

WBJEEB has been instrumental in the admission process based on online application and allotment through e-Counselling since then. It advocates fairness and transparency, ensures no error, and adopts state-of-the-art technology in all its activities</p>

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- D. For Pharmacy Diploma students, Paper-II consists of 100 questions in Category-1.
- E. Each question is a multiple-choice question (MCQ) in English with four possible answers, and two hours are allotted to complete the paper.

2.3 **Syllabus of Examination:** The subject-wise syllabus for the JELET-2026 is given in Appendix 5.

Scoring Methodology

2.4 **Category-1**

- a) Only one option is correct.
- b) A correct response will yield 1 (one) mark for each question.
- c) Incorrect response will yield -1/4 (25% negative) marks for each question.
- d) For any combination of more than one option, even if it contains the correct option, the said answer will be treated as incorrect and will yield -1/4 (negative 1/4) marks.

Not attempting the question will fetch zero mark.

Category-2

- a) One or more options is/are correct.
- b) Marking all correct options only will yield 2 (two) marks.
- c) For any combination of answers containing one or more incorrect options, the said answer will be treated as incorrect, and it will yield zero (0) mark even if one or more of the chosen options is/are correct.
- d) For partially correct answers, i.e., when all correct options are not marked and also no incorrect options are marked, marks awarded = 2 X (no of correct options marked) / (total no of actually correct options).

Not attempting the question will fetch 0 marks

2.5 **Mode of answering in the examination**

- Questions are to be answered on a specially designed optical machine-readable response (OMR) sheet, which will be evaluated by the Optical Mark Recognition method. Thus, it is very important to follow the correct method of marking.
- Candidates will indicate their response to the questions by darkening the appropriate circle/bubble completely with a blue/black ink ballpoint **pen**.
- Any other kind of marking, e.g., filling the circle/bubble incompletely, filling with pencil, cross mark, tick mark, dot mark, circular mark, overwriting, scratching, erasing, white ink, marking outside the circle/bubble, etc., may lead to wrong/partial/ambiguous reading of the response. **WBJEEB will be in no way responsible for such an eventuality, which may lead to cancellation of the OMR sheet.**
- Response marking cannot be edited/changed/erased/modified.

2.6 **Ranking Methodology and Publication of Merit Lists**

- a) WBJEEB will prepare merit ranks based on the candidates' **scores in the Common Entrance Test**. Individual candidates will be able to view and download his/her Rank Card, which will contain their score and rank. **WBJEEB does not publish any rank or score lists to ensure the confidentiality of each individual candidate.**
- b) The rank shall be in the name and style of '**GMR**' (General Merit Rank)/ '**PMR**' (Pharmacy Merit Rank).
- c) Two (2) separate rank lists will be prepared based on the candidates' qualifying examination, e.g.

- i. Diploma in Engineering/ Technology OR B.Sc.D.Voc. and B.Voc., (**GMR**).
- ii. Diploma in Pharmacy. (**PMR**).

- d)** The sequence of GMR/PMR will be prepared based on the marks scored.
- e)** Ranking shall be done in descending order of marks scored. In the event of a tie, the tie-breaking rules in 2.7 shall apply.
- f)** Separate reserved category merit position will also be indicated for respective category of students, e.g., SC Rank, ST Rank, OBC-A Rank, OBC-B Rank, PWD Rank, EWS Rank, etc., as applicable.
- g)** **Sequencing order for counselling/allotment of seat/admission will be based on GMR/PMR only** (not on category ranks). Category ranks are for information only to candidates of the respective category.
- h)** **Category ranks** are generated based on the category information given by the candidates during online application, but documents are verified by the allotted Institutes during counselling and admission. Hence, the candidate’s certificates/documents/proofs must be valid as of the date of verification. If, during verification, any candidate’s claim is found invalid at that time, his/her category rank will be cancelled, and the candidate will be considered thereafter in the general category. **The category ranks of other candidates will not be revised.**

2.7 Tie-Breaking Methodology in the Determination of Merit Rank

A. Paper - I

- 1. Less negative marks in total.
- 2. More positive marks in Mathematics.
- 3. Less negative marks in Mathematics.
- 4. More positive marks in Physics.
- 5. Less negative marks in Physics.
- 6. More positive marks in Chemistry.
- 7. Less negative marks in Chemistry.
- 8. More positive marks in Fundamentals of Electrical & Electronics Engg.
- 9. Less negative marks in Fundamentals of Electrical & Electronics Engg.

B. Paper-II:

- 1. Less negative marks in total.

C. After application of the Tie-breaking Rules as applicable, if there are still ties, the same will be broken by the date of birth (DOB) of the candidates, with the older candidate having preference over the younger one. If the tie still remains, then it will be decided by the application number in ascending order.

2.8 Rules of the examination: Rules to be followed during the examination are given in Appendix-6.

3.0 Eligibility and academic qualification criteria

3.1 Eligibility criteria for application

- a) Citizenship: Applicant must be a citizen of India.
- b) Age Restriction:
- I. There is **no upper age limit** for Diploma holders in Engineering/ Technology/ D.Voc. /Pharmacy.
 - II. For B. Sc. Candidates, the **upper age limit** is 27 (twenty-seven) years as on 31.12.2026.
 - III. For Diploma holders in marine Engineering, the **upper age limit** is 25 (twenty-five) years as on 31.12.2026.

3.2 Eligibility criteria for admission**(A) Diploma holders seeking admission in Engineering & Technology Degree Courses:**

- i. Passed Minimum Three years / Two years (Lateral Entry) Diploma examination with at least 45% marks (40% marks in case of candidates belonging to the reserved category) in ANY branch of Engineering and Technology [as given in the table 8.2(viii) in AICTE Approval Process Handbook-2024-2027].

OR

Passed B.Sc. Degree from a recognised University as defined by UGC, with at least 45% marks (40% marks in case of candidates belonging to the reserved category) and passed 10+2 examination with Mathematics as a subject [as given in the table 8.2(viii) in AICTE Approval Process Handbook-2024-2027].

OR

Passed B.Voc/3-year D.Voc. Stream in the same or allied sector [as given in the table 8.2 (viii) in AICTE Approval Process Handbook-2024-2027].

(The Universities will offer suitable bridge courses such as Mathematics, Physics, Engineering drawing, etc., for the students coming from diverse backgrounds to achieve the desired learning outcomes of the programme)

N.B. : Reserved Category belongs to SC/ST/OBC-A/OBC-B/PwD

- ii. But for admission in **Jadavpur University**, the candidate must secure at least 60% (45% for SC/ ST/ OBC-A/ OBC-B/ PwD) marks or equivalent CGPA in the diploma examination. **D.Voc. Candidates are not eligible for admission in Jadavpur University through lateral entry.**

Note: Any changes to the abovementioned admission criteria will be notified separately in due course.

- iii. All relevant norms of **D. G. Shipping** will be applicable for admission into the Degree Course in Marine Engineering.

(B) B. Sc./B.Voc. candidates seeking admission into the Engineering & Technology Degree Course:

- i. The candidate must pass B. Sc. /B.Voc. Degree from any University recognised by UGC with at least 45% (40% for SC/ ST/ OBC-A/ OBC-B/ PwD) marks.
- ii. Also, the B.Sc. candidate must have passed the 12th standard school examination with Mathematics as a subject.
- iii. The candidate, if admitted, will have to clear the subjects of Engineering Mechanics and Engineering Graphics / Engineering Drawing of the 1st year Degree Course in Engineering/Technology, along with their second-year subjects.
- iv. **B.Sc./B.Voc. candidates will be considered for admission only if vacancies remain after filling the seats with available Diploma-holding candidates.**
- v. **B.Sc. /B.Voc. Candidates are not eligible for admission into the Degree Course in Pharmacy.**

vi. **B.Sc./B.Voc. Candidates are not eligible for admission in Jadavpur University through lateral entry.**

(C) Both B. Sc Candidates and Diploma holders in Engineering & Technology will also be eligible for admission to the 1st year Engineering Degree Courses, subject to vacancies in the 1st year classes in case the vacancies as lateral entry at the second year are exhausted. However, the admission shall be based strictly on the eligibility criteria as mentioned above.

(D) Diploma holders in Pharmacy seeking admission into the Degree Course in Pharmacy

- i. The candidate must pass a Diploma in Pharmacy from an institution approved by the Pharmacy Council of India under section 12 of the Pharmacy Act.
- ii. The candidate must secure at least 45% (40% for SC/ ST/ OBC-A/ OBC-B/ PwD) marks or equivalent CGPA.
- iii. Such candidates will also be eligible for admission to the 1st year Degree Course, subject to vacancies in the 1st year classes, in case the vacancies as lateral entry at the second year are exhausted. However, admission shall be based strictly on the eligibility criteria mentioned above, or on any notification issued by the Pharmacy Council of India on this issue.

N.B. However, if any notification/circular is issued by the Pharmacy Council of India on the above matter, it will be published in due course for taking necessary action accordingly.

3.3 Document verification

- a) Admit cards and Rank cards are issued based on the information provided by the candidate. All verifications are done during and after counselling **by the allotted Institute**. Hence, candidates cannot assume that the personal information shown in the admit card and rank card is approved by the Board.
- b) If during document verification by the **allotted Institute**, it is found that any information given by the candidate is/are incorrect or if the candidate is unable to produce certificate/ document/ proof **valid as per the then applicable rules and as on the date of its verification**, his/her information will be corrected/modified accordingly which may even make him/her ineligible for some/all seats/course(s).
- c) Similarly, if at any stage during or after counselling, it is found on scrutiny that the information/document(s) provided by the candidate is false/incorrect, his/her candidature is liable to be treated as cancelled even if he/she secured a Merit Rank and/or a seat has been allotted to the candidate. Hence, securing a Rank does not constitute a right/guarantee in favour of a candidate for his/her claim for admission if he/she fails to comply with the required criteria.

4.0 Seat matrix

The seat matrix for last year, i.e., the academic session 2025-26, is available on the Board's website.

Seat matrix for the academic session 2026-27 will be declared by the office of the Director of Technical Education, Govt. of W.B., in due course of time and will be published on the Board's website before counselling.

Note that there may be other seats available in some institutes/courses that are not offered by them through e-counselling and hence will not appear in the seat matrix.

5.0 Reservation of seats for students under the reserved category

- a) Reservation policies will be according to the extant rules of Govt. of WB for admission in reserved seats for SC/ST As per The Kolkata Gazette Notification dated June 10, 2025-

OBC-Category-A /OBC-Category-B as per Vide Notification No. 1056-BCW/MR-33/2025(Pt.1) dated the 27th May, 2025 & No.1057- BCW/MR 38/2025 Dated the 27th May, 2025 & No.1107-BCW/MR-38/2025 dated the 3rd June, 2025, No.917-BCW/MR-33/2025 Dated the 8th May, 2025 and No.1106-BCW/MR- 33/2025 Dated the 3rd June, 2025/EWS/PWD. The number of category-wise reserved seats will be declared by the above Authorities before counselling.

- b) The reservation in OBC-A/ OBC-B category shall be subject to the result of SLP (C) No. 017751-017755 of 2024 arising from the judgement and order dated 22.05.2024 passed in WPO No. 60/2011 22.05.2024 in WPA No. 8844/2020 22.05.2024 in WPO No. 1160/2013 22.05.2024 in WPO No. 578/2012 22.05.2024 in WPA No. 22145/2010 by the Hon'ble Calcutta High Court.
- c) In case of admission in reserve seat for EWS, the Memorandum No. 325-PAR (AR)/3P-1/2019 dated 09th July 2019 issued by the Personnel & Administrative Reforms Department (Administrative Reforms Cell), Govt. of West Bengal read with Memorandum No. 959-BCW/MR-52/2019 dated 18th May 2023 issued by Backward Classes Welfare Department, Govt. of West Bengal, along with any extant order(s) as applicable at the time of admission.
- d) Such reservation shall be restricted to candidates who are Indian citizens and domiciled in West Bengal only.
- e) Certificates issued by the Competent Authority are to be produced for verification by the allotted Institute during counselling, admission, etc. If at that time, it is found that any information given by the candidate is/are incorrect or if the candidate is unable to produce a certificate/ document/ proof valid as per the then applicable rules as on the date of its verification.
- f) The certificate is to be produced during counselling, admission, etc. If the certificate is then found to be invalid, the candidate will lose the opportunity for admission in the reserve category and will be treated as a General category candidate.

6.0 Requirements in terms of Residential/Domicile Criteria

- a) The candidate must be a domicile of Home State, i.e., West Bengal, for admission in,
 - i. Any seat, including general category seats, in any Government-aided Engineering/ Technology / Pharmacy Colleges.
 - ii. Any seat, including general category seats, in Aliah University.
 - iii. Any seat, including general category seats, in Jadavpur University.
 - iv. Any reserved category seat (SC, ST, OBC-A, OBC-B, PWD and EWS) in any institute.
- b) The candidate needs to download the required proforma as per the details given in section 6.1 and keep the certificate ready to be produced during counselling, admission, etc.
- c) If any of the certificates is then found to be invalid, the candidate will lose the opportunity of admission in seats reserved for WB domiciled candidates.

However, Diploma holders in Fashion Technology from Govt. Polytechnic Institutions from Tripura are eligible for admission to the Degree-level Apparel Production & Management Course and the Textile Technology Course in the Government. College of Engineering and Textile Technology, Serampore and Berhampore, under the Lateral Entry Scheme, with relaxation of the West Bengal domicile criteria.

6.1 Criteria to be treated as the domicile of West Bengal, and the applicable proforma of the certificate

Only those candidates will be treated as domiciled in West Bengal who are residing in West Bengal continuously for at least the last 10 (ten) years as on 31.12.2025.

OR

whose parent(s) is/are permanent resident(s) of West Bengal having a permanent address within the State of West Bengal.

In case of a) above, a certificate is to be obtained as per proforma 'a1' (Appendix-1).
 In case of b) above, a certificate is to be obtained in proforma 'b' (Appendix-2) AND
 The candidate must produce, in original, any two of the Voter ID card/ Aadhaar card/ Passport/ Ration card belonging to his/her parents. The said documents must justify that the residential address of the parent(s) is in West Bengal.
 During counselling, etc., if SC/ST/OBC-A/OBC-B candidates who cannot produce the required domicile certificate, they can produce/upload their category certificates (issued by the Govt. of WB) in lieu of the domicile certificate. But in that case, if the category certificate is found invalid at the time of verification, their domicile status is also considered to be NON-West Bengal

6.2

Competent authority to issue a domicile certificate

a) Proforma 'a1' or 'b' must be signed and certified by any of the following competent authorities from the Central Government or the State Government having local jurisdiction over the place of the permanent residence of the concerned candidate or his/her parent(s), viz.

- i. District Magistrate, Additional District Magistrate, Deputy Magistrate, Deputy Collector, Sub- Divisional Officer, Block Development Officer.
- ii. Superintendent of Police, Additional Superintendent of Police, Sub-divisional Police Officer, Deputy Superintendent of Police,
- iii. Commissioner, Additional Commissioner, Joint Commissioner, Deputy Commissioner, Assistant Commissioner of Police, Commissionerate.
- iv. Judicial Magistrate of any rank or position in the concerned district or Metropolitan locality or Hon'ble High Court at Calcutta or Hon'ble Supreme Court of India.
- v. Corporation Area - Commissioner, Additional Commissioner, Joint Commissioner, Assistant Commissioner.
- vi. Assistant Secretary or above in the Secretariat to the Government of West Bengal (including GTA) or Central Government.
- vii. Deputy Director or above in the Directorate to the Government of West Bengal or the Central Government.
- viii. Officials issuing domicile certificates MUST provide his/her full name, designation, place of posting with address, land line/mobile number. He/she should also provide his/her identity card number if available.
- ix. Collector of Kolkata (Stamp and Revenue) located at 11, N.S. Road, Kolkata-700001, for the inhabitants under the jurisdiction of Kolkata Police Area.

N.B.: Domicile certificates issued by any elected people's representative, such as municipal commissioner, Councillor of Municipal Corporation/ Municipality, Member of the three-tier Panchayat system or GTA, MLA or MP, are not acceptable.

7.0

Competent Authorities for the issuance of SC/ST Certificate for WB domicile candidates claiming under such reserve category of seats

SC/ST Certificates are to be issued by any of the following authorities:

1. Sub-Divisional Officers for all districts except Kolkata
2. District Welfare Officer, Kolkata & Ex-Officio Joint Director, B.C.W. Dept. in case of Kolkata Municipal Area [as defined in clause (9) of Section 2 of K.M.C Act, 1980.]

Competent Authorities for the issuance of OBC-A (NCL*) / OBC-B (NCL*) Certificate for WB domicile candidates claiming under such reserve category of seats

As per Notification vide No. 374(71)-TW/EC/MR-103/94 dated 27/7/1994, read with Memorandum No. 1204-SBCW/MR-67/10 dated 27/7/2015 issued by Backward Classes Welfare Department. In the Govt. of W.B., the Sub-Divisional Officer of a Sub-Division in a District is the certificate-issuing authority. In Kolkata, such a certificate is issued by an officer authorised by the State Government. Accordingly, the District Welfare Officer, Kolkata, and Ex-officio Joint Director, BCW Dept. has been notified to act as the certificate issuing authority in

respect of Kolkata covering the jurisdiction of the Kolkata Municipal Corporation.

Only OBC-Category-A/OBC-Category-B candidates belonging to the Non-Creamy Layer (NCL) are eligible for consideration as reserved candidates. OBC-Category-A /OBC-Category-B candidates must produce updated NCL certificates issued by the competent authority on or after 01.04.2025 during counselling or admission.

*NCL- Non-Creamy Layer

Competent Authorities for issuance of EWS Certificate for WB domicile candidates claiming under such reserved category of seats and others.

As per Office Memorandum No. 325-PAR(AR)/3P-1/2019 dated 09th July 2019 issued by the Personnel & Administrative Reforms Department (Administrative Reforms Cell), Govt. of West Bengal read with Memorandum No. 959-BCW/MR-52/2019 dated 18th May 2023 issued by Backward Classes Welfare Department, Govt. of West Bengal, EWS Certificates are to be issued by any of the following authorities:

- a) District Magistrate/ Additional District Magistrate
- b) Sub-Divisional Officers
- c) District Welfare Officer, Kolkata and Ex officio JD, BCW & TD in respect of Kolkata covering the jurisdiction of the Kolkata Municipal Corporation.

N.B. For eligibility and other details, please refer to the Memoranda mentioned above.

10.0

Reservation of seats for PWD candidates

- a) According to Section 2(r) of the RPWD Act, 2016, “persons with benchmark disabilities” means a person with not less than forty percent (40%) of a specified disability where specified disability has not been defined in measurable terms and includes a person with disability where specified disability has been defined in measurable terms, as certified by the certifying authority.
- b) Accordingly, reservation in PWD seats will be available for the following types of disabilities, the percentage of disability being not less than 40%.
 - i. Locomotor disability as specified in the Schedule of RPWD Act, 2016.
 - ii. Visual impairment as specified in the Schedule of RPWD Act, 2016.
 - iii. Hearing impairment as specified in the Schedule of RPWD Act, 2016.
 - iv. Speech & language disability as specified in the Schedule of RPWD Act, 2016
 - v. Intellectual disabilities as specified in the Schedule of RPWD Act, 2016
 - vi. Mental illness.
 - vii. Disabilities caused by chronic neurological conditions and blood disorders.
 - viii. Multiple disabilities, including deaf blindness.
- c) The “specified disabilities”, which are included in the Schedule of the RPWD Act, are given in APPENDIX-8.

PWD certificates are to be issued by any of the authorities as given in the Order No. 289-HF /O/PHP/IR-05/2017 dated 29.08.2018 by the Government of West Bengal, Health & Family Welfare Department (PHP Branch).

10.1

Special facilities for PWD candidates for appearing in the examination

- a) **Concessional application fees:** PWD candidates are eligible for 40% concession on application fees. To avail of the same, the candidate must formally apply in writing (enclosing a copy of his/her confirmation page and PWD certificate) to the Chairman, WBJEEB, and submit the application to the Board office at least 30 days before the date of commencement of the examination.
- b) **Compensatory time:** Twenty minutes per hour compensatory time, as per the duration of the examination (On a pro-rata basis), will be allowed to the PWD candidates with benchmark disabilities.

c) **Scribe/reader:** Facility of own Scribe/Reader will be allowed to a candidate with benchmark disability and has limitation in writing, including that of speed, if so desired by him/her. (See Appendix – 3 and Appendix – 4).

d) In order to avail the facility of compensatory time and/or scribe/reader, the candidate must formally apply in writing (enclosing a copy of his/her confirmation page, PWD certificate, a certificate in the format as given in appendix-3 and a letter of undertaking in the format as given in appendix-4) to the Chairman, WBJEEB and send/submit the application to the Board office at least 30 days before the date of commencement of the examination. **Special arrangements will be made at the Board office in Kolkata for such candidates to sit for the examination. Such facilities are not available in other examination centres.**

e) The Board's decision in this regard will be final and binding on the candidate.

11.0 Legal jurisdiction

- a) All matters pertaining to the conduct of the examination and counselling shall fall within the jurisdiction of Kolkata only.
- b) The Board will not be a party to any dispute arising in the process of admission.
- c) WBJEEB is obliged to share with any candidate any information about his/ her own status in the common entrance test and counselling, for which any candidate can contact WBJEEB individually and personally. But WBJEEB is unable to share any information about any other candidate.

12.0 Procedure for submission of the application form, payment of examination fees

12.1 Registration

- a) The candidate will enter personal details such as name, father's name, mother's name, date of birth, identification type and number, present and permanent address, mobile number, email ID, etc.
- b) Candidates must be careful while entering their name, father's name, mother's name, date of birth and domicile. This information cannot be changed/edited/modified under any circumstances.
- c) Then the candidate has to create a password, review and submit the registration.
- d) An application number will be generated and will appear on the screen. Also, SMS/email will be sent to the registered mobile number./ Mail-id of the candidate(s).
- e) Candidate must remember his/her application number, security question/answer and password. If the candidate forgets their password, they must recover it using the "Forgot Password" option. There is no other way to recover the password.
- f) No person/agency can change/edit/input any information without knowing the password. Hence, candidates must not share their password with anybody. The Board will not be responsible for any change resulting from the sharing/ divulging of the password.

12.2 Application

- a) At this stage, the candidate needs to fill in various other information, such as domicile, category, PWD status, family income status, religion, nationality, academic details, etc.
- b) Thereafter, the candidate needs to choose zones of examinations in order of his/her choice and submit the application.

12.3 Uploading of images

- The candidate is required to upload JPG/JPEG images of his/her recent colour photograph (10 to 200 KB) and signature (4 to 30 KB).
- If any document, e.g., certificate/marksheet, etc., is to be uploaded, it must be in PDF format (50 to 300 KB)
- Photo and Signature of the candidate are to be uploaded in one go.

12.4 Payment of Examination Fees

- The Examination Fees can be paid by Net Banking/ Debit Card/ Credit Card/ UPI/QR Code only.

12.5 Confirmation Page

Upon successful completion of all the above steps, the candidate shall be directed to download the 'Confirmation Page', indicating that the application is complete. **APPLICATION IS NOT COMPLETE UNTIL THE CONFIRMATION PAGE IS GENERATED.**

12.6 Correction of the application form

- It is not possible to correct any primary registration data, i.e., Name, Father's Name, Mother's Name, domicile, and Date of birth.**
- If any candidate intends to correct any other information in his/her application, he/she can do so after logging in during the given correction period. The Board will not entertain any request for a correction outside the correction period. Also, the Board will not make any corrections on behalf of any candidate.

13.0 Admit Card

- Admit cards will be generated on the notified date for the student to download and take a print. The candidate must carry a printed hard copy of the admit card to the examination centre.

Candidates must ensure that the admit card is not mutilated/ distorted/ soiled even by accident. Candidates with such mutilated/ distorted/ soiled admit cards may not be allowed to appear in the examination.

14.0 Allocation of examination centre

- Allocation of the examination centre will be based on the choices of zones given by the candidate. However, in unavoidable circumstances, any candidate may be allocated to a zone outside his/her choice. **The Board's discretion in the allocation of examination zones/centres shall be final.** No request for a change of allocated centre will be entertained under any circumstances. **The list of district-wise examination zones is given in Appendix 7.**

- b) Any examination zone may be dropped if adequate numbers of candidates are not available or under any unavoidable circumstances. In such a case, the candidate will be allocated an alternative examination zone.

15.0 Evaluation and declaration of the result

- a) **Model Answer Keys** will be available for a brief period at Board's website shortly after the examination. Candidates can log in and view the model answer keys.
- b) Candidates can also **challenge any answer key on payment of ₹500 (Rupees Five hundred only) per question** plus the bank's service charges, if any. **The fee once paid is not refundable under any circumstances.**
- c) The Board will review the challenges and publish Final and Frozen Answer Keys. **The Board's decision in this regard will be final, and no further communication will be entertained.**
- d) Images of OMRs and machine-read responses will be available for a brief period on the Board's website, one week (tentatively) after the examination. Any candidate can view images of their OMRs and machine-read responses by logging in with their password. Candidates should download and preserve copies of their OMRs. However, the duration of preservation of record (s)/ document (s)/ information has been notified and is available on the Board's website.
- e) Any candidate who is not satisfied with the captured responses may challenge online on payment of ₹500 (Rupees Five hundred only) per question plus the bank's service charges, if any. **The fee once paid is not refundable under any circumstances.**
- f) The Board will review the challenges and take final decision. **The Board's decision on the challenges will be final and no further communication will be entertained.**
- g) Challenges by email, letter, fax, telephone etc. other than through online mode will not be accepted or entertained.
- h) The result will be published in the form of Rank Card, which will contain all relevant ranks, total score, and component scores in respective paper. Candidates can view and download their rank card by logging in with their password. **The Board never publishes a rank list to ensure confidentiality to each individual candidate.**
- i) Ranks cards with scores will be issued to all candidates, who appears in JELET-2026. But all **may not be awarded a rank and hence may not be eligible for counseling**, for which a cut off rank and/or a cut off score will be decided by the Board.

APPENDIX - 6

Rules of the Examination

1. Candidates are advised to reach the examination centres at least 30 minutes before the commencement of the test.
2. Be sure about the exact location of your examination centre and means of commuting to avoid any inconvenience, if any, on the day of the examination.
3. No candidate will be allowed to seat for the test in any center other than the one allotted to him/her and as is mentioned in the admit card.
4. Any candidate found to occupy a seat other than the one allotted to him/her will be **reported against**, and his/her paper will be cancelled.
5. Carry the following documents to enter the examination center:
 - a) A printed copy of the admit card.
 - b) A copy of a colour photograph as was uploaded during the online application.
 - c) Any photo identity card in original, such as Aadhaar card/ Pan card / Passport/ voter card/ 10th standard admit card/ School – ID card.
6. Candidates are not allowed to carry any written or printed material, calculator, pen, log table, wristwatch, any communication device like mobile phones, any Bluetooth device, any electronic gadgets, etc. inside the examination hall. Any candidate found with such items will be reported against, and his/her candidature will be summarily cancelled.
7. Frisking may be carried out while entering the centre for checking prohibited objects/articles.
8. Candidates are advised to take their seats at least 15 minutes before the commencement of the test.
9. No candidate will be allowed to enter the examination centre beyond the scheduled time of commencement of the test for each half under any circumstances.
10. Question booklets will be distributed well before the commencement of the test. Take out the OMR sheet and check that your OMR number and question booklet number are the same. If not, ask the invigilator to replace the whole set from the same series (e.g., A/B/C/D).
11. Put your signature on the top of the question booklet.
12. Read the instructions given on the OMR and on the cover page of the question booklet very carefully.
13. Write the question booklet number and roll number at the appropriate places on the OMR. Wrong entry of the question booklet number and roll number may lead to rejection of the OMR or wrong scoring, for which the Board will not be held responsible. If any candidate makes any mistake, he/she must not overwrite. Request the invigilator to strike it out, rewrite the correct numbers, and put his/her (Invigilator) signature.
14. Darken the appropriate circle/bubbles of question booklet number, roll number and question booklet series (e.g., A/B/C/D).
15. Write your name in BLOCK LETTERS, name of the center and put your signature in appropriate places on the OMR. Do not put any stray mark anywhere else; it may lead to rejection of the OMR.
16. Check that your roll number, photograph, and spelling of your name in the attendance

sheet match those given in your admit card. If any correction is needed, bring it to the invigilator's attention.

17. Question booklets can be opened only at the time of commencement of the test and as will be announced by the invigilator. Check all the pages of the question booklet. If there is any damage or a missing page or any difficulty in reading the question booklet, ask your invigilator to replace the whole set from the same series (e.g., A/B/C/D).
18. Maintain silence during the test. Any conversation/gesticulation or creation of disturbances will be deemed as misdemeanor. If any candidate is found adopting any unfair means, his/her candidature will be cancelled, and/or he/she will be debarred either permanently or for a period as is deemed fit by the Centre- in- Charge.
19. No discussion will be allowed with the invigilator regarding any question.
20. Candidates may do rough work in the space provided in the question booklet.
21. No candidate will leave his/her seat without permission of the invigilator until the test is over.
22. No candidate will leave the hall till the end of the test and all OMRs are collected and tallied by the invigilator.
23. Candidates are allowed to take his/her question booklet after the test.
24. If any examinee is found impersonating, he/she will be handed over to the police and the candidature of the original candidate will be cancelled outright.

Appendix-8

THE SCHEDULE
[See clause (zc) of section 2]
SPECIFIED DISABILITY

1. Physical disability

A. Locomotor disability (a person's inability to execute distinctive activities associated with movement of self and objects resulting from affliction of the musculoskeletal or nervous system or both), including—

(a) "leprosy cured person" means a person who has been cured of leprosy but is suffering from—
(i) loss of sensation in hands or feet as well as loss of sensation and paresis in the eye and eyelid but with no manifest deformity;

(ii) manifest deformity and paresis but having sufficient mobility in their hands and feet to enable them to engage in normal economic activity;

(iii) extreme physical deformity as well as advanced age which prevents him/her from undertaking any gainful occupation, and the expression "leprosy cured" shall be construed accordingly;

(b) "cerebral palsy" means a Group of non-progressive neurological conditions affecting body movements and muscle coordination, caused by damage to one or more specific areas of the brain, usually occurring before, during or shortly after birth;

(c) "dwarfism" means a medical or genetic condition resulting in an adult height of 4 feet 10 inches (147 centimetres) or less;

(d) "Muscular dystrophy" means a group of hereditary genetic muscle disease that weakens the muscles that move the human body, and persons with multiple dystrophies have incorrect and missing information in their genes, which prevents them from making the proteins they need for healthy muscles. It is characterised by progressive skeletal muscle weakness, defects in muscle proteins, and the death of muscle cells and tissue.

(e) "acid attack victims" means a person disfigured due to violent assaults by the throwing of acid or a similar corrosive substance.

B. Visual impairment—

(a) "blindness" means a condition where a person has any of the following conditions, after best correction—

(i) total absence of sight; or

(ii) visual acuity less than 3/60 or less than 10/200 (Snellen) in the better eye with best possible correction; or

(i) limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 10 degrees.

(b) "low-vision" means a condition where a person has any of the following conditions, namely:

(i) visual acuity not exceeding 6/18 or less than 20/60 upto 3/60 or upto 10/200 (Snellen) in the better eye with best possible corrections; or

(ii) limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 40 degrees up to 10 degrees.

C. Hearing impairment—

(a) "deaf" means persons having 70 DB hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears;

(b) "hard of hearing" means a person having 60 DB to 70 DB hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears;

D. "Speech and language disability" means a permanent disability arising out of conditions such as laryngectomy or aphasia affecting one or more components of speech and language due to organic or neurological causes.

2. Intellectual disability, a condition characterised by significant limitation both in intellectual functioning (reasoning, learning, problem solving) and in adaptive behaviour which covers a range of everyday, social and practical skills, including—

(a) "specific learning disabilities" means a heterogeneous group of conditions wherein there is a deficit in processing language, spoken or written, that may manifest itself as a difficulty to comprehend, speak, read, write, spell, or to do mathematical calculations and includes such conditions as perceptual disabilities, dyslexia, dysgraphia, dyscalculia, dyspraxia and developmental aphasia;

(b) "autism spectrum disorder" means a neuro-developmental condition typically appearing in the first three years of life that significantly affects a person's ability to communicate, understand relationships and relate to others, and is frequently associated with unusual or stereotypical rituals or behaviours.

3. Mental behaviour

"Mental illness" means a substantial disorder of thinking, mood, perception, orientation or memory that grossly impairs judgment, behaviour, capacity to recognise reality or ability to meet the ordinary demands of life, but does not include retardation, which is a condition of arrested or incomplete development of the mind of a person, specially characterised by sub-normality of intelligence.

4. Disability caused due to—

a) Chronic neurological conditions, such as—

(i) "multiple sclerosis" means an inflammatory, nervous system disease in which the myelin sheaths around the axons of nerve cells of the brain and spinal cord are damaged, leading to demyelination and affecting the ability of nerve cells in the brain and spinal cord to communicate with each other;

(ii) "Parkinson's disease" means a progressive disease of the nervous system marked by tremor, muscular rigidity, and slow, imprecise movement, chiefly affecting middle-aged and elderly people associated with degeneration of the basal ganglia of the brain and a deficiency of the neurotransmitter dopamine.

b) Blood disorder

(i) "haemophilia" means an inheritable disease, usually affecting only male but transmitted by women to their male children, characterised by loss or impairment of the normal clotting ability of blood so that a minor wound may result in fatal bleeding;

(ii) "thalassemia" means a group of inherited disorders characterised by reduced or absent amounts of haemoglobin.

(iii) "sickle cell disease" means a haemolytic disorder characterised by chronic anaemia, painful events, and various complications due to associated tissue and organ damage; "haemolytic" refers to the destruction of the cell membrane of red blood cells resulting in the release of haemoglobin.

5. Multiple Disabilities (more than one of the above specified disabilities) including deaf blindness which means a condition in which a person may have combination of hearing and visual impairments causing severe communication, developmental, and educational problems.
