The important issues / developments related to the Department of Water Resources, River Development & Ganga Rejuvenation during the month of March 2024 are as follows: -

**A.** Storage Position of Important Reservoirs: Central Water Commission is monitoring live storage position of 150 important reservoirs spread all over the country and issuing bulletin on every Thursday. Overall storage position in 150 reservoirs as on <u>28.03.2024</u> was **64.606 BCM** which is **84%** of the live storage of corresponding period of last year and **97%** of average storage of last ten years. Out of the 150 Reservoirs being monitored, **20** reservoirs are of Hydro-Electric projects having total live storage capacity of **35.299 BCM**, and **7**Reservoirs of these had Storage less than or equal to average of previous 10 years.

### B. Inauguration of Namami Gange Projects by Hon'ble Prime Minister:-

- I. On 1<sup>st</sup> March, 2023 Hon'ble PM inaugurated three projects worth ₹575 crore from Hooghly, West Bengal which are as follows:-
  - 40 MLD STP work with Interception & Diversion at Bally, West Bengal, Total cost ₹ 191.51 crore.
  - 60 MLD STP work with Interception & Diversion at Kamarhati and Baranagar Municipalities, West Bengal, Total cost₹ 174.15 crore.
  - 65 MLD STP work with Interception & Diversion at Howrah, Total cost ₹ 209.13 crore.
- II. On 2<sup>nd</sup> March, 2024, following twelve **projects** worth ₹2,189 Crore were inaugurated from Aurangabad, Bihar:-
  - 60 MLD STP and sewerage network at Saidpur, Patna. Total cost: ₹ 184.93
  - 162 km sewerage network at Saidpur, Patna; Total cost:₹268.63
  - 60 MLD STP and sewerage network at Pahari, Patna; Total cost: ₹191.62
  - 93 km sewerage network at Hill Zone IVA, Patna; Total cost: ₹230.48
  - 116 km sewerage network at Hill Zone V, Patna; Total cost: ₹356.37
  - 180 km sewerage network at Beur, Patna; Total cost: ₹225.77

# III. On 10<sup>th</sup> March, 2024, Hon'ble PM further inaugurated following **three**Sewage projects worth ₹ 1,114 crore from Azamgarh, Uttar Pradesh:-

- 72 MLD STP and I&D network work at Naini (District-G, 42 MLD), Phaphamau (District-F, 14 MLD) and Jhunsi (16MLD), Prayagraj. Total cost: ₹767.59 crore.
- 30 MLD STP and I&D network work at Jaunpur. Total cost: ₹206.05 crore.
- 45 MLDSTP and I&D network work at Etawah. Total cost: ₹140,6 crore.

#### C. Inauguration of Project by Hon'ble Minister of Jal Shakti

On 16<sup>th</sup> March, 2024, the Union Minister of Jal Shakti inaugurated Dam at Indroka, Jodhpur and 72 Artificial Recharge Structures spread over various parts of Rajasthan, constructed by WAPCOS limited, in the presence of Minister of Parliamentary Affairs & Justice, Govt. of Rajasthan and various dignitaries and officials from Ministry of Jal Shakti. This 715m long and 9.3m high Zoned Earth Filled Dam and other Artificial Recharge Structures shall recharge the ground water and meet the shortage of water in the area.

#### D. Launch of Jal Shakti Abhiyan: Catch the Rain- 2024

The Union Minister for Jal Shakti launched the fifth edition of "Jal Shakti Abhiyan: Catch the Rain" campaign on 9<sup>th</sup> March, 2024, at the NDMC Convention Centre in New Delhi organized by National Water Mission with the theme '*Nari Shakti se Jal Shakti'* in collaboration with Jal Jeevan Mission, DDWS to recognize and appreciate the crucial role played by women in water management, conservation, and sustainability and emphasizing the empowerment of women for water-related activities. The Union Minister also virtually launched two books namely "Jal Shakti Abhiyan 2019 to 2023- The Journey for Sustainable Water Future" and "101 glimpse of Women Power: Through the prism of Jal Jeevan Mission".

## E. Release of 'Resource Book for Spingshed Management in Mountainous Regions of India'

Recognizing the critical role of springs in water and ecological security DoWR, RD & GR had set up a Steering Committee on 'Springshed Mapping of the Indian Himalayan Region including Mountainous Regions of the Country and Springshed-

based Watershed Management Plan'. The committee, supported by technical expertise, initiated the First Springs Census to expedite nationwide springshed management. Responding to the need for comprehensive guidance, the committee, led by Shri Subodh Yadav, Joint Secretary, DoWR RD & GR crafted the 'Resource Book and SoPs for Springshed Management in the Mountainous Regions of India', featuring insights from domain experts and implementing agencies for practical utility. The book covers various essential aspects of springmanagement like database assessment, standard definitions classifications, mapping methodologies, discharge measurement techniques, holistic management strategies, water quality protocols, environmental isotopes' use, tailored guidelines, discharge indexes etc. The book- released in March, 2024- is expected to enhance ongoing efforts and motivate stakeholders to promote sustainable development of vital resources and may be accessed through the link: https://jalshakti-dowr.gov.in/document/resource-book-for-springshedmanagement-in-the-mountainous-regions-of-india/.

# F. Signing of MoA for Establishment of an International Centre of Excellence for Dams (ICED):-

An MoA was signed between CWC, DoWR, RD & GR, MoJS with Indian Institute of Science (IISc) Bangalore for Establishment of an International Centre of Excellence for Dams (ICED) under externally supported Dam Rehabilitation and Improvement Project (DRIP) Phase II and III. This (ICED) will give the right impetus towards building an 'Atmanirbhar Bharat' and will also provide a window of opportunity for disseminating knowledge and expertise in the dam safety area to many underdeveloped and developing nations in future."

ICED will also act as a technological arm of the Ministry of Jal Shakti (MoJS) to provide specialized technical support in investigations, modelling, research and innovations to the Indian and overseas dam owners and would provide solutions to various emerging challenges faced in dam safety through scientific research.

### I. National Mission for Clean Ganga: Major Activities:-

Steering **Committee Meeting:** On 20<sup>th</sup> March, 2024, the first meeting of the Steering Committee on the PTB-NMCG project, was held under the chairmanship of the DG, NMCG, to strengthen the quality infrastructure for water monitoring of the Ganges River II, as part of the Indo-German Technical Cooperation Programme.
- 2. **Monitoring Committee meeting**: On 27<sup>th</sup> March, 2024, the second Monitoring Committee meeting was held under the chairmanship of DG, NMCG, for the NMCG-NIUA 'Centre for River Sensitive Cities' project. These discussions included outlining the roadmap for Indo-Netherlands & RCA collaboration on Prayagraj URMP, conceptualizing a plan for the RCA website, institutionalizing RCA through the Ministry of Jal Shakti and the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs, and enhancing Decision Support System (DSS) tools in alignment with international case studies.
- 3. **Signing of MoU:** On 15<sup>th</sup> March, 2024, a tripartite concession agreement was signed between NMCG, Kolkata Municipal Corporation and M/s. GR Sewage Treatment Plant Pvt. Ltd for the construction of 65 MLD STPs with I&D network at Kolkata, West Bengal under the Hybrid Annuity PPP mode at a cost of 243.36 crore.

- 1. Meetings for preparation of DPR including Hydrology of Modified Parbati-Kalisindh-Chambal Link Project chaired by Chairman, Task Force for Interlinking of River (TFILR), DoWR, RD&GR were held on 01.03.2024, 04.03.2024 & 15.03.2024.

- Interception & Diversion of Sewerage Water from Existing Drains to 3. Nearest STP for Treatment Purpose in Jodhpur City for Pollution Abatement of River Jojari at Jodhpur, Rajasthan- Rs. 51.99 Crore on 04th March, 2024.
- 4. Establishing and Commissioning of 30 MLD Sewage Treatment Plant at Nandari for pollution abatement of river Jojari at Jodhpur, Rajasthan- Rs **53.86 Crore** on 08<sup>th</sup> March, 2024.
