The important issues / developments related to the Department of Water Resources, River Development & Ganga Rejuvenation during the month of July 2024 are as follows: -

- A. Storage Position of Important Reservoirs: Central Water Commission is monitoring the live storage position of 150 important reservoirs spread all over the country and issuing bulletins every Thursday. The overall storage position in 150 reservoirs as on 25.07.2024 was 69.27 BCM which is 82% of the live storage of corresponding period of last year and 96% of average storage of last ten years. Out of the 150 Reservoirs being monitored, 20 reservoirs are of Hydro-Electric projects having total live storage capacity of 35.299 BCM and 11 Reservoirs of these had Storage more than the average of previous 10 years.
- B. Launch of "Flood Impact Analysis Publication" by Hon'ble Minister of Jal Shakti: Union Minister for Jal Shakti, Shri C.R. Paatil released a report titled 'Assessment of Area Affected due to Floods in India' brought out by Central Water Commission (CWC), in New Delhi on 25.07.2024. This comprehensive report, based on satellite data from 1986 to 2022, shows that approximately 20.5 million hectares (Mha) have been protected from floods through various structural measures and about 21 Mha have been affected by floods during the same period.

The publication provides details of district-wise areas affected by flood and is designed to aid stakeholders in developing early warning systems, improving flood management strategies, and planning effective emergency responses. It is a valuable resource for planners, policymakers, disaster managers and relief agencies working to mitigate flood impacts and enhance flood protection efforts.

C. CWC receives Prestigious GEEF Global WaterTech Award for Innovation in Water Resources: The Central Water Commission (CWC), DoWR, RD & GR have been honoured with the GEEF Global WaterTech Award for 'Water Department of the Year' at the Global Water Tech Summit 2024 organized by the Global Energy and Environment Foundation (GEEF) on 26<sup>th</sup> July, 2024. The award highlights the achievements in water, wastewater, and desalination sectors, focusing on innovation, technology and sustainability. The CWC was recognized for its crucial work in hydro-meteorological data collection, flood forecasting, reservoir monitoring, coastal management, etc. The foundation also applauded CWC's initiatives like enhanced collaboration with state water resources departments, capacity building in Urban Hydrology and the development of the 'Floodwatch India' app for dissemination of flood related information to the public at large, etc. This award reflects CWC's dedication to excellence and progress in water technology and resource management.

- D. 6<sup>th</sup> Meeting of Steering Committee of Ken-Betwa Link Project: The 6<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Steering Committee of Ken-Betwa Link Project Authority was held on 19.07.2024 under the chairpersonship of Secretary, DoWR, RD&GR. The meeting was attended by the officers from D/o. Water Resources, Madhya Pradesh, D/o. Irrigation &Water Resources, Uttar Pradesh, Field Director of Panna Tiger Reserve and representatives from NITI Aayog, Ministry of Tribal Affairs, Ministry of Finance and Wildlife Institute of India (WII). During the meeting Secretary DoWR, RD &GR highlighted the project's importance for Bundelkhand, stressing the need for best practices in construction to protect the environment and support community development. Secretary, DoWR, RD &GR commended Madhya Pradesh for timely land transfer and urged both States to expedite land acquisition for the Link Canal and complete pending DPRs. Secretary, DoWR, RD &GR also emphasized effective resettlement and rehabilitation, compensatory afforestation and integrated management planning.
- E. CWC and SAC Collaborate on Advanced Hydrology Studies and Water Management Innovations: On 08.07.2024, a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed between DoWR, RD&GR (CWC) and the Space Application Centre (SAC), ISRO. This MoU aims to strengthen collaboration between CWC and SAC in the domains of hydrology and water resources management. The agreement focuses on leveraging remote sensing technologies and collaborative research to address key challenges. The MoU outlines carrying out joint studies in several critical areas, including the assessment of waterlogged and salinity-affected regions, spatial inundation mapping and monitoring across India, estimation of satellite-based meteorological parameters and Al/ML-driven predictions for river and reservoir parameters. It also covers wetlands monitoring, forecasting technologies for extreme weather events, and the monitoring of high-altitude lakes.
- **F.** 53<sup>nd</sup> Water Talk Seminar Series- On 25<sup>th</sup> July, 2024, the Department (NWM) organized the 53<sup>nd</sup> seminar series of 'Water Talk', under the theme "Community- Based Water Resources Management". This platform has been established to foster dialogue and knowledge exchange among participants on various water-related subjects. The primary objective of 'Water Talk' is to raise awareness, enhance stakeholder capacities and inspire active engagement in water conservation and preservation efforts.
- G. Inter-State Cooperation Facilitates Mahadayi PRAWAH- Field Visit and Meeting: The Authority Members of the Mahadayi PRAWAH (Constituted in 2023 to give effect to the decisions of the Mahadayi Water Dispute Tribunal), representing Governments of Goa, Karnataka and Maharashtra, as well as full-time members led by Chairperson Shri P. Manroi Scott, conducted a "Mahadayi Basin Familiarization" visit across the three states from 4<sup>th</sup>-7<sup>th</sup> July, 2024. This field visit provided valuable insights and a clearer understanding of the existing and proposed water infrastructures and their uses. To conclude the visit, the Government of Karnataka hosted the 2nd Meeting of the PRAWAH on 8<sup>th</sup> July, 2024 in Bengaluru.
- H. Important meetings / conference held at the level of Hon'ble Minister of Jal Shakti during the month of July 2024:-
  - 1. A meeting to review the "Draft Technical guidelines on Flood Plain Zoning" was held on 08.07.2024 under the chairmanship of Hon'ble Minister of Jal Shakti. The guidelines have been circulated to the states for suggestions.

- 2. A meeting to review the preparation of DPR of "Modified PKC Link Project" and "Expansion of Atal Bhujal Yojna" was held on 08.07.2024 under the Chairmanship of Hon'ble Minister of Jal Shakti.
- Hon'ble Minister of Jal Shakti reviewed the progress made with regard to the Cabinet decisions pertaining to the Department taken in the last 10 years and implementation of various Acts administered by the Department in a meeting taken on 15.07.2024.

## K. National Mission for Clean Ganga: Major Activities:-

- 1. Executive Committee Meeting: The 55<sup>th</sup> Executive Committee meeting of the NMCG was held on 05.07.2024 under the chairmanship of the DG, NMCG. In this meeting, the committee approved projects of approx. ₹ 600 crore. The important projects *inter alia* includes 20 Million Liters Per Day (MLD) Sewage Treatment Plant (STP) with Interception and Diversion (I&D) in Deoband, Uttar Pradesh, 7 MLD STP with I&D in Murshidabad, West Bengal and a 14 MLD STP with I&D in Katwa, West Bengal.
- 2. Workshop on Natural Farming: on 24<sup>th</sup>July, 2024, NMCG, DoWR, RD&GR, in association with the Organization for Industrial, Spiritual and Cultural Advancement (OISCA), organized the 'Natural Farming Training Workshop for Farmers at Sambhal' in Uttar Pradesh under the Arth Ganga initiatives. During the workshop, more than 400 farmers participated in the development of a Natural Farming Model Farm of one hectare in Sambhal. The workshop was attended by the Embassy of Japan, SMCG, the State Agriculture Department, India, the Animal Husbandry Department, NCONF, the Fishery Department and other organizations.
- 3. Visit of Ethiopian Delegates: On 29<sup>th</sup> July, 2024, a meeting was held under the chairmanship of the Executive Director (Projects), NMCG with a 12-member delegation from Ethiopia's Ministry of Water and Energy. This visit was part of an educational exchange program aimed at gaining insights from India's successful Faecal Sludge and Septage Management (FSSM) models. The Ethiopian delegation was keen to understand how India has effectively managed faecal sludge and septage to improve sanitation and environmental health. During their visit, they were introduced to the PRAYAG initiative, a key project by NMCG focused on innovative and sustainable FSSM solutions.
- 4. Workshop on Leveraging Space Technologies: On 26<sup>th</sup> July, 2024, NMCG, in collaboration with Map My India, organized a workshop under the Ganga Knowledge Centre titled "Leveraging Space Technologies." The workshop showcased how advanced space technology can be utilized to enhance the monitoring and management of the Ganga River, focusing on improving decision-making processes for a cleaner and more sustainable river. Presentations and demonstrations highlighted the potential of satellite imagery and geospatial data to track water quality, manage pollution, and support conservation efforts effectively.
- 5. Meeting with National Institute of Urban Affairs (NIUA) & Netherlands' Water as Leverage: On 8<sup>th</sup>July, 2024, a meeting was held under the chairmanship of DG, NMCG with the National Institute of Urban Affairs (NIUA) and the Netherlands' Water as Leverage (WaL) team to discuss the Prayagraj Urban River Management Plan (URMP), aiming to integrate innovative and sustainable practices. This collaboration leverages international expertise to address urban river management challenges, enhance water quality and promote ecological balance in Prayagraj.

6. Review Meeting of PRAYAG: On July 11<sup>th</sup>, 2024, a meeting was held under the chairmanship of the DG, NMCG to review the status of "PRAYAG - Platform for Real-time Analysis of Yamuna, Ganga and their Tributaries". The meeting aimed to assess the progress of PRAYAG's components, identify challenges and plan future steps to ensure the effective implementation and success of this real-time analysis platform.

## L. Miscellaneous

- 1. **Webinar with NGOs:** A webinar on the "Role of NGOs for implementation of Jal Shakti Abhiyan: Catch the Rain (JSA:CTR) 2024" was organized by the Department (National Water Mission) on 09.07.2024 with a view engage NGOs in the Abhiyan and sensitize them about the activities of the campaign. A total of 315 NGOs participated in the webinar.
- 2. Webinar Session on "Best practices of Water management: Dialogues with DMs & Municipal Administrators": The 42<sup>nd</sup> session of the webinar series, started in August, 2020, was organized on 26.07.2024 by NWM under the Chairpersonship of AS &MD NWM. The panelists included District Magistrates of Dindori, MP and Chief Development Officer, Varanasi, UP. All the Panelists shared their ideas/best practices in water management during the webinar.
