1. Gist of the Complaint:

1.1 The Complainant, a person with above benchmark locomotor disability, vide complaint dated 20.09.2023 alleges that on 18.03.2022, around 5:00 AM, he was forcibly abducted from his home by Sub Inspector Deepak (Mahendra Park Police Station, Delhi), accompanied by other officers and civilians, including land mafia Saurabh Mehta. The abduction occurred without any warrant or FIR, violating legal protocols and the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016.

1.2 During illegal detention, the petitioner was subjected to third-degree torture and caste-based abuse. On 19.03.2022, he was paraded handcuffed in his

neighbourhood to humiliate him. An FIR (No. 463/22 under IPC 384) was filed against the petitioner only after a kidnapping complaint was lodged by his wife on the same day. The Complainant relied upon RTI replies from the Delhi Police stating that no person can be detained or handcuffed without an FIR or court authorization, and that police had visited his locality pursuant to proceedings under Section 156(3) Cr.P.C. without coordination with the local police.

1.4 The Complainant seeks legal action against the involved police officers and civilians for abuse of power, unlawful detention, physical torture, caste-based discrimination, and violation of disability rights.

2. Notice issued to the Respondent:

A Notice dated 29.09.2023 was issued to the Respondent for forwarding their comments within 30 days to this Court u/s 75 & 77 of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (hereinafter referred as "the Act"). Final reminder dated 08.11.2023 under Rule 38 (2) of Rights of Persons with Disabilities Rule, 2017 issued to the Respondent.

3. Reply filed by the Respondent:

3.1 Respondent filed their reply dated 06.12.2023 and submitted that Mr. Rajan Kumar, identifying as a Dalit and Divyang (disabled), filed a complaint alleging exploitation and torture by Delhi Police officials from PS Mahendra Park. He claimed he was handcuffed and wrongfully arrested on 31.12.2021. An inquiry conducted by ACP/PG/NWD found that Rajan Kumar did not cooperate with the investigation and instead responded via WhatsApp.

3.2 The inquiry revealed that FIR No. 463/22 was registered against him based on a complaint by builder Sh. Saurabh Mehta, alleging extortion of Rs. 2.75 lakh. Kumar was accused of repeatedly extorting money by threatening to complain about construction sites and using bank accounts of acquaintances for laundering the funds. He was arrested on 18.03.2022, and incriminating evidence, including mobile phones, was recovered. He was later granted conditional bail, and the case is under trial.

3.3 The inquiry concluded that Rajan Kumar is a habitual extortionist, having filed about 45 complaints in the past three years to pressure builders. His claims against the police were found baseless, lacking any supporting evidence.

4. Rejoinder filed by the Complainant:

4 . 1 The complainant vide email dated 08.01.2024 and submitted that Complainant has been alleged serious misconduct by Delhi Police in their reply.

4.2 Complainant submitted that he has filed a separate case under the SC/ST Act and a contempt petition. The main case against him is under trial at Rohini Court.

5. Seeking current status of the case from both parties:

5.1 Both parties was asked vide email dated 02.07.2025 to provide current status of the instant case.

6. Response from the parties:

6.1 The complainants vide email dated 23.07.2025 stating that grievance is still not resolved. However, no response received from the Respondent.

7 . Hearing (I) and Proceedings of the hearing: A hearing of the case was held on 08.09.2025. During the hearing, the Complainant alleged that on 18.03.2022, police illegally detained and assaulted him without a valid FIR or arrest procedure, falsely implicating him in an extortion case linked to a salary dispute with Shri Sourav Mehta. He also claimed humiliation due to being publicly paraded while disabled.

7.2 The Respondents denied all allegations, stating that the Complainant was lawfully arrested in FIR No. 463/22 based on extortion complaints and evidence, medically examined, and produced before court within 24 hours.

7.3 The Court noted that the matter is sub-judice before Rohini Court and recommended the Respondents to submit documentary proof within 15 days. However, no response received from Respondents.

8. Hearing (II): A hearing of the case was held on 19.05.2026. The following parties/representatives were present during the hearing:

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9. Observation and Recommendations:

10.1 During the proceedings, the Respondent submitted that FIR No. 463/2022 is pending adjudication before the Learned ACMM, Rohini Courts, Delhi, in Criminal Case No. 6472/2022, and is listed for hearing on 08.07.2026. It was further submitted that the Complainant's application under Section 156(3) Cr.P.C. was dismissed by the competent Sessions Court and that Criminal M.C. No. 3001/2024 under Section 482 Cr.P.C. is pending before the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi. The Complainant also acknowledged that proceedings arising from the same subject matter are pending before the Hon'ble High Court.

10.2 This Court observes that the grievance primarily relates to criminal allegations, investigation, arrest, and allied issues which are already sub judice before the competent criminal courts and the Hon'ble High Court. In these circumstances, adjudication on the merits by this Court would not be appropriate. However, the Respondent police authorities shall ensure strict compliance with the provisions of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016, particularly Sections 3 and 7, while dealing with the Complainant, including ensuring dignity, non-discrimination, and reasonable accommodation. The Complainant shall remain at liberty to pursue appropriate remedies before the competent courts.

10. Accordingly, the case stands disposed of.
