted, compassionate interventions that address these critical issues, helping clients navigate the underlying causes of their distress and build long-term resilience.

Key Achievements-

- **All-encompassing psychological care services:** From October to December 2025, the Counselling Centre provided expert, personalized support to over 46 cases. This milestone reflects our team's exceptional clinical expertise and unwavering commitment to compassionate care for every individual and family served
- **Key focus areas include:**
 - Strategies for holistic well-being (mental, physical, emotional, social).
 - Managing life stress impact on relationship and health.
 - Identifying and addressing work-related stressors, especially management-related issues.
- ❖ **Voluntary and follow-up cases-** A significant number of clients received voluntary counselling services to address personal challenges and specific life issues. This proactive engagement is further evidenced by a high rate of follow-up sessions, demonstrating a sustained commitment to long-term healing and growth.

Success Story

- ❖ A 32-year-old husband and 25-year-old wife, married in 2022 with their families' full support, experienced a happy union until a minor misunderstanding in 2023 over a visit to the wife's maternal home escalated into a significant conflict. Following the dispute, both parties independently contacted the police as a precautionary measure; however, negative influence from friends and excessive family interference further strained the relationship, leading the wife to return to her maternal home and file several court cases. Notably, the husband refrained from initiating any legal action. Through the counselling process, the couple successfully resolved their differences; the husband expressed his sincere desire to reconcile and welcome his wife back, and the wife reciprocated, agreeing to dismiss the legal proceedings and return home from the court premises.
- ❖ A couple from Uttarakhand and Bihar, who met via a matrimonial site and married in 2016, faced immediate challenges, including the absence of the husband's parents at their wedding. After only three months of cohabitation, deep-seated disputes led to a separation, with the wife moving to her maternal home with their child and initiating legal proceedings. For 10 years, both parties remained rigid in their demands and grievances. However, through intensive counselling, the couple successfully addressed their misunderstandings. A pivotal breakthrough occurred when the wife's father was counselled, leading him to release his resentment and express a sincere desire to reconcile with his son-in-law's parents—a crucial step for inter-familial harmony. Ultimately, the couple agreed to unconditionally reunite and withdraw all pending court cases.

The ADR Centre at SLSA Nainital continues to achieve significant success in resolving matrimonial disputes through expert counselling. By facilitating targeted interventions, our counsellors help couples bridge their differences, leading to the successful reunification of numerous families. This initiative has empowered many to reconcile their grievances and voluntarily withdraw pending litigation in favour of cohabitation. These outcomes underscore SLSA Nainital's unwavering commitment to providing holistic support and positive guidance to the community.

Campaign on the occasion of "World AIDS Day"

World AIDS Day, observed every 1st of December, stands as one of humanity's most powerful global health observances, a solemn yet resolute reminder that the fight against HIV/AIDS is far from over. Since its inception in 1988, this day unites governments, health organizations, communities and individuals across every corner of the globe under a shared crimson ribbon, symbolizing solidarity living with HIV and honoring the tens of millions who have lost their lives to AIDS-related illnesses. Decades of relentless scientific advancement have transformed HIV from a near-certain death sentence into a manageable chronic condition, with antiretroviral therapies enabling people to live long, full lives, yet staggering inequities in access to treatment, persistent stigma and systemic discrimination continue to block the path to a true global end to AIDS. World AIDS Day is not merely a day of remembrance; it is a clarion call for bold political will, equitable healthcare, compassionate communities, and unyielding scientific innovation, because as long as one person remains untreated, unprotected or unheard, the mission remains unfinished.

World AIDS Day was observed across the State of Uttarakhand on **01st December, 2025** by various Legal Services Institutions, during which **78 Legal Awareness Camps and programmes** were organized and approx. **17855** persons including boys and girls students, parents, women, children, and senior citizens about the **symptoms, prevention, and treatment of HIV/AIDS**.

The awareness initiatives also addressed critical issues such as prevention of sexual exploitation and abuse against children, child sexual abuse prevention, promotion of treatment and rehabilitation, child safety and strengthening community awareness regarding child protection laws, cybercrime and digital arrest, the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act, the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, lewdness, bad touch awareness, children's rights, women's rights, rights of senior citizens and tribal welfare initiatives under Satya Yojana Samvad Yojana.

Detailed information was also provided about the functions and services of NALSA, SLSAs, DLSAs, TLSCs, NALSA Portal and the NALSA Helpline Number **15100**. The programmes were jointly conducted in District Hospitals and Primary Health Centers under the aegis of District Legal Services Authorities and the Health Department, where seminars and legal awareness camps were organized in the presence of CMS, Medical Officers, doctors, health workers, panel lawyers, legal defense counsel and PLVs associated with the DLSAs.

18 DECEMBER, 2025 CELEBRATION OF "WORLD MINORITY RIGHTS DAY"

World Minority Rights Day, observed on 18 December, to commemorates the 1992 adoption of the UN Declaration on the Rights of Persons Belonging to National or Ethnic, Religious and Linguistic Minorities, affirming every minority's right to their culture, religion, and language free from discrimination. The day calls upon governments, institutions, and civil society to ensure equal opportunities, legal protection, and social inclusion for minority communities, while combating prejudice and marginalization through education, dialogue, and participation. Ultimately, it serves as a powerful reminder that protecting minority rights is fundamental to building democratic, inclusive, and just societies worldwide.

As per the directions of the Hon'ble Executive Chairman of Uttarakhand State Legal Services Authority, **Minority Rights Day** was observed on **18 December 2025** across the State of Uttarakhand by various legal services institutions. On this occasion, the District Legal Services Authorities (DLSAs), Taluk Legal Services Committees (TLSCs), Para Legal Volunteers (PLVs), and Pro-Bono PLVs organized **89 legal awareness camps and rallies** in rural areas, schools, colleges, and public places through pamphlets and banners, reaching approximately **33,580 participants**. During these programmes, the attendees were sensitized about the **equal and special rights of minority communities**—including religious, linguistic, ethnic, and cultural minorities—guaranteed under the Constitution of India, which aims to ensure equality, security, inclusion, and respect for diversity. The programmes also highlighted the valuable contribution of all communities to the unity and integrity of the nation, promoting mutual understanding, harmony, and the elimination of discrimination. Furthermore, awareness activities were conducted in both rural and urban areas in collaboration with the Department of Women Empowerment and Child Development, District Social Welfare Department, and Child Welfare Committees, where the general public was informed about the protection of minority rights, the right to equality, the right to religious freedom, preservation of culture, language, and identity, as well as various welfare schemes implemented by the Central and State Governments for minority communities and mechanisms available for the redressal of their grievances.





MISCELLANEOUS ACTIVITIES

- DLSA, Dehradun, in collaboration with Kanishka Hospital and Welfare Society, organized a Free Health Camp on 21st December 2025 at Senior Citizen Swabhiman Kendra, Garhi Cantt., Dehradun. The camp, attended by Secretary Mrs. Seema Dungrakoti, aimed at promoting the well-being of senior citizens. Specialist doctors, including a cardiologist and urologist, provided free consultations, medical advice, and necessary referrals. The initiative was highly appreciated and reflected DLSA's commitment to supporting vulnerable sections of society.



- On 11th December, 2025, the Hon'ble District Judge, Dehradun, Shri Prem Singh Khimal, accompanied by Mrs. Seema Dungrakoti, Secretary, DLSA Dehradun, conducted a formal inspection of the Child Care Institute, Sarfina Trust Open Ashram Children's Home, Dehradun. During the inspection, the living conditions, sanitation, nutritional provisions, educational arrangements, and overall well-being of the children were thoroughly reviewed. The inmates were personally interacted with, their grievances were attentively heard, and the management was duly apprised of the observations, with appropriate directions issued wherever necessary, reaffirming DLSA Dehradun's commitment to ensuring the dignity, safety, and legal rights of every child in institutional care.



- During **December, 2025**, the **DLSA, Tehri Garhwal** organized a **One Day Basic Training Programme** for newly selected **Para Legal Volunteers (PLVs)**. During the training, the PLVs were comprehensively imparted knowledge of various Rules, Acts, and legal provisions relevant to their role, equipping them with the essential legal understanding and practical skills required to effectively and efficiently discharge their duties as Para Legal Volunteers in the service of the community.



- On **4th December, 2025**, a meeting was held at the Conference Hall, DLSA Haridwar, wherein the MMC reviewed and evaluated the work performed by Panel Lawyers and the LADC. Detailed discussions were held regarding the assignments entrusted to them, and views were freely exchanged on the various challenges and problems encountered in their day-to-day working. The MMC carefully assessed the overall performance of the Panel Lawyers and LADC, and constructive guidance was extended to ensure more effective and efficient delivery of legal aid services to the beneficiaries.



- On 7 December 2025, an inspection of the Auditorium Hall was conducted for organizing a Multipurpose Camp, followed by a meeting with the President, Vice President, and Dean of the Legal Services Department at COER University.



- On 3 December 2025, a PLVs meeting was held at the Conference Hall, DLSA Haridwar. The discussion covered the action plan for December 2025, including awareness topics, review and evaluation of PLVs' work, an awareness session on the NALSA Scheme for unorganized sector workers (2015), and welfare schemes for mentally disabled persons. A monthly work review was also conducted.



- On 23 December 2025, the Secretary, DLSA Dehradun, conducted a refresher training for police officers on the Supreme Court guidelines in the Gohar Mohammad case. The session covered the MV Act, warrants, summons, arrest rules, and victims' rights. The Chief Legal Aid Defence Counsel and Assistant Legal Aid Defence Counsel also provided detailed guidance and addressed queries.



- On 9th December, 2025, the DLSA, Chamoli conducted a **Training Programme on "NALSA Portal (LSMS & LAIS) and NALSA Schemes"** at the **District Court Auditorium, Gopeshwar**. The participants were comprehensively trained on the operational aspects and practical use of the **Legal Services Management System (LSMS)** and the **Legal Aid Information System (LAIS)** modules of the NALSA Portal, along with detailed guidance on the provisions, objectives, and benefits of various **NALSA Schemes** aimed at providing legal aid and assistance to eligible beneficiaries. The training equipped the participants with the necessary technical knowledge and procedural understanding to effectively utilize the portal in the efficient delivery of legal services at the grassroots level.



- Marking the **International Day of Persons with Disabilities**, the **Secretary, DLSA, Almora**, organized a **Legal Awareness and Free Health Check-up Camp** on **03.12. 2025**, at the **Lepers Colony, Baldhoti**. Conducted in close collaboration with the **Health Department**, the camp extended free health check-ups and medicines to the residents, bringing much-needed medical relief directly to one of society's most vulnerable communities. Complementing the health services, dedicated awareness sessions were held to educate the participants about their **legal rights**, available **government welfare schemes**, entitlement to **free legal aid**, and the procedure and benefits of the forthcoming **National Lok Adalat**.



- On **21st November, 2025**, **Secretary, DLSA, Pithoragarh**, visited the **Legal Services Clinic at the ANM Center**, and sensitized the visitors about a range of important legal and social issues. During the visit, detailed awareness was imparted on the **NALSA (Child-Friendly Legal Services for Children) Scheme, 2024**, highlighting its provisions and benefits for the protection and welfare of children. The visitors were further educated on the growing menace of **drug abuse** and the serious implications of **cybercrime**, equipping them with the knowledge to safeguard themselves and their families from such threats. Additionally, information was shared about the forthcoming **National Lok Adalat scheduled 13th December, 2025**, encouraging eligible persons to avail the opportunity for swift and amicable resolution of their disputes through this accessible and cost-free mechanism.

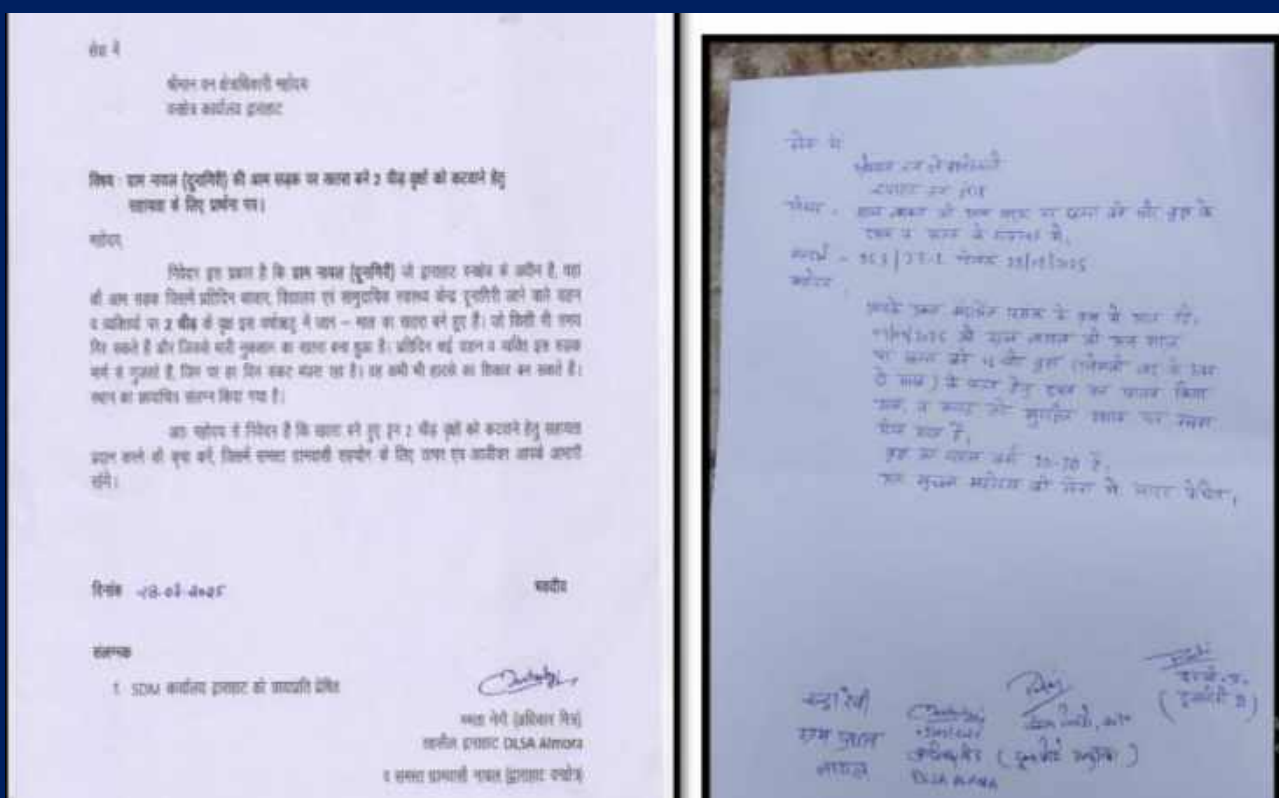


- In compliance with the directions of the **Uttarakhand SLSA, Nainital, Monthly Meeting of DLSA Haridwar** was convened on **14th November, 2025**, under the esteemed chairmanship of the **District Judge, Haridwar**. The meeting brought together all key stakeholders of the district administration on a common platform to deliberate upon the progress, challenges, and effective implementation of legal aid services and ongoing programmes of the Authority. The proceedings reflected DLSA Haridwar's steadfast commitment to ensuring coordinated, transparent, and result-oriented functioning in furtherance of the mandate of providing free and competent legal services to all eligible persons.



SUCCESS STORY

1. Under the guidance of the Secretary, DLSA Almora, on 13.08.2025, Adhikar Mitra at Tehsil Dwarahat, submitted a written intimation to the Forest Range Officer, Range Dwarahat, regarding two pine trees in Village Nayal (Dunagiri) which had become hazardous during the rainy season. The trees were leaning towards the public road and posed a serious risk to commuters, including students, patients, and residents traveling to the school, Community Health Centre, and market. During her regular duty at **Prem Nagar Police Station, Para Legal Volunteer Najma Parveen** assisted in reuniting two young boys, **Suraj and Krishna** (aged 7–8), who had been found wandering near **Nanda Ki Chowki, Prem Nagar** on the morning of the incident. Unable to recall their full addresses, the children were brought to the police station by a local medical store owner. Recognizing the urgency, PLV Najma Parveen immediately contacted **PLV Akbar Khan**, who traced the children’s home and brought their parents—both daily wage laborers unaware of their children’s absence—to the station. Thanks to the **prompt and diligent action** of the PLVs, the children were safely reunited with their families, who expressed **heartfelt gratitude to the District Legal Services Authority and the PLVs** for their timely intervention.



3.
