NORTH ZONE REGIONAL CONFERENCE ON "ENHANCING ACCESS TO JUSTICE"

HELD ON 11TH –12TH APRIL, 2026 AT DEHRADUN

As per directions of the Central Authority i.e. National Legal Services Authority (NALSA), New Delhi, Uttarakhand State Legal Services Authority, Nainital in collaboration with the National Legal Services Authority (NALSA) organized the North Zone Regional Conference on "Enhancing Access to Justice" with the theme "Justice Beyond Barriers: Rights, Rehabilitation and Reform for the Most Vulnerable" on 11th–12th April, 2026 at Dehradun, Uttarakhand. The Conference brought together Hon'ble Judges of the Supreme Court of India, Chief Justices of High Courts, Executive Chairpersons and officers of Legal Services Authorities, judicial officers, legal practitioners, Para Legal Volunteers, domain experts and representatives of civil society organizations to deliberate upon critical issues concerning access to justice.

The North-Zone Regional Conference on **"Enhancing Access to Justice"** was successfully held on **11th and 12th April, 2026** at **Dehradun, Uttarakhand**. The Conference witnessed the participation of the States/UTs of **Chandigarh, Delhi, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir, Ladakh, Punjab, Uttar Pradesh, and Uttarakhand**.

The Conference was graced by the august presence of **His Excellency the Governor of Uttarakhand, Hon'ble the Chief Justice of India & Patron-in-Chief, NALSA, Hon'ble the Chief Minister of Uttarakhand, Hon'ble the Executive Chairman, NALSA, Hon'ble the Chairman, Supreme Court Legal Services Committee (SCLSC), and other Hon'ble Judges of the Supreme Court of India**. The Hon'ble Chief Justice, High Court of Uttarakhand & Patron-in-Chief, UKSLSA, and the Hon'ble Chief Justices of the High Court and Hon'ble Executive Chairmen, SLSAs of participating State/UTs, the Hon'ble Executive Chairman, UKSLSA, the Hon'ble Justice The presence of these distinguished dignitaries imparted exceptional significance, prestige, and solemnity to the Conference, underscoring the collective commitment of the

judiciary and the executive towards strengthening access to justice and reinforcing the constitutional mandate of ensuring equal justice for all.

The Conference was also attended by the **Member Secretaries of all the participating States/UTs**, the **Member Secretary, Uttarakhand State Legal Services Authority (UKSLSA)**, **Nainital**, and **District Judges and Judicial Officers from across the State of Uttarakhand**. Their active participation significantly enriched the deliberations and facilitated a meaningful exchange of experiences, best practices, and innovative approaches towards strengthening the legal aid delivery system and enhancing access to justice.

The Conference was convened with the objective of strengthening institutional mechanisms for legal aid delivery and advancing the constitutional mandate embodied in Article 39A, which enjoins the State to ensure that justice is accessible to all, irrespective of economic or social disadvantage. The Conference brought together a distinguished gathering of Hon'ble Judges of the Supreme Court of India, Chief Justices of the Hon'ble High Courts, Executive Chairpersons and officers of State Legal Services Authorities, Executive Chairpersons of the High Court Legal Services Committees, members of the District Judiciary, legal practitioners, Para Legal Volunteers, domain experts, and representatives of civil society organizations from across the North Zone, reflecting a collective institutional effort towards enhancing access to justice for vulnerable and marginalized sections of society.

The Conference commenced with the Inaugural Session on 11th April, 2026, which set the tone for the deliberations by emphasizing that access to justice must be understood not merely in terms of availability of legal remedies, but in terms of their effective reach, usability, and impact on the ground. The dignitaries underscored that despite the existence of comprehensive legal frameworks, significant gaps persist in ensuring that the benefits of these frameworks are realized by intended beneficiaries, particularly in remote, socio-economically disadvantaged, and geographically challenging regions. The need for transitioning from a passive model of legal aid to a proactive, outreach-

oriented framework was emphasized, with particular focus on early intervention, community engagement, and institutional coordination.

The deliberations of the Conference were organized through a series of thematic technical sessions, each addressing a critical dimension of access to justice. **The first Technical Session, titled “Effective Implementation of the Forest Rights Act, 2006: From Recognition to Realization,”** focused on the challenges faced by forest-dwelling and tribal communities in securing recognition and enforcement of their statutory rights. The discussions highlighted the gap between legislative intent and ground-level implementation, particularly in relation to high rejection rates of claims, procedural and evidentiary barriers, and lack of awareness among beneficiaries. Emphasis was placed on the central role of the Gram Sabha in the decision-making process, the need for a flexible and inclusive evidentiary framework, and the importance of ensuring adherence to procedural safeguards. The session underscored the role of Legal Services Authorities in providing proactive legal assistance, capacity building, and awareness generation, while also bringing forth ground-level perspectives reflecting challenges relating to livelihood insecurity, limited access to welfare schemes, and constraints on traditional practices.

The Conference featured extensive deliberations on key thematic areas including effective implementation of the Forest Rights Act, 2006, prison reforms and undertrial justice, justice for acid attack survivors, and strengthening legal protection and support systems for women and children. The discussions highlighted several actionable strategies aimed at strengthening legal aid delivery mechanisms and ensuring more inclusive, accessible and human-centric justice systems.

The second Technical Session, on “Prison Reforms, Undertrial Justice and Human-Centric Legal Aid,” examined systemic issues within the prison system, with particular focus on undertrial prisoners and the need for reformatory and dignity-based approaches to incarceration. The discussions highlighted concerns relating to overcrowding, delays in legal processes, lack of effective representation, and systemic opacity in tracking detention periods. It was emphasized that incarceration does not extinguish fundamental rights, and that the constitutional guarantee of dignity under Article 21 of Constitution

continues to apply within custodial settings. The session highlighted the transformative potential of technological interventions such as the E-Prison platform in enabling real-time monitoring and proactive legal aid, as well as the importance of institutionalizing practices such as periodic jail visits by legal aid lawyers. The need to expand reformative models such as open prisons, promote skill development and rehabilitation, and adopt a human-centric approach to prison administration was also emphasized.

The second day of the Conference commenced with a Welcome Session marked by the presence of distinguished dignitaries and the launch of several institutional initiatives aimed at strengthening access to justice through innovation and outreach. These included digital platforms, resource materials on best practices, and initiatives aimed at improving last-mile delivery of legal services, reflecting an increased emphasis on the use of technology, mobility, and institutional convergence in legal aid delivery.

The third Technical Session, titled “Justice for Acid Attack Survivors: Compensation, Rehabilitation and Dignity-Centric Support,” focused on the need for a comprehensive, survivor-centric approach to addressing the challenges faced by victims of acid attacks. The discussions highlighted that acid violence constitutes a severe form of gender-based violence with long-term physical, psychological, and social consequences. It was emphasized that access to justice for survivors must extend beyond compensation to include timely medical care, psychological support, economic rehabilitation, and social reintegration. The deliberations underscored the importance of proactive outreach by Legal Services Authorities, the creation of integrated support systems, and the need for sensitive and victim-centric judicial processes. The session also highlighted the role of societal attitudes and the need for sustained awareness and sensitization to address stigma and promote dignity and inclusion.

The fourth Technical Session, on “Strengthening Legal Protection and Support Systems for Women and Children,” examined systemic barriers faced by women and children in accessing justice and emphasized the need for preventive, coordinated, and victim-centric approaches. The

discussions highlighted challenges arising from socio-economic dependency, lack of legal awareness, social stigma, and procedural complexities, which often deter victims from seeking redressal. Emphasis was placed on early identification of vulnerability, strengthening legal literacy, and ensuring institutional convergence among police, legal services authorities, healthcare providers, and child protection systems. The session also underscored the importance of child-friendly and sensitive judicial processes, the role of Paralegal Volunteers in grassroots outreach, and the need for effective implementation, monitoring, and accountability mechanisms to ensure that legal frameworks translate into meaningful outcomes.

Across all sessions, the Conference reflected a consistent emphasis on bridging the gap between rights recognized in law and their actual realization in practice, highlighting the need for proactive, preventive, and human-centric approaches to justice delivery. The importance of leveraging technology and data systems to improve transparency and efficiency, strengthening grassroots mechanisms for last-mile delivery, enhancing capacity building and sensitization of stakeholders, and promoting institutional coordination emerged as key themes. The deliberations reaffirmed that access to justice is not merely a legal obligation but a continuous institutional responsibility requiring sustained engagement, innovation, and responsiveness to the lived realities of vulnerable communities.

The Welcome Address was delivered by Hon'ble Mr. Justice Manoj Kumar Tiwari, Executive Chairman, Uttarakhand SLSA, Nainital. His Lordship extended a warm welcome to the august gathering and underscored the significance of organizing such a conference in a geographically challenging State like Uttarakhand. His Lordship highlighted that access to justice, though constitutionally guaranteed, continues to face practical barriers in regions marked by difficult terrain and dispersed populations.

The Opening Address was delivered by Hon'ble Mr. Justice Manoj Kumar Gupta, Chief Justice, High Court of Uttarakhand and Patron-in-Chief, Uttarakhand State Legal Services Authority. His Lordship contextualized the theme of the Conference within the constitutional mandate of ensuring justice—

social, economic, and political—and drew attention to Article 39A of the Constitution of India. Emphasizing that access to justice extends beyond physical access to courts, His Lordship observed that it encompasses the ability of individuals to be heard, understood, and provided timely and meaningful redress.

In his Special Address, Hon'ble Mr. Justice N. Kotiswar Singh, Judge, Supreme Court of India, reflected upon the foundational promise contained in the Preamble to the Constitution, emphasizing that justice—social, economic, and political, is not merely aspirational but enforceable. His Lordship observed that despite significant advancements, access to justice remains uneven, particularly for those residing in remote areas or belonging to marginalized communities. His Lordship elaborated that access to justice must be understood in a comprehensive sense, encompassing awareness of rights, availability of legal aid, affordability of processes, timeliness of adjudication, and effective enforcement of remedies.

Hon'ble Mr. Justice Sandeep Mehta, Judge, Supreme Court of India, in his Special Address, expressed appreciation for the thoughtful selection of themes for the Conference, noting that they are deeply rooted in the lived realities of marginalized communities. His Lordship observed that such conferences must focus on issues that directly impact those at the margins of society, rather than on abstract or purely academic concerns.

The Inaugural Address was delivered by Hon'ble Mr. Justice J.K. Maheshwari, Judge, Supreme Court of India and Chairman, Supreme Court Legal Services Committee. His Lordship set the overarching tone for the Conference by posing a fundamental question as to whether the legal system is effectively delivering timely, affordable, and meaningful justice to the common citizen. His Lordship observed that the contemporary challenge lies not in the absence of laws, but in the gap between the existence of rights and their actual realization. His Lordship emphasized that access to justice must be evaluated through the lived experiences of individuals, reflected in the ease with which they can approach legal institutions, the dignity with which they are treated, and the timeliness of redressal.

In his address, the Hon'ble Minister of State (Independent Charge), Ministry of Law and Justice, Government of India, highlighted the imperative of aligning legislative intent with effective implementation at the grassroots level. He observed that access to justice must be viewed as an essential component of governance and development, and emphasized the role of coordinated policy frameworks in strengthening institutional capacities. The address underscored the importance of enhancing legal awareness, simplifying procedures, and ensuring that legal aid mechanisms are adequately resourced and efficiently administered so as to reach the intended beneficiaries.

The Keynote Address was delivered by Hon'ble the Chief Justice of India and Patron-in-Chief, NALSA. His Lordship provided a profound and expansive articulation of the constitutional and institutional dimensions of access to justice. His Lordship underscored that access to justice is not merely a statutory or procedural concept, but a foundational principle that sustains the legitimacy of democratic governance. His Lordship observed that the strength of any justice delivery system must ultimately be assessed by its ability to serve those who are most marginalized, and that the true test of institutional efficacy lies in its capacity to respond to the needs of the "last person."

In his Presidential Address, His Excellency the Hon'ble Governor of Uttarakhand reflected upon the broader societal role of legal services institutions in strengthening democratic values and promoting social justice. His Excellency emphasized that the justice delivery system must function as an instrument of empowerment, particularly for those who are socially and economically disadvantaged.

The session concluded with a Vote of Thanks delivered by Hon'ble Mr. Justice Manoj Kumar Tiwari, Judge, High Court of Uttarakhand and Executive Chairman, Uttarakhand SLSA, Nainital. His Lordship expressed sincere gratitude to all dignitaries and participants for their valuable presence and contributions. The proceedings concluded with the National Anthem, marking the formal close of the Welcome Session.

The Conference continued with the Technical Sessions-III and IV, and concluded with the **flagging off of Multi-Utility Vehicles (MUVs) of UKSLSA of 13 MUVs for the 13 DLSAs in the State**, dedicated to strengthening last-mile delivery of legal services. These vehicles are envisaged as mobile units for legal awareness, outreach, and facilitation, particularly in remote and inaccessible areas. The initiative reflects a pragmatic recognition of the geographical challenges in States like Uttarakhand and underscores the commitment of the legal services institutions to physically reach communities that remain beyond the conventional institutional framework. The deployment of such mobile units is expected to significantly enhance the visibility and accessibility of legal aid services, ensuring that justice delivery mechanisms are not constrained by terrain or distance.

GLIMPSES FROM THE CONFERENCE































NATIONAL LOK ADALAT

National Lok Adalat is a people-centric dispute resolution mechanism conducted under the Legal Services Authorities Act, 1987. It helps to settle cases through mutual agreement without lengthy court procedures. Awards passed in Lok Adalats are legally binding and treated as decrees of civil courts.

During the quarter **April to June, 2026**, quarterly National Lok Adalat was organized on **09th May, 2026** across the State of Uttarakhand under the aegis of the National Legal Services Authority and the Uttarakhand State Legal Services Authority in accordance with the provisions of the Legal Services Authorities Act, 1987. The Lok Adalat was conducted simultaneously in the Hon'ble High Court at Nainital, all Districts, Taluks and Court Complexes with the objective of promoting amicable dispute resolution, reducing pendency of cases in courts, and ensuring speedy and cost-effective justice to litigants.

During the said National Lok Adalat, a total of **3970 pre-litigation cases** and **13861 pending cases** were successfully settled through mutual compromise between the parties. As a result of these settlements, an amount of Rs. 8,79,86,108/- was realized in pre-litigation matters, while Rs. 36,21,73,113/- was received as settlement amount in pending court cases. The successful disposal of a large number of disputes and the substantial settlement amount achieved during the National Lok Adalat significantly contributed to reducing the burden on regular courts and strengthened the objective of providing accessible, affordable, and expeditious justice to the people of the State.

The National Lok Adalat held on 09th May, 2026 witnessed a remarkable achievement in the realm of alternative dispute resolution and **34 cases** were settled amicably through quasi-judicial forums Consumer Court, Dehradun and compensation of ₹ 85,45,368/- were awarded to the deserving parties.





MULTI-PURPOSE CAMPS

DLSA – Pithoragarh

On 1st May, 2026 a Multi-purpose camp was organized by the DLSA Pithoragarh in the benign presence of Hon'ble Mr. Justice Manoj Kumar Gupta, Hon'ble Chief Justice of the High Court of Uttarakhand and Patron-in-Chief, UKSLSA; the Hon'ble Executive Chairman, UKSLSA.

Their Lordships also visited District Jail Pithoragarh for the inauguration of the **"Legal Aid Clinic"**. During the visit, the Hon'ble Chief Justice inspected the newly established Legal Aid Clinic and reviewed the legal aid services being provided to inmates. **"The Mulakati Help Desk"** was also inaugurated to facilitate assistance and guidance for visitors and prisoners families.



The Hon'ble Chief Justice interacted with the inmates, took cognizance of their concerns and grievances, and emphasized the importance of ensuring access to justice, legal assistance, and welfare measures for all prisoners. The visit reaffirmed the commitment of the legal services institutions towards protecting the rights and well-being of inmates.

DLSA – Tehri Garhwal

On 10th May 2026, Hon'ble Mr. Justice Manoj Kumar Tiwari, Judge of the High Court of Uttarakhand at Nainital and Executive Chairman of the Uttarakhand State Legal Services Authority, attended a Multi-Purpose Legal Services and Awareness Camp organized by the District Legal Services Authority, Tehri Garhwal, under the aegis of the Uttarakhand State Legal Services Authority, Nainital, at the Municipal Council Auditorium, New Tehri.

While addressing the gathering, Hon'ble Mr. Justice Manoj Kumar Tiwari emphasized that the primary objective of the camp was to ensure **"Access to Justice for All"** every section of society, particularly for those with limited resources.



His Lordship highlighted that legal services extend beyond court proceedings and include free legal advice and assistance in matters such as family disputes, domestic violence, wage-related issues, and other legal concerns. He urged citizens to remain aware of their rights and responsibilities, stating that awareness is the foundation of empowerment.

DLSA – Nainital

At a Multi-Purpose Legal Literacy and Awareness Camp organized on 17th May, 2026 at Government Inter College, Lweshal, Ramgarh Block, Hon'ble Mr. Justice Manoj Kumar Tiwari emphasized the need to ensure access to justice for every individual, particularly those residing in remote and underserved areas.

During the programme, the Information Department presented a street play promoting a drug-free Uttarakhand. Winners of painting and essay competitions, meritorious students, and 21 Para Legal Volunteers (PLVs) were felicitated for their achievements and contributions.



Shri Pradeep Mani Tripathi, Member Secretary of the Uttarakhand State Legal Services Authority, explained the concept of the **"Ideal Village"** and highlighted the role of legal services institutions in community development. Officials from various departments also disseminated information regarding government welfare schemes, while health check-up services were provided to local residents.



DLSA – Almora

A Multi-Purpose and Legal Awareness Camp was organized on 31.05.2026 at Government Inter College, Mergaon, through the joint efforts of the DLSA, Almora, and the District Administration. The programme was graced by Hon'ble Mr. Justice Alok Mahra Judge of the Uttarakhand High Court as the Chief Guest.

During the camp, members of the public were sensitized about various welfare schemes, legal rights, and statutory provisions through departmental outreach initiatives. Eligible beneficiaries were also provided on-the-spot benefits under different government schemes. A total of 629 persons were benefited through various welfare programmes and services delivered during the camp.

DLSA- Bageshwar

A New Module Legal Services/**Multi-purpose Camp** was organized by the **DLSA, Bageshwar** on **21st June, 2026** at the Pandit Badridatt Pandey Government College Campus, Bageshwar under the chairmanship of Hon'ble the Executive Chairman, UKSLSA, Nainital, and in the august presence of Hon'ble Mr. Justice Alok Mahara, Judge, High Court of Uttarakhand and Administrative Judge for Bageshwar. The Camp witnessed enthusiastic participation from various Government Departments, public authorities, healthcare institutions, and welfare agencies with the objective of promoting legal awareness, facilitating access to government welfare schemes, and ensuring doorstep delivery of essential public services to the people.

During the Camp, **Hon'ble the Executive Chairman, UKSLSA** highlighted the initiatives of the Legal Services Authorities, disseminated information regarding the NALSA (DAWN) Scheme, 2025, the NALSA (Jagriti) Scheme, 2025, and the NALSA Toll-Free Helpline No. 15100, and reiterated the commitment of the Legal Services Authorities to promoting legal awareness and ensuring equal access to justice for all. Addressing the gathering, **Hon'ble Mr. Justice Alok Mahara**, Judge, High Court of Uttarakhand and Administrative Judge for Bageshwar, emphasized the pivotal role of the Legal Services Authorities in ensuring access to justice for the poor and marginalized. **Mr. Pradeep Kumar Mani, Member** Secretary, UKSLSA, Nainital, sensitized the participants about the objectives, activities, schemes, and free legal services of NALSA and UKSLSA.

During the Camp, various Government Departments disseminated information regarding their welfare schemes and provided on-the-spot services and assistance to the beneficiaries. The District Tourism Office apprised the public about tourism promotion schemes offering loans of up to ₹30 lakh, while the Horticulture, Agriculture, and Animal Husbandry Departments distributed seeds, agricultural implements, veterinary medicines, and technical guidance to eligible beneficiaries. A comprehensive medical camp organized by the District Medical Department, Bageshwar resulted in the issuance of 76 disability certificates, medical examination of approximately 203 persons, free distribution of medicines, and RBS testing for 30 persons. Eye screening camps organized by Baba Haidakhan Trust and Shubhanu Eye Hospital benefited approximately 445 persons, with 150 beneficiaries receiving free spectacles. Various welfare benefits, including wheelchairs, hearing aids, crutches, sewing machines, blankets,

tarpaulins, solar lanterns, water purifiers, umbrellas, Mahalaxmi Kits, and other essential articles, were distributed to eligible beneficiaries. Additionally, several Government Departments provided on-the-spot grievance redressal and public services, including Revenue, Panchayati Raj, Women Welfare, Aadhaar, and Food & Civil Supplies services, enabling citizens to access multiple welfare schemes and essential public services at a single platform.

The Multipurpose Legal Awareness and Literacy Camp received an overwhelming response from the local community, with an estimated **1,500 to 2,000 persons** participating in the programme. The participants availed themselves of a wide range of legal aid services, medical assistance, welfare benefits, public utility services, and information regarding various Government schemes under one roof. The Camp successfully fulfilled its objective of taking justice and welfare services to the doorstep of the people and demonstrated the collective commitment of the Legal Services Authorities and the participating departments towards ensuring **accessible, inclusive, and people-centric justice**.

International Labour Day (1st May, 2026)

In compliance with the direction issued by UKSLSA all DLSAs, all Para Legal Volunteers (PLVs) and Pro Bono PLVs of the State of Uttarakhand organized legal awareness camps in public places and urban/rural areas on 01st May, 2026. Through these programmes, workers were made aware of:

- The Labour Codes.
- Code on Wages, 2019.
- Industrial Relations Code, 2020.
- Social Security Code, 2020.
- The NALSA (Legal Services to Workers in the Unorganized Sector) Scheme, 2015.
- Occupational Safety, Health and Working Conditions Code, 2020.



The participants were informed about various labour laws and the legal rights and protections available to workers. Legal awareness camps were organized at labour colonies, industrial areas, construction sites, educational institutions and public places.

- Para Legal Volunteers conducted outreach programmes and door-to-door awareness campaigns to educate workers about their legal rights.
- Information was provided regarding the **Code on Wages, 2019**, including provisions relating to minimum wages, timely payment of wages, equal remuneration and prevention of wage discrimination.

Throughout the Legal Literacy and Awareness Camp, the Secretary, DLSAs, PLVs, Pro Bono PLVs actively participated in conducting the programme and disseminating legal information among the attendees. They explained various legal provisions, welfare schemes and citizens' rights in a simple and accessible manner, ensuring that the participants understood the benefits available to them under different laws and government initiatives.

Further, TLSCs, with the assistance of PLVs and Pro Bono PLVs organized legal awareness rallies and camps at the Local Court premises. During these programmes, people were sensitized regarding labor laws and informed that the objective of labour rights is to ensure **dignity, equality and safety for every worker**.

During the campaign, awareness and legal literacy programmes were organised across the districts of Uttarakhand at various locations, including **Base Hospital, Almora; Labour Auditorium, Bageshwar; the route to Badrinath Dham, Chamoli; various locations in Champawat, Dehradun, Haridwar, Tehri Garhwal, Udham Singh Nagar and Uttarkashi; Nagar Palika Parisar, Pauri; New Beershiva Public School, Pithoragarh; and Megha Engineering & Infrastructure Ltd., Sumerpur, Rudraprayag**, with several camps being conducted by PLVs. In all, **8,755 participants** were sensitised and informed about the **Code on Wages, 2019; Industrial Relations Code, 2020; Social Security Code, 2020; Occupational Safety, Health and Working Conditions Code, 2020; and the NALSA (Legal Services to Workers in the Unorganized Sector) Scheme, 2015**. The programmes focused on creating awareness among workers regarding their legal rights, social security entitlements, occupational safety and health standards, working conditions, industrial relations and the availability of legal aid and assistance through the Legal Services Institutions.

World No Tobacco Day (31st May, 2026)

In accordance with the Monthly Action Plan issued by the Uttarakhand State Legal Services Authority (UKSLSA), all District Legal Services Authorities (DLSAs) observed **"World No Tobacco Day"** on 31st May through legal awareness camps, anti-tobacco campaigns, counselling sessions and outreach programmes. Special awareness programmes were organized in district jails, educational institutions, public places and community centres to educate people about the harmful effects of tobacco and substance abuse. The programmes aimed to promote a healthy lifestyle, discourage tobacco consumption and spread awareness regarding the legal provisions governing tobacco products and narcotic substances.

Major Activities Conducted:

- Legal awareness camps and counselling sessions were organized in District Jails, educational institutions, villages and public places.
- Prison inmates, students, youth and members of the public were sensitized about the harmful effects of tobacco consumption, smoking, gutka, pan masala and other addictive substances.
- Information was provided regarding the **Cigarettes and Other Tobacco Products Act (COTPA), 2003**, including restrictions on smoking in public places, prohibition on advertisement of tobacco products, and restrictions on the sale of tobacco products near educational institutions.
- Participants were informed about the penalties and legal consequences for violations under the provisions of COTPA, 2003.
- Awareness was created regarding the health risks associated with tobacco use, including cancer, heart disease, respiratory disorders and other life-threatening illnesses.
- Detailed information was provided regarding the **Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act, 1985**, including offences related to possession, consumption, trafficking, production and transportation of narcotic drugs and psychotropic substances.



- Participants were informed about the stringent punishments prescribed under the NDPS Act for drug-related offences.
- Awareness was generated regarding the social, economic and psychological consequences of drug addiction and substance abuse.

- Special emphasis was laid on preventing drug abuse among youth and encouraging healthy and productive lifestyles.
- Information was disseminated regarding rehabilitation facilities, de-addiction centres and support mechanisms available for individuals affected by substance abuse.
- Nukkad Nataks, awareness rallies and interactive sessions were organized to spread anti-tobacco and anti-drug messages among the public.
- Para Legal Volunteers conducted door-to-door awareness campaigns and community outreach programmes highlighting the dangers of tobacco and narcotic substances.

On the occasion of World No Tobacco Day, awareness and legal literacy programmes were organised across various districts of Uttarakhand at District Jail, Almora; Block Auditorium; Modern Government Inter College, Dakpathar; District Jails and Schools; Villages and several other locations covered through PLVs. A number of awareness camps were organised by PLVs, including 7 places, 36 places, 23 camps, 18 awareness camps, 14 places and 162 places, as reported by the respective districts. In all, 10,002 persons were sensitised and made aware about the ill-effects and health hazards of tobacco consumption, the importance of tobacco cessation, prevention of tobacco use, the legal and social implications of tobacco consumption, and the available mechanisms for seeking assistance and protection against tobacco-related harms. The programmes particularly focused on creating awareness among students, prisoners, youth and members of the general public regarding the adverse consequences of tobacco use and the importance of adopting a healthy and tobacco-free lifestyle.

World Environment Day (5th June, 2026)

On the occasion of world environment all District Legal Services Authorities (DLSAs) across the State observed “**World Environment Day**” on 5th June, 2026 through a series of legal awareness and outreach programmes.

The programme was conducted at educational institutions, public places, Panchayat Ghars and other suitable locations with the active participation of Judicial Officers, Panel Lawyers, Para Legal Volunteers (PLVs), Government officials, students, teachers, and members of the general public.



World Environment Day, observed every year on **5th June**, aims to encourage environmental protection and promote sustainable practices. During the awareness programme, participants were sensitized about the importance of preserving natural resources, preventing pollution, combating climate change, conserving biodiversity, and maintaining ecological balance.

The participants were also informed that the **theme of World Environment Day 2026 was "Beat Plastic Pollution."** Emphasis was laid on eliminating single-use plastic, promoting recycling, and encouraging community participation in environmental conservation.

During the legal awareness session, information was also disseminated regarding the constitutional and statutory framework relating to environmental protection, including:

- **Article 48A** of the Constitution of India – Protection and improvement of the environment.
- **Article 51A(g)** – Fundamental duty of every citizen to protect and improve the natural environment.
- **Environment (Protection) Act, 1986.**
- **Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1974.**
- **Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1981.**
- **Plastic Waste Management Rules, 2016.**
- **Solid Waste Management Rules, 2016.**
- Relevant provisions of the **National Green Tribunal Act, 2010.**

The participants were encouraged to adopt sustainable lifestyles by practicing the principles of **Reduce, Reuse, and Recycle**, minimizing the use of plastic products, keeping their surroundings clean, and actively participating in community cleanliness and plantation initiatives.

In compliance with the Monthly Action Plan for June 2026 issued by the **Uttarakhand State Legal Services Authority (UKSLSA), Nainital**, the District Legal Services Authorities and Tehsil Legal Services Committees organized **Legal Literacy and Awareness Camps** on the occasion of “**World Day Against Child Labour**” on **12th June, 2026** at schools, villages, Panchayat Ghars, public places, and other suitable locations.

During the awareness sessions, participants were informed about the following:-

1. **Child and Adolescent Labour (Prohibition and Regulation) Act, 1986.**
2. **The Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education Act, 2009.**
3. **The Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2015.**
4. **The Factories Act, 1948.**
5. The constitutional safeguards provided under **Articles 21A, 23, and 24 of the Constitution of India.**
6. They were also informed that employing children in hazardous occupations is a punishable offence and that every child has the right to education, protection, and holistic development.



Awareness was also created regarding the **Dowry Prohibition Act, 1961**, highlighting that giving, taking, or demanding dowry is a punishable offence. Information was disseminated about free legal aid services, the objectives of the Legal Services Authorities, and the availability of legal assistance through **NALSA Toll-Free Helpline – 15100, Legal Services Management System (LSMS), Legal Aid Defence Counsel System**

(LADCS), Child Helpline – 1098, Cyber Crime Helpline – 1930, Emergency Response Support System – 112, and the MANAS National Anti-Narcotics Helpline – 1933.

- Report child exploitation immediately.
- Free legal aid is available for eligible persons.
- Protect children from abuse, trafficking, and hazardous employment.

Campaign on "वरिष्ठजन अधिकार, सशक्तिकरण और गरिमा"
On the occasion of World Elder Abuse Awareness Day (15.06.2026)

As per the e-mail dated 28th May, 2026 received from NALSA, New Delhi and in compliance with the directions issued by the Hon'ble Executive Chairman, UKSLSA, Nainital, all the DLSAs across the State of Uttarakhand successfully conducted awareness campaign under the **NALSA (JAGRITI) Scheme, 2025** on the theme **"वरिष्ठजन अधिकार, सशक्तिकरण और गरिमा"** during June, 2026, with special observance of **15th June, 2026** as **World Elder Abuse Awareness Day (WEAAD)**.

As per directions DLSAs organized awareness sessions, legal literacy programmes, outreach activities and special campaigns focusing on the legal rights, welfare, protection, dignity and access to justice of senior citizens. The campaign was implemented in accordance with the Guidelines issued by NALSA. The DLSAs also ensured effective digital outreach by using the mandatory hashtags **#NALSAJAGRITI**, **#WorldElderAbuseAwarenessDay** and **#वरिष्ठनागरिक_सम्मान**, while maintaining the dignity, privacy and confidentiality of elderly beneficiaries in all campaign-related publications.

During the campaign total of **376 awareness camps** were organized across the State, benefiting **12887 participants**. In addition, **85 special observance programmes** were conducted on and around **15th June, 2026**, covering **2188 participants**, to commemorate World Elder Abuse Awareness Day. These programmes were organized with the objective of creating awareness about the physical, mental, emotional, financial and social abuse of senior citizens and promoting their dignity, protection, welfare and legal rights.

To promote awareness regarding cyber safety and financial frauds affecting senior citizens, **189 special cyber/financial fraud awareness camps** were conducted, in which **2080 participants** were sensitized regarding safe digital practices, prevention of online fraud and available legal remedies.

A total of **2371 beneficiaries** were directly covered through the special activities organized under the World Elder Abuse Awareness Day campaign. During the campaign, **255 senior citizens** were assisted in availing pension schemes, **124 beneficiaries** were facilitated under **Ayushman Bharat/health schemes**, **59 beneficiaries** received assistance under disability/widow assistance schemes and **128 beneficiaries** were facilitated in accessing insurance and other welfare entitlements. Besides, **5 beneficiaries** were provided legal assistance through Panel Advocates, while **71 senior citizens** availed the benefit of health check-up services.

The outreach activities extended to **7 Old Age Homes** and **301 urban and rural locations**, ensuring wider dissemination of legal awareness to senior citizens. For effective implementation of the campaign, **1257 PLVs** were deployed by the DLSAs to conduct awareness programmes, mobilize beneficiaries and facilitate access to welfare schemes and legal services. As part of the campaign, **03 Awareness Rallies** were also organized to further disseminate the message of protection, dignity, empowerment and welfare of senior citizens in the State.

Celebration of "International Yoga Day"
&
"Cleanliness Drive"

With a view to creating awareness among the general public about the importance of yoga and promoting a healthier lifestyle, and in compliance with the directions issued by the Hon'ble Executive Chairman, UKSLSA, Nainital, all DLSAs were directed to celebrate the **"International Yoga Day"** and also **Cleanliness Drive** on 21st June, 2026.

The programmes were organized to promote the importance of yoga in achieving physical, mental, and spiritual well-being. Emphasizing the connection between yoga, cleanliness and environmental consciousness, the Hon'ble Executive Chairman, UKSLSA has been pleased to direct the Legal Services Institutions in the State to organize a statewide **Cleanliness Drive** on 21.06.2026 in conjunction with the observance of International Yoga Day, promoting collective responsibility towards a healthy and sustainable environment.

Accordingly, on the occasion of International Yoga Day, various programmes were organized by the DLSAs and TLSCs in the District Court & Tehsil Complexes. Further, on the occasion of Yoga Day, a special cleanliness awareness and cleanliness drive were also organized. The drive commenced from the Judgeship Complex and continued up to the nearby and adjoining areas. Judicial Officers, Advocates, Court Staff, PLVs and other participants actively participated in the campaign. During the drive, members of the public were made aware of the importance of maintaining a clean environment and the message of the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan was widely disseminated.

During the cleanliness drive, the garbage/litters scattered across the areas were collected and deposited in the designated dumping zone. Biodegradable and non-biodegradable waste was segregated and disposed of separately in accordance with proper waste management practices.

The campaign was conducted successfully across the district with active coordination and support from the District Courts, Forest Department, concerned Nagar Nigam/Palika, Educational Institutions, NGOs, Gram Panchayats and Zila Panchayats. A total of **65** Yoga Sessions were organized with the participation of **3632** individuals. Additionally, **241** cleanliness drives were conducted, engaging

7775 participants, while **1241** PLVs were deployed to facilitate coordination, mobilize communities and spread awareness. Overall, activities were carried out at **203** venues/locations, and approximately **3536** units of waste were collected and disposed of during the campaign.

The campaign achieved a visible positive impact by improving cleanliness at public places and fostering a strong sense of community ownership. Awareness rallies conducted alongside the cleanliness drives sensitized citizens about the importance of sanitation, hygiene, and environmental conservation.

CAPACITY BUILDING/TRAINING PROGRAMMES

FIRE SAFETY TRAINING TO PLVS DURING JUNE-2026:-

PLVs are working, as a vital link between the Legal Services Institutions and the common public, particularly the weaker and marginalized sections of society. PLVs are entrusted with spreading legal awareness, facilitating access to justice, assisting needy persons in availing free legal aid and guiding citizens regarding their legal and constitutional rights.

It is also kindly submitted that being a predominantly hilly and forest-rich State, Uttarakhand frequently faces the serious problem of forest fires, particularly during the summer season, causing extensive damage to forest wealth, biodiversity, wildlife and the environment. Forest fires not only pose a threat to ecological balance but also endanger human life, public health and nearby habitations.

Considering the aforesaid and in compliance directions of the Hon'ble Executive Chairman, UKSLSA, Nainital DLSAs have imparted Fires Safety & Fire Services Training to PLVs, enrolled with DLSAs in cooperation with concerned District Administration, Fire & Emergency Services Department, SDRF/NDRF authorities, Forest Department etc.

During the Fire Safety & Fire Services Training, organized for PLVs in cooperation with the concerned District Administration, Fire & Emergency Services Department, SDRF/NDRF authorities and Forest Department, the PLVs were sensitized about fire prevention and safety measures, identification of fire hazards, emergency preparedness and response, evacuation procedures, use of basic fire-fighting equipment, first aid and rescue techniques and the role of PLVs in creating awareness and extending assistance to the community during fire-related emergencies and disasters.







CAPACITY-BUILDING AND TRAINING PROGRAMME FOR NEWLY ENROLLED PLVs:

DLSA Nainital & Pauri Garhwal organized an Orientation, Capacity-Building and Training Programme for newly enrolled PLVs on 28.04.2026 & 21.04.2026 respectively. The programme was conducted in accordance with the NALSA Scheme for Para-Legal Volunteers (Revised) and the prescribed Module for Orientation, Induction and Refresher Courses for PLV Training. The programme aimed to equip the newly enrolled PLVs with the requisite knowledge, skills and practical understanding of their roles and responsibilities, with particular emphasis on facilitating access to justice, assisting vulnerable and marginalized sections of society, creating legal awareness and effectively connecting eligible persons with available legal services and government welfare schemes.



On May 16, 2026, **DLSA, Haridwar**, successfully concluded a three-day Training/Capacity Building programme for Newly enrolled PLVs/ Adhikar Mitras at the Vikas Bhawan auditorium. The valedictory session was graced by District Judge/Chairman of DLSA Haridwar, as the Chief Chief Guest and District Magistrate Haridwar, as the Special Guest. Other esteemed Judicial Officers in attendance included Permanent Lok Adalat Chairperson, 1st ADJ, CJM and Secretary DLSA, Haridwar. Over the course of the three days, expert speakers

from various departments equipped the trainees with critical knowledge regarding public welfare schemes and legal procedures. During the closing ceremony, District Judge expressed confidence that trainees would propagate their acquired knowledge with honesty and dedication. The event concluded with the distribution of certificates, identity cards and essential toolkits to the trained PLVs, followed by vote of thanks by Secretary DLSA, Haridwar, who reaffirmed DLSA's commitment to ensuring accessible justice for every citizen.



DLSA Nainital organized a six-day Skill Development Training Programme on Fast Food Preparation for prisoners at District Jail, Nainital. The programme was aimed at imparting practical, employment-oriented skills to prisoners and facilitating their rehabilitation, self-reliance and social reintegration. Through hands-on training, participants were provided an opportunity to develop basic skills in fast-food preparation, food handling, hygiene and related vocational practices, enabling them to explore dignified livelihood opportunities after their release.



Under the aegis of **DLSA Nainital**, training was provided to women prisoners lodged in the Sub-Jail, Haldwani through **Jan Shikshan Sansthan, Bhowali, and Sunidhi Vikas Sanstha**. The training focused on various skill-development activities such as **Beauty Parlor services, soft toy making, and tailoring**. The women prisoners participated actively and enthusiastically in the training programmes.



COUNSELLING

The ADR Centre at UKSLSA, Nainital, offers specialized legal, emotional and psychological support to help individuals navigate complex personal challenges. Guided by the Hon'ble Executive Chairman, UKSLSA, Nainital and with oversight from the Member Secretary, these dedicated counseling services are expertly delivered by Ms. Rakhi and Mr. G.K. Tripathi.

Professional counselor continuously refines their therapeutic approach to address these expanding environmental psychological demands. By merging modern mental health strategies with deeply personalized care plans, the counselor provides every individual and family with a tailored roadmap toward psychological recovery. This dedicated, one-on-one guidance transforms immediate crisis management into long-term personal resilience, equipping clients with the practical aspects necessary to withstand severe external pressures and maintain a peaceful home environment.

Key Achievements-

Martial dispute counselling-Marital dispute counselling provides couples with a safe, structured space to identify destructive patterns, heal past emotional wounds, and develop healthy relationship for long-term partnership success.

Conflict resolution between couple and families-Healthy conflict resolution between a couple and their families requires the partners to maintain a united front while setting clear, respectful boundaries with relatives. It relies on open communication to address issues early, active listening to understand different perspectives, and keeping core relationship discussions private. Prioritizing the partnership while managing family ties with empathy protects the bond and minimizes external tension.

Neutral ground and core issues identification-Creating a safe, non-judgmental space. A counselor maintains an unbiased stance, allowing both the client and the therapist to bypass defenses and accurately identify underlying core issues.

correcting self-blame and coping mechanism-Counseling fixes self-blame by replacing toxic guilt with healthy accountability. Counsellor uses cognitive restructuring to help clients challenge negative thoughts and share responsibility accurately. This shifts them from harmful coping habits like rumination into resilient, compassionate emotional processing.



Comprehensive Psychological Care Services: -

From April to June 2026, our counsellor delivered specialized counseling services across 106+ unique cases, actively engaging spouses, children and extended families to foster holistic healing. By seamlessly blending advanced therapeutic expertise with deeply compassionate care, we provide unparalleled emotional and psychological support designed to mend relationships and strengthen the foundational bonds of couples and families.



Voluntary and follow-up cases-

At the counseling center, approximately 9 to 10 individuals proactively availed the counseling services voluntarily, driven by distinct personal motivations to confront and resolve specific psychological challenges. Many cases were attended in follow up sessions including couple and their families. Demonstrating their mental health journey, these clients have actively sustained their engagement by consistently participating in ongoing follow-up sessions, ensuring reliable support and continuous developmental progress over the time.



Child Counselling cases-

Child counselling provides a supportive environment where children and teenagers can safely process their emotions, manage behavioral issues, and build healthy coping mechanisms. Through age-appropriate techniques like play and art, counselors help young people navigate challenges such as anxiety, school stress, family changes, and grief. This targeted support empowers kids to communicate their feelings effectively, improving both their mental well-being and their relationships at home, school and with parents.

In matrimonial cases, children are often conditioned to speak only in favor of the parent they reside with, which severely impacts their mental, social, and behavioral development, often leaving lasting scars on their future. Professional counseling addresses this by offering children a safe, confidential space where they are deeply heard and understood. Through this supportive environment, counselors help children grasp positive moral values, clear up emotional confusion, and bridge family divides, ultimately working to balance their lives and guide them toward a healthier, more positive direction.

Law interns and students-

Through immersive interactions with the professional counsellor, law interns and students representing diverse universities gained invaluable firsthand insights and a comprehensive understanding of the counselling process. This collaborative environment allowed participants to engage in deep, interactive discussions and exchange shared professional experiences, which effectively helped them clarify their specific roles within the practice. By bridging the gap between theoretical academic knowledge and real-world legal-psychological applications, the students successfully built their professional confidence, sharpened their interpersonal skills, and advanced their overall career development.



SUCCESS STORY

A success story- from marital conflict to family harmony.

A working professional couple was referred for counselling in his matrimonial dispute as they were experiencing significant marital discord. Persistent misunderstanding, ineffective communication, emotional distancing and unresolved interpersonal conflicts had gradually eroded trust and marital satisfaction.

The husband had become firmly inclined towards divorce, perceiving separation as the only viable solution to their ongoing distress. The counselling process involved the series of structured individual and joint sessions. Individual counselling provided each partner with safe to express their emotions, identify personal cognitive and emotional patterns, and gain insight into the factors contributing to conflicts. Joint session was focused on strengthening communication, fostering empathy and enhanced the emotional regulation. Couple rebuild the mutual trust and respect.

Psychologically, the intervention helped both partners Shift from a defensive, blame oriented mindset to one characterized by self-awareness, emotional maturity and collaborative problem solving. The husband particularly experienced a significant emotional transformation. Gradually he gave way to renewed commitment to the marital relationship. In follow up session couple shared. They are happily cohabiting and has been blessed with a healthy boy, marking a joyful new chapter in their lives.

This case illustrates the transformative power off counselling in facilitating emotional healing, cognitive restructuring and marital resilience.

**OBSERVANCE OF INTERNATIONAL DAY AGAINST DRUG ABUSE AND
ILLCIT TRAFFICKING**

As per directions of NALSA and approval of the Hon'ble Executive Chairman, UKSLSA, Nainital and in order to implement the **NALSA (DAWN – Drug Awareness and Wellness Navigation – For a Drug Free India) Scheme, 2025**, all DLSAs in the State of Uttarakhand were directed to observe **International Day Against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking** on **26.06.2026** by organizing awareness programmes in localities, jails, observation homes, juvenile homes, rehabilitation centers, schools, colleges etc. by showcasing short films, videos and documentaries on drug de-addiction and rehabilitation in schools, colleges and public places.

DLSAs were further directed to share the official DAWN Campaign Video across their social media platforms—Facebook (nalsa.india.1), Instagram (nalsalegalaid), X (NALSAlegalAid), LinkedIn (national-legal-services-authority-nalsa), and YouTube (NALSA)—on 26.06.2026, using the prescribed campaign hashtags: #SayNoToDrugsYesToLife, #DrugsFreeIndia, #YuddhNasheKeVirudh, #NopeToDope and #NashaMuktBharat, with a view to maximizing public outreach and promoting awareness against drug abuse.

As per the aforesaid directions and under the implementation of the **NALSA (DAWN) Scheme, 2025**, and in observance of the International Day Against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking on 26.06.2026, the **Secretaries of DLSAs, Panel Lawyers, PLVs/Adhikar Mitras** organized **1,449 awareness camps and door-to-door awareness campaigns** in coordination with **Village Panchayats, District Administration, Local Authorities, and other stakeholders**. During these campaigns, awareness videos received from NALSA, including **"DAWN Campaign Videos"** and **"Tum Mat Girna,"** were screened among the participants to effectively communicate the message against drug abuse.

The awareness programmes focused on educating the public, particularly the youth and weaker sections of society, about the **harmful effects of drug abuse, preventive measures, and the importance of adopting an addiction-free lifestyle**. Information was disseminated on the theme **"Safe Drugs: Safe Life"**, highlighting the adverse impact of narcotic substances on physical health, mental well-being, and social harmony. The participants were informed that drug addiction can lead to **depression, serious mental health disorders, increased instances of domestic violence, and severe financial hardships** for individuals and families.

Through these initiatives, the public was sensitized about the need to stay away from drugs, support affected persons, and contribute towards building a **drug-free society**. The participants were also encouraged and appealed to refrain from drug consumption and to spread awareness among their communities regarding the prevention and ill effects of substance abuse.

As part of the campaign, **123** programmes were conducted for **screening of films/videos** on drug abuse, drug addiction, the ill effects of drugs, and messages from dignitaries, with the participation of **3,071** persons. Short films were also showcased across **96** schools, colleges, and universities to sensitize students and youth about the harmful consequences of drug abuse. Further, awareness activities were conducted in **09** Observation/Juvenile Homes/Jails, covering **111** inmates, with the objective of promoting awareness and encouraging a drug-free lifestyle.

The campaign also included outreach to **07** Rehabilitation/De-addiction Centres and the conduct of **25** counselling sessions to provide support and guidance to individuals affected by substance abuse. A total of **06** victims/persons were referred to rehabilitation services for further assistance and care.

Reports regarding the activities undertaken were uploaded on the DLSAs and NALSA's aforementioned social media handles to ensure wider dissemination and public outreach. The official DAWN Campaign initiatives were also promoted through digital platforms to enhance awareness among the masses.

Further, District Level Meetings of DAWN Units were conducted for effective implementation and monitoring of the campaign. News reports were published in Digital India and sustained follow-up actions were ensured through legal aid clinics and dynamic outreach activities by PLVs to provide continuous support and awareness at the grassroots level.

Uttarakashi (The Hawk): On the eve of the International Day Against Drug Abuse and Black Trafficking, the District Legal Services Authority (DLSA), Uttarakashi, organised a legal literacy and awareness camp at Info Coaching Centre on Thursday. SUCCESS STORY

Free Legal Aid Ensured Justice for an Economically Weaker Woman:

An application seeking free legal aid was received by the DLSA, Pauri Garhwal from an economically weaker woman. A criminal case arising out of Crime No. 01/2023, registered in Revenue Area Aswalsyun under Section 304A of the Indian Penal Code, was pending as Criminal Case No. 767/2024 (State vs. Mukesh & Others) before the Court of the Chief Judicial Magistrate, Pauri Garhwal. Owing to her poor financial condition, the applicant requested the appointment of a free legal aid counsel for her defense. Immediately upon receipt of the application, the District Legal Services Authority, Pauri Garhwal took prompt action and referred the matter to the Legal Aid Defense Counsel System (LADCS), Pauri Garhwal, with directions to provide effective legal representation. The Legal Aid Defense Counsel promptly initiated legal proceedings on behalf of the applicant and filed a bail application before the Court of the Chief Judicial Magistrate, Pauri Garhwal. The Hon'ble Court granted her bail upon furnishing a personal bond of ₹30,000 along with one surety of the like amount. Thereafter, following the framing of charges, the Legal Aid Defense Counsel effectively represented the applicant throughout the trial. All prosecution witnesses were thoroughly cross-examined and comprehensive legal and factual arguments were advanced before the Court. After considering the evidence and hearing the parties, the Hon'ble Chief Judicial Magistrate, Pauri Garhwal, by judgment dated 25 May 2026, acquitted the applicant of all charges. Expressing her gratitude, the beneficiary stated that she was a poor woman and was unable to engage a private advocate due to financial constraints. She said that had the District Legal Services Authority, Pauri Garhwal not provided her with timely and competent legal representation, she might have been deprived of justice. She sincerely thanked the District Legal Services Authority and the Legal Aid Defense Counsel System for their invaluable support. This case demonstrates the vital role played by the District Legal Services Authority, Pauri Garhwal in ensuring access to justice for economically weaker and marginalized persons through timely, competent, and effective free legal aid. It reaffirms the commitment of the legal aid system to uphold the constitutional promise of equal justice for all.

Amicable Resolution of a Matrimonial Dispute through Legal Services and Assistance Centre:

On 17 May 2026, Shri Prakash Chand Dobriyal of Laldhang approached Kotwali Shyampur along with his daughter, Shalini, and her two children, alleging that her husband, Manish Kestwal of Kotdwar, was subjecting her to domestic disputes, physical assault, verbal abuse, and neglect after consuming alcohol. The matter was referred to the Legal Services and Assistance Centre at Kotwali Shyampur.

The aggrieved party was provided with legal guidance and counseling, while continuous efforts were made to establish communication with the husband's family. Acting on the advice of the Police Station In-charge, both parties appeared before the Legal Services and Assistance Centre on 23 May 2026.

Adhikar Mitra Mukesh Kumar conducted nearly two and a half hours of counseling and mediation with the husband, wife, and their family members. The parties were sensitized about family responsibilities, the welfare of their children, the importance of mutual trust, and the need to maintain a peaceful family life. The husband was specifically counseled to abstain from alcohol-related misconduct, treat his wife with dignity, and discharge his family responsibilities.

The sustained counseling and mediation efforts resulted in a mutually agreed settlement. A written settlement deed was executed, and the couple agreed to resume cohabitation, thereby reuniting a family that was on the verge of separation. The parties expressed their appreciation to the Legal Services Authority and *Adhikar Mitra* Mukesh Kumar for their timely intervention.

This case demonstrates the significant role of the Legal Services and Assistance Centre in resolving matrimonial disputes through counseling, mediation, and legal awareness, thereby promoting family harmony and access to justice.

Amicable Resolution of a Village Dispute through Mediation:

Under the guidance of the District Judge/Chairman and Secretary, DLSA, Haridwar and in accordance with the directions of the Uttarakhand State Legal Services Authority, Nainital, a long-pending dispute between two residents of Pili Padav village was amicably resolved at the Legal Services and Support Centre, Shyampur.

The mediation was facilitated by *Adhikar Mitra* Mukesh Kumar in the presence of the Gram Pradhan, Shri Shashi Pal Singh Jhandwal. As the matter involved compoundable offences, the parties were provided with impartial legal counseling and encouraged to resolve their differences through dialogue and mutual understanding.

With the active support of the village head and the sustained efforts of the *Adhikar Mitra*, both parties voluntarily arrived at a mutually acceptable settlement and executed a written compromise. They agreed to maintain peace, harmony, and cordial relations and resolved not to indulge in any future disputes.

The successful resolution of the matter highlights the vital role of the Legal Services and Support Centre in promoting access to justice through counseling, mediation, and alternative dispute resolution, thereby strengthening social harmony and reducing avoidable litigation.



Safe Recovery and Family Reunification of a Missing Child through Timely Legal Intervention:

On 28 March 2026, Smt. Phool Devi, a resident of Gandhi Gram, Dehradun, approached the Legal Services Functionary and reported that her 13-year-old daughter had gone missing from home. Recognizing the urgency and sensitivity of the matter, immediate guidance and assistance were extended under the supervision of the District Legal Services Authority (DLSA), Dehradun. The complainant was promptly advised to contact the CHILDLINE (1098), and the matter was simultaneously brought to the notice of the Child Welfare Committee (CWC) for immediate intervention.

During the rescue operations conducted by CHILDLINE, a minor girl was found among children involved in begging. Upon verification through photographs provided by the family, it was confirmed that the rescued child was the missing girl. In close coordination with the Child Welfare Committee, the child was placed safely in a Government Girls' Shelter Home (Balika Niketan) to ensure her protection and well-being until her identity and custody could be formally verified.

With sustained coordination and follow-up by the District Legal Services Authority, the Child Welfare Committee, and CHILDLINE, the child was reunited with her parents on 30 March 2026. After completion of all statutory formalities and execution of the required undertaking, the girl was safely restored to the care and custody of her parents on 2 April 2026.

This case stands as a remarkable example of the prompt intervention, effective coordination, and child-centric approach adopted by the District Legal Services Authority, Dehradun. The timely collaboration between DLSA, CHILDLINE, and the Child Welfare Committee ensured the safe recovery and rehabilitation of the missing child, reaffirming the commitment of the legal services institutions towards child protection, access to justice, and the preservation of family unity.
