& review of the data base and methodology adopted in the estimation of various aggregates. The new

series, besides shifting of base year from 1993-94 to 1999-2000, incorporates latest available data from

long term surveys and censuses, new economic activities previously uncaptured, wider coverage of

activities & improvement in procedures.

I am grateful to Mr. Ramesh Kolli (ADG), Dr. Savita Sharma (DDG) and all other officers of

CSO for their fuller cooperation and guidance in preparing this new series of estimates.

I would also like to thank various Directorates of the State Government for their cooperation in

making available the required information to the Directorate of Economics and Statistics, Uttarakhand.

This publication is the result of sincere and painstaking work done by a team of officers and the

staff of the DES. I would like to place my deep appreciations of their dedicated efforts and hard work.

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NEW SERIES OF STATE DOMESTIC PRODUCT OF UTTARAKHAND

(Base year 1999-2000)

I- INTRODUCTION

he development of official estimates of State Domestic Product (SDP)and related aggregates of Uttarakhand, to meet the requirements for planning and policy purposes, begin after the creation of the State. As the data required to prepare the estimates is very huge and the calculation involved is complex in nature, it was difficult for the newly created DES to quickly prepare the estimates of the State. However, a small team of five dedicated personnel of DES started gearing up on the subject and it approached National Accounts Division of Central Statistical Organization(CSO), Government of India, New Delhi, to organize training program for them. Mean-while DES also started collecting data for previous years from DES, U.P. and NAD-CSO and latest data from different Directorates of the State. As a result, first training program was organized by CSO at Raipur (Chhattisgarh) during 21 – 25 October, 2002, second program was organized at New Delhi during 21 – 28 March, 2003 and third program was organized at Nainital (Uttarakhand) during 16 – 20 February, 2004. Needless to say that due to these efforts, in accordance with the methodology recommended by the Central Statistical Organization, DES Uttarakhand could prepare its first publication of estimates of State Domestic Products of Uttaranchal (1993-94 to 2001-02) with base year 1993-94 in November, 2004 and second publication of State Domestic Products of Uttaranchal (1993 to 2003-04) with base year 1993-94 in March, 2006. This is the third publication of State Domestic Product of Uttarakhand (1999-2000 to 2005-06). However, it is the first issue with the revised base year 1999-2000.

This publication presents in brief, the guiding principals for new series and their applications with reasons for choosing 1999-2000 as the base year. Besides this, the estimates of Gross/ Net State Domestic Product (GSDP/NSDP) both at current and constant prices & related aggregates of Uttarakhand from 1999-2000 to 2005-06 with new base year 1999-2000 along with brief analysis and note on the improvements made in the new series are also presented in this publication.

GUIDING PRINCIPALS FOR NEW SERIES

The three major components influencing the present revision exercise include:

- Revision of base year to a more recent year for meaning full analysis of the structural changes in the economy,
- Complete review of existing database and
- Complete review of methodology employed in the estimation.

(1) REVISION OF BASE YEAR TO A MORE RECENT YEAR FOR MEANING FULL ANALYSIS OF THE STRUCTURAL CHANGES IN THE ECONOMY

CHOICE OF 1999-2000 AS BASE YEAR

In the past, as per the guidelines of the CSO, there had been the practice of revising State Domestic Product decennially, changing the base-year to an year **synchronizing** with the year of

decennial population Census. It was primarily because in the base year estimates, the information on workforce has played an important role and it was obtained from the population census which are conducted decennially in the year ending with 1. But in the previous series (base year 1993-94), it was observed that the data on work participation rate (WPR) captured by the National Sample Survey Organization (NSSO) was better then the one estimated through the Population Census. Accordingly, workforce estimates based on WPR from 50th Round of NSS (1993-94) survey results were used and the base year was revised to 1993-94.

In continuation with this practice, the new year 1999-2000 is adopted as the base year in the new series of State Domestic Products using the data on WPR NSS 55th Round of NSS (1999-2000) on Employment and Unemployment. In this series, the WPR data has been used in conjunction with data of the population census.

(2) COMPLETE REVIEW OF EXISTING DATABASE

(i)USE OF RESULTS OF RECENT SURVEYS AND CENSUSES

After complete review of data, efforts have been made to make use of most recent data and available results of latest surveys. Some of the important sources of data which have been utilized in new series are as follows.

- (1) Quinquennial Survey on Employment and Unemployment, 1999-2000 (55th Round of NSS)
- (2) Survey on Unorganized Manufacturing, 2000-01 (56th Round of NSS).
- (3) Survey on Service Sector, 2001-02 (57th Round of NSS).
- (4) Survey on Housing Condition, 2002-03 (58th Round of NSS).
- (5) All-India Live Stock Census, 2003, Department of Animal Husbandry, Dairying and Fisheries.
- (6) Population Census, 2001, Registrar General of India (RGI).
- (7) All-India Census of Small Scale Industries, 2001-02, Development Commissioner (Industries)
- (8) Quinquennial Survey on Consumer Expenditure, 1999-2000 (55th Round of NSS).
- (9) Cost of Cultivation Studies (CCS), Ministry of Agriculture, GOI

(ii) USE OF RESULTS OF TYPESTUDIES

In addition to using the results of above surveys & censuses, the results of the following typestudies, conducted by different agencies are also incorporated in the new series:

- (1) Rates and Ratios in Agriculture Sector by Socio Economics Research Center (SERC); a Delhi based NGO
- (2) Yield Rates for Meat, Meat Products and By Products conducted by the CSO
- (3) Yield Rates of Camel Hair and Pig Bristles conduct by the CSO
- (4) Market Charges Paid by the Farmers executed by DES Ag, GOI

(iii) IMPROVEMENT IN COVERAGE

(1) Improvements in terms of coverage in the new series in the GSDP estimates have mainly been inclusion of (i) Water Transport Activity, (ii) Incidental Activities in Transport Sector, (iii) Repair and Maintenance of Motor Vehicle and (iv)Repair and Maintenance of Personal and Household Goods.

Besides the above, economic activities like (i) Other Private Communication, (ii) Renting of Machinery and Equipment without Operator, (iii) Computer Related Activities in Unorganized Segment, (iv) Coaching Centers. (v) Recreation, Cultural and Sporting Activities, have been taken into account as per the latest available data from the NSS 55th and NSS 57th Round. These activities have not been adequately captured in the earlier series, but are explicitly defined in the National Industrial classification, 1998; according to which the NSSO collected the data in these rounds.

(3) COMPLETE REVIEW OF METHODOLOGY EMPLOYED IN THE ESTIMATION

(i) IMPROVEMENT IN THE PROCEDURE OF COMPILATION

The important procedural changes in new series are –

- (1) Estimates in respect of Trade, Hotel and Restaurants Activities were prepared as a whole in previous series while in new series these estimates have been prepared separately for Trade Activities and Hotel & Restaurant Activities.
- (2) Research and Scientific Services category has been included in **Real Estate**, **Ownership of Dwellings**, **Legal and Business Services Sector** with the name "**Research d Development Services**". Previously, this category was included in **Other Services Sector**.
- (3) Estimates of activities related to Washing of Textiles, Hair Dressing and Other Beauty Treatment, Funeral and Auxiliary Services and Private Household with Employed Person have been prepared separately. These all activities were included in "the Rest of Services" Category, in the previous series.

(ii) ESTIMATION OF WORKFORCE FOR USE IN NEW SERIES

The term **workforce** refers to the number of persons (employees, employers and self employed) engaged wholly or partly in the production of goods and services. In this series, workforce is refer as labour input in each economic activities, which is also the job count in those activities. Traditionally, the estimates of workforce used in the estimation of State Domestic Products were from the Population Census. However, estimates of workforce are also available form other alternative sources, namely (i) large scale household sample surveys on Employment and Unemployment conducted by NSSO, which provide workforce participation rates (WPR); these WPRs used in conjunction with the estimated population, provide workforce estimates, (ii) economic census conducted by the CSO and (iii) the Follow up Enterprise Surveys of the Economic Census conducted by the CSO and the NSSO. After a detailed analysis of data from all these sources, following methodology have been used by CSO to prepared state level workforce estimates.

DATA SOURCE:-

- 1. Compilation of Categorywise Workforce Data at 4 Digit Level of NIC 1998 (Main and Marginal Worker) using population Census, 2001.
- 2. Labour Input (Principal and Subsidiary Workers) at 1 Digit Level separately for Rural and Urban Areas using Employment and Unemployment Survey (1999-2000).

METHODOLOGY:-

- Step 1-4 Digit Level Data of Workers from RGI is grouped into 1 Digit Level separately for Rural and Urban Areas.
- Step 2-Computed Ratio of NSSO 1 Digit Level Data to RGI 1 Digit Level Data.
- Step 3-Adjusted RGI 4 Digit Level Data by the Ratio obtain in Step 2.

The Labour Input estimates, thus prepared were supplied by the CSO to all the states for their use.

However, in case of few categories, DES observed that Labour Input data obtained from CSO, is either too low or too high. Thus an exercise has been attempted to calculate appropriate Labour Input to make them comparable with the old series. In this exercise adjustment has been done in Labour Input of those compilation categories without disturbing the total at 1 Digit Level data of Labour Input.

As a result, labour input of Real Estate, Legal Services, Research & Development, Sewage and Refuse Disposal and Membership of Organization category were adjusted without disturbing the total at 1-Digit Level data.

(iii) ESTIMATES OF VALUE ADDED PER WORKER (VAPW)

CSO has compiled the estimates of VAPW for unorganized and some private organized segment of manufacturing and service sectors from the results of the following three surveys:-

- 1. Data on Informal Non-Agricultural Enterprises from 55th Round of NSS (1999-2000).
- 2. Data on Manufacturing Enterprises in the Unorganized Sector from 56th Round of NSS (2000-01).
- 3. Data on Unorganized Enterprises in Service Sector (Excluding Trade & Finance) from 57th Round of NSS (2001-02).

The State wise estimates of Value Added Per Worker at the compilation category level have been arrived at as ratio of the Gross Value Added to the total workforce in the particular compilation category.

II: The GSDP & NSDP ESTIMATES

The provisional estimates of GSDP/ NSDP and Per Capita NSDP at Current and Constant (1999-00) prices for the year 1999-00 to 2005-06 are given in Table :-

It can be seen from the above table that the estimates of GSDP/ NSDP and Per Capita NSDP at Current Prices respectively Rs. 12618 Crores, Rs. 11264 Crores and Rs. 13609 during 19939-00 have gone up to Rs. 26433 Crores, Rs. 23925 Crores and Rs. 26118 in 2005-06. It means that these estimates have respectively gone up by approximately 209%, 212% and 192%. Whereas at constant prices i.e. setting aside price fluctuation, these estimates are Rs. 21456 crores, Rs. 19323 Crores and Rs. 21095 respectively in 2005-06. Thus, it is clear that even at Constant Prices the GSDP, NSDP and Per Capita NSDP have gone up by 170%, 172% and 172% respectively.

REVIEW OF GROWTH IN STATE'S ECONOMY AT CONSTANT (1999-00) PRICES

Although the above mentioned percentage increases reflect an overall growth of economy, it is necessary to analyse the yearwise performance. The yearwise growth in GSDP, NSDP and Per Capita Income (NSDP) at Constant (1990-00) Prices from 2000-01 to 2005-06 in percentage terms is presented in Table -2.

It can be seen from the Table-2 that the Uttarakhand's Economy witnessed highest growth in the year 2000-01 and the lowest growth in 2001-02. Highest growth in 2000-01 is mainly due to the rapid performance of manufacturing, trade, hotel, restaurant, communication and other service sector during the year.

SECTORAL SHARES OF GSDP DURING 1999-00 & 2005-06

Table-3 has been prepared to analyse the share of the three broad sectors of the economy in the GSDP.

From Table-3, it can be observed that considerable changes in the sectoral composition of GSDP have been taken place. While in 1999-00 the lowest contributor is the secondary sector, in 2005-06 it is primary sector. The tertiary sector is the major contributor through out the period. This gives an idea that Uttarakhand's Economy is growing in similar terms with the Global Economy where service sector is likely to play a major role.

III THE ANALYTICAL REVIEW

The estimates of Gross & Net State Domestic Product at Current and Constant Prices with base year 1999-00 have been prepared from 1999-00 to 2005-06 on the basis of latest available data. The analysis and salient features of these estimates are detailed below.

1- SECTORAL ANALYSIS

The overall view of sectoral composition of State Economy at Current Prices 1999-00 to 2005-06 is tabulated in Table-4 and its graphical representation has already been depicted in Fig.-3.

The contribution of the primary sector, 31.22% during 1999-00, has come down to 20.03% in 2005-06. Whereas, the contribution of the secondary sector recorded at 17.37% in 1999-00, has gone up to 26.32 % in 2005-06. On the other hand, contribution of tertiary sector reported 51.41% in 1999-00 has descended marginally to 50.64% in 2003-04.

The analysis of sectoral contribution in Gross State Domestic Product (GSDP) at Current Prices reveals that the contribution of primary sector comprising of Agriculture, Livestock, Forestry, Fishing, Mining & Quarrying is decreasing. While the contribution of secondary sector (comprising of Manufacturing, Electricity, Gas & Water Supply and Construction) is increasing. It is clear that the share of primary sector has gone down by 8.2 points in the reference period, the share of secondary sector has gone up by 8.9 points. The contribution of tertiary sector, also known as the services sector (comprising of Trade, Hotels & Restaurants, Transport, Storage, Communication, Banking & Insurance, Real Estates, Business Services, Public Administration and Other Services) has remained, more or less, constant through out the reference period.

Sectoral Composition of State Economy at Constant (1999-00) Prices for 1999-00 to 2005-06 is tabulated in Table - 5 and its pictorial representation has already been depicted in Fig.-4.

Sectoral composition of GSDP at Constant (1999-00) Prices also indicates the same trend as that of Current Prices but with slight variation in percentages. During 2005-06, contribution of primary, secondary and tertiary sector are 22.24%, 29.38% and 48.38% respectively, while in 1999-00 their contribution has been 31.22%, 17.37%, and 51.41% respectively.

The preliminary reason for such a change in the sectoral composition of Uttarakhand's Economy may be attributed to the urbanization that has taken place in the state during the reference period.

2- THE GROSS STATE DOMESTIC PRODUCT

SDP at Current and Constant Prices have registered annual compound growth rate of 13.1% and 9.3% respectively during the reference period i.e., from 1999-00 to 2005-06. In absolute terms the GSDP at Current Prices has grown from Rs. 12618 crores in 1999-00 to Rs. 26433 crores in 2005-06 and the GSDP at Constant Prices has grown from Rs. 12618 crores in ·1999-00 to Rs. 21456 crores in 2005-06. The micro analysis based on indices reveals that GSDP at current prices from primary sector has increased one and half times and from the secondary & tertiary sectors it has tripled & doubled respectively during the reference period. GSDP at Constant Prices from primary, secondary and tertiary sectors has grown by 21%, 187% and 60% respectively. Thus, it is

clear that the secondary sector has grown at comparatively better rate than primary and tertiary sector. GSDP at Current and Constant Prices is given in Table-6 and its graphical representation has already been depicted in Fig.-1. I

3- THE NET STATE DOMESTIC PRODUCT/ STATE INCOME

In absolute terms the NSDP at Current Prices has grown up from Rs. 11264 crores in 1999-00 to Rs. 15051 crores in 2005-06 and NSDP at Constant Prices has grown from Rs. 11264 crores in 1999-00 to Rs. 19323 crores in 2005-06. NSDP at Current and Constant Prices have recorded annual compound growth rates of 13.4% and 9.4% respectively during the reference period. The micro analysis of NSDP based on indices reveals the same trend as GSDP. It has increased one and half times in case of Primary sector, while it has tripled and doubled in case of secondary and tertiary sectors respectively. NSDP at Constant Prices from primary, secondary and tertiary sector has grown by 21%, 188% and 60% respectively. NSDP at Current and Constant Prices are given in Table-7 and its graphical representation has already been depicted in Fig.-2.

4- PER CAPITA INCOME IN THE STATE

The estimates when studied in relation to the total population of the state indicate

the level of Per Capita Net Output of Goods and Services available or Standard of Living of the People in the state. The estimates of Per Capita Income both at Current and Constant (1999-00) prices are presented in Table-8 below and depicted in Fig.-5 previously.

Annual compound growth rate of GSDP, NSDP and Per Capita Income at Current Prices during the reference period are 13.1%, 13.4% and 11.5% respectively. Thus, it is clear that State's Economy is growing at relatively higher rate but the percolation of benefits of its growth to the population is getting affected due to higher population growth. In other words, the physical quality of life in state is not improving at the rate of growth of the economy.
