The Law Commission of India released a Consultation Paper on 'Media Law' in May 2014.

In an effort to deepen public engagement, the Law Commission of India is organizing a **Consultation** in collaboration with National Law University, Delhi, **on the 27**th **and 28**th **of September 2014 in New Delhi**. Hon'ble Minister for Law & Justice and Communications and IT, Mr. Ravi Shankar Prasad has kindly consented to inaugurate the event.

The Consultation will consist of five sessions each of which opens with a panel discussion followed by audience inputs. The following issues will be discussed in each session:

- 1. Self Regulation v. Statutory Regulation: Does the news media need structural regulation?

- 3. Social media
- 4. Contempt of Court and Reporting of Court and Legislative Proceedings
- 5. Privacy, Defamation and Trial by Media
