

Inauguration of e-Challan System for Department of Police Government of Goa

Chief Minister of Goa, Dr. Pramod Sawant, inaugurated and officially launched the e-Challan System for Department of Police, Government of Goa on 27th December 2019 in presence of Shri Parimal Rai, Chief Secretary, Shri Jaspal Singh, IGP, officials of NIC, Goa and Axis Bank.

e-Challan system will help Goa Police to issue on the spot Challan and receive, payment from traffic violators through cash or credit / debit card with the help of a point of sale terminal (POS terminal).

During this event, Chief Minister pointed out that “system will bring in transparency” in the collection of fines. On the occasion, Inspector General of Police(IGP), Shri. Jaspal Singh said that System would be making the task of data analysis simpler, robust, quick, transparent and also help in reducing the corruption.

e-Challan system has been developed & maintained by National Informatics Centre and operationalised from National Data Centre, New Delhi <https://echallan.parivahan.gov.in>, under One Nation, One Challan initiative of Ministry of Road Transport and Highways (MoRTH), Govt of India.

e-Challan is a sophisticated software application comprising Android based mobile app and web interface, developed for the purpose of providing an comprehensive solution for Transport Enforcement Officers and Traffic Policemen. This app-cum application is integrated ecosystem with Vehicle Registration, Fitness, Tax, Permit Details from VAHAN, Driving Licence details from SARATHI, Insurance details from IRDA, Pollution details from PUC and Stolen/Black Listed Vehicles details from NCRB and also provides a number of user-friendly features while covering all major functionalities of Traffic Enforcement System.

The application offers customized interfaces for the following stakeholders:

- ▶ Enforcement officers;
- ▶ Citizens (private or commercial car owners/drivers);
- ▶ State Transport Office/NIC Admin;
- ▶ Regional transport/Traffic Office;
- ▶ Ministry of Road and Transport.

Around 400 machines with e-Challan App have been provided to Goa Police by the Axis Bank. Earlier in the month of September 2019, integration of Axis Bank account was done in the e-Challan App with the help of e-Challan Team at NIC HQ. The customized APK now would enable Goa Police to collect fines from offender through credit/debit card ensuring transparency in the system.

Later in the month of October 2019, support team at National Informatics Centre(NIC), Goa along with Axis Bank conducted three days training cum workshop for the officials of Goa Police on e-Challan App. After month of trial run, the e-Challan App was then inaugurated and launched by Chief Minister of Goa.
