### 3. <u>National Rural Livelihoods Mission (NRLM)/Aajeevika</u> (Started in June, 2011)

**Objective** : To reduce poverty in the rural areas.

Funding Pattern : Centre 60% and State 40%

Eligibility : > All poor households including non BPL households as

identified by the community are eligible under this scheme.

Implementation Phase

In 2013-14, 12 blocks of 4 districts (Bhiwani, Jhajjar, Kaithal & Mewat) were selected for intensive implementation of NRLM. Out of 12 blocks, 4 blocks namely Siwan (Kaithal), Bawani Khera (Bhiwani), Matanhail (Jhajjar) and Tauru (Mewat) were identified as Resource Blocks. The other intensive blocks of these districts are Bhiwani, Tosham, Jhajjar, Beri, Gulha, Rajaund, Nuh and Nagina where no activity was initiated during 2013-14.

➤ In 2014-15, 5 new districts (Panchkula, Karnal, Rohtak, Hisar and Fatehabad) have been included in the intensive implementation strategy and 10 blocks have been selected in these districts (Pinjore, Morni, Gharaunda, Indri, Narnaund, Hansi-I, Fatehabad, Jhakal, Kalanaur and Lakahanmajra).

Out of 22 blocks in 9 districts namely (Ambala, Jind, Palwal, Y/Nagar, K/shetra, Rewari, Sonipat, Gurgaon and M/garh) NRLM activities have been intensively initiated in 19 blocks during 2014 -15. Out of these 19 blocks 9 are resource blocks. The activities could not be initiated in Hansi-I, Jhakal and Indri blocks.

> In 2015-16, the work will continue in 19 old blocks and 2 other blocks namely Indri and Uchana. District Jind has been included in the intensive districts.

The main objectives of the IWMP are to restore the ecological balance by harnessing, conserving and developing degraded natural resources such as soil, vegetative cover and water. The outcomes are prevention of soil erosion, regeneration of natural vegetation, rain water harvesting and recharging of the ground water table. This enables multi-cropping and the introduction of diverse agro-based activities, which help to provide sustainable livelihoods to the people residing in the watershed area.

Since beginning to till date a sum of Rs.76.01 Cr. grant-in-aid were released out of which Rs. 58.91 Cr. have been incurred till 30-9-2016. EPA and NRM activities have already been completed in Batch-III and entered into work phase. In Batch-IV EPA activities have been completed and NRM activities are still in progress. During the current financial year an amount of Rs.9.26 Cr. have been utilized upto Jan., 2017 on various activities of the scheme.

A new scheme has been started by Govt. of India, Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare for Water Conservation and Water Harvesting (PMKSY)/ for implementing Water Conservation, Water Harvesting works for ground water recharge in over exploited blocks of the State. Central Ground Water Board (CGWB) has notified 22 blocks of the state falling in 11 districts i.e. Karnal, Kurukshetra, Panipat, Kaithal, Fatehabad, Sirsa, Bhiwani, Rewari,

Mahendragarh, Faridabad & Gurgaon which are to be taken up during the current financial year 2015-16. The new scheme is being funded in 60:40 ratio between the Centre and the State. An amount of Rs.24.88 Cr. (Rs.14.93 crore as Central share and Rs. 9.95 crore as State share.) has been released as first instalment to implement the scheme.

### 5. <u>Member of Parliament Local Area Development Scheme (MPLADS)</u> (<u>Started in December.1993</u>)

**Objective**: To enable MPs to recommends works of developmental nature

with emphases on the creation of durable community assets based on locally felt needs to be taken up in their

constituency.

Funding Pattern : 100% By Central Govt.

have been completed.
