E-NEWSLETTER FOR JANUARY-2026 TO MARCH-2026

NATIONAL LOK ADALAT

National Lok Adalat is a people-centric dispute resolution mechanism conducted under the Legal Services Authorities Act, 1987. It helps to settle cases through mutual agreement without lengthy court procedures. Awards passed in Lok Adalats are legally binding and treated as decrees of civil courts.

During the quarter **January to March, 2026**, quarterly National Lok Adalat was organized on **14th March, 2026** across the State of Uttarakhand under the aegis of the National Legal Services Authority and the Uttarakhand State Legal Services Authority in accordance with the provisions of the Legal Services Authorities Act, 1987. The Lok Adalat was conducted simultaneously in the Hon'ble High Court at Nainital, all Districts, Taluks and Court Complexes with the objective of promoting amicable dispute resolution, reducing pendency of cases in courts, and ensuring speedy and cost-effective justice to litigants.

During the said National Lok Adalat, a total of **9401 pre-litigation cases** and **18285 pending cases** were successfully settled through mutual compromise between the parties. As a result of these settlements, an amount of **Rs. 21,10,73,655/-** was realized in pre-litigation matters, while **Rs. 90,43,34,127/-** was received as settlement amount in pending court cases. The successful disposal of a large number of disputes and the substantial settlement amount achieved during the National Lok Adalat significantly contributed to reducing the burden on regular courts and strengthened the objective of providing accessible, affordable, and expeditious justice to the people of the State.

The National Lok Adalat held on 14th March, 2026 witnessed a remarkable achievement in the realm of alternative dispute resolution and **36 cases** were settled amicably through quasi-judicial forums Consumer Court, Dehradun and compensation of ₹64,89,932/- were awarded to the deserving parties.





MULTI - PURPOSE LEGAL SERVICES AND AWARENESS CAMP

A Mega Multipurpose Legal Literacy and Awareness Camp was successfully organized by Secretary **DLSA, Almora** at Atal Utkrisht Government Inter College, Bhikiyasain, a remote and far-flung area of District Almora. The camp witnessed enthusiastic participation from the local public, students, government departments and social organizations. During the programme, the attendees were made aware about the establishment, objectives and functions of NALSA, SLSA and DLSA, free legal aid services, and important legal rights relating to women, children, transgender persons and senior citizens. Information regarding the NALSA Toll Free Helpline Number 15100 and Childline Number 1098 was also disseminated. The NALSA theme song was played to promote legal awareness and constitutional values among the participants.

Students provided certificate in appreciation of their performances in social awareness and justice programme. The camp also served as an important platform for extending the benefits of various Government welfare schemes to the needy beneficiaries. In collaboration with Ram Krishna Kutir, Almora, several assistive devices and essential items including 02 laptops, 10 tablets, 11 wheelchairs, 100 walking sticks, 54 hearing aids, 25 water purifiers, 04 Mahalaxmi kits, sports kits, 08 sewing machines and 100 blankets were distributed among eligible beneficiaries.

The Health Department conducted free health check-ups and distributed medicines to the general public, besides issuing 15 disability certificates during the camp. Free eye check-ups and distribution of spectacles were provided by Haidakhan Charitable Trust, Chilianaula, Ranikhet. Officers from various departments also provided information regarding public welfare schemes and extended benefits under different schemes through departmental stalls and awareness counters established at the venue.

The Adhikar Mitras/PLVs actively assisted the general public through help desks and legal aid stalls established at the venue and distributed approx. 2000 free legal awareness pamphlets among the attendees. The camp was attended by nearly people 5000 including local population and get benefitted from the legal awareness programmes, free health services and various welfare initiatives conducted during the event. The programme proved to be a meaningful and impactful initiative towards promoting legal literacy, ensuring access to justice and extending essential welfare services to the people residing in the remote areas of District Almora.



DLSA, Chamoli, organized 02 Multi-Purpose Legal Literacy and Awareness Camps was organized on 14 & 16 February, 2026, at Shiv Mandir premises, Sol Dugri, under the remote Tharali Tehsil and Bust Stand Nandnagar (Ghat) area of District Chamoli. The programme witnessed the participation of different dignitaries, officers and employees of various departments; Gram Pradhans of Gram Panchayats, PLVs and approximately 1,178 local residents.

Various government departments set up service/awareness stalls to educate and provide services relating to their department. The participants were sensitized about cyber crimes, women safety and emergency response services, free legal aid services, constitutional and legal rights, access to justice, and procedures for availing various welfare schemes. During the camp Rural Development Department assisted 50 beneficiaries with local products, Agriculture Department distributed farm equipment to 50 individuals. Department of Horticulture provided seeds and plants to 50 people, Social Welfare Department disbursed cheques under the Atal Housing, Stick and Vatsalya Schemes to 20 beneficiaries and Sub Treasury Dharali offered information related to Civil Pension to 5 individuals. Revenue Department informed 35 people about financial schemes and assisted with necessary certificates and the Education Department reached out to 75 beneficiaries. The State Bank of India served 40 individuals related to KYC and accounts, Labour Department done registration work for 20 beneficiaries.

The Panchayati Raj Department provided UCC cards, birth and death certificates to 60 people. The Sainik Welfare Department attended to 50 beneficiaries with pension-related information, and the Food Supply Department ration cards to 25 individuals, The Indian Postal Department facilitated Aadhaar registration and new Aadhaar card applications for 10 people, District Disabled Rehabilitation Centre provided UDID card-related assistance to 7 individuals. The Health Department conducted ENT and eye-related health check-ups and distributed medicines to 85 persons. The camp served a combined total of 562 beneficiaries across 15 departments directly to the people.



ESTABLISHMENT OF ANTI DRUG UNIT IN SCHOOLS & COLLEGES

The **National Legal Services Authority** has launched the **NALSA (DAWN – Drug Awareness and Wellness Navigation for a Drug Free India) Scheme, 2025** to address the growing problem of drug abuse through legal awareness, prevention, and rehabilitation support. The scheme aims to create awareness about the harmful effects of drugs, educate youth and communities about legal provisions, and provide guidance, counselling and legal assistance to persons affected by substance abuse.

Further, Uttarakhand, being a predominantly **hilly and geographically sensitive State**, has been increasingly facing the serious challenge of drug abuse. The problem of drug addiction has gradually permeated across various districts of the State, adversely affecting the social fabric and public health. In particular, **youth and students constitute the most vulnerable and affected segment of society**, as they are often exposed to substance abuse due to socio-economic pressures, unemployment, migration patterns, and limited recreational or developmental opportunities in remote hill regions.

Therefore, keeping in view the directions/guidelines of **NALSA** under the **NALSA (DAWN) Scheme** and in compliance of the directions issued by the Hon'ble Executive Chairman, UKSLSA, Nainital in the month of March, 2026, **Anti-Drug Units** in the premises of their Educational Institution, are being established in every **school, college, degree college, law college and university across the State of Uttarakhand**. The establishment of such institutional mechanisms would play a significant role in protecting youth and students from the growing menace of drug abuse, promoting healthy and responsible lifestyles, and ensuring the development of safe and drug-free educational campuses, thereby advancing the larger objective of creating a drug-free society as envisaged under the NALSA DAWN Scheme.

As per the aforesaid directions till date total **1471** Anti Drug Unit has established in the schools & colleges of the State.

These **Anti Drug Unit** constituted comprising of *01 Teacher, 02 Student Representatives (nominated by respective Principal), Counselors, Community Volunteers and 02 Para-Legal Volunteers (nominated by the respective Secretary, DLSA)*, total Seven (07) Members, who shall collectively work towards creating awareness regarding the harmful effects of drugs, identifying vulnerable students at an early stage, encouraging peer support systems and facilitating counselling and rehabilitation wherever necessary. These Anti Drug Units may also organize **awareness campaigns**,

workshops, seminars and legal literacy programmes in coordination with DLSAs/TLSCs and other stakeholders to strengthen preventive efforts and foster a responsible and drug-free campus environment.





LEGAL SERVICES CLINICS IN VILLAGE/CLUSTER OF VILLAGES

The Legal Aid/Services Clinics in villages, envisioned as the legal equivalent of Primary Health Centres, with a broad mandate to provide first-point legal advice and assistance and to liaison with government offices, are facing critical operational crises.

Pursuant to the provisions of the Legal Services Authorities Act, 1987 and in accordance with the NALSA Legal Aid Clinics Scheme, Village Legal Aid Clinics have been established across the State of Uttarakhand with the objective of making legal services accessible at the grassroots level and delivering justice directly to villagers and rural communities. These clinics particularly aim to assist the poor, marginalized, and weaker sections of society who face financial, social, or geographical barriers in approaching courts.

In light of the existing number of Village Legal Aid Clinics in the State and the findings of the India Justice Report 2022 and 2025, the Hon'ble Executive Chairman, UKSLSA, Nainital has been pleased to direct in February-2026, to all DLSAs/TLSCs to establish at least **One (01) Village Legal Aid Clinic for every cluster of Ten villages (Maximum 10 villages)** and **One (01) Legal Literacy Club in each Inter College in their respective districts** to effectively implement the mandate of "Access to Justice for All" under the Legal Services Authorities Act, 1987, thereby strengthening last-mile legal service delivery, enhancing legal awareness, and ensuring timely and affordable access to justice for rural and marginalized communities.

Therefore, as per the aforesaid total 483 Village Legal Aid Clinics have been established in the villages of the State and 458 Legal Aid Clinics & Legal Literacy Clubs have been established in the Schools, Colleges, Law Colleges & Universities of the State.



Statewide campaign “Apna Ashray-Our Shelter” In the month of February & March, 2026

Uttarakhand is a predominantly hilly State and during the winter season, particularly in higher and remote districts the region experiences extremely low temperatures and harsh climatic conditions. In such circumstances, **homeless persons, beggars, nomads, wanderers and other marginalized communities** face severe hardships, especially during night time. Lack of shelter, warm clothing and basic amenities exposes these vulnerable groups to serious health risks, including cold-related illnesses and, in extreme cases, poses a threat to life.

In order to ensure the **safety, dignity and basic well-being** of such persons, special protective and rehabilitative measures are required during the winter months. Provision of **night shelters/Ran Basera, temporary homes, blankets, warm clothing, drinking water and sanitation facilities** is essential.

Accordingly, as per directions of the Hon’ble Executive Chairman, UKSLSA Nainital, a campaign titled as “**Apna Aashray – Our Shelter**” has been launched in the State and directed to send the Monthly progress report.

In compliance with the aforesaid directions, all the District Legal Services Authorities are actively carrying out the campaign “Apna Aashray – Our Shelter” within their respective districts in coordination and cooperation with the Chief Development Officer, District Administration, local bodies, PLVs and other stakeholders. The campaign is being conducted with the objective of identification, protection, rehabilitation and welfare of homeless persons, beggars, nomadic communities and other vulnerable and marginalized sections of society, thereby ensuring their access to shelter, legal assistance, social security and various Government welfare schemes.

In a dedicated effort to protect the homeless and vulnerable population during the winter season, 424 PLVs were deployed across various areas to identify and assist those in need. Through sustained outreach, a total of **39 homeless and vulnerable persons** were identified, out of which **34** persons were provided shelter in **Ran Baseras (Night Shelters)**, and an overwhelming **709 persons** were provided with blankets and warm clothing to shield them from the harsh cold. Furthermore, **02 persons** were assisted for **temporary rehabilitation**, ensuring their immediate safety and well-being. The initiative was carried out in close coordination with the *District Administration, District Social Welfare Department, Women & Child Development Department* and various NGOs as Art of Living etc., through whom welfare schemes including Ran Basera and Social Welfare Schemes were facilitated for the beneficiaries.

However, certain challenges were encountered during the drive, notably the difficulty in identifying homeless and vulnerable persons in remote and scattered locations and the concern that many identified individuals, though neglected by their families, possessed homes but lacked financial support for their livelihood, making their rehabilitation a complex issue requiring long-term intervention.



CAMPAIGN UNDER 'PREVENTION OF SALE OF EXPIRY ITEMS'

Under the campaign **"Prevention of Sale of Expiry Items,"** a total of **33** meetings were convened by the committee members, comprising Food Safety Officers and Drug Inspectors.

The Food Safety Officers and Drug Inspectors informed the committee that surprise inspections of medical stores are being conducted every month at the district headquarters and in each tehsil of their respective districts as per the prescribed roster.

During the quarter from January to March 2026, a total of 205 medical stores were inspected, out of which 122 samples were taken for legal action by the concerned officers. Of these, 38 samples were found to be conforming to the prescribed standards. Further, 48 daily-need shops/stores/complexes were inspected, 649 registrations and licences were issued and 396 samples were collected.

The Food Safety Officers were directed that the number of inspections being conducted at present is inadequate. Therefore, the number of inspections should be increased every month. Special efforts should also be made to collect samples of food items at the entry/check points within their respective districts and to ensure regular quality checks of food items in order to maintain food safety standards.

In order to ensure the effective implementation of the aforesaid Awareness Drive through Mobile Van, following directions were issued to all the District Legal Services Authorities:-

1. To ensure the wider publicity of the **"Mediation for the Nation 2.0 Drive"** during the said visits. For this purpose, Banners/Posters/ Pamphlets and other necessary publicity materials be printed and distributed to the public at large during the said visits.
2. To play the NALSA theme song (**"Ek Mutthi Aasman"**) in all the legal awareness programmes being organized by the Mobile Van and to publicize the NALSA Helpline Number 15100 during the said visits.
3. To display/broadcast the documentary films and other audio-video informative materials (as prepared by the NALSA and Uttarakhand SLA, Nainital) during the mobile van visit and to distribute the SaralKannuniGyan Mala books to the general public.
4. To avail the services of Panel Lawyers and Legal Aid Defense Counsels for this purpose.
5. To deploy 02 PLVs for each day with the Mobile Van for this purpose.
6. To fill up/prepare the necessary applications, forms, etc. for seeking legal aid, advice, and other beneficial schemes of the Central/State Govt. by the PLVs on the spot and thereafter the office of DLSA shall coordinate with the concerned departments.
7. To ensure the wide publicity of the upcoming National Lok Adalat through Mobile Van.
8. To ensure the wide publicity about the role, objectives and benefits of the Permanent Lok Adalats in all the legal awareness programmes being organized by the Mobile Van in their respective districts.
9. To coordinate with the Police, District & School Administration and the concerned Gram Panchayats and Gram Pradhans, etc. for extending their cooperation in this regard.

In compliance of the aforesaid directions, District Legal Services Authorities conducted masslegal literacy and awareness programmes and camps through Mobile Van in rural and urban areas of their districts as well as in schools and Colleges.

REPORT ON CAMPAIGN GENERIC DRUGS: EFFECTIVE, ECONOMICAL & ESSENTIAL & SAFE DRUGS: SAFE LIFE CAMPAIGN

Access to affordable and safe medicines is a fundamental component of public healthcare. Generic medicines provide the same therapeutic benefits as branded medicines at significantly lower costs, making healthcare more accessible to all sections of society. Simultaneously, awareness regarding the safe use of medicines is equally important to prevent misuse, adverse drug reactions, and antimicrobial resistance.

To address these concerns and as per directions of the Hon'ble Executive Chairman, UKSLSA, Nainital the "Generic Drugs: Effective, Economical, and Essential" initiative and the "Safe Drugs: Safe Life Campaign" campaign are being carried out across the State which aims to educate citizens about the benefits of generic medicines and promote the responsible use of drugs.

Understanding Generic Drugs

Generic drugs are medicines that contain the same active ingredients, dosage, strength, quality, and intended use as branded medicines. They are approved by regulatory authorities after ensuring safety, efficacy, and quality standards.

Key Features:

- Same therapeutic effect as branded medicines.
- Significantly lower cost.
- Quality tested and approved.
- Widely available through Jan Aushadhi Kendras and healthcare institutions.



"GENERIC DRUGS: EFFECTIVE, ECONOMICAL AND ESSENTIAL" CAMPAIGN

In compliance with the directions issued by UKSLSA all DLSAs, conducted awareness campaign titled **"Generic Drugs: Effective, Economical and Essential"**. The campaign was organized with the objective of promoting awareness regarding the effectiveness, affordability, and necessity of generic medicines among the general public.

The campaign was conducted under the guidance of the Chairman, District Legal Services Authorities and the supervision of the Secretary, DLSAs.

Objectives of the Campaign:

1. To educate citizens about the benefits of generic medicines.
2. To promote the use of affordable and quality-assured medicines.
3. To create awareness regarding the difference between generic and branded medicines.
4. To reduce healthcare expenditure for economically weaker sections.

SAFE DRUGS: SAFE LIFE CAMPAIGN CAMPAIGN:

In compliance with the directions issued by the Uttarakhand State Legal Services Authority, Nainital, All District Legal Services Authority (DLSAs), organized and monitored various awareness and inspection activities under the campaign titled **"Safe Drugs: Safe Life" (सुरक्षित दवा-सुरक्षित जीवन)** during February–March 2026. The campaign aimed to promote awareness regarding safe medicines, prevent the sale and consumption of harmful drugs, and ensure public health and safety.

Objectives of the Campaign:

1. To spread awareness regarding safe and responsible use of medicines.
2. To prevent misuse and illegal sale of medicines.
3. To ensure compliance with drug safety regulations by medical stores.
4. To educate the public regarding the harmful effects of intoxicating and expired drugs.
5. To strengthen coordination among legal services institutions, health authorities, and law enforcement agencies.

- Medical stores were found generally compliant with prescribed regulations
- Public awareness regarding safe medicine usage increased.
- Better coordination was established among DLSA, Health Department, and Police Administration.
- Medical store owners were sensitized regarding legal obligations and safe storage practices.
- Citizens were educated about the risks associated with unsafe and unauthorized medicines.

Generic medicines represent an effective, economical, and essential healthcare solution. Coupled with responsible drug usage practices, they can significantly improve public health outcomes and reduce financial burdens on families. Through sustained awareness, community participation, and strong institutional support, the "Generic Drugs: Effective, Economical, and Essential" initiative and the "Safe Medicine: Safe Life" Campaign can contribute towards a healthier, safer, and more affordable healthcare system for all. The campaign proved to be a significant initiative towards ensuring public health and drug safety. Through joint inspections, awareness programmes, and community engagement, the campaign successfully promoted responsible medicine use and strengthened public awareness regarding safe healthcare practices. Continued efforts in this direction will contribute substantially towards a healthier and safer society.

CAMPAIGN "SAY NO TO DOWRY"

In Compliance of the directions issued in the Judgment dated 15.12.2025 passed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in Criminal Appeal Nos. 132-133/2017, State of U.P. Vs. Ajmal Beg etc.' and as per approval of the Hon'ble Executive Chairman, UKSLSA, Nainital the DLSAs have carried a Campaign as '**Say No to Dowry**' during the quarter January to March, 2026, by organizing workshops and awareness programmes across the State, on the provisions, objectives and consequences of violations under the Dowry Prohibition Act.

The campaign was organized with the objective of sensitizing the public to the vital importance of education, healthcare, and proper nutrition for the girl child, while promoting gender equality and social empowerment. It also sought to raise awareness about the need to eradicate gender-based discrimination and deeply entrenched social evils, particularly the dowry system, which continues to adversely affect women and girls in society.

Total **348** camps/workshops/programmes were organized during the campaign and approx. **11385** people have attended these campaigns and were informed about the salient provisions of the Dowry Prohibition Act, 1961, including the legal implications and penal consequences associated with the demanding, giving, or taking of dowry. The resource persons emphasized the rights and protections available under the law and encouraged active community participation in combating such unlawful practices. The programme served as an effective platform for enhancing legal literacy, fostering social responsibility and empowering individuals to speak out against dowry and other discriminatory practices. In this campaign **34** persons were benefited by providing Legal Aid/Assistance by the DLSAs.

The Dowry Prohibition Act, 1961 defines dowry as any property or valuable security given or agreed to be given in connection with a marriage. Giving, taking, or demanding dowry is a punishable offence. The Act also prohibits dowry advertisements. Such offences are cognizable, non-bailable, and non-compoundable, with penalties including imprisonment and fines. The burden of proving that no dowry was taken or given lies on the accused.

The campaign witnessed the enthusiastic participation of common mass including community members, who pledged their commitment to building a society free from dowry and gender discrimination. These programmes were conducted in close coordination with the District Administration, with active engagement and participation

of all stakeholders, including civil society groups, NGOs, educational institutions and other relevant agencies, ensuring meaningful participation of women and girls to promote awareness, prevention and social sensitization against the practice of dowry.

The DLSAs also promoted the said campaign through print, electronic, and social media, and photographs of the campaign activities were uploaded on various social media platforms.





04th February, 2026 Observation of "World Cancer Day"

Every year on **4 February, World Cancer Day** serves as a powerful reminder that cancer affects millions of lives across the globe. The day encourages awareness, early diagnosis, and collective action to ensure better prevention, treatment, and support for everyone impacted by the disease. Cancer remains one of the leading causes of death worldwide.

Cancer does not discriminate. It touches every nation, every community, and every family. World Cancer Day challenges the myths and misconceptions that prevent people from seeking timely care and it amplifies the urgent call for equitable access to quality treatment for all regardless of geography or income. Early diagnosis alone can increase survival rates by up to 80% for several common cancers.

To create awareness among the general public, DLSAs TLSCs, and PLVs observed **World Cancer Day** on **04 February 2026**. On this occasion, a total of **117 awareness camps, programmes, and rallies** were organized through banners and pamphlets in rural areas, hospitals, and other public places. These programmes were attended by **14,561 persons**, who were sensitized about the causes and symptoms of cancer, the importance of timely check-ups, early detection, vaccination, and preventive measures. Participants were also informed about the need for mental and social support for cancer patients, various government facilities available for their treatment and welfare and the importance of fostering compassion and sensitivity towards individuals suffering from cancer.

To mark the occasion, a **Painting Competition** was also organized on the theme **"Cancer-Free Society."** The competition witnessed enthusiastic participation, providing a platform for participants to creatively express messages of cancer awareness, prevention, hope, and recovery through their artwork. The event encouraged public engagement and helped spread awareness about the importance of building a healthier and cancer-free society.





CELEBRATION OF INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY ON 8th MARCH, 2026

International Women's Day is a powerful reminder of the strength, resilience, and achievements of women across the world. Celebrated every year on March 8, this day honors the social, economic, cultural, and political contributions of women while also raising awareness about gender equality and women's rights. It is not just a celebration, but also a call to create a world where every woman is respected, empowered, and given equal opportunities to succeed. International Women's Day inspires people to appreciate the important role women play in families, workplaces, and society, and encourages everyone to work together for a more inclusive and equal future.

As per the directions of the Hon'ble Executive Chairman, UKSLSA, Nainital, all DLSAs were directed to celebrate International Women's Day on 08th March, 2026 throughout the State of Uttarakhand. The DLSAs were further instructed to highlight the NALSA Scheme for Women and organize Girls' Mega Awareness Rallies, Legal Aid Desks in public markets, and felicitation ceremonies for women change-makers who have made significant contributions to society.

In compliance with the aforesaid directions the DLSAs, in collaboration with the officials and staff of the One Stop Centre, Women and Child Development Department, District Probation Department, and Child Welfare Committee, organized **57** awareness programme attended by 3140 persons and **09** Awareness Rallies in rural and urban areas of their districts, to mark the occasion in a meaningful manner. Furthermore, TLSCs, were also organized legal awareness camps within their jurisdiction, with the assistance of PLVs and other stakeholders.

During these programmes, participants were sensitized regarding various women-centric laws and welfare provisions, including the Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act, 2005, the POSH Act, 2013, Dowry Prohibition Act, the Maternity Benefit Act, laws relating to maintenance and alimony, women and girl empowerment, safety laws, health awareness, equal opportunities, legal remedies property and inheritance rights, free legal aid under the Legal Services Authorities Act, 1987 and various government schemes.

Further, as per the directives of the DLSAs, the PLVs and Pro-Bono PLVs also organized legal awareness camps & rallies at places of their deployment.

Detailed information was disseminated to the public covering the following key legislations and entitlements:

To utilize the occasion effectively and ensure meaningful outreach, the DLSAs also conducted counseling sessions for domestic violence survivors, single mothers, widows, women workers, and migrant women. Following the counseling process, 07 matters requiring further intervention were referred to the concerned for necessary action and assistance.

"Bal Vivah Mukht Bharat Abhiyan"

Campaign (January to March, 2026)

Under the NALSA (ASHA) Standard Operating Procedure (SOP)-Towards Eliminating Child Marriage, 2025, the **"Bal Vivah Mukht Bharat Abhiyan"** campaign was carried out across the State from January to March 2026. The campaign aimed to prevent child marriages, protect children at risk and facilitate the rehabilitation of victims through a coordinated, multi-stakeholder approach. It focused on empowering children, parents, guardians and communities through legal awareness, capacity building and support mechanisms to combat the social and familial pressures that often lead to child marriage.

As part of the campaign, extensive awareness and capacity-building activities were undertaken throughout the State. A total of 47 training and refresher sessions on child protection and prevention of child marriage were organized, and one PLVs was deployed in each village to strengthen grassroots outreach and intervention efforts. Further, 550 programmes were conducted to secure community resolutions and declarations of zero tolerance towards child marriage. In addition, 751 legal literacy programmes were organized in schools and colleges, while 800 community-level awareness programmes, public demonstrations, and campaigns were conducted, benefiting 26362 persons across Uttarakhand.

The campaign also played a significant role in intervention and rehabilitation efforts. A total of 36 rescue operations were facilitated in accordance with the Mission Vatsalya Framework, leading to the rehabilitation of 11 persons. To enhance public engagement and community participation, 8 Nukkad Nataks and 19 rallies were organized across various districts, effectively disseminating the message against child marriage and promoting the rights and welfare of children.

The DLSAs and PLVs organized 53 awareness Camps & Rallies in rural areas, schools and public places through banners and pamphlets, educating people on the importance of forests, prevention of deforestation and forest fires, oxygen reserves, environmental balance, water conservation and the role of forests in livelihood and nutrition. Participants were also made aware of the legal framework protecting forests and the environment, including the Forest Rights Act, 2006 (Individual and Community Rights), the Wildlife Protection Act, 1972, the Indian Forest Act, 1927, the Environment Protection Act, 1986 and Article 48A of the Constitution of India, thereby integrating environmental awareness with legal literacy at the grassroots level.

"WORLD WATER DAY"

Water is the foundation of all life on Earth and **World Water Day**, observed every year on **March 22**, is a global initiative to highlight the critical importance of freshwater and advocate for the sustainable management of water resources. Despite covering nearly 71% of the Earth's surface, only about 3% of the world's water is fresh and a large portion of it remains inaccessible, making water scarcity one of the most pressing challenges of our time. Billions of people around the world still lack access to safe drinking water and sanitation, threatening public health, food security, and economic development. Through awareness campaigns, community programs and policy advocacy, this day urges to take meaningful action to **conserve water, prevent pollution, and ensure equitable access to this precious resource** because protecting water today means securing life for generations to come.

Keeping in view of the aforesaid, the DLSAs organized awareness camps and outreach programmes on the occasion of **"World Water Day"** on 22.03.2026 at various places within their respective districts. The programmes were conducted in rural and urban areas, schools, public institutions, community centres, and other public places with active participation from Panel Lawyers, PLVs, students, local residents and members of the community.

The primary objective of the campaign was to create awareness among the general public regarding the importance of water conservation and sustainable use of water resources. Through awareness camps, rallies, banners, pamphlets, and interactive sessions, participants were educated about the growing water crisis, prevention of unnecessary wastage of water, rainwater harvesting, groundwater recharge, protection of rivers, ponds, and other natural water bodies, as well as the harmful effects of water pollution, excessive exploitation of groundwater, and climate change. Special emphasis was also laid on encouraging individuals and communities to adopt water-saving practices and actively participate in preserving natural water resources and maintaining cleanliness around local water sources.

During the campaign, total of 33 awareness camps and 07 rallies were organized by the DLSAs with the active assistance and participation of Panel Lawyers, Para Legal Volunteers (PLVs), government departments, educational institutions, local authorities, social organizations, and other stakeholders associated with water conservation and environmental protection activities.

- **Key focus areas include:**

-Holistic well-being requires a balanced, interconnected approach. Physical health builds the foundation through regular movement and restorative habits, while mental clarity is nurtured with daily mindfulness. Furthermore, emotional resilience is cultivated by acknowledging feelings, and social connections are strengthened through community engagement and supportive relationships.

-When stress strikes, stop treating it as an enemy. Instead, reframe pressure as an external challenge your relationship is tackling together. This mindset shift calms your physical fight-or-flight response—protecting your long-term health—and transforms moments of crisis into opportunities to build deeper trust and teamwork.

- Identify management-related stressors by tracking triggers like micromanagement, unclear expectations and lack of support. Address these by requesting structured, one-on-one check-ins to align on priorities, set realistic deadlines, and practice assertive, solution-focused communication with your supervisors.

- ❖ **Voluntary and follow-up cases-** At the counselling center, 10-12 individuals proactively sought out voluntary counselling services, largely motivated by distinct personal needs to address specific issues or psychological challenges. Clients have actively continued their session by consistently availing themselves of ongoing follow-up services, ensuring sustained support and progress.

SUCCESS STORY

The case demonstrates how timely psychological intervention, family support and constructive communication can transform a distressed marital relationship into a successful reunion. Couple entered into marriage at the age of 30yr with hope and expectations for a fulfilling married life. However shortly after the marriage, the wife returned to her parental home for rituals after spending only two days with her husband. The wife and her family reported that she was experiencing health related concerns and emotional discomfort. During this period, she sought medical treatment and remained with her family. The unexpected separation created uncertainty, disappointment and emotional distress for both spouses. The husband experienced feeling of confusion, rejection and helplessness despite his willingness to support his wife and facilitate her treatment.

Simultaneously, the wife appeared to be struggling with health issues, emotional adjustment and anxiety associated with the transition of married life. As communication between the spouses and their families became limited, assumptions and misunderstanding gradually replaced direct dialogues. Emotional reactions, unmet expectations and family influences contributed to growing mistrust. Over time the relationship deteriorated and both parties sought legal remedies through matrimonial proceeding. This step of both intensified emotional strain and reinforced negative perceptions on both sides.

The matter was subsequently interacted in counselling. During the initial session both spouses were provided a safe and non-judgmental environment to express their feeling, disappointments and expectations. Individual

counselling help each to gain inside into their emotional responses and recognize the impact of miss communication on the relationship.

Joint session with family focused on improving communication promoted empathy and increased perspective taking. The outcome was highly positive. The spouses mutually agreed to reunite and resumed their marital life. Wife and husband agreed to withdraw their court cases. The counselling reflected not only the resolution of dispute but also the restoration of emotional connection, trust and mutual respect.

The ADR Centre at SLSA Nainital utilizes psychological interventions to facilitate conflict resolution in matrimonial disputes. By addressing the cognitive and emotional barriers in distressed relationships, the counsellors foster a deeper understanding between couples. This therapeutic approach empowers partners to shift from adversarial stances to collaborative problem-solving, actively addressing underlying grievances. Consequently, many couples experience restored relationship satisfaction and emotional readiness to withdraw pending litigation in favor of renewed cohabitation.

JAIL ACTIVITIES

- On 29.01.2026 Secretary, DLSA Almora organized legal awareness camp in District Jail Almora. Interaction with inmates was done. Inspection of kitchen, hospital, barracks etc was done. Progress of ongoing vocational training programmes was also assessed by Secretary DLSA Almora. Visit of PLAC was conducted. Retainer lawyer, Community PLV and Jail PLV were also present. Numerous persons were benefitted.



- Online meeting/interaction was made on 20/01/2026 with jail inmates about their rights and progress in filing of applications/appeals before the concerned courts by secretary, district Legal Service Authority, Bageshwar.

- On 23.01.2026, during an inspection of the jail, the Secretary, DLSA Champawat, interacted with the inmates at Judicial Lockup, Lohaghat to understand their concerns regarding food, healthcare facilities, and the availability of free legal aid. The primary objective of the awareness camp was to identify areas with a high prevalence of drug abuse and communities vulnerable to drug use and trafficking. During the programme, the prisoners were sensitized and made aware of the objectives and benefits of the NALSA (DAWN) Scheme, 2025.



- On 31.01.2026, the PLV visited Lohaghat Prison under the Jail Manual Legal Aid Clinic Programme to inquire about the well-being of the inmates and to ascertain any issues or grievances faced by them. During the interaction, the prisoners were asked about their problems; however, none of the inmates reported any difficulties or concerns. A total of 41 inmates were found to be lodged in Lohaghat Prison at the time of the visit.



- On 22.01.2026, the Secretary, DLSA Dehradun, inspected Dehradun Jail and interacted with female inmates. The Legal Aid Clinic, kitchen, youth barracks, and jail workshop were also inspected. Inmates were informed about free legal aid services and encouraged to avail skill development opportunities. Their grievances were addressed with the assistance of PLVs. During the inspection, information was received regarding the



serious illness of the son of an inmate. The concerned PLV was directed to coordinate with the family and hospital authorities, provide necessary assistance, and submit a report. The tition was subsequently conveyed to the inmate through the jail authorities.

- Secretary, DLSA Dehradun, on 23.03.2026 conducted a surprise inspection of District Jail, Dehradun to assess the welfare of inmates and the functioning of legal aid services within the prison. During the inspection, she visited the women's barrack and interacted with newly admitted inmates, informing them about their legal rights and the availability of **free legal aid services**. The **Prison Legal Aid Clinic** was also inspected to review its functioning and accessibility to



inmates. Furthermore, necessary directions were issued regarding the ongoing **HIV screening, counselling and awareness initiatives** being conducted in the jail, with an emphasis on ensuring timely medical support, effective counselling, and the protection of inmates' health and well-being.

- On 27.02.2026, a joint inspection of the District Jail, Haridwar was conducted by the District Judge/Chairperson and the Secretary, DLSA Haridwar. During the visit, they interacted with the jail inmates to understand their concerns, grievances, and legal needs. The Chairperson and Secretary carefully heard the issues raised by the inmates and provided appropriate guidance and assistance. The grievances brought to their notice were addressed and referred to the concerned authorities



for necessary action, as per the nature of the issues. As part of the inspection, the Chairperson and Secretary reviewed the overall living conditions and welfare measures available to the inmates. Special attention was given to the quality and hygiene of food, cleanliness and maintenance of toilets, accessibility and functioning of the



complaint

box mechanism, medical facilities, and other essential amenities within the jail premises. The inspection was undertaken to ensure the protection of inmates' rights, monitor the availability of legal aid services, and strengthen access to justice within the correctional institution.



TRAINING/CAPACITY BUILDING PROGRAMME

As per the directions of the Hon'ble Executive Chairman, UKSLSA, Nainital and considering the frequent updation and revision of Acts, Rules and legal provisions by the Government, as well as the growing importance of PLVs in bridging the gap between Legal Services Institutions and the public, to disseminate public welfare schemes and extend the outreach of legal services institutions, all DLSAs have increased the strength of PLVs and accordingly Basic Training Programmes for newly appointed PLVs under the guidance and supervision of the **Secretary, DLSA**. The programme was conducted with the objective of equipping the newly appointed PLVs with fundamental knowledge of the legal services delivery system, their roles and responsibilities and the various welfare and legal aid schemes available for the benefit of the public.

During the training, participants were sensitized about the objectives and functions of the **NALSA** and **Legal Services Institutions**, access to free legal aid, victim compensation schemes, legal awareness activities, alternative dispute resolution mechanisms and methods of assisting vulnerable and marginalized sections of society. The Secretary, DLSA, emphasized the crucial role of PLVs as a bridge between the legal aid institutions and the community. The programme concluded with an interactive session in which participants raised queries and discussed practical aspects of legal aid outreach, enabling them to better understand their responsibilities.

- Secretary DLSA Almora organized 10 days vocational training of electrician work for male inmates in collaboration with I.T.I. Almora at District Jail Almora from 22.01.2026.
- On 02.01.2026 Secretary DLSA Almora organized 10 days vocational training program of plumbing for male inmates in District Jail in collaboration with I.T.I. Almora.



- On 07.01.2026 Secretary DLSA organized orientation sessions for legal aid counsels and PLVs attached to Prison Legal Aid Clinic with regard to previous quarter's performance in UTRC, pendency, gaps identified by them as well as by NALSA.

- On 05.01.2026, DLSA Chamoli organized Training Programme and the participants were imparted training relating to the provisions of the NALSA Portal (LSMS and LAIS) and NALSA Schemes. The event was attended by 48 PLVs and 12 Panel Lawyers.



- On 28.03.2026, a Refresher Training Programme was conducted for police officers of Dehradun with the objective of strengthening their understanding of key legal provisions and procedural requirements. The training covered significant legal topics, including the guidelines issued by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the Gohar Mohammad Case, important provisions of the Motor Vehicles Act, procedures relating to the execution of warrants and service of summons, lawful arrest



procedures and the rights of accused persons, as well as victims' rights and the documentation required at various stages of criminal proceedings. The programme was conducted by the Secretary, DLSA Dehradun, along with members of the LADCS, who provided practical insights on the effective application of legal provisions in day-to-day policing. The resource persons also addressed the queries and operational challenges faced by the officers, fostering a better understanding of legal compliance and procedural fairness. The session concluded with an interactive discussion, enabling participants to exchange experiences and clarify doubts, thereby promoting the effective and lawful implementation of justice delivery mechanisms.

MISCELLANEOUS ACTIVITIES

- On 05.01.2026 PLV'S meeting was organized at conference hall DLSA haridwar. Discussion about plan of action for the month of JANUARY 2026 includes all the topics to be covered for awareness in the month of JANUARY 2026 and Review & Evaluation of the work done by PLVs, Awareness session about Implementation of the NALSA (VEER PARIVAR SAHAYATA YOJNA) Scheme 2015. Also review of per month work was done.



- On 06.01.2026 a Monthly Meeting with Panel lawyers & LADC by Monitoring Mentoring Committee under the chairmanship of Chairman DLSA. Discussions with panel lawyers & LADC about the works assigned to them, exchanged views about various problems faced in day to day working with Panel lawyers and evaluation of work done by Panel lawyers & LADC was reviewed by the MMC and it was informed that bills of panel advocates will be generated only through the LSMAC portal.



- On 15.01.2026, a monthly UTRC/Board of Visitors meeting was convened at the Meeting Hall, District Court, Roshnabad, Haridwar, under the chairmanship of the Hon'ble Executive Chairman, DLSA (District Judge). The meeting reviewed legal aid and welfare measures for poor and undertrial prisoners, along with the implementation of the Victim Compensation Scheme, focusing on timely identification of eligible victims, processing of claims, and disbursement of compensation.



- On 26.01.2026, Republic Day was celebrated at the District Court, Haridwar, with a formal ceremony attended by the District Judge, judicial officers, court staff, and DLSA representatives. The DLSA Secretary administered the oath of the Preamble to the Constitution, reaffirming the fundamental values of the Indian Republic.



- Aligned with the campaign for International Women's Day, DLSA Haridwar, in collaboration with the One Stop Center and other stakeholders, organized a **Mahila Jan Sunwai Camp** on 21.03.2026 at Zila Sahkari Hall, Haridwar. The grievances and issues brought forward during the camp were duly heard, and appropriate redressal measures were undertaken by the concerned departments in accordance with the nature of the cases.



- DLSA Haridwar** celebrated the Republic Day with great enthusiasm and patriotic spirit. The celebrations commenced with the hoisting of the National Flag, followed by the rendition of the National Anthem. The programme was attended by the Chairman and Secretary, DLSA, Judicial Officers, officials and staff of the District Judiciary and DLSA officials. The occasion served as an opportunity to reaffirm the ideals of justice, equality and constitutional values.



- On the occasion of the World Day of Social Justice on 20.02.2026 Secretary, DLSA Haridwar, visited the Legal Aid Clinic at Tehsil Jwalapur, District Haridwar. During the visit, the Secretary interacted with visitors and senior citizens to assess the effectiveness of legal aid services and to understand their concerns. The Secretary patiently heard the problems and issues raised by the visitors and senior citizens and provided appropriate guidance and assistance. The grievances brought forward during the interaction were addressed and resolved, or referred to the concerned authorities for necessary action, in accordance with the nature of the issues. The visit aimed to strengthen access to justice at the grassroots level and to enhance awareness regarding the legal aid services provided by DLSA Haridwar.



- In compliance with the directions of the Hon'ble Executive Chairman, UKSLSA, Nainital, Secretary, DLSA Haridwar organized a special safety awareness campaign from 16 January 14 February, 2026 at Patanjali Bhartiya gyan Evam Anusandhan Sansthan, Haridwar.



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Secretary, DLSA Haridwar sensitized students, faculty members, staff and other participants about the importance of responsible road usage and adherence to traffic regulations for the prevention of road accidents. During the campaign, participants were educated on various aspects of road safety, including compliance with speed limits, mandatory use of hel-

metts and seat belts, avoidance of mobile phone use while driving, and the dangers of drunken and rash driving. Special emphasis was laid on the concept of the **Golden Hour** and the role of **Good Samaritans**, highlighting the importance of providing immediate assistance to road accident victims and the legal protections available to those who voluntarily help injured persons. Information regarding emergency helpline numbers, road safety laws, and the availability of legal aid and compensation mechanisms for accident victims was also disseminated to promote a culture of safety, responsibility, and civic awareness.



- Under the aegis of the District Legal Services Authority, Nainital, training programmes were organized for women inmates lodged in prison. Through the Jan Shikshan Sansthan, Bhimtal, and the Sunidhi Vikas Sanstha, the inmates were imparted training in beauty parlour work, soft-toy making, and tailoring, in which they participated actively and enthusiastically.



- The Secretary, DLSA Chamoli, organized legal awareness camps on **11.03.2026** and **23.03.2026**. During these camps, participants were sensitized about the provisions of the

Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act, the **NALSA Toll-Free Helpline No. 15100**, and the **NALSA Portals (LSMS and LAIS)**. Awareness was also imparted on important subjects such as **Human Trafficking**, **Plea Bargaining**, the **Role and Objectives of Free Legal Aid**, **Legal Literacy and Awareness**, and the functioning of **Permanent Lok Adalats**.

Additionally, the complaint boxes installed



near the Prison Legal Aid Clinic were inspected to ensure effective grievance redressal and access to legal assistance for inmates.

- An awareness camp was organized by **Ms. Sandya, Para Legal Volunteer (PLV), DLSA Dehradun**, at **Nai Jindagi Nasha Mukti Centre, Dehradun**, on **13.03.2026** to create awareness about the harmful effects of substance abuse and addiction. During the programme, participants were sensitized to the fact that substance abuse is a grave social menace that adversely impacts an individual's physical and mental well-being, disrupts family harmony, and undermines social stability.



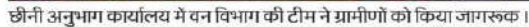

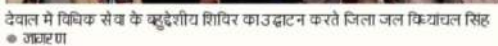

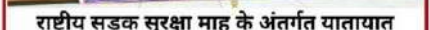
