RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS

1. **Hearing:** A hearing in the hybrid mode in the matter was conducted on 25.11.2025 wherein the following were present:

2. **Proceedings during the hearing:**

2.1 The Respondent No. 2 (NMC), represented by Ms. Priyanka Sati, Legal Assistant, submitted that the grievance primarily relates to admission in the current academic year. The Complainant had appeared in an earlier NEET-PG examination. For admission in the current session, a fresh and valid NEET score of the current year is required. Old scores cannot be used for admission in the present academic year.

2.2 The Court observed that the Complainant's absence prevented effective adjudication of the matter on merits. It further noted that the dispute primarily concerns the validity of the disability certificate, the Complainant's eligibility for

admission, and the applicability of his earlier NEET-PG scores for the current admission session. Considering that the matter involves issues relating to the disability certificate and the admission process, the Court found it necessary to afford the Complainant another opportunity to present his case.

2.3 Accordingly, the Court recommended that the Respondents remain present at the next hearing with the complete records pertaining to the Complainant's disability certificate, NEET-PG scores, and admission eligibility. A fresh notice was also directed to be issued to the Complainant, clearly intimating that in the event of his failure to appear or make submissions at the next hearing, the matter would be decided *ex parte* on the basis of the material available on record.

2.4 Accordingly, matter is adjourned and listed for hearing on **21.07.2026**.
