



Whereas, the petitioner Ajit Singh Dahiya has filed Civil Writ Petition No. 26983 of 2019 titled as Ajit Singh Dahiya vs. State of Haryana and others in the Hon'ble High Court of Punjab and Haryana at Chandigarh with the following prayer:-

"For issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents to grant the benefit of one increment which becomes due on 1st July 2014 to the petitioner at the time of retirement ."

The Hon'ble High Court disposed of the present Writ Petition vide order dated 20.09.2019. The operative part of said order is reproduced as under:-

"Petitioner has approached this Court seeking grant of the increment for the service which he had rendered continuously for a period of one year before he superannuated on 30.06.2014.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that benefit of the increment has not been allowed on the ground that the increment was to be granted on 01.07.2014 and as the petitioner retired on 30.06.2014 and was not in service on that relevant date, he is not entitled for the benefit of increment.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the increment is to be granted for the service rendered for the year which the petitioner rendered prior to the retirement and hence, denial of increment for which he is entitled for is contrary to the law laid by the judgment of Madras High Court attached as Annexure P-4 which has been upheld by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India.

Learned counsel for the petitioner further states that the petitioner will be satisfied, in case a time bound direction is issued to the respondents to decide his claim raised in the legal notice dated 16.05.2019 (Annexure P-2) Without commenting upon the merits of the case or about the entitlement of the petitioner for the relief which has been claimed by him in the legal notice dated 16.06.2019 (Annexure P-2), the present writ petition is disposed of with

a direction to the respondents to decide the legal notice dated 16.06.2019 (Annexure P-2) within a period of three months from the receipt of copy of this order.

In case, it is found that the petitioner is entitled for the monetary benefits after the decision of the legal notice, the same should also be paid to the petitioner within three months thereafter.

Present writ petition stands disposed of.”

That number of writ petitions were filed in the Hon'ble High Court challenging Rule 10 of the Haryana Civil Services (Revised Pay) Rules, 2008 to an extent that the above said rule denies annual increment to the employees, who retire on 30th June of a year, despite the fact that the above said categories of employees have completed six months or more than six months of service. The above said writ petitions came up for consideration before the Hon'ble High Court on 22.04.2019 in CWP No. 29465 of 2018 before the Division Bench of Hon'ble Chief Justice of Punjab & Haryana High Court and on that day, the counsel appearing on behalf of the State on instruction gave the statement that the above said issue is under active consideration of the State of Haryana and, in fact, a letter has been issued to the Government of India, Ministry of Personnel Public Grievance and Pension, New Delhi seeking clarification with respect to the actual position regarding the issue in question. It was further stated that as soon as the relevant clarification/ information was received from the Central Government, appropriate decision shall be taken by the State of Haryana. The State of Haryana also sought clarification from the Government of India in regard to the above said issue in view of the judgment passed by the Hon'ble Madras High Court in CWP No. 15732 of 2017 titled as P. Ayyamperumal v. Union of India decided on 15.09.2017. In the light of the said statement given by the counsel appearing on behalf of the State, the above said writ petitions were disposed of vide order dated 22.04.2019 with the direction to the State of Haryana to take an appropriate decision with regard to the issue involved in the above said writ petitions soon after

receiving the requisite information sought from Central Government. Matter was referred to Finance Department again who vide U.O. No. 6/109/2019-3PR(FD)/36292 dated 23/12/2019 reiterated the fact to keep the matter pending till the final decision from the Government of India.

That after receiving the clarification/decision from the Government of India on the above said issue, the State of Haryana will take an appropriate decision.

Therefore, the claim of the petitioners at this stage is kept pending.

Whereas the petitioners Satbir Singh and others have filed Civil Writ Petition No. 29577 of 2019 titled as Satbir Singh and others vs. State of Haryana and others in the Hon'ble High Court of Punjab and Haryana at Chandigarh with the following prayer:-

"For issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents to re-fix the pension of the petitioners by granting the annual increment on their date of retirement, in view of Haryana Govt. letter no. 6/126/2013-4PR (FD) dated 07.01.2015 (Annexure-5)."

The Hon'ble High Court disposed of the present Writ Petition vide order dated 15.10.2019. The operative part of said order is reproduced as under:-

"Petitioners have approached this Court seeking grant of the increment for the service, which they had rendered continuously for a period of one year before they superannuated.

As per the averments made in the writ petition, benefit of increment has not been allowed to the petitioners on the ground that on the date of grant of increment, the petitioners were not in service and therefore, they have not been granted the benefit of one increment though they had rendered one year service prior to their retirement. Counsel for the petitioners argues that denial of increment, for which they are entitled for, is contrary to the law laid by the judgment of Madras High Court in case W.P. No.15732 of 2017 titled as 'P. Ayyamperumal Vs. The Registrar, Central Administrative Tribunal and others', decided on 15.09.2017 (Annexure P-2), which has been upheld by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India.

From the pleadings, it transpires that for the relief which has been claimed in the present writ petition, petitioners have submitted a representation dated 28.06.2019 (Annexure P-1) which is still pending consideration with the respondents.

Interest of justice will be served, at this stage, in case a time bound direction is issued to the respondents to

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decide the claim of the petitioners raised in the representation dated 28.06.2019 (Annexure P-1).

Without commenting upon the merits of the case or about the entitlement of the petitioners for the relief, which has been claimed by them in the representation dated 28.06.2019 (Annexure P-1), the present writ petition is disposed of with a direction to the respondents to decide the representation dated 28.06.2019 (Annexure P-1) within a period of three months from the receipt of copy of this order. In case, it is found that the petitioners are entitled for any monetary benefits after the decision of the representation, the same should also be paid to them within three months thereafter.

Present writ petition stands disposed of."



Whereas, Bajinder Singh PGT English, has filed the CWP No. 31684 of 2019 before the Hon'ble High Court challenging the transfer orders dated 13.09.2019 (Annexure P/6- Colly) issued by the Department or to issue any writ, order or direction which the Hon'ble court may deem fit in the facts and circumstances of the case.

Whereas the above mentioned writ petition was disposed of on 04.10.2019 and the operative part of the order is reproduced as under:

"Prayer in present writ petition is for issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents to take decision on the representation of the petitioners.

Notice of motion.

On asking of Court, Mr. Harish Nain, AAG, Haryana, who is present in Court, accepts notice on behalf of respondents/State.

Mr. Jasbir Mor, learned counsel appearing on behalf of petitioners submits that petitioners, at this stage, would be satisfied if a direction is issued to respondent No.2 to consider and decide representations, Annexure P- 8 (colly) within some specified time.



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hold any ground as no teacher has been allotted a post/station which was kept blocked except for those who were granted benefit of interim stay on their transfer by the order of Hon'ble High Court.

In view of the position explained above, it is clear that the petitioner has been rightly transferred as per Teachers Transfer Policy, 2016 (as amended time to time) and there is no substance in the representation of the petitioner and the same is liable to be dismissed, being devoid of merits.
